## Louisville-Clemson Ties Highest-Ranked AP Games in ACC History

With third-ranked **Louisville** heading to fifth-ranked **Clemson** this Saturday, that combined matchup ties the highest combined AP rating for any meeting of ACC schools in football. This will be the fourth time ACC teams have met ranked third and fifth, the most recent occurring when Florida State (5) travelled to Clemson (3) on Oct. 19, 2013. Saturday's game will be the fifth game matching ACC teams in AP's Top Five.

## ACC Unbeaten in Week Four in Non-Conference Play

The ACC posted its second-best record in non-conference play this weekend, winning all eight non-conference games. Only the league's 11-0 mark in the second week of the 2014 season is better. The ACC is 31-9 (.775) in non-conference play heading into Week Five.

## ACC Has Five Teams in Coaches Poll

With North Carolina re-emerging in this week's Amway Coaches poll, the ACC now has five teams ranked among he nation's Top 25. **Clemson** leads the way in the Coaches poll at No. 3, followed by **Louisville (4)**, **Florida State (12)**, **Miami (13)** and now **North Carolina (23)**.

## ESPN's GameDay Coming to Clemson-Louisville

ESPN's iconic pre-game show GameDay will make its fifth appearance at Clemson this weekend for the Clemson-Louisville game. This is GameDay's fourth appearance in the last four years at Clemson and marks the third week of the last four weeks that GameDay has been at the site of an ACC game.

## North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky Named Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week

After throwing for a career-high 453 yards and five TD passes and leading UNC to a dramatic fourth-quarter comeback, climaxed by the winning touchdown pass with just two seconds remaining, UNC QB **Mitch Trubisky** has been named the Walter Camp Offensive Player of the Week. Trubisky's honor marks the third time in four weeks an ACC player has received the Walter Camp Award, as Louisville's **Lamar Jackson** claimed the honor for the first two weeks of the season.

## Fifth-Ranked Clemson Hosts Third-Ranked Louisville No. 14 Miami Travels to Georgia Tech for Coastal Battle No. 12 Florida State Hosts North Carolina

For the only the 15th time in ACC history, but for the second time in three weeks, a pair of ACC teams ranked in the Nation's Top 10 will face each other when fifth-ranked Clemson hosts third-ranked **Louisville** this Saturday at Memorial Stadium in **Clemson** (8 pm, ABC)... The meeting is only the fifth of AP-ranked top five ACC teams and ties the highest combined ranking for any two ACC teams in a game. Three times previously (1997, 2005, 2013) ACC teams ranked third and fifth have met each other, and It is the first since then third-ranked Clemson hosted fifth-ranked Florida State in 2013...The Tigers and Cardinals headline Week Five in the ACC. The schedule includes eight games, five conference matchups and three non-conference games...Virginia Tech is the only ACC team to have a bye this week.

## More on Tigers-Cardinals

Louisville, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by QB **Lamar Jackson**, will be facing its second Top Five opponent in three weeks as the Cardinals downed then second-ranked Florida

State, 62-20, on Sept. 17...Clemson, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by QB **Dashaun Watson**, has won its two previous meetings with Louisville--in 2014 at Clemson (23-17) and in Louisville last year (20-17)--by a combined average 4.5 points a game. Those are the only two meetings between the two schools in football. Louisville leads the nation in total offense (682.0) and scoring offense (63.5), while Clemson is second nationally in total defense (218.5), fifth in scoring defense (11.0) and second in pass efficiency defense (78.44). Jackson is second nationally in total offense (464.0), first in points responsible for (150) and is tied for the nation's lead in scoring (18.0). The Cardinal sophomore signal caller has totalled 25 TDR (TDs rushing and passing) in just four games.

their performances as one of the Top Eight nationally. The Davy O'Brien Award honored North Carolina's **Mitch Trubisky**, Louisville's **Lamar Jackson** and Duke's **Daniel Jones** for their play, while the Manning Award honored Trubisky, Jackson and Virginia Tech **QB Jerod Evans**.

### ACC Tailgate Tour Heads to Durham

The ACC Lumber Liquidators Tailgate Tour heads to Durham, N.C. this Saturday as the Blue Devils host Virginia in a 12:30 pm Coastal Division contest (ACC Network). Former Duke QB Anthony Boone will be available at the Tailgate site for photos and autographs. Virginia, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall** and led by **QB Kurt Benkert**, begin ACC play against Duke, which is coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by redshirt freshman **QB Daniel Jones**. Duke, which is coming off an impressive upset win over Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind., has won six of the last eight meetings between the two teams, including the last four in Durham. UVa's last win in the Bull City was in 2006. The Cavaliers are coming off their first win in the Mendenhall era, a 49-35 triumph over previously unbeaten Central Michigan.

### Georgia Tech Hosts No. 14 Miami

**Miami**, ranked 14th in AP and the Amway Coaches poll, will face **Georgia Tech** Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta (Noon, ESPN2), in a meeting of two teams expected to compete for the Coastal Division crown. The Hurricanes, under new head coach **Mark Richt**, are led by **QB Brad Kaaya**. Miami has won six of the last seven meetings between the two teams. Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, holds an overall 9-4 advantage in Atlanta. In 15 seasons as a head coach at Georgia, Richt's Bulldog teams were 8-0 at Bobby Dodd Stadium. Miami leads the nation in scoring defense (7.7) and team tackles for loss (13.3); is tied for first in team sacks (4.33) and is 2nd nationally in total defense (217.3). The Hurricanes are also ninth nationally in rushing offense (272.0) behind the twin tailback tandem of **Mark Walton** (133.7) and **Joe Yearby** (85.3).

### No. 12 Florida State Hosts North Carolina

**Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**, looks to keep its standing in the Atlantic Division race when the Seminoles host **North Carolina** this Saturday at Doak S. Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee (3:30 pm, ESPN). The Tar Heels are coached by **Larry Fedora** and are led by **QB Mitch Trubisky** and are ranked 23rd nationally in the Amway Coaches poll. The Seminoles hold a 7-1 advantage in the series in Tallahassee, but UNC's only win there occurred in their last meeting, a 37-35 decision in 2010. Both teams are coming off impressive wins, FSU at South Florida (55-35) and North Carolina, a last second, 37-36 thriller against Pitt. Cook recorded a career-best 267 rushing yards in the win over USF, while Trubisky threw for a career-high 453 yards and 5 TDs in

the the Tar Heels' win over Pitt.

### Orange Host Notre Dame at MetLife Stadium

**Syracuse**, coached by **Dino Babers** and led by **QB Eric Dungey**, host **Notre Dame** this Saturday at MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford, N.J. (Noon, ESPN). The Irish are coached by **Brian Kelly** and are led by **QB DeShone Kizer**. **Dungey** leads the ACC and ranks 8th nationally in passing yards per game (341.6). Syracuse **WR Amba Etta-Tawo** had 12 catches and 270 receiving yards against UConn, becoming only the third player in ACC history to top 200 receiving yards in a game twice in the single season (Torry Holt, NC State, 1998; Craphonso Thorpe, FSU, 2003).

### NC State Faces Streaking Wake Forest in Atlantic Division Battle

**NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Ryan Finley**, will host unbeaten Wake Forest this Saturday at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh (3:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks). The rivalry is the longest, continuous series in the ACC, having been played every year since 1910. Saturday's game is the 110th meeting of the two schools in football. The Deacons are coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by **LB Marquel Lee**. Wake enters the game after an impressive road win at Indiana (33-28), while **NC State** had an open date. The Deacons are ranked 12th nationally in rushing defense and tied for fourth in red zone defense. Wake Forest's last win in Raleigh was in 2006, which was also the last year the Deacons began a season 4-0.

### Pitt Hosts Marshall Seeking Rebound

Seeking to rebound from its second straight last-second loss, **Pitt**, coached by **Pat Narduzzi**, and led by **RB James Conner**, will host Marshall Saturday at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa. (7:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks). After a 2-0 start the Panthers have dropped back-to-back heartbreakers to Oklahoma State and North Carolina. Conner is sixth in the ACC in rushing (86.8), while **WR Quadree Henderson** leads the conference and is third nationally in all-purpose yardage (206.2). The Thundering Herd of coach Doc Holliday is facing their second straight ACC foe this week, having dropped a 59-28 decision to Louisville last week in Huntington. Holliday is a former assistant at NC State under Chuck Amato.

### Boston College Hosts Buffalo at Alumni Stadium

Boston College, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by graduate transfer **QB Patrick Towles**, will host Buffalo of the Mid-American Conference this Saturday at Alumni Stadium (1 pm, ACC Network Extra). Towles recorded four touchdowns running and passing last Saturday as BC evened its record with a win over Wagner. Buffalo is coached by Lance Leipold. The Eagles are sixth nationally in total defense (235.6) and 14th in rushing defense (91.0). BC **DE Harold Landry** had three sacks and five tackles for loss against Wagner.





# The ACC By The Numbers

**.917** - Clemson's winning percentage with **Deshawn Watson** starting at quarterback. The Tigers are 22-2 with Watson as its starter.

**1** - **Louisville** leads the nation in total offense, averaging 682 yards per game, and in scoring offense, averaging 63.5 points per game.

**1.38** - The average number of sacks per game for Pitt **DE Ejuan Price** this year. Price is tied for second nationally with two other players, one of whom is Florida State **DE DeMarcus Walker**.

**2** - Syracuse graduate transfer **WR Amba Etta-Tawo** became only the third ACC player in history to record two 200-yard pass receiving games in the same season with his 270-yard effort in the Orange's win over UConn. Etta-Tawo earlier had 210 yards versus Colgate. He joins NC State's Torry Holt (1998) and Florida State's Craphonso Thorpe (2003), who each had two 200-yard receiving games.

**2.5** - The number of passes defended per game by Duke senior **CB Breon Borders**. Borders has eight pass breakups and two interceptions in four games and his 2.5 average leads the nation.

**3** - The number of ACC quarterbacks who were included in both the Davey O'Brien Award Great Eight list of signal callers who were nominated for quarterback of the Week and the Manning Award QB Stars of the week. North Carolina's **Mitch Trubisky** and Louisville's **Lamar Jackson** made both lists. Duke's **Daniel Jones** was tabbed as one of the O'Brien Great Eight, while Virginia Tech's **Jerod Evans** was honored by the Manning Award as one of its eight QB Stars of the Week.

**4** - Virginia Tech **QB Jerod Evans** ranks fourth nationally and leads the ACC in pass efficiency with a 185.8 rating. Evans, a junior college transfer, is in his first season as a major college starter.

**5** - Currently the ACC has five current head coaches who have won 100 or more football games led by Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** (171), Miami's **Mark Richt** (148), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (104), Wake Forest's **Dave Clawson** (100) and Virginia's **Bronco**

**Mendenhall** (100). That has happened only once before in ACC history in 1992 when George Welsh (Virginia), Bill Dooley (Wake Forest), Dick Sheridan (NC State), Bobby Bowden (FSU) and Ken Hatfield (Clemson) were in the league.

**Also 5** - The number of road non-conference wins for the **ACC** last Saturday. That's the most non conference road wins in a single weekend for the league. The previous high was three, accomplished 10 times.

**10** - **Clemson** has now won 10 consecutive ACC games, including all eight conference games last year, the 2015 ACC Championship and its 2016 ACC season-opener versus Georgia Tech.

**16** - North Carolina senior **WR Ryan Switzer** tied a school record that is also an ACC standard last week with 16 receptions in the Tar Heels' win over Pitt. That tied a mark recorded eight times previously, most recently by Sammy Watkins of Clemson against Ohio State in the 2014 Orange Bowl. Former Tar Heel Charlie Carr originally set the record in 1966, which was also later tied by another former UNC standout, Quinshad Davis in 2012.

**25** - The number of touchdowns running and passing for Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** after just four weeks of the season. That's a four-game ACC record. Jackson tied an ACC mark with eight in his season-opener against Charlotte, had five against Syracuse and Florida State, then recorded seven last week versus Marshall. He leads the nation in points responsible for (150), is tied for the lead in scoring (18.0/gm.) and is second nationally in total offense (464.0).

**30** - North Carolina junior **QB Mitch Trubisky** set an ACC standard for most consecutive pass completions, completing 30 straight passes between UNC's wins over James Madison and Pitt. Trubisky connected on his last 18 passes against JMU and his first 12 against Pitt.

**42** - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt's **James Conner**. Conner has 40 rushing touchdowns, which ties him for ninth on the all-time ACC list. The total of 42 TDs ties him with former NC State standout Stan Fritts and former UNC standout Mike Voight for 10th place on the ACC career list.

**100** - Two ACC head coaches recorded their 100th career victories last weekend. When Wake Forest stayed unbeaten with its fourth straight win of the year, a 33-28 decision over Indiana, Deacon head coach **Dave Clawson** claimed his 100th career win (100-98). When Virginia downed previously unbeaten Central Michigan, 49-35, UVA's **Bronco Mendenhall** received his 100 career win (100-46).

**110** - Saturday's meeting between **NC State** and **Wake Forest** in Raleigh will be the 110th meeting of the two schools in football. It's the ACC's longest continuous series among its schools, having been played every year since 1910.

**217.3** - The number of yards per game **Miami** has allowed this season, which ranks the Hurricanes second in the nation in total defense. Miami also ranks first in scoring defense (7.7) and team tackles for loss (13.3), and is tied for first in team sacks (4.33).

**267** - Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** ran for a career high 267 yards against South Florida last Saturday. The junior running back had a 74-yard TD run among his 28 carries and averaged 9.5 yards a carry in leading the Seminoles over the Bulls. His total was the second-highest in the FBS this season. In his last two meetings with USF, Cook has rushed for 266 and 267 yards, a total of 533 yards in two games.

**341.6** - The average number of passing yards per game for Syracuse sophomore **QB Eric Dungey**. Dungey leads the ACC and ranks seventh nationally in passing yards per contest.

**1920** - **Louisville** is only the fourth team since 1920 to score 59 or more points in four consecutive games and only the second of those teams to do so in the first four games of the season (Baylor, 2013).

**2006** - The last time that **Wake Forest** started the season 4-0. The Deacons won their first five games that year en route to their second ACC Championship and their only Orange Bowl appearance. The 2006 season was also the last time the Deacons defeated NC State in Raleigh, which is who and where they play this week.

# ESPN's College Football GameDay Makes Fifth Appearance in Clemson

*Iconic College Football Show Originates An ACC Game for the Third Time in Four Weeks*

Clemson will host ESPN's College GameDay Built by the Home Depot this week for the fifth time when the Tigers host third-ranked Louisville at Memorial Stadium this Saturday. This marks the 10th time Clemson has played in a game from where GameDay has emanated.



This week marks the third time in four weeks that GameDay has been at the site of a game involving an ACC team. On Sept. 10, GameDay originated from the Bristol Motor Speedway, where Virginia Tech met Tennessee in the Pilot J

Battle at Bristol, which set an all-time college football attendance record of 156,990.

On Sept. 17, GameDay was in Louisville as the cardinals, then ranked 10th nationally, posted a 63-20 triumph over second-ranked Florida State.

Including this weekend, current ACC schools have hosted College GameDay a total of 37 times, while current ACC schools have appeared 91 times on the sites where College GameDay has been held. Florida State has hosted GameDay more than any other ACC school (11), followed by the Hokies and Miami (6), Clemson (5), Boston College, Georgia Tech and Pitt (2 each) and North Carolina, NC State and Louisville (1 each).

Florida State has hosted more ESPN College GameDays (11) than any school nationally with the exception of Ohio State (13) and Florida (12).

# Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a “collaborative” process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference’s Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC’s stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?**

**ANSWER:** They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

### **Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?**

**A:** There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

### **Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?**

**A:** Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

### **Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?**

**A:** They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

### **Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?**

**A:** Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

### **Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?**

**A:** No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?**

**A:** No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?**

**A:** No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

### **Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?**

**A:** The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

# 2016 ACC Players of the Week

## Atlantic Coast Conference Announces Football Players of the Week

*Duke's Jones, Wilson honored following Blue Devils' road win at Notre Dame*

GREENSBORO, N.C. (theACC.com) – A pair of Duke student-athletes have been honored as Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week following the Blue Devils' 38-35 road win at Notre Dame on Saturday. Redshirt freshman quarterback Daniel Jones earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors, while Shaun Wilson was named the Specialist of the Week after they led Duke's comeback from an early two-touchdown deficit to the program's first-ever win in South Bend. North Carolina also had two players recognized following their ACC and school record-setting performances in the Tar Heels' 37-36 win over Pitt, as quarterback Mitch Trubisky was tabbed the ACC Offensive Back of the Week and Ryan Switzer the Receiver of the Week. Florida State's Roderick Johnson (Offensive Lineman), Virginia Tech's Ken Ekanem (Defensive Lineman), Syracuse's Zaire Franklin (Linebacker) and Wake Forest's Jessie Bates (Defensive Back) complete the ACC's list of weekly honorees for Sept. 26. UNC's Trubisky was also named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, giving the ACC three recipients of that award in the first four weeks of the season.

### OFFENSIVE BACK – Mitch Trubisky, North Carolina, Jr., QB, 6-3, 225, Mentor, Ohio

Trubisky completed 35 of 46 passes for 453 yards, five touchdowns and no interceptions in Saturday's 37-36 win over Pitt. In addition to directing a game-ending drive and throwing the winning touchdown pass with two weeks to play, he set career highs for completions, pass attempts, passing yards and touchdown passes. Trubisky tied the school record for TD passes in a game and set an ACC and school record with 30 consecutive completions over two games (final 18 attempts Sept. 17 vs. James Madison, first 12 vs. Pitt). Trubisky's 453 passing yards were the second-most in for a single game in UNC history behind Marquise Williams' 494 versus Duke in 2015. UNC has played 1,271 football games, and Trubisky posted the school's second- and fourth-highest single-game passing yardage totals in a span of eight days (432 yards versus James Madison, 453 versus Pitt).

### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Roderick Johnson, Florida State, Jr., OT, 6-7, 311, Florissant, Mo.

In Saturday's 55-35 win over USF, Johnson led an offensive line effort that paved the way for 478 yards rushing – the nation's highest single game performance this season – and 647 yards of total offense – the most by the Seminoles since 2012. Johnson had the offensive line's top grade and opened holes for Dalvin Cook's incredible day (267 rushing yards, 329 total yards, two TDs). Jacques Patrick added 124 yards and a score on the ground, while quarterback Deondre Francois had 75 yards on the ground and 169 yards passing. FSU came within one yard of tying the school record for rushing yards in the road victory.

### RECEIVER – Ryan Switzer, North Carolina, Sr., WR, 5-10, 185, Charleston, W. Va.

Switzer tied the ACC and school record with 16 receptions for a career-high 208 yards and one touchdown in the Tar Heels' 37-36 win over Pitt. Only eight other ACC players have caught 16 passes in a single game. Switzer also became the sixth Tar Heel to have 200-plus receiving yards in a game. His previous high was 136 against Georgia Tech in 2014. It was his seventh career game with 100 or more receiving yards. Switzer ranks in the top 10 in UNC history in receptions (third) and receiving yards (fifth) and touchdown receptions (tied for seventh).

### DEFENSIVE LINE – Ken Ekanem, Virginia Tech, Sr.-r, DE, 6-3, 255, Centreville, Va.

Ekanem led a stout defensive effort as the Hokies recorded six quarterback sacks and 16 total tackles for loss while limiting East Carolina to 81 net rushing yards in Saturday's 54-17 win at Lane Field. Ekanem recorded two of Virginia Tech's sacks, including a takedown of ECU quarterback James Summers in the third quarter that resulted in a safety and a 40-7 lead for the Hokies. Ekanem finished with five total tackles and added a pair of quarterback hurries.

### LINEBACKER – Zaire Franklin, Syracuse, Jr., MLB, 6-0, 230, Philadelphia, Pa.

Franklin made a career-high 14 tackles, including a season-best 2.5 tackles for loss, in Syracuse's 31-24 victory at Connecticut. He also had one pass breakup. Franklin was involved in two of the game's most pivotal plays. With the score tied at 17 late in the third quarter, Franklin tipped UConn quarterback Bryant Shirreffs' pass into the waiting arms of cornerback Cordell Hudson, who returned the ball 22 yards for a touchdown to give Syracuse a 24-17 lead. Then, midway through the fourth quarter and Huskies down seven, Franklin stopped Shirreffs for a gain of just one yard on fourth-and-goal from the SU 2-yard line.

### DEFENSIVE BACK – Jessie Bates, Wake Forest, Fr.-r, SS, 6-2, 200, Fort Wayne, Ind.

Bates played his first college football game in his home state and did not disappoint as the Deacons claimed a 33-28 win at Indiana on Saturday. Bates had two interceptions, returning one for a touchdown. He totaled 94 yards in returns, including his 55-yard return for a score. He led the team with eight tackles, returned two punts for a total of two yards, and recovered Indiana's final on-side kick. In the first quarter with Wake Forest trailing 7-0, Bates intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 39 yards, leading to a Deacon touchdown that tied the game. With the game tied at 7-7 in the second quarter, Bates intercepted a pass and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown to give Wake Forest a 14-7 lead.

### SPECIALIST – Shaun Wilson, Duke, Jr., RB, 5-9, 180, Charlotte, N.C.

Wilson returned four kickoffs for 163 yards (40.75), including a 96-yard return for a touchdown, in the Blue Devils' 38-35 win at Notre Dame. Filling in for injured three-time All-America kick returner DeVon Edwards and with Duke trailing, 14-0, in the opening quarter, Wilson delivered his 96-yard scoring return, which jump-started a 28-7 spurt as Duke claimed a 28-21 advantage at halftime. Jones' runback matched the 14th longest kickoff return in school history, and he posted the eighth highest single-game kickoff return average (minimum three returns) in school history.

### ROOKIE – Daniel Jones, Duke, Fr.-r, QB, 6-5, 210, Charlotte, N.C.

Jones spearheaded Duke – a three-touchdown underdog – to a 38-35 road win over Notre Dame as the Blue Devils rallied from deficits of 14 points in the first quarter and seven points in the fourth quarter. Jones completed 24-of-32 passes for 290 yards with three touchdowns and one interception while rushing for an additional 19 yards on five attempts. Jones engineered Duke's game-winning 10-play, 44-yard drive, which culminated in AJ Reed's 19-yard field goal with 1:24 remaining in the game. Earlier in the fourth quarter, Jones threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to WR Anthony Nash to tie the game, 35-35, with 6:47 left. Jones matched the school single-game record for scoring passes of 20-plus yards with touchdown tosses to Nash (32 and 64 yards) and Quay Chambers (25 yards).

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. **Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.

His winning percentage is the best of any first-time ACC head coach after six seasons and is second only to Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden,

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the third year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

### The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

### ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Duke ended regulation tied with Indiana at 41-41 in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl on December 26, 2015, they played the 77th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 77 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, seven in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 77 overtime contests, 38 have been ACC games while 39 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-26 advantage in the 67 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-36 record. Fifty-six of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
