- Virginia looks for its second College Cup appearance as it hosts Michigan
- The Cavaliers are hosting a NCAA Quarterfinal for the third time (1990, 1992) • Nov. 29 is the second-latest date for a game in UVa history (12/1/01 at Santa
- Clara in NCAA quarterfinals)

SERIES HISTORY:

- First all-time meeting
- UVa is unbeaten (14-0-3) against first-time opponents since 2007
- Head Coach Steve Swanson is 1-0-0 vs. U-M (won 2-0 with Dartmouth, 9/9/95)
- Swanson was 4-0-0 vs. Michigan as player at Michigan State (1980-83)

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY:

• UVa is an overall top-four seed for the fifth time (1990, 1991, 1992, 2004, 2013)
• Virginia is participating in its 20th consecutive NCAA Tournament and 26th NCAA Tournament overall

- Only North Carolina and Notre Dame have longer active consecutive NCAA streaks
- Virginia has a 30-23-4 all-time NCAA Tournament record
- Under Steve Swanson, UVa has a 27-12-3 NCAA Tournament record

• UVa is 1-5-0 in NCAA Quarterfinals (won at UConn '91; lost vs. UConn '90, lost vs. Duke '92, lost at Santa Clara '01, lost at UCLA '05, lost at Florida St. '11)

AT HOME IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:

- Virginia is hosting NCAA Tournament play for the 20th year
- At home, Virginia is 24-12-3 in NCAA Tournament play
- UVa is 22-4-2 at home in NCAA play since 2000

2013 CAVALIER WOMEN'S SOCCER GAME NOTES

SEEKING CARY:

- Virginia is looking to reach its second Women's College Cup
- The Cavaliers were a semifinalist in 1991 when the tournament was 12 teams
- Mary Morgan, Kate Norbo and Morgan Stith are the only current Cavaliers who were born the last time Virginia made the College Cup
- LOOK HOOS THE TOP SEED:
- Virginia is the overall No. 1 seed in this year's NCAA Tournament
- UVa is the ninth school to be the overall No. 1 (Brown, Connecticut, Massa-
- chusetts, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Penn State, Santa Clara, Stanford)
- The overall No. 1 has made the College Cup the last five seasons, but only one of those teams won the championship (Stanford - 2011)

PERFECTION IN THE REGULAR SEASON:

- Virginia completed a perfect regular season with a 19-0 record (13-0 ACC)
- First team to have a perfect regular season since Stanford in 2009 (20-0)
- First ACC team to have a perfect regular season since UNC in 2003 (18-0)
- First team to go unbeaten/untied in ACC play since UNC in 2006 (10-0)
- Virginia won its first ACC regular season championship

GOALS, GOALS, GOALS!!!:

 Virginia leads the nation in scoring at 3.12 goals per game, scoring a national-best 75 goals

- UVa also leads the nation in assists and points per game
- The 75 goals are a school record, topping the 66 goals they scored in 2012
- Of the 75 goals scored, the Cavaliers have 14 different goal scorers

SCORING STREAK:

 Virginia is one of two schools nationally to have scored a goal in every game this season (Elon)

• Dating back to last year, UVa has scored in 32 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the nation (next longest, Elon - 21)

WHILE YOU WERE DISTRACTED BY ALL THE GOALS:

- The Cavalier defense has posted shutouts in 11 of the last 14 games
- Virginia leads the ACC with 16 shutouts, setting a new school record
- UVa's 0.58 goals against average ranks 3rd in the ACC

DOMINATING PERFORMANCES:

- Virginia has more goals (75) this season than shots on goal allowed (57)
- That +18 ratio isn't just the highest in the nation, UVa is the only school in positive figures
- UVa had more goals than shots on goal allowed in 17 of 24 games this
- season
- Virginia leads the nation with a +61 goal differential this season

THE SCHOOL-RECORD 20-GAME WIN STREAK:

- UVa had its school-record 20-game win streak snapped in the ACC semis
- The previous school record was a 16-game win streak set in 1990
- It was 10th 20-game streak in ACC history, the first by a team other than UNC

- **GOALS vs. SOG ALLOWED** Virginia (75-57) +18 North Carolina (50-56) -6
 - -13 Georgetown (58-71)
 - Florida State (52-75) -23 -25 Florida (52-77)

BENCH PRODUCTION:

- Virginia has recorded 20 goals and 22 assists this season from substitutes
- 92 of 323 Division I teams scored fewer goals this season than the UVa bench
- The Cavaliers have gotten a goal or assist off the bench in 15 of 24 games

CURRENT STREAKS:

• Virginia has won 17 consecutive home games (school record)

- Virginia has won 17 consecutive non-conference games (school record)
- Virginia has won 31 straight games and is unbeaten in its last 45 games
- (43-0-1) against unranked opponents

COMEBACK CAVALIERS:

Virginia rallied from a deficit to win at BC, Pitt and Duke, the first time in school history with three consecutive come-from-behind wins
UVa has five come-from-behind wins this season, the most in school history for an entire season, breaking the previous high of four (1997 and 1998)
The win at Duke marked the sixth time in school history that UVa rallied to win when trailing by two goals (first time since at PSU in 2009 NCAA 2nd rd)

PACK THE HOUSE:

- Virginia had a record women's soccer crowd of 3,894 for the Florida State game on Oct. 27
- It broke the previous record of 2,838 set 17 days earlier during the win over Notre Dame

• This season has produced the five largest

crowds in school history and six of the top 10 • Virginia ranks fourth nationally in attendance, averaging 1,985 fans per game

• The crowd of 1,988 for the NCAA 2nd round game vs. Georgetown was the largest women's soccer NCAA Tournament crowd in Klöckner history

SWANSON REACHES PAIR OF MILESTONES:

• Virginia head coach Steve Swanson earned his 300th career win on Sept. 19 with the 2-1 victory at Boston College

- Swanson became the 16th Division I coach to join the 300 win club, and the 11th to accululate 300 wins at the Division I level
- He became the 31st NCAA coach (all divisions) to reach the milestone
- On Oct. 6, he posted his 200th win at Virginia with the 3-0 win over Clemson

TRIO OF DOUBLE DIGIT SCORERS:

With Makenzy Doniak (19 goals), Morgan Brian (15) and Brittany Ratcliffe (12), UVa is the one of two teams nationally with three 10-goal scorers (Santa Clara)
It is the first time in school history that UVa has had three 10-goal scorers
UVa is the first ACC team with three double-digit goal scorers since UNC in 2006 (Yael Averbuch-16, Heather O'Reilly-12, Whitney Engen-12)

FOUR HOOS SCORE 20:

• Virginia leads the nation with four players with at least 20 points (Brian-44, Doniak-43, Ratcliffe-27, Colaprico-23)

2013 CAVALIER WOMEN'S SOCCER GAME NOTES

20-20-20 VISION WITH BRIAN, DOUGLAS & DONIAK:

• Virginia has three players with at least 20 career goals in Morgan Brian (30), Makenzy Doniak (29) and Gloria Douglas (22)

• It is the first time UVa has had three active 20-goal scorers since 1991

MO AND MAK LEAD THE ATTACK:

• Morgan Brian (15G-14A-44P) and Makenzy Doniak (19G-5A-43P) are the top two scorers in the ACC

 Virginia is the first team nationally to have two 40-point scorers since 2009 when three schools accomplished the feat: UCLA (Sydney Leroux & Lauren Chaney), Stanford (Christen Press & Kelley O'Hara) and Florida State (Tiffany McCarty and Jessica Price)

ACC-OLADES:

- Virginia had six players named to All-ACC teams
- Morgan Brian, Makenzy Doniak and Emily Sonnett were on the first team
- Brian becomes UVa's seventh 3-time first-team All-ACC selection
- Danielle Colaprico was named to the second team
- Molly Menchel was named to the third team
- Steve Swanson was named ACC Coach of the Year

BRIAN DOES DOUBLE DUTY WITH VIRGINIA & USWNT:

 Morgan Brian has earned three caps with the United States Women's National Team this year, as she has played for both UVa and the USWNT this fall

• She has made appearances against South Korea (June 15), Mexico (Sept. 3) and Australia (Oct. 20)

• She scored her first goal for the USWNT on Sept. 3 in the 7-0 victory over Mexico in Washington, D.C.

• She became the first active collegian to score for the USWNT since Alex Morgan in 2010 (as a senior at Cal)

 At age 20, Brian is the youngest USWNT goal-scorer since Christine Nairn (at age 18) scored for the team in 2009

• She is one of three current collegians to have earned a cap with the USWNT (North Carolina's Crystal Dunn, Santa Clara's Julie Johnston)

• Brian will participate in the USWNT's camp in December in Carson, Calif. following the conclusion of the collegiate season

BRIAN A FINALIST FOR US SOCCER AWARD:

 Morgan Brian is one of five finalists for the 2013 US Soccer Young Female Athlete of the Year Award

BRIAN SCORING & SETTING UP GOALS:

- Morgan Brian has double-figure goals (15) and assists (14) this season
- She is just the second Cavalier to reach double figures in both categories in the same season, joining Andrea Rubio (13 goals, 10 assists) in 1990

BRIAN PASSING WITH FLYING COLORS:

- Morgan Brian has tied the school record for assists in a season with 14
- She leads the ACC in assists and assists/game
- She is ninth nationally in assists/game (0.61)
- Brian's 29 career assists already rank fourth in school history

BRIAN BECOMES VIRGINIA'S TOP NCAA TOURNAMENT SCORER:

- Morgan Brian enters the game with 17 career points (7G, 3A) in NCAA play
- She ranks first in Virginia history in NCAA Tournament points and goals
- Danielle Colaprico's seven NCAA Tournament assists also rank first at UVa

DONIAK WITH THE HAT TRICK:

Makenzy Doniak scored her first career hat trick against Saint Francis in the first round of the NCAA Tournament

• It was the first hat trick by a Cavalier this season and the 14th in UVa history

• It was the fourth NCAA Tournament hat trick in Virginia history (Angela Hucles vs. JMU-1997; Lindsay Gusick vs. Cincinnati-2001; Kelly Hammond vs. JMU-2004)

RATCLIFFE, THE SUPER SUB:

• Brittany Ratcliffe has 12 goals this season, 11 of which have come off the bench

• Her 11 goals off the bench is a school record for goals as a substitute for a season, breaking the previous record of six

STEARNS SHINES IN GOAL:

Morgan Stearns is the first true-freshman goalkeeper to start multiple games in a season for Virginia since Jodi Clugston made 11 starts in 2000
She ranks fourth in the ACC with a 0.62 goals against average

MENCHEL STEPS UP WHEN IT COUNTS:

• Defender Molly Menchel has scored 12 career goals, the most career goals by a Cavalier defender

• Seven of her 12 career goals have been game-winning goals, including three this season (VCU, Richmond, BC)

COLAPRICO ASSISTS:

• Danielle Colaprico is second in the ACC in assists with 13, trailing only teammate Morgan Brian's 14 assists

Colaprico's 13 assists rank fourth for a season in UVa history

• She has three multi-assist games this season and four for her career (including two in the NCAA Tournament)

TRIO SET APPREANCE RECORD:

Gloria Douglas, Molly Menchel and Kate Norbo all set the UVa record for career appearances with their 94th game against Wake Forest in the 3rd round
The record had been held by Sarah Senty, who made 93 appearances from 2005-08

UP NEXT:

• The Virginia-Michigan winner will advance to the College Cup to play either North Carolina or UCLA

• That semifinal game would be Friday, Dec. 6 in Cary, N.C.

• The semifinal games are scheduled for 5 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. and both will air live on ESPNU
