FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Virginia makes its first trip to the state of Texas since the 1995 season.
- While UVa has played 32 all-time games against current members of the Big 12 Conference, Saturday's game at TCU will only represent the third time the opponent is an active member of the Big 12 Conference at the time of the contest.
- Michael Rocco has completed 15-of-22 (68 percent) of his passes on third down and long situations for eight first downs and two TDs.
- Rocco was 6-of-6 for 97 yards and a TD in UVa's game-winning drive in the closing minutes of the Penn State game - a drive that represented Rocco's third career game-tying or winning drive in the closing minutes of a game.
- Darius Jennings has 13 catches on the season, five of which resulted in a first down while in a third down situation.

VIRGINIA MAKES FIRST TRIP TO THE LONE STAR STATE IN 17 YEARS

- Virginia heads to Fort Worth on Saturday for its third-ever appearance in the state of Texas and first since the 1995 season. The Cavaliers will clash with the TCU Horned Frogs, ranked No. 17 in the *Associated Press* and No. 16 in the *USA Today* coaches polls, Saturday inside Amon G. Carter Stadium. The game will be televised live on ESPN.
- UVa head coach Mike London is 3-3 all-time against teams ranked in the *Associated Press* poll and 1-2 when that game is played on the road. The lone win came last season at then-No. 23 Florida State (14-13), a victory that made UVa the first team in college football history to have road wins at Miami (Fla.) and FSU in the same season.
- The last time UVa played in Texas was Oct. 21, 1995 in Austin when facing the Texas Longhorns. Current UVa safeties coach and special teams coordinator Anthony Poindexter was a freshman on that 1995 UVa team and had six tackles, while UVa head coach Mike London's younger brother, Paul, had nine tackles for the UVa defense in the last trip to the state of Texas. That 1995 Virginia football team had 30 players on its roster that later went on to play in the NFL, including Ronde and Tiki Barber, James Farrior, Jamie Sharper and of course Poindexter.
- UVa's only other contest in the state of Texas was a 1977 meeting in Austin with the Longhorns.

SERIES VS. TCU, BIG 12

- The series is tied, 1-1, between the Horned Frogs and Virginia. The Cavaliers won the first meeting of the series in the 1994 Independence Bowl, 20-10. TCU won the second meeting, 30-14, during the Horned Frogs first trip ever to the Commonwealth of Virginia in 2009.
- Saturday will be the third meeting between UVa and TCU and the third different conference the Horned Frogs have been affiliated with at the time of the contest. In 1994 TCU was co-champions of the Southwest Conference, while in 2009 the Horned Frogs were champions of the Mountain West Conference and made a BCS appearance in the Fiesta Bowl.
- UVa is 16-15-1 all-time against current members of the Big 12 Conference, however 12 wins, 10 losses and the tie all came against West Virginia prior to the Mountaineers' matriculation into the league. The records against other current members of the Big 12 are as follows: Kansas (2-0), Oklahoma (0-1), Texas (1-2), Texas Tech (0-1).
- In fact, UVa is only 1-1 when the opponent is an active member of the Big 12 at the time of the game.
- The win was at Scott Stadium versus Texas, 37-13, during the first season of Big 12 football in 1996. The lone loss came at the hands of Texas Tech (31-28) during the high-octane 2007 Gator Bowl.
- Saturday marks the first contest for UVa head coach Mike London against a Big 12 Conference opponent.

VIRGINIA HISTORY AGAINST THE BIG 12 PRECURSOR: BIG EIGHT AND SOUTHWEST CONFERENCES

- Looking back into the history of the Big 12 - UVa has a small history versus the league's predecessors, the Big Eight and Southwest Conferences. UVa went 2-2 when facing a Big Eight Conference team (2-0 vs Kansas, 0-1 vs Missouri and 0-1 vs Oklahoma). UVa also was 0-2 when facing Texas as a member of the Southwest Conference, while the only win UVa has against TCU also serves as the Cavaliers' lone win when playing a Southwest Conference school.

TEXAS CONNECTIONS ON UVA ROSTER

- Two student-athletes on the UVa roster came to Charlottesville via Texas.
- Freshman CB Kelvin Rainey is from Houston and attended the same high school (Stratford) as Indianapolis Colts QB Andrew Luck. Rainey's older brother, Derrick, currently plays at Arizona.
- Sophomore FB Zachary Swanson is from Katy, which is located roughly 30 miles west of Houston.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

On each Monday during the football season, the UVa Athletics Media Relations office will conduct the weekly football press conference, attended by head coach Mike London and selected student-athletes. London will field questions beginning at 3 p.m. and student-athletes will begin interviews at 3:30 p.m. Snacks will be served.

Quotes from the Monday press conference will be posted on VirginiaSports.com Monday afternoon.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available each Monday, depending on class schedules. This is the best opportunity to interview players. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVa Athletics Media Relations office by Noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful

LAST MEETING: 2009 (TCU 30, UVA 14)

- TCU made its first trip to the Commonwealth of Virginia (Sept. 12, 2009) and left with a 30-14 triumph that set the Horned Frogs on their way to the school's first BCS Bowl bid, the 2010 Fiesta Bowl.
- TCU, ranked No. 16 at the time in the *Associated Press* poll, scored the first 30 points of the game and Andy Dalton threw for 177 yards and one TD as the Horned Frogs' defense limited UVA to 177 yards of total offense.
- Seven current Cavaliers played in the 2009 game, including WR Tim Smith and LB Steve Greer making starts. The start was the first career start for Smith and for Greer it was his first start against FBS opponent, after starting the season-opening game in 2009 versus William & Mary. Smith collected his first career touchdown, a 26-yard catch from Jameel Sewell.
- Greer was third on the team with eight tackles against the Horned Frogs.
- Perry Jones made his collegiate debut against TCU, returning two kickoff returns in the fourth quarter, including a 25-yard return.
- Ausar Walcott made one tackle on special teams. Will Hill, Matt Mihalik and Colter Phillips also played in game against TCU.

UVA STRUGGLES AT GEORGIA TECH

- The 56 points UVA surrendered served as the most points by an opponent since Illinois put up 63 points in the 1999 Micronpc.com Bowl.
- UVA gave up 594 yards of total offense, the most the Cavaliers have allowed since giving up 627 yards to Georgia Tech in a Bobby Dodd Stadium visit in 2000.
- With 297 yards of total offense, UVA failed to reach 300 yards of total offense for the second-straight game. The last time UVA failed to reach 300 yards of total offense in consecutive games was in the 2009 season when the year ended with the last seven games not reaching 300 yards of total offense.
- UVA gave up 276 rushing yards in the first half, which is more than any opponent had in a game against the Cavaliers in all of 2011 - topping Auburn's 273 in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.
- The Yellow Jackets finished with 461 rushing yards, the most UVA has given up since its 2010 trip to Bobby Dodd Stadium when Georgia Tech rushed for 477 yards.
- Coming into the game UVA had given up only eight plays of 20 yards or more; against Georgia Tech they gave up eight.
- UVA failed to rush for a TD for the second-consecutive game, marking the first time since the 2011 NC State/Miami games where the Cavaliers didn't rush for a score in back-to-back games. It is only the third time in the Mike London era where the Cavaliers went back-to-back games not rushing for a TD (2010 - VMI & Florida State).

RUSHING GAME DROUGHT

- UVA has rushed for 314 yards and four TDs and is rushing for 3.3 yards per carry.
- Compare that to UVA three games into the 2011 season when the Cavaliers had rushed for 572 yards and eight TDs and posted 4.7 yards per carry.
- UVA rushed 26 more times in 2011 when compared to 2012 after three games.

UVA RUSHING GAME LOOKS TO GET GOING

- The Virginia rushing attack is down thus far in 2012, averaging 104.7 yards per game - which ranks No. 107 nationally and No. 8 in the ACC.
- Those numbers are a stark difference to 2011 when UVA averaged 165.3 rushing yards per game. That number was the second-highest amount put up by the Cavaliers in the past 12 seasons. During that time only the 2004 team (242.8) had a higher rushing average than the 2011 squad.

PENN STATE WIN GARNERS COMPARISONS

- The Virginia win over Penn State had some comparisons with notable Cavalier victories last season.
- The win, which pushed Mike London's career record versus the Big Ten to 2-0, was similar to his first win over the conference at Indiana last season.
- Playing Penn State on the same weekend they played Indiana a year ago - each game's outcome was determined on the game's final play. In 2011 at IU, it was a 23-yard field goal made by UVA's Robert Randolph as time expired. In the Penn State game it was the 42-yard missed field goal by Sam Ficken.
- The miss by Penn State's Ficken was from the same distance (42-yards) that Florida State's Dustin Hopkins miss was that sealed the 2011 win for the Cavaliers, making UVA the first team in college football history to win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season.
- Both kicks sailed wide left.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY

- For the third season in a row, the UVA coaching staff under head coach Mike London has remained intact.
- UVA is one of 16 schools in the nation entering 2012 with the same nine assistants that started the 2011 season.
- Florida State, Miami and Virginia Tech join UVA among ACC schools on the list of 16.
- BYU, Colorado, Georgia, Louisiana Tech, UL-Lafayette, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Mississippi State, Northwestern, Oregon, San Diego State and Texas also made the list.
- Virginia joins Florida State and Louisiana Tech as schools that have staffs that have remained intact for two years in a row, while the only school on the list of 16 with a longer tenure is Oregon (three years).

FOURTEEN RETURNING STARTERS

- The 2012 roster features 14 returning starters (seven on offense and five on defense).
- Virginia has had at least 10 returning starters every year since 1998.
- Overall, UVA welcomes 42 lettermen back.

LONDON IMPROVES TO 5-0 IN SEASON OPENERS

- In his career as a head coach, Mike London has won all five of his season openers: 2008 at Elon and 2009 at Duke while at Richmond, and 2010 vs. Richmond, 2011 vs. William & Mary and 2012 vs. Richmond while at Virginia.
- With the Cavaliers' 43-19 win over Richmond in the season opener, Mike London became the second UVA coach to ever win the first three season openers of his tenure on Grounds - matching Rice Warren (1913, 1920-21).

CITY OF LYNCHBURG TURNS OUT FBS QBs

- UVA's Michael Rocco hails from Lynchburg, Va., as does Virginia Tech's starting QB Logan Thomas.
- Rocco played for his father Frank at Liberty Christian Academy and Thomas starred at Brookville HS.
- No other city in the nation can boast two FBS starting QBs from Week 1 from a smaller populated city.
- Lynchburg has a population of 75,568.
- Of the 124 FBS schools, only Austin, Texas, Corona, Calif., Indianapolis, Ind., Pittsburgh, Pa., Tallahassee, Fla., Tampa, Fla., and Miami, Fla., can join Lynchburg, Va., with multiple native sons starting at QB to kickoff the 2012 season.
- Austin (pop. 812,025) has Garrett Gilbert (SMU) and Tanner Price (Wake Forest).
- Corona (pop. 152,374/part of 2.2 million in Riverside County) has Matt Scott (Arizona) and Taylor Martinez (Nebraska).
- Indianapolis (pop. 829,718) has Tre Roberson (Indiana) and MarQueis Gray (Minnesota).
- Pittsburgh (pop. 2.4 million) has Tino Sunseri (Pitt) and Perry Hills (Maryland).
- Tallahassee (pop. 182,965) has Austin Dantin (Toledo) and B.J. Daniels (South Florida).
- Tampa (pop. 4.2 million) has Aaron Murray (Georgia) and Robert Marve (Purdue).
- Miami (pop. 2.5 million) has Geno Smith (West Virginia) Tedd Bridgewater (Louisville) and Stephen Morris (Miami).

FIVE CAPTAINS NAMED FOR 2012 TEAM

- Virginia will have five team captains this season.
- The captains: senior OT Oday Aboushi, senior ILB Steve Greer, senior DT Will Hill, senior TB Perry Jones and senior OLB LaRoy Reynolds.
- Perry Jones is the lone repeat captain from 2011 and becomes the first Cavalier to be named a captain multiple times since Nick Jenkins (2010-11).

THREE CAVALIERS COMPETING AS GRADUATE STUDENTS

- There are three Cavaliers that are graduate students at UVA this fall.
- (HLD) Jacob Hodges, (TE) Kyle McCartin and (WR) Brian Pomper all already hold their undergrad degree from UVA.
- Pomper was a two-year letterwinner on the UVA men's lacrosse team and part of the Cavaliers No. 1 recruiting class in 2008.

NOTING THE PENN STATE VICTORY

- UVa is now 3-5 all-time against Penn State and 2-2 in Charlottesville.
- Virginia lost its first turnover of the season on its first offensive play of the day.
- PSU's opening drive of 17 plays was the longest against UVa since Georgia Tech in 2011 (19 plays).
- In the four Penn State drives following UVa's four turnovers, the Cavalier defense allowed minus-14 yards, resulting in just three points.
- With UVa's win over Penn State (17-16) and Indiana (34-31) last season, it is only the fourth time an ACC team has defeated different Big Ten opponents in successive seasons - NC State (Indiana in '00 and Minnesota in '01), NC State (Iowa in '92 and Purdue in '93) and North Carolina (Michigan State in '64, Ohio State in '65 and Michigan in '66).
- It was only the fourth time in the Mike London era that UVa failed to reach 300 yards of total offense (295), but marked the first victory. The losses for UVa were: 2010 Virginia Tech (291), 2011 vs. Virginia Tech (241) and 2011 vs. NC State (249).
- With 32 rushing yards, UVa rushed for its fewest yards in a victory since rushing for two yards (20 carries) in a 27-22 victory at Duke on Oct. 5, 2002.
- Penn State's Sam Ficken missed four field goals against UVa, becoming the first opponent kicker to miss four field goals against the Cavaliers since Maryland's Bernardo Bramson went 1-for-5 in the 1964 meeting.
- UVa had four turnovers against Penn State. The last time UVa had four turnovers and won was in 2011 at Indiana.
- The last time UVa was minus four in the turnover battle and won the game was on Sept. 17, 1994 against Clemson. UVa had four INTs and lost three fumbles, while Clemson threw three INTs. UVa won the game 9-6 at Scott Stadium.

HILL, TERRELL NAMED SPRING'S MOST IMPROVED

- Prior to the team's annual spring game, head coach Mike London announced the recipients of the Rock Weir Awards representing the most improved players during spring drills.
- Senior DT Will Hill was the most improved player on defense, while sophomore WR Dominique Terrell was tabbed the offense's most improved player.

LONDON FACES THREE FORMER COLLEAGUES IN 2012

- UVa head coach Mike London will face three head coaches this season (Danny Rocco of Richmond, Tom O'Brien of NC State and Al Golden of Miami) with whom he formerly worked.

FIVE FORMER UVA ASSISTANTS NOW HEAD COACHES

- Five current ACC head coaches have previously been assistant coaches at Virginia. Boston College's Frank Spaziani, NC State's Tom O'Brien, Miami's Al Golden, Wake Forest's Jim Grobe (graduate assistant) and of course UVa's Mike London.

WINNING THE TIME OF POSSESSION BATTLE

- Sixteen times in Mike London's time as head coach Virginia won the time of possession battle.
- London-led teams at UVa are 10-6 when winning the possession battle.

- Pablo Alvarez (FS), Ross Burbank (C), David Dean (DT), Jeremy Dollin (TE), Ian Frye (KO), Jon Goss (OG), Nick Koutris (OT), Darius Lee (SS), Sammy MacFarlane (FB), John Pond (OG), Mason Thomas (S), Jay Whitmire (OT) and Alec Vozenilek (P) also all made collegiate debuts against Richmond.
- A total of 22 total first-time players made their debut against Richmond.

- Against Penn State Dominique Terrell (WR) and Conner Davis (OG) made their first career starts.
- Against Georgia Tech Jake McGee (TE) made his first career start.

CANADIANS ON UVA'S ROSTER

- UVa is tied for second behind Eastern Michigan for the most Canadian natives in the nation on its current roster.
- UVa has three (Trent Corney, Ryan Doull and Brent Urban).
- Buffalo, UConn, Iowa and Rice are tied for second with UVa.
- Boston College, Boise State, Northern Illinois, UNLV and Wyoming have two.
- There are 16 schools with at least one Canadian.
- Former UVa offensive guard Austin Pasztor hailed from Langton, Ontario and was a second team AP All-American last season and was part of the 2012 training camp with the Minnesota Vikings.

LONDON'S SECOND SEASON BY THE NUMBERS

- According to a study by Phil Steele's College Football Publications, UVa head coach Mike London in year two was ahead of the numbers of most second-year head coaches.
- According to research done on head coaches hired from 1990-2011, UVa's eight wins last season put Mike London 2.25 victories ahead of the average of 5.75 wins amongst all second-year coaches over the last 22 seasons.
- Since 1990 there have been 368 head coaches that have experienced a second season of their tenure, the combined record over that span is 2119-2268, good for a .483 winning percentage.
- In Year Two at UVa Mike London went 8-5, good for a .615 winning percentage.

LONDON SERVES AS VOTER ON USA TODAY COACHES' POLL

- For the third-consecutive season, Mike London will serve as a voter on the USA Today Coaches' Poll.
- Fifty-nine coaches from FBS institutions across the nation participate in the poll.

PARKS SCORES TOUCHDOWNS ON OPENING DAY

- Kevin Parks rushed for two TDs against Richmond in the season opener.
- Parks in two seasons has five career TDs in season-opening games after rushing for 3 vs. William & Mary a year ago.

KEVIN PARKS SETS FRESHMAN TDs RECORD

- Kevin Parks had nine rushing touchdowns in 2011, setting a Virginia school record for rushing touchdowns in a season by a freshman. The previous high was seven by Howard Petty (1983) and Marcus Wilson (1987).

PERRY JONES PUT UP IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS

- Jones had 915 rushing yards in 2011, which was the most by a Cavalier since Alvin Pearman (1,037) in 2004.
- Jones had 1,468 all-purpose yards last season. That number is UVa's best since Alvin Pearman led the ACC in 2004 with 1,938.

PERRY JONES STANDS ALONE IN THE BCS

- Jones was one of only two players (only BCS player) in the nation last season to rush for at least 900 yards and notch at least 500 yards receiving, joining him was New Mexico State's Kenny Turner (1074 rush, 514 rec).

PERRY JONES CLIMBS TWO UVA ALL-TIME LISTS

- Jones finished the 2010 season with 31 receptions for 224 yards. In 2011 he had 48 catches for 506 yards.
- Jones set a career high with nine catches at FSU in 2011.
- His 78-yard reception at Miami (Oct. 27, 2011) was the longest of his career and the longest for the Cavaliers in 2011.

JONES ONE OF FEW RBs IN THE NATION

- With 87 career receptions, Perry Jones is No. 3 in the nation among active running backs in career catches and No. 2 among BCS running backs.
- Jones leads all active ACC running backs with his 87 career catches, with NC State's James Washington (77) the closest of all league backs.

... AND JONES AS A PASSER

- Jones' 37-yard TD pass at Miami (Oct. 27, 2011) to Tim Smith was the first pass attempt, completion and TD toss of his career. The duo also had the same Jones to Smith hookup when they were teammates at Oscar Smith HS.
- It was the first scoring "option play" for UVa since Vic Hall's 5-yard pass to Joe Torchia at Clemson in 2009.
- Jones becomes the first Cavalier since Vic Hall in 2009 to rush for a TD, pass for a TD and catch a reception for a TD in the same season.

UVA PASSING GAME GETS VERTICAL IN 2012

- UVa is creating more dynamic plays in the vertical passing game in 2012 with the wide receivers and tight ends compared to the 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- So far in 2012, UVa has 11 pass plays that have gone to wide receivers or tight ends for 20 yards or more – an average of 3.67 per game.
- Compare that number to 2011 when the entire season saw 35 passes of 20 yards or more to wide receivers or tight ends for a rate of 2.69 per game.
- The 2010 season resulted in 38 total receptions by wide receivers or tight ends of 20 yards or more for an average of 3.17 per game.

ROCCO EFFICIENT ON 3RD AND 4TH DOWN

- Michael Rocco, as the starting quarterback, has completed 61.7 percent (84-of-136) of his third down passes during the 2011 and 2012 seasons.
- Rocco is also completing 61.5 percent (59-of-96) of his third down and long opportunities through his 16 career starts.
- His third down numbers are relatively consistent to his overall passing percentage of 61.4 percent (283-of-461) through 16 career starts.
- Rocco is also 60.0 percent (3-of-5) on fourth down passes.
- Third down and long represents any situation of seven yards or longer needed to reach a first down.

ROCCO'S PASSING GAME ELEVATES

- Since the Oct. 27, 2011 game at Miami, Michael Rocco has led UVa to a 6-3 record, completing 62.4 percent (174-of-279) of his passes for 2,197 yards and 13 touchdowns to seven interceptions.
- Rocco's career completion percentage of 60.9 percent (296-of-486) ranks No. 3 all-time at UVa for a career, trailing Matt Schaub (67.0 percent) and Marques Hagans (62.3 percent).

ROCCO GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLUTCH

- Michael Rocco was pinpoint on UVa's final offensive drive against Penn State, throwing what proved to be the game-winning TD pass in the process.
- Rocco was 6-of-6 passing for 97 yards and had the one TD pass to Jake McGee during the drive against PSU. He was 4-of-4 on the drive when in a third down situation.
- The Penn State game was the third time in Rocco's career he has marched down the field in the closing minutes to tie a game or win it.
- The other games: **at Indiana** (Sept. 10, 2011) when Rocco orchestrated a 15-play, 77-yard drive that tied the contest with 1:36 left in the game after Rocco found Paul Freedman on the two-point conversion.
- **At Florida State** (Nov. 19, 2011) when Rocco started the game-winning drive with 1:53 left on the clock and he marched the Cavaliers down the field on a five-play, 75-yard five in 47 seconds, culminating with a Kevin Parks TD run.

TIGHT ENDS CONTINUE TO PRODUCE

- Virginia has been strong at tight end over the last decade, and that continues with Colter Phillips, Paul Freedman, Jeremiah Mathis and Jake McGee back for 2012 (Mathis moved to tight end during the 2010 season).
- Phillips, Freedman and Mathis combined for 36 receptions for 264 yards and five TDs in 2010 and 20 receptions for 152 yards and two TDs in 2011.
- Jake McGee turns the trio into a quartet in 2012 with his first collegiate receptions.
- UVa TEs have caught 545 passes for 5,906 yards and 74 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span.

JENNINGS SCORES TDS ON BIG PLAYS

- UVa WR Darius Jennings has two career TDs, but when he scores six points for the Cavaliers it comes in a big way.
- Jennings averages 52.0 yards per career TD, scoring on a 53-yarder at Miami in 2011 and a 51-yarder against Richmond on Sept. 1.

ROCCO FINDS 11 DIFFERENT RECEIVERS VS UR

- Michael Rocco completed 25 passes to 11 different receivers during UVa's win over Richmond.
- That number represents the most Cavalier receivers to collect a catch in a game since the 2010 meeting with Florida State at Scott Stadium when 11 different receivers in that game also caught a pass.

JAKE MCGEE NOTCHES CAREER DAY VS PENN ST.

- Jake McGee had a career day against Penn State catching four passes for 99 yards, both career highs. McGee's six-yard TD reception put UVa up for good with 1:28 left. The TD was the first of McGee's career.
- McGee was clutch against the Nittany Lions. Here is a break down of his four catches, all resulting in points or a first down:
 - first catch for 26 yards was in a 2nd and 15 situation (third quarter)
 - second catch for 23 yards was in a 3rd and 20 situation (third quarter)
 - third catch for 44 yards was in a 3rd and 16 situation (fourth quarter)
 - fourth catch for six yards was for a TD on a 3rd and goal from the six (fourth quarter).

THE MCGEE AND ROCCO CONNECTION

- UVa QB Michael Rocco and TE Jake McGee have a connection that goes back before both enrolled at UVa back in 2010, both as QBs.
- McGee led his high school, Collegiate School in Richmond to the 2008 & 2009 VIS Division I state titles, defeating Michael Rocco's Liberty Christian Academy squad in the state title game in 2009. McGee tallied seven TDs in the game, four passing and three rushing.
- McGee later got the best of Rocco in the boys' basketball state quarterfinal round.
- McGee asked the UVa coaching staff to move from QB to TE after two practices in fall camp of 2010.

A COUPLE COLLEGE FIRSTS

- The Georgia Tech game on Sept. 15 will stand in the memories of a few UVa Cavaliers as they collected collegiate firsts.
- Phillip Sims threw his first two collegiate TD passes.
- E.J. Scott and Zachary Swanson were each recipients of Sims' TD passes, recording their own first collegiate TDs.
- Freshman WRs Adrian Gamble and Canaan Severin each caught their first collegiate passes.

SPREADING THE RECEIVING WEALTH

- Virginia QBs have completed passes to 14 different receivers already in 2012.
- That number matches the number of different receivers that caught passes in all of 2012.
- The 2010 season saw UVa connect on passes to 19 different receivers, the most since the 1959 season when that squad also found 19 different receivers during the season.

JEREMIAH MATHIS CATCHES TDS

- UVa TE Jeremiah Mathis moved from defensive end to tight end after five games into the 2010 season.
- Mathis has 11 career catches, four of which are for TDs.
- By the numbers, 36.4 percent of Mathis' catches result in a touchdown. By comparison prolific UVa TE Heath Miller's had 13.8 percent of his career catches result in a TD.

BIG OFFENSIVE NUMBERS IN OPENER

- Michael Rocco's 311 passing yards against Richmond are the most ever by a UVa QB in a season opener.
- Rocco became the first UVa QB since Aaron Brooks in 1997 to pass for over 300 yards in season opener. Brooks had 305 in a loss to Auburn at Scott Stadium.
- With 545 yards of total offense against Richmond, UVa amassed the most yardage in a season opener since the 1990 Cavaliers trounced Kansas for 564 yards of total offense in Lawrence, Kan., ironically 22 years to the day of this year's Richmond game.

PRO STYLE OFFENSE PAYS DIVIDENDS

- UVa has amassed more than 400 yards of total offense in 13-of-28 games since offensive coordinator Bill Lazor brought his pro-style attack to Charlottesville. The Georgia Tech (297) and Penn State game this year (295 yards), the Oct. 22, 2011 game vs. NC State (249 yards) and UVa's 2011 (241 yards) and 2010 (291 yards) regular-season finales against Virginia Tech are the only games during the Mike London tenure where the Cavaliers failed to amass at least 300 yards of total offense.
- The Penn State game this year is the only time UVa has failed to reach 300 yards of total offense and won the game.
- Four times since 2005 UVa has amassed 500 yards of total offense. They did so against Richmond (545) in the season-opening win, at Maryland (527) in 2011, Duke (643) in 2010 and Indiana (536) in 2009.

TIM SMITH'S AVERAGE PER CATCH

- WR Tim Smith averaged 17.1 yards per catch in 2011 - an average that ranked first on the team and sixth in the ACC.
- In six games on the road or at a neutral site in 2011, Smith averaged 20.7 yards per catch.
- So far in 2012 Smith is averaging 15.4 yards per catch.
- For a career Smith is averaging 15.6 yards per catch.

ABOUSHI GRADING OUT HIGH

- Oday Aboushi has graded out high on the offensive line during the first two games.
- Aboushi graded out at 97 percent versus Richmond with seven knockdown blocks.
- Aboushi graded out at 94 percent versus Penn State with 12 knock down blocks.
- For his effort against Penn State, Aboushi was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week.

UVA HAS NO SENIORS IN SECONDARY

- UVa has zero seniors in its secondary after having three senior starters a year ago.
- Only three other schools (Florida State, LSU and North Texas) in the nation also lack a senior in their secondary.

NO UPPERCLASSMEN AT CORNERBACK

- UVa has zero upperclassmen on its roster at the cornerback position.
- On UVa's roster there are four freshmen and two sophomores listed as cornerbacks.
- UVa is one of 13 schools in the nation that has zero upperclassmen at a specific position on its roster.
- North Texas lacks upperclassmen at cornerbacks and safeties.
- Boston College, Navy and North Texas join UVa at the cornerback position.
- Six of those schools (Auburn, Indiana, Marshall, Nevada, Oregon and Texas A&M) are at the QB position.
- Rounding out the list are Illinois (RBs), Idaho (TEs) and Tulsa (TEs).

NICHOLSON SENIOR STATESMAN AS SO. AT CB

- In 2011 Demetrius Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook did so in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.
- He started all 13 of the Cavaliers' 2011 contests and earned freshmen All-America honors from two different publications.
- Now Nicholson is the veteran in experience in a UVa secondary that features four sophomore starters: Harris (FS), Hoskey (CB) and Phelps (SS).

DYNAMIC DUO OF GREER AND REYNOLDS

- The last two seasons the linebacker duo of Steve Greer and LaRoy Reynolds has been solid, accumulating 347 tackles between the two since the start of the 2010 season. Below is a list that shows where they rank among the top active tackling duos in the ACC since the start of 2010:

WALCOTT MAKES FIRST START AT DE

- DE Ausar Walcott made his first career start at DE at Georgia Tech.
- Walcott's previous 18 career starts all came at OLB - he moved this past spring to DE.
- Walcott first came to UVa as a safety and didn't make the move to LB until 2010.
- Walcott also has had a different number for each position. He wore 30 as a safety, 26 as a linebacker and now 3 as a defensive end.

UVA DEFENSE ON POINT VS PENN STATE

- UVa was minus-four in turnover margin against Penn State, but in the four Penn State drives following UVa's four turnovers, the Cavalier defense allowed minus-14 yards, resulting in just three points.
- Penn State missed three field goals, while UVa turned the ball over all four times in Cavalier territory.
- Penn State's Sam Ficken missed four field goals against UVa, becoming the first opponent kicker to miss four field goals against the Cavaliers since Maryland's Bernardo Bramson went 1-for-5 in the 1964 meeting.

GREER CLIMBS UVA CAREER TACKLE LIST

- LB Steve Greer has 273 career stops in 38 career games, including 15 tackles (2 TFL) Sept. 8 against Penn State.
- Greer has eight career games with double digit numbers in tackles, four of which came in 2011. The other three games came as a redshirt freshman in 2009. Below is where Greer racks up all-time on UVa's career list for tackles:

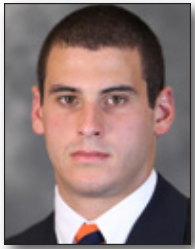

DID YOU KNOW?

- UVa QB Michael Rocco and WR Dominique Terrell share a unique bond as both from 2006-08 could be spotted at Liberty football games watching their older brothers play together for the Flames. Zach Terrell and Chris Rocco were teammates for three years together in Lynchburg where current UVa offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator.
- Ausar Walcott has a unique story behind the meaning of his name first name. His mother, Pamela Robinson, named him Ausar, which is a derivative of Osiris, the Egyptian god of the afterlife. Osiris is classically depicted with two large ostrich feathers at either side, ironic since Ausar has stated over his life people have told him it looks like he runs like an ostrich.
- 2012 marks the fifth season in a row that UVa has seven home games on the schedule.
- Cornerback Demetrius Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.
- Freshman Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.
- Cavalier TE Colter Phillips has two brothers who also played college football - Andrew was a former guard at Stanford and Paul is a sophomore tight end at Indiana.

- UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 102 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day.
- Freshman CB C.J. Moore is the nephew of Gail Devers, three-time Olympic champion in track & field.
- TB Perry Jones, WR Tim Smith and QB Phillip Sims were all members of Oscar Smith High School's Virginia Group AAA Division 6 State Championship in 2008.
- Senior walk-on WR Brian Pomper was a two-year letterwinner (2009-10) on the UVa men's lacrosse team, a member of its 2010 ACC championship squad and part of its 2008 No. 1 recruiting class.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 421 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 243-167-12.

Mike London's plans to build the Virginia football program made remarkable progress during his second season in 2011.

The Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the

ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVa being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. A total of five Cavalier players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Virginia's 2011 squad ranked No. 4 in the ACC in total offense at 399.8 yards per game and rose to No. 3 in total defense at 351.7 yards allowed per game. The Cavaliers were one of just two ACC teams to be ranked in the top four of both of those key statistical categories.

In the spring of 2012 DE Cam Johnson was selected by the San Francisco 49ers to mark the 29th consecutive season a UVa player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media. He did not just wait for constituents to come to Virginia, he actively took the Cavalier program to the public.

London embraced a groundbreaking 18-episode television production entitled "The Building of a Program" that gave an all-access look at UVa football. He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He quickly defined the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVa the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years and student-athletes were heavily involved in community service projects and outreach programs.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. His first edition of Virginia football produced a 4-8 record but achieved a number of milestones that showed positive progress.

The Cavalier offense ranked third in the ACC at 404.8 yards per game after finishing last in 2009 at 269.6 yards per game. Senior Marc Verica led the league's fourth-best passing attack, finishing with 2,799 yards in the air, marking the third-best season mark in UVa history. Wide receivers Dontrelle Inman and Kris Burd became the first UVa wide receiving duo to each total a minimum of 40 receptions in a season. They also recorded over 600 yards receiving, also a program first for a wide receiver tandem.

Keith Payne led a much-improved rushing attack that featured two of the ACC's most productive runners. Payne led

the ACC with 14 rushing touchdowns, 16 total touchdowns and an 8.7 points per game scoring average.

Honorable mention All-American Chase Minnifield anchored the UVa defense in 2010, earning first-team All-ACC honors. Minnifield's two interceptions helped spark the Cavaliers' upset of No. 22 Miami, giving UVa its first win over a ranked team since 2008. Minnifield finished the year No. 2 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation with six INTs.

Offensive lineman Morgan Moses earned freshman All-America honors by helping the Cavaliers go 13 consecutive quarters without allowing a quarterback sack.

Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVa staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVa to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texas. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew

Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

- Rocco has reached 200 yards passing in four straight games.
- Zachary Swanson finished with two catches for seven yards, his first two collegiate catches.
- Jake McGee caught two passes for 23 yards, his first two collegiate receptions.
- Darius Jennings' 51-yard TD catch is the second longest reception of his career. He had a 53-yard TD reception in '11 at Miami. Both of his TD receptions have gone for over 50 yards.
- Jennings set career highs with five receptions and 84 yards receiving.
- Drew Jarrett attempted his first career FG, and his 45-yard make ranks as the fifth-longest initial FG by a UVa kicker.
- Khalek Shepherd returned his first career punt and returned two for nine yards.
- Shepherd's 59-yard kick return to start the second half was the longest return of his career.
- E.J. Scott caught three balls for 54 yards, the first catches of his career.
- Kevin Parks had two TDs and now has five career TDs in UVa season openers.

- UVa is now 3-5 all-time against Penn State and 2-2 in Charlottesville.
- Four Penn State drives following UVa's four turnovers, the Cavalier defense allowed minus-14 yards, resulting in just three points.
- The Cavaliers were 4-4 on third downs during the game-winning drive.
- With UVa's win over Penn State (17-16) today and Indiana (34-31) last season, it is only the fourth time an ACC team has defeated different Big Ten opponents in successive seasons - NC State (Indiana in '00 and Minnesota in '01), NC State (Iowa in '92 and Purdue in '93) and North Carolina (Michigan State in '64, Ohio State in '65 and Michigan in '66).
- It was only the fourth time in the Mike London era that UVa failed to reach 300 yards of total offense (295), but marked the first victory. The losses for UVa were: 2010 Virginia Tech (291), 2011 vs. Virginia Tech (241) and 2011 vs. NC State (249).
- With 32 rushing yards, UVa rushed for its fewest yards in a victory since rushing for two yards (20 carries) in a 27-22 victory at Duke on Oct. 5, 2002.
- Penn State's Sam Ficken missed four field goals against UVa, becoming the first opponent kicker to miss four field goals against the Cavaliers since Maryland's Bernardo Bramson went 1-for-5 in the 1964 meeting.
- The last time UVa was minus four in the turnover battle and won the game was on Sept. 17, 1994 against Clemson. UVa had four INTs and lost three fumbles, while Clemson threw three INTs. UVa won the game 9-6.
- Michael Rocco was 6-of-6 passing for 97 yards and a touchdown on the game-winning drive.

- Khalek Shepherd's 72-yard kick off return was a career high and the longest by a Cavalier since Terrence Fells-Danzer returned a 70-yard kick for a TD versus Eastern Michigan in 2010.
- With 143 yards passing, Michael Rocco passed Scott Secules (3,388) for No. 11 all-time at UVa in career passing yards. Rocco now has 3,526.
- TE Jake McGee made his first career start.
- DE Ausar Walcott made his first career start at DE - previous 18 starts came at OLB.
- Adrian Gamble made his first collegiate catch in the fourth quarter.
- Phillip Sims collected the first two passing touchdowns of his career.
