ACC Dr Pepper FB Championship Moving From Charlotte

The 2016 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is one of 10 ACC neutral site championships--eight actual events--that will be relocated from the state of North Carolina due to concerns of the ACC's Council of Presidents over North Carolina's House Bill 2. The ACC's Presidents on September 14 voted to move the championship. Speculation over a new site for the 12th annual ACC game is premature at this time and the conference will announce the new site when those arrangements are finalized. The ACC FB title game had been held in Charlotte since 2010.

Louisville and Clemson in AP Top 5

The ACC still has two Top Five teams as Louisville moved to No. 3 in the AP poll, after its win over Florida State, while Clemson remained at No. 5. The Seminoles (13th) and Miami (15th) are also ranked in the AP Top 15. In the Coaches poll, Clemson is No 3, followed by Louisville (4), FSU (14) and Miami (19).

Louisville Sets ACC Mark

In defeating 2nd-ranked Florida State 63-20, Louisville became the first ACC team to score 62 or more points in three consecutive games.

Louisville Only 2nd Team To Score 62 or More Points In a Season's First Three Games

Louisville becomes only the second FBS team (Baylor, 2013) since 1930 to open the season scoring 62 or more points in three straight games. The Cardinals are only the fifth team to do it at any time during the season and only the fourth to accomplish that in the same season.

Richt, Five From ACC Lead the Allstate Good Works Team

Miami head coach **Mark Richt** was named the honorary head coach and five ACC players--far and away the most of any conference--were among the 12-members chosen from the FBS for the 25th Anniversary Allstate Good Works team announced last Thursday. Named to the team from the ACC were Clemson **QB Deshaun Watson**, Duke **CB DeVon Edwards**, Florida State **C Alec Eberle**, Georgia Tech **DE Keshun Freeman** and Pitt **LB Mike Caprara**.

Fifth-Ranked Clemson at Georgia Tech on ESPN Thursday Night No. 3 Louisville Travels to Marshall; No. 13 FSU Heads to USF Pitt, UNC Open ACC Play; Duke Travels to Notre Dame

Clemson, ranked fifth by AP and third in the Coaches Amway poll travels to Atlanta, Ga., to take on **Georgia Tech** this Thursday night at Bobby Dodd Stadium in a nationally televised game on ESPN (7:30 pm). The game kick starts a weekend that has 12 ACC teams playing 10 games, nine on Saturday with two conference matchups and eight non-conference affairs... **Miami**, ranked 15th in AP and 19th in the Coaches poll, and **NC State** will have bye weeks...In addition to the Tigers making their 2016 debut against Tech, **Pitt** and **North Carolina** also make their 2016 conference debuts Saturday at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill, N.C. (ESPNU, 3:30 pm).

More On Jackets-Tigers

Clemson, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Deshaun Watson**, enters the game having won its last nine ACC Games...The Tigers last conference loss was a 28-6 decision in 2014 to the Jackets, who are coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**...The Tigers enter this week's game having won five straight Thursday ESPN contests

under Swinney...Tech has hosted more Thursday ESPN games (20) than any other ACC school and holds a 2-1 mark against Clemson on Thursday nights.

ACC Coaches Take Part in the AFCA's Coach to Cure MD Program

This week, many ACC coaching staffs will be wearing special arm patches in honor of the AFCA's Coach to Cure MD program. This is the ninth year coaches around the country join together to raise funding and awareness of Duchenne muscular dystrophy.

Pitt, North Carolina Seek Coastal Edge

Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi**, and led by **RB James Conner**, and North Carolina, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Mitch Trubisky**, will each be looking to get an early Coastal Division win... The game matches the Tar Heels, preseason favorite of the media to win the division for the second straight year, and the Panthers, who were preseason pick to be the runnerup in the Coastal. **Georgia Tech** currently has the early lead in the Coastal Division with a 1-0 mark. The game also matches three of the best running backs in the nation in Conner and UNC's tandem of **Elijah Hood** and **T.J. Logan**.

Third-Ranked Louisville On Road at Marshall

Louisville, coming off its impressive win over Florida State, will face Conference USA foe Marshall Saturday at Joan C. Edwards Stadium in Huntington, W.Va. (8 pm, CBSSN)...The Cardinals are coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by **QB Lamar Jackson**...Marshall is coached by former NC State assistant Doc Holliday...Saturday's game will be Louisville's first trip to Huntington since 1977...In the first three weeks of the season alone, Jackson has set ACC records for total offense in a single game (610), and most TDR in a half (8), a game (8), two games (13) and three games (18).

No. 14 Florida State Faces In-State Rival USF

Florida State, ranked 14th nationally by the Amway Coaches poll, faces a tough road test against the unbeaten Bulls of USF of the American Athletic Conference this Saturday in a nationally televised game at Tampa's Raymond James Stadium (Noon, ABC)...Florida State is coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**... USF is coached by Willie Taggart...The Seminoles have won two of the three meetings between the two teams, including in the only prior meeting in Tampa, a 30-17 triumph in 2012.

Duke Travels to Notre Dame

Duke faces its second straight road trip to the Midwest Saturday, when the Blue Devils, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by red-shirt freshman **QB Daniel Jones**, face **Notre Dame**, coached by Brian Kelly at Notre Dame Stadium in South Bend, Indiana (3:30 pm, NBC)...Duke faced Northwestern last week in Evanston, Ill...This will be the fifth meeting between the two teams and first since 2007...

This is the first of five contests this year with ACC teams for the Irish.

Virginia Tech Hosts East Carolina

Virginia Tech, coached by **Justin Fuente**, and led by **QB Jerod Evans** remains at Lane Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network). to face an East Carolina team that upset NC State on Sept. 10. The Pirates, of the American Athletic Conference, are coached by former Duke WR and assistant coach **Scottie Montgomery**. Evans is coming off a five-TD Pass Day in last Saturday's win over Boston College. The Pirates rank seventh nationally in passing yards per game (370.0), while the Hokies counter with a defense that leads the nation in fewest passing yards allowed (80.3) and third in pass efficiency defense (64.19).

Central Michigan Visits Virginia

Virginia faces its fourth straight non-conference opponent this Saturday when the Cavaliers, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall**, and led by **QB Kurt Benkert** host unbeaten Central Michigan of the Mid-American Conference Saturday at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville (12:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks). Central Michigan is coached by John Bonamego. After Saturday's game, UVa's final eight opponents will be ACC teams.

Syracuse Travels to UConn For First Road Test

The Syracuse Orange, coached by **Dino Babers** and led by sophomore **QB Eric Dungey** and graduate transfer **Amba Etta-Tao** becomes the second straight ACC team to travel to East Hartford, Connecticut, when it visits UConn at Rentschler Field this Saturday (1 pm, CBSSN). Virginia visited UConn last week. Etta-Tao is tied for third nationally in receptions per game (10.0) and second in receiving yards (313). UConn, coached by Bob Diaco, will face three ACC teams this year. The Huskies will also travel to Boston College on Nov. 19.

Wake Forest Travels to Indiana Looking to Stay Unbeaten

Wake Forest faces Big Ten rival Indiana for the second straight year, travelling to Bloomington, Indiana, for a game at Memorial Stadium (3:30 pm, Big Ten Network). The Demon Deacons are coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by senior **LB Marquel Lee**. Indiana is coached by Kevin Wilson, a graduate of North Carolina. IU offensive line coach Greg Frey played on four ACC championship teams for Bobby Bowden at Florida State. A win by the Deacons would give Clawson the 100th victory of his career and Wake its first 4-0 start since 2006.

Boston College at Home with Wagner

Boston College finally plays a true home game after opening the season in Dublin, Ireland; Foxborough, Massachusetts; and Blacksburg, Virginia. The Eagles, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by graduate transfer **QB Patrick Towles**, host Wagner at Alumni Stadium (1 pm, ACC Network Extra). BC **LB Connor Strachan** is tied for fifth the national lead in tackles for loss. Wagner is coached by Jason Houghtaling.



The ACC By The Numbers

.913 - Clemson's winning percentage with **Deshaun Watson** starting at quarterback. The Tigers are 21-2 with Watson as its starter.

2 - Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** this week is second in the FBS in rushing yards per game (154.7); second in total offense (459.0), first in points responsible for (108) and yards per carry (9.47), and eighth in passing efficiency (181.8).

2.3 - Duke senior **CB Breon Borders** is averaging 2.3 passes defended per game. He ranks fifth nationally in the FBS with five pass breakups and two interceptions in three games.

4 - The number of **ACC teams** that are ranked in the Top 10 nationally in the FBS in total defense. Virginia Tech is second (204.7), followed by Miami in third (207.3), Wake Forest is sixth (247.7) and Clemson is eighth (250.0).

4.5 - The overnight rating for last Saturday's **Florida State at Louisville** game for ABC. That's the second-best September rating for a noon kickoff game since 2004, when ABC began keeping overnight ratings records.

5 - After starting 1-9 in Thursday night games on ESPN, **Clemson** has won its last five Thursday night prime time contests in a row under head coach Dabo Swinney. The Tigers are 5-0 on ESPN Thursdays heading into this week's game at Georgia Tech.

7.92 - The combined per-carry average for Miami **RB's Mark Walton** and **Joe Yearby**. Walton ranks fifth nationally, averaging 8.35 yards per carry, while Yearby is 11th in the nation, averaging 7.31 yards a crack.

8 - Also the number of career returns for touchdowns by Duke's **CB DeVon Edwards**. Edwards has returned six kickoffs for scores, one shy of the ACC and NCAA record, and also has two interception returns for TDs in his career. Edwards leads all ACC active players in returns for TDs.

9 - **Clemson** enters Thursday night's

game with Georgia Tech having won nine consecutive ACC games, all occurring last year. The Tigers were 8-0 during the regular season and added the 2015 ACC Championship game. The last ACC loss for the Tigers was on Nov. 15, 2014 at Georgia Tech (28-6).

10th - When Pitt **RB James Conner** rushed for 111 yards in 24 carries against Oklahoma State, it marked his 10th career game over 100-yards in rushing and his second straight game over the century mark this year.

11.3 - UVa **LB Micah Kiser** is averaging 11.3 tackles per game which leads the ACC and is tied for 10th nationally.

18 - The number of touchdowns passing and rushing for Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** in his first three games this year. That is an ACC three-game record. Jackson has already set records for TDR in a half (8), a single game (8) and two games (13).

Also 18 - North Carolina junior **QB Mitch Trubisky** set a school record by completing 18 consecutive passes in the Tar Heels' win over James Madison. Trubisky completed 24 of 27 passes (.889 pct.).

19.3 - The number of combined receptions per game for Syracuse **WRs Ervin Phillips** and **Amba Etta-Tao**. Phillips ranks second nationally (10.0), while Etta-Tao is third in the nation (9.3).

21 - Thursday night's nationally televised game on ESPN at **Georgia Tech** will mark the 21st such game the Yellow Jackets have hosted. That's the most of any ACC school.

24 - When **North Carolina** scored 56 points against James Madison last Saturday, it marked the 24th time in 53 games under Larry Fedora that the Tar Heels have topped the 40 point mark. In 55 games under Fedora, UNC has averaged 37.1 points per game.

40.8 - Pitt **WR Quadree Henderson** leads the nation in kickoff return average. Henderson is averaging 40.8 yards on kickoff returns. He is also third nationally in all-purpose yards, averaging 192.0 yards

per game.

41 - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt **RB James Conner**. Conner has 39 rushing TDs and two pass receiving. The ACC career mark for TDs is 52 by Wali Lundy of Virginia (2002-05) and the league mark for rushing TDs is held by NC State's Ted Brown (49, 1975-78).

63 - **Louisville's** point total against second-ranked Florida State. That's the highest point total for an ACC team against a team in the AP Top 10. Florida State had held that mark, in a 54-7 win over No. 10 Clemson on Nov. 4, 2000.

94 - The number of yards **Wake Forest** allowed Delaware last Saturday in its 38-21 win. The Deacons are ranked sixth nationally in total defense, allowing just 247.7 yards per game.

100 - A win Saturday for Virginia against Central Michigan or a triumph for Wake Forest at Indiana would give either **Bronco Mendenhall** of UVa or **Dave Clawson** their 100th victory as a head coach. Mendenhall takes a 99-46 career mark into Saturday and Clawson is 99-98.

171 - The number of career wins for Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** in his 18-year head coaching career at Georgia Southern, Navy and Georgia Tech. Johnson now ranks fifth among all active FBS head coaches in career victories. Five ACC coaches begin 2016 ranked in the Top 25, including Miami's **Mark Richt** (10th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (21st), Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** and Wake Forest's **Dave Clawson** are each tied for 23rd.

272 - **Virginia Tech** has now scored in 272 consecutive game, the sixth-longest active streak in the nation among FBS schools. It's also tied with Washington for the 10th longest streak in FBS history.

2008 - Is the last year prior to this one that **Wake Forest** started the season 3-0. The Deacons take a 3-0 mark into Saturday's game at unbeaten Indiana.

An ACC record 331 Olympic sporting events will be streamed live this fall by ACC Network Extra, a dedicated digital channel for ACC sports that made its debut on August 19. The coverage marks the initial phase

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When fifth-ranked (AP) Clemson travels to Georgia Tech for this Thursday night's (7:30 p.m.) game at Bobby Dodd Stadium, the meeting will be the 99th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. The game will also match the two teams that have played three times each on ESPN on Thursday nights, with Clemson winning in 2009 and 2013 and Tech holding forth in 1998.

Georgia Tech has hosted more Thursday night games than any other ACC team, as this will be the 21st home appearance on ESPN Thursdays for the Jackets.

Tech actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. The Jackets hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory. Tech is 11-17 overall and 10-10 at home on Thursday night on ESPN.

Clemson enters this Thursday's game riding two win streaks. The Tigers have won nine straight ACC games, as their last ACC loss was at Tech in 2014. Clemson has also won five straight Thursday night ACC games dating back to 2012, under coach Dabo Swinney.

Virginia Tech has won more games (21) on ESPN Thursday Night than any other ACC team. The Hokies were 21-9 overall under former head coach Frank Beamer on ESPN Thursday night.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 173 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies (30) and Yellow Jackets (28), Miami leads in total appearances with 22, followed by Pitt (21), Louisville (20), NC State (19), Clemson (15), North Carolina (15), Florida State (14), Boston College (12) and Virginia (12).

When Maryland was a member of the ACC, the Terrapins played in 13 Thursday ESPN games, 10 of them at home.

Miami has the best winning percentage of any ACC team on Thursdays on ESPN. The Hurricanes are 18-4 overall (.818), including an 11-1 mark at home in the old Orange Bowl (8-0) or Hard Rock (then Sun Life) Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

There have been many great moments in the Thursday night series, including the 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked

in the Top 10 nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers, both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third-quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC upset 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was a classic a see-saw battle decided when the Hokies' David Wilson returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown with 2:23 remaining. Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's win over second-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating. Louisville recorded a pair of strong ratings while a member of the Big East in 2006, a 5.33 in downing West Virginia and a 5.03 in losing to Rutgers.

This week's game is the first of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. Virginia Tech will host Miami on Oct. 20 in Blacksburg, Va., at Lane Stadium, followed by the Hokies travelling to Pitt's Heinz Field the very next week on Oct. 27.

Duke will host North Carolina on Nov. 20 at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium and then Louisville will travel to seventh-ranked Houston on Nov. 17.

The ACC and ESPNU on Thursday Night

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006 and Louisville appeared on ESPNU as a member of the Big East in 2011.

Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a “collaborative” process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference’s Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC’s stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?

ANSWER: They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?

A: There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?

A: Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?

A: They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?

A: Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?

A: No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?

A: No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?

A: No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?

A: The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. **Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Duke ended regulation tied with Indiana at 41-41 in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl on December 26, 2015, they played the 77th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 77 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, seven in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 77 overtime contests, 38 have been ACC games while 39 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-26 advantage in the 67 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-36 record. Fifty-six of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
