## PRESS CREDENTIALS

To obtain a press credential, please use Virginia's online credentialling system:
https://www.sportssystems.com/clients/virginia/ Please allow ample time for credentials to be processed. You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room. Contact Melissa Dudek (mdudek@virginia.edu) for more information about credentials.

## PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers and television camera operators approved to work on the floor must secure an armband before the game. It is requested that photographers please wear the armband on their arms to make it easier for event staff to see they are properly credentialed. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

## PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVA athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

## INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day, preferably longer, to arrange an interview.

## POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Joanne Boyle will meet with media representatives after a cooling off period in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Visiting coaches and players are available by request.

## RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.

## GAME SERVICES

Information packets are available before each game at John Paul Jones Arena, and a full statistical summary and play-by-play sheets are distributed at halftime and after the game. Quotes from both coaches and two or three players from each team will be available at the conclusion of the game. A pregame buffet meal is served for working members of the media in the press room on the event level of John Paul Jones Arena.

## TELEPHONES/WIRELESS

The Virginia athletics media relations office will have a limited number of telephones available for postgame reporting. Should you require your own telephone for game coverage, please contact Darlene Craig or Amy Mulligan in the Virginia athletics media relations office.

A wireless network is available at John Paul Jones Arena for visiting media. A UVA media relations representative will provide login directions.

## JOANNE BOYLE

## Head Coach

Fifth Season
Duke (1985)


On April 9, 2011, Joanne Boyle was announced as the fourth head coach in the history of the Virginia women's basketball program.
During her 13-year head-coaching career, Boyle has amassed a 276149 career record with eight 20-win seasons. She has led her teams to 11 post-season berths, including five NCAA Tournament appearances, with her 2008-09 California squad advancing to the Sweet-16 for the first time in program history.

In her first four seasons in Charlottesville, Boyle has amassed a 72-56 record that includes six upset victories over top- 25 opponents, including three wins over top-10 opponents at John Paul Jones Arena. Boyle's Cavaliers closed out the 2014-15 regular-season with a 75-59 victory over No. 8 Louisville. In 2013-14, Boyle's UVA squad registered an 86-72 victory over No. 6 Maryland, a team that would go on to play in the 2014 Final Four, in the Terps' last-ever visit to JPJ as an ACC opponent. Boyle, in her fourth game at the helm of the Cavaliers, led her team to a 69-64 overtime victory over No. 3 Tennessee, during the 2011-12 season.
Known throughout her career for her talents as a recruiter, Boyle signed back-to-back-to-back top-20-ranked recruiting classes at Virginia that have included a pair of Gatorade State Players of the Year, two members of the 2013 Parade Magazine High School Girls All-America Team, and a gold-medalist from the 2011 USA Basketball U16 team that swept through the FIBA Americas Championship in Merida, Mexico.
Boyle has transformed the squad into one of the stingiest defensive teams in the ACC. In her first season at UVA, the Cavaliers led the ACC by holding opponents' scoring to 54.1 points per game. The 54.1 ppg was the lowest opponent scoring average since 1975-76 when

UVA allowed 46.2 ppg . The team also held a record-setting 26 opponents to under 60 points. The year before Boyle arrived, the team was allowing 64.5 ppg , a reduction of over 10 points per game. Boyle had a similar impact when she took over at California, with the Bears allowing 60.1 ppg in her first season (2005-06) after averaging 71.3 points allowed the year before.
Under her tutelage, Boyle's players have been recognized as being among the top athletes in the elite Atlantic Coast Conference with Ariana Moorer, Ataira Franklin and Faith Randolph being named to the All-ACC team, with Franklin earning first-team honors in 2013. Lexie Gerson was twice named to the All-Defensive team while Faith Randolph was named the conference's Sixth Player of the Year in 2014. Mikayla Venson earned a spot on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2015. During Boyle's tenure, Simone Egwu became only the second Virginia women's basketball player to earn the prestigious ACC's Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Last season (2014-15), Boyle's players were ranked in the top-10 in the ACC in eight different statistical categories including Randolph who just was the fifth player in ACC history to win the free throw crown while shooting over 90 percent from the stripe.
In her first season, the Cavaliers finished with a $25-11$ overall record, a 9-7 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play and a quarterfinal appearance in the 2012 Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT), posting 25 wins for the first time since the 1999-2000 season when that team finished with a $25-9$ record. The squad finished with that season with a 17-3 home record.

Prior to being named head coach at UVA, Boyle was the women's head basketball coach at the University of California at Berkeley for six years (2005-2011).

Boyle compiled a 137-64 (.682) record with the Golden Bears. She led California to postseason play each year she directed the program, including four NCAA tournament appearances and two trips to the Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Golden Bears won the 2010 WNIT championship.

Boyle began her head-coaching career at the University of Richmond in 2002. In three years she led the Spiders to a 67-29 (.698) record, winning at least 21 games each season. Her final year at Richmond the Spiders went 23-8 and advanced to the NCAA Championships.


When Boyle took over as the California head coach in 2005 she inherited a program that had gone 12 consecutive seasons without a winning record. Among the highlights during her career at California:
*Named the 2011 Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Carol Eckman Award winner which is presented annually to an active WBCA coach who exemplifies Eckman's spirit, integrity and character through sportsmanship, commitment to the student-athlete, honesty, ethical behavior, courage and dedication to purpose.

* Named 2006-07 Pac-10 Coach of the Year
* Named 2007-08 Russell Athletic/WBCA Region 8 Coach of the Year
* In 2007-08, led Cal to the Pac-10 Tournament final for the first time
${ }^{*}$ In 2008-09, spent four weeks at a program-best No. 3 ranking in both the AP and USA Today-ESPN Coaches' polls
*Advanced the 2008-09 squad to the Sweet-16 after winning a second round game in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history
${ }^{*}$ Coached the 2006-07 Pac-10 Player of the Year (Devanei Hampton) and the 2005-06 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year (Alexis GrayLawson)
*Her players earned All-Pac-10 honors 17 times and Pac-10 AllFreshman accolades 11 times
*Coached three All-Americans (Devanei Hampton, Ashley Walker, and Alexis Gray-Lawson)
${ }^{*}$ Coached the 2010 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner (Alexis Gray-Lawson), an honor given to the top player in the nation 5-8 and under

Boyle is highly regarded in the women's basketball community. She was a member of the State Farm/Wade Trophy selection committee and was a member of the USA Basketball Junior National Team Committee (2009-2012). In 2006 she was an assistant coach for the USA team that competed in the 2006 FIBA Americas U20 Championship for Women and a member of the WBCA Board of Directors.

Boyle, who grew up in Monroeville, Pa., was inducted into the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame (East Boros Chapter) in October of 2012.

Boyle served as an assistant coach at Duke from 1993 to 2002. During that nine-year span the Blue Devils recorded a 225-121 record, advancing to the NCAA Championships the last eight seasons and making Final Four appearances in 1999 and 2002.

A four-year letterwinner at Duke, Boyle graduated in 1985 with a degree in economics and obtained a master's of science degree in health policy and administration from North Carolina in 1989. Her 75 steals during the 1984-85 campaign remained the highest singleseason total until Alana Beard broke the mark in 2000-01. Prior to starting her coaching career at her alma mater she played professionally in Luxembourg and Germany for three years.

Boyle and her daughter, Ngoty, reside in Charlottesville.

Kim (Hairston) McNeill was named an assistant coach at UVA in May 2011. McNeill was promoted to associate head coach in August 2013.

Virginia finished the 2011-12 season with a $25-11$ overall record, the most wins since a 25 -win season in 1999-2000. McNeill was also instrumental in helping to sign a top-10 ranked recruiting class in 2012.

McNeill is a native of Bassett, Va., and has been a member of Boyle's staffs at Richmond, California and now UVA. Before coming to Virginia, McNeill was an assistant coach at the University of Georgia from 2007-11. During that period the Lady Bulldogs participated in four-consecutive NCAA Tournaments and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 in both 2010 and 2011.

On the recruiting trail, McNeill helped Georgia ink 2008 and 2009 recruiting classes that were ranked among the nation's top five.

McNeill was selected to attend Nike's Villa 7 Coaches Consortium for three-consecutive years (2009-11) and the Achieving Coaching Excellence (ACE) Program in 2003.

Prior to serving as an assistant at Georgia, McNeill spent two seasons on Boyle's staff at California (2005-07). The Golden Bears earned back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths and compiled a 41-21 record in those two seasons.

McNeill was also a member of Boyle's staff at Richmond, her alma mater. In 2005 the 23-8 Spiders received their first NCAA berth in 14 seasons. Prior to her time at Richmond, McNeill worked three seasons (2000-01 and 2002-04) at James Madison, including the Dukes' run to the 2001 Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) semifinals. In between her time at JMU, McNeill was an assistant coach at Howard University.

The 1996 Big South Rookie of the Year while playing at Radford, McNeill transferred to Richmond where she was a three-year letterwinner and co-captain. In 2000 she was named to the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) All-Defensive team.

McNeill received her bachelor's degree in sport science from Richmond in 2000.

McNeill and her husband, fellow assistant coach Cory McNeill, are the proud parents of a twin son and daughter, Cayden and Gabrielle, who were born Jan. 4, 2013.

La'Keshia Frett Meredith was named as an assistant coach at UVA in July 2013. Frett Meredith, a former All-American and four-time All-SEC honoree at Georgia, will work primarily with the Cavalier post players.

As a professional basketball player, La'Keshia Frett Meredith played seven seasons in the WNBA, including making four appearances in the Western Conference Finals, after a two-year stint in the American Basketball League. Frett Meredith retired from the WNBA to take a full-time coaching position at her alma mater, serving as an assistant coach for Georgia from 2005-11 and the director of operations for her final two seasons with the Bulldogs.

In 1997, Frett Meredith was a first-round draft pick in the ABL, where she played two seasons for the Philadelphia Rage. After the ABL folded, she was drafted by the Los Angeles Sparks, beginning a seven-year WNBA career that included playing for the Sparks (1999-00), the Sacramento Monarchs (2001-03), the Charlotte Sting (2004) and the New York Liberty (2004-05). All but one of the teams reached the playoffs, including trips to the Western Conference Finals in 1999, 2000 and 2003. She also played overseas in Hungary, Israel, South Korea and Spain.

As a player, Frett Meredith enjoyed remarkable success at the prep, collegiate and professional levels. She earned 1993 National Prep Player of the Year honors and then helped lead Georgia to back-to-back Final Four appearances and consecutive SEC titles. Within the professional ranks, her teams advanced to the WNBA playoffs in six of her seven seasons in the league.

While at Georgia, Frett Meredith was the 1994 SEC Freshman of the Year and was named All-SEC by league coaches each of her four years, earning first-team recognition as a sophomore, junior and senior. She was a Naismith All-American as a junior and earned All-America recognition from Naismith, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and the Associated Press (third team) as a senior in 1997. Frett Meredith helped lead Georgia to a combined 98-27 (.784) record from 1993-97. Frett Meredith scored 1,980 points in her Bulldog career, ranking sixth on the career scoring list, and ranked eighth with 842 rebounds.

Frett Meredith was a three-time All-American at Phoebus High School and then headlined one of the most celebrated recruiting classes in women's hoops history that featured five of USA Today's top-20 prospects in the nation. Frett Meredith and her classmates Kedra Holland-Corn and Tracy Henderson went on to become three of the top- 15 overall picks in the 1997 ABL Draft, the first draft conducted when professional women's basketball emerged in the U.S. following the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.
Frett Meredith received her bachelor's degree in consumer economics from Georgia in 1997.

Cory McNeill was named an assistant coach at UVA in May 2011.
In McNeill's first season with the Cavaliers, Virginia finished with a 2511 overall record, the most wins since a 25 -win season in 1999-2000, and advanced for the quarterfinals of the 2012 Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT).

McNeill, a defensive specialist, helped mentor junior guard Lexie Gerson to earn a spot on the ACC All-Defensive team after finishing second in the ACC and in the top-20 in the nation in steals per game. The 201112 Cavaliers, as a team, led the conference in scoring defense and limited 22 opponents to scoring fewer than 60 points.

McNeill, a native of Baltimore, Md., came to UVA after spending four seasons at Georgetown University (2007-11). During that time period, the Hoyas continued one of the nation's most impressive turnarounds, earning back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths (2010 and 2011) for the first time in program history.

McNeill served as Georgetown's defensive coordinator all four of his seasons, helping the Hoyas become one of the nation's leaders in forced turnovers and defensive field goal percentage.

In 2011, the Hoyas advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the second time in school history. Georgetown had the 2009 BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and five All-BIG EAST conference selections during McNeill's tenure.

McNeill helped the Hoyas ink a national top-10 recruiting class in 2008.

McNeill was selected to attend Nike's Villa 7 Coaches Consortium in 2010 and 2011 as well as the ACE program in 2009.
Prior to his time at Georgetown, McNeill spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Coppin State (2002-07). During McNeill's tenure, Coppin State earned two Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championships, three regular-season MEAC Championships, two NCAA Tournament berths and a WNIT appearance.

While at Coppin State, McNeill was the offensive coordinator and the MEAC Player of the Year came from an Eagles' squad for four-consecutive years.

McNeill played collegiate basketball at Morgan State and received his bachelor's degree in finance in 2002. He earned his master's degree in public administration from the University of Baltimore in 2005.

## 1991 NCAA FINAL FOUR MARCH 30-31, 1991 AT NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA



Virginia advanced to its first national championship appearance with a 61-55 victory over Connecticut in the semifinal game on March 30, 1991. Connecticut was coached by former UVA assistant coach Geno Auriemma. Tennessee defeated defending national champion Stanford, 68-60, in the other semifinal game to advance to the final the Lady Vols rallied to defeat Virginia in overtime, 70-67, in the national championship game Tennessee led 27-26 at halftime, but Dawn Staley led the Cavaliers in the second half the score was tied at 60 at the end of regulation the championship was the first NCAA Final Four overtime title game Staley scored a championship game record 28 points and added 11 rebounds. Staley was named Final Four Most Outstanding Player, marking the first time the award was given to a player from the losing team Tennessee's Dena Head also scored 28 points to share the scoring record. Staley and Cardoza were named to the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament team Virginia registered the first 30-win season in school history.

## VAL ACKERMAN

In June of 1999, Val Ackerman was inducted into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame. Ackerman is a 1981 graduate of the University of Virginia where she was a four-year starter for the women's basketball team and a two-time Academic All-American selection. She graduated with high distinction and received the Jettie Hill Award for the highest grade-point average among UVA women athletes. Ackerman played basketball professionally for one year in France before attending law school at UCLA where she earned her degree in 1985. Following two years of work at the New York City law firm of Simpson Thacher \& Bartlett, Ackerman was hired by the National Basketball Association (NBA) as a staff attorney in 1988. From 1990-92, she served as special assistant to NBA Commissioner David Stern before being named vice president of business affairs in 1994.

In August 1996, Ackerman was appointed president of the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA). A member of the Board of Directors of USA Basketball, she was a driving force behind the creation of the 1995-96 USA Basketball Women's National Team that compiled a 60-0 record during a year-long tour against college and international opponents, and won the gold medal at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. In March 2005, Ackerman became president of USA Basketball. She also serves on the board of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Ackerman received the University of Virginia Distinguished Alumna Award in October of 1997. The UVA Women's Center established the annual award to honor a female UVA graduate who has demonstrated excellence, leadership, and extraordinary commitment to her field, and who used her talents as a positive force for change.

The Virginia women's basketball team averaged close to 4,000 fans per game in the 1990s. Virginia was one of the first teams in the country to consistently average over 3,000 fans per game. Below are the year-by-year attendance figures since 1982 when attendance figures were recorded for women's basketball at UVA.

## TERESA A. SULLIVAN

 University PresidentTeresa A. Sullivan is the University of Virginia's eighth president. Since taking office in 2010, she has led UVA through a period of significant progress. In fall 2012, she launched a planning effort to provide a road-map for the University's future, while gathering input from 10,000 alumni, parents, students, faculty, staff, and others. This effort produced a new strategic plan for the University, the Cornerstone Plan. President Sullivan developed a new financial model for the University to ensure stability and transparency and to spur innovation in a period of significant financial pressure in higher education.

President Sullivan has assembled a highly effective leadership team, led by Executive Vice President and Provost Tom Katsouleas, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Pat Hogan, Executive Vice President for Health Affairs Dr. Rick Shannon, Senior Vice President for University Advancement Bob Sweeney, and a group of experienced deans, vice presidents, and staff. Working with her team, President Sullivan has prepared UVA to tackle the serious challenges in higher education related to cost-containment, affordability, faculty compensation, and the emergence of online education. UVA now has ongoing efforts, at both the unit and the pan-University levels, to reduce costs, improve processes, and enhance efficiency, while protecting the quality of the academic enterprise. In 2013, President Sullivan proposed a plan to aggressively improve faculty compensation after many years of stagnation in faculty salaries. Under her leadership, faculty and staff have been encouraged to experiment strategically with new technologies, such as massive open online courses, or MOOCs. President Sullivan also provided seed funding to allow professors to experiment with "hybrid" courses that combine the traditional classroom experience with technology-enhanced teaching.

In spring 2013, President Sullivan led the University to completion of its \$3-billion capital campaign, and quickly announced plans to raise financial support for three strategic priorities: retaining and recruiting top faculty,
restoring the University's Jeffersonian Grounds, and providing needy students with scholarships.

President Sullivan is a respected scholar in labor force demography. The author or coauthor of six books and many scholarly articles, her most recent research has focused on measuring productivity in higher education.

President Sullivan is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. She serves as Vice Chair of the Council of Presidents for the Association of Governing Boards of Universities and Colleges, Co-Chair of the National Research Council's Committee on Improving Higher Education's Responsiveness to Regional STEM Workforce Needs, and as a member of the Advisory Board for the Northern Virginia Technology Council, the trade association of the technology industry in Northern Virginia. She is a member of the Higher Education Advisory Committee that provides guidance for implementation of the Virginia Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2011. In 2013, the Governor appointed her to the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Investment Authority.

President Sullivan came to UVA from the University of Michigan, where she was provost and executive vice president for academic affairs. Prior to her work at Michigan, Ms. Sullivan was executive vice chancellor for academic affairs for the University of Texas System, a position she held from 2002 until May 2006. She served as faculty member at the University of Texas at Austin from 1981 to 2006.

She is a graduate of Michigan State University's James Madison College, and earned her doctoral degree in sociology from the University of Chicago. She is married to Douglas Laycock, the Robert E. Scott Distinguished Professor of Law at UVA. They have two adult sons.

President Sullivan is a passionate fan of UVA athletics, and regularly attends sports events on and off Grounds.

## CRAIG LITTLEPAGE

 Director of AthleticsCommitted to preserving and building on UVA's longstanding tradition of academic and athletic excellence, Craig Littlepage is in his 15th year as Virginias Athletics Director. Littlepage's appointment as athletics director was announced in August of 2001.
Littlepage served as Virginia's interim athletics director from June 1, 2001, until his permanent appointment to the position. He had also served as the University's interim athletics director from December of 1994 until July of 1995.

The first African-American athletics director in Atlantic Coast Conference history, Littlepage was named the Black Coaches Association's "Athletics Administrator of the Year" in 2003 and 2006. He was also listed on Sports Illustrated's list of the 101 most influential minorities in sports in 2003 and 2004. In March 2005, Littlepage was named one of Black Enterprise magazine's "Most Powerful AfricanAmericans in Sports."

Littlepage has been a member of UVA's athletics administration since 1990 when he was appointed an assistant athletics director, a position he held from 1990-1991. He then spent four years as the associate director of athletics for programs and six years (1995-2001) as senior associate director of athletics, managing all aspects of the athletics department's day-to-day operations.

Littlepage leads a comprehensive 25 -sport athletics program that routinely competes for championships and national rankings in many sports. At the same time, Cavalier student-athletes who exhaust their eligibility at Virginia graduate at a rate comparable to the student body as a whole. Annually, UVA student-athletes rank among the top Division I-A public universities in the country in graduation rates.

He has outlined a number of ambitious 10 -year goals for the department to achieve by 2022: graduate 100 percent of its student-athletes; win 12 national championships and 70 conference titles; fully endow all scholarships and provide the operational support required to meet all other stated goals; build and
maintain high-quality facilities; annually recruit the best student-athletes in the country (based on how coaches rate their top prospects); and fully comply with Title IX.

Such goals reflect Littlepage's vision of "uncompromised excellence in intercollegiate athletics" as well as the department's overall mission to "enhance and support the intellectual purpose of the University and its exemplary academic standards and traditions."

Virginia captured NCAA championships in men's soccer, men's tennis and its first-ever title in baseball capped another successful athletics season in which teams or individuals from 20 of the Cavaliers' 25 intercollegiate athletics programs advanced to NCAA postseason competition in 2014-15. UVA secured its second straight top-10 finish in the Directors' Cup standings. The Cavaliers established an ACC record with NCAA championships in three men's sports in one season and placed in the top 20 in the Directors Cup standings for the ninth consecutive year.

In addition to its three NCAA championships, the women's soccer team placed second nationally and the women's swimming and diving and rowing programs each finished fifth. Womens cross country finished 15th nationally and womens tennis advanced to the NCAA Round of 16.

UVA captured six Atlantic Coast Conference championships and its 69 conference titles since the spring of 2002 are the most of any ACC school during that time. In 2014-15, UVA won ACC championships in women's golf (first ever), rowing (sixth consecutive and 15th in 16 years), men's tennis (ninth consecutive and 11th in the last 12 years), women's tennis (second consecutive), women's swimming and diving (eighth consecutive) and wrestling (first since 2010).

Great progress has also been made in the area of athletics facility improvements during Littlepage's watch, including the additions of the George Welsh Indoor Practice Facility (2013) and John Paul Jones Arena (2006).
Littlepage has held many leadership roles within the NCAA, ACC, the University-at-large and professional organizations. He is currently serving as chair of the John McLendon

Foundation Steering Committee and served on the Executive Committee of the National Association of Collegiate Athletics Directors (NACDA) from 2006-10.

In February 2002, he was appointed to the 10 -member Division I Men's Basketball Committee by the NCAA Championship/Competition Cabinet and served a five-year term which was completed Aug. 31, 2007. In 2005-06, Littlepage served as the chair of the Men's Division I Basketball Committee and administered its selection process.

Littlepage previously was a member of the NCAA Division I Infractions Committee and the NCAA Academics, Eligibility and Compliance Cabinet, serving on the Recruiting and StudentAthlete Reinstatement Subcommittees. He chaired the Reinstatement Subcommittee in 1999-2000. He also served the NCAA on committees that studied sports wagering, postgame crowd control, basketball issues, and the College Basketball Partnership. He has participated as a presenter and mentor to the NCAA's Ethnic Minority Male Institute and the Black Coaches and Administrator Association.

Littlepage has chaired the ACC Women's Basketball Committee, ACC Committee on Awards, ACC StudentAthlete Welfare Committee, the ACC Men's and Women's Swimming/Diving Committees and the ACC Mens Soccer Committee.

Littlepage has participated in NCAA leadership development programs designed to help aspiring athletics administrators and head coach candidates in football and basketball.
He is a member of the Associate Faculty for the University's Center for Alcohol and Substance Education, and participates in various alcohol and drug prevention/education conferences. Littlepage also has been active in the local community, having served on the Board of Directors for the Charlottesville Ronald McDonald House and serving as a Trustee with the Mount Zion Baptist Church and the St. Anne's-Belfield School.

Before beginning his career in athletics administration, Littlepage served two stints as an assistant coach with the Cavalier men's basketball program, from 1976-82 and from 1988-90.

Littlepage held head coaching positions at Pennsylvania (1982-85) and at Rutgers (1985-88) before returning to Virginia. While he was at Penn, the Quakers won the Ivy League championship and participated in the 1985 NCAA Tournament. Littlepage was an assistant basketball coach at Villanova for two years and at Yale for one year before joining the UVA basketball program as an assistant coach in 1976.

The LaMott, Pa., native earned his bachelor's degree in economics from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania in 1973. He was a member of three Ivy League basketball championship teams at Penn and was instrumental in the Quakers' drive to three consecutive NCAA Eastern Regional playoff appearances.

Littlepage was inducted into the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 2014.

Littlepage and his wife Margaret have three children, two daughters Erica (29) and Erin (24), and a son Murray (26).


## JON OLIVER

## Executive Associate Athletics Director

Jon Oliver is in his 15th year at Virginia. His primary responsibility is oversight of the day-to-day operations of the athletics department.

Oliver is the administrative liaison for football, men's basketball and men's tennis and he has senior staff administrative oversight responsibilities for Academic Affairs, Equipment Room Operations, Human Resources, Facilities and Game Operations, Lifeskills, Marketing and Promotions, Sports Medicine, Sports Nutrition, Sports Psychology, Strength and Conditioning and Video Services. Oliver also serves as the Department's representative on all major facility projects.

In July 2015, ACC Commissioner John Swofford appointed Oliver to a three-year term on the Atlantic Coast Conference's Finance Committee that will end in June 2018.

Before coming to UVA, Oliver spent the previous six years involved in various aspects of athletic administration at Washington State University. Oliver ended his tenure at WSU as the associate athletics director for external affairs and prior to that served as the associate athletics director for finance and facilities development, the assistant athletics director for business and compliance and the director of compliance.

Oliver earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Boise State in 1994 and his law degree from the Idaho School of Law in 1997.

Oliver is a former member of the University of Idaho Law School Advisory Board and served on the NCAA's Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee.

He and his wife, November, have a son, Dante, and two daughters, Ariana and Mia.


JANE MILLER
Senior Associate Athletics Director for Programs/Senior Woman Administrator
A 32-year veteran of the Virginia athletics department, Jane Miller has served as the senior associate director of athletics for programs since 2001. Previously, Miller was the associate athletics director for programs/senior women's administrator.

In December 2014 Miller was the first Senior Women's Administrator appointed to the NCAA Division I Board of Directors where she will participate in the overall governance of NCAA Division I Athletics. Miller also serves on the University Women's Leadership Council, Calendar Committee, Admissions Committee and Judicial Review Board. She is a member of the ACC Women's Lacrosse, Women's Basketball, Baseball, Men's Lacrosse and Equity Committees. Miller was appointed Deputy Title IX Coordinator for the University in 2013.

Miller was elected Chair of the NCAA Division I Championship/ Sports Management Cabinet in 2011 serving until January 2014 and served as Chair of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame Committee (women's division) from 20102012. Miller was a member of the NACWAA Board of Directors from 2009-13.

Head coach of the UVA women's lacrosse team for 12 seasons, Miller resigned her coaching duties in 1995 for a full-time administrative role. She retired as the winningest coach in UVA women's lacrosse history, compiling a record of 145-44, including two national championships and six Final Four appearances. She was elected to the Virginia chapter of the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1996, the New England chapter of the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2000 , the U.S. Lacrosse National Hall of Fame and Oliver Ames High School Hall of Fame in 2003 and the Eastern Mass Chapter of the US Hall of Fame in July 2015.

A native of Easton, Mass., Miller graduated from Northeastern University in 1973 and was elected to her alma mater's Hall of Fame in 1983. She was a three-sport standout at Northeastern in basketball, field hockey and lacrosse.
Miller was reappointed to the Board of Directors for the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators in 2014 and is a member of the National Association ofCollegiateDirectors of Athletics. In May 1999, she received the Woman of Achievement Award from the UVA Women's Faculty and Professional Association and in 2009 she received the President's Award for Exemplary Service to the ACC. In 2013, she received the Claudia Dodson Equity Award from the WINs organization. In September of 2014 Miller received the Elizabeth Zintl Award presented by the University of Virginia Women's Center.


## ERIC BAUMGARTNER Associate Athletics Director for Compliance

Eric Baumgartner joined the Virginia athletics staff in October of 2011 as the associate athletics director for compliance. He previously held the same position at the University of Georgia.

Baumgartner was the assistant athletics director for compliance at Georgia from October of 2005 to 2010 before being promoted to associate athletics director. While serving at Georgia he developed, administered and monitored compliance systems for the institution's 21 intercollegiate athletics programs. He was responsible for rules education programs for coaches, administrators, student-athletes, alumni and other university personnel.

Prior to working at Georgia, Baumgartner was an assistant director of membership services at the NCAA. His duties included helping schools interpret NCAA legislation, conducting on-campus compliance reviews and serving as the lead for NCAA athletic certification publications.

Baumgartner was the assistant athletic director for compliance at Clemson from June of 2000 through August of 2003. He developed, administered and monitored Clemson ${ }^{1}$ s compliance systems to maintain institutional control for the school's athletics program. He also served as the assistant athletic director for compliance at Jacksonville University from August of 1997 until June 2000.

Baumgartner earned his master's degree in sports administration from Georgia State in 1997. He earned his undergraduate degree from Virginia Tech in exercise science in 1995. He is a native of Blacksburg, Va.


## TODD GOODALE <br> Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs

Todd Goodale was named senior associate director of athletics for external affairs in August of 2015. In that role, he oversees the marketing and promotions, media relations, strategic ticketing, ticketing, and video services departments. Previously, Goodale was the associate director for external affairs from 2013-15.

He also serves as the University's licensing director.

Goodale was the associate athletics director for marketing and video services starting in July of 2006. He was named UVA's director of video services in July of 2004.

He received the Bus Male Service Award in 2005 and was named the department's employee of the year in 2010.

Goodale was the creative director for Cavalier Sports Marketing from 1998-2004. Prior to that, he was a member of the Virginia Sports Marketing staff, serving as producer of the football and basketball coaches television shows and as an account executive.

He is a 1994 graduate of Virginia. Following his graduation, he was a sports reporter and anchor for WVIR-TV in Charlottesville.

Goodale serves on the board of ParadeRest, a Charlottesville-based non-profit organization that serves military members and military families in Virginia.


## ADRIEN HARRAWAY <br> Associate Athletics Director for Student Services

In January of 2012 Adrien Harraway was named associate athletics director for academic affairs. He had previously served as the assistant athletics director for academic affairs for football at Virginia since November of 2010. Prior to that he was the director of academic affairs for football since June of 2007 and also served as an assistant director/academic coordinator of academic affairs for football since coming to Virginia in the summer of 2005 .

Harraway is responsible for oversight and long-range planning in the academic affairs area, hiring and training staff, evaluating the program and designing its content, developing and implementing policy, and developing and managing the budget.

Harraway came to Virginia after earning a master's degree in higher education administration from Arizona State in 2005. While at Arizona State, he worked as a graduate assistant in the area of academic support with the football program from 2003-05.

He was an administrative intern for the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics from 2002-03. In that role he served as an assistant liaison for the International Collegiate Licensing Association, the National Association of Athletics Development Officers and the Division I-AA Athletics Directors Association.

Harraway earned his undergraduate degree in business administration from Northern Iowa in 2002. He played football at Northern Iowa and lettered three years as a safety.


## DIRK KATSTRA

Executive Director of the Virginia Athletics Foundation/Senior

## Associate Athletics Director

Dirk Katstra is in his 20th year as executive director of the Virginia Athletics Foundation. In July of 2013 he was named senior associate athletics director and took on the role as the sport administrator for men's and women's swimming and diving.

In June 2004, Katstra was named Fundraiser of the Year by the National Association of Athletic Development Directors (NAADD) in recognition of his outstanding leadership and success in fundraising on behalf of Virginia athletics. In June 2012, he was named to the executive committee of NAADD and now serves as the Third Vice President/Treasurer.

The Virginia Athletics Foundation is responsible for all fundraising efforts for Virginia athletics, including the current "All In For Excellence" initiative, which calls for $\$ 22.5$ million to be raised annually beginning in 2015. This effort includes a $\$ 17.5$ million annual fund for scholarships, summer school, academic affairs and operational costs; $\$ 4$ million in endowment contributions to add to a $\$ 70$ million scholarship endowment; and $\$ 1$ million in Coaches 10 projects for additional operational budget support. In addition, the Foundation is responsible for raising funds to support any new or renovated facility projects that are developed.

Katstra previously served the athletics department as the associate director for external affairs, overseeing the long-range planning and daily operations for media relations, sports publications, and the ticket office. From 1992 to 1996, Katstra served as director of annual giving for the Foundation.

A native of Stilwell, Kan., Katstra is a 1991 graduate of UVA with a degree in sport management. A member of the Cavalier basketball
team from 1987 to 1991, Katstra played on three NCAA Tournament teams and was a senior captain on the 1990-91 squad.

Before joining the Virginia Athletics Foundation staff in 1992, Katstra served an internship with the athletics department's promotions and marketing office, and had administrative responsibilities with the men's basketball program.
Katstra is married to the former Michelle Massie of Charlottesville. The couple has two sons, Austin and Ryan, and daughter, Ryleigh. Katstra's father, the late Richard Katstra, lettered as a member of the UVA basketball team in 1963 and 1964.


STEVE PRITZKER
Senior Associate Athletics
Director for Business
Operations
Steve Pritzker is in his first year as the senior associate athletics director for business operations and the chief financial officer (CFO) for the University of Virginia athletics department. Previously, Pritzker was the associate athletics director for business operatoins from 201315.

In addition to supervising the business operations staff and the manager of information systems, Pritzker serves as the financial adviser to the athletics department staff and coordinates the implementation and management of the department's operating budget. He serves as the department's primary liaison to the University's audit, budget, financial administration and procurement offices.

Pritzker returned to Virginia in 2013 after serving as the head rowing coach at Iowa. He spent the previous nine years as a member of Virginia's coaching staff, from 2004 to 2012. After volunteering with the rowing team during the 2004 season, while earning his master's degree in business administration, Pritzker assumed full-time coaching responsibilities in the fall of 2004. In 2007 he was promoted to associate head coach. While at Virginia,

Pritzker helped guide the Cavaliers to NCAA team championships in 2010 and 2012, along with runnerup finishes in 2005 and 2007. He also coached the Varsity 4 to four individual National Championships, as well as three National runner-up finishes. Virginia won eight ACC titles in his nine seasons.

While working with the Cavaliers' rowing program, Pritzker supported the Athletic Department on finance and budgeting matters, including forecasting and achieving financial efficiencies. He worked directly with different units within the athletics department on budget management. He also developed risk analyses for long-term budget planning.

Pritzker's business background includes a two-year stint with Credit Suisse First Boston in New York City as a research sales analyst where he conducted research and financial analysis for major institutional clients. He also worked for two years for Kingdon Capital Management as an associate, developing valuation models to evaluate investments and advising portfolio managers.

A native of Alexandria, Va., Pritzker graduated from Yale and received his master's degree from UVA's Darden Graduate School of Business in 2005. He was selected as a Schwartz Research Fellow at Yale, while earning four varsity letters as a coxswain on the rowing team.
While a graduate student, Pritzker was selected as a resident for the Range in the historical Academical Village at UVA on the basis of his academic achievement and service to the University.


## VALERIE RICHARDSON

Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sports Programs

Valerie Richardson is in her first year as a senior associate athletics director for sports programs. Previously, Richardson was the associate athletics director for sports programs for seven years. She is in her eighth year as a member of the athletics department's senior staff.

Richardson's primary area of responsibility is the supervision of multiple sports programs and their head coaches. She participates on various ACC, UVA and departmental committees and has responsibilities in long-range planning and scheduling, policy and procedure development and implementation, and budgeting. Richardson has served as both chair of the NCAA Honors Committee and as a member of the NCAA Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee.

Currently Richardson is a member of the NCAA Wrestling Committee, chair of the ACC Wrestling Committee and a member of the ACC Awards Committee. She has also completed the NCAA Pathway Program, a year-long leadership development program for senior level athletics administrators, and she has also participated in, the Division IA Athletics Directors' Institute and the NACDA Senior Administrators Mentoring Institute.

Richardson came to UVA from St. John's University in New York, where she was the Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs, directing all major fundraising events for the office of athletics development while assisting with annual giving efforts for several sports programs.

Prior to working at St. John's, Richardson was the Associate Athletics Director/Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University where she served as a member of the athletics department's executive management team and supervised eight sports programs. She worked in a similar capacity at the University of

California, Santa Barbara, where she supervised 10 sports programs, in addition to the compliance staff, in her role as Associate AD/SWA.

Richardson spent six years at the West Coast Conference prior to assuming the UCSB position, serving first as Director of Championships and Membership Services before being promoted to Assistant Commissioner/SWA. She has also worked as the Director of Marketing for MAAC Properties, as well as a media relations assistant at Washington State, and has served internships at Nike and at the NCAA.

A California native, Richardson graduated from Stanford University with a degree in psychology. She is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators.
