OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia returns to the road for its first-ever visit to historic Franklin Field on Saturday. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 6 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 7 in the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media poll. Penn is ranked No. 17 in the coaches poll and No. 20 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

- Saturday marks the ninth all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Quakers, and the first meeting in Philadelphia. UVA owns a 6-2 advantage in a series that dates back to 1929, but is being contested for the seventh time since 1997 and the fifth time since 2011. UVA dropped the first two meetings in the series in 1929 and 1931, before winning the past six.
- Penn head coach Mike Murphy is in his eighth season as the head coach of the Quakers and he returns 28 letter-winners and three starters off a 2016 team that went 8-7. Murphy was an assistant coach at UVA from 1993-97.

D'AMARIO IS ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- For the second week in a row a Cavalier has been named ACC Offensive Player of the Week. Mike D'Amario earned the accolade after scoring seven goals on eight shots in UVA's 18-14 win over Drexel.
- The seven goals ties D'Amario with eight other Cavaliers for fourth-most in a game in program history.
- He posted two goals and two assists on Tuesday vs. Siena.
- Last week Dox Aitken was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week.



Michael Kraus scored three goals and assisted three more in UVA's 20-13 win over Siena on Tuesday night at Klöckner Stadium. It was a career night for the first year in his third collegiate start.

#GOHOOS: BY THE NUMBERS

60 UVA picked up 60 ground balls on Tuesday against Siena. It was the most since 2013 vs. Bellarmine (60).

96 Attackman Zed Williams has 96 career points (55 goals, 41 assists), needing four more to reach 100.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE QUAKERS

- UVA leads the series with Penn 6-2, as the Cavaliers are winners of the past six meetings in a series that started in 1929.
- The series had only been played in Charlottesville (1929, 1931, 1997, 1998, 2011) until the 2012 meeting took place in Denver at Sports Authority Field as part of the Mile High Classic.
- There are a few Penn and UVA connections to this game.
- Penn head coach Mike Murphy was an assistant coach under former UVA head coach and US Lacrosse Hall of Famer, Dom Starsia, on his final Brown staff in 1992 and his first five UVA teams from 1993-97, which included two NCAA title games and three NCAA semifinal games.
- US Lacrosse Hall of Fame head coach Jim Adams served as head coach at both Penn (1970-77) and Virginia (1978-1992), retiring in Charlottesville in 1992 and was succeeded by Dom Starsia.
- Current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany faced Penn all 10 of his seasons as the head coach at Brown and went an even 5-5. That record mirrors what Tiffany's college coach at Brown and UVA predecessor Dom Starsia did in his 10 years in the Ivy League as the Bears' head coach.
- The 2017 season marks the eighth season out of the last 11 that UVA has a regular season schedule that features two Ivy League teams (2010, 2013, 2014 did not).
- UVA plays at Cornell March 11 in Costa Mesa, Calif. In 2011 and 2012 it was Cornell and Penn - In 2009 it was Cornell and Dartmouth.
- In 2007 and 2008 the schedule featured Dartmouth and Princeton.

UVA AND FRANKLIN FIELD CONNECTION

- Virginia is playing its first men's lacrosse game Saturday at the historic Franklin Field.
- The Virginia football team has played in Franklin Field 13 times against the Quakers, losing 12 times.
- The win came in 1949 and was UVA's only football victory in historic Franklin Field. The victor served as a huge upset win for the UVA football program, winning its seventh-straight game of the 1949 season, 26-14.
- A story from Franklin Field in 1949 lives in UVA lore happened with the beloved mascot Seal. In the 1920s-1950s, UVA cherished two dog mascots. The second, Seal, was roaming the sidelines at Franklin Field in 1949. During halftime of the contest, wearing a blue blanket embossed with a large orange "V," Seal walked from the 50-yard line to the Pennsylvania sideline where the Penn cheerleaders had placed their megaphones. The rest of the event was recounted as follows in the Cavalier Daily. "Slowly he walked from midfield to the Quaker side. Indifferently he inspected their cheerleading appurtenances. Eighty thousand people watched with bated breath. Coolly, insolently, Seal lifted a leg—the rest is history." Seal later came to be known as Caninus Megaphonus Pennsylvanus.
- UVA's last football game at Franklin Field was a loss in 1950.
- UVA's women's lacrosse team lost the 2007 NCAA title game to Northwestern, 15-13, at Franklin Field.
- UVA's men's and women's track & field programs have appeared multiple times at the Penn Relays, most recently in 2015.

TIFFANY STARTS OUT 3-0 AT UVA

- Lars Tiffany has won his first three games as Virginia's 17th head coach. He is only the fifth Cavalier head coach to not lose a game in his first contests at the helm. Jim Adams in 1978 started his UVA career out 4-0 before losing his first game.

VIRGINIA IS AVERAGING 18 GOALS PER GAME

- UVA is averaging 18 goals per game through the season's first three contests. It is the highest average by a Cavalier offense through three games since the 1997 team averaged 20.3 goals through three game, which included a 22-21 loss at Syracuse, a 27-2 win over Mercyhurst and a 14-13 overtime setback at Princeton.
- The 1997 team holds the program record for goals per game in a season with 18.2.

VIRGINIA ATTACK SCORING POINTS

- UVA started Mike D'Amario, Michael Kraus and Zed Williams on Tuesday against Siena. The trio has a combined 42 of UVA's 91 points (46.2 percent).

BRUGEL HAS NICE DEBUT AGAINST DREXEL

- UVA first year Luke Brugel was 12-of-15 from the faceoff X in his collegiate debut against Drexel. Brugel also scored a goal, dished out an assist, while picking up five ground balls.
- Brugel was a perfect 11-of-11 on faceoffs in the second half.

TIFFANY WINS UVA DEBUT

- Lars Tiffany won his UVA head coaching debut at then-No. 6 Loyola, 16-15, in the season opener. He becomes just the sixth Cavalier head coach to do so.
- Only Lars Tiffany and Jim Adams beat teams ranked in the USILA Top 20. Adams beat a Duke team ranked No. 12.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 128-32 (.8000) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-0 mark in 2017. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

NEAR INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only seven night games at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall UVA is 36-7 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights, ironically, also to Duke on April 17, 2010.
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA also lost to North Carolina in 2015, a 7 p.m. start.
- UVA lost its first night game in 2016, an overtime setback (12-11) to High Point.

- UVA has four mid-week games in 2017. Tuesday against Siena was the first. UVA also faces High Point (March 1), Cleveland State (April 4) and Robert Morris (April 11).

FIRST YEARS SHINE AT LOYOLA

- First years Dox Aitken (four goals) and Michael Kraus (two goals, three assists) led UVA with nine combined points at then-No. 6 Loyola.
- The nine combined points is the most by a UVA freshmen duo in a season-opening collegiate debut since Drew McKnight (two goals, four assists) and Jay Jalbert (four goals) combined for 10 points in the 1997 season opener against then-No. 2 Syracuse.
- Aitken's four goals in his collegiate debut makes the freshman the third Cavalier since 1997 to score four goals in a season-opening collegiate debut, joining Jay Jalbert (1997, 4 against Syracuse) and Joe Yevoli (2002, 4 against Drexel).
- Aitken and Kraus become the 6th and 7th Cavalier freshmen since 1997 to record at least four points in a season-opening debut.

AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017

- Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.
- It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.
- Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

VIRGINIA IN SEASON OPENERS

- UVA is 50-33-1 (.595) all-time in season openers.
- When the season opener is at home, the Cavaliers have compiled a 28-17-1 (.633) record throughout the years.
- The Cavaliers are 17-16 (.515) when the season opener is on the road, including winning the last six.
- The 2017 season was the seventh time in the last 18 seasons the Cavaliers have opened on the road.

TIFFANY BRINGS FAST PACE OF PLAY TO UVA

- New UVA head coach Lars Tiffany has brought a frantic pace of play with him from Brown. His Brown team led the nation in goals per game in 2016 with a 16.3 average, helping the Bears to Championship Weekend in Philadelphia. Brown was No. 5 in the nation in goals scored per game in 2015 with a 13.9 goals per game average.
- Tiffany has commented about this style of play: "We're absolutely committed to this style of play. This is the way the game used to be played. This is the way we played the game growing up, and it's the way I saw the game played. This is nothing new. We just dusted it off and brought back the '70s and '80s."

TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.
- Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).

TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.
- Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.
- Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVA has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 30 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

It was a wild finish at the Ridley Athletic Complex as 13 combined goals were scored in the fourth quarter, but No. 14 Virginia (1-0) outlasted No. 6 Loyola (0-1), 16-15, to open the Lars Tiffany era.

Virginia owned a 10-5 lead with 7:50 left in the third quarter when Zed Williams found Ryan Conrad for a Cavalier goal that capped a 6-0 UVA run. It took 45 seconds for Loyola to begin a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game, 10-10, with 12:57 left in the game.

Making his collegiate debut against Loyola, Dox Aitken went straight toward the cage and scored his third goal of the game with 12:19 left in the contest to halt the Greyhounds run, giving UVA the lead back, 11-10. Conrad scored unassisted at 11:27 to give UVA a 12-10 advantage. Aitken and Conrad's goals were the beginning of a 4-1 UVA, giving the Cavaliers a 14-11 lead. Aitken capped the run with his fourth goal of the game with 8:13 left to play.

The Greyhounds came roaring back with a 4-1 run of their own, tying the game at 15-15 after Graham Savio won a faceoff and sprinted toward the UVA cage with 2:59 left. Virginia wasted no time after winning the ensuing faceoff as Williams dodged and flipped a pass behind his back to Conrad and the sophomore deposited the game's final goal, lifting UVA to the 16-15 win.

A UVA turnover in the final seconds set up an opportunity for Loyola to tie the game. But Tanner Scales knocked down Zack Sirico's pass with three seconds left and Conrad picked up the ground ball as time expired.

Loyola started the game's scoring with a Mike Perkins goal via an assist by Zach Sirico at 12:08 in the first quarter. Virginia responded with a 4-1 run to take a two-goal lead, 4-2. Aitken and Joe French each scored goals for UVA, while Jason Murphy and Michael Kraus capped the run. Kraus' first collegiate goal came with 8:56 left in the first half.

The Greyhounds retaliated with a 3-0 run, taking a 5-4 lead. Loyola received goals from Brian Begley and one from Zirico. Savio capped the Loyola run with an unassisted goal with 6:14 left in the second quarter. Virginia held Loyola scoreless for the next 14:09, while the Cavaliers took a 10-5 lead, via a aforementioned 6-0 run.

Attackman Mike D'Amario scored seven goals to lead No. 7 Virginia (2-0) to an 18-14 triumph over the Drexel Dragons (0-1) inside Klöckner Stadium. The seven goals by D'Amario were the most by a Cavalier since Matt White scored seven in the championship game of the 2013 ACC Tournament against North Carolina.

The scoring was steady and often for both teams. UVA opened up the game with a comfortable 8-3 run. Ryan Lukacovic scored the first two goals for Virginia unassisted. D'Amario scored two of his seven goals during this run. Luke Brugel capped the run with 12:31 left in the second quarter on a helper from Dox Aitken. It was Brugel's first career goal on Aitken's first career assist.

Sloppy play by the Cavaliers led to a 5-1 Drexel run to close out the second half, giving UVA a narrow 9-8 lead entering the intermission.

The Dragons crept back to one goal, 14-13, via a 5-1 run. Marshal King scored his second goal of the game with 11:31 left in the contest to finish off the Drexel sprint.

After the Drexel run, UVA had one more spurt in them. Aitken and D'Amario each scored two goals on a 4-1 UVA run to finish the game and secure the Cavalier victory.

Ten different Cavaliers scored goals as No. 6 Virginia (3-0) rolls to a 20-13 victory over the visiting Siena Saints (0-3) inside Klöckner Stadium.

Virginia started out hot, opening the game on a 9-3 run. Zed Williams started the scoring on a Ryan Conrad helper 1:02 into the game. Michael Kraus scored back-to-back goals to put UVA up 3-0 after only 2:59 expired on the game clock.
