VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia is competing in its 16th NCAA tournament, including its 13th straight trip to the Big Dance.
- UVA is 52-34 in the NCAA tournament. UVA is 40-18 in NCAAs over the last seven years (second most NCAA wins since 2009 – Vanderbilt, 46).
- This is UVA's ninth home regional (all in the last 13 years).
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVA is 46-28 in the NCAA tourney and 31-19 in regional play.
- UVA owns six regional championships (2009, '10, '11, '13, '14, '15).
- UVA advanced to the College World Series in 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2015, taking runner-up honors to Vanderbilt in the 2014 CWS Finals before going on a wild march to the program's first national championship in 2015.

VIRGINIA ONE OF FIVE SCHOOLS IN LAST 13 NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of five Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last 13 seasons (including 2016).
- The Cavaliers are one of three teams in the ACC to hold that distinction.
- Top current NCAA tournament streaks: Miami (44), Florida State (39), Cal State Fullerton (25), Rice (22), Virginia (13).
- Virginia is one of 16 schools in NCAA history to reach 13 straight NCAA tournaments (17 total occurrences).

VIRGINIA AGAINST THE 2016 NCAA FIELD

- Virginia faced 11 teams that advanced to the NCAA tournament this year (Boston College, Clemson, Coastal Carolina, Duke, East Carolina, Georgia Tech, Louisville, Miami, NC State, Wake Forest, William & Mary).
- Twenty-nine of Virginia's 57 games were against NCAA qualifiers.
- UVA went 14-15 against those teams.

CAVALIERS AGAINST REGIONAL OPPONENTS

- Virginia is familiar with East Carolina and William & Mary, having played both in five-day span in late February and early March.

O'CONNOR SETS UVA WINS RECORD

- Brian O'Connor scored his 595th win as Virginia's head coach on Saturday against Louisville, surpassing Dennis Womack (594, 1981-2003) as UVA's all-time winningest head coach.
- O'Connor already holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (244).
- O'Connor also has a 46-28 career NCAA tournament record, accounting for all but six of UVA's all-time NCAA tourney victories.
- UVA recorded its 13th straight .500-or-better ACC record under O'Connor.

CAVALIERS LOOK TO CONTINUE HOME SUCCESS

- Virginia is 375-93 (.806) at Davenport Field since 2004 under Brian O'Connor, including a 23-10 mark this season.
- UVA is 25-13 in home NCAA tournament games under O'Connor, including a 16-6 mark since 2011.
- UVA has averaged 3,638 fans per game this year, a program record for the regular season.
- The Cavaliers passed the 100,000 mark in attendance for the sixth time in seven years this season (120,082 total).

UVA BOASTS NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

- Virginia's position players have combined for 106 games of NCAA tournament experience.
- Daniel Pinero started all 24 NCAA games at shortstop in 2014 and 2015.

FOUR CAVALIERS EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

- A quartet of Cavaliers earned spots on the 2016 All-ACC Team, with each earning his first such honor.
- Connor Jones was a first-team pick at starting pitcher.
- Matt Thaiss (catcher) and Pavin Smith (first base) were second-team selections, while Ernie Clement (second base) was a third-team honoree.
- Thaiss and Daniel Pinero (shortstop) each were named to the ACC All-Tournament Team last week.

THAISS CONTINUES BIG SEASON

- Matt Thaiss is in the midst of his best season at UVA and comes into the tournament on a career-high 16-game hit streak.
- It is the longest hit streak at UVA since Tyler Cannon's 16-game stretch in 2010 and Dan Grovatt's 19-game streak in 2009.
- He was named one of 15 semifinalists for the Johnny Bench Award.
- He leads Virginia in multiple-hit (28) and multiple-RBI (15) games.
- Thaiss was UVA's top hitter in ACC play (.357) and drove in a team-high 32 runs in conference play.

PITCHING MOVES PAY DIVIDENDS IN ROTATION

- Virginia tinkered with its pitching rotation in early April, moving Adam Haseley and Alec Bettinger in and shifting Tommy Doyle to the closer role and Daniel Lynch to the midweek starter.
- Since Bettinger came out of the closer role, UVA's weekend starters are 11-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 135 innings (6.5 innings per start) while batters are hitting .208 against them.
- Each of the starters has recorded at least one complete game while UVA has totaled five this year, all in the last ACC six series (UVA had 5 CG in the previous four seasons combined).
- It marks the most complete games by a UVA staff since 2004, Brian O'Connor's first year at UVA (6 CG).

DOYLE LEARNING AS CLOSER

- Since taking over as the UVA closer for the BC series, Tommy Doyle has been challenged in an array of tough situations.
- Doyle has struck out 21 batters in 17 innings over 12 games since moving to the bullpen.
- After a tough first weekend at BC, Doyle has allowed two earned runs while picking up three saves and finishing off five more wins.
- He earned his first two saves at then-No. 1 Miami, picking up a two-inning save Friday before recording four straight outs to close the Sunday victory.
- He left the bases loaded to end the Friday game.

CLEMENT CONTINUES TO RAKE

- Ernie Clement leads the ACC in hits (86) and is third in runs (59) and 12th in batting (.348) heading into the NCAA tournament.
- Clement needs one hit to reach the top 10 in single-season hits at UVA.
- He recorded the most regular-season hits (83) for a UVA player since current Arizona Diamondback Phil Gosselin racked up 85 hits in the 2010 regular season.
- Clement owns hits in 50 of 57 games and has four streaks of eight games or more this season, including an 11-game streak that was snapped May 21.
- He has 24 multiple-hit games this year after picking up 12 in the entire 2015 season.

SIMMONS STEPS UP IN 9-HOLE

- Freshman Cam Simmons struggled for much of the first two months this season, but has turned things around over the past six weeks, primarily while batting in the 9-hole.
- In his last 17 games, including 16 straight starts, Simmons is batting .328 (20-for-61), accounting for over half of his hits this season (39).
- Simmons was batting .207 as of April 20, but has raised his average to .255.
- Of the 6-foot-3, 195-pound Simmons, head coach Brian O'Connor recently said "I think he's the largest 9-hole hitter in captivity. He's a big man."

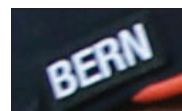
NOVAK GIVES LINEUP BOOST

- Justin Novak has been a jack-of-all-trades for UVA this season, but of late has been a steady force at third base.
- Novak has started UVA's last 31 games, including 23

QUICK SEASON RECAP

- Virginia started the season 20-14 after dropping two of three games at BC (4/8-10), but has gone 17-6 since.
- UVA started 7-8 in the first half of ACC play, but went 12-3 the rest of the way (won last five ACC series).
- Virginia altered its rotation in early April, moving midweek starter Adam Haseley and closer Alec Bettinger into the weekend rotation, while shifting Tommy Doyle from the rotation to closer.
- Since Bettinger moved out of the closer role, UVA's weekend starters are 11-4 with a 3.07 ERA.
- Connor Jones has anchored the rotation with an 11-1 record and a 2.29 ERA in a league-high 98 1/3 innings. He owns a league-best nine ACC wins this year.
- Matt Thaiss is having another All-America caliber season, as he ranks fourth in the ACC in batting (.382) while starting at catcher in 52 of UVA's 57 games, including 26 straight.
- Ernie Clement has emerged as one of UVA's top hitters with a league-high 86 hits (.348 average).

- He has played in 46 games, with 41 starts (29 at 3B, six at 2B, five at C and one at SS).
- Novak has batted in the 2-hole in UVA's last 15 games (UVA is 12-3 in that stretch).
- After recording five hits the first five ACC series, Novak picked up 16 in the last five ACC series.

DEFENSE SHINES DURING RECENT STRETCH

- During the last 15 games, Virginia has been much more solid on defense, committing just eight errors (.986 fielding percentage) while going 12-3.
- UVA did not commit an error in the ACC tournament.
- After a strong start defensively to the season, Virginia then committed 45 errors over a 26-game stretch (14-12 record), good for just a .956 fielding mark.
- UVA recorded 11 errors in its first 16 contests (.982 fielding pct).
- The Cavaliers currently own a .971 fielding percentage, which ranks sixth in the ACC.

HASELEY SHOWS HIS VERSATILITY

- In addition to his work on the mound, Adam Haseley has been a key instigator in the Cavaliers' offense this season.
- He owns a team-high 29 extra-base hits (18 2B, 5 3B, 6 HR) and ranks second in the ACC in triples (5), fifth in runs (57) and eighth in doubles (18).
- He hit his sixth home run May 13 against Georgia Tech and is tied for second on the team in long balls.
- He has reached base safely in all but seven games this season.

2015 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- In a turbulent season, Virginia peaked at the perfect time as the Cavaliers won their first NCAA National Championship.
- Making its second straight trip to the College World Series Finals, UVA avenged its 2014 series defeat to Vanderbilt by defeating the Commodores in a best-of-three series.
- Virginia finished with a 44-24 record, including a 10-2 mark in the NCAA tournament.
- UVA became the first ACC team to win the NCAA baseball championship since Wake Forest in 1955.
- The NCAA championship was the 23rd in Virginia Athletics history.

REGULAR SEASON

- Dealing with youth and an onslaught of injuries, the Cavaliers went 18-19 in March and April and a berth in the ACC tournament was in peril.
- UVA bounced back to go 5-1 in their final two ACC series, including a three-game sweep at North Carolina to end the regular season.
- After winning their ACC tournament play-in game, 11-0, over Georgia Tech, UVA then lost the next three games in pool play.

NCAA TOURNAMENT

- After winning three straight games at the Lake Elsinore Regional, UVA rallied for back-to-back super regional wins at home against Maryland, with Ernie Clement's walk-off, two-run single sending UVA to Omaha.
- UVA topped Arkansas, 5-3, in its CWS opener, and won two of three games against No. 4 seed Florida to advance to the CWS Finals.
- UVA dropped the first game of the CWS Finals to Vandy, 5-1, but allowed just two runs over the final two games to rally and win the title.
- The Cavaliers trailed 2-0 after one inning in Game 3 against Vandy, but Pavin Smith's two-run homer in the fourth inning tied the game and his two-out RBI single in the fifth gave UVA the lead.

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- UVA came from behind in seven of its 10 tournament and scored the go-ahead run in the fifth inning or later in each of their 10 wins.
- Forty of Virginia's 57 runs in the tournament came in the fifth inning or later. In seven CWS games, Virginia recorded 24 two-out hits that resulted in 15 runs.
- Sborz was named College World Series Most Outstanding Player. He tied a CWS record by earning three wins at the 2015 CWS.
- Sborz made eight appearances in the NCAA tourney and did not allow an earned run. He did not allow an earned run over his final 27 innings, including all 13 of his innings in Omaha.
- Virginia was just the the third No. 3 seed or lower to win the CWS Finals since seeding began in 1988 (joining No. 3 Oregon State in 2007 and No. 4 Fresno State in 2008).

BIG FIVE HIGHLIGHT THE BATTING ORDER

- Virginia has leaned on five veterans to anchor its batting order this year: Matt Thaiss (.382), Ernie Clement (.348), Daniel Pinero (.335), Pavin Smith (.329) and Adam Haseley (.295).
- They are batting a combined .336 this year.
- The quintet has 376 of the team's 605 hits (62.1 percent) and 252 of the 363 runs (65.8 percent).

SENIOR DAY FOR FOUR CAVALIERS

- Virginia held Senior Day ceremonies on May 21 for fourth-years Robbie Coman, Kevin Doherty and David Rosenberger as well as manager Tom Regn.
- The class has been a part of 185 wins during its four years, which includes three NCAA Super Regionals, two College World Series and the 2015 NCAA Championship.
- All four earned their undergraduate degrees two weeks ago from UVA. Doherty and Rosenberger majored in history, Coman in economics (with a history minor) and Regn in mechanical engineering.

NOTING THE EIGHT-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia's season-long eight-game win streak came to a halt Sunday.
- In that stretch, Cam Simmons led the team in batting at .406 (13-32) with five doubles, while Daniel Pinero batted .375 (12-32) and Pavin Smith .367 (11-30).
- UVA batted .337 as a team, while opponents hit only .218.
- UVA committed only six errors in that span (.981 fielding pct.).
- The start of the streak coincided with Ernie Clement's move to the leadoff spot in the batting order. He batted .361 (13-36) in that stretch.

MAKING HEADWAY ON THE ROAD

- Virginia concluded a successful road trip on May 3 at Liberty prior to the exam break, capping a 7-1 swing with a 7-3 win over the Flames.
- The eight-game trip was UVA's longest stretch of regular-season true road games since 1999.
- UVA picked up ACC series wins at then-No. 1 Miami and Pitt.
- The Cavaliers finished 11-8 in true road games in the regular season.

UVA EARNS SERIES WIN AT NO. 1 MIAMI

- Virginia won its seventh straight series against the Hurricanes, matching UVA's longest current streak against an ACC opponent (Clemson).
- Then-No. 1 Miami led in only four innings in the series (sixth through ninth Saturday).
- Twelve of Virginia's 15 runs came with two outs.
- UVA got contributions up and down the lineup, while its typical top four in the order (Haseley, Clement, Thaiss, Smith) went 8-for-47 (.170).
- Justin Novak (4-9) and Daniel Pinero (4-10) led UVA in hits.
- UVA's starting rotation allowed five earned runs in 20 innings in three straight quality starts.

RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation over the last eight years (379).
- UVA has won 595 games since 2004 – an average of more than 46 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 39 wins each of the last 12 years, including 10 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 has played in at least one College World Series.

THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

- Virginia has qualified for 13 straight NCAA tournaments, including UVA's first national championship in 2015.
- UVA is one of five programs nationally to play in each tournament since 2004 and one of two to play in six of the last seven NCAA Super Regionals.
- Virginia is one of 16 schools in Division I history to have a streak of at least 13 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances (17 occurrences).

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- UVA has won 40 NCAA tournament games since 2009 – second most in the nation in that span.
- Eighteen of the 40 tournament wins since 2009 have come in the College World Series.
- Virginia has earned four national seeds in the NCAA Tournament, including the No. 1 overall seed in 2011.

BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

- Virginia has made four College World Series appearances, including two trips to the CWS Finals.
- UVA has won six NCAA Regional and four Super Regional championships since 2009.
- UVA earned the 2010 and 2011 ACC Coastal Division Championships (regular season).
- Virginia has made four appearances in the ACC Championship game, including titles in 2009 and 2011.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- UVA reached the No. 1 national ranking in the polls in 2010, 2011, 2014 and 2015.
- Twenty-one Cavaliers have earned All-America selections in the last 12 seasons.
- Brian O'Connor has been named National Coach of the Year on three occasions.

SUCCESS AT NEXT LEVEL

- Sixty-six Cavaliers have been selected in the MLB Draft in the last 12 years, including seven in 2015
- Under the current coaching staff, 14 former Cavaliers have reached the big leagues.
- Sean Doolittle (Oakland) and Ryan Zimmerman (Washington) each have been named MLB All-Stars.

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 595-219-2 (.729) in his 13th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history last Saturday.
- O'Connor's 73.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 14th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Coming off the program's first national championship in 2015, Virginia has won at least 39 games in each of O'Connor's first 12 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

YOUTH IS SERVED

- Even with five key returning veterans anchoring the lineup, Virginia has one of its greenest teams in recent years.
- Virginia's 35-man roster includes just three seniors and six juniors, which includes JuCo transfers Holden Grounds and Tyler Shambora.
- UVA has 16 freshmen, one redshirt freshman and 10 sophomores.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES AGAIN

- Much like 2015, Virginia has relied on a host of freshmen as part of its regular lineup.
- UVA has started at least three freshmen in the field in 32 games, including three games with four rookie starters.
- Five rookies have played in at least 20 games.
- Ryan Karstetter leads the freshmen with 49 games and 30 starts. Cam Simmons (47), Nate Eikhoff (39), Andy Weber (32) and Doak Dozier (25) also have seen significant action.
- 30 percent of UVA's at bats have come from rookies.

INJURIES PLAGUE CAVALIERS AT KEY POSITIONS

- Injuries hit UVA hard during the first few weeks of the season.
- A pair of regulars, Robbie Coman (elbow) and Jake McCarthy (big toe), each are out for the season after injuries suffered in the East Carolina series.
- Charlie Cody suffered a sprained ankle against VMI, but returned on April 6.
- Starting pitcher Derek Casey (elbow) also has missed the entire season.

CAVALIERS IN PRO BASEBALL (as of June 1)

- Eight former Cavaliers are currently on Major League Baseball 25-man rosters, while 24 more are playing in Minor League Baseball.
- Ten former Cavaliers have seen time on Major League rosters already this season.
- A program-record 11 Virginia alumni played in MLB at some point in 2015, including Tyler Wilson (Baltimore) and John Hicks (Seattle), who made their MLB debuts.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia lost several key players off of its 2015 National Championship squad.
- The biggest losses came on the mound, where UVA lost key contributors Brandon Waddell (school-record 53 career starts), Nathan Kirby (31 starts) and Josh Sborz (80 career games).
- Sborz was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2015 College World Series, while Waddell and third baseman Kenny Towns joined him all the All-CWS Team.
- Towns played in 207 career games (ninth in UVA history), including 178 starts.
- Starting right fielder Joe McCarthy (151 career starts) also departed for the MLB Draft.

IT'S BIG, IT'S BLUE, BUT IT'S NO LONGER A MONSTER

- Virginia's infamous Blue Monster in center field takes on a new meaning this year. It now serves simply as a batter's eye.
- With the addition of wall padding this year, a consistent home run line was established throughout the park.
- Previously, a ball had to carry over the 32-foot-high wall to be a home run.

WHAT ELSE IS NEW AT DAVENPORT?

- Fans will notice an array of enhancements to Davenport Field this season, with several to commemorate Virginia's 2015 National Championship. Among the additions and changes:
 - A new backlit sign hangs below the scoreboard in right-center field, honoring the 2015 National Champions
 - A new trophy case to showcase the 2015 NCAA Championship trophy on the concourse level
 - New signage to honor UVA's CWS teams and ACC championship teams located beneath the press box
 - New NCAA championship murals on the back of the right-field bleachers as well as the façade of the suite level on the first-base side of the stadium
 - Higher protective netting that extends throughout the entire blue-seat reserved section
 - All of the bleacher seats have been painted blue
 - New padding and signage on the outfield wall
 - The foul poles also have been painted yellow, per new NCAA regulations
 - A plaque commemorating the 2015 NCAA Championship team has been installed on the concourse along the third-base line
