FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVA is meeting the NEC's Saint Joseph's for the second time in lacrosse and holds a 1-0 advantage in the series. UVA is 19-0 all-time against current members of the NEC.
- Virginia is No. 2 in the NCAA with 40.8 ground ball per game.
- Senior Attackman James Pannell has 10 points over his last two games (7 goals and 3 assists).
- Zed Williams' 10 ground balls against Loyola in the opening game are the second most in the nation this season by a non-FOGO in a game. Most is 11 by Brown's Alec Tulett vs. Stony Brook.
- Ryan Conrad's eight points through his first five collegiate games is the most points by a UVA freshman midfielder in the Dom Starsia era.

GAME OVERVIEW

Virginia (2-3) concludes its four-game homestand as the Cavaliers host the Saint Joseph's Hawks (3-1) on Tuesday night at Klöckner Stadium. Faceoff is set for 7 p.m. UVA is ranked No. 17 in both the USILA coaches and the Cascade/Maverik media polls.

THE SERIES VS. HAWKS

Virginia and Saint Joseph's are meeting for the second time in men's lacrosse. UVA won last year's meeting in Charlottesville, 15-14. The Cavaliers used five goals from Owen Van Arsdale and nine points from Ryan Lukacovic (four goals, five assists) to top the Hawks. Saint Joseph's is out of the NEC, a conference that UVA is 19-0 all-time against.

Taylor Wray is in his fifth year as the Hawks' head coach. Wray welcomes back 31 letterwinners from last season's 11-6 team that went 6-0 in the NEC regular season before being upset by Bryant in the conference finals.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 24th season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 269-97 (.735) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. In his 24th season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 366 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

• Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)

- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVA's quarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVA head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVA to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13 times
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urlick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

CREDENTIALS

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

When covering a game at Klöckner Stadium, please include the umlaut above the letter 'ö' in Klöckner. Mac users can do this by clicking Alt-u or Option-u and then typing the letter o. PC users should make sure their number lock is off and then type Alt 0246.

THE SERIES VS. SAINT JOSEPH'S - NEC

- Virginia and Saint Joseph's are meeting for the second time in series history. UVA holds a 1-0 advantage in the series after winning 15-14 last year at Klöckner Stadium.
- There are only two active members of the NEC that UVA has yet to play. Sacred Heart and Wagner are the two NEC UVA has yet to play.
- UVA is 19-0 all-time against current members of the NEC. Mount St. Mary's (12-0), Hobart (4-0), Bryant (1-0), Robert Morris (1-0) and Saint Joseph's (1-0).

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 123-31 (.7987) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 1-3 mark in 2016. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

CAVALIERS IN MIDWEEK GAMES

- Virginia's 36-game winning streak going back to 2001 in regular-season midweek games was snapped against High Point on Feb. 23.
- Virginia has three midweek games scheduled in 2016. They also play VMI on March 29.
- Before the High Point loss, the last time the Cavaliers lost a midweek contest was an 11-8 loss to Notre Dame on March 14, 2001 (a Wednesday).
- Under head coach Dom Starsia, Virginia is 54-3 (.947) in mid-week games since 1993.
- After losing his first mid-week game (9-6 to Princeton in 1993), the Cavaliers rattled off 22 wins in a row before that loss to Notre Dame 15 years ago.

NEAR INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only seven night games at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall UVA is 33-7 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights ironically also to Duke on April 17, 2010.
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA also lost to North Carolina in 2015, a 7 p.m. start.
- UVA lost its only night game in 2016, an overtime setback (12-11) to High Point on Feb. 23.

RYAN CONRAD POISED FOR A SPECIAL FRESHMAN SEASON

- Freshman midfielder Ryan Conrad has five goals and seven total points through his first four games of his Virginia career.
- The seven points are the most by a Dom Starsia freshman (1993-present) through a season's first four games, while playing strictly midfield in their first season.
- Ryan Tucker (2012) is the only freshman midfielder under Starsia to have more goals (six) than Conrad through the season's first four games.
- Conrad is already No. 11 all-time among Starsia freshman for a season playing strictly midfield.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- According to UVA head coach Dom Starsia - "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVA has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011
- UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 21 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA

- UVA is 24-17 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVA is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVA is 14-5 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The five losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup, at Syracuse (2013) and home against High Point (2016).
- Virginia is 14-3 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia at UVA's home edifice.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse, the second was the 2012 Hopkins game and the third was the 2016 High Point game.
- Starsia is 14-4 all-time at home in OT games while at UVA - the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 258 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 258 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means that in 24 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 21.6 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVA's dominance are Syracuse at 54 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

Ryan Lukacovic and AJ Fish scored unassisted goals to continue the run. Coholan finished what he started with an unassisted goal with 8:39 left in the game.

After a Matt Barrett save, Will McNamara picked up the ground ball and tried to race out of danger, however he was collapsed on and lost the ball. Mariano was there to pounce on the ball for Syracuse in front of the crease and deposited it in the net for the deciding goal with 6:12 left.

Virginia made it interesting, as Pannell scored his fourth goal of the game unassisted with 37 seconds left, making it a one-goal game again. Michael Howard lost the ensuing faceoff on a violation by Virginia and Syracuse ran out the clock and secured the victory.
