## OPENING KICK

### UVA OPENS 128TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

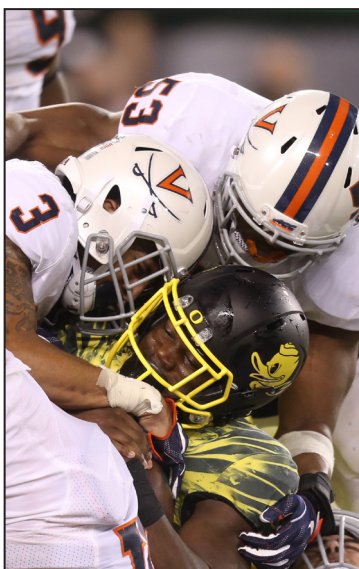
- The University of Virginia opens its 128th season of football Saturday against William & Mary.
- It is the 87th season the Cavaliers have played in Scott Stadium.
- UVA is 80-38-9 (.665) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 74-21-7 (.760) in home season openers and have won 17 of their last 22 season openers at Scott Stadium.
- In his career as a head coach, Bronco Mendenhall is 8-4 in 12 season-openers.
- Virginia is one of 336 college football coaching staffs from all four NCAA divisions that will wear American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) patches on their shirts opening weekend to bring awareness of and promote the association.

### VIRGINIA VS. WILLIAM & MARY, CAA

- Virginia owns a 28-6-1 edge in the all-time series with William & Mary. UVA has won eight of the last nine meetings, including a 35-29 win the last time these teams met in 2015.
- In games played in Charlottesville, Virginia has a 22-4 advantage.
- William & Mary's last win in the series came in 2009, a 26-14 victory at Scott Stadium.
- The Cavaliers own a 58-10-3 record against current members of the CAA.

### FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- Virginia is opening a season against William & Mary for the 13th time in program history. UVA is 8-3-1 in season openers against the Tribe and 7-2 when those games are played in Charlottesville.
- Virginia returns the ACC's top two tacklers in 2016 with **Micah Kiser** (11.2) and **Quin Blanding** (10). It is the second year in a row Kiser and Blanding finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the league in tackles.
- Blanding is the first player in ACC history to finish No. 2 in the league in tackles three straight years.
- UVA is replacing 178 career starts on offense in 2017. **Eric Smith** (44), **Keeon Johnson** (27), **Jackson Matteo** (27), **Michael Mooney** (25), **Taquan Mizell** (22) and **Matt Johns** (17) are the players lost with double-digit career starts on offense. UVA returns five offensive players with double-digit career starts, highlighted by **Jack English**'s 18, **Jack McDonald** (13), **Doni Dowling** (12), **Olamide Zaccheaus** (11) and **Kurt Benkert** (10) also have double-digit career starts for the Cavaliers.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** is facing an FCS team for the 10th time as a head coach. He is 8-1 all-time against FCS competition. Mendenhall has faced Eastern Illinois (1-0), Eastern Washington (1-0), Idaho State (2-0), Northern Iowa (1-0), Richmond (0-1), Savannah State (1-0), Wagner (1-0) and Weber State (1-0).



Micah Kiser and Quin Blanding have finished No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the ACC in tackles each of the past two seasons.

- 1** FS Quin Blanding's 358 career tackles are the most among all active FBS players and ranks No. 9 all-time in the UVA record book.
- 16** HB Olamide Zaccheaus has a reception in 16-straight games. The streak started in Miami against the Hurricanes on Nov. 7, 2015.
- 21** QB Kurt Benkert's 21 passing touchdowns are the second most returning in the ACC behind Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson's 30.

Each Monday during the football season, the UVA Athletics Media Relations office will conduct a weekly football press conference, attended by head coach Bronco Mendenhall and selected student-athletes. Mendenhall will field questions beginning at 12 p.m. and student-athletes will follow.

Quotes from the press conference will be posted on VirginiaSports.com Monday afternoon.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS**

Players are available for interviews each Monday, depending on class schedules. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVA Athletics Media Relations office by noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Coach Mendenhall will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Mendenhall. UVA athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

On each Monday during the season, ACC schools will announce any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Wednesday for Friday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

## UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

## UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

## THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

## UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

## WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- In his 38th year as the head coach of William & Mary, Jimmye Laycock is facing his fourth UVA head coach on Saturday in Bronco Mendenhall. Laycock has also coached against UVA football teams headed by George Welsh, Al Groh and Mike London.
- UVA's Andrew Brown and Evan Butts made their first collegiate start against William & Mary in 2015, while Darius Latimore made his collegiate debut.
- UVA's Olamide Zaccheaus returned his first collegiate punt against William & Mary in 2015 for 30 yards.
- UVA's Micah Kiser collected 15 tackles, 2.0 sacks and forced a fumble in the 2015 game against William & Mary. The 2015 game against the Tribe served as Kiser's second career game with double-digit tackles.

## Last Meeting

Matt Johns threw three touchdown passes as Virginia beat William & Mary, 35-29, the last time these programs met.

The Cavaliers led 21-20 at halftime and used big plays on consecutive touches to pull away in the third quarter. Johns and Taquan Mizzell started it by teaming up for a short pass that Mizzell turned into an 80-yard touchdown, and Maurice Canaday returned a punt 74 yards for another score about 2 1/2 minutes later.

Johns completed 17-of-23 passes for 263 yards. He also found Connor Wingo-Reeves for a 3-yard touchdown and Canaan Severin for a 26-yarder.

Mizzell led UVA with five receptions for 123 receiving yards, while rushing five times for 44 yards.

- Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, UCF, Clemson, Colorado State, Florida, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Illinois, Kentucky, LSU, UMass, Miami, Mississippi State, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, Tennessee, Texas A&M, Tulsa, Utah State, Vanderbilt, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest also have nine 2016 bowl teams on its schedule.

**BLANDING AND KISER RETURN TO ANCHOR DEFENSE**

- FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser return to anchor the UVA defense. The duo finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. Kiser (11.2) led the ACC in tackles and finished No. 4 nationally. Blanding (10.0) finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row and No. 9 nationally.
- Kiser (9.75) and Blanding (9.58) also finished No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the ACC in tackles in 2015.
- Since the ACC started tracking tackle leaders in 1990, no tandem of tacklers has led the league in tackles for two consecutive seasons.
- Blanding, who also finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2014 (10.25), is the first player in ACC history to finish second in tackles for three straight seasons.
- The only ACC player since 1990 to lead the league in tackles for three consecutive seasons is Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11), now of the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

**NEW STARTERS AT KEY POSITIONS**

- There are five positions between the offense, defense and special teams at which no current Cavalier has started a game.
- No player on UVA's current roster has ever started a game at center, right tackle, fullback, defensive tackle and strong safety.
- Also, UVA has zero kickers on its roster that have appeared in a college game.

**DEFENSE GETS COOK AND HARRIS BACK AFTER EACH MISSED THE 2016 SEASON**

- UVA's defense welcomes the return of OLB Malcolm Cook and CB Tim Harris. Cook missed the entire 2016 season with a medical condition, while Harris received a medical hardship after appearing in two games.
- Harris owns 21 career starts, while Cook was slated as a starter at OLB in Bronco Mendenhall's 3-4 in 2016 before a medical condition almost halted his athletic career.
- Cook has received a sixth year from the NCAA and ACC and will play in 2017 as a redshirt junior. Harris and Cook, both hail from Richmond, enrolled together in 2013.

**BLANDING DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES**

- UVA's Quin Blanding enters 2017 with 18 double-digit tackles games over 36 collegiate games.
- Blanding has had six double-digit tackle games in each of his three previous seasons.
- Blanding has 358 career tackles, 9.94 per game.

**EIGHT CAVALIERS FROM KEY POSITIONS OWN 30+ CAREER GAMES PLAYED**

- Entering 2017, eight different Cavaliers have appeared in at least 30 career games at Virginia.
- TB Daniel Hamm leads the way with 37 games played. FS Quin Blanding (36), ILB Micah Kiser (36), OT Jack English (35), OG Jack McDonald (35), Tim Harris (33), Doni Dowling (32) and Krik Garner (31) all have appeared in at least 30 career games for UVA.

## ZACCHEAUS GIVES BENKERT A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON

- Junior Olamide Zaccheaus returns for his third season with Virginia. The HB led UVA with 584 receiving yards and seven receiving touchdowns in 2016 as one of QB Kurt Benkert's primary targets. His 51 receptions was one behind team leader Doni Dowling's 52 receptions.
- Zaccheaus needs 200 receiving yards to become the 37th Cavalier all-time with 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Benkert found Zaccheaus for an 82-yard touchdown against Central Michigan. Zaccheaus' 82-yard touchdown reception is one of UVA's 19 all-time receptions of 80 yards or more.
- Zaccheaus has also rushed for 286 yards and one score over his first two seasons on Grounds.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

## CAVALIERS LOOK TO NEW RUNNING BACKS IN 2017

- With the graduation of Taquan Mizzell and Albert Reid, UVA is looking to a new stable of running backs.
- Mizzell (2,075, 12 TDs) and Reid (1,287, 12 TDs) combined for 3,362 rushing yards and 24 rushing touchdowns in their collegiate careers. Mizzell finished his career No. 16 all-time in the UVA record book with 2,075 career rushing yards.
- UVA has two backs in senior Daniel Hamm (462, 5 TDs) and junior Jordan Ellis (135, 3 TDs) that have experience carrying the ball for the Cavaliers the past few years.
- Freshman Lamont Atkins enrolled at Virginia in January. Atkins was named the Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year after rushing for 1,905 yards and 31 touchdowns on 12 yards per carry at Lake Braddock High School in Burke, Va.
- Sophomore Chris Sharp moved back to tailback during the spring. The Burlington, N.J., native enrolled at Virginia in 2015 as a running back, but moved to wide receiver and then safety during the 2015 season. Sharp played in the secondary in 2016 and returned some kicks.

## HAMM LOOKS TO RUSH FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN FIVE STRAIGHT SEASONS

- TB Daniel Hamm has rushed for at least one touchdown in each of the past four seasons.
- No Cavalier has ever rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- With available records dating back to 2004, no ACC player has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- Hamm played in two games as a true freshman in 2013 before being hurt at Pitt and receiving a medical hardship. In his collegiate debut he set a UVA record for most rushing yards in a college debut with 136 against VMI. Hamm also rushed for two touchdowns against the Keydets in 2013.
- Hamm has five career rushing touchdowns.

## SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 457 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 256-189-12.

**JOE REED EXCELLED ON KICK RETURN IN 2015**

- Wide Receiver Joe Reed led UVA with 678 kick return yards as a true freshman in 2016.
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation.
- Reed's 678 kick return yards are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game in 2016 was 117 return yards against Miami and his 50-yard return against North Carolina was a season best.

**BREAKING IN A NEW PLACEKICKER/PUNTER**

- None of the UVA kickers on the 2017 roster have attempted a field goal or a punt in a collegiate game. In fact, no UVA kicker or punter has appeared in a college game.
- Virginia, Arizona State and UAB are the only programs in the nation that enter 2017 with a kicker or a punter on its roster with zero collegiate experience.
- Virginia is one of six schools in the nation that has zero career collegiate field goal attempts and punts among the kickers on its roster entering 2017. Arizona State, Georgia Tech, Hawaii, Troy and UAB are the other schools.
- This is the second year in a row UVA has entered a season without a kicker that had attempted a field goal in college.

## BLANDING CLIMBS UVA'S CAREER TACKLE LIST

- FS Quin Blanding is No. 9 all-time at UVA with 358 career tackles.
- Blanding is the third-fastest in program history to record 300 tackles, which he did in his 30th career game. Charles McDaniel (1982-85) did so in 28 games, while Jamie Sharper (1993-96) reached 300 tackles in 29 games.
- Blanding reached 300 tackles the fastest of any UVA defensive back, making it to the milestone seven games sooner than Anthony Poindexter (1995-98).
- Blanding is No. 1 all-time among UVA defensive backs with 358 career tackles. Poindexter, who had 342 stops, ranks No. 12 all-time at UVA. Both Blanding and Poindexter wore No. 3.
- UVA's Quin Blanding owns 18 double-digit tackle games over 36 collegiate games.
- Blanding owned five double-digit tackle games in 2016 (UConn, Central Michigan, Pitt, UNC, Miami).
- Blanding had six double-digit tackle games in 2015 and six as a freshman in 2014.
- Blanding has 358 career tackles in 36 career games (9.94 per game).

## Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • First Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his second season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, the Cougars are one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU is joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with at least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive categories.

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.
