## OPENING KICK

### RARE TRIP WEST OF THE MISSISSIPPI

- Virginia continues its non-conference action Saturday when the Cavaliers hit the road at No. 24 Oregon
- This is only the 19th game played west of the Mississippi River in UVA school history.
- Virginia is 4-14 in games played west of the Mississippi.
- UVA's last venture west was a 34-16 loss at then-No. 13 UCLA in 2015; the Cavaliers' last win west of the Mississippi was a 45-40 win at BYU on Sept. 25, 1999.
- At approximately 2,800 miles from Charlottesville, this game is tied for the second-longest trip in school history.
- The longest is a journey of approximately 4,800 miles for the 2000 O'ahu Bowl in Honolulu, while this week's journey ties a trip to Seattle in 1976 (approximately 2,800 miles).
- This is the third of four straight years that UVA will play a regular season game west of the Mississippi River.
- UVA is scheduled to play at Boise State in 2017.

### VIRGINIA VS. OREGON, PAC-12

- Virginia is facing Oregon for the second time in program history and the Ducks hold the edge, 1-0, in the all-time series after a 59-10 victory over UVA at Scott Stadium in 2013. Oregon was ranked No. 2 in the nation at the time.
- Saturday's game is only the seventh time Virginia has faced a member of the Pac-12 Conference.
- UVA is 0-6 against the Pac-12 and it is the only 'Power 5' conference against whom the Cavaliers are winless.
- Oregon (2013) was only the second Pac-12 school to come to Charlottesville to play UVA. USC (2008) was the first. UCLA (2014) has since also traveled to the Commonwealth to face the Cavaliers.
- UVA's road games against Pac-12 teams are Washington (1976), USC (2010) and UCLA (2015).

### FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- **Kurt Benkert** made his first collegiate start against Richmond. The East Carolina transfer was 26-of-34 for 264 yards and three touchdowns. The 26 completions and three touchdowns tied Mike Groh for the most by a UVA quarterback in his first career start, while the 264 passing yards ranked No. 3.
- Running back **Taquan Mizzell** has a reception in 34 straight games. The streak started against then-No. 2 Oregon on Sept. 7, 2013. It was Mizzell's second career game. Mizzell is No. 3 all-time at UVA with 147 career receptions.
- Sixteen Cavaliers made their collegiate debut against Richmond, including five true freshmen.
- OLB **Jordan Mack** made his first collegiate start against Richmond, becoming the first UVA true freshmen to start a season opener at linebacker since **Ahmad Brooks** in 2003.
- UVA is playing in a contiguous state that borders the Pacific Ocean for only the fourth time.

## #HoosRising: BY THE NUMBERS

- 0** The Cavaliers were not penalized against Richmond, the first time a UVA team accomplished that since 2006 against Miami.
- 34** Consecutive games RB Taquan Mizzell has a reception, a streak that started against then-No. 2 Oregon on Sept. 7, 2013.
- 99** Mendenhall enters Saturday's game with 99 career wins. He is the No. 13 winningest active coach among FBS coaches with five or more years.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Coach Mendenhall will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Mendenhall. UVA athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

## UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

## UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

## THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

## UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

## WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

## SHARED HISTORY: LEWIS &amp; CLARK EXPEDITION FROM CHARLOTTESVILLE TO OREGON

- Meriwether Lewis was born locally in Albemarle County, Virginia, in the present-day community of nearby Ivy, also the hometown of former UVA All-American and current New England Patriot Chris Long.
- After the Louisiana Purchase in 1803, President Thomas Jefferson wanted to get an accurate sense of the new land and its resources. Jefferson chose Lewis to lead the expedition. Lewis recruited another Virginian, William Clark, then age 33, to share command of the expedition.
- Clark was born in Caroline County, Va., but his family for years also lived in Albemarle County.
- The expedition commenced the beginning of what became the Oregon Trail. President Jefferson had hoped to find an "easy" route through the Rocky Mountains to discover a water route to the Pacific, via the Missouri, Columbia, Oregon or Colorado rivers as a direct and practicable water communication across the continent.
- The expedition made it all the way to Portland, Oregon and current day Astoria. Portland is roughly 110 miles north of Oregon's campus in Eugene.
- On Main Street, in downtown Charlottesville, there is a statue to pay homage to the Lewis & Clark expedition.
- This impressive and historic statue is located at the intersection of Ridge and Main Streets and commemorates the 1803-1806 journey of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. The statue has a brick walk and shrubs surrounding it, and visitors can view it anytime, though most clearly during the day.
- The statue of Meriwether Lewis, William Clark and Sacagawea was sculpted by Charles Keck, who was a prominent sculptor of his day. The statue was commissioned by Paul Goodloe McIntire and given to the citizens of Charlottesville in 1919. The statue is located in a prominent historic and geographic position in Charlottesville that predates the settlement of the town. The present day Main Street was once called Three Notch'd Road, and was constructed in the 1730's by improving an old Monacan Indian trail to allow travel between Richmond and the Shenandoah Valley.
- Artifacts that Lewis & Clark brought back from the expedition as gifts to Thomas Jefferson currently hang in the former President and UVA founder's home at Monticello.
- The Lewis & Clark Exploratory Center is located in Charlottesville, adjacent to land that William Clark's family owned for years. The Lewis & Clark Exploratory Center is a hands-on center focusing on the historic expedition as a gateway for learning about exploration, transportation, the arts, science, the natural environment, and native cultures.

## VIRGINIA - OREGON CONNECTIONS

- When UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall was a safety and linebacker at Oregon State (1986-87), his defensive back position coach as a senior in 1987 was current Oregon passing game coordinator and defensive backs coach John Neal.
- Mendenhall was part of a unit that Neal oversaw in 1987 that finished second in the Pac-10 in pass defense (183.3 per game).
- Neal is a BYU alum, narrowly missing out on playing with current UVA offensive coordinator and inside receivers coach, Robert Anae, who was serving his mission in Tulsa, Okla., when Neal finished up his playing career in Provo in 1979.
- Mendenhall, a 1988 graduate of Oregon State, played in two "Civil War" games. The Beavers lost in 1986 and 1987 to the Ducks.
- Mendenhall faced current Oregon defensive coordinator Brady Hoke in Mountain West Conference action in 2009 and 2010. Mendenhall was the BYU head coach and Hoke was the San Diego State head coach. Mendenhall won both meetings, including the 2010 meeting when Hoke ended up being named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.
- Oregon defensive line coach Ron Aiken has coached in the Commonwealth of Virginia before, serving as head coach at Greensville County High School in 1979. Greensville County High School is located in Emporia, Va., located roughly 70 miles south of Richmond.

## THE LONG FAMILY AND BRAGGING RIGHTS

- Saturday's game will have sibling bragging rights for two sons of NFL Hall of Famer and Ivy resident Howie Long.
- The eldest son, Chris, was a UVA All-American (2007) and a current member of the New England Patriots. He played at UVA from 2004-07. The middle son, Kyle, spent the 2012 season as an offensive guard with the Oregon Ducks and was the Chicago Bears first round draft pick in 2013.
- Chris Long has a sandwich named after him at Littlejohns on UVA's historic Corner.

## CAVALIERS WITH PAC-12 TIES

- In addition to UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall who played at Oregon State, three other Cavaliers have ties to the Pac-12 Conference.
- QB Connor Brewer spent two years at Arizona. He was on the sidelines at Autzen Stadium when Arizona beat Oregon in 2014. He later was on the sidelines at the Pac-12 Championship game at Levi's Stadium when Oregon avenged the early season loss to Arizona.
- DE Jack Powers spent two seasons at Arizona State, redshirting one. Arizona State did not play Oregon in 2014, the only season Powers appeared in games for the Sun Devils.
- Offensive coordinator Robert Anae spent the 2011 and 2012 seasons in the Pac-12 at Arizona as the offensive line coach for the Wildcats.

Virginia got a very early look at what it was up against as Mariota dropped back on a third-and-5 in the game's opening series, then bolted up the middle untouched, going 71 yards for a touchdown.

Mariota finished with 122 yards rushing on four carries and completed 14 of 28 passes for 199 yards.

Kevin Parks led Virginia with 60 yards rushing, and Jake McGee caught eight passes for 53 yards.

- Virginia is 56-43-1 all-time in night games, which is determined by events that begin at 6 p.m. or later.
- UVA is 22-26 all-time in road night games and is playing its first road night game since the 2014 season finale at Virginia Tech.
- Bronco Mendenhall is 28-17 all-time in night games in 11 seasons as a head coach, including a 38-8 Las Vegas Bowl win over Oregon to conclude the 2006 season. The 2006 meeting against Oregon is the only time Mendenhall has faced the Ducks as a head coach.

- Other collegiate debuts against Richmond were made by sophomores Jake Fieler (OG), Ben Hogg (WR) and Cory Jones (OLB).

- Six Cavaliers made their first career starts against Richmond on Sept. 3.

- True freshman WR Hasise Dubois and redshirt freshman WR Warren Craft each made their collegiate debut against Richmond. Both wide receivers caught two passes for 16 yards.
- Craft played football for the first time as a junior at William Fleming High School in Roanoke, Va. Craft, a basketball standout, originally accepted a scholarship to play basketball at Virginia Tech.

**JORDAN MACK STARTS AT OUTSIDE LINEBACKER**

- True freshman Jordan Mack (Lithonia, Ga.) started at one of the outside linebacker positions against Richmond. Mack finished with three tackles.
- Mack became the first true freshman to start at linebacker in a season opener since Ahmad Brooks in 2003. Brooks made seven tackles and broke up two passes in his debut against Duke on Aug. 30, 2003.

**MIZZELL RECEPTION STREAK ONE OF THE NATION'S LONGEST**

- RB Taquan Mizzell has a reception in 34 straight games, which is the fourth-longest active streak in the nation and the longest of any running back. Stanford's Christian McCaffrey is the next closest running back at 27 games.
- Mizzell's streak started in his second career college game, Sept. 7, 2013, against then-No. 2 Oregon.

**OLAMIDE ZACCHEAUS SPRINTS IN SECOND HALF AGAINST RICHMOND**

- Olamide Zaccheaus made five catches for a team-high 75 yards and one touchdown in the second half against the Spiders.
- Zaccheaus came to UVA as a running back, but switched to wide receiver as a true freshman to fill a need in 2015.
- The versatile Zaccheaus also ran back kicks in 2015 and is on the preseason watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, the national honor given to the most versatile player.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

**EARNED NOT GIVEN**

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall has brought an "Earned Not Given" mentality to the Virginia Football program.
- When winter workouts started, players wore all black and nothing affixed with a Virginia logo. Players had to earn the right to wear the blue and orange. Then had to earn the right to wear the Virginia logo.
- Everything from access to the locker room, to numbers was part of the new "Earned Not Given" mentality. Even when it came to practice, players had to earn the next period, repeating the previous period as many times as needed until the next period was earned.

**TASK UNIT LEADERS**

- Bronco Mendenhall has entrusted the team with a leadership body with six units. With a military flair, there are six task unit leaders.
- The coaching staff selected the six task leaders. Each unit consists of 12-13 players, drafted by the task unit leaders themselves. Each task unit leader from his team names an assistant leader.
- A lot of activities over the summer was accomplished through the task units. Accountability and discipline were two really big emphasis.
- It was the task unit leaders that determined the draft order when it came time to select numbers.
- RB Jordan Ellis received the first pick and NT Donte Wilkins received the second pick.



**PLAYERS EARN THEIR NUMBERS**

- On the night of Saturday, Aug. 27, inside the locker room at Scott Stadium, 60 players earned their numbers in a special ceremony.
- Eleven more Cavaliers earned their numbers on the morning of Sept. 1, prior to practice.

## ALL IN THE FAMILY

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall brought seven coaches with him from BYU. Joining Mendenhall in Charlottesville from Provo, Utah were: Robert Anae, Mark Atuaia, Jason Beck, Nick Howell, Shane Hunter, Kelly Poppinga and Garrett Tujague.
- All seven of those assistants worked the last three seasons together as on Mendenhall's staff. Shane Hunter is only UVA assistant coach that wasn't a full-time assistant at BYU, serving as a graduate assistant during that three-year span.
- There are 32 combined years of coaching under Mendenhall between the seven assistant coaches on UVA's staff that came to Charlottesville from Provo.
- Three of UVA's graduate assistants also have ties to Mendenhall. Famika Anae and Vic So'oto graduated from BYU and played for Mendenhall. Kyle Visciglia was a graduate assistant at BYU in 2015. So'oto was a project coordinator for BYU in 2015.

## NEW FACES AT WIDE RECEIVER FOR VIRGINIA IN 2016

- The wide receiver position in 2016 will feature many contributors who didn't get much or any time in 2015.
- Only Olamide Zaccheaus (21 catches) and Keeon Johnson (13 catches) return in 2016 after playing significant roles at wide receiver in 2015.
- Doni Dowling (one catch) and Andre Levrone (two catches) each missed bulks of time with injury in 2015. Levrone made 15 receptions in 2014 as a redshirt freshman.
- Warren Craft and Ben Hogg are expected to make their collegiate debuts in 2016. Craft redshirted his first year at UVA in 2015, while Hogg is a walk-on who is in this redshirt sophomore season and hasn't made an appearance yet for the Cavaliers.
- David Eldridge saw time in seven games and caught two passes during his true freshman season in 2015. Ryan Santoro is a former walk-on who saw time on special teams in 2015 and made one catch while playing offense.

## MENDENHALL BRINGS FAST-PACED OFFENSE TO CHARLOTTESVILLE

- When UVA offensive coordinator Robert Anae rejoined Bronco Mendenhall's BYU staff in 2013, he brought a faster pace to the offense. Virginia will follow that lead and run its offense at a faster tempo in 2016 as it looks to increase the offensive output from recent years.
- In Mendenhall's 11 seasons as the head coach of BYU, his teams averaged over 400 yards of total offense per game for a season 10 times. UVA has only averaged over 400 yards of total offense twice over the last 16 seasons.
- UVA averaged 404.8 yards of total offense per game in 2010 and 423.4 yards per game in 2004.
- Under Mendenhall, BYU had a quarterback throw for over 3,000 yards in six of his 11 seasons in Provo. UVA in its history has never had a 3,000-yard passer in a season. The program record for a season by Cavalier quarterback is Matt Schaub's 2,976 yards in 2002.

## VIRGINIA CHANGES TO 3-4 DEFENSIVE SCHEME

- A new look for the Virginia defense in 2016 is the change from the 4-3 to 3-4 scheme.
- A lot of new faces will help usher in the defensive change as the Cavaliers have lost 150 career starts on defense with the graduation of David Dean (35), Demetrious Nicholson (35), Maurice Canady (34), Mike Moore (24), Trent Corney (11) and Kwontie Moore (11).

## NEW LOOK ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Virginia defensive line has a fresh look in 2016 after losing 81 career starts to graduation. UVA graduated David Dean (35), Mike Moore (24), Trent Corney (11) and Kwontie Moore (11).
- Donte Wilkins entered 2016 with 10 career starts at defensive tackle, with five coming in 2014. Andrew Brown entered 2016 with one career start, coming in 2015 at defensive end.

## INTERCEPTIONS HAVE ELUDED UVA OF LATE

- Virginia owns the NCAA record with 39 straight games with an interception, a streak that covered four seasons (1993-96). However, of late the interception has been hard to come by for UVA.
- UVA's four picks in 2015 tied a program low and marked the second time in four seasons UVA only managed four picks (2012).
- Former UVA All-American and current Minnesota Viking Anthony Harris led the nation in 2013 with eight interceptions, but the rest of the team only managed two.
- Head coach Bronco Mendenhall comes in from BYU where his defenses failed to reach double figures in interceptions twice, 2005 and 2008, both times finishing with nine.

## CONTE ONE OF THE ACC'S TOP PUNTERS

- Senior Nicholas Conte finished 2015 No. 2 in the ACC with a 44.7 yards per punt average.
- Conte, a former walk-on, is now on scholarship. As a high school punter Conte was an unknown until he secured the last spot at a UVA high school camp. He left with a preferred walk-on offer. Conte redshirted his first season in 2012, then did not appear in any games during 2013 or 2014 while Alec Vozenilek was UVA's punter. Conte made his collegiate debut in the Rose Bowl against UCLA in the 2015 season opener.
- Phil Steele has tabbed Conte as his preseason first-team All-ACC punter.
- In the 2016 season opener Conte punted three times, twice for 46 yards and once for 48 yards.

## SEVEN CAVALIERS FROM KEY POSITIONS OWN 30+ CAREER GAMES PLAYED

- Seven different position groups boast one player with at least 30 career games played at Virginia entering 2016.
- QB Matt Johns leads the way with 36, while 15 of those were strictly as the holder. TB Taquan Mizzell (34), OT Eric Smith, NT Donte Wilkins (33), Keeon Johnson (32), CB Tim Harris (31) and SS Kelvin Rainey (31) all have appeared in at least 30 career games for UVA.

## SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 452 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 255-185-12.

### KURT BENKERT NOTES

#### BENKERT NAMED STARTING QUARTERBACK

- Kurt Benkert was named the starting quarterback by head coach Bronco Mendenhall on August 24 following the final practice of fall camp.
- Benkert, a transfer from East Carolina, became (vs. Richmond) the first Cavalier quarterback to start his UVA debut since 1977 when Bryan Shumock started the season opener against NC State. Shumock switched to defensive back for the 1978 season and led UVA with four interceptions.
- Benkert was the 11th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 12 seasons. The list includes: Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

#### UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Kurt Benkert, a transfer from ECU, made his first collegiate start for the Cavaliers against Richmond (Sept. 3) in the season opener.

## Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • First Season

Bronco Mendenhall was named Virginia's head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. He served as the head football coach at Brigham Young University for 11 years before joining the Cavalier program. Mendenhall, Virginia's 40th head football coach, has compiled an overall record of 99-43 in his 11 seasons as head coach at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage (.697) among all active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience, and he ranks 10th among active coaches with at least 10 years of experience.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, the Cougars are one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU is joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

In his first year in 2005 after taking over a program coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Maaco Bowl Las Vegas -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. The Cougars finished tied for second in the MWC with a 5-3 league ledger.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with at least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive categories.

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.

## UVA'S EARLY FOOTBALL HISTORY AT LAMBETH FIELD

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 103 in 2016. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

## UVA ATHLETIC TRAINER FOR FOOTBALL IS ONE OF A FEW

- Virginia's Kelli Pugh is one of 10 women at the FBS level that is their school's sports medicine department's primary care provider for football.
- Pugh is only one of four women at the FBS level that works with a Power-Five level program. Ariko Iso, who was with the Pittsburgh Steelers for years, is with Oregon State. Sally Nogle works with Michigan State and Kammy Powell took over football in 2016 at Minnesota.

• UVA junior Quin Blanding was named by his mother Cory Lee after the movie titled "The Mighty Quinn," starring Denzel Washington and Mimi Rogers. It was the first movie she saw following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of that moment during pregnancy. She knew he will be all right and that he will be the mighty one.

• Blanding's father, Kevin, played football at NCAA Division II Glenville State (W.Va.) for current Arizona football head coach Rich Rodriguez.

• When offensive coordinator Robert Anae finished playing football, he returned home to Hawaii and served as the body model for the towering stature of the father of surfing, Duke Kahanamoku, a five-time Olympian.

The statue, created by artist Jan Fisher, is right next to the famous Waikiki Beach. Anae was a graduate assistant at Hawaii at the time and the artist needed a model, a surfer that was tall, and he went looking for the tallest surfer on the North Shore.

• UVA's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 106 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVA stats crew on game day.

• Matt Johns made his collegiate debut as the UVA holder in 2013. The first time Johns made it into a college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU and now current UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in UVA history.

• Senior SS Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13).

• QB Connor Brewer spent two seasons playing for Rich Rodriguez at Arizona (2013-14).

- Micah Kiser led UVA with 14 tackles and had one sack and two forced fumbles.
- Chris Sharp led UVA with 73 kickoff return yards in his collegiate debut.
- Chris Peace had five tackles and recorded his first career sack.
- Zach Bradshaw had a career-best two tackles for loss and his first career forced fumble.
- Andrew Brown had a career-best seven tackles.
- Kirk Garner had a career-best six tackles.
