## CAVALIERS WELCOME NIAGARA AND LA SALLE

- Virginia has a limited history with both of its weekend opponents.
- UVA is 2-0 all-time against Niagara and 1-0 versus La Salle.
- The Cavaliers played Niagara on March 13, 2007 (29-2 win) and March 2, 2011 (7-0 win) at Davenport Field.
- UVA's only prior game with La Salle came on Feb. 21, 2015, in Charleston, S.C., an 8-3 UVA win at Charleston Southern.
- Ernie Clement hit a home run to start that game and went 3-for-5, while Pavin Smith also homered.

## HOT BATS TO START THE SEASON

- Virginia has scored at least seven runs in each of its first eight games for the second time in program history (1897).
- UVA racked up 86 runs and 98 hits in its first eight games, scoring at least seven runs and 11 hits in each contest.
- UVA ranks second in the ACC with 10.75 runs per game this year.
- Seven of UVA's regular starters are batting over .300, highlighted by Robbie Coman (.467, sixth in ACC) and Adam Haseley (.438, 10th in ACC).

## DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Virginia already has hit 13 home runs, the most homers through eight games in the Brian O'Connor era.
- The Cavaliers did not hit their 13th homer last year until March 25 (23rd game).
- Adam Haseley has a team-high four long balls – each to the opposite field.

## RUNNING WILD

- Virginia stole eight bases in the Rutgers series, including six from Jake McCarthy. UVA is 13-for-14 in base thievery this year (third in ACC).
- McCarthy already has an ACC-best seven steals this year, more than any Cavalier had in the entire 2016 season (Ernie Clement led team with six).
- UVA stole 27 bases last year, its fewest during the Brian O'Connor era.

## THINGS TO KNOW

- UVA is one of two ACC teams (FSU) to walk more than it has struck out this season (30/22).
- UVA has struck out half as many times as any other ACC team (Georgia Tech second fewest - 44).
- Jake McCarthy leads the ACC and is fourth nationally with seven stolen bases.
- The top three in UVA's batting order are batting a combined .392 (Clement/McCarthy/Haseley).

### BULLPEN SOLID IN HOME GAMES

- Virginia's bullpen has done the job during the current homestand, allowing 11 hits and eight walks in 16 2/3 innings (3.24 ERA).
- The bullpen has limited opponents to a .186 batting average during the five-game stretch.
- Tommy Doyle has closed three of those games (five total this year) and has yet to allow a run.

### O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He ranks 10th in ACC history in wins and, in 825 games, is the second-fastest in league history to reach 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 604 career wins, O'Connor needs five victories to surpass former Wake Forest coach George Greer (1988-2004) for ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (244) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

### COMEBACK KIDS

- Virginia has come from behind on three occasions this year when it trailed in the seventh inning or later.
- UVA twice has rallied from large, late deficits.
- UVA came back from a 6-0, seventh-inning deficit on Feb. 19 against Kansas to win 9-6. It marked the Cavaliers' largest comeback since rallying from 6-0 down in the first inning on May 16, 2006, at Old Dominion.
- The Cavaliers rallied from a 6-2 deficit in the seventh inning against VMI, winning 9-7.

### CAVALIERS AT HOME AT DAVENPORT

- This marks the 129th season of Virginia Baseball, including the 16th at Davenport Field, which opened in 2002.
- Virginia is 381-95 (.800) at Davenport Field since 2004 under Brian O'Connor, including a 24-12 mark last season.
- UVA averaged 3,675 fans per game last year, including a program-record 3,638 per game for the regular season.
- The Cavaliers passed the 100,000 mark in attendance for the sixth time in seven years this season (120,082 total).

### TRIO OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named to various All-America teams in the preseason: Ernie Clement (2B), Adam Haseley (UTL) and Pavin Smith (1B).
- Haseley and Smith also were named to the 55-man Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- The Preseason All-America honors:
  - **Ernie Clement:** 1st team (D1Baseball), 2nd team (Baseball America)
  - **Adam Haseley:** 2nd team (Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball)
  - **Pavin Smith:** 1st Team (Baseball America, Perfect Game), 2nd Team (Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball)

### VETERAN LINEUP RETURNS

- Virginia returns seven position starters from its 2016 team, including 2015 starter Robbie Coman, who missed most of 2016 with an injury.
- UVA's right side of the infield is one of the best in the nation, with the All-ACC duo of Pavin Smith (1B, 135 starts) and Ernie Clement (2B, 129 starts).
- UVA returns outfield starters Adam Haseley (CF, 136 starts) and Cam Simmons (RF), and also regains the services of Jake McCarthy, who missed the final 53 games last year with a toe injury.
- Coman anchors the catching staff, while versatile infielder Justin Novak (72 starts) also is back.

### QUESTION MARKS, BUT TALENT FOR PITCHERS

- Virginia's starting pitching is largely unproven entering 2017, but the coaching staff is enthusiastic about the potential.
- Adam Haseley (20 career starts) is the lone rotation holdover from the end of the 2016 season. He was second in the ACC as a 1.73 ERA last year.
- Daniel Lynch started nine games last year, including six on weekends, primarily in the first half of the year.

- The bullpen is anchored by junior Tommy Doyle at closer and Alec Bettinger — each of whom spent time in the 2016 weekend rotation.
- Veterans Bennett Sousa, Jack Roberts, Tyler Shambora and Chesdin Harrington also are back for the bullpen.

### BACK FROM INJURIES

- Virginia gets five players back this year from injuries suffered over the past two seasons.
- Pitchers Derek Casey, Evan Sperling and Riley Wilson are back and healthy, as are catcher Robbie Coman and outfielder Jake McCarthy.
- Sperling suffered an arm injury in his final start as a senior in high school and missed all of his freshman season at Virginia.
- Casey was injured while pitching on April 21, 2015, and sat out all of the 2016 season.
- Wilson battled shoulder problems over his first two seasons at UVA, but has returned to full strength.
- McCarthy (toe) and Coman (arm) each were injured in the first two weeks of the 2016 season.

### IN THE POLLS

- Virginia is ranked as high as No. 8 in the latest polls (Collegiate Baseball) and is No. 12 in the Baseball America poll this week.
- UVA has 15 games scheduled against teams ranked in the Baseball America poll: Florida State (2), Louisville (6), North Carolina (13), Clemson (15) and Georgia Tech (17).
- The Cavaliers do not play NC State (10) in league play this year.

### VETERAN COMAN BACK FOR FIFTH YEAR

- UVA benefits from the return of graduate student Robbie Coman, who suffered a season-ending arm injury on Feb. 28, 2016, just seven games into the season.
- He has been a part of 193 wins during his five years, including three NCAA Super Regionals, two CWS and the 2015 NCAA Championship.
- Coman earned his bachelor's degree in economics (with a history minor) last spring and is on track to earn a master's in higher education athletic administration in May.

### O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 604-223-2 (.729) in his 14th season as UVA's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history late last season.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's first 13 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

### LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 604 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 13 seasons.

### RECORDS WATCH

- Currently with 64 games and 10 saves, RHP Alec Bettinger needs nine appearances and two saves to reach the top 10 in UVA history.
- Adam Haseley is tied for 10th in program history with nine triples and will move into ninth with his next triple.
- Ernie Clement (7 triples) needs two triples to crack the top 10 at UVA.
- Pavin Smith (116 RBI) needs 30 RBI to reach the top 10 at UVA.

### UVA SECOND NATIONALLY IN ERA SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the second best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 12 seasons with a 3.17 team ERA since 2005.
- UVA finished second nationally in ERA (2.23) in 2014 and has ranked among the NCAA top 20 in nine of the 13 years under the current coaching staff.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2011 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

### DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia has posted the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- UVA has accrued a .973 fielding percentage over the last 13 seasons.
- UVA had a .970 fielding percentage in 2016.

### CAVALIERS TOP ACC IN BATTING SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years with a combined .303 average.
- The Cavaliers led the conference in batting in 2009, 2010 and 2013 and were second in 2011, 2012 and 2014.
- UVA was third in the ACC in batting last year at .304.

### WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia lost several key players off of its 2016 team.
- Two-time All-America catcher Matt Thaiss (153 career starts) was a first-round draft pick (16th overall) of the L.A. Angels after batting a team-high .375 in 2016.
- Three-year starting shortstop Daniel Pinero (194 starts) was drafted in the ninth round by the Tigers.
- UVA's Friday starter, Connor Jones, was selected in the second round by St. Louis, and finished fourth in career wins (22) and eighth in innings (268.2) at UVA.
- Left-handed pitchers Kevin Doherty and David Rosenberger each graduated after playing key roles out of the bullpen last year.

### ACC NETWORK EXTRA PROVIDES EXPANDED COVERAGE

- Each of Virginia's 55 games in 2017 will be broadcast either on television, online or radio.
- Thirty-seven UVA games, including 25 home contests, will be broadcast online via ACC Network Extra, a dedicated digital channel for ACC sports which is available to authenticated subscribers of ESPN3 through WatchESPN and the ESPN app.
- The ACC Network Extra coverage marks the initial phase of the full ACC Network announced July 21 by ESPN and the Atlantic Coast Conference.

### PINERO NAMED TO CANADA'S ROSTER FOR WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC

- Former Cavalier shortstop Daniel Pinero has been named to Canada's roster for the upcoming World Baseball Classic.
- Pinero is the first Virginia alum to play in the WBC, which began in 2006 and is in its fourth installment this year.
- Canada joins Colombia, Dominican Republic and United States in Pool C, which will be played at Marlins Park in Miami from March 9-13.

### CHANGES COMING AT DAVENPORT

- Davenport Field is scheduled to undergo a \$12-18 million expansion following the 2017 season, with renovations slated to be complete in time for the start of the 2018 campaign.
- Among the planned renovations to improve the game-day experience:
  - A new grand entry in right field.
  - An expanded concourse down the right-field line that extends around the right-field pole toward right centerfield.
  - A field-level club area and seating for approximately 140 fans.
  - Chairback seats along the first baseline.
  - Moving the UVA bullpen to left field to make room for chairback seats along the third baseline.
  - New concessions, merchandise, and restroom facilities.
  - Areas for player training and development, including an indoor pitching development center.
  - New offices for the baseball coaches.
