FOR OPENERS

- Virginia and Villanova are the defending regular-season champions of the Atlantic Coast and BIG EAST conferences.
- UVA is 68-12 (.850) over the past three seasons, while Villanova is 70-9 (.886).
- UVA last faced consecutive ranked teams in non-league play in the regular season on Nov. 26 and 27 and Dec. 4, 2002 – vs. No. 15 Kentucky, No. 19 Indiana and No. 21 Michigan State. The UK and IU games were in the Maui Classic and the MSU game was in East Lansing.
- UVA ranks sixth nationally in scoring defense (57.1 ppg) and turnover margin (1.77).
- UVA is shooting 51.1 percent from the field (best since 52.3% in 1982-83), 38.3 percent from 3-point range (best since 38.8% in 2010-11) and 74.3 percent from the free throw line (best since 74.8% in 2009-10).
- Senior forward Anthony Gill is the reigning ACC Player of the Week after tallying his fourth career double-double vs. West Virginia.

VIRGINIA'S RANKED NO. 8/9 IN LATEST POLLS

- UVA is ranked No. 8 in the latest Associated Press poll and No. 9 in the USA Today Coaches' poll.
- UVA was ranked No. 12 in both polls on Nov. 23, falling out the top 10 for the first time since Feb. 24, 2014.
- UVA had been ranked in the top 10 in 25 consecutive AP polls since March 3, 2014, its longest span since 49 consecutive polls from 1980-83.
- The Cavaliers' No. 6 preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- Virginia has been ranked in the preseason top-10 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1981-82 and 1982-83.
- UVA has finished in the top 10 (No. 3 in 2014 & No. 6 in 2015) in the final AP rankings in back-to-back seasons for the first time since three straight seasons from 1981-83.

ALL-TIME VS. VILLANOVA

- The Cavaliers own a 4-2 advantage over the Wildcats in the all-time series that dates back to 1981.
- UVA and Villanova last met during the 2004 NIT when the Wildcats defeated the Cavaliers 73-63 at The Pavilion in Villanova, Pa.
- UVA is 1-0 vs. Villanova in Charlottesville, defeating the Wildcats 88-59 on Jan. 17, 1987 at University Hall.

LAST TIME VS. VILLANOVA

- Villanova's Allan Ray tallied 23 points and Randy Foye added 21 to lead the Wildcats to a 73-63 win over Virginia in the first round of the 2004 NIT.
- Gary Forbes led the Cavaliers with 19 points and Elton Brown added 13 points as UVA finished the season 18-13.
- Villanova held a 44-31 rebounding advantage as Curtis Sumpter grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds for the Wildcats.

AGAINST THE BIG EAST CONFERENCE

- UVA meets a BIG EAST Conference foe for the first time since defeating St. John's 68-50 in the second round of the 2013 NIT.
- UVA is 23-32 all-time against current BIG EAST Conference members (0-2 vs. DePaul, 11-12 vs. Georgetown, 3-1 vs. Marquette, 3-3 vs. Providence, 0-3 vs. Seton Hall, 1-7 vs. St. John's, 4-2 vs. Villanova and 1-2 vs. Xavier).

UVA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- UVA is 1-0 vs. ranked opponents, defeating then-No. 14 West Virginia 70-54 on Dec. 8.
- UVA went 4-4 vs. ranked foes in 2014-15, defeating Maryland, Notre Dame, North Carolina and Louisville.
- Virginia is 15-21 against ranked opponents, including a 2-6 mark vs. top-5 foes, in the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 130-316 vs. ranked opponents, including a 25-119 mark against top-5 foes, since 1953-54.
- The Cavaliers are 1-26 vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).

LAST TIME OUT

- Anthony Gill posted season highs of 20 points and 12 rebounds for his fourth career double-double in then-No. 10 Virginia's 70-54 win over then-No. 14 West Virginia in the Jimmy V Classic on Dec. 8 at Madison Square Garden.
- Malcolm Brogdon added 14 points and London Perrantes added 13 points (5-6 FGs, 3-3 3FGs) in his return from an appendectomy.
- UVA overcame a six-point halftime deficit by shooting 73.7 percent (14-19) from the field in the second half.
- The Cavaliers committed a season-high 19 turnovers in the game.

BACK TO THE FUTURE

- Virginia's 76.3 points per game average is its highest under Tony Bennett and highest since averaging 76.8 points in 2007-08.
- Virginia has scored 80 or more points in five games, the most under Tony Bennett and most since five in 2008-09 and 11 in 2007-08.
- The Cavaliers scored 82 or more points in three straight games (Nov. 19-22 at Charleston Classic) for the first time since the first three games of the 2001-02 season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett sports a 144-65 mark in seven seasons at Virginia and 213-98 career mark in 10 seasons.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett was also named ACC Coach of the Year, NABC District 2 Coach of the Year and USBWA District 3 Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to four consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014 and 2015, and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett-coached teams are 76-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 10-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense three times (2008-09, 2013-14 & 2014-15), and finished in the top five nationally in six of nine seasons.
- Bennett is one of 26 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.
- UVA is 76-24 (.760) in non-conference action and 88-20 (.815) at home under Tony Bennett.

'HOO ARE THESE WAHOOS?

- UVA is averaging 76.3 points per game and yielding 57.1 ppg (6th nationally and most since 62.4 in 2010-11).
- Virginia ranks No. 1 overall in the KenPom.com overall ratings.
- The Cavaliers rank sixth in the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.77), 11th in field goal percentage (51.1%), tied for 11th in turnover margin (5.0) and 15th in scoring margin (19.0).
- Senior All-America candidate Malcolm Brogdon leads UVA in scoring for the third consecutive season at a career-best 16.9 points per game, while All-ACC performer Anthony Gill is averaging a career high 13.4 points and 6.4 rebounds.
- Brogdon has four 20-point efforts, including a career-high 28 at

- George Washington), and Gill has reached double figures in scoring in all nine games.
- London Perrantes is averaging career highs in points (10.4), assists (5.1) and 3-point field goal percentage (53.8%).
- UVA has out-rebounded its opponents in seven of its eight wins and has a +8.0 rebounding margin overall.
- Nine players are averaging 10 or more minutes per game.
- The Cavaliers have shot 50 percent or better from 3-point range in three of their last six games.

ALL-AMERICAN BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason co-ACC Player of the Year Malcolm Brogdon is averaging a team-leading 16.9 points and 4.6 rebounds per game in 2015-16.
- Brogdon is aiming to become the first UVA player since Sean Singletary (2006-08) to lead the Cavaliers in scoring for three straight seasons.
- Brogdon's 16.9 scoring average is the highest for UVA since Mike Scott's 18.0 ppg in 2011-12.
- Brogdon was named a preseason All-American by The Sporting News (1st team), Blue Ribbon Yearbook (1st team), CBSsports.com (2nd team), NBCsports.com (2nd team), Bleacher Report (2nd team), USA Today (3rd team) and CollegeInsider.com.
- In 2014-15, Brogdon averaged 14.0 points and 3.9 rebounds en route to All-America second-team and All-ACC first-team accolades.
- The two-time All-ACC performer, who was a John Wooden Award finalist last season, ranks 26th on UVA's all-time scoring list with 1,286 points in 108 career games (11.9 career ppg).
- Brogdon ranks second on UVA's career free-throw percentage list at 85.9% (304-for-354).
- Brogdon, who is a candidate for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award and Wooden Citizen Cup Award, was named to the 2014 Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- Brogdon helped Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto.
- The redshirt senior earned a degree in history and is pursuing a master's degree in public policy from the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy.

LONDON CALLING THE SHOTS

- Junior point guard London Perrantes is enjoying a breakout season in 2015-16.
- Perrantes has hit double figures in scoring in four of his last five games, including a season-high 16 points vs. George Mason.
- He tallied his second career double-double with 16 points and a career-high 11 assists against George Mason en route to MVP honors at the Charleston Classic.
- Perrantes is shooting a career-best 53.8 percent (14-26) from 3-point range and has a career 3.2 assist-to turnover ratio (320 assists, 96 turnovers) in 76 career games.
- Perrantes averaged 6.4 points and 4.6 assists en route to honorable mention All-ACC honors last season.
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami (1/3/15).
- Perrantes earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors in 2013-14.

DT SHOWING HIS VERSATILITY

- Darius Thompson has averaged 8.4 points, 2.6 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.2 steals in 24.6 minutes in his first season at UVA.
- He has four-game double figure scoring streak, and tallied 12 points in four of nine games.
- Thompson has started five games and is averaging 10.2 points in those contests.
- Thompson sat out as a transfer last season after averaging 2.6 points and 2.4 assists in 37 games at Tennessee in 2013-14.
- Thompson had 12 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals in his UVA debut as a starter vs. Morgan State.

HIGH POINT MAN TO THE GILLS

- Preseason All-ACC second-team selection Anthony Gill, who is averaging 13.4 points and 6.4 rebounds, is Virginia's top frontcourt player.
- Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, averaged 11.6 points and 6.5 rebounds en route to All-ACC third-team (media) honors in 2014-15.
- Gill's team-leading 29 steals helped earn him a spot on the coaches' All-ACC Defensive Team in 2014-15.
- Gill, who has led UVA in field goal percentage in each of the past two seasons, is shooting 58.3 percent during his UVA career.
- Gill earned MVP honors at the 2014 Barclays Center Classic and ranked 13th in the ACC in rebounding.
- Gill has amassed 1,082 career points in three seasons at UVA and one at South Carolina.

HALL OF A SPARK OFF THE BENCH

- Redshirt sophomore guard Devon Hall has earned increased playing time this season for UVA.
- Hall has played in all nine games this season and is averaging 19.7 minutes after averaging 10.6 minutes in 23 contests last season.
- Hall netted a career-high 13 points vs. Morgan State and drained a career-best four 3-pointers for 12 points vs. Long Beach State.
- He played a career-high 26 minutes vs. William & Mary.

BROGDON AND GILL ON WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Malcolm Brogdon and Anthony Gill are among 50 players on the preseason 2016 John R. Wooden Award Watch List, honoring the nation's top player.
- Gill earns his first preseason Wooden Award Watch List honor, while Brogdon was a Wooden Award All-American and finalist last season.
