## QUICK HITS - ACC BOWL NOTES

**ACC Clemson Ranked No. 1, Returns to CFP:** The ACC Champion Clemson Tigers (12-1) are No. 1 in the CFP rankings and will face No. 4 Alabama (11-1) in the CFP Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl at 8:45 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 1. It marks the third-consecutive year Clemson has faced the Crimson Tide in the College Football Playoff. If the Tigers advance past Alabama this year, they will face No. 2 Oklahoma (12-1) or No. 3 Georgia (12-1) for the CFP National Championship at 8 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 8, at Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The Tigers are looking to become the first team to repeat as national champions since Alabama in 2011 and 2012.

**ACC Orange Success:** ACC Coastal Division champion and 10th-ranked Miami (10-2) will face No. 6 Wisconsin (12-1) in the Capital One Orange Bowl on Saturday, Dec. 30, at 8 p.m. (ESPN). It will be the 41st bowl appearance for the Hurricanes, who own a 20-20 record in their previous postseason games. Miami will be playing in the Orange Bowl for the 10th time, and the first since 2004. The Hurricanes own a 6-3 record in their previous appearances. The ACC has won five consecutive Orange Bowl games, the longest streak by any conference in 73 years.

**ACC Earns Nation's Best 10 Bowl Bids:** Led by defending national champion Clemson, the ACC secured 10 spots in the 2017 postseason bowl lineup – the most of any conference. Over the last two years, the ACC has had 21 teams in bowl games. This marks the 17th consecutive year that at least six ACC teams are in a bowl game. The ACC ranks second among all conferences with 116 total bowl bids since 2005.

**ACC The Last Five Years:** Since 2013, the ACC has made 54 postseason appearances (second-most among Power 5 conferences), has the most wins (7) of any conference in BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games, and has captured the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016).

**ACC Bowl Streaks:** A pair of ACC schools – Florida State and Virginia Tech – will continue the two longest current Division I bowl streaks in the nation. FSU is in a bowl game for the 36th-straight year and will face Southern Miss in the Walk-On's Independence Bowl on Dec. 27. Virginia Tech, which has the longest streak recognized by the NCAA, will play in its 25th-straight bowl when the 22nd-ranked Hokies take on No. 19 Oklahoma State in the Camping World Bowl on Dec. 28.



## 2017 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

### AWARD SPOTLIGHT

• **Bradley Chubb Wins the Nagurski Trophy & Hendricks Award:** NC State DE Bradley Chubb, a unanimous All-American, won the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Chubb ranks second nationally in tackles for loss (2.2) and is eighth in the nation in sacks per game (0.83). Chubb also brought home the Ted Hendricks Award as the nation's top defensive end.

• **Jackson Finishes Third in Heisman:** Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson finished third in the Heisman Trophy vote behind winning quarterback Baker Mayfield of Oklahoma and running back Bryce Love of Stanford. Jackson became the fifth player to win the award and return as a finalist the following year, joining Oklahoma's Jason White (2003-04), Southern Cal's Matt Leinart (2004-05), Florida's Tim Tebow (2008-09), and Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel (2013-14). He becomes only the second ACC player to be voted in the top three in two different years. Clemson's Deshaun Watson finished third in 2015 and was runner-up to Jackson in 2016.

• **Clemson's Elliott Named Broyles Award Winner:** For the second year in a row, a Clemson coordinator was named the winner of the Frank Broyles Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Tony Elliott, Clemson's co-offensive coordinator, was named the 2017 winner one year after Tigers' defensive coordinator Brent Venables was honored. Of the 22 past winners, 13 have coached in the ACC.

• **Walter Camp Tabs Calvin Johnson as its Man of the Year:** The Walter Camp Foundation named former Georgia Tech All-America WR and Detroit Lions All-Pro Calvin Johnson as its 2017 Man of the Year. The Walter Camp "Man of the Year" award honors an individual who has been closely associated with the game of football as a player, coach or close attendant to the game. He must have attained a measure of success, been a leader in his chosen profession and must have contributed to the public service for the benefit of his community, country and his fellow man. The person must have an impeccable reputation for integrity and must be dedicated to our American Heritage and the philosophy of Walter Camp.

• **FSU's Bowden Voted Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl Head Coach:** Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden was voted head coach of the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl 50th Anniversary Team via the @CFAPeachBowl Twitter account.



### QUICK HITS

• **BCS/NYE6/CFP Success:** Since 2012, no other conference has been as successful on the biggest stage as the ACC. The league is 8-3 (.727) over the last five years in BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games. The only other conference with a winning record in those games entering this year's bowl season is the Pac-12 with a 5-4 mark (.556).

• **Bowling the Last Two Years:** Thirteen of 14 ACC teams have earned an invitation to a postseason bowl game over the last two seasons. Over the last four years, every ACC team has enjoyed a trip to a bowl game and the league has made 43 postseason appearances.

• **Swinney Only Coach with Four ACC Championship Game Wins:** Clemson's 38-3 win over Miami gave head coach Dabo Swinney his fourth Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game victory, something no other coach in league history has accomplished. Swinney has guided the Tigers to ACC title game wins in 2011, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

• **Swinney Becomes Fourth ACC Head Coach to Win 100 Games:** Clemson's Dabo Swinney became just the fourth head coach to win 100 games while coaching in the ACC, when his Tigers defeated South Carolina 34-10 on Nov. 25. Swinney joined Bobby Bowden (173) of Florida State, George Welsh (136) of Virginia and Frank Beamer (113) of Virginia Tech, who each had at least 100 wins as ACC head coaches.

• **Seven ACC Coaches Rank Among the Top 25 Active Head Coaches in Career Victories:** The ACC has seven of the Top 25 active coaches nationally in career victories – all of them with 100 or more – which is by far the most of any conference. The next closest league has four coaches in the top 25. Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson is in fourth place with 182 wins. He is followed by Miami's Mark Richt, who is eighth with 164 wins, Louisville's Bobby Petrino is 17th with 116, Wake Forest's Dave Clawson is tied for 21st (110), Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall is 23rd (107), Duke's David Cutcliffe is 24th (102) and Clemson's Dabo Swinney is 25th (101).

### RANKED MATCHUPS

Since the start of the 2016 season, the ACC has compiled an 8-4 record vs. non-conference opponents when both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25. The conference is even better in games involving Top 10 teams, posting a 4-1 mark during the same time period.

## 2017 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

### ACROSS THE ACC

- **Wins Over .500 Teams:** Led by Clemson with eight, the ACC leads all conferences in wins (41) vs. teams with a .500-or-better record.
- **CFP Top 25:** Four ACC teams were ranked in the final CFP rankings, including No. 1 Clemson, No. 10 Miami, No. 22 Virginia Tech and No. 24 NC State. Clemson has been ranked No. 1 by the CFP Committee eight times. Clemson was No. 1 in every poll in 2015 before losing in the National Championship Game to Alabama. Last year, Clemson was never No. 1 in the CFP Poll, then defeated No. 1 Alabama in the National Championship Game.
- **AP Top 25:** Three ACC teams are ranked in the most recent AP Top 25 with two others receiving votes. Clemson is No. 1, followed by No. 11 Miami and No. 22 Virginia Tech. NC State and Louisville received votes.
- **NFL Quarterbacks:** Thirteen quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers are from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They are joined by Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears) and T.J. Yates (Texans), Pitt's Tom Savage (Texans) and Nathan Peterman (Bills), Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers) and E.J. Manuel (Raiders). All 13 played in the ACC.
- **ACC-SEC Rivalry Games:** Over the last four years, the ACC is 13-3 in its games against the SEC on rivalry week, which features Clemson-South Carolina, Florida State-Florida, Georgia Tech-Georgia and Louisville-Kentucky. The league was 3-1 this year, winning all three games on the road.
- **ACC National Champions:** Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the last four years.
- **National Title & Heisman Trophy:** In 2016, the ACC became the first conference since 1994 to have a football national champion (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

### CAMPBELL TROPHY WINNER – VIRGINIA'S MICAH KISER

■ Virginia linebacker Micah Kiser was named the 28th recipient of The William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments, at the 60th National Football Foundation Annual Awards Dinner in New York City.

The Campbell Trophy® ranks as one of college football's most sought after and competitive awards, recognizing an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary community leadership. The award, which is prominently displayed at its official home inside the New York Athletic Club, comes with a 24-inch, 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 postgraduate scholarship.

A 2016 Second Team Academic All-American, Kiser graduated with a bachelor's degree in foreign affairs in May 2017 while boasting a 3.42 GPA. The two-time First Team Academic All-District selection currently maintains a 4.0 GPA while working toward his master's in higher education. A Baltimore native, Kiser is a two-time Academic All-ACC selection and a three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll member.

A semifinalist for the 2017 Butkus Award, Kiser has racked up an impressive 134 tackles during the regular season, which leads the ACC and is tied for fourth in the nation. His 11.2 tackles per game average leads the ACC for the third consecutive year and is tied for fifth in the FBS. He also has four pass breakups and is second on the Cavaliers with five sacks and 9.5 tackles for loss. Kiser's two fumble recoveries this season are tied for second in the ACC, and he was named a finalist for the 2017 Lott IMPACT Trophy.

**Winning 10:** Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last seven years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of seven or more years with double-figure victories.

**NC State's Bradley Chubb Becomes Fourth ACC Player in Eight Years to win the Nagurski Trophy:** NC State DE Bradley Chubb was named the winner of this year's Bronko Nagurski Trophy, given annually by the FWAA to the nation's defensive player of the year. Chubb becomes the fourth ACC player in eight years to win the Trophy, joining Da'Quan Bowers of Clemson (2010), Luke Kuechly of Boston College (2011) and Aaron Donald of Pitt (2014). He is also the eighth player from a current ACC school to win the honor. Chubb is second nationally in tackles for loss per game (2.2) and eighth in sacks per game (0.83).

**ACC Has Won Five Straight in the OB:** When No. 10 Miami faces No. 6 Wisconsin in this year's Capital One Orange Bowl, the Hurricanes will be seeking to extend a streak of five consecutive wins by ACC teams. The streak is the longest in Orange Bowl history since the SEC won seven straight from 1938-44 (73 years ago). One of those wins was by Georgia Tech, then a member of the Southeastern Conference.

**Miami Makes 10th Appearance in Orange Bowl:** Miami will be making its 10th appearance in the Capital One Orange Bowl this year. Only Oklahoma (19), Nebraska (17) and Florida State (10) have as many or more appearances in the Orange Bowl. The Hurricanes are 6-3 overall in their previous nine games and only Oklahoma (12) and Nebraska (8) have won more Orange Bowls than Miami.

**Duke, Wake Forest Bowling in the Same Year for the First Time:** Duke and Wake Forest have been playing football since 1888, a span of 129 years, but this is the first time the two schools are going to a bowl game in the same year. Duke will be going to a bowl game for the 13th time and Wake Forest will be participating in its 12th.





## 2017 ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

### BOWL STREAKS

With its win over Louisiana Monroe on Dec. 2, Florida State is going to a bowl game for the 36th consecutive year, by far the most of any program in the FBS. Virginia Tech, which will be attending its 25th straight bowl game, is next on the list and the Hokies streak is the longest currently recognized by the NCAA. Clemson is ninth, making its 13th consecutive appearance in the postseason.

### WINNING BOWL PROGRAMS

With a minimum of 15 bowl appearances, the ACC has six of the Top 22 winningest bowl programs, more than any other conference in the country. Florida State leads the way with the fourth-best winning percentage (.630), followed by Syracuse (seventh), Georgia Tech (16th), Boston College (17th), NC State (19th) and Clemson (22nd).

**Wake Forest Offensive Improvement:** Wake Forest has increased its scoring by 13.29 points per game from last year. That's on pace to be the fourth-largest year-to-year improvement in ACC history. The Demon Deacons were tied for last in the ACC in scoring in 2016, averaging just 20.4 points per game. This year, behind QB John Wolford, who is 10th nationally in pass efficiency (157.5), the Deacons are averaging 33.67 points per game, good enough for third in the conference. Wake's 404 points this season are a school record.

**Duke LB Joe Giles-Harris Ranks Fifth in FBS Career Tackles Per Game:** Duke sophomore LB Joe Giles-Harris has had a very productive first two years of his collegiate career. Giles-Harris ranks fifth nationally among all active FBS players in tackles per game for a career. He has 224 total tackles in 24 games, an average of 9.33 tackles per game.



**Kiser Leads ACC in Tackles for Third Straight Year:** For the third consecutive year, Virginia LB Micah Kiser leads the ACC in tackles. He enters his final game 13 tackles ahead of teammate Quin Blanding and 17 ahead of Duke LB Joe Giles-Harris. Kiser has 134 hits on the year and is averaging 11.2 tackles per game this year, which ranks fifth in the nation. He becomes just the second player to lead the conference in tackles for three consecutive years, joining Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11).



**Dillon Seeks ACC Rushing Crown:** Boston College's AJ Dillon, who became only the second freshman in ACC history to rush for 200 or more yards twice, has a chance to do something which hasn't been done by a true freshman in 36 years. Dillon has 1,432 yards this season and would need to overtake Louisville QB Lamar Jackson (1,443) to lead the league in rushing. The last time a true freshman led the conference in rushing was in 1981, when Joe McIntosh of NC State averaged 119.0 yards per game. Dillon's total of 1,432 yards is already the most by a true freshman and ranks second only to Virginia Tech redshirt freshman Ryan Williams (1,655 yards in 2009) among all first-year players.



**Virginia's Blanding Leads All FBS in Tackles:** Virginia senior S Quin Blanding leads all players in the FBS with 479 career tackles. That total now places him 10th on the ACC career tackle list for all positions. If he remains in second place on the ACC tackle list for 2017, he will have finished second in the league in total tackles in each of his four seasons – something no other player has done in ACC history.



**Serigne Sets ACC TE Records:** Wake Forest TE Cam Serigne holds ACC career records for most career receptions and receiving yards by a tight end and is tied for TD pass receptions. Heading into the Dec. 29 Belk Bowl against Texas A&M, Serigne has 165 catches for 1,963 yards and 20 TDs. He is tied with Virginia Tech's Bucky Hodges and Virginia's Heath Miller for the ACC TD reception record.



**Slye Fifth, Badgley Six on ACC Scoring List:** Virginia Tech PK Joey Slye is in fifth place on the ACC career scoring list with 400 points. Slye has 78 field goals, which ties for the third-best total in ACC history with Ross Martin of Duke. He trails only Florida State's Dustin Hopkins (88) and Maryland's Nick Novak (80) on the ACC career list. Despite an injury, which sidelined him late in the year, he has a chance to kick in Tech's Camping World Bowl game against Oklahoma State on Dec. 28. Miami's Michael Badgley sits in sixth place with 397 total points and 76 career field goals and has a Dec. 30 date remaining in the Orange Bowl against Wisconsin.



**Virginia Tech's Phillips Has 236 Career Catches:** Virginia Tech senior WR Cam Phillips has 236 career receptions, which is the second-highest total of any active FBS player. Entering the Dec. 28 Camping World Bowl against Oklahoma State, Phillips is in eighth place on the ACC career receiving list and needs five more catches to move past Clemson's Sammy Watkins (240) for seventh.

## ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR LAMAR JACKSON



### LOUISVILLE'S LAMAR JACKSON NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Louisville junior quarterback Lamar Jackson repeated as the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year in 2017.

Jackson – also voted the ACC's Offensive Player of the Year for the second year in a row – leads the nation in total offense with 4,932 yards and total offense per game (411.0). He is on pace to set ACC season and career records for total yards per game and season records for total yards.

Jackson is the sixth student-athlete to be named the ACC Football Player of the Year in back-to-back seasons and the first since Florida State's Charlie Ward in 1992 and 1993. Jackson led the overall ACC Player of the Year balloting with 51 votes. NC State's Bradley Chubb was second with six votes.

**ACC Lamar Jackson Makes History--Again:** Earlier this year, Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson became the first player in NCAA history to pass for 3,000 or more yards and rush for 1,000 or more yards in consecutive seasons. This season, Jackson has thrown for 3,489 yards and rushed for 1,443.

**ACC Jackson Could Become First Quarterback to Lead the ACC in Rushing:** Jackson, who has an 11-yard lead over Boston College freshman AJ Dillon for the ACC's rushing crown, could become the first quarterback in league history to lead the conference in rushing. Jackson currently has 1,443 rushing yards, while Dillon has 1,432 heading into the bowl season.

**ACC Jackson Third in ACC Career Total Offense:** Jackson needs just 224 yards of total offense to move past former Clemson standout Tajh Boyd (13,069) for second place on the ACC's career total offense list in 47 games. Jackson, in 37 career games, has 12,846 yards. Jackson leads all active players in the FBS, averaging 347.2 total yards per game for his career, which is an ACC record. He needs just 154 yards against Mississippi State to become the first junior in ACC history to total 13,000 yards of offense.

**ACC Jackson Already the Leader in ACC Career Per-Game Total Offense:** Jackson will end this season as the ACC career leader in yards per game in total offense. Jackson is averaging 347.2 yards per game through 37 games, and even if he is held to zero yards against Mississippi State in the TaxSlayer Bowl, he would still have the best per-game average in total offense in ACC history at 338.1, ahead of Clemson's Deshaun Watson (318.3).

**ACC Jackson Has Seven of Top 10:** When Jackson rushed for 178 yards against Florida State on Oct. 14, it was the 10th-best rushing total by a quarterback in ACC history. Of the 10 performances, Jackson has recorded seven of them. He is also one of two quarterbacks nationally to have rushed for 175 or more yards seven times in this century (Denard Robinson, Michigan).

**ACC Jackson Ranks Six on NCAA Career Quarterback Rushing List:** Jackson, who has 3,974 rushing yards in his career, now stands in sixth place on the NCAA all-time rushing list for a quarterback. He needs 139 rushing yards against Mississippi State in the TaxSlayer Bowl to pass Colin Kaepernick for sixth place. He also needs 129 yards to break his own ACC single-season record for rushing yards by a quarterback. Everyone ahead of him on the NCAA career list played four seasons and Jackson is just finishing his third. He is eighth on the ACC career rushing list for all positions and needs 93 yards to pass Georgia Tech's Robert Lavette for fifth place. Of those ahead of him on the ACC list, only Florida State's Dalvin Cook, who ranks second, played just three seasons.

**ACC Jackson Threatening ACC TD Record:** Jackson has rushed for 49 career touchdowns. That is an ACC career record for a quarterback. The conference career mark for rushing touchdowns regardless of position is 52, set by Pitt's James Conner. The 49 rushing scores ties Ted Brown of NC State for second place on the ACC rushing TD list.

**ACC Jackson Has 116 Career TDR:** Jackson has been responsible for 116 touchdowns in his career. Jackson has rushed for 49 TDs and thrown for 67. He trails only Clemson's Tajh Boyd (133) and is tied with the Tigers' Deshaun Watson (116) for second place on the ACC career list.

**ACC Jackson's Sixth in FBS Career Rushing:** Jackson's career per-game rushing average of 107.4 yards per game ranks fourth best of any current FBS player. Jackson leads all quarterbacks and his per-game average would be the third-highest in ACC history for any position.

**ACC Jackson Fastest to 10,000 Career Yards:** Louisville QB Lamar Jackson has 12,846 total yards. He became the fastest player to 10,000 yards in league history, accomplishing the feat in just 31 games. He is only the second junior to do so, joining Clemson's Deshaun Watson who needed 33 games to top 10,000. He now ranks third on the ACC career list, trailing only Tajh Boyd of Clemson (13,069) and Philip Rivers (13,582) of NC State.

**ACC Record-Breaking:** Jackson has broken the ACC career mark for most rushing yards and most touchdowns rushing by a quarterback in only his third season. Jackson now has 3,974 career yards, bettering the mark of 2,806 set by Georgia Tech's Joshua Nesbit (2007-10). Jackson, who had one rushing TD against Wake Forest on Nov. 11, now has 49 career rushing touchdowns, bettering the ACC career mark for a quarterback of 38 scores set during the 2009-12 seasons by Georgia Tech's Tevin Washington.



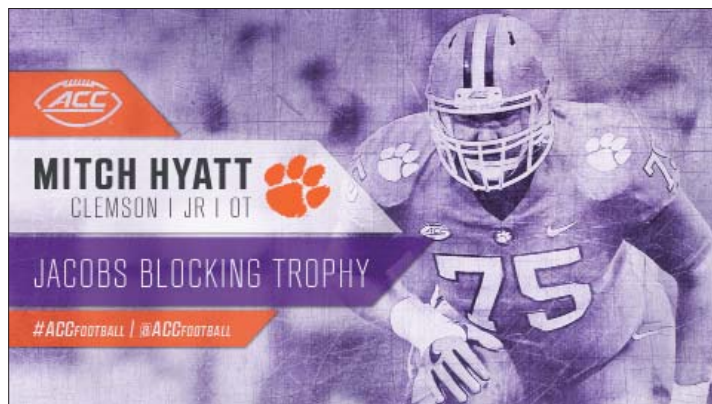
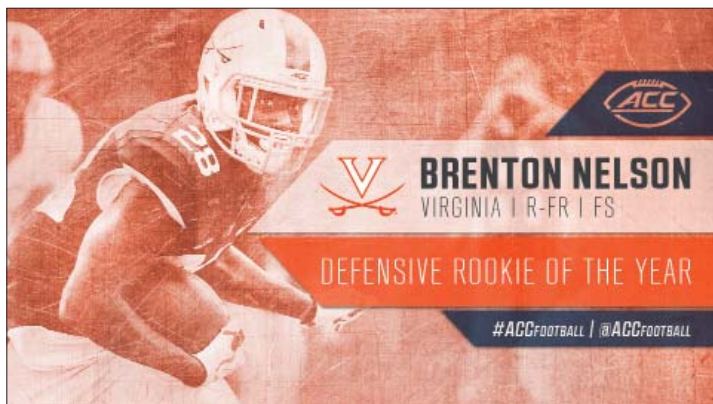
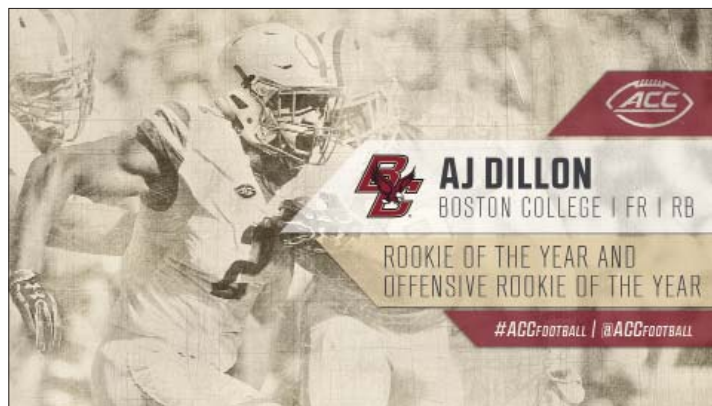


## 2017 ACC INDIVIDUAL AWARD WINNERS

### NC STATE'S BRADLEY CHUBB NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

NC State defensive end Bradley Chubb was voted the 2017 ACC Defensive Player of the Year. He leads the ACC in quarterback sacks (10) and ranks second nationally in tackles for loss (26). The Marietta, Georgia, standout's senior season has assured that he will graduate from NC State as the program's all-time leader in both categories (26 sacks, 60 tackles for loss).

A 2017 first-team All-ACC selection, Chubb was voted the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week three times during the regular season. Chubb led the ACC Defensive Player of the Year balloting with 45 votes. Clemson's Christian Wilkins and Clelin Ferrell were the next closest with four votes each.

Three current ACC head coaches rank among the Top 10 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage and seven are ranked in the Top 25, led by Clemson's Dabo Swinney, who ranks fourth overall with a .777 mark behind Ohio State's Urban Meyer (.850), Washington's Chris Peterson (.822) and Texas A&M's Jimbo Fisher, whose .783 mark was achieved at Florida State. Joining Swinney in the Top 10 are Mark Richt of Miami at seventh and Bobby Petrino of Louisville at 10th. **Clemson ...** The Tigers begin defense of their national title when they face Alabama in the CFP for the third consecutive year • Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney, an Alabama graduate who lettered on the Crimson Tide's 1992 national championship team and spent eight years as a member of the Alabama coaching staff, is 1-1 versus his alma mater in postseason • The Tigers edged Alabama in the final seconds of last year's title game and dropped a 45-40 decision to the Crimson Tide in the finale two year ago • Clemson has posted seven straight double-digit win seasons and is the ACC champion for the 17th time • Swinney owns 101 wins in 10 seasons as Clemson's head coach • Swinney hit the century mark with a road win at rival South Carolina in the Tigers' regular-season finale, and then added the 38-3 win over No. 7 Miami in the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game • The Tigers have won 43 of their last 46 games • Clemson's senior class became the first from the ACC to win 50 games with the Tigers' ACC title-game victory.



**Alabama ...** The Crimson Tide seeks its 12th national football championship in the poll era (AP, UPI, BCS, CFP) and its fifth under current head coach Nick Saban • Since its inception in 2014, Alabama is the only team to appear in all four College Football Playoffs and has appeared in the top five of every CFP poll over the last four seasons • While Clemson is making just its second appearance in the Sugar Bowl (the first was a 7-0 loss to LSU in the 1959 game), the Crimson Tide will be making a record 16th appearance in the game • Alabama's eight wins in the Sugar Bowl is also a record • In addition to its 14 previous Sugar Bowl appearances, the Tide played in the 2012 Allstate BCS National Championship game, when it upended LSU, 21-0, for the national title • The Crimson Tide also secured national championships with wins in the Sugar Bowl in 1962, 1979, 1980 and 1993 • Alabama sophomore quarterback Jalen Hurts is already the school record-holder in quarterback rushing touchdowns (21) and ranks No. 2 in quarterback career rushing (1,722 yards) and career touchdown responsibility (59).

**Wisconsin ...** This year marks Wisconsin's first appearance in the Orange Bowl, which has been in existence since 1935 • The Badgers will make their second straight appearance in a New Year's Six bowl, having defeated Western Michigan, 24-16, in the Cotton Bowl last year • It is UW's 11th bowl game in the state of Florida • The Badgers have gone 5-5 in their previous 10 Florida bowl appearances, including a 34-31 overtime victory over Auburn in the 2015 Outback Bowl • The Badgers lead the Big Ten and rank among the nation's top two in total defense, scoring defense and rushing defense • Wisconsin also ranked fourth nationally in pass defense • The Badgers' Paul Chryst, familiar to ACC fans from his previous head coaching stint at Pitt, was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year by both the conference's head coaches and media • Chryst, 33-7 in three seasons at Wisconsin, split a pair of games versus Miami as the Panthers head coach, losing 41-31 in 2013 and winning 35-23 in 2014 • Eight Badgers were named to the All-Big Ten first, second or third teams at the conclusion of the 2017 regular season, including two consensus picks in ILB T.J. **Notes:** No. 22 Virginia Tech's current bowl streak of 25 consecutive seasons is the longest active streak recognized by the NCAA and is tied as the third-longest streak in college football history • Virginia Tech has won three consecutive bowl games and four of its past five • The Hokies' current bowl streak began with a 45-20 win over Indiana in the 1993 Independence Bowl • This year's meeting in Orlando will mark the third time Virginia Tech and Oklahoma State have met on the gridiron, but the first since splitting a home-and-home series in 1971 and 1972 • The Cowboys defeated Virginia Tech 24-16 in the first meeting in Stillwater, Oklahoma • The Hokies countered with a 34-32 win in Blacksburg the following season • Virginia Tech's coaching staff has strong ties to the state of Oklahoma • Head coach Justin Fuente is a native of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and began his collegiate playing career at the University of Oklahoma • Offensive line coach Vance Vice played at Oklahoma State from 1985-89 and was a teammate of current Cowboys head coach Mike Gundy. Vice is a native of Bristow, Oklahoma • Offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen is a native of Texhoma, Oklahoma, and spent time at Oklahoma State as both a graduate assistant coach and a quality control coach • This season's 19th-ranked Oklahoma State team posted a pair of wins over teams that were ranked in the AP Top 25 at the time they played – 50-39 over No. 22 West Virginia and 49-42 over No. 24 Iowa State • The Cowboys ascended as high as No. 6 in the AP Top 25 this season • Virginia Tech and Oklahoma State played two common opponents during the 2017 regular season • The Cowboys defeated Pitt 59-21 on the road on Sept. 16 and won 50-39 at West Virginia on Oct. 28 • The Hokies edged West Virginia 31-24 in their season opener Sept. 3 at Landover, Maryland, and defeated Pitt 20-14 on Nov. 18 in Blacksburg • Cowboys QB Mason Rudolph leads the nation with 4,553 passing yards, and WR James Washington leads the nation with 1,423 receiving yards • Virginia Tech, meanwhile, boasts the nation's No. 4 scoring defense.

**Notes:** This will be the third all-time matchup between the Wolfpack and the Sun Devils • NC State fell at Arizona State in 1960 (25-22), but then won in Tempe in 1974 (35-14) • NC State has not faced a Pac-12 team since Arizona in the 1989 Copper Bowl (a 17-10 loss) • NC State will be making its fourth consecutive bowl appearance, all under head coach Dave Doeren • It will be the Pack's first appearance in the Sun Bowl • In Doeren's seven years as a head coach overall, he has advanced to the postseason six times • The Wolfpack finished the 2017 regular season ranked No. 24 in the final College Football Playoff Rankings • The Wolfpack's six wins in ACC play this season tied for the most in a single season all-time at NC State • The Hyundai Sun Bowl will be NC State's 31st postseason appearance (16-13-1) and the 13th bowl game since 2000 • Wolfpack All-America DE Bradley Chubb, the ACC Defensive Player of the Year Chubb, was the 2017 recipient of both the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (nation's top defensive player) and the Ted Hendricks Award (nation's top defensive end) • The Sun Bowl game will be the final one for Todd Graham as Arizona State head coach • Graham was relieved of head coaching duties following the end of the regular season but will coach the Sun Devils through the bowl game before giving way to newly hired Herm Edwards • ASU will play in its 30th bowl game overall, and it is the team's sixth bowl appearance in the last seven seasons • It will be the Sun Devils' sixth appearance in the Sun Bowl • Arizona State holds an 8-10 record all-time against ACC opponents • The Sun Devils are 3-1-1 in the Sun Bowl, including a dramatic 36-31 victory over Duke in 2014 that saw the two competing teams combine for nearly 800 total yards • NC State's stout offensive line has allowed an ACC-low 12 sacks and helped redshirt junior quarterback Ryan Finley pass for 3,200 yards and 16 touchdowns • ASU's Manny Wilkins enters the contest ranked 28th in the nation in passing yards with 2,918 on the year, (243 per game) • WR N'Keal Harry heads to El Paso tied for 19th nationally with 73 receptions and 24th in the nation with exactly 1,000 yards receiving.

**Notes:** The Cardinals, making their eighth-consecutive bowl appearance, will play in their second post-season contest in Jacksonville, Florida • This marks Louisville's 22nd bowl appearance and the eighth in the Bobby Petrino head coaching era • Overall, the Cardinals own a 10-10-1 overall record and are 3-4 under Petrino, splitting the last four postseason games • Louisville fell 29-9 to LSU last season in the Citrus Bowl • Louisville enters the TaxSlayer Bowl having won four of the last five contests • Playing their best football of the season, the Cardinals are averaging 46 points per game over the last three games with a 30-point average margin of victory during that span • The Cardinals' emergence has come in large part due to a ground game that is ranked 13th nationally entering the postseason, with an average of 249.9 yards per game • Louisville's rushing attack averaged 351.7 yards per game in the last three contests • QB Lamar Jackson has led the surge in the rushing game, posting six consecutive 100-yard games and becoming the first player in school history to rush for over 1,300 yards in consecutive seasons • He leads the team with 1,443 yards and 17 touchdowns • RBs Malik Williams and Reggie Bonnafon have totaled 518 and 446 yards, respectively, this season • Louisville's defense has improved during the winning streak, allowing an average of 233.3 yards of total offense and just 16.0 points per game • With the return of CB Jaire Alexander from injury, the Cardinals have yielded an average of 154.0 yards per game through the air and recorded five interceptions in the last three games • Aeris Williams paces the Bulldogs' offensive attack with 1,019 yards rushing and five touchdowns, while the MSU defense is one of the best in the country, allowing just 302.0 yards per game • Louisville's last appearance in Jacksonville for a bowl game came in the 2005 Gator Bowl, a 35-24 loss to Virginia Tech • With former head coach Dan Mullen taking the Florida job, assistant Greg Knox will guide the Bulldogs vs. Louisville in the bowl game • Former Penn State OC and Fordham head coach Joe Moorhead has been hired as the new MSU head coach.

**Notes:** This year's Belk Bowl marks Wake Forest's 12th all-time bowl selection and its second consecutive bowl invite • The Demon Deacons' seven regular season victories were the most since the 2008 team won seven times • Wake Forest has defeated five teams that are bowl-eligible this season, tying the school record set in 2008 • Wake Forest and Texas A&M have never met in football • The Belk Bowl will serve as Wake Forest's third bowl game against an SEC opponent • The Deacons fell to LSU in the 1979 Tangerine Bowl and to Mississippi State in the 2011 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl • The 2017 season marks the eighth time in 18 seasons that Wake Forest head coach Dave Clawson has led his team to the postseason • He was 4-3 in three FCS playoff appearances • At Bowling Green, Clawson's teams were invited to three bowl games in six seasons • This is Wake Forest's second bowl appearance in Clawson's four years • Wake Forest is 7-4 all-time in bowl games • The Deacons first appeared in the 1946 Gator Bowl and posted a 26-14 win over South Carolina • Wake Forest also appeared in the 1949 Dixie Bowl, the 1979 Tangerine Bowl, 1992 Independence Bowl, the 1999 Aloha Bowl, the 2002 Seattle Bowl, the 2007 FedEx Orange Bowl, the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl, the 2008 EagleBank Bowl and the 2011 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl • In 2016, the Deacons beat No. 23 Temple 34-26 in the Military Bowl to complete a 7-6 campaign • Clawson has excelled in his fourth year at each of his four head coaching stops. His four fourth-year teams have a combined record of 36-16 with four postseason appearances • Texas A&M will be led by interim coach Jeff Banks in the bowl game • The Aggies will then move forward with former Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher at the helm • Fisher took the A&M job on Dec. 1 • Texas A&M's invitation to the 2017 Belk Bowl marks the 39th bowl game in program history • This will mark Texas A&M's first appearance in the Belk Bowl • The Aggies will be seeking their fifth bowl win in the last seven tries • A&M is appearing in a bowl game for a school-record ninth straight year.

**Notes:** The New Era Pinstripe Bowl is the 26th bowl appearance for Boston College and the 16th bowl in the last 19 years for the Eagles • It will be BC's second appearance in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl (a 31-30 overtime loss to Penn State in 2014) • The Eagles are 14-11 all-time in bowl games after last season's 36-30 win over Maryland in the Quick Lane Bowl • The victory over the Terps was the first bowl win for BC since 2007 • Boston College finished the regular season winning five of its last six games as the Eagles closed out with a 42-14 win over Syracuse on Nov. 25 • Head coach Steve Addazio has led the Eagles to four bowls in his first five years, the first head coach in BC history to do so • Over the last six games, BC is averaging 36 points per game and outscoring the opposition by 19 points per contest, including wins over Florida State (35-3), at Louisville (45-42) and at Virginia (41-10) • Boston College features nine All-ACC selections, led by ACC Rookie of the Year and All-ACC first-team selection AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 15 overall rusher with 1,432 yards and 13 touchdowns • Dillon has 1,099 rushing yards over the last six games, the most of any player in the country • BC junior safety Lukas Denis earned second-team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Foundation • He is the 13th Boston College player in school history to earn the prestigious honor • The Hawkeyes are making their 31st bowl game appearance, and their first in New York • Iowa has posted a 14-15-1 record in 30 previous bowl games • The Pinstripe Bowl marks the first ever meeting between Iowa and Boston College • The Hawkeyes are 8-11 all-time versus the ACC, but have won four straight against current members of the conference • That includes a 24-14 win over No. 9 Georgia Tech at the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl • Iowa played three top 10 teams this season, losing to No. 4 Penn State on the final play of the game, and at No. 6 Wisconsin • The Hawkeyes' biggest win of the year was a 55-24 victory over No. 3 Ohio State at Kinnick Stadium • Iowa ranks third among Big Ten teams in all-time bowl appearances.

**Notes:** This year's bowl selection marks the nation-leading 36th straight postseason appearance for the Seminoles, who won three in a row and four of their final five games of the 2017 season to reach postseason eligibility • In its current three-game winning streak, Florida State has outscored its opponents 157-38 • Florida State's current winning streak includes defeating in-state rival Florida for a program-record fifth straight time and extending a program-best winning streak in Gainesville to four • Interim head coach Odell Haggins, who led the Dec. 2 win over Louisiana Monroe that clinched bowl eligibility, will direct the Seminoles in the bowl game before incoming head coach Willie Taggart takes charge • Florida State leads the all-time series with the Golden Eagles 13-8-1 • The series dates back to 1952, but this will be the first matchup between the programs since the No. 3 Seminoles beat 25th-ranked Southern Miss 54-14 in 1996 • This will be the first time the schools have met in a bowl game and will be Florida State's first appearance in the Walk-On's Independence Bowl • The Golden Eagles will make their third-straight bowl appearance, 13th in the last 16 years and 25th overall • Southern Miss returns to Shreveport for its third Independence Bowl appearance but its first since 1988 • The Golden Eagles registered 438.3 yards per game during the regular season, ranking No. 34 in the FBS • Southern Miss has allowed just 321.9 yards per game, which ranks No. 17 in the FBS • There are several Florida State connections on Southern Miss coaching staff, including co-defensive coordinator Tony Pecoraro (Florida State student assistant, 2002-03, quality control assistant 2007-2009); defensive line coach Derek Nicholson (Florida State linebacker, 2005-08); offensive line coach Erik Losey (Florida State offensive graduate assistant, 2009-10); cornerbacks coach Dan Disch (Florida State alum, 1981) and offensive graduate assistant Bryan Stork (Florida State center, 2009-13) • Past Florida State-Southern Miss games include Brett Favre leading the Eagles to a win in 1989, one year after Deion Sanders' touchdown interception return had sparked a Seminoles' victory.

**Duke** - David Cutcliffe (58-67 in 10th year at Duke; 102-96 in 17th year overall)

**Northern Illinois** - Rod Carey (43-23 in 5th year at NIU and overall)

**Notes:** The Blue Devils are set to play in their fifth bowl game in six seasons and the program's 13th overall • Duke head coach David Cutcliffe, who is 5-4 all-time as a head coach in bowl games, will participate in the 27th bowl game of his coaching career • The Blue Devils own an all-time record of 4-8 in postseason games • The Blue Devils also have appeared in the Rose Bowl (1938 & 1941 seasons), Sugar Bowl (1944), Orange Bowl (1954 & 1957), Cotton Bowl (1960), All American Bowl (1989), Hall of Fame Bowl (1994), Belk Bowl (2012) Chick-fil-A Bowl (2013), Hyundai Sun Bowl (2014) and Pinstripe Bowl (2015) • LB Joe Giles-Harris was named Duke's season MVP • Giles-Harris earned first team All-ACC and second team All-America honors and leads the Blue Devils in tackles (117) and tackles for loss (15.0) while adding 4.5 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and seven quarterback pressures • Offensively, the Blue Devils are led by redshirt sophomore QB Daniel Jones, who has thrown for 2,439 yards and 12 touchdowns while rushing for an additional six scores • NIU will play in a postseason bowl for the ninth time in the last 10 seasons and for the 17th time in school history • The Huskies are 4-7 in bowl games since becoming a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) program in 1969 • The Huskies will face an ACC team for the second time in a bowl game, and for the second time this season as NIU fell to Boston College, 23-20, in the 2017 season opener • NIU features one of the top defenses in the country, led by one of the most dynamic players in the FBS, MAC Defensive Player of the Year Sutton Smith • The Huskies rank in the top 25 nationally in nine defensive categories, including rushing defense (11th) and total defense (18th) • NIU leads the nation in tackles for loss and is second in team sacks, while Smith, a Ted Hendricks Award finalist and All-America candidate, tops the national charts in both categories • NIU's program -- and some of its veteran players -- are no stranger to Detroit and Ford Field • The Huskies played in six consecutive MAC Championship games in the domed stadium from 2010 through 2015, claiming the trophy on three occasions.

**Notes:** This year's game will mark Virginia's first appearance in the Military Bowl, which is celebrating its 10-year anniversary • The Military Bowl will mark Virginia's 19th bowl appearance and first under second-year head coach Bronco Mendenhall • This will be the 40th meeting between UVA and Navy, but the first since 1994 • Navy leads the all-time series, 28-11, but Virginia is riding a five-game winning streak in head-to-head matchups, beating the Midshipmen annually from 1990 to 1994, most recently a 47-10 victory in Annapolis on Sept. 10, 1994 • Virginia's coach at that time was George Welsh, who guided the Cavaliers from 1982 to 2000 and is the all-time winningest coach in school history • Welsh previously coached Navy from 1973 to 1981, and his 55 victories at the academy are second only to current Midshipmen coach Ken Niumatalolo • Navy will be making its third appearance in the nation's capital region's bowl game • The Midshipmen lost to Wake Forest, 29-19, in the inaugural EagleBank Bowl at RFK Stadium in 2008 and beat Pittsburgh, 44-28, in the 2015 Military Bowl in Annapolis • This will be Navy's 14th postseason bowl appearance • Navy will be facing the Cavaliers on its home field at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium • Cavaliers LB Micah Kiser will enter the game fresh off a string of honors that includes the Campbell Award as the nation's top football scholar-athlete, second-team All-America honors and the Dudley Award presented to the top player in the state of Virginia • Kiser ranks No. 1 in the ACC and tied for No. 4 in the nation with 134 tackles • His 134 stops tie his 2016 output and Wali Rainer (1998) for No. 4 on UVA's single-season tackle list • Kiser and the UVA defense will be focused on a Navy ground-oriented attack that has seen backs Zach Abey and Malcolm Perry combine for 2,393 rushing yards and 23 touchdowns • Virginia will be making its first postseason appearance since the 2011 Chick-Fil-A Bowl • QB Kurt Benkert, a graduate student who began his college career at East Carolina, is the only player on the UVA roster to have played in a bowl game (ECU's 28-20 loss to Florida in the 2015 Birmingham Bowl).
