Duke Hosts 10th-ranked Tigers in Primetime on ESPN2

A Thursday night nationally-televised (7:30 pm, ESPN) matchup of Coastal Division rivals Virginia Tech and Miami at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens headlines Week 10 of the 2012 ACC football campaign...The Hokies and Hurricanes are two of four Coastal teams with two losses each and are the only teams in the Coastal that could claim a berth in Charlotte by winning their remaining ACC games... The game also pairs the two most successful ACC programs on ESPN's Thursday Night package in Miami (15-3) and Virginia Tech (19-5)...The Hokies of coach **Frank Beamer** feature an improving defense led by **LB Bruce Taylor** and a versatile offense built around **QB Logan Thomas**, who is 5th in the ACC in total yards...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden**, counter offensively with a passing attack led by junior **QB Stephen Morris**, who is 3rd in the ACC in passing yards per game (277.4) and a defense led by **LB Denzel Perryman**...Atlantic Division leader Florida State, ranked 9th nationally (AP, 7th USA Today), is in the driver's seat for a slot in the 8th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship...The Seminoles can claim that with wins at Virginia Tech (Nov. 8) and at Maryland (Nov. 17)...FSU has a bye this week heading into next week's Thursday night contest with the Hokies... Should the Seminoles slip up in either of those

two games, though, that would open the door for 10th-ranked Clemson (9th, USA Today), which travels to Duke this Saturday for a nationally televised prime-time (7 pm, ESPN2) contest at Wallace Wade Stadium...The Blue Devils of coach **David Cutcliffe**, led by ACC career leading receiver **Conner Vernon**, are one of the two-loss teams looking to keep pace with Virginia Tech and Miami for the Coastal Division crown...The Tigers of coach **Dabo Swinney** feature a high-powered offense led by junior **QB Tajh Boyd**, who is 9th nationally in total offense (326.8 yds/gm), and big-play **WRs DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins** and **Sammy Watkins**...In Raleigh, N.C., NC State, coached by **Tom O'Brien**, is out to keep its Championship Game hopes alive, hosting Virginia at Carter-Finley Stadium (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...The Wolfpack are led by senior **QB Mike Glennon**, who leads the ACC and is 11th nationally in passing yards per game (306.9), while Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, is seeking to snap a six-game losing streak behind the playmaking of the TB tandem of senior **Perry Jones** and sophomore **Kevin Parks**, who have combined to rush for 825 yards and 5 TDs...To get to Charlotte, State needs to win out and have the Seminoles lose once...A win by the Wolfpack would make them bowl-eligible...In College Park, Md., the

Maryland Terrapins, coached by **Randy Edsall**, have bowl hopes of their own and will be hosting Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, in a battle of the irresistible force facing the immovable object at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...Tech's spread option offense, led by **QB Tevin Washington**, ranks 4th nationally in rushing offense (311.75), while the Terrapins' defense, led by senior **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, is ranked 4th nationally in defense against the run (77.63) and 7th in total defense (289.25)...Postseason aspirations are also in play in Winston-Salem, N.C., where Wake Forest, coached by **Jim Grobe** and led by junior **WR Michael Campanaro**, who is 9th nationally in receptions per game (7.33/gm) hosts Boston College, coached by **Frank Spaziani** and led by the junior passing combination of **QB Chase Rettig** and **WR Alex Amidon** at BB&T Field (3:30 p.m., RSN)... The Deacons need two wins to be bowl eligible, while BC, just coming off its first ACC win of the year last week against Maryland, is also looking to remain eligible for a bowl berth... Amidon ranks 4th nationally in receiving yards per game (117.88)...North Carolina, coming off a big win against NC State, also has a bye this week.

National Football Hall of Fame To Induct Miami's Jimmy Johnson

Atlantic Coast Conference schools will have one inductee this year at the annual National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annual banquet in New York City. Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

Johnson coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

ACC schools combined for an average GSR of 74.75% The ACC was the only FBS league nationally to have multiple teams finish with 90 percent GSR or better in every year since 2006, with three schools--Boston College (94), Miami (92) and Duke (92)--recording GSRs this year of well over 90 percent.

1 - North Carolina sophomore **TB Giovanni Bernard** leads the nation in scoring, all-purpose yardage and punt return average. Bernard, who also ranks 3rd nationally in rushing averaging 132.9 yards per game, is averaging 12.86 points per game, 20.75 yards per punt return and 214 yards of all-purpose yardage per contest. In his last four games, Bernard has run for 717 yards, an average of 179.3 yards per game, while averaging 7.4 yards per carry.

2 - Clemson junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins** ranks 7th nationally in receiving yards per game and is tied for 10th in receptions per game. Hopkins, who is 2nd in the ACC in receptions per game (7.25) and receiving yards per game (113.6), is tied for the ACC lead in touchdown receptions (10), and has caught a TD pass in each of his last four games.

4 - Maryland ranks 4th nationally in defense against the run. The Terrapins have allowed just 77.63 yards per game on the ground. Led by All-America **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, they held Boston College to a net of just eight rushing yards Saturday, the 5th foe the Terps have held under 100 yards on the ground. Maryland has held its opponents to just 2.31 yards per rush, the 3rd best figure in the nation.

8 - When NC State sophomore **WR Bryan Underwood** scored on a 20-yard TD pass play against North Carolina Saturday, it marked the 8th straight game that Underwood has recorded a pass reception for a touchdown. That is an NC State school record and is one game shy of the ACC mark set by Virginia's Herman Moore in 1990. Underwood has only 28 catches on the season but 10 of them have gone for scores.

9 - **ACC punt returners** have already returned nine punts for touchdown this year and we still have a third of the year to go. In all of 2011, there were only three punts returned for touchdowns. The ACC has TDs on punt returns this fall than any other NCAA FBS conference nationally. Both North Carolina's Giovanni Bernard and Florida State's Rashad Greene each had two returns for scores.

11 - The number of major statistical categories in which **Florida State** ranks in the nation's top 10. The Seminoles rank 4th nationally or better in every major defensive category including total defense (2nd, 227.11), scoring defense (3rd, 12.0), rushing defense (3rd, 72.89), pass efficiency defense (4th, 90.89) and defensive 3rd down efficiency (1st, 23.08).

17 - The number of career interceptions for NC State junior **CB David Amerson**, who led the nation in interceptions last year. Amerson leads the nation among active players in career interceptions and is tied for 4th on the ACC career list. Clemson's Rashard Hall, who has 13 career picks, is tied for 4th nationally among active players.

20 - When Clemson **PK Chandler Catanzaro** missed a 48-yard field goal against Wake Forest, that snapped a streak of 20 consecutive made field goals for the Clemson junior. The streak is the 4th-longest in ACC history. Catanzaro has now made 48 of 62 field goals during his career, a .774 percentage, and has made 12 of 13 field goal attempts this year. Catanzaro's last previous miss was also against the Deacons at Clemson in 2011.

29 - The number of times **ACC teams** have topped the 500-yard mark in total offense through the first eight weeks of this year. In all of the 2011 season, conference teams only topped the 500-yard mark a total of 15 times.

29.43 - **Boston College** leads the nation in punt return average as a team, mainly due to the efforts of BC sophomore **WR Spiffy Evans**, who has returned 5 punts for 202 yards, an average of 40.04 yards per return. Evans does not have enough returns to qualify for the individual standings where four ACC returners already rank in the top 10 in North Carolina's Giovanni Bernard (1st, 20.75), Virginia Tech's Kysheo Jarrett (4th, 18.1), Duke's Lee Butler (5th, 17.0) and Florida State's Rashad Greene (8th, 15.84).

33 - The number of career rushing touchdowns for Georgia Tech senior **QB Tevin Washington**. This year, Washington ranks 7th nationally in points per game (11.5) and is 2nd the ACC career list in career TDs for a QB, trailing only former ACC standout Joshua Nesbitt of Georgia Tech (35).

37 - With a 42-point outing against Wake Forest Thursday night, **Clemson** became only the second team in ACC history to score 37 or more points in 7 consecutive games. The Tigers' streak began on Sept. 8 with a 52-point outing against Ball State and Clemson has averaged 43.1 points a game during the streak. The 1995 Florida State team opened the year with seven straight games of 42 or more points and averaged 56.1 points a game during that span.

67.3 - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 498 of 740 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .673. If maintained for the rest of this year, that would be the best in ACC history. Virginia's Matt Schaub (.670) and Wake Forest's Riley Skinner (.669) are currently 1-2 on the career list.

81 - The number of career field goals for Florida State senior **PK Dustin Hopkins**, who is now the ACC's career leader. Hopkins' record-breaker was a career-long 56-yard field goal against Duke. He

is in 4th place on the NCAA's career list and needs just 7 field goals to break the record set by Georgia's Billy Bennett during the 2000-03 seasons.

202 - Clemson sophomore **WR Sammy Watkins** set a school record with 202 receiving yards last Thursday against Wake Forest. Watkins managed it on 8 receptions with a 61-yard TD catch and run play. Watkins broke the record of 197 yards set earlier this year by teammate **DeAndre Hopkins** on Sept. 29.

252 - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon became the ACC's all-time career-leading receiver on Oct. 6 against Virginia. He has shattered the old mark of 232 catches set by Clemson's Aaron Kelly during the 2005-2008 seasons. His career total of 3,436 receiving yards puts him in 4th place on the ACC career list. He needs 82 receiving yards to set a new standard, currently held by FSU's Peter Warrick (3,517).

255 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 255 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. With the Hokies' win over Duke on Oct. 13, Beamer tied former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne for 7th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list.

304 - North Carolina sophomore **TB Giovanni Bernard** totalled 304 all-purpose yards, including the game-winning 74-yard punt return in the Tar Heels' 43-35 win over NC State. The 304 yards were the 20th-best effort in ACC history. Bernard rushed for 135 yards, had 95 yards in pass receptions and 75 yards in returns.

328 - The number of passing yards for NC State **QB Mike Glennon** in the first half Saturday against North Carolina. Glennon complete 20 of 29 passes in the first 30 minutes alone. Glennon finished with a career-high 467 yards and tied his career-best with 5 TD passes.

400 - This Saturday's Wake Forest home game against Boston College will be the 400th consecutive Demon Deacon football game for Assistant Athletic Director for Football Bill Faircloth. Faircloth, in his 33rd year on staff at Wake, has not missed a game since joining the Deacons in 1978.

428 - The number of passing yards for Clemson junior **QB Tajh Boyd** in the Tigers' win over Wake Forest. Boyd broke the school record previously set by Charlie Whitehurst (420) against Duke in 2002.

429 - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** improved upon his ACC and Florida State career scoring records last weekend with a 12-point performance against Duke. That gives him 429 points for his career, outdistancing the records of 393 points set by Maryland's Nick Novak (ACC, 2001-04) and Derek Schmidt. He is now in 3rd place on the NCAA's career list for points by kicking and needs only 11 points to break the NCAA record of 439 points set by Boise State's Kyle Brotzman during the 2007-10 seasons.

2012 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 25, 27

#14/13 Clemson 42, Wake Forest 13

QB Tajh Boyd threw for a school-record 428 yards and five touchdowns, with all five scoring tosses coming in the first half, as the visiting Tigers (7-1, 4-1 ACC) rolled to a Thursday night victory before a national ESPN audience. Sophomore WR Sammy Watkins became the first player in Clemson history to reach 200 receiving yards in a game. He finished with eight catches for 202 yards, eclipsing the century mark for the first time this season and topping his previous career high of 155 yards prior to halftime with 177 yards before the break. Wake Forest (4-4, 2-4) got on the board with 12 seconds left in the first half, as QB Tanner Price hit FB Tommy Bohanon for an 8-yard touchdown to make the score 35-7. Price and Bohanon hooked up again to open the second-half scoring for an 18-yard touchdown with 7:45 to go in the third quarter that trimmed the deficit to 35-13. RB D.J. Howard stretched the Tigers' lead back out to 42-13 with a 1-yard touchdown run that capped a 13-play, 86-yard drive that took 5:02 off the clock and provided the final margin.

North Carolina 43, NC State 35

RB Giovani Bernard's 74-yard punt return with 13 seconds remaining lifted North Carolina (6-3, 3-2) past the rival Wolfpack (5-3, 2-2) on Saturday at Kenan Stadium. Bernard's return capped a wild afternoon that saw the Tar Heels build a 25-7 first-quarter lead, only to see NC State score 28 unanswered points to take a 35-25 lead into the fourth quarter. UNC then outscored the Wolfpack 18-0 in the final 15 minutes to claim its first win in the series in 2006. The punt return capped a huge day for Bernard, who ran for 135 yards and two touchdowns. He also had eight receptions for 95 yards. QB Mike Glennon threw for a career-high 467 yards and a school record-tying five touchdowns to lead N.C. State. Two of Glennon's TD tosses went to WR Bryan Underwood, who has caught at least one TD pass in every game this season and is the only player in the nation to have a TD catch in every game this season.

#11/10 Florida State 48, Duke 7

The Seminoles (8-1, 5-1) regained control of the driver's seat in the ACC Atlantic Division race with a convincing win over the Blue Devils (6-3, 3-2), who entered the game in sole possession of first place in the Coastal Division. Florida State QB EJ Manuel averaged a little more than 35 yards per completion as his 8-of-16 night resulted in 282 yards and two touchdowns -- one to WR Rashad Greene and another to WR Kelvin Benjamin. WR Rodney Smith finished with a career-best 112 yards in receptions and Benjamin had 77. RB Devonta Freeman ran 12 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns to lead FSU's rushing attack. LB Christian Jones led all FSU tacklers with 11 stops as the Seminoles limited the visiting Blue Devils to 232 total yards. DE Tank Carradine registered a career-high four quarterback hurries. Duke's lone touchdown came on RB Jela Duncan's 4-yard run in the second quarter.

Boston College 20, Maryland 17

QB Chase Rettig's 14-yard touchdown strike to WR Johnathan Coleman with 52 seconds to play lifted the Eagles (2-6, 1-4) to their first ACC win of the season. Freshman RB David Dudeck recorded his first career touchdown on a 20-yard reception in the first quarter for the Eagles, and PK Nate Freese is a perfect 12-for-12 on field goals this season after connecting on a pair in Saturday's win. Sophomore DB Spenser Rositano recorded his second interception of the season with 39 seconds remaining sealing the win for BC. Former fourth-string QB Caleb Rowe completed a 66-yard touchdown pass to Stefon Diggs midway through the fourth quarter to give Maryland (4-4, 2-2) its first lead of the game prior to BC's last-minute heroics by Rettig, Coleman and Rositano. A true freshman making the start because of injuries to Maryland's top three quarterbacks, Rowe completed 23 of 42 passes for 240 yards and two touchdowns.

BYU 41, Georgia Tech 17

RB Jamaal Williams scored four touchdowns to lead Brigham Young (5-4) past Georgia Tech (3-5) in Saturday's nonconference game in Atlanta. Georgia Tech DB Jamal Golden returned a second-quarter kickoff for a 97-yard touchdown, and S Isaiah Johnson returned an interception 22 yards for another TD. But it was otherwise a tough day for the Yellow Jackets, who did not score an offensive touchdown for the first time since Dec. 31, 2008 (vs. LSU in the Chick-fil-A Bowl) and were held to a season-low 117 yards on the ground. Tech had entered the game ranked 3rd nationally in rushing, BYU was 8th nationally in rushing defense.

North Carolina's Bernard, Cooper Headline This Week's Honorees After Dramatic Win Over NC State

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Two North Carolina honorees lead a group of nine student-athletes recognized as Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week, as announced by the conference on Monday. Running back/punt returner Giovani Bernard was honored as ACC Specialist of the Week, while guard Jonathan Cooper earned Offensive Lineman of the Week honors following the Tar Heels' dramatic 43-35 ACC win over NC State on Saturday. Bernard had 304 all-purpose yards and scored three touchdowns, capping his big day with a 74-yard touchdown return for a touchdown that snapped a 35-all tie with 13 seconds remaining and lifted the Tar Heels to their first win over the rival Wolfpack since 2006.

Cooper played 85 snaps, posted 18 knockdown blocks and graded out at 90 percent as the Tar Heels recorded 570 yards of offense in earning his second ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week honor this season. The weekly honor is also the second of the season for Bernard, who was also named the ACC Offensive Back of the Week on Oct. 8.

Clemson, Florida State and Maryland joined North Carolina in seeing two players from their squads receive weekly honors, and one player was honored from NC State. Clemson quarterback Tajh Boyd was named Offensive Back of the Week after throwing for a school-record 428 yards and five touchdowns in the Tigers' 42-13 win over Wake Forest. The Tigers' Sammy Watkins, who hauled in eight of Boyd's passes for a school-record 202 yards and one touchdown, received ACC Receiver of the Week honors. Florida State's Christian Jones earned Linebacker of the Week honors after making 11 tackles, including eight solo stops and four tackles for loss as the Seminoles limited Duke to a season-low 232 yards in a 48-7 victory. Freshman cornerback Ronald Darby was named the Co-Defensive Back of the Week after playing a key role in a stout Florida State pass defense that limited the Blue Devils to just 129 yards through the air. ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week Joe Vellano of Maryland was part of an effort that limited Boston College to just eight net rushing yards in the Terps' 20-17 loss. Vellano recorded 2.5 sacks that resulted in 22 net yards of lost yardage. Terrapin WR Stefon Diggs was named ACC Rookie of the Week for the third time and picked up his fourth overall weekly honor after posting career highs with 11 catches for 152 yards. NC State cornerback C.J. Wilson earned Co-Defensive Back of the Week honors after coming up with two turnovers in the Wolfpack's road loss to North Carolina.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Tajh Boyd, Clemson, Jr., QB, 6-1, 225, Hampton, Va.

Boyd completed 27 of 38 passes for 428 yards and five touchdowns without an interception in Clemson's 42-13 win over Wake Forest last Thursday night. He also had 16 carries for 27 yards, giving him 455 yards of total offense. The 428 yards passing were an all-time Clemson single-game record, while his 455 yards of total offense were second best. Boyd threw all five of his touchdown passes in the first half, including four in the second quarter when he took the Tigers to 28 points. That set a record for touchdown passes in a half as well. He tied the single-game touchdown record. His pass efficiency rating for the game was 208, also the best in school history given a minimum of 35 attempts.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Jonathan Cooper, North Carolina, Sr., OG, 6-3, 295, Wilmington, N.C.

Cooper played 85 snaps, posted 18 knockdown blocks and graded out at 90 percent as the Tar Heels recorded 570 yards of offense in a 43-35 victory over NC State. Carolina rushed for 212 yards, averaging 5.4 yards per carry. Cooper has not allowed a sack all season.

RECEIVER – Sammy Watkins, Clemson, So., 6-1, 200, Fort Myers, Fla.

Watkins had eight receptions for 202 yards and a touchdown in Clemson's 42-13 victory over Wake Forest. Watkins touchdown was a 61-yard catch and run down the sidelines in the second period. He had 177 receiving yards in the first half when Clemson broke the game open. He had three catches of at least 50 yards in the game, also a first. The 202 receiving yards set a Clemson single game record, breaking the previous record of 197 yards by DeAndre Hopkins earlier this year at Boston College. Watkins also had four yards rushing to finish with 206 all-purpose yards.

DEFENSIVE LINE – Joe Vellano, Sr., Maryland, DE, 6-1, 285, Rexford, N.Y.

Vellano was part of a defensive line that allowed Boston College to rush for just 8 net yards on 27 attempts. The senior recorded five tackles, including 2.5 sacks to total minus-22 yards, and also forced a fumble that the Terrapins recovered. Vellano leads the ACC and is tied for ninth nationally with 1.75 tackles for loss per game. He's played a big role on a defense that ranks fourth nationally against the run, having surrendered just 77.6 yards per game.

LINEBACKER – Christian Jones, Jr., Florida State, OLB, 6-4, 240, Winter Park, Fla.

Florida State set the tone from the start on defense vs. Duke, and Jones played a huge role in that performance. The second-year starter registered eight of his season-high 11 tackles in the first quarter and three of those were tackles for loss, which eclipsed his previous career-high of two. He finished the night with four tackles for loss, while eight of his 11 tackles were solo stops. Florida State's defense, which leads the ACC in every major category and ranks second nationally in total defense, limited the Blue Devils to a season-low 232 total yards.

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – Ronald Darby, Fr., Florida State, 5-11, 176, CB, Oxon Hill, Md.

Continuing his season-long role as the first corner off the bench for the Seminoles, Darby was instrumental in another shut-down performance by the Florida State defense. He finished with four tackles (three solo stops) and provided solid coverage on a day when Duke's passing game could not get going. Florida state limited Duke quarterbacks to 129 passing yards on a 16 of 37 performance and shut down Blue Devils' receiving star Connor Vernon, who had three receptions for 12 yards. The Seminoles rank fourth nationally in pass efficiency defense (90.89) and sixth in passing defense (154.22 ypg).

CO-DEFENSIVE BACK – C.J. Wilson, Fr., NC State, 5-11, 185, Lincolnton, N.C.

Wilson played 59 snaps at UNC and made two of the biggest defensive plays of the game. He created two Tar Heel turnovers in the red zone, as he intercepted a pass in the end zone and stripped another ball out of the receiver's hands at the NC State 10 and returned it to the 24. Wilson also tallied three tackles and broke up another pass in the contest.

SPECIALIST – Giovani Bernard, So., North Carolina, 5-10, 205, Davie, Fla.

Bernard had 304 all-purpose yards to lead North Carolina to a 43-25 victory over rival NC State. Bernard scored on a 74-yard punt return with 13 seconds to play to give the Tar Heels the victory and snap the Wolfpack's five-game winning streak in the series. The punt return was Carolina's first for a score against NC State since 1986. It was Bernard's second punt return touchdown of the season, tying the school record. Bernard finished with a game-high 135 rushing yards on 23 carries and two rushing touchdowns. He also had eight catches for a career-high 95 yards and led the Tar Heels in both rushing and receiving.

ROOKIE – Stefon Diggs, Maryland, Fr., WR, 6-0, 185, Gaithersburg, Md.

Diggs turned in his most productive receiving game this season, setting career marks with 152 receiving yards and 11 catches. The freshman caught a career-long 66-yard touchdown pass, marking the fourth time in the last five games he's had a catch of at least 50 yards. It was the third 100-yard receiving game of the season for Diggs and vaulted him into 16th place on Maryland's single-season receiving yards list with 666. That ranks second all-time among freshmen, trailing only Darrius Heyward-Bey's 694 in 2006.



ATLANTIC DIVISION TEAM NOTES



Boston College

Junior **WR Alex Amidon** registered 137 receiving yards in Saturday's 20-17 win over Maryland ... It marked Amidon's fifth 100-plus yard receiving game of the season, the most of any player in the ACC... With a season total of 943 receiving yards, Amidon is now third all-time in single season receiving yards at BC ... Sophomore **WR Spiffy Evans'** 72-yard punt return in the first quarter was the second longest of the season and career ... Evans had an 82-yard touchdown return vs. Maine on Sept. 8 ... Boston College leads the nation in punt return average as a team (29.43) ... The Eagles held Maryland scoreless in the first half, marking the first time it has held an opponent scoreless in the first half since November 27, 2010 at Syracuse ... Senior **LB Nick Clancy**, who is the BC team-leader in tackles (11.6), had three pass breakups against Maryland, giving him the team lead with seven ... Junior **PK Nate Freese** is a perfect 12-for-12 on field goals under 50 yards this season ... Junior **LB Kevin Pierre-Louis** had his 3rd double-digit tackle game of the season with 10 tackles against the Terps.



Maryland

QB Caleb Rowe made his first career start vs. Boston College and became the sixth true freshman to start on either offense or defense this season ... Rowe completed 23 of 42 passes for 240 yards, with two touchdowns and three interceptions... He became the first Maryland QB with 40 pass attempts in a game since **C.J. Brown** vs. Wake Forest on Nov. 19, 2011 ... On Sunday, the Terps announced that Rowe had suffered an ACL injury and will be sidelined for the remainder of the year ... Rowe became the fourth Maryland quarterback this season -- and the third in a span of just over a week -- to suffer a season-ending injury ... With four games to play, **WR Stefon Diggs** has already cracked the top 20 on the Maryland single-season receiving yards list ... Diggs had 152 yards on 11 catches against Boston College, bringing his season total to 670 yards, which ranks 16th. That's second all-time among freshmen, trailing only Darrius Heyward-Bey's 694 in 2006. ... Maryland's defense limited Boston College to eight net rushing yards and now ranks fourth nationally in defense against the run (77.63 ypg) and seventh in total defense (289.25 ypg).



Clemson

The Tigers have scored at least 37 points in a game in seven straight games, tying an ACC record set by Florida State in 1995 ... Clemson has four consecutive wins over ACC teams by 14 points or more for the first time since 1978 ... **QB Tajh Boyd** broke two Clemson records in the Tigers' win at Wake Forest ... Boyd's 428 passing yards were the most in Clemson history, eclipsing the 420 by Charlie Whitehurst at Duke in 2002 ... Boyd also set a Clemson record for touchdown passes in a half with five (to five different receivers) in the first half ... Boyd's five TD passes for the game tied the Clemson school game record... Boyd had five last year against North Carolina and Cullen Harper had five against Louisiana Monroe and Central Michigan in 2007...Boyd is 9th nationally in total offense (326.75 avg.) and 10th in pass efficiency (163.93) ... **WR Sammy Watkins** set a Clemson record for reception yards vs. Wake Forest with 202 on eight receptions... He broke the record of 197 by teammate **DeAndre Hopkins** at Boston College earlier this year on September 29, so Hopkins record lasted less than a month.



NC State

QB Mike Glennon threw for a career-best 467 yards, completing 29-of-52 passes, in last Saturday's ACC road game at North Carolina ... Glennon also tied his career high and a school record with five touchdown passes ... Glennon has now thrown for over 300 yards in back-to-back games, a first for the Wolfpack since Russell Wilson had five straight games over 300 yards in 2010 ... Redshirt sophomore **WR Bryan Underwood** extended his own school record to eight straight games with at least one TD catch with a pair against the Tar Heels ... Underwood is the only player in the nation to have a touchdown catch in every game this season, and is just one game shy of the ACC record for consecutive games with a TD catch (Herman Moore of Virginia in 1990) ... Senior **CB C.J. Wilson** recorded his fourth career interception in the second quarter against North Carolina ...Wilson's pick stopped a North Carolina first-and-goal drive with a touchback ... Wilson was also involved in the Tar Heels' second turnover of the day, stripping the ball from a receiver and returning it 14 yards to stop a North Carolina drive at the Wolfpack 10-yard line.



Florida State

Sophomore **RBs Devonta Freeman** and **James Wilder Jr.** combined for three rushing touchdowns in Saturday night's win over Duke to give the Seminoles 29 touchdowns on the ground this season, and putting them just six scores away from tying the all-time FSU record for rushing TDs in a season of 35 set in 1995 ... Junior **DE Bjoern Werner** added to his ACC-leading tackle for loss total with one versus the Blue Devils, giving him 12.5 on the season. Werner now ranks 16th in TFLs in the FSU single-season record book. His 29.5 career TFLs ties for 15th in the FSU career record books ... Senior **PK Dustin Hopkins'** 56-yard field goal in the fourth quarter vs. Duke was a career-best and also set a new ACC record for career field goals with 81, breaking former Maryland kicker Nick Novak's mark of 80 set from 2001-04 ... It also moved Hopkins into fourth all-time in NCAA history in field goals made, just six behind former Georgia kicker Billy Bennett's record of 87 set from 2000-03 ... Hopkins is now just 10 points shy of the NCAA career mark for points by kicking set in 2010 by Kyle Brotzman of Boise State (439).



Wake Forest

Senior **FB Tommy Bohanon** continued his solid season catching the football, finishing with three catches for 29 yards and two touchdowns in the Oct. 25 game vs. Clemson ... Bohanon posted his second two-touchdown receiving game of the season and now leads the team with five touchdown catches on the year ... Junior **WR Michael Campanaro** returned to the field against Clemson after missing the previous two games with a broken hand ... Campanaro finished with six receptions for 52 yards ... **QB Tanner Price** completed passes to eight different receivers in last Thursday night's game ... Senior **WR Terence Davis** tied his career-high with seven receptions in the game ... **ILB Justin Jackson** recorded his team-leading fourth sack of the season ...Freshman **P Alexander Kinal** booted a 61-yard punt in the fourth quarter, the longest of his career ... **CB Kevin Johnson** also had four pass breakups on the night, which gives him a team-high nine on the season ... Johnson's six tackles are his second-most this season behind his 10 in the season-opener against Liberty.

Duke

Duke recovered four Florida State fumbles in last Saturday's ACC road game, giving the Blue Devils 11 defensive fumble recoveries on the season ... Duke has caused 19 turnovers this season, 11 of which came on fumbles ... The four fumble recoveries mark the second time this season that Duke has forced four turnovers in a game with the last coming in a 34-27 road win at Wake Forest on Sept. 29 (two interceptions, two fumble recoveries) ... **S Jordan Byas** finished with 11 tackles vs. Florida State for his fourth double-digit tackle game this season and fifth consecutive game with at least eight stops ... **WR Desmond Scott** has become the third player in ACC history with 1,000 rushing, 1,000 receiving and 1,000 kickoff return yards, joining a list that includes Clemson's CJ Spiller (2006-09) and Virginia's Frank Quayle (1966-68) ... **WR Conner Vernon** has extended his own school record streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 44 – also the longest active streak in the nation and one shy of the ACC record held by North Carolina's Corey Holliday ... Vernon's streak of 24 consecutive games with at least two receptions is the third-longest in Duke history.



North Carolina

TB Giovanni Bernard's 74-yard punt return for the game-winning touchdown last Saturday vs. NC State was Bernard's second of 2012, tying the school record for punt return touchdowns in a season ... He also had a 70-yarder against Elon in the season opener ... Bernard is the sixth North Carolina player to have two in a season (two of the previous five were on blocked punts), joining Johnny Branch (1930), Charlie Justice (1948), Norris Davis (1987, blocks), Andre Purvis (1993, both on blocks) and Bosley Allen (2000) ... Bernard had 230 yards from scrimmage and a career-best 304 all-purpose yards on Saturday ... Bernard, who leads the nation in all-purpose yards per game (214.0), has 1,498 all-purpose yards this year, already the ninth-most in school history ... **P Tommy Hibbard** passed for a pair of two-point conversions vs. NC State and has three successful conversion passes in the last three games ... **TE Eric Ebron** extended his single-season UNC record for receiving yards by a tight end to 546 with 79 yards against NC State, the 7th-best single season in ACC history... He also pulled within one catch of Ryan Taylor's single-season record for receptions by a tight end (36 in 2010).



Georgia Tech

DB Jamal Golden's 97-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. Brigham Young last Saturday was Tech's first kickoff return for a score since Oct. 31, 1998 (a streak of 178 games), when Dez White had a 100-yard kick return against Maryland ... Golden's return was the Yellow Jackets' first for a score in Bobby Dodd Stadium since 1990 (Kevin Tisdell vs. Duke) and tied for the fifth-longest kick return in Georgia Tech history ... Tech has had at least one interception in seven consecutive games, including **S Isaiah Johnson's** pick and 22-yard return for a touchdown vs. BYU ... Johnson's interception and return was the 11th defensive touchdown scored by Tech in **Paul Johnson's** five seasons as head coach, 10 of which have come via interception returns ... Senior **DE Izaan Cross** has now started 34 consecutive games ... Sophomore **T Morgan Bailey** became the 13th Yellow Jacket to make first career start in 2012 vs. BYU ... Saturday's game against BYU marked the first time Tech did not score an offensive touchdown since Dec. 31, 2008, vs. LSU in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.



Virginia

With 30 yards receiving in the Oct. 20 game vs. Wake Forest, **RB Perry Jones** became the 31st player in UVa history with 1,000 career receiving yards ... Jones is now the fourth player in UVa history, and 12th player in ACC history, with 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career rushing yards... Other UVa players are Frank Quayle, Terry Kirby and Alvin Pearman ... Jones is also only the second active FBS player to have 1,000 career rushing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards; Houston's Charles Sims is also part of the club ... With five receptions, Jones passed Terry Kirby (105) and is now tied with Patrick Jeffers (108) for No. 11 all-time at UVa in career receptions ... **WR Tim Smith** became the 32nd player in UVa history 1,000 career receiving yards in the Wake Forest game ... Smith and Jones were high school teammates at Oscar Smith High School (Chesapeake, Va.), and both graduated in 2009 ... UVa's defense has allowed a combined 448 yards in the last two games, an average of 224 yards per game.



Miami

Thirteen of Miami's 30 scoring drives this season have needed less than two minutes, including five that have needed less than 60 seconds ... Freshman **S Deon Bush** and redshirt freshman **LB Eddie Johnson** both have three forced fumbles each – tied for the lead among ACC defenders. Bush and Johnson have combined for six of Miami's 11 forced fumbles this season ... Thirty-one of sophomore **LB Denzel Perryman's** 47 tackles have come in the last three games, including a team-high 11 tackles in an Oct. 13 loss to North Carolina and a season-high 12 stops Oct. 20 vs. No. 14 Florida State ... Miami has 15 different players that have at least one reception in eight games ... In the first 20 games of the **Al Golden** era, Miami has used 18 different defensive starting lineups ... In each of Miami's four wins, the Hurricanes made up a deficit of at least seven points to come back and win ... Through eight games, the Hurricanes are converting 82.8 percent of their red zone opportunities (24 of 29)... Dating back to the third quarter of its 44-37 win Sept. 29 vs. NC State, Miami has converted eight straight red zone trips.



Virginia Tech

QB Logan Thomas needs 181 yards to hit the 6,000 mark for his career ... The Hokies have four games remaining, two of which will be nationally-televised games on ESPN on successive Thursday nights (this week at Miami and Nov. 8 at home vs. Florida State) ... Playing on Thursday used to be routine for Virginia Tech as Tech and VMI clashed in Roanoke every Thanksgiving afternoon except for two from 1913 through 1969 in what once was known as "The Military Classic of the South" ... Overall, Tech has a 65-32-5 record in games played on Thursday ... This week marks the Hokies' 25th appearance on ESPN Thursday Night Football (19-5) after beating Georgia Tech and North Carolina last year on Thursday ... Since joining the ACC in 2004, the Hokies have lost just two of their 27 league games played in the month of November ... With 255 career wins, **Frank Beamer** needs one win to take over sole possession of seventh place in all-time wins among NCAA FBS football coaches ... **LB Jack Tyler's** 9.6 tackles per game rank him third-best among ACC players.

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When Miami hosts Virginia Tech this Thursday night (7:30 p.m.) at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla., the game will be the 81st contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also be a meeting of the two winningest ACC programs on ESPN's Thursday Night package.

The Hurricanes have the highest winning percentage on nationally televised games on Thursday night of any current ACC school, having posted a 15-3 overall mark, an .833 winning percentage. Miami is even better at home, posting a 10-1 mark in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (2-1). The only UM loss came last year, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

Virginia Tech has won more nationally televised games on Thursdays than any other current ACC school, posting an impressive 19-5 record (.792), including the last four in a row. The Hokies of Coach Frank Beamer are also almost equally effective on the road (.800 winning percentage) as at home (.786), and have won more Thursday ESPN road games (8) than any other ACC squad.

This week's game marks only the second time these two teams have met on Thursday night. Miami took the one prior contest, a 16-14 decision at Sun Life Stadium in 2008.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 134 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

This week, Virginia Tech will tie Georgia Tech for most Thursday Night ESPN appearances, as the Hokies will be playing in their 25th Thursday night game. Miami will be making its 19th appearance, followed by NC State (18), Maryland (13), Boston College (12), Florida State (12), Virginia (11) and Clemson (11).

Georgia Tech has hosted more games (18) than any other ACC school. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

There have been many other great moments in the series including the game on Oct. 25, 2007 when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents who were both ranked in the Top Ten nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC turned the tables, upsetting 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by UNC placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was also a classic; a see-saw battle which featured a dramatic 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Hokies' David Wilson with 2:23 remaining as the deciding play.

Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's dramatic upset of 2nd-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State, which resulted in a 6.1 rating.

This week's game is the second of four consecutive ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. Wake Forest and Clemson began the string last Thursday night in Winston-Salem, with the Tigers claiming a 42-13 triumph. Next week, Florida State then travels to Blacksburg, Va., to face the Hokies on Nov. 8; and finally, North Carolina visits Virginia's Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va. on Nov. 15.

The ACC and ESPNU on Thursday Night

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006.

Florida State's EJ Manuel North Carolina's Gio Bernard Named Semifinalists for Maxwell Award

Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel and North Carolina sophomore TB Giovanni Bernard were among 16 players chosen nationally as semifinalists for the 2012 Maxwell Award, which is presented annually to the nation's outstanding college football player.

Manuel, from Virginia Beach, Va., has led the Seminoles to an 8-1 overall record and a No. 9 national (AP) ranking. Manuel ranks 3rd nationally in pass efficiency and is 4th nationally among all active players in the FBS in career pass completion percentage (.673).

Bernard, from Davie, Fla., leads the nation in all-purpose yardage (214.00 yds/gm), in scoring (12.86 pts/g,m) and in punt return average (20.75 avg.) and is 3rd nationally in rushing yards per game, averaging 132.86 per contest.

Florida State's EJ Manuel has completed 67.3 percent of his passes and currently has the best career mark in league history. But North Carolina junior Bryn Renner is right behind, having completed 65.5 percent of his passes. In all, five ACC quarterbacks have completed better than 60 percent of their passes for their careers, while nine have completed 57 percent or better. Manuel ranks 4th in the NCAA among active players in career completion percentage with Renner 9th and Duke's Sean Renfree 15th.

Florida State's EJ Manuel: The ACC's Accuracy Leader

Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel continues to enjoy one of the most accurate seasons and careers in ACC history. The 6-5 Virginia Beach, Va., signal-caller is currently on pace to set an ACC career passing percentage record. Manuel has completed 498 of 740 passes, a completion percentage of .673. If maintained through the end of this year, that would make Manuel the most accurate passer in league history. Manuel is also putting together quite a senior campaign.



■ He is completing 70% of his passes this fall, the best of his career and close to the ACC mark for the best percentage in a season, which is currently held by former Wake Forest standout Riley Skinner (72.4 in 2007).

■ His career pass efficiency rating of 154.78 would be the best in ACC history if maintained, surpassing the mark of 151.15 set by former FSU Heisman Trophy winner Chris Weinke during the 1997-99 campaigns.

■ He is currently ranked 4th among all active players in the NCAA's FBS in career pass completion percentage (.673). He is also currently ranked 3rd among all active players in the NCAA's FBS in career pass efficiency rating (154.78).

■ In games against Clemson and Boston College this year, he has completed 54 of 69 passes (78.3%), for 819 yards, 6 TDs and only 2 interceptions, an impressive pass efficiency rating of 200.86.

■ He has led Florida State to a 21-5 record as a starter for the Seminoles including consecutive bowl wins over West Virginia, South Carolina and Notre Dame.

Sean Renfree went from quarterback to cheerleader in a matter of minutes, guiding the Duke Blue Devils to a thrilling 33-30 win over rival North Carolina with a final-minute touchdown pass, then leading the fans in the celebration after the game. Duke's win, which makes it bowl-eligible for the first time since 1994, earned the Blue Devils the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl National Team of the Week honor for games of the weekend of Oct. 20. The announcement came exclusively on SiriusXM Radio's "College Sports Today," hosted by Mark Packer and Eddie George.

Duke's Sean Renfree Named NFF Scholar-Athlete



The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Football Hall of Fame has announced that Duke University redshirt senior quarterback Sean Renfree has been named one of 15 recipients of the 2012 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award, presented by Fidelity Investments, a leading provider of not-for-profit workplace retirement savings plans in higher education. The 15 honorees also comprise the list of finalists for the 2012 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by HealthSouth, which recognizes an individual as the absolute best scholar-athlete in the nation. Selected from a nationwide pool of 147 exceptional semifinalists from among all NCAA divisions and the NAIA. This season, Renfree has guided Duke to a 6-3 overall record – the school's best start since 1994 – by hitting on 177-of-258 (.686) pass attempts for 1,885 yards with 11 touchdowns and seven interceptions. On Duke's all-time charts, he ranks first in pass completion percentage (.645), fourth in passing yardage and fifth in touchdown passes. In addition, his passing yardage total is the 17th-highest in ACC history. Renfree graduated from Duke in December of 2011 with a degree in public policy studies, boasting a cumulative grade point average of 3.40. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in humanities, where he holds a 3.81 GPA. A native of Scottsdale, Ariz., Renfree becomes the third Duke player to earn the honor, joining Mike Diminick (1988) and Bill Obremsky (1983).

Clemson's Meek's Named Jim Thorpe National DB of the Week

After recording two key interceptions, including one he returned 74 yards for a touchdown in 14th-ranked Clemson's 38-17 win over Virginia Tech on Oct. 20, senior safety Jonathan Meeks (Rock Hill, S.C.) was named the Jim Thorpe Defensive Back of the Week. Up just 10-7 with Virginia Tech driving in the second quarter, Meeks intercepted a pass at the Clemson 26-yard line and returned it for the score giving the Tigers momentum and a 17-7 lead. The 74-yard return was the longest interception return for a score by a Clemson player since 2006. Meeks also added four tackles, a pass breakup and had another interception earlier in the second quarter as Meeks jumped to fifth in Clemson history in total interception return yards with 192.



Duke's Renfree Piling Up Completions, Yards and 300-Yard Game

Duke junior QB Sean Renfree (Scottsdale, Ariz.) moved into 8th place on the ACC career completions list with 778 completions this past week and is now 17th on the ACC career passing yardage list with 8,237 yards. He has topped 300 passing yards in a game 9 times in his career, good enough for a tie for 9th in the ACC.

Biletnikoff Watch List Includes 12 From The ACC; The Most of Any Conference

With Duke sophomore **WR Jamison Crowder** being added to the Watch List for the prestigious Biletnikoff Award, that brings the total number of ACC players on the list to 12, the most of any conference in the nation. Crowder, from Monroe, N.C., is 5th in the ACC in receptions per game with 53 catches and is 8th in the ACC



in receiving yards per game averaging 71.7 yards per game. He has topped the 100-yard receiving mark three times in nine games.

The Biletnikoff Award is given annually to the nation's outstanding pass receiver by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation in honor of former FSU wide receiver Fred Biletnikoff.

Boston College junior **WR Alex Amidon** (Greenfield, Mass.) currently leads a contingent of 6 ACC receivers ranked among the Top 41 nationally in receiving yards per game. Amidon, who is 3rd in the ACC in receptions per game (7.1), is averaging 117.9 yards per game and ranks 4th nationally. He is followed by Clemson junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins** (Central, S.C.), who ranks 7th nationally in receiving yards per game (113.6), and is tied for 10th nationally in receptions per game (7.25).

Joining him in the national rankings are Duke senior **WR Conner Vernon** (Miami, Fla.), who is 27th in reception yardage (84.56); Maryland true freshman **Stefan Diggs** (Gaithersburg, Md.), who is 31st (83.25); Virginia Tech's **Marcus Davis** (Virginia Beach, Va.) who is 40th at 80.38 and Wake Forest's **Michael Campanaro** (Clarksville, Md.), who is 41st (80.17).

Clemson's Chandler Catanzaro's Streak Ends at 20 Consecutive Field Goals

Clemson junior **PK Chandler Cantanzaro** had his streak of 20 consecutive field goals ended against Wake Forest on Oct. 25. The streak was the 4th-longest streak in ACC history. NC State's Marc Primanti set the ACC record of 27 straight during the 1995 and 1996 seasons. Cantanzaro had made his first 12 three-pointers this year prior to missing a 48-yarder at Wake Forest. Ironically, his last previous miss was against Wake in 2011.

Duke's Vernon Threatens ACC Career Reception Yardage Record

Duke senior **WR Conner Vernon** (Miami, Fla.) is now on the verge of breaking the ACC's career mark for reception yardage, currently held by Florida State's Peter Warrick (3,517). Vernon, who already holds the ACC career mark for pass receptions with 252 catches, is now in 2nd place in career receiving yardage with 3,436 yards and needs 82 more yards to become the ACC's all-time leader in receptions and receiving yardage. A 2nd-team All-ACC pick last year, who became the first receiver in league history with back-to-back 70-catch seasons, Vernon also holds the longest current streak in the NCAA for catching a pass. Vernon has caught a pass in 44 straight games--every game of his college career.

Clemson's Tajh Boyd Is One of the ACC's Most Productive Quarterbacks



Clemson junior QB Tajh Boyd, who recently broke the Clemson career record for touchdown passes after just a year and a half as a starter for the Tigers and was named a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award for the second straight year, is becoming one of the most productive quarterbacks in ACC History. With 7,022 yards of total offense in 29 career games, he is averaging 242.1 yards per game. In his 22

starts, his average jumps to 302.8 yards per game.

■ The Hampton, Va., native has now thrown 57 touchdown passes in 29 career games, an average of 1.97 per game.

■ Boyd has accounted for 67 TDs rushing and passing (TDR) in his 29 games, an average of 2.31 per game. As a starter, Boyd's TDR average in 22 games as a starter (62 TDR) is 2.82.

■ Boyd's TD pass average is even better as a starter with 53 TD passes in 22 starts, an average of 2.41 per start.

■ Boyd broke the school record with 428 passing yards against Wake Forest and now has thrown for 6,164 yards in his 22 games as a starter, an average of 280.2 yards per game. His average of 216.6 yards per game for his entire 29-game career would place him 14th on the ACC career list.

Florida State's Dustin Hopkins Sets ACC Scoring Mark

Florida State senior PK Dustin Hopkins, a 2011 finalist for the Lou Groza Award and a 2010 Groza semifinalist, continued his assault on the ACC and NCAA record books.



Hopkins became the ACC's career scoring leader on Oct. 13 against Boston College on 3 field goals and 6 PATs and added another 13 points against Duke. He now has 429 career points and has moved into 3rd place on the NCAA's career scoring by

Tech's Tevin Washington Ranks 7th Nationally In Scoring

With 15 touchdowns already this season, Georgia Tech **QB Tevin Washington (We-tumpka, Ala.)** ranks 7th nationally in scoring, averaging 11.2 points a game. Washington is in 2nd place on the ACC's career TD list for signal callers with 33 scores. He is now 4th in the ACC in career rushing yards for quarterbacks with 2,022 yards.

He ranks 7th in the ACC in rushing yards and is averaging 60.1 yards per game.

Washington has improved his passing accuracy. He came into his final season completing just 47.2 percent of his passes for his career. After 7 games, Washington has completed 59.3 percent of his passes this year, an improvement of more than 12 percent from his career average.

Duke Bowl Eligible for First Time Since 1994

Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has guided Duke to a 6-3 start this year. That's the best start for Duke since the Blue Devils won their first seven games en route to their last postseason bowl appearance under former head coach Fred Goldsmith in 1994. That was also the last time the Blue Devils were bowl eligible.



Cutcliffe has now led Duke to 21 football victories in four and a half seasons as head coach, two more triumphs than the school accounted for in the previous 12 years (1996-2007) prior to his arrival in Durham.

BC's Andre Williams Records Longest Run In ACC History

In the midst of a career-best 191-yard rushing day at Army on Oct. 6, Boston College junior RB **Andre Williams** uncorked the longest run from scrimmage in league history. With 10:45 remaining in the second quarter, Williams, from Greenfield, Mass., broke open at the line of scrimmage and scampered 99 yards for a TD, bettering the previous mark of 98 yards set by former Maryland standout Steve Atkins on Nov. 18, 1978. The run also tied an NCAA record set originally by Gale Sayers of Kansas in 1963 and matched since by eight others including Williams. Williams also tied the record for shortest possible TD run against the Cadets that is held by many, scoring from one yard out with 5:47 remaining in the first quarter.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Becomes NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 255 triumphs in his 32-year coaching career. Beamer has tied former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne for 7th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list, two wins shy of former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards (257) by three wins. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 142 career wins and NC State's Tom O'Brien is in 21st place (112). Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, finished his career in 2nd place on the all-time list with 389 victories, though the NCAA recognizes only 377 triumphs due to NCAA sanctions. With the NCAA sanctions levied against Penn State, Bowden is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader.



Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, finished his career in 2nd place on the all-time list with 389 victories, though the NCAA recognizes only 377 triumphs due to NCAA sanctions. Five Current ACC Head Football Coaches Have UVa Ties

When **Al Golden** joined the ACC as Miami's head coach for the 2011 season, he became the fifth former UVa assistant or graduate assistant coach to be a current head football coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Golden joined Boston College's **Frank Spaziani**, NC State's **Tom O'Brien**, Virginia's **Mike London** and Wake Forest's **Jim Grobe** as current ACC head coaches who have spent time as assistants or graduate assistants for the Cavaliers. Golden spent four seasons (2001-04) at Virginia as defensive coordinator under Al Groh. The Eagles' Spaziani served as an assistant coach at Virginia under then head coach George Welsh for nine seasons (1982-90), the last five as defensive coordinator. O'Brien also served under Welsh at UVa, spending 15 seasons (1982-96) there including the last six as offensive coordinator. London served two terms at UVa under Groh, serving as defensive line coach in 2001-04 and again in 2006-07 as defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. London and Golden also served as assistants to Tom O'Brien at Boston College. Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe, a 1975 Virginia graduate, who just completed his 11th season with the Deacons, lettered two seasons at UVa as a middle guard and linebacker and also spent one year as a graduate assistant coach (1975) under then Virginia head coach Sonny Randle.

Wake Forest's Jim Grobe Latest To Join 100-Win Club

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is the fourth active ACC coach with 100 career wins. Grobe now has a record of 105-104-1 career mark for 18 seasons, the last 12 with the Deacons. NC State's Tom O'Brien has 113 wins, having accumulated 75 of them in a 10-year stay at Boston College. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (255), the nation's leading active coach in the FBS in wins, and Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (143) are the other ACC coaches over the century mark in career triumphs.

North Carolina's Larry Fedora Has Heels High Scoring

North Carolina Head Coach Larry Fedora's fast-paced offense has his team scoring at a record pace. Ranked 17th nationally in scoring defense, averaging 39.44 points a game, the Tar Heels have already accomplished the following:



■ UNC scored a school-record 66 points against Idaho on Sept. 29.

■ UNC has topped the 60-point mark on two occasions this year for the first time in school history

■ The Tar Heels scored 48 points against Virginia Tech on Oct. 6, the most points for UNC against the Hokies in the 35 meetings between the two teams in football.

■ UNC's 43 points in its win against NC State was its highest point total in the series since 1996 and 3rd-best all-time.

NC State's Tom O'Brien Latest To Coach at Multiple ACC Schools

NC State's Tom O'Brien is the fifth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to have served as a head coach of two ACC schools. O'Brien coached at Boston College from 1997 through 2006, which included the school's first two seasons (2005-06) of ACC membership. Jim Tatum was the first ACC coach at two schools; he first coached at North Carolina in 1942, then at Maryland from 1947-55 before returning to UNC beginning in 1956 until his death in 1958. Others who have coached at two ACC schools include Bobby Ross (Md, GT), Al Groh (WF, UVa) and Bill Dooley (UNC, WF).



Dooley actually coached at three current ACC schools as he spent nine seasons at Virginia Tech before the Hokies joined the ACC, in between stints at UNC and Wake Forest, winning 162 games in his career. Dooley and Ross are the only coaches in ACC history to be named ACC Coach of the Year at more than one school. Others who have coached at more than one current ACC school, though not necessarily when they were in the ACC, include John Heisman, who coached at both Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Tech's Beamer Becomes 10th FBS Head Coach To Win 200 Games At One School

With a 17-10 win over East Carolina in 2011, Virginia Tech head football coach Frank Beamer accomplished yet another milestone in a career which now spans 32 years as a head coach. The win was Beamer's 200th at his alma mater making him only the 10th head coach in NCAA FBS history to have won 200 games at one school. He became only the second ACC head coach to do so, joining former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, Beamer's overall record, now in his 26th year at Virginia Tech is 213-102-2 (.675). He is now only the second active FBS head coach with 200 wins at one school with Nevada's Chris Ault (231).

In just his third season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 27-9 record (.750) in his

third season. His winning percentage ranks him tied for 5th with former NC State head coach Lou Holtz among all ACC head coaches in their third season, ahead of such figures as Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.859).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams have won 14 of the first 16 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .875. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching.

Swinney's winning percentage has him 2nd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 10 of his first 12 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (2nd), Danny Ford (8th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non-divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

2012 ACC Bowl Selection

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series.



Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocare V100 Independence Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C.

Conditional Agreement*

8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt or Western Athletic conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is

Playoff Coming In 2014-15

On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Georgia Tech and Miami ended regulation tied at 36-36, it marked the 60th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 60 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 60 overtime contests, 30 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-19 advantage in the 53 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-28 record. Forty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
