## QUICK HITS - WEEK 11

**ACC Clinch Scenarios:** Clemson and Miami, both listed in the top 10 of the most recent College Football Playoff rankings, could clinch spots in the 2017 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game this weekend. The Tigers, who are coming off a road win at NC State, can play their way into the title game with a victory over Florida State Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The Hurricanes play a non-conference game vs. Notre Dame on ABC at 8 p.m., and can only clinch the Coastal Division if Louisville beats Virginia.

**ACC ESPN College GameDay:** Miami will host ESPN's College GameDay show for the first time since a Labor Day Monday night contest vs. Florida State on Sept. 4, 2006. It's also the first time GameDay has been to Coral Gables on a Saturday since 2001 vs. Syracuse. This is the sixth time Miami has hosted GameDay and the 19th time the show has been at the site of a Hurricanes' football game. It's also the second straight weekend Miami has been the site of ABC's Saturday Night Game of the Week.

**ACC Florida State at Clemson:** Clemson can win the Atlantic Division and earn a berth in the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game for the third straight year with a victory over the Seminoles. It is the first

time in seven seasons in which both teams have not been nationally ranked. However, it is the 25th time in the 31-game series that at least one has been ranked among the AP Top 25.

**ACC NC State at Boston College:** NC State travels to Boston College for a noon kickoff and must win to keep alive any chance for an Atlantic Division crown. The game will be televised regionally on ABC, and on ESPN2 to the rest of the country. BC has won three straight ACC games for the first time since 2013 and is coming off a bye week. The Eagles have won eight of 12 meetings against NC State since joining the conference.

**ACC Bowl Eligibility:** The ACC has five bowl-eligible teams this week – Miami (8-0), Clemson (8-1), Virginia Tech (7-2), NC State (6-3) and Virginia (6-3). Three other teams need just one win this week to achieve postseason eligibility, including Boston College, Louisville and Wake Forest. Four other ACC teams – Duke, Georgia Tech, Pitt and Syracuse – need two wins to go bowling.



## IN THE RANKINGS

- Syracuse senior WR Steve Ishmael is second in the nation in receptions per game (8.7), second in total receptions (78), fourth in total receiving yards (986), and fourth in receiving yards per game (109.6). Ishmael is one of three ACC players in the top 10 in receptions per game, including his teammate Ervin Phillips, who is third (8.1) and Virginia's Olamide Zaccheaus, who is tied for ninth (7.3). Wake Forest's Greg Dortch and NC State's Jaylen Samuels are currently 13th (6.6).
- Boston College's Michael Walker leads the nation in combined return yardage. Walker, who is 10th nationally in punt return average (16.1), has 912 total return yards, including both punt (356) and kickoff (556) returns. North Carolina sophomore Anthony Ratliff-Williams is fifth with 716 yards, all on kickoff returns, while Pitt's Quadree Henderson is seventh with 684.
- Pitt's Quadree Henderson is seventh in the country in punt return average (16.1).
- NC State senior DE Bradley Chubb is third nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 2.1 per game. He is also 11th nationally in quarterback sacks, averaging 0.83 per game.
- Louisville QB Lamar Jackson leads the nation in total offense, averaging 426.3 yards per game, points responsible for (194), while also ranking 14th among all players in rushing (114.3). He is ahead of the ACC total offense record of 393.4 yards per game that he set last year. Jackson's average is more than 47 yards more per game than his next closest competitor, Baker Mayfield of Oklahoma (366.0)
- Syracuse junior QB Eric Dungey is currently seventh nationally in total offense, averaging 343.3 yards per game.
- Virginia's Joe Reed leads the ACC and ranks fourth nationally with a 31.7 kickoff return yards average. He returned three kickoffs for a total of 170 yards (56.7 avg.) against Georgia Tech including a 92-yarder for a TD.

## QUICK HITS

**Wins Over .500 Teams:** Led by Clemson with seven, the ACC leads all conferences in wins (32) vs. teams with a .500-or-better record. No other team in the AP Top 10 has played more .500-or-better teams than Clemson (7).

**Notre Dame at Miami:** One of college football's most significant rivalries resumes Saturday night when Miami and Notre Dame meet for the 27th time overall, but first at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens. Notre Dame holds an 18-7-1 advantage in a series which began in 1955. The Irish have won the last four meetings between the two teams and Miami's last win was a 27-10 upset of the then No. 1-ranked Irish in 1989 at the old Orange Bowl. The series is tied 6-6-1 in the 13 games played in South Florida, including the last five meetings at the Orange Bowl. Notre Dame ranks fourth nationally in rushing offense (324.8), seventh in scoring offense (41.3) and 17th in scoring defense (17.1). Miami leads the nation in tackles for loss (8.8) and is 12th in scoring defense (17.6).

**North Carolina at Pitt:** For the second time in the last three years, North Carolina and Pitt will meet in an ESPN Thursday night contest. The Tar Heels took a 26-19 decision at Heinz Field in 2015. UNC has won all four ACC meetings between the two teams since 2013 but none have been by more than seven points with the average margin of victory just 5.0. In fact, the average margin of victory in the 11 games between the two teams is just 6.8 points with UNC holding an 8-3 advantage. The Panthers' last win in Pittsburgh was a 7-6 decision in 1982 when they were ranked No. 1 nationally and the Tar Heels were No. 5. Pitt's three wins in the series have been by a total of just seven points.

**Wake Forest at Syracuse:** The Demon Deacons and Orange meet for only the sixth time in a series which began in 2006 in Winston-Salem. Syracuse has won all three meetings in the Carrier Dome and holds an 4-2 overall advantage. The game pits two of the top quarterbacks in the ACC in Syracuse junior Eric Dungey, who is ranked seventh nationally in total offense (343.3), and Wake's John Wolford, who ranks ninth nationally in pass efficiency (161.2).

**Virginia Tech at Georgia Tech:** Nine times in the last 13 years the winner of this game has either claimed the ACC title or represented the Coastal Division in the ACC Championship Game. The Hokies hold a 9-5 advantage in the series which began in 1990 in Atlanta and a 5-2 lead at Bobby Dodd Stadium. The Jackets are third nationally in rushing offense, averaging 331.9 yards per game, while the Hokies are 18th nationally in rushing defense, allowing just 122.8 yards per game and are fourth in third down defense (.248).

**Virginia at Louisville:** Louisville has won the last two meetings, but all five games in the series have been close with the largest margin of victory being seven points, and the average margin of victory just 3.8 points per game. The Cardinals are third nationally in total offense (549.3).

**Duke at Army:** The teams meet for the 25th time this weekend with the Blue Devils holding a 13-10-1 advantage in a series that began in 1944 in New York City. Duke has won the last two meetings and nine of the last 11. Under David Cutcliffe, Duke is 3-1 against the Cadets, including a 44-3 decision on the Blue Devils' last trip to West Point in 2015. Army has won five in a row heading into Saturday's game and have won six straight at Michie Stadium (5-0 this year). Duke, which began the season with four consecutive wins, is looking to snap a five-game losing streak. Army leads the nation in rushing offense, averaging 365.4 yards per game and is second in red zone defense (.619). Duke is 40th in defense against the run, allowing just 142.1 yards per game and is 14th in team tackles for loss (7.6).

**Dabo Ranks Fifth:** Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney, who earned his 97th career victory last weekend, is now fifth on the all-time ACC coaching wins list. Former ACC coach Bill Dooley is next on the list, having won 98 games at North Carolina and Wake Forest.

**Rushing QBs:** The top two rushers in the ACC this year are Louisville quarterback Lamar

WIN STREAKS

- Miami’s 13-game win streak is the longest in the country ahead of Georgia and Wisconsin, which have each won 10. The Hurricanes will face a Notre Dame team this weekend that was won seven consecutive games, which is the nation’s sixth-longest streak.
- Clemson has won nine straight over top 25 teams, the longest streak in Tiger history. The Tigers are 11-1 in matchups of top 15 teams over the last three years and 14-1 in its last 15 games against teams ranked in the top 25 of at least one poll.
- Georgia Tech, which plays host to Virginia Tech this weekend, has won seven straight at home, the sixth-longest streak in the country.

EIGHTY WINS

FSU head coach Jimbo Fisher is just the eighth coach in ACC history to have won at least 80 games at an ACC school since the conference began in 1953. Fisher won his 80th game at Duke on Oct. 14 and is currently 81-22. He joins Dabo Swinney, Danny Ford and Frank Howard of Clemson; Bill Murray of Duke; Bobby Bowden of Florida State; George Welsh of Virginia and Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech with 80 wins at one ACC school.

Jackson (114.3) and Georgia Tech QB TaQuon Marshall (108.8). In its 65 years, the ACC has never had a quarterback finish the season as its rushing leader.

**Difficult Schedule:** Based on opponent winning percentage, Boston College and NC State have played the nation’s second- and sixth-most difficult schedules, respectively. BC’s nine opponents are 43-22 (.662), while Florida State’s seven opponents are 38-22 (.633).

**Undefeated Hurricanes:** Miami is 8-0 for the first time since 2002 it won 12 straight before falling in the Fiesta Bowl to Ohio State.

**Scoring Defense:** Virginia Tech ranks fourth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 14.3 points per game. The Hokies are one of three ACC teams ranked in the top 12, including Clemson, which is eighth allowing 15.1 points a game and Miami, which is 12th allowing 17.6 per contest.

**In The Rankings:** Clemson has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in each of the past 37 weeks. That ties Alabama for the longest current streak in the nation.

**Coaching Success:** Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher (81-22, .786) and Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney (97-29, .770) are the two winningest coaches by percentage in ACC history.

**Bobby Dodd Award:** Four ACC coaches are included on the Bobby Dodd Award Midseason Watch List, including Dave Doeren of NC State, Justin Fuente of Virginia Tech, Mark Richt of Miami and Dabo Swinney of Clemson. Swinney is a past winner of the Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2011.

**Lamar Jackson Numbers:** Louisville QB Lamar Jackson became the fastest player in league history to gain 10,000 yards of total offense, accomplishing the feat in just 31 games. He is only the second junior to top the 10,000-yard mark, joining Clemson’s Deshaun Watson, who did so in 33 games. Jackson’s career total now stands at 11,751 through 34 games. He ranks fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Watson (12,097), Tajh Boyd of Clemson (13,069) and Philip Rivers (13,582) of NC State. Jackson is only the second ACC quarterback in history to top 1,000 rushing yards twice in a season, joining former Clemson standout Woodrow Dantzler. He has an ACC-best 1,026 rushing yards this season.

**Tackles For Loss:** Miami ranks first nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 8.8 hits behind the line of scrimmage per game. The Hurricanes are one of four ACC teams ranked in the top 11, and are followed by Wake Forest (third, 8.7), Clemson (sixth, 8.3) and Virginia Tech (11th, 7.8).

**Punt Return Distance:** The two longest punt returns in the nation have been turned in this year by ACC returners. NC State’s Nyheim Hines has the longest in the FBS to his credit, a 92-yarder for a TD against Pitt on Oct. 14 that was one yard longer than the 91-yard return for a score by Virginia Tech’s Greg Stroman against North Carolina on Oct. 21.

**Butkus Award:** Three ACC players – Clemson’s Dorian O’Daniel, Virginia’s Micah Kiser and Virginia Tech’s Tremaine Edmunds – have been named semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which is presented annually to the nation’s top linebacker.

**Thorpe Award:** Three ACC players have been named semifinalists for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, which is presented annually to the nation’s top defensive back. Named from the ACC were Jeremy McDuffie of Duke, Derwin James of Florida State and Quin Blanding of Virginia.

**Lou Groza Award:** Three ACC placekickers have been honored as semifinalists for this year’s Lou Groza College Placekicker of the Year award. Named from the ACC were Miami’s Michael Badgley, Louisville’s Blanton Creque and Syracuse’ Cole Murphy.

CAMPBELL TROPHY FINALISTS

■ Miami wide receiver Braxton Berrios and Virginia linebacker Micah Kiser are among the 13 finalists for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy, which is awarded by the National Football Foundation to an individual deemed the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

Boasting a nearly perfect 3.96 GPA, Berrios is the leading receiver for undefeated Miami. His impressive resume earned his spot as the Hurricanes’ fourth NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

Kiser personifies the student-athlete ideal, having already earned his degree while claiming All-America accolades as one of the top defensive players in the nation. The two-year team captain becomes Virginia’s fifth NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

**Wuerffel Trophy:** The ACC had three of the 11 football student-athletes selected as semifinalists for this year's Wuerffel Trophy, the most of any conference. The Wuerffel is regarded as the premier award in College Football recognizing Community Service. Honored from the ACC were NC State P.A.J. Cole III, Pitt T Brian O'Neill and Duke OL Gabe Brandner.

**Lott IMPACT Trophy:** Six ACC players were chosen as quarterfinalists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, the most of any conference nationally. Named as members of the 20 quarterfinalists from the ACC were Quin Blanding, S, Virginia; Tremaine Edmunds, LB, Virginia Tech; Zaire Franklin, LB, Syracuse; Derwin James, DB, Florida State; Micah Kiser, LB, Virginia and Christian Wilkins, DT, Clemson. Virginia was one of just two schools in the country to have two players chosen as quarterfinalists.

**NFL Quarterbacks:** Eleven quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers are from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They are joined by Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), Pitt's Tom Savage (Texans), Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers) and E.J. Manuel (Raiders). All 11 played in the ACC.

## COASTAL NOTES

The name Swilling should be familiar to ACC and Georgia Tech fans. Brady Jordan-Swilling, the adopted son of former Tech All-America and New Orleans Saints all-pro Pat Swilling and nephew of former Tech All-America safety Ken Swilling, had a breakout game against Virginia Saturday. The true freshman LB had 11 tackles, a TFL, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and an interception and 27-yard return in the Jackets' close loss to Virginia.

Virginia Tech Quarterback Josh Jackson leads all freshmen nationally with 17 touchdown passes and 2,245 passing yards. He is second among freshmen QBs in pass efficiency rating (147.7).

Virginia Tech senior WR Cam Phillips has 223 career receptions, which is the second-highest total of any active FBS player. Phillips is 10th on the ACC career receiving list.

Virginia Tech PK Joey Slye needs just four points to become the fifth player in ACC history with 400 or more career points. Slye currently has 396 points and is fifth on the ACC career list. He now has 77 career field goals, which is the fourth-highest total in league history. Miami place-kicker Michael Badgley has 72 career field goals, which ranks fifth on the ACC list and 373 points, which is eighth.

Virginia LB Micah Kiser, who is one of the finalists for the prestigious National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, the award also known as the academic Heisman, leads the ACC and is eighth nationally in tackles, averaging 10.8 per game. He had 18 tackles in the Cavaliers' win over Georgia Tech, which is the highest total in the ACC this season.

Duke LB Joe Giles-Harris ranks fifth among all active players in the FBS, averaging 9.19 tackles per game in his career. A sophomore, Giles-Harris has 193 career hits in 21 games.

## ATLANTIC NOTES

For only the third time this century, an ACC team had two players with 12 or more catches in the same game when Syracuse's Steve Ishmael and Ervin Philips each had 12 pass receptions in its loss to Florida State. Clemson's Mike Williams (15) and Artavis Scott (13) accomplished the feat last Nov. 12 against Pitt, and Philips (14) and Amba Etta-Tawo (12) did it against Colgate also last year on Sept. 2.

Louisville's Lamar Jackson has recorded seven of the top 10 single-game rushing performances by an ACC quarterback. Jackson is also one of two quarterbacks in the country to have rushed for 175 or more yards seven times this century. Michigan's Denard Robinson is the other.

Jackson has been responsible for 106 career touchdowns, including 46 by rush and 60 by pass. He is fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Clemson's Tajh Boyd (133) and Deshaun Watson (116) and NC State's Philip Rivers (112).

Jackson is averaging 104.7 career rushing yards per game, which is the sixth-best of any

current FBS player. In fact, Jackson is one of just two quarterbacks in the top 10. The other is Navy's Zach Abey with 122.0 yards per game in a run-first offense.

Jackson has rushed for 46 touchdowns, an ACC career record for a quarterback. The conference career mark for rushing touchdowns regardless of position is 52, set by Pitt's James Conner. The 46 rushing scores ties Florida State's Dalvin Cook (2014-16) for fourth on the ACC career list.

When Florida State freshman running back Cam Akers rushed for 199 yards against Syracuse, it marked the second-highest single game total in the ACC this year by a freshman, trailing only the 272 yards recorded by Boston College's AJ Dillon, and was the fifth-best rushing day by any ACC runner this season. It was also the 15th-best single-game rushing effort by an ACC freshman.

Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last six years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of six or more years with double-figure victories. The Tigers are only the 11th team to have had 10 wins in six successive seasons.

### ACC COACHING SUCCESS

Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top 20 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State's Jimbo Fisher ranks fourth (.786), followed by Clemson's Dabo Swinney (sixth, .770), Miami's Mark Richt (seventh, .747), Louisville's Bobby Petrino (11th, .708), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (16th, .666) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (20th, .654).

Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 181 wins in his 20-year career. Miami's Mark Richt is tied for eighth with 162 wins, followed by Louisville's Bobby Petrino, who is tied for 18th with 114 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (108) who is 22nd, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall, who is 23rd with 107 wins, and Duke's David Cutcliffe, who is 24th with 100 wins. Clemson's Dabo Swinney ranks 26th with 97.

### NATIONAL TITLES & HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS

Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the four years.

The ACC is the first conference since 1994 to have a football national title winner (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

### DR PEPPER ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

This season, The Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be held at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium for a seventh time, resuming an agreement between the ACC and the Queen City venue that runs through the 2020 season.

The 13th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is set for Saturday, Dec. 2. The game will again be shown in prime time on ESPN (at 7:45 p.m.) or ABC (at 8 p.m.)

The six Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Games held in Charlotte have been extremely successful from a fan experience and attendance standpoint. The games have averaged over 69,000 fans per contest, including sellout crowds in 2010, 2011, and 2015. An ACC

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

#### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

#### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

### Four ACC Coaches In Top 11 in Career Winning Percentage; Seven in Top 28

Four current ACC head coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage and six are ranked in the Top 20, led by Florida State's Jimbo Fisher, who ranks third overall with a .786 mark just behind Ohio State's Urban Meyer (.847) and Washington's Chris Peterson (.825). Joining Fisher in the Top 11 are Dabo Swinney of Clemson at 6th, Mark Richt of Miami at 7th and Bobby Petrino of Louisville 11th. Paul Johnson (16th) of Georgia Tech and Bronco Mendenhall (20th) are also ranked in the Top 20. After a 6-3 start this year, NC State's Dave Doeren is ranked 28th (.621).

### Career Victories - Active Coaches Five ACC Coaches in Top 25

Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson, in his 21st year as a head coach, is ranked fourth in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with 181. Johnson is one of six current ACC coaches who rank among the FBS Top 25 in career wins. Johnson is joined by Miami's Mark Richt, who is tied for eighth on the active FBS list with 162 career wins. Louisville's Bobby Petrino is 18th with 114 wins, while Dave Clawson of Wake Forest is tied for 22nd (108), Bronco Mendenhall of Virginia (107) is 23rd and Duke's David Cutcliffe is 24th (100). Clemson's Dabo Swinney, just three wins from 100, is tied for 26th.

**Notes:** North Carolina has won all four ACC meetings between the teams to date, including a 26-19 victory in an ESPN Thursday Night game at Pitt two years ago • The last six games in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less, including North Carolina's 37-36 win last season in Chapel Hill • The Tar Heels trailed by 13 points in that contest with six minutes to play, but pulled out the win on QB Mitch Trubisky's 2-yard touchdown pass to WR Bug Howard with two seconds remaining • Trubisky threw for career highs of 453 yards and five touchdowns • UNC leads the overall series 8-3, including a 3-2 mark versus the Panthers in Pittsburgh • Pitt's most recent win in the series came in the 2009 Meineke Car Care Bowl, where RB Dion Lewis rushed for 159 yards and a touchdown to key a 19-17 Panthers' win.
