TODAY'S GAME:

- UVa looks for its third ACC Tournament title as it plays Florida State (2004, 2012)
- The Cavaliers look to avenge their only loss of the season (1-0 at FSU on Sept. 28)
- FSU looks to become the 1st team to defeat UVa in both the regular season and ACC Tournament since North Carolina in 2005

SERIES HISTORY:

- UVa leads 18-4-4 overall (UVa leads 3-1-1 in ACC Tournament)
- Since 2009, the teams have split nine meetings (4-4-1, including each team winning once in the ACC Tournament)

CAVALIER OFFENSE vs. SEMINOLE DEFENSE:

- In the last 80 games, UVa has been shutout 3 times (all vs. FSU in Tallahassee)
- In the four UVa-FSU games in that stretch outside of Tallahassee, Virginia has scored 10 goals and is 3-1-0 in those contests

ACC TOURNAMENT HISTORY:

- Virginia has an all-time record of 17-18-8 in the ACC Tournament
- UVa is 12-7-7 at the tournament during the Steve Swanson era
- The Cavaliers won the ACC Tournament in 2004 and 2012

HIGH SCORING HOOS:

- The Cavaliers lead the ACC and rank second nationally in scoring offense at 3.42 goals per game
- Virginia led the nation in scoring in 2013 at 3.00 goals per game
- UVa has 15 different goal scorers this season, including 12 players with multiple goals and seven players with at least four goals
- Virginia has scored at least two goals in 18 of 19 games this season

- Virginia led all schools with three first-team All-ACC selections (Morgan Brian, Danielle Colaprico and Makenzy Doniak)
- Brian becomes the fourth Cavalier to be a four-time 1st Team selection (Amanda Cromwell, Angela Hucles, Sinead Farrelly)
- Emily Sonnett (2nd Team) and Brittany Ratcliffe (3rd Team) were also honored
- Colaprico was the inaugural recipient of the ACC Midfielder of the Year award

THE ERA OF OFFENSE:

- Since this year's senior class arrived at Virginia in 2011, the Cavaliers have led the nation in goals
- Virginia has scored 268 goals over the past four seasons, including 78 last season to lead the nation

SCORING FROM THE BACK:

- Virginia has 13 goals from defenders this season (Cox-4, Sonnett-3, McNabb-3, Iordanou-2, Reid), breaking the school record of nine set last year

BENCH PRODUCTION:

- Virginia has recorded 14 goals and 13 assists this season from substitutes
- The Cavaliers have gotten a goal off the bench in 12 of 19 games this year

WINNING BIG:

- Virginia currently leads the nation in goal differential at +53 this season
- UVA led the nation with a +62 GD last season

GOALS GALORE:

- Virginia found the back of the net 12 times in wins over BC & NCSU
- First time since 2008 a team scored at least six goals in consecutive ACC games
- UVA was the first Power 5 Conference team (ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, Pac-12, SEC) to score at least six goals in consecutive games since 2011

TRIO OF WEEKLY HONORS:

- Virginia had three players earn weekly honors on Oct. 14 after the victories over Boston College and NC State
- Danielle Colaprico was named ACC Player of the Week after posting a goal and two assists in each victory
- Kaili Torres was named the TopDrawerSoccer.com Player of the Week after an assist vs. BC and a goal and three assists vs. NC State
- Makenzy Doniak was the College Soccer Madness ACC Player of the Week after two goals and an assist vs. BC and a goal and an assist vs. NC State

RATCLIFFE'S LATE WINNER SINKS IRISH:

- Virginia won 2-1 at Notre Dame on Brittany Ratcliffe's goal in the 90th min.
- The goal was scored with 20 seconds left as she tapped in a rebound of a saved shot by Makenzy Doniak
- It was the latest GWG in regulation by a Cavalier since Nikki Krzysik scored with 14 seconds left to defeat William & Mary 1-0 in the second round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament
- Ratcliffe was named ACC Player of the Week on Oct. 7

DONIAK ON A STREAK:

- Makenzy Doniak has scored a goal in the last 7 games, the second longest streak in UVa history (one behind Caroline Miller - 8 games in 2012)
- She has had a point in 8 consecutive games, tied for the third longest streak in Virginia history

DONIAK RISING UP THE UVA RECORD BOOK:

- Makenzy Doniak, only a junior, has entered several UVa career top 10 lists
- She ranks 3rd in goals (44), 2nd in points (110) and T-5th in GWG (13)

COLAPRICO SETS SINGLE-SEASON ASSIST MARK

- Danielle Colaprico leads the ACC with 15 assists this season, setting a school record for assists in a season
- Her 40 career assists ranks 2nd in school history
- She had a point in seven straight games earlier this season, the longest streak of her career and tied for the fifth-longest streak in Cavalier history

BRIAN HELPS UNITED STATES SECURE WORLD CUP BERTH:

- Morgan Brian has returned to UVa after missing eight games this season due to international duty with the United States Women's National Team, including missing five games for CONCACAF World Cup Qualifying
- Brian made her first appearance in qualifying on Oct. 20, entering as a substitute in the 63rd minute and scoring a goal in the 82nd minute in the 6-0 win over Haiti at RFK Stadium in Washington
- She played 23 minutes as a substitute on Oct. 24 in the 3-0 semifinal win over Mexico in Philadelphia as the team clinched a Women's World Cup berth
- She started the championship game, a 6-0 win over Costa Rica, playing 50 minutes and assisting on Abby Wambach's goal in the fourth minute
- Brian has 16 appearances for the USWNT and three international goals since her debut in June 2013
- She was the only collegian on the 20-player USWNT qualifying roster

SWANSON ASSISTING USWNT:

- Head Coach Steve Swanson also assisted the United States Women's National Team as it competed in CONCACAF World Cup Qualifying
- He worked with both teams this fall, but his schedule minimized the number of Virginia games he missed (only one: Old Dominion)

KLÖCK-WORK AT HOME:

- Virginia has won a school-record 29 consecutive home games (longest active streak in the nation)
- It is tied for the eighth-longest streak in NCAA Division I women's soccer history (chart on pg. 3)
- This year's senior class is 54-4-2 at Klöckner over their career

BRIAN AND DONIAK REACH 100 POINT MARK:

- Morgan Brian became the fifth player in school history to record 100 career points (37G, 34A - 108pts) on Sept. 25
- Makenzy Doniak became the sixth player in school history to record 100 career points (44G, 22A - 110pts) on Oct. 12
- Virginia is the first ACC team to have two active 100-point scorers since North Carolina had three in 2005 (Lindsay Tarpley, Heather O'Reilly and Kacey White)

BRIAN JOINS 30-30 CLUB:

- Morgan Brian became the second Cavalier to join the 30-30 club, currently having 37 goals and 34 assists in her career
- Andrea Rubio (1989-92) is UVa's other member (36G, 30A)
- Rachel Tejada of Illinois State and Daphne Corboz of Georgetown are the only other active members of the club

CAVALIERS HAVE TWO IN 30-20 CLUB:

- Only 14 active players nationally have posted at least 30 goals and at least 20 assists in their career, and Virginia has two of them
- Morgan Brian (37G, 34A) and Makenzy Doniak (44G, 22A) are both members of the club
- Doniak is one of two juniors on the list

THREE HOOS ON PRESEASON HERMANN LIST:

- Virginia had three players named to the preseason watch list for the MAC Hermann Trophy
- Morgan Brian, who became Virginia first women's MAC Hermann Trophy winner, was joined by 2013 semifinalist Makenzy Doniak and Danielle Colaprico
- All three were also named preseason All-Americans by Soccer America and Top Drawer Soccer

- The Cavaliers are expected to be selected to their 27th NCAA Tournament and their 21st consecutive NCAA Tournament
