### VIRGINIA-MIAMI SERIES

- Miami holds an 18-12 lead in the all-time series with Virginia.
- UVA took three of four contests with Miami last season, winning two of three in Coral Gables before snagging the teams' game in the ACC tournament as well.
- The Hurricanes won two of three in 2009 in Charlottesville.
- Overall, Miami has claimed seven of the last 11 meetings.

### TIME TO SHAKE OFF THE RUST

- Virginia has had its struggles coming out of the exam break, posting an 11-10 record since 2004 in the series directly following finals.
- UVA bucked the trend last year, sweeping a three-game series with North Carolina at Davenport Field.

### NEW SEATS IN PLACE THIS WEEKEND

- Virginia added 249 general admission seats in time for the Miami series.
- This brings the Davenport Field seating capacity to 5,074.
- The seats are in right field nearest the foul pole.

### CAVALIERS MOVE UP SINGLE-SEASON WINS LEDGER

- Despite only playing 48 games thus far, the 2011 Virginia team already ranks seventh in single-season wins in UVA history with 43.
- With its next win the 2011 squad will move into the top five in single-season victories at Virginia.
- UVA leads all Division I teams in wins this year (Vanderbilt, 40).

### 2011 TEAM IS FASTEST TO 40 WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- With its 40-3 start, the 2011 Virginia team reached 40 wins in the fewest number of games in program history and the second fewest in ACC history (Clemson, 43 games, 1995).
- Virginia hit the 40-win plateau in game 49 last year (May 4 vs. VCU).
- This also marks the first time Virginia has reached 40 wins prior to the month of May.
- UVA has won 40 games or more games in seven of the last eight seasons.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia joins Vanderbilt as the lone teams in Division I with fewer than 10 losses this year.
- UVA is outscoring its foes by 5.1 runs/game – a full run more than any other team in the nation (Vandy, 4.1).
- UVA leads the ACC in batting (.314), pitching (2.23) and fielding (.983).
- UVA is 10-3 in one-run games this year.
- UVA is 35-0 this season when its opposition scores three runs or fewer.

### BRANDON GUYER MAKES MLB DEBUT

- Former Cavalier Brandon Guyer made his Major League Baseball debut last Friday with the Tampa Bay Rays, starting in left field against the Baltimore Orioles.
- Guyer made quite a splash, hitting a 2-run home run on a 3-1 pitch off the Orioles' Zach Britton in his first at bat.
- He became just the 109th player in MLB history and the first in Rays' history to homer in his first career at bat.
- Guyer played at UVa from 2005-07 and became the 27th former Cavalier to reach the Major League level.
- He was optioned back to triple-A Durham on Sunday as the Rays needed another pitcher on the roster.

### SENIORS TO BE HONORED SUNDAY

- Virginia will honor its senior class with Senior Day ceremonies prior to the Sunday contest with Miami.
- UVa's honorees: John Barr, Tyler Biddix, David Coleman, Kenny Swab, Tyler Wilson and Cody Winiarski, as well as managers Rod Larson and Tyler Wagner. (note: Corey Hunt was honored last year during Senior Day ceremonies).
- Over the last four years, Virginia has won a school-record 182 games, earned ACC regular-season and tournament championships and two NCAA regional titles as well as advancing to the program's first College World Series in 2009.

### SPREADING THE WEALTH ON OFFENSE

- Ten Virginia players have driven 20-plus runs each this season.
- This is just the fourth time this has occurred for a UVa baseball team, including the second straight.
- UVa also had 10 players reach 20 RBI in 1988, 2007 and 2010.

### CAVALIERS RUNNING WILD

- UVa went 10-for-12 in stolen base attempts during the Boston College series and 2-for-2 at VCU.
- The Cavaliers have been extremely successful on the basepaths of late, going 28 of 32 (87.5 percent) in stolen base attempts since April 1 (21 games).
- In the first 27 games, UVa was 41-for-62 (66.1 percent) in its stolen base tries.

### VIRGINIA VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has played 10 games against four ranked team this season, winning two of three against then-No. 4 Florida State (March 18-20) and then-No. 8 Georgia Tech (April 8-10), sweeping then-No. 4 Clemson (March 11-13) and winning 13-2 at then-No. 23 Auburn on Feb. 19.
- UVa went 19-10 against ranked opponents last year, including a 6-4 mark on the road.
- Virginia is 39-20-1 against ranked foes since 2009.

### CAVALIERS RECORD TWO SHUTOUTS IN BC SERIES

- Virginia picked up a pair of shutouts in its series at Boston College, winning the opener, 17-0, and the finale, 4-0.
- This is just the third time since the ACC went to the three-game series format in 1990 that Virginia has recorded a pair of shutouts in a series.
- UVa blanked Maryland twice in 2006 (6-0 and 8-0 on March 28 and 29, respectively) and again in 2007 (14-0 and 4-0 on March 27 and 29, respectively).

### BATS COME IN LIKE A LION IN APRIL

- Virginia sizzled at the plate in April, hitting at a .337 clip in 19 games during the month (16-3 record).
- UVa had at least 10 hits in 15 of 19 games.
- UVa posted 232 hits, including 49 doubles, seven triples and eight homers, in April (in contrast, its opponents had 143 hits in the same period).
- Six Cavalier regulars hit over .300 during that span, led by David Coleman at .549. Steven Proscia (.386), John Barr (.342), Reed Gagnani (.333), John Hicks (.313) and Jared King (.310) all hit over .300 in April.

### O'CONNOR REACHES 350 WINS IN FEWEST GAMES IN ACC HISTORY

- In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 359 wins entering the weekend (359-123-1); he reached 350 on April 15.
- He posted 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history (472).
- Mike Martin of Florida State was the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC).

### CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN LATEST RPI

- UVa was ranked No. 2 in the fifth RPI report, announced Tuesday by the NCAA.
- UVa held the No. 2 spot for the first two weeks, then supplanted Florida for the No. 1 position for a week before sliding back to No. 2 behind the Gators last week.
- Virginia already is 8-2 against the RPI top 25 and 13-4 against the top 50 this year.
- Miami stands 22nd in the RPI this week.

### ROBERTS OWNS LONGEST ACTIVE WIN STREAK

- Will Roberts boasts the longest active win streak in the nation with 16 straight victories.
- Roberts has yet to absorb a loss at UVa and is 16-0 in his career, including 9-0 this year.
- The only other pitchers nationally to have more than 10 straight wins currently are Texas' Taylor Jungmann (13) and Troy's Tyler Ray (11).
- UVa's Danny Hultzen owned the longest active streak (17) until his loss April 25 to NC State.

### VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 25 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 29 dates), UVa ranked 22nd nationally in total attendance in 2011 with 82,630.
- UVa also stood 23rd in average attendance at 2,849 fans per game.
- UVa has played in front of 11 home crowds of 3,000-plus this season, including a midweek record of 3,128 on Wednesday, April 20 vs. Richmond.

### COLEMAN CONTINUES TO MASH

- David Coleman has moved into second in the ACC with a .390 batting average, behind Clemson's Brad Miller (.422).

- Coleman has been the Cavaliers' hottest hitter of late. He hit .549 (28-for-51) with a team-best 21 RBI in April.
- He had a career-long 11-game hitting streak snapped at VCU on May 3.
- Coleman posted a pair of four-hit games in April and notched hits in 16 of the 17 games in which he played in the month (only exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).

## PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.6 runs per game, fewest in Division I baseball (Texas, 2.7).
- Virginia entered the week with a .983 fielding percentage which was third nationally behind San Francisco and Stony Brook (.984 each).
- UVa has committed 30 errors in 48 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

## WAHOOS RACK UP ACC-RECORD 14TH SHUTOUT

- Virginia has recorded 14 shutouts in its 42 wins this season, breaking the ACC record.
- The conference record of 11 shutouts was held by the 1977 Clemson and 2005 Virginia teams.
- The NCAA single-season shutout record is 24, set by the 1972 Arizona State team.
- UVa posted two shutouts in 2010 and five in 2009.

## CAVALIERS STRIKE FOR BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has a tendency to score in bunches, with 58 innings of three runs or more this season.
- The Cavaliers' single-inning high is 10 runs vs. Maryland; UVa scored nine in an inning vs. Duke as well.
- UVa has scored three runs in 32 different innings.
- On the flip side, Virginia has allowed just 14 innings of three or more runs (eight 3-run innings, five 4-run innings, one 6-run inning).

## PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time in school history, UVa has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak which started March 22 and ended April 10 at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

## PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-5 in all of those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (2nd, 2.23), strikeouts/9 innings (2nd, 10.0), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.74), fewest walks/9 inns (3rd, 2.21).
- UVa has allowed more than four earned runs just six times this year.

## VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,018 games all time (1,613 losses, 40 ties).

## HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 112, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (154).
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in eight of his 11 starts this season (13.32 per nine innings - second in nation to Bauer, 13.76).
- He has issued only 12 walks (9.33:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 10-1 in Hultzen's starts this year and 34-9 in his career, including 24-3 since 2010; UVa is 13-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia's streak of 15 straight series-opening wins with Hultzen pitching came to an end April 25 against NC State.
- With 112 strikeouts this season, Hultzen ranks fifth in UVa single-season history (needs one to reach fourth, set by Buddy Charles in 1950).

## HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record earlier this season. With 342 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He currently is 10th in career strikeouts in ACC history.

## HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He ranks first in career wins with 29 and passed Jacob Thompson (2006-08) for the most wins in program history. This also is tied for 22nd in ACC history.
- Hultzen is second in career winning percentage (.906; 29-3), just behind Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.14 stands second in UVa history, while his 342 strikeouts ranks first.
- He ranks sixth in innings pitched with 277.2. With 2.2 innings, he will match Pat Daneker (1995-97) for fifth place.

## VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 107 batters (2.21/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.23 team ERA.
- UVa easily leads the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings this year. (Clemson, 2.92/9 IP) .

## WILSON A FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball.
- One-third of the final voting tally comes from fan votes at [seniorclassaward.com](http://seniorclassaward.com).
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

## WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 5-0 with a 2.85 ERA in 11 starts this year. In 66.1 innings he has allowed just 52 hits and 18 walks with 79 strikeouts (sixth most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 22 career wins, which is tied for third in Virginia history (22-7, 3.15 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 83 (14 starts)
- Wilson has 222 career strikeouts, which ranks 10th in UVa history; he needs seven strikeouts to tie Joe Koshansky (2001-04) for ninth.

### ROBERTS CONTINUES STRONG PITCHING

- Will Roberts currently ranks among the ACC leaders in several categories.
- Roberts stands fourth in the ACC with a 1.43 ERA and is tied for second in wins (9), shutouts (2) and complete games (2) and eighth in opponent batting average (.207).
- Roberts has been a part of five shutouts – most of any pitcher in the nation this year.

### ROBERTS SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 26.2 INNS

- Will Roberts gave up a run-scoring single to Duke's David Perkins April 17 in the first inning, ending his scoreless innings streak at 26.2.
- That is the longest scoreless streak for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle worked 29.0-consecutive scoreless innings from April 10-May 25, 2005.
- He had not allowed a run in his previous four starts (5.0 innings vs. Towson, 9.0 vs. George Washington, 7.0 vs. Radford, 5.0 vs. Georgetown).
- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.

### CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has slowed its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 15 stolen bases in 31 attempts (48.4 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 24 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 51.6 percent of potential base stealers, UVa also tops the ACC. UNC is second (43.9 percent).

### KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 13 saves.
- He is tied for seventh in the NCAA in saves; the total also is the fourth most in a season in UVa history.
- Kline has struck out 40 in 28.2 innings (team-high 22 games). In that span he has allowed five runs, 18 hits and 11 walks (1.57 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

### HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate this year.
- He is batting a team-best .359, which ranks fourth in the ACC, and has 71 hits, which is tied with teammate Steven Proscia for second in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks has racked up a .330 batting average in 24 ACC games this season (14th in conference).

### HICKS MOVES UP UVA CAREER CHART

- John Hicks is fifth in Virginia history with 51 doubles; he needs one double to match Bill Narleski (1984-87) for fourth.
- With 152 career runs scored, Hicks ranks 10th in career runs at Virginia.

- Hicks needs four runs to tie Greg Miclat (2006-08) for ninth in the UVa annals.
- He currently has 224 career hits and needs two more to tie David Adams (2006-08) for 10th in UVa history.

### PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .391 clip (43-for-110). That ranks second in the conference behind Clemson's Brad Miller (.423).
- Proscia also leads the ACC with 43 hits in conference games. He is second in the ACC with 25 RBI in ACC games (behind UNC's Colin Moran, 28).
- He owns a .405 on base percentage in ACC play.
- Proscia has racked up two or more hits in 14 of the 24 ACC games, with at least one hit in 20 of 24.

### PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER

#### RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers, with a school-record 171 career RBI.
- He set the Virginia career RBI record April 30 at Boston College, moving out of a tie with Sean Doolittle (2005-07, 167).
- Proscia now has 237 career hits, which ranks ninth in Virginia history (he needs three hits to tie for eighth).
- Proscia also owns 55 career doubles, which is second in the Virginia career annals behind Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.
- Proscia ranks ninth in career at bats with 715 and also owns 25 career homers, which is tied with Bobby Rivell (1987-90), for 10th at UVa.

### MOST MARCH WINS EVER ...

- UVa recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

### FOLLOWED BY SECOND-MOST WINS IN APRIL

- Virginia went 16-3 in April as it posted its second-most wins ever in the month.
- UVa went 18-4 in April 1996.
- It stands as UVa's second-best winning percentage ever in the month of April (.842), topped only by the 1959 team (7-1, .875).

• Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.

• The lefties have combined to work 32.1 innings out of the bullpen and 40.0 innings total in 34 appearances.

• In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.

• Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVA while recovering from shoulder surgery.

## ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

• Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.

• Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.

• He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

## ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

• After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.

• He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week

• In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

## O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

• UVA head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.

• O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.

• The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

## DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

• A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVA averaged 3,148 fans per game.

• Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.

• Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

## VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

• Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.

• UVA is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

• Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.
