Noting ACC Football ACC Lands Two Top 10 Teams in Coaches Poll

Florida State and Clemson landed in the Top 10 in this week's Amway Coaches poll. FSU, which has been in the Top 10, moved up to sixth, while Clemson made its first appearance in the nation's Top 10 at No. 9. Georgia Tech is 16th this week. Four other ACC teams are among others receiving votes in the Coaches poll in Duke, Miami, NC State and Pitt.

Florida State's Dalvin Cook Named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week

After rushing for a career-high 266 yards and three touchdowns in FSU's 34-14 win over South Florida, Florida State's **Dalvin Cook** was named the Walter Camp National Player of the Week. Cook is 2nd in the nation in rushing this week--first among the Power Five--averaging 211 yards a game and his 266-yard total against USF is the highest single-game performance in the nation and the 11th-best in ACC history.

ACC Sets Scoring Mark

The ACC's 14 teams set a league record for scoring on a weekend, totaling 574 points and averaging 41.0 points per team. Both total points and average per team are the most in league history.

Virginia Tech-Ohio State Most Viewed Opening Weekend Game; ACC Involved In All Top Five

Last Monday Night's Labor Day Battle between Virginia Tech and Ohio State was the most watched opening weekend college football game ever on ESPN-ABC with 10,585,000 viewers. The ACC is involved in all of the Top Five most-watched games on the opening weekend for ESPN-ABC.

A Perfect Ten

This week the **ACC Network** will televise the Northwestern at Duke game to 125 different markets nationally, including all of the Top 10 TV markets in the nation and 85 of the Top 100.

ACC & The Big Ten Face Off In Five Games *No. 11 Clemson, Louisville Clash on ESPN Thursday Night; 9th-Ranked FSU Faces Boston College on ESPN Friday; No. 14 Georgia Tech Travels to 8th-ranked Notre Dame*

Florida State (6th) and **Clemson** (9th) are both in the nation's Top 10 in the Coaches poll this week, while **Georgia Tech** was ranked 16th...In AP, FSU is ninth followed by Clemson (11th) and Georgia Tech (14th)...The Atlantic Coast Conference posted a 10-2 non-conference record last weekend and is now 20-6 (.769) against non-conference foes on the year, with four of the six losses to teams ranked in the nation's Top 18 this week...A pair of Atlantic Division contests open Week Three with **Louisville** hosting 11th-ranked **Clemson** on ESPN Thursday night (7:30 pm) and **Boston College** hosting ninth-ranked **Florida State** at Alumni Stadium and on ESPN on Friday (8 p.m.)...The ACC and the Big Ten will square off in five games this Saturday...Three

ACC teams will host. No. 23 **Northwestern** visits **Duke**, **Miami** will host **Nebraska** and **Illinois** will play at **North Carolina**. Games at Big Ten schools will include **Virginia Tech** at **Purdue** and **Pitt** at **Iowa**...No. 11 **Clemson**, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by explosive **QB Deshaun Watson**, will open the weekend travelling to Louisville's Papa John's Cardinal Stadium on Thursday (7:30 p.m., ESPN)...Louisville, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, is looking for stability at QB after playing **Lamar Jackson**, **Reggie Bonnafon** and **Kyle Bolin** in a pair of close losses to then sixth-ranked **Auburn** (seven points) and **Houston** (three points)... nation in five major defensive categories, including total defense (51.0) and rushing defense (7.0) after holding Howard to just 11 total yards of offense, the fewest yards allowed in ACC history...The Eagles are led defensively by the linebacker tandem of **Steve Daniels** and **Connor Strachan**...They will be facing a **Florida State** offense which features the nation's 2nd-leading rusher in sophomore **TB Dalvin Cook** (211.0/gm)...The Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, are led by **QB Everett Golson**, who ranks 18th nationally in pass efficiency (173.6)...FSU enters Friday night's game with a 24-game winning streak against ACC opponents...Saturday, 14th-ranked Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, travels to South Bend, Ind., to face the 8th-ranked Fighting Irish, coached by Brian Kelly...Tech's spread-option offense, engineered by **QB Justin Thomas**, has been in high gear and leads the nation in rushing, averaging 457 yards per game in wins over Alcorn State and Tulane and recording the most points in ACC history in a two-game span (134)...The Irish have sophomore Deshone Kiser making his first start at QB after Malik Zaire suffered a season-ending injury in a close win over Virginia... Notre Dame is also led by WR Will Fuller and RB C.J. Prosise...In Chapel Hill, N.C., **North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Marquise Williams**, will host the Fighting Illini of Illinois at Kenan Stadium (Noon, ESPN2)...Illinois, coached by Bill Cubit, has been impressive in a pair of wins and is fourth nationally in total defense and pass efficiency defense...A few miles to the East in Durham, N.C., **Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, will host 24th-ranked Northwestern at **Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium** (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...The Blue Devils are currently in the midst of a two-year renovation of Wallace Wade, which already features the new Brooks Field...**Duke** is also featuring a new QB this year in junior **Thomas Sirk**, who ranks 16th nationally in pass efficiency...Northwestern, coached by Pat Fitzgerald, has impressive wins over Stanford and Eastern Illinois...At Sun Life Stadium (3:30 pm, ABC/ESPN2) in Miami Gardens, Fla., **Miami**, coached by **Al Golden**, puts its 2-0 record on the line against Nebraska, coached by Mike Riley...The Hurricanes are led by **QB Brad Kaaya** and also rank 8th nationally in total defense...Virginia Tech, coached by **Frank Beamer** and led by **QB Brenden Motley**, will travel to face Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium in West Lafayette, Ind. (3:30 pm, ESPN2)...The Boilermakers are coached by Darrell Hazell, who is assisted by former North Carolina offensive coordinator John Shoop...Motley was

impressive in a win over Furman last week after taking over for Michael Brewer, who was injured against No. 1 Ohio State...Pitt, coached by first-year head coach **Pat Narduzzi**, complete the ACC-Big Ten games this weekend by traveling to Iowa City Iowa, to face Iowa, coached by Kirk Ferentz at Kinnick Stadium (8 p.m., Big Ten Network)...The Hawkeyes are coming off a big win over in-state rival Iowa State...Pitt features an offense built around a collection of tailbacks led by **Qadree Ollison** and pre-season All-America **WR Tyler Boyd**, who had 11 catches in his season debut against Akron, as well as an aggressive defense that limited the Zips to just 110 total yards... **Syracuse**, which currently sits atop the ACC's Atlantic Division after a win over Wake Forest last week, looks to continue its winning ways, hosting Central Michigan of the Mid-American Conference at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. (12:30 pm, RSN)...Coached by **Scott Shafer**, the Orange are led by true freshman **QB Eric Dungey**...Forced into action in the first half of Syracuse season-opener due to an injury to **QB Terrel Hunt**, Dungey has led the 'Cuse to back-to-back wins and is ranked seventh nationally in pass efficiency (197.8)...Syracuse' defense ranks 2nd nationally against the run and 11th in total defense...**NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren**, travels to Norfolk, Va., to face Old Dominion of Conference USA at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium (8 p.m., ASN)...The Wolfpack is led by **QB Jacoby Brissett**, who leads the nation in pass completion percentage (.844), and **TB Matt Dayes**, who is averaging 121 yards a game...Old Dominion is coached by Bobby Wilder and led by TB Ray Lawry, who leads the nation in rushing (219.0/gm)...In Charlottesville, Va., Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, looks to rebound from a loss in the final 12 seconds of play to 8th-ranked Notre Dame, hosting William and Mary at Scott Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...Against the Irish, the Cavaliers received strong performances from **QB Matt Johns** and **WR Canaan Severin**...William & Mary is coached by the legendary Jimmie Laycock, who has won 230 games in 36 seasons with the Tribe...**Wake Forest** completes the week as the Demon Deacons will travel to West Point, N.Y., to face the Cadets of Army at Michie Stadium (Noon, CBSSN)...Wake, coached by **Dave Clawson**, is led by **QB John Wolford**, who leads the ACC in passing yards (696), while Army, seeking its first win of the season, is coached by former Georgia Tech assistant **Jeff Monken**.

ACC Football By The Numbers

.844 - The national-leading completion percentage for NC State **QB Jacoby Brissett**. Brissett has completed 38 of 45 passes for 412 yards and 3 TDs in NC State's season-opening wins over Troy and Eastern Kentucky. Brissett has now thrown 129 consecutive passes without an interception. Clemson's **Deshaun Watson** ranks seventh nationally in completion percentage (.771).

.927 - The career field-goal percentage of Florida State **PK Robert Aguayo**, who leads all active placekickers with 25 or more career attempts. Aguayo has made 51 of his 55 career field-goal attempts. Aguayo has made an ACC-record 161 consecutive PAT attempts.

3 - Three **ACC teams** recorded shutouts this past weekend as Duke defeated N.C. Central (55-0), NC State blanked Eastern Kentucky (35-0) and Boston College kept Howard from scoring (76-0). That's the first time the ACC has had three teams record shutouts against non-conference teams on the same weekend since 1990.

4 - After losing nine of its first 10 appearances on ESPN's Thursday Night package, **Clemson**, under Dabo Swinney, has turned that number around and has now won four straight games on Thursdays when televised by ESPN. That streak began in 2012. The Tigers travel to Louisville this Thursday night for a nationally televised game on ESPN.

5 - **Georgia Tech** became only the fifth team since World War II to score 65 or more points in its first two games of the season when it scored 69 against Alcorn State and added 65 against Tulane. Only nine teams have accomplished that since 1920. The teams since WWII are Baylor (2013), Kansas State (1998), Ohio State (1996) and Florida (1994).

11 - The number of pass receptions for Virginia senior **WR Canaan Severin** against 10th-ranked Notre Dame. Severin recorded a career high against the Irish, totalling 153 receiving yards

18 - As of Tuesday, Sept. 8, NFL rosters included 18 quarterbacks who played at current **ACC schools**. That is the most of any conference nationally. In all, 16

of the 18 were on active rosters and six were projected starters.

24 - **Florida State** enters Friday night's game at Boston College having won 24 consecutive games against Atlantic Coast Conference teams. The streak dates back to a 17-16 loss to NC State in 2012. The Noles' winning streak ties for the second-longest in league history, bettered only by the 29-game skein FSU achieved when it entered the ACC in 1992. That streak ended at Virginia in 1995. FSU also put together a 24-game winning streak which began in 1998 and ended in 2001.

57 - The number of career field goals for Duke senior **PK Ross Martin**, who is the active career leader among all ACC kickers and ranks 2nd nationally. Martin, who has made all five of his FG attempts this year, has made 57 of his 68 career attempts, an .838 percentage.

60 - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles just two games into his sixth season as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .843 (60-11) is the best of any ACC coach after his first six seasons as a head coach.

76 - **Boston College** recorded several ACC records in a 76-0 win over Howard last week. The margin of victory was the most by an ACC team. BC only allowed Howard 11 yards of total offense, which also breaks the old ACC standard of 17, set by NC State against Western Carolina in 1990. BC also set an ACC mark for most points in a quarter, tallying 41 in the first quarter, and also in a half with 62.

89 - Two ACC pass plays covered exactly 89 yards for a touchdown last weekend. Duke's **Shaun Wilson** took a **Thomas Sirk** pass 89 yards for a score against North Carolina Central, while Syracuse's **Brisly Esteime** covered the same distance on a pass from **Eric Dungey** against Wake Forest.

134 - **Georgia Tech** has scored 134 points in its first two games of the year, the most in ACC history in the first two games of any season. Florida State held the previous standard, scoring 124 in the first two contests of 2012. FSU also holds the record for most points in back-

to-back games with 139 in the national championship season of 2013.

169 - In his last five games, dating back to 2014, but including games against Florida, Georgia Tech, Oregon, Texas State and USF, Florida State **TB Dalvin Cook** has averaged rushing for 169.2 yards per game. During that time Cook has also averaged 7.1 yards per carry (119-846).

197.8 - The pass efficiency rating for Syracuse true freshman **QB Eric Dungey** through two games of the season. Dungey, who was forced into the lineup due to an injury suffered by Terrel Hunt, has completed 18 of 30 passes for 335 yards and 4 scores and ranks 7th nationally in passing efficiency.

243 - **Miami's Joe Yearby** rushed for 146 yards and had 97 receiving yards in the Hurricanes' 44-20 win at Florida Atlantic totalling 243 yards rushing and receiving. He became the first ACC player with 95 or more yards in rushing and receiving in a game since Georgia Tech's Robert Godhigh (126 and 103) did it at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.

274 - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314).

373 - For the second week in a row, Wake Forest sophomore **QB John Wolford** topped a career high when he threw for 373 yards against Syracuse. Wolford threw for a previous career high of 323 yards in a season-opening win over Elon. He leads the ACC with 696 passing yards.

2,530 - The number of career pass receiving yards for Pitt preseason All-American **WR Tyler Boyd**. Boyd is the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in each of his freshman and sophomore seasons. He now ranks 25th on the ACC career receiving yards list and is tied for 26th in pass receptions (174).

Atlantic Coast Conference Announces Football Players of the Week

Florida State leads all schools with four selections

September 14, 2015

Sophomore running back **Dalvin Cook** leads a group of four Florida State student-athletes earning ACC Football Player of the Week honors, as announced by the conference office on Monday. Cook was selected as the ACC Offensive Back of the Week, while **Roderick Johnson** was named Offensive Lineman of the Week, **Jalen Ramsey** the Co-Defensive Back of the Week and **Roberto Aguayo** the Specialist of the Week. Cook, who rushed for 266 yards and three touchdowns in the Seminoles' 34-14 win over South Florida, was also named the Walter Camp Football Foundation Offensive Player of the Week. Two players from Syracuse were honored following the Orange's 30-17 win over Wake Forest in its conference season opener, with **Julian Whigham** tabbed as the Co-Defensive Back of the Week and **Eric Dungey** the Rookie of the Week. Also recognized were Virginia's **Canaan Severin** (Receiver of the Week), Pitt's **Tyrique Jarrett** and Clemson's **Shaq Lawson** (Co-Defensive Linemen of the Week), and North Carolina's **Shakeel Rashad** (Linebacker of the Week).

OFFENSIVE BACK – Dalvin Cook, Florida State, So., RB, 5-11, 202, Miami, Fla.

Cook rushed for 266 yards and three touchdowns on 30 carries to lead the Seminoles to a 34-14 victory over USF. Cook's rushing total is the most by a running back in the nation this season and the most by an ACC running back in almost two seasons (since Boston College's Andre Williams rushed for 339 yards against NC State on Nov. 16, 2013). Cook had a 74-yard touchdown in the first quarter, a 24-yard score in the second quarter and a 37-yard touchdown in the fourth. He became the first Seminole with a 200-yard rushing game since Sammie Smith in 1988 while posting the second-best rushing total in FSU history.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Roderick Johnson, Florida State, So., LT, 6-7, 323, Florissant, Mo.

Johnson paved the way Florida State's offense in its 34-14 victory over USF. Johnson had the highest grade of any FSU offensive lineman and registered five knockdown blocks while opening holes for the Seminoles to total 278 yards on the ground, including 266 from Dalvin Cook. Overall, Florida State had 441 yards of total offense, including 331 in the second half. FSU's offense picked up as the game wore on, scoring points on all five of its second-half possessions.

RECEIVER – Canaan Severin, Virginia, Sr., WR, 6-2, 210, Marlborough, Mass.

Severin set career highs with 11 receptions for 153 yards as Virginia made a serious bid to upset No. 9 Notre Dame before falling 34-27. He also recorded the longest catch of his career (38 yards), and seven of his receptions resulted in a first down. Severin also drew one pass interference call against the Irish secondary.

CO-DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Tyrique Jarrett, Pitt, Jr., DT, 6-3, 335, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Jarrett spearheaded a Pitt defensive effort that limited Akron to just 110 total yards in Saturday's 24-7 win. The Panthers' junior had three tackles for losses (eight yards) among his five total stops. When he was not making tackles, Jarrett was a disruptive force by plugging up running lanes. He played a major role in the Zips netting just 47 rush yards on 24 carries (just less than 2.0 yards per carry.).

Shaq Lawson, Clemson, Jr., DE, 6-3, 275, Central, S.C.

Lawson had three tackles for loss, including a sack, in Clemson's 41-10 win over Appalachian State. Lawson's big plays took place in the first half when the Tigers took a commanding 31-0 lead. He had four tackles for the game and was a big reason Clemson's pass rush helped limit Appalachian State to just 95 yards through the air and just nine completions in 28 attempts.

LINEBACKER – Shakeel Rashad, North Carolina, Sr., OLB, 6-2, 235, Jacksonville, Fla.

Rashad forced a fumble, intercepted a pass, broke up another and had two tackles – including a 10-yard tackle for loss – in North Carolina's 53-14 win over North Carolina A&T. In the first quarter, Rashad forced a fumble that was scooped up by teammate Sam Smiley and returned 52 yards to set up a UNC score. On the next NC A&T possession, Rashad picked off a pass to stop a promising Aggies' drive.

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – Jalen Ramsey, Florida State, Jr., CB, 6-1, 222, Smyrna, Tenn.

Ramsey proved dominant in shutting down his side of the field in Florida State's 34-14 victory over USF. The junior cornerback was rarely tested but still had three pass break-ups and helped limit the Bulls to just 125 yards through the air (71 of which came on a broken play on the opposite side of Ramsey). He ranks second in the ACC and tied for fifth nationally with four passes broken up this season.

Julian Whigham, Syracuse, Sr., CB, 6-1, 187, West Palm Beach, Fla.

Whigham had seven total tackles, including six solo stops, and broke up two passes as the Orange improved to 2-0 overall and posted a 30-17 win over Wake Forest at the Carrier Dome in their Atlantic Coast Conference opener.

SPECIALIST – Roberto Aguayo, Florida State, Jr.-r, PK, 6-1, 204, Mascotte, Fla.

Aguayo broke the ACC record for consecutive PATs (161) and officially became the most accurate kicker in the NCAA record books in the Seminoles' 34-14 victory over USF on Saturday. Aguayo made field goals from 30 yards and 38 yards and nailed all four of his extra points. Aguayo needed to make 50 field goals in his career to qualify for NCAA records. He is now 51 of 55 on field goals (.927) – the highest percentage in college football history – and has made 212 of 216 career kicks (.982). The latter is also the best mark for combined PATs and field goals.

ROOKIE – Eric Dungey, Syracuse, Fr., QB, 6-4, 195, Lake Oswego, Ore.

Making his first collegiate start, Dungey finished 8-of-13 for 221 yards – including touchdown throws of 89 and 53 yards – without throwing an interception in the Orange's 30-17 win over visiting Wake Forest. The 89-yard touchdown pass was the third longest in school history. The Oregon native also ran the ball 12 times for 36 yards.

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night



The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When Clemson travels to Louisville for this Thursday night's (7:30) game at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium against the Cardinals, the game will be the 95th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the third time that Louisville has hosted an ACC team. The Cardinals have hosted Florida State twice previously, once last year, a 42-31 Seminole win, and in 2002, a 26-20 overtime upset of the then fourth-ranked Seminoles.

Louisville also lost to Miami in 2004 on an ESPN Thursday night game, a 41-39 thriller in the old Orange Bowl. Overall, the Cardinals are 11-8 on ESPN Thursdays, including a 6-5 mark at home.

Clemson comes into this week's game with a 5-9 mark when playing on ESPN's Thursday night, but under current head coach Dabo Swinney, the Tigers are 4-1 and have won their last four games on ESPN Thursday night.

Virginia Tech has won more games (20) on ESPN Thursday Night than any other ACC team. The Hokies of coach Frank Beamer will travel to Georgia Tech later this year (Nov. 12) for their only Thursday appearance this year. The Hokies are 20-9 overall on ESPN Thursday night.

Georgia Tech has hosted more Thursday night games than any other ACC school, a total of 19. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory. The Yellow Jackets are 11-16 overall on Thursday night ESPN games.

Miami has the highest winning percentage (.857) of any ACC team on ESPN Thursdays, having posted an 18-3 mark, including a 7-2 record on the road. The Hurricanes have been better at home, with an 11-1 record in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 166 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies and Yellow Jackets, Miami leads in total appearances with 21, followed by Pitt (20), NC State (19), Louisville (19), Clemson (14), Florida State (14), North Carolina (14), Boston College (12) and Virginia (12).

When Maryland was a member of the ACC, the Terrapins played in 13 Thursday ESPN games, 10 of them at home.

There have been many great moments in the Thursday night series, including the 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game

still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers, both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third-quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC upset 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was a classic a see-saw battle decided when the Hokies' David Wilson returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchswin with 2:23 remaining. Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's win over second-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating. Louisville recorded a pair of strong ratings while a member of the Big East in 2006, a 5.33 in downing West Virginia and a 5.03 in losing to Rutgers.

This week's game is the second of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. North Carolina dropped a 17-13 decision to South Carolina in a game play in Charlotte on Sept. 3. The next ACC Thursday appearance will be on Oct. 1 when Miami travels to Cincinnati of the American Athletic Conference. North Carolina then makes its second Thursday night appearance of the year when it travels to Pitt on Oct. 29 and Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech wrap things up in Atlanta on Nov. 12 in a Coastal Division matchup at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 274 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 167 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach **Bobby Bowden**, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

His winning percentage is the best of any first-time ACC head coach after five seasons and is second only to Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby

Bowden, who posted a 54-6-1 record (.893) in his first five seasons in the ACC. Clemson's Danny Ford (.789) and Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (.776) have the next best marks after their first five seasons in the league.

Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).

North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

After three seasons with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 15 times and bettered 30 points 24 times in 38 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 35.4 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first three seasons, UNC has averaged 446 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning its final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 18 of 20 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .900, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 23 of his first 26 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .885. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins over the past two seasons, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to almost as many wins (42) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

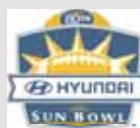

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Boston College and Penn State ended regulation tied at 24-24 in the Pinstripe Bowl, they played the 71st game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 71 overtime contests, a large portion of them--29--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 71 overtime contests, 35 have been ACC games while 36 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 38-24 advantage in the 62 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 37-34 record. Fifty-two of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
