VIRGINIA CONTINUES ACC PLAY AT PITT

• Virginia returns to the road on Saturday when the Cavaliers travel to Heniz Field to take on the Pitt Panthers. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m. and the game will be televised by regional sports networks.

VIRGINIA AT NFL STADIUMS

• Virginia is 10-18 all-time in stadiums that at the time of the contest were active NFL stadiums.

 Seven of the 14 NFL stadiums UVA has played in are still active today.

 Since UVA's 28-21 win at Miami in 2011, the Cavaliers have lost their last five games in NFL stadiums, including twice at Pitt (Heinz Field) and twice at Miami (Hard Rock Stadium). The streak started in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl (Georgia Dome).

• Virginia also plays at the Miami Dolphins' Hard Rock Stadium this season, when the Cavaliers play the Miami Hurricanes on Nov. 18.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

• The series between UVA and Pitt began in 1953, but until the Panthers joined the ACC in 2013, these two teams only met twice in the regular season between 1956 and 2012.

• FS Quin Blanding needs four tackles to pass Jamie Sharper and become UVA's all-time career leader in that category. He needs 35 tackles to pass UNC's Dexter

Reid (2000-03) for the most career tackles in ACC history by a defensive back.

• WR Doni Dowling needs to two receptions to become the 22nd player in Virginia history with 100 career receptions.

• With 338 career tackles, ILB Micah Kiser ranks No. 13 all-time at Virginia in career tackles. He is four tackles away from No. 12 Athony Poindexter and 16 away from entering the Top 10, where Stuart Anderson sits with 354 career stops.

• UVA has started off 2-0 on the road for the first time since the 2000 season when the Cavaliers won road games at Duke and Wake Forest. The last time UVA started a season 3-0 on the road it was 1992 with wins at Navy, Duke and Wake Forest.

#HoosRising: BY THE NUMBERS

FS Quin Blanding's 432 career tackles are the most among all active FBS players and ranks No. 2 all-time in the UVA record book.

HB Olamide Zaccheaus already has 49 catches through seven games. Last season, his 51 receptions was one shy of Taguan Mizzell's team lead.

Lester Coleman broke the single-game UVA record for punting average against Boston College with 52.3 yards per punt over seven punts.

On each Monday during the season, ACC schools will announce any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Wednesday for Friday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful - Out

S UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

PITT SERIES NOTES

THE SERIES VS. THE PANTHERS

Pittsburgh leads the all-time series by a 6-3 margin.
Between 1956 and 2012 UVA and Pitt only met twice in the regular season and once in a bowl game. Once Pitt joined the ACC in 2013, the two programs have met every season as members of the ACC Coastal Division.
Until UVA's 44-14 win in the 2007 Scott Stadium meeting, Pittsburgh had won all three regular-season meetings. The Panthers won 26-0 in Charlottesville in 1953, 18-7 in Pittsburgh in 1955 and 38-13 in Pittsburgh in 2006.

• Virginia's 23-16 win over Pittsburgh in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl in Charlotte, N.C., was one of the most closely contested game of the series.

• UVA's Tony Franklin played a big role on defense in the bowl game to end Larry Fitzgerald's 18-game streak with a touchdown reception.

• The teams seesawed back and forth in the first half with Virginia holding a 17-13 lead at halftime. The second half featured only field goals in UVA's seven-point win. Matt Schaub closed his stellar career by capturing MVP honors after passing for 244 yards. Former Pittsburgh Steeler tight end Heath Miller had a big day for UVA with four receptions for 84 yards, including a 52-yard touchdown reception from Schaub late in the first quarter for the game's first score.

MORE ON THE PITT SERIES DURIG THE LEAN 1950'S

• The 26-0 loss in 1953 remains one of the worst offensive performances in the modern era of UVA football. The Cavaliers recorded three first downs, an all-time low, and had just 43 yards of total offense, their second-lowest modern-day total.

• Pittsburgh scored on its first possession 5:52 into the contest and scored in every guarter to win.

• In 1955, UVA ended more than 80 scoreless minutes against Pitt when halfback Ralph Kneeland scored UVA's first touchdown in the series on an eight-yard run at the 9:39 mark of the second quarter. That score gave UVA a brief 7-6 lead, but Pitt halfback Lou Cimarolli scored the game-winner on a 32-yard dash midway through the third quarter.

Last Meeting

Virginia scored 28 first-half points, including two touchdowns from Albert Reid, but Pittsburgh broke away in the second half and beat the Cavaliers 45-31 the last time these two teams met.

The Panthers got a 93-yard kickoff return touchdown from Quadree Henderson and a 59-yard interception return touchdown from Jordan Whitehead, the latter to allow the Panthers to take a 35-28 lead into halftime.

Virginia had its two-game winning streak snapped. The Cavaliers moved the ball at will in the opening 30 minutes, piling up 270 yards, but were just the opposite thereafter. They gained 15 yards in the third quarter and finished with 108 yards in the half.

Taquan Mizzell rushed 12 times for 95 yards and one touchdown for Virginia, while Kurt Benkert was 20-of-44 for 278 yards and one touchdown.

COLEMAN SET UVA SINGLE-GAME PUNTING RECORD

- Junior Lester Coleman averaged 52.3 yards per punt over his seven punts last Saturday against Boston College to break the single-game UVA punting record.
 - The previous record belonged to Ryan Weigand, who averaged 51.6 yards per punt at Wyoming in 2007. • Coleman had a long of 60 yards against the Eagles and five landed inside the 20, three of which were downed inside the 10.

BLOUNT RECORDS THE TACKLES ON SPECIAL TEAMS

• Freshman Joey Blount leads UVA with eight tackles on special teams, six of which have come on kickoffs. • Blount recorded his first career double-digit tackle game against Boston College, notching 10 stops while seeing his most playing time on defense to date.

• Blount is the son of former UVA safety, Tony Blount, who played for the Cavaliers from 1976-79 and owns the 11th-longest interception return (63) in program history.

CROSS IS A TRIPLE-THREAT

• Redshirt freshmen De'Vante Cross has played offense, defense and special teams in the same game twice this season, doing so against Duke and Boston College.

• Prior to Cross, the last time UVA had a player accomplish that feat was Vic Hall in 2009, when he did so in numerous games, the last time coming against Virginia Tech.

• Against Boston College Cross saw his most time on defense, notching one tackle. He also rushed once for 13 yards out of the wildcat formation.

• Recruited as a quarterback, Cross has seen time in the wildcat and at wide receiver.

BENKERT AND PASSES OF 80+ YARDS

• At North Carolina on Oct. 14, Kurt Benkert found Olamide Zaccheaus on an 81-yard scoring strike. The touchdown served as the fourth-longest one-play scoring drive in program history and it was Benkert's third career pass of 80 yards or more.

• In program history, only Benkert and Wayne Schuchts have three career passes of 80 yards or more. • Benkert's first two came in 2016 at Duke (84 yards to David Eldridge) and against Central Michigan (82yard touchdown to Zaccheaus).

• Schuchts' passes were 93 yards (to Nick Merrick, vs. Wake Forest, 1982), 85 yards (to Barry Word, vs. Wake Forest, 1983) and 80 yards (to Quentin Walker, vs. Duke, 1983).

ZACCHEAUS A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON FOR VIRGINIA

 Junior Olamide Zaccheaus recorded his second career receiving touchdown of 80+ yards when he scored on an 81-yard pass from Kurt Benkert at North Carolina.

- It is the longest reception in the ACC this season and No. 18 among all FBS schools.
- Zaccheaus is the only player in UVA history with two career receptions of 80+ yards. He also scored on an 82-yard scoring strike from Benkert in 2016 against Central Michigan.

· Zaccheaus has scored at least one touchdown in all seven wins of the Bronco Medenhall era, seven via the pass and one on a rush.

• In UVA's five wins in 2017, Zaccheaus has caught 31 passes for 376 yards and four touchdown, while also rushing 13 times for 130 yards and one more score.

• Over the seven wins of the Mendenhall era, Zaccheaus has caught 43 passes for 559 yards and seven touchdowns, which comes out to 13.0 yards per reception.

• His active reception streak of 23 games is the third longest active streak in the ACC.

• Zaccheaus became the 37th Cavalier all-time with 1,000 career receiving yards after his 122-yard day against UConn.

• Žaccheaus also became the 21st Cavalier to reach 100-career receptions in UVA history after grabbing four at Boise State.

- · Zaccheaus' 12 receptions against Indiana on Sept. 9 are the sixth most in a single game in UVA history.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

UVA'S THIRD-DOWN OFFENSE

• UVA is ranked No. 25 in the nation and No. 4 in the ACC in third down offense with a success rate of 45.4 percent.

• UVA's 4-of-16 performance at UNC dropped UVA down from No. 10 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC. • QB Kurt Benkert is 38-of-62 passing (61 percent) on third down, collecting 26 first downs and two touchdowns.

• Benkert is 36-of-64 passing (56 percent) when its 3rd and 6, or greater, connecting on 24 first downs and two touchdowns.

ELLIS RUNS HARD FOR THE VIRGINIA OFFENSE

• TB Jordan Ellis is averaging 5.1 yards per rush on first down through seven games with nine first downs and one touchdown.

• Ellis has been a workhorse in short yardage on 3rd and 4th down. On fourth down, Ellis has rushed five times for four first downs on an average of 2.4 yards per carry. On third down, Ellis has 17 first downs, four touchdowns on 31 rushes.

• UVA's rushing offensive by Jordan Ellis helped eat clock and secure victory against Duke three weeks ago.


• Ellis rushed seven times for 33 yards (4.7 per carry) and two first downs in the fourth quarter, helping seal the ACC victory.

SNOWDEN COMES UP BIG LATE AGAINST DUKE

• OLB Charles Snowden played two defensive plays in crunch time against Duke and made the most of them. He was on the field on UVA's last two defensive plays, one being a 3rd and 6 where he dropped Duke quarterback Daniel Jones for a loss of 10. The sack was his first career solo sack and set up a 4th and 16 last ditch effort for the Blue Devils.

• Snowden also was on the field for the 4th and 16 play, providing pressure on the pass play Juan Thornhill broke up to secure the victory.

• Snowden played four total defensive plays against Duke, as well as playing on kickoff and punt returns. Snowden made his collegiate debut at Boise State late in the game. He and fellow true freshman Elliott Brown shared a sack in Boise.



2017 VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

UVA RECEIVERS HAVE RARE ACCOMPLISHMENT IN 2017

• UVA is one of eight schools in all of FBS in 2017 with at least three different players with at least one 100-yard receiving game.

• UVA is tied for No. 4 in the nation with three.

• Oklahoma State, who had four receivers go over 100 yards against Pitt this year, is the only other team this season with at least three players in the same game reach the 100-yard receiving mark.

RECEIVING TRIO SETS RECORD AGAINST UCONN

• For the first time in program history, UVA had three different players record at least 100 yards receiving in the same game. Doni Dowling (136), Andre Levrone (127) and Olamide Zaccheaus (122) became the first UVA trio to accomplish the milestone in UVA's 38-18 win over UConn.

It was only the 10th time UVA had multiple Cavaliers with at least 100 yards receiving in the same game and the first time since the 2013 Georgia Tech game (Tim Smith, 151 yard & Darius Jennings, 119 yards).
Dowling, Levrone and Zaccheaus are only the sixth ACC trio to accomplish the feat since 2000.
Since 2000, Florida State accomplished the feat twice in 2000 and once in 2005. Miami did it in 2012 and Virginia Tech in 2016.

UVA MAKES A LITTLE HISTORY AT BOISE STATE

• UVA's 42-23 win at Boise State on Sept. 22 created a little niche in history for the Cavaliers.

• It was UVA's first win on a Friday since Nov. 10, 1939 when UVA beat Washington & Lee, 7-0.

• It was UVA's first non-conference road win since 2011 (at Indiana).

• UVA is now 6-8-1 all-time on Fridays in the regular season.

• UVA handed Boise State its first double-digit loss at home since Sept. 8, 2001 vs. Washington State, which was a 41-20 triumph.

• UVA snapped Boise State's 32-game regular season non-conference home winning streak, which dated back to the 2001 Washington State game.

• Boise State lost by 19 points at home to Virginia. In its 102 previous home games, Boise State lost 4 games by a combined 17 points.

• It was UVA's first win west of the Mississippi River since winning at BYU in 1999.

BENKERT BREAKS UVA SINGLE-GAME PASSING/TOTAL OFFENSE RECORD

 QB Kurt Benkert was 30-of-40 for a career-high 455 passing yards against UConn on Sept. 16. He broke his own UVA single-game passing record (421) that he set last season against Central Michigan.
 Benkert's 455 passing yards against UConn are the most in the ACC this season for a game and ranks No.

16 among performances in the FBS this season.

• UVA has had a quarterback throw for over 400 yards only three times in program history and Benkert has done it twice.

• Marc Verica was the first Cavalier to throw for at least 400 yards in a game in 2010 when he threw for 417 at Duke.

• Benkert also broke Verica's record for total offense in a game with 465 yards of total offense. Verica's record was 413 at Duke in 2010.

DOWLING AND ZACCHEAUS REACH MILESTONE TOGETHER

• WR Doni Dowling and HB Olamide Zaccheaus each passed the career 1,000-yard receiving mark in UVA's win against UConn on Sept. 16. Zaccheaus became the 37th Cavalier in program history in the second quarter, while Dowling became the 38th Cavalier in program history in the fourth quarter. • Against UConn, Dowling recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game (136). Zaccheaus recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game (122). Zaccheaus had his first last season against Central Michiqan, the other career game QB Kurt Benkert threw for over 400 yards.

DOWLING HONORS TIM HARRIS

• WR Doni Dowling moved from No. 7 to No. 5 prior to the Indiana game to honor CB Tim Harris. Wearing No. 5 since his arrival on Grounds in 2013, Harris had a season-ending injury in the opener against William & Marv.

• Dowling and Harris have been lifelong friends, as well as teammates at Richmond's Varina High School.

BLANDING AND KISER ANCHOR THE DEFENSE

FS Quin Blanding (10.6) and ILB Micah Kiser (10.3) currently rank No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles.
This is nothing new for the duo as they finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2015 and 2016.
Kiser ranks No. 9 in the nation in tackles in 2017, while Blanding ranks No. 7 in the nation.

• In 2016 Kiser (11.2) led the ACC in tackles and finished No. 4 nationally. Blanding (10.0) finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row and No. 9 nationally.

Kiser (9.75) and Blanding (9.58) also finished No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the ACC in tackles in 2015.
Since the ACC started tracking tackle leaders in 1990, no previous tandem of tacklers has led the league in tackles for two consecutive seasons until Kiser and Blanding.

• Blanding, who also finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2014 (10.25), is the only player in ACC history to finish second in tackles for three straight seasons.

• The only ACC player since 1990 to lead the league in tackles for three consecutive seasons is Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11), now of the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

BLANDING AND KISER GET HELP ON DEFENSE

• Despite ranking No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles, FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser are getting solid help on defense as UVA has three of the ACC's Top 17 tacklers.

II P Jordan Mack is No. 6 in the ACC with 9.2 tacklos per game

• With eight receptions in 2017 already, Butts has more catches than he had in all of 2016 (seven).

VIRGINIA FOOTBALL TO WEAR #HOOSTOGETHER PATCHES ON UNIFORMS IN 2017

• In the aftermath of the events that took place in Charlottesville this summer, the Virginia athletics department initiated the #HoosTogether campaign on social media in an effort to unite our community in support of love, diversity and inclusion.

• During the 2017-18 academic year, all UVA sports programs will incorporate a #HoosTogether patch on their uniforms or equipment. It is UVA's hope the patches serve as a reminder of what can be accomplished when we are united behind a common goal and we hope this effort continues to help bring our community together.

HAMM RUSHES FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN FIVE STRAIGHT SEASONS

After his five-yard rushing score against UConn, TB Daniel Hamm has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.

• Hamm becomes the first Cavalier to rush for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.

• With available records dating back to 2004, no ACC player has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons

• Hamm played in two games as a true freshman in 2013 before being hurt at Pitt and receiving a medical hardship. In his collegiate debut, he set a UVA record for most rushing yards in a college debut with 136 against VMI. Hamm also rushed for two touchdowns against the Keydets in 2013. • Hamm has six career rushing touchdowns.

REINKENSMEYER STARTS OPENER AT LEFT TACKLE, SHIFTS TO CENTER

• Dillon Reinkensmeyer was the first freshman, true or redshirt, to start a season-opening game on the offensive line for UVA since R-Fr. Will Barker started at RT in 2006 vs. Pitt.

• Reinkensmeyer is the first freshman, redshirt or true, to start a season-opening game at LT since D'Brickashaw Ferguson (true freshman) in 2002 vs. Colorado State.

• Reinkensmeyer has not appeared at left tackle since, despite receiving the highest grade on the offensive line against the Tribe.

• He played most of the second half at center against Indiana and since the UConn game, has started every game at center.

SIXTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED IN 2017

• Sixteen UVA true freshmen have played in 2017, which ranks No. 7 in the nation entering week No. 9. • Ten true freshmen made their collegiate debut against William & Mary on Sept. 2. SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings. Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field. Virginia has played 461 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 258-191-12.

JOE REED EXCELS ON KICK RETURN

• Wide Receiver Joe Reed has returned 11 kicks in 2017 for 271 yards (24.6 yards per return), which is No. 4 in the ACC.

• Reed is coming off a solid 2016 where he led UVA with 678 kick return yards as a true freshman.

• Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.

• Reed's 678 kick return yards are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Second Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his second season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015. In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a

on Dec. 4, 2015. In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America nonors in the same season. Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season. Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time. In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Itech and Wisconsin on that list. Mong those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories. BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams sin

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft. Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recogniz-ing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007. The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership develop-ment and organizational design. Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee. Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Fortbell Gradher Argentic Program Pul Coache of the Xery In addition Chris Petersen, W

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

Award. A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with as least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive catego-ries. ries

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.
