VIRGINIA-DUKE SERIES

- Virginia holds a 78-51-1 edge in its all-time series with Duke.
- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor holds an 11-5 record against the Blue Devils, including a 5-1 mark at Davenport Field.
- The Blue Devils won two of three last year in Durham, marking their first series win vs. UVa since 1998.

TOP CAVALIERS VS. DUKE

- Only three UVa pitchers have seen action previously vs. Duke (Carraway, Davis, Packer).
- Tyler Cannon is a .360 (9-for-25) career hitter vs. Duke (2 2B, one RBI).
- Dan Grovatt went 5-for-11 (.455) last year with a home run, double and four RBI.
- Jarrett Parker went 5-for-12 (.417; 2B, 3B, 2 RBI), while Franco Valdes was 5-for-13 (.385; 2B, HR, 4 RBI).
- Saturday starter Andrew Carraway is 0-1 career vs. Duke and lost his start last year at Duke (5.1 IP, 3 ER, 6 H, 4 K). He has a 9.39 career ERA vs. the Blue Devils.

HONORING THE SENIORS

- Virginia will honor three seniors in Senior Day ceremonies prior to the game Sunday (12:30 p.m.) – Will Campbell, Andrew Carraway and Brad Grove.
- The four-year senior class has combined for 166 wins – second most in school history (2007 class had 177 wins).

IN ELITE COMPANY

- With 35 wins, Virginia is tied with Arizona State, East Carolina, Florida State and Oklahoma for the seventh-most wins in the nation.
- George Mason (38), Kansas State and North Carolina (37) and Coastal Carolina, LSU and Ole Miss (36) are the only teams to have more wins this year.

HULTZEN ZEROES IN ON UVA FRESHMAN K RECORD

- Danny Hultzen (75) needs two strikeouts to match the Virginia freshman record for strikeouts in a season.
- Jacob Thompson posted 77 strikeouts in 2006.

CARRAWAY CLIMBS UVA CHARTS

- Andrew Carraway has moved into 10th place in career strikeouts at UVa (209). He needs four to move into a tie for eighth place.
- He ranks second in career winning percentage at UVa (16-3 record, .842 pct.).
- He also has made 66 career appearances and will move into a tie for ninth with his Saturday start.

SLOW STARTERS AFTER FINALS

- Over the last five years, Virginia is 6-9 in the first ACC series following its finals break.
- Since 2000, Virginia is 7-20 in its first ACC series after finals.
- UVa has won one ACC series in that time, taking two of three vs. UNC in 2006.
- UVa played its last game April 28 vs. Liberty.

O'CONNOR BECOMES THIRD-FASTEST TO 250

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor has 250 career wins in his six seasons at Virginia (349 games total).
- With his 250th career win April 25 vs. NC State (348th career game), he became the third-fastest to reach 250 wins in ACC history.
- Only Clemson's Jack Leggett (338 games) and FSU's Mike Martin (343 - since joining ACC) reached 250 wins faster.
- O'Connor is 251-98-1 (.717) at Virginia.

THE HOMERS KEEP COMING

- Virginia has hit 39 home runs this year, topping its total from the entire 2008 season (25 in 62 games).
- It is the most home runs of any UVa team in the Brian O'Connor coaching era (since 2004); the previous high was 35 in 2005.
- Six Cavaliers have at least three homers this year - only three players had at least three in 2008.

CARRAWAY, HULTZEN NAMED TO PITCHER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- The College Baseball Foundation and Mizuno have announced the first watch list for the inaugural presentation of the Pitcher of the Year Award. The list included UVa starters Andrew Carraway and Danny Hultzen.
- They are two of seven pitchers on the list from the ACC.
- The Pitcher of the Year will be honored dur-

CANNON ON BROOKS WALLACE LIST

• Tyler Cannon has been named to the initial watch list for the 2009 Brooks Wallace Award.
• For the first time since its creation in 2004, the Wallace Award will honor the country's finest shortstop. Previously, the Wallace Award was given to the national player of the year.
• Cannon is one of three ACC shortstops to make the watch list, joining FSU's Stephen Cardullo and Georgia Tech's Derek Dietrich.

CARRAWAY NAMED

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

• Andrew Carraway has been named to the 2009 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Baseball Team. Carraway was a first-team selection on the District 3 First Team.
• District 3 consists of schools from Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia.
• It marks the second straight year that he has earned the honor. He will now be on the ballot for the Academic All-America award.

HITTING, PITCHING NOT LIMITED TO NON-CONFERENCE

• Virginia, which leads the league in batting (.342) and pitching (3.10), also paces the conference in batting in ACC games only. UVa is hitting .333 in ACC contests.
• In contrast, UVa hit just .260 in ACC games last season.
• UVa also is third in ERA in ACC games only with a 4.46 mark (UNC leads at 4.34).

NAILBITERS BECOME THE NORM

• Fourteen of UVa's last 17 ACC games have been decided by three runs or fewer.
• Six of UVa's eight ACC losses have come by one run, with the others coming by two and three runs.

DEFENSE COMES THROUGH

• The Cavaliers have a .971 fielding percentage, which is tied for third in the ACC.
• In ACC games, that mark is even higher – UVa has a .976 fielding percentage, tied with BC and trailing only Duke (.982).

UNDERCLASSMEN PUT UP BIG NUMBERS

• UVa's offense has been dominated by the freshmen and sophomores.
• In all, 83 percent (457 total) of the Cavaliers' hits this year have come from underclassmen (92 from upperclassmen).
• Freshmen and sophomores also account for 83 percent of the team's runs and RBI.

GROVATT STRONG ON WEEKENDS

• Dan Grovatt has a team-best .404 batting average in ACC games this year (fourth-best in conference).
• His three home runs and four of his five doubles have come in ACC play.
• He also has 25 RBI in league play – tied for ninth in the conference.

HIGH MARKS IN THE RPI

• Virginia is 12th in the latest RPI ratings, released Tuesday by the NCAA.
• The Cavaliers were up from No. 14 the previous week.

• Virginia has scored first in 32 of its 45 games, including 16 of the 22 ACC games.
• UVa is 11-4-1 when scoring first in ACC games and 27-4-1 overall.
• The Cavaliers have combined to outscore their opponents 142-46 in the first three innings this season.

HOOS HAVE TOP K:BB RATIO IN ACC, SIXTH BEST OVERALL

• Virginia pitchers currently have the best strikeout to walk ratio in the ACC and the fifth-best in the nation (3.01:1).
• The Cavaliers have recorded the second-most strikeouts in the league (417) – only North Carolina (489) has more.
• UVa has allowed the fewest walks (139) in the ACC.

RAIN RAIN GO AWAY

- Rain and poor weather have been main adversaries of the Cavaliers this year.
- UVa has lost five games to weather this year, including two games with then-No. 14 Florida State and one game against then-No. 19 Coastal Carolina.
- The Cavaliers also have had four games delayed by rain.
- Including the Saturday Duke game, Virginia has altered seven game times in order to get in games (not including cancelled games).

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVa's lead-off hitter.
- He is second in the ACC with 62 runs scored and has scored at least one run in 34 of 45 games.
- Parker ranks seventh in the ACC in batting (.383). He leads the ACC in triples (5) and total bases (132) and is seventh with 67 hits.

PARKER SPRINTS PAST RUNS RECORD

- Jarrett Parker scored his 61st run of the season April 26, breaking the previous record of 60. It took Parker 44 games to break the mark.
- The record was held by two former players, Mark Reynolds (2004) and David Guy (1988).
- Reynolds needed 59 games to score 58 times, and it took Guy 49 games.

LEADING OFF WITH A BANG

- Jarrett Parker has hit four home runs to lead off games this season – UVa had not had a leadoff homer in the four previous years.
- Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.
- Parker also has hit leadoff home runs against Delaware, North Carolina and Maryland.

HULTZEN GETS OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has had a strong start to his college career, going 6-0 in 10 starts.
- In 58.2 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 75 batters – third-most in the ACC.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a pair of nine-strikeout games (at Wake Forest, vs. NC State).

PITCHING AT TOP OF ACC HEAP

- The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (3.10) in the conference thus far.
- Clemson is second with a 3.58 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered 335 hits (7.4/game) this year.
- Opponents are batting an ACC-low .228 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

- Virginia leads the ACC with 93 stolen bases.
- That total ranks 14th nationally.
- UVa has been caught stealing just 20 times.
- NC State (94) is the only ACC team which has attempted more stolen bases than UVa has stolen.
- Four Wahoos ranks among the top 10 in the ACC in steals – Phil Gosselin (third, 18), Jarrett Parker (fourth, 17), Tyler Cannon (sixth, 16) and Dan Grovatt (seventh, 13).
- Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

- In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.
- He ranks first among ACC freshmen with a .351 batting average.
- Proscia is third in the ACC with 17 doubles.

OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

- In the NCAA's latest rankings (5/4), Virginia ranked 11th nationally in team batting average (.342 entering the week). New Mexico leads at .368.
- The Cavaliers also are 22nd in hits (549) and 12th in triples (19).

PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

- Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (3.10 as of 5/3). Only Texas (2.17) and Arizona State (2.48) were better.
- UVa also stands first in hits allowed per nine innings (7.52) and eighth in strikeouts per nine innings (9.4).

DAVENPORT DOMINANCE

- Virginia is 26-5 this year at Davenport Field after going 31-9 last season.
- UVa is 172-40 (.812) at Davenport since 2004, including 58-24 (.711) in ACC games.
- In nonconference games, the record is even more impressive – 114-16 (.875).

EVERYONE HITS!

- Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.
- In 45 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 23 times.
- UVa's high in one inning this year is 13 batters, set March 31 against Radford.
- UVa scored a season-high nine runs in the second inning vs. Radford.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa recently finished a brutal ACC stretch, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- It started when the Cavaliers played host to Florida State. Miami then came to Charlottesville before Virginia traveled to North Carolina. UVa went 3-4 in the stretch (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. UNC). Three of the four losses were by one run, the other by two.
- Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss March 21 to Miami.
- UVa was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers also started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY

- The Cavaliers' 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth-longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

- Virginia piled up 177 runs through its first 15 games – the most ever at UVa.
- The previous high was 161 runs during the first 15 games of the 1898 season.

CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
- The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVa ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.
