QUICK HITS - WEEK 13

Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game Matchup: No. 2 Clemson will face No. 3 Miami in the 2017 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game on Saturday, Dec. 2, at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium. Miami (Coastal Division Champion) will be making its first appearance in the game, while Clemson is in the game for the third straight year and fifth time overall. The Tigers won the championship game in 2011, 2015 and 2016.

Sold Out Again: The 2017 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is sold out for fourth time in seven years at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium. The six previous ACC Football Championship Games in Charlotte averaged more than 69,000 fans per contest, including sellout crowds in 2010, 2011, and 2015. Over the last seven years, the ACC ranks second among all conferences in attendance at its football championship games.

Success For ACC Winner: The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game has gone on to play in the National Championship

Game or compete in the College Football Playoffs each of the previous four seasons.

Highest Ranking: With Clemson ranked No. 2 and Miami at No. 3, this is the first time two ACC teams have been ranked in the top four of the College Football Playoff Rankings. If those rankings hold for the ACC Championship Game, it would be a matchup of the two highest ranked teams in conference history.

Friday Matchups: Seeking a perfect regular season, Miami plays at Pitt at noon on Friday, Nov. 24. Later that evening, Virginia Tech heads to Charlottesville to face Virginia at 8 p.m.

ACC-SEC: Traditional rivalry games with the Southeastern Conference will be played on the final Saturday of the regular season when Georgia Tech plays host to Georgia, Louisville travels to Kentucky, Florida State plays at Florida and Clemson faces South Carolina in Columbia.



2017 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

IN THE RANKINGS

- Louisville QB Lamar Jackson leads the nation in total offense, averaging 414.5 yards per game, is second in points responsible for (242), and is 16th among all players in rushing (117.0). He is ahead of the ACC total offense record of 393.4 yards per game that he set last year. Jackson's average is more than 37 yards more per game than his next closest competitor, Oklahoma State's Mason Rudolph (377.4).

- Wake Forest QB John Wolford leads the ACC and ranks seventh in the nation with a 163.5 pass efficiency rating. Wolford has thrown 23 touchdown passes with just four interceptions.

- Syracuse senior WR Steve Ishmael is second in the nation in receptions per game (8.5), second in total receptions (94), fourth in total receiving yards (1,160), and sixth in receiving yards per game (105.5). Ishmael is one of three ACC players in the top 10 in receptions per game, including his teammate Ervin Phillips, who is sixth (7.4) and Virginia's Olamide Zaccheaus, who is ninth (6.9).

- Boston College's Michael Walker and North Carolina's Anthony Ratliff-Williams rank first and second in the nation in combined return yardage. Walker has 973 total return yards, including both punt (356) and kickoff (617) returns, while Ratliff-Williams has 836 yards, all on kickoff returns. Syracuse's Sean Riley is sixth and Pitt's Quadree Henderson is 13th.

- NC State senior DE Bradley Chubb ranks second in the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 2.2 per game. He is also seventh nationally in quarterback sacks, averaging 0.91 per game.

- Virginia's Joe Reed leads the ACC and ranks 10th nationally with a 28.6 kickoff return yards average. He returned three kickoffs for a total of 170 yards (56.7 avg.) against Georgia Tech including a 92-yarder for a TD. UNC's Anthony Ratliff-Williams is 13th, averaging 27.7 yards.

- Virginia senior S Quin Blanding leads all FBS players with 462 career tackles. That total places him 16th on the ACC career tackle list.

QUICK HITS

Wins Over .500 Teams: Led by Clemson with seven, the ACC leads all conferences in wins (41) vs. teams with a .500-or-better record. The next closest conference is the SEC with 36.

Eight Bowl Eligible: The ACC has eight bowl-eligible teams, including Miami (10-0), Clemson (10-1), Virginia Tech (8-3), NC State (7-4), Louisville (7-4), Wake Forest (7-4), Boston College (6-5) and Virginia (6-5). Georgia Tech and Duke need just one win to achieve postseason eligibility. Florida State, which faces Florida and ULM, needs to win both games to extend its 35-year consecutive bowl streak.

AP Top 25: Three ACC teams are ranked in this week's AP Top 25 with two others receiving votes. For the second consecutive week, Miami is No. 2 and Clemson is No. 4. Virginia Tech moved back into the rankings at No. 24, while NC State and Wake Forest both received votes.

ACC Leads All Conferences in Wins Against the CFP Top 25: ACC teams have posted more non-conference wins against teams ranked in the College Football Playoff Committee's Top 25 than any other conference. Four ACC teams have defeated teams currently ranked in the CFP Top 25. The four wins are one more than any other conference.

Miami at Pitt: Coastal Division foes Miami and Pitt meet for the 37th time in a series which began in Pittsburgh in 1950. Miami holds a 25-10-1 advantage and has won 18 of the last 20 meetings, including three of the last four games in ACC competition.

Virginia Tech at Virginia: The Hokies travel to Charlottesville seeking to maintain their 13-game winning streak in the series which began in Virginia Tech's first season in the ACC (2004). UVA's last win against Tech came in 2003 in Charlottesville. The two Coastal Division arch-rivals are meeting for the 99th time. The participating head coaches, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall and Virginia Tech's Justin Fuente, have met only once, a 52-10 win for the Hokies last year in Blacksburg. UVA QB Kurt Benkert is coming off a four-TD pass, 384-yard game against Miami, while the Hokies are sixth in scoring defense, allowing just 14.7 points per game.

Georgia Tech at Georgia: "Clean Old Fashioned Hate" reconvenes for the 112th time when Georgia Tech hosts arch-rival Georgia at Bobby Dodd Stadium. Tech has defeated Georgia four times in this century, including a 28-27 win last year, but ironically all four wins came in Athens. It's been since 1999 that Tech had a win over the Bulldogs in Atlanta, a 51-48 overtime contest. Tech is led by the 1,000-yard rushing tandem of QB TaQuon Marshall (1,074) and BB KirVonte Benson (1,009), who each topped the 1,000-yards mark against Duke.

Florida State at Florida: Florida State and Florida meet for the 62nd time when the Seminoles travel to Gainesville's Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Though Florida holds an overall, 34-25-2 advantage in the series which began in 1958 in Gainesville, the Seminoles have won six of the last seven meetings under Jimbo Fisher, including the last three in Gainesville. The Seminoles are looking to keep their bowl hopes alive needing a win Saturday and the following week at home against ULM.

Clemson at South Carolina: Clemson and South Carolina meet for 115th time in a series that began in 1896 in Columbia as the Tigers visit Williams-Brice Stadium. The Tigers have won the last three meetings between the arch-rivals, 13 of the last 20 games since 1997, and hold an overall 68-42-4 advantage. Last year's 49-point victory in a 56-7 decision was the second-highest margin

2017 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

WIN STREAKS

- Miami has the nation's longest win streak at 15, three clear of Wisconsin, which has won 12 straight. The Hurricanes have won nine in a row at home, five consecutive on the road and last year's neutral site game in the Russell Athletic Bowl.
- Clemson has won nine straight over top 25 teams, the longest streak in Tiger history. The Tigers are 11-1 in matchups of top 15 teams over the last three years and 14-1 in its last 15 games against teams ranked in the top 25 of at least one poll.
- Clemson was perfect at home this season, winning all seven games. Overall, the Tigers have won eight in a row in Death Valley, which is the seventh-longest active streak in the country. Georgia Tech, which plays host to No. 7 Georgia this weekend, has also won eight straight at home.

EIGHTY WINS

FSU head coach Jimbo Fisher is just the eighth coach in ACC history to have won at least 80 games at an ACC school since the conference began in 1953. Fisher won his 80th game at Duke on Oct. 14 and is currently 82-23. He joins Dabo Swinney, Danny Ford and Frank Howard of Clemson; Bill Murray of Duke; Bobby Bowden of Florida State; George Welsh of Virginia and Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech with 80 wins at one ACC school.

of victory in the series. South Carolina, though, under new head coach Will Muschamp enters the game with its best record (8-3) since 2013, its last win in the series. Clemson is third nationally in scoring defense, second in team sacks (3.55) sixth in team tackles for loss (8.5).

ACC Louisville at Kentucky: Louisville and Kentucky collide in the battle for the Governor's Cup for the 30th time as the Cardinals visit Kroger Field in Lexington. Kentucky holds a 15-14 advantage in the series which began in 1912, but had a 70-year hiatus from 1924 to 1994. Louisville actually holds a 9-8 lead in games in Lexington and has won five of the last six meetings overall. The Cardinals, behind QB Lamar Jackson, are third nationally in total offense, averaging 560.4 yards per game.

ACC Boston College at Syracuse: Former Big East and current ACC Atlantic Division rivals Boston College and Syracuse meet for the 51st time when the Eagles travel to the Carrier Dome. Syracuse holds an overall 31-19 edge in the series which began in 1920 in Syracuse. The Orange holds a 3-1 advantage since joining the ACC in 2013. BC's last win at Syracuse was a 16-7 decision in 2010, one of just five wins for the Eagles in 25 games at Syracuse. Both teams have suffered injuries to their starting QBs. BC freshman RB AJ Dillon is second in the ACC in rushing yards and second among all freshmen nationally with 1,239 yards. Syracuse WR Steve Ishmael is second nationally in pass receptions (8.5) and sixth in receiving yards (105.5).

ACC Duke at Wake Forest: In the second-oldest gridiron series in the ACC, Duke and Wake Forest meet for the 98th time, when the Blue Devils travel to BB&T Stadium in Winston-Salem. Wake Forest's 24-14 win in Durham last year snapped a four-game Blue Devil winning streak in the series, but from 2000-2011 Wake won 12 straight games. Wake Forest QB John Wolford leads the ACC and is seventh nationally in pass efficiency (163.5), while Duke is third in the ACC in total defense, allowing just 335.4 yards per game. Duke and Wake Forest first met on the gridiron in 1889.

ACC North Carolina at NC State: The Tar Heels and Wolfpack collide for the 117th time when North Carolina travels to State's Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh. The Tar Heels hold an overall edge in the series 66-34-6, but the Wolfpack have won seven of the last 10 meetings between the arch-rivals, including a 28-21 win last year in Chapel Hill. NC State DE Bradley Chubb is second nationally in tackles for loss while UNC ranks 103rd in tackles for loss allowed.

ACC Lamar Jackson Makes History Again: Louisville QB Lamar Jackson is the first player in NCAA history to pass for more than 3,000 yards and rush for more than 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons. This year Jackson has thrown for 3,273 yards and rushed for 1,287.

ACC Jackson Third in ACC Career Total Offense: Louisville's Lamar Jackson moved past former Clemson standout Deshaun Watson for third place on the ACC's career total offense list. Jackson in 36 career games has 12,474 yards, while Clemson's Tajh Boyd is in second-place with 13,069 yards. Jackson leads all active players in the FBS, averaging 346.5 total yards per game for his career, which, if maintained would be an ACC record.

ACC Jackson Threatening ACC TD Record: Louisville QB Lamar Jackson has scored 49 career touchdowns (all rushing), an ACC career record for a quarterback. The conference record for touchdowns regardless of positions is 56, set by Pitt's James Conner (2013-16). Conner also holds the ACC career rushing touchdown record with 52.

ACC Nation's Longest Win Streak: Miami has the nation's longest winning streak at 15 games, three games clear of Wisconsin at 11. The Hurricanes are 10-0 for the first time since winning their first 12 games in 2002 before falling to Ohio State in the BCS National Championship Game.

ACC Blame It On The Chain: Buoyed by its well-known turnover chain, Miami leads the nation in turnover margin, averaging a positive 1.60 turnovers per game more than its opponents. The

■ Miami wide receiver Braxton Berrios and Virginia linebacker Micah Kiser are among the 13 finalists for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy, which is awarded by the National Football Foundation to an individual deemed the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

Boasting a nearly perfect 3.96 GPA, Berrios is the leading receiver for undefeated Miami. His impressive resume earned his spot as the Hurricanes' fourth NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

Kiser personifies the student-athlete ideal, having already earned his degree while claiming All-America accolades as one of the top defensive players in the nation. The two-year team captain becomes Virginia's fifth NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

ACC Dillon Tops 200 yards Again: Boston College's AJ Dillon topped the 200-yard rushing mark in a game for the second time this season when he rushed for 200 yards on 24 carries and two TDs in the Eagles' 39-16 win over Connecticut. He becomes only the second freshman in ACC history to twice rush for 200 or more yards in a game. North Carolina's Amos Lawrence accomplished the feat twice in 1977, including an ACC freshman record 286 yards against Virginia. Dillon previously recorded the best rushing day in the ACC this year with a 272-yard, 39-carry effort against Louisville on Oct. 14. That showing is the best by a freshman in the FBS this season and still the seventh-best day by any player in the nation.

ACC Louisville's Williams Gains 20 Yards A Carry: Louisville senior Malik Williams became only the 12th player in this century in the FBS to average 20 yards or more a carry and gain 180 yards in a game. Williams rushed for 180 yards on just nine carries against Syracuse, becoming only the fourth ACC player to do so since 2000, joining Georgia Tech's Marcus Marshall (2015 vs. Alcorn State), Duke's Shaun Wilson (2014 vs. Kansas) and Florida State Chris Thompson (2012 vs. Wake Forest).

ACC Wake Forest Offensive Improvement: Wake Forest has increased its scoring by 14.26 points per game from last year. That's on pace to be the third-largest year-to-year improvement in ACC history. The Demon Deacons were tied for last in the ACC in scoring in 2016, averaging just 20.4 points per game. This year, behind QB John Wolford, who is seventh nationally in pass efficiency, the Deacons are averaging 34.6 points per game, good enough for third in the conference. Wake's 381 points this season are a school record.

ACC Serigne Sets ACC TE Records: Wake Forest tight end Cam Serigne now holds ACC records for most career receptions and receiving yards by a tight end and is tied for most touchdown receptions. Serigne has 155 catches for 1,941 yards and 20 TDs. He is tied with Virginia Tech's Bucky Hodges and Virginia's Heath Miller for the ACC touchdown record.

ACC Bradley Chubb Named Finalist for the Nagurski Trophy: NC State DE Bradley Chubb was named one of the five finalists for this year's Nagurski Trophy, which is presented annually to the nation's top defensive player by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Chubb ranks second nationally in tackles for loss (2.2) and is seventh in the nation in sacks per game (0.91).

ACC Has Three Named Walter Camp Semifinalists: NC State DE Bradley Chubb, Louisville QB Lamar Jackson and Miami S Jaquan Johnson have been named three of the 15 Players of Interest for the 2017 Walter Camp National Player of the Year.

ACC Swinney, Richt Named Semifinalists for Maxwell Munger Coach of the Year: Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney and Miami head coach Mark Richt have been named two of the semifinalists for the 2017 George Munger National Coach of the Year Award which is presented annually by the Maxwell Club to the nation's top head coach.

ACC Dabo Ranks Fifth: Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney, who earned his 99th career victory last weekend, is fourth on the all-time ACC coaching wins list. Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer is in third place with 113 wins.

ACC Rushing QBs: Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson (117.0) and Georgia Tech QB TaQuon



Marshall (107.4) rank first and third, respectively, in the ACC in rushing. In its 65 years, the ACC has never had a quarterback finish the season as its rushing leader. Boston College running back AJ Dillon is second at 112.6 per game.

ACC Scoring Defense: Clemson ranks third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 13.9 points per game. The Tigers are one of three ACC teams ranked in the top 15, including Virginia Tech, which is sixth allowing 14.7 points a game and Miami, which is 15th allowing 17.7 per contest.

ACC In The Rankings: Clemson has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in each of the past 39 weeks. That ties Alabama for the longest current steak in the nation.

ACC Coaching Success: Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher (82-23, .781) and Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney (99-29, .773) are the two winningest coaches by percentage in ACC history.

ACC Bobby Dodd Award: Four ACC coaches are included on the Bobby Dodd Award Midseason Watch List, including Dave Doeren of NC State, Justin Fuente of Virginia Tech, Mark Richt of Miami and Dabo Swinney of Clemson. Swinney is a past winner of the Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2011.

ACC Tackles For Loss: Four ACC teams rank in the top 15 of tackles for loss. Miami ranks fourth nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 9.0 hits behind the line of scrimmage per game. The Hurricanes are followed by Clemson (sixth, 8.5), Wake Forest (sixth, 8.2), Virginia Tech (13th, 7.8).

ACC Butkus Award: Two ACC players – Clemson’s Dorian O’Daniel and Virginia Tech’s Tremaine Edmunds – have been named finalists for the Butkus Award, which is presented annually to the nation’s top linebacker.

ACC Thorpe Award: Three ACC players have been named semifinalists for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, which is presented annually to the nation’s top defensive back. Named from the ACC were Jeremy McDuffie of Duke, Derwin James of Florida State and Quin Blanding of Virginia.

ACC Lou Groza Award: Three ACC placekickers have been honored as semifinalists for this year’s Lou Groza College Placekicker of the Year award. Named from the ACC were Miami’s Michael Badgley, Louisville’s Blanton Creque and Syracuse’s Cole Murphy.

ACC Wuerffel Trophy: The ACC had three of the 11 football student-athletes selected as semifinalists for this year’s Wuerffel Trophy, the most of any conference. The Wuerffel is regarded as the premier award in College Football recognizing Community Service. Honored from the ACC were NC State P A.J. Cole III, Pitt T Brian O’Neill and Duke OL Gabe Brandner.

ACC NFL Quarterbacks: Twelve quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers are from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They are joined by Clemson’s Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College’s Matt Ryan (Falcons), North Carolina’s Mitch Trubisky (Bears), Pitt’s Tom Savage (Texans) and Nathan Peterman (Buffalo), Virginia Tech’s Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State’s Jameis Winston (Buccaneers) and E.J. Manuel (Raiders). All 12 played in the ACC.

ACC Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last seven years.

The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of seven or more years with double-figure victories.

ACC COACHING SUCCESS

ACC Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top 25 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State’s Jimbo Fisher ranks fourth (.781), followed by Clemson’s Dabo Swinney (sixth, .773), Miami’s Mark Richt (seventh, .749), Louisville’s Bobby Petrino (10th, .712), Georgia Tech’s Paul Johnson (17th, .664) and Virginia’s Bronco Mendenhall (21st, .649).

ACC Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 182 wins in his 20-year career. Miami’s Mark Richt is tied for eighth with 164 wins, followed by Louisville’s Bobby Petrino, who is tied for 17th with 116 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (110) who is 21st, Virginia’s Bronco Mendenhall, who is 23rd with 107 wins, and Duke’s David Cutcliffe, who is 24th with 101 wins. Clemson’s Dabo Swinney is tied for 25th with 99.

NATIONAL TITLES & HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS

ACC Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the four years.

ACC The ACC is the first conference since 1994 to have a football national title winner (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

2017 ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

The ACC is in the fourth year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the CFP semi-final games, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team, if it is ranked high enough, could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls. This year the New Year's Six at-large berths will be in the Goodyear Cotton, PlayStation Fiesta and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowls.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl (this year) will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Camping World Bowl.

Camping World Bowl

The Camping World Bowl has first pick of ACC teams in 2017 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

One Win Rule Applies To Notre Dame

Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the available ACC team with the best overall record in order to be chosen. For example, if an ACC team is 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team can not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

Four current ACC head coaches rank among the Top 10 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage and six are ranked in the Top 20, led by Florida State's Jimbo Fisher, who ranks fourth overall with a .781 mark behind Ohio State's Urban Meyer (.849), Washington's Chris Peterson (.821) and Stanford's David Shaw (.783). Joining Fisher in the Top 11 are Dabo Swinney of Clemson at 6th, Mark Richt of Miami at 7th and Bobby Petrino of Louisville at 10th. Paul Johnson (17th) of Georgia Tech and Bronco Mendenhall (21st) are also ranked in the Top 21. NC State's Dave Doeren is ranked 28th (.618).
