FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- UVA and Virginia Tech meet for the 94th time in series history. The only school UVA has faced more times is North Carolina (117 games).
- With 357 career tackles, Steve Greer is No. 1 among active ACC players, is No. 10 among active FBS players and No. 8 all-time at UVA. On the season Greer is tied for No. 2 in the ACC with 103 tackles.
- La'Roy Reynolds is No. 8 among ACC players with 75 tackles despite missing 2.5 games with an injury early in the season.
- With four career 300-yd passing games, QB Michael Rocco trails only Matt Schaub (8) and Aaron Brooks (6) for most in UVA history.
- Since the bye week, UVA has amassed 1,278 total yards over last three games for a 426.0 yards per game average. UVA also has scored 11 offensive TDs.

VIRGINIA AND VIRGINIA TECH CLASH FOR THE COMMONWEALTH CUP SATURDAY

• Virginia concludes its 2012 season with a trip to Blacksburg for a meeting with inter-state rival, Virginia Tech, Saturday at noon. The game will be televised live on ESPNU.

VIRGINIA-VIRGINIA TECH RIVALRY

- Virginia Tech leads the all-time series 51-37-5 and has won 12 of the last 13 meetings, including eight-straight. Tech has also taken 15 of the teams' last 19 meetings.
- The series began in 1895 with UVA gaining a 38-0 win in Charlottesville.
- UVA's most recent victory in the series was a 35-21 win at home in 2003.
- The Hokies (93 games) are UVA's second-most frequent opponent - UVA has played North Carolina 117 times.

COMMONWEALTH CUP UP FOR GRABS

- The winner of this game claims the Commonwealth Cup for the next year.
- After holding the trophy following wins in 1997 and 1998, the Cavaliers have taken it just once since then (2003) with the Hokies winning 12 of the last 13 meetings.
- The award was started for the 1996 game between the two state foes, with the Hokies receiving the trophy for the first time with a 26-9 win.
- The Cup is made of marble and cherry wood, stands four feet high and weighs more than 100 pounds.
- The scores of all 93 games in the rivalry are engraved on the sides of the trophy.

COACHES FAMILIAR WITH RIVALRY

- Three UVA coaches are veterans of the Virginia-Virginia Tech rivalry.
- Shawn Moore and Anthony Poindexter are Virginia alums.
- Moore quarterbacked the Cavaliers in wins over the Hokies in 1988 and 1989 and a loss in 1990.
- Poindexter was 2-2 during his tenure at defensive back from 1995-98, with wins over Tech in 1997 and 1998, although he was injured for the 36-32 victory in 1998 in Blacksburg.
- Head coach Mike London was a UVA assistant coach during the 2001-04 and 2006-07 seasons, with the Cavaliers going 1-5 during that span, including a victory in 2003. He is 0-2 as a head coach against Virginia Tech.
- In addition, graduate assistant Marques Hagans played for the Commonwealth Cup as Cavalier player. UVA Graduate assistant Jonathan Lewis played in the rivalry on the other side of the ball, for Virginia Tech. Lewis, a defensive tackle, played in four Commonwealth Cup games for the Hokies (2002-05).
- Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was a varsity defensive back for the Hokies from 1966-68. He made his first start in Tech's 1966 game against Virginia, a 24-7 Hokies' victory.

CITY OF LYNCHBURG TURNS OUT FBS QBs

- UVA's Michael Rocco hails from Lynchburg, Va., as does Virginia Tech's starting QB Logan Thomas.
- Rocco played for his father Frank at Liberty Christian Academy and Thomas starred at Brookville HS.

32 IS VIRGINIA'S MAGIC NUMBER

- Scoring plenty of points against the Hokies means good things for the Cavaliers.
- Virginia has scored at least 32 points in each of its last seven series wins dating back to 1989.

VIRGINIA IN SEASON-ENDERS

- This game is the Cavaliers' final contest of the 2012 season.
- UVA is 44-74-4 all-time in regular-season finales and has lost its last eight.
- This is the seventh straight year and the 18th time in the last 22 seasons Virginia has closed the regular season against the Hokies.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

ACC INJURY GUIDELINES

On each Monday during the season, ACC schools will announce any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

LAST MEETING: 2011 (VT 38 – @UVA 0)

- The first meeting when both schools were ranked in the AP Top-25 since 2007 belonged to the Hokies, becoming the first team to shutout UVA since the 2006 VT squad did, 17-0, at Lane Stadium.
- The Hokies held a 14-0 halftime lead and a 17-point fourth quarter sealed the victory.
- Michael Rocco was 16-of-27 for 211 yards and two INTs, while the rushing game never got going. UVA rushed for 30 net yards, led by Kevin Parks' 17 yards.

LONDON HAS FACED THREE FORMER COLLEAGUES

- UVA head coach Mike London has faced three head coaches this season (Danny Rocco of Richmond, Tom O'Brien of NC State and Al Golden of Miami) that he has formerly worked with.
- Richmond's Rocco and Miami's Golden were assistant coaches together at UVA with London.
- London worked with O'Brien at Boston College.

FBS COACHES WITH SONS PLAYING FOR SAME SCHOOL

- TE's coach Shawn Moore and DE Mike Moore make UVA one of 25 FBS programs to have a head coach or assistant coach that has a son(s) that also play for the same program.
- Florida State is the only other program in the ACC as offensive line coach Rick Trickett is the father of backup QB Clint Trickett.
- Below is the entire list of FBS coaches and their sons playing for the same school.

CITY OF LYNCHBURG TURNS OUT FBS QBs

- UVA's Michael Rocco hails from Lynchburg, Va., as does Virginia Tech's starting QB Logan Thomas.
- Rocco played for his father Frank at Liberty Christian Academy and Thomas starred at Brookville HS.
- No other city in the nation can boast two FBS starting QBs from Week 1 from a smaller populated city.
- Lynchburg has a population of 75,568.
- Of the 124 FBS schools, only Austin, Texas, Corona, Calif., Indianapolis, Ind., Pittsburgh, Pa., Tallahassee, Fla., Tampa, Fla., and Miami, Fla., can join Lynchburg, Va., with multiple native sons starting at QB to kickoff the 2012 season.
- Austin (pop. 812,025) has Garrett Gilbert (SMU) and Tanner Price (Wake Forest).
- Corona (pop. 152,374/part of 2.2 million in Riverside County) has Matt Scott (Arizona) and Taylor Martinez (Nebraska).
- Indianapolis (pop. 829,718) has Tre Roberson (Indiana) and MarQueis Gray (Minnesota).
- Pittsburgh (pop. 2.4 million) has Tino Sunseri (Pitt) and Perry Hills (Maryland).
- Tallahassee (pop. 182,965) has Austin Dantin (Toledo) and B.J. Daniels (South Florida).
- Tampa (pop. 4.2 million) has Aaron Murray (Georgia) and Robert Marve (Purdue).
- Miami (pop. 2.5 million) has Geno Smith (West Virginia) Tedd Bridgewater (Louisville) and Stephen Morris (Miami).

UVA TEAM STRUGGLES

- After spending most of the season No. 123 or 124 in the nation in turnover margin, UVA was plus four at NC State, creating five turnovers. Heading into the game the Cavaliers had only forced four turnovers.
- UVA is now No. 111 in the nation in turnover margin with a -13 margin.
- Before the NC State game no FBS team had caused fewer turnovers than UVA - now South Florida (9), New Mexico State (9) and UConn (10) are the schools that have forced fewer turnovers than UVA.
- The turnover margin is one aspect that has allowed UVA's opponents to start 33 drives, or 21.7 percent of overall opponent drives, inside UVA territory - while only 13 of UVA's drives, or 8.7 percent of overall drives, have started in opponent territory.
- UVA has started 38 drives, or 25.5 percent of overall drives, inside its own 20.
- UVA's average starting field position is its own 28, while its opponent's average is its own 35.

YOUNG DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

- If you take out the 594 total yards UVA's defense gave up to the triple-option of Georgia Tech, it no longer would be No. 34 in the nation in total defense.
- In UVA's other 10 games, the defense has yielded a combined 3,343 yards, or 334.3 yards per game. UVA's defensive average would rank No. 23 nationally and No. 3 in the ACC this week if the Georgia Tech game was not included.
- If you take out the 461 rushing yards Georgia Tech collected against UVA, the Cavaliers have yielded only 1,104 opponent rushing yards over the other 10 games. That comes out to 110.4 rushing yards per game and 3.36 yards per rush.
- UVA has also slowed down some of the nation's top passers. TCU's Casey Pachall (No. 4 when suspended) and Louisiana Tech's Colby Cameron (No. 20) rank in the Top 20 nationally in passing efficiency - both performed below their season average in efficiency when facing the Cavaliers.

NINE TRUE FRESHMEN DEBUT IN OPENER

- Nine true freshmen made their college debut against Richmond on Sept. 1.
- Demeitre Brim (OLB), Maurice Canady (CB) Trent Corney (LB), Anthony Cooper (DB), Adrian Gamble (WR), Eli Harold (DE), Kwontie Moore (LB), Mike Moore (DE), Canaan Severin (WR).
- Pablo Alvarez (FS), Ross Burbank (C), David Dean (DT), Jeremy Dollin (TE), Ian Frye (KO), Jon Goss (OG), Nick Koutris (OT), Darius Lee (SS), Sammy MacFarlane (FB), John Pond (OG), Mason Thomas (S), Jay Whitmire (OT) and Alec Vozenilek (P) also all made collegiate debuts against Richmond.
- A total of 22 total first-time players made their debut against Richmond.
- In all 16 freshmen, including true and redshirt, made their debut against Richmond.
- No new true freshmen have made a debut since the Richmond game.

UVA MAINTAINS HIGH RANKINGS IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT

- The University of Virginia retained its spot among the nation's elite institutions of higher education in the 2013 U.S. News & Report college rankings.
- In tact is UVA's string of more than 20 consecutive years in the top 25 listing of best national universities and its rank as the second-best public university, a spot now held for nine straight years.
- UVA lands this year in a three-way tie for No. 24 among all universities, public and private. It shares the position with the University of California, Los Angeles, and the University of Southern California.

CANADIANS ON UVA'S ROSTER

- UVA is tied for second behind Eastern Michigan for the most Canadian natives in the nation on its current roster.
- UVA has three (Trent Corney, Ryan Doull and Brent Urban).
- Buffalo, UConn, Iowa and Rice are tied for second with UVA.
- Boston College, Boise State, Northern Illinois, UNLV and Wyoming have two.
- There are 16 schools with at least one Canadian.
- Former UVA offensive guard Austin Pasztor hailed from Langton, Ontario and was a second team AP All-American last season and was part of the 2012 training camp with the Minnesota Vikings.

LONDON'S SECOND SEASON BY THE NUMBERS

- According to a study by Phil Steele's College Football Publications, UVA head coach Mike London in year two was ahead of the numbers of most second-year head coaches.
- According to research done on head coaches hired from 1990-2011, UVA's eight wins last season put Mike London 2.25 victories ahead of the average of 5.75 wins amongst all second-year coaches over the last 22 seasons.
- Since 1990 there have been 368 head coaches that have experienced a second season of their tenure, the combined record over that span is 2119-2268, good for a .483 winning percentage.
- In Year Two at UVA Mike London went 8-5, good for a .615 winning percentage.

LONDON SERVES AS VOTER ON USA TODAY COACHES' POLL

- For the third-consecutive season, Mike London will serve as a voter on the USA Today Coaches' Poll.
- Fifty-nine coaches from FBS institutions across the nation participate in the poll.

FIVE FORMER UVA ASSISTANTS NOW HEAD COACHES

- Five current ACC head coaches have previously been assistant coaches at Virginia. Boston College's Frank Spaziani, NC State's Tom O'Brien, Miami's Al Golden, Wake Forest's Jim Grobe (graduate assistant) and of course UVA's Mike London.

HILL, TERRELL NAMED SPRING'S MOST IMPROVED

- Prior to the team's annual spring game, head coach Mike London announced the recipients of the Rock Weir Awards representing the most improved players during spring drills.
- Senior DT Will Hill was the most improved player on defense, while sophomore WR Dominique Terrell was tabbed the offense's most improved player.

PENN STATE WIN GARNERS COMPARISONS

- The Virginia win over Penn State had some comparisons with notable Cavalier victories last season.
- The win, which pushed Mike London's career record versus the Big Ten to 2-0, was similar to his first win over the conference at Indiana last season.
- Playing Penn State on the same weekend they played Indiana a year ago - each game's outcome was determined on the game's final play. In 2011 at IU, it was a 23-yard field goal made by UVA's Robert Randolph as time expired. In the Penn Sate game it was the 42-yard missed field goal by Sam Ficken.
- The miss by Penn State's Ficken was from the same distance (42-yards) that Florida State's Dustin Hopkins miss was that sealed the 2011 win for the Cavaliers, making UVA the first team in college football history to win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season.
- Both kicks sailed wide left.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY FOR UVa

- For the third season in a row, the UVa coaching staff under head coach Mike London has remained intact.
- UVa is one of 16 schools in the nation entering 2012 with the same nine assistants that started the 2011 season.
- Florida State, Miami and Virginia Tech join UVa among ACC schools on the list of 16.
- BYU, Colorado, Georgia, Louisiana Tech, UL-Lafayette, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Mississippi State, Northwestern, Oregon, San Diego State and Texas also made the list.
- Virginia joins Florida State and Louisiana Tech as schools that have staffs that have remained intact for two years in a row, while the only school on the list of 16 with a longer tenure is Oregon (three years).

WINNING THE TIME OF POSSESSION BATTLE

- Virginia has won the time of possession battle 22 times in Mike London's time as head coach.
- London-led teams at UVa are 12-10 when winning the possession battle.

NOTING ROCCO AFTER THE MIAMI GAME

- Michael Rocco threw for 300 yards against Miami for his fourth career game of 300 yards passing or more, placing him No. 3 all-time at UVa. Matt Schaub (8) and Aaron Brooks (6) are the only names ahead of Rocco in the record book.
- Rocco's game was only the 38th time a UVa QB has passed for 300 yards or more in program history.
- In two career games against the Hurricanes, Rocco is 40-of-57 (70.2 percent) for 526 yards and six TDs (zero INTs).
- Rocco completed 18 passes in a row at one point, breaking Matt Blundin's program record for consecutive completions in a game. Blundin completed 14 in a row against Duke in 1991. Rocco also passed Shawn Moore for most consecutive completions for a career. Moore completed 15 in a row during a two-game span in 1989.

TWO-HEADED QB TRAIN

- Michael Rocco (1,740) and Phillip Sims (1,253) both have thrown for over 1,000 yards this season.
- The last time UVa had two QBs throw for over 1,000 yards in the same season was 2001 when the Matt Schaub (1,524) and Bryson Spinner (1,334) tandem did so.

RUSHING GAME GETTING BETTER

- UVa took a small step back, rushing for only 94 yards against Miami on Nov. 10 - but bounced back with 145 rushing yards against North Carolina on Nov. 15.
- UVa only averaged 104.67 rushing yards a game through the first three games of the season, but since rushing for 164 yards at TCU, the Cavaliers have averaged 149.8 yards a game.
- UVa has rushed for 1,512 yards and 10 TDs and is rushing for 3.8 yards per carry.
- Prior to the Miami game, Virginia rushed for 248 yards at NC State on Nov. 3, the most by a UVa team since rushing for 274 against Georgia Tech in 2011.
- It was the first time UVa rushed for over 200 yards in a game since the 2011 Maryland contest in College Park (220).
- Against the Wolfpack, Kevin Parks rushed 25 times for 115 yards and a TD. It was the second time this season and third time in his career that he topped 100 yards.
- Parks rushed for a career-high 129 yards against Maryland on Oct. 13.
- After rushing for 18 TDs in 2011, UVa only has 10 rushing TDs in 2012 and went 16 quarters without rushing for a TD until Kevin Parks scored on UVa's opening drive of the Duke game.
- After rushing for two TDs in the first quarter of the Duke game, UVa went 11 quarters without rushing for a TD until Phillip Sims did so on the opening drive of the NC State game.
- Parks and Sims each rushed for TDs against Miami - the first time in 2012 UVa rushed for TDs in back-to-back games.

SWANSON TALLEST FB IN THE NATION

- UVa's starting fullback Zachary Swanson stands at 6-6 and is the tallest fullback in the nation.
- Three fullbacks closest in height all measure out at 6-4 and have all started games for their schools this season:
 - Braden Wilson (Kansas State)
 - Jake Sinkovec (Boston College)

PASSING GAME PRODUCES BIG PLAYS

- UVa has 18 pass plays in 2012 that have gone for 30 yards or more - six of those came in the Louisiana Tech game when the Cavaliers set a team record for most passing yards in a game with 480.
- Darius Jennings had two of the six, one going for 50 yards and the second going for 47 yards.
- Perry Jones was on the passing and receiving end of two of the six plays - throwing a 36-yard TD pass to Tim Smith and receiving a 34-yard pass from Phillip Sims.
- UVa's longest pass reception to date also came in the game - a 73-yard TD reception on a Michael Rocco to Khalek Shepherd connection.
- UVa has had eight passes for 30 or more yards since the Louisiana Tech game.

TIGHT ENDS CONTINUE TO PRODUCE

- Virginia has been strong at tight end over the last decade, and that continues with Colter Phillips, Paul Freedman, Jeremiah Mathis and Jake McGee back for 2012 (Mathis moved to tight end during the 2010 season).
- Phillips, Freedman and Mathis combined for 36 receptions for 264 yards and five TDs in 2010 and 20 receptions for 152 yards and two TDs in 2011.
- McGee turned the trio into a quartet in 2012 with his first collegiate receptions.
- UVa TEs have caught 575 passes for 6,206 yards and 78 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span.

UVA PASSING GAME GETS VERTICAL IN 2012

- UVA is creating more dynamic plays in the vertical passing game in 2012 with the wide receivers and tight ends compared to the 2011 season.
- So far in 2012, UVA has 37 pass plays that have gone to wide receivers or tight ends for 20 yards or more – an average of 3.4 per game.
- Compare that number to 2011 when the entire season saw 35 passes of 20 yards or more to wide receivers or tight ends for a rate of 2.69 per game.

PARKS REACHES 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

- With 74 rushing yards at Duke, Kevin Parks became the 41st player in program history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Parks now has 1,422 career rushing yards and currently ranks No. 28 all-time at UVA in career rushing.
- With 14 career rushing TDs, Parks ranks tied for No. 20 at UVA in career rushing touchdowns.
- Gerry Furst ('50-'52) and Gary Helman ('69-'71) share the spot with Parks.

OSCAR SMITH HS TEAMMATES SHARE MILESTONE

- UVA's Perry Jones and Tim Smith, teammates at Oscar Smith High School, became the 31st and 32nd players in UVA history to collect 1,000 career receiving yards when they each reached the milestone against Wake Forest.
- Phillip Sims, the Oscar Smith QB when Jones and Smith were seniors and won the 2008 state title, was the UVA QB that made the milestone connection against Wake Forest.

ABOUSHI GRADING OUT HIGH

- Oday Aboushi has graded out high on the offensive line during the first 11 games.
- For the season, Aboushi has graded out over 90 percent each game and averaged 10-plus knockdown blocks a game.
- Aboushi graded out at 97 percent versus Richmond with seven knockdown blocks.
- Aboushi graded out at 94 percent versus Penn State with 12 knockdown blocks.
- For his effort against Penn State, Aboushi was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week.

- The other three players are Alvin Pearman (2,394 rush, 1,396 rec), Terry Kirby (3,348 rush, 1,022 rec) and Frank Quayle (2,695 rush, 1,145 rec).
- Only two other active FBS player are over 1,000 career yards in both rushing and receiving: Houston's Charles Sims (2,370 rushing/1,707 receiving) and Duke's Desmond Scott (1,159 rushing/1,132 receiving), who joined the club on Oct. 27.
- Jones with 126 career receptions sits No. 6 all-time at UVA in career receptions.

JONES HITS 100 IN RUSH/REC IN A GAME

- Perry Jones is one of three players in FBS football this season to have at least one game of 100 yards rushing and one game of 100 yards receiving.
- Jones had 100 receiving yards against La Tech and rushed for 100 yards at Duke.
- Northwestern's Kain Colter rushed for 161 yards and had 131 receiving yards against Indiana.
- Utah State's Kerwynn Williams had 147 receiving yards and 113 rushing yards against UNLV.

... AND JONES AS A PASSER

- Jones' 37-yard TD pass at Miami (Oct. 27, 2011) to Tim Smith was the first pass attempt, completion and TD toss of his career.
- Jones and Smith hooked up again against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 29) on an identical play - going for a 36-yard score in the first quarter.
- Jones for his career is 2-for-5 for 73 passing yards and two career TD passes - raking up a career 254.6 passing efficiency mark.
- The duo also had the same Jones to Smith hookup when they were teammates at Oscar Smith HS.
- Both Jones to Smith connections are the lone scoring "option play" for UVA since Vic Hall's 5-yard pass to Joe Torchia at Clemson in 2009.
- In 2011 Jones became the first Cavalier since Vic Hall in 2009 to rush for a TD, pass for a TD and catch a reception for a TD in the same season.

JONES ONE OF FEW RBs IN THE NATION

- With 126 career receptions, Perry Jones is No. 2 in the nation among active running backs in career catches and No. 1 among BCS running backs.
- Jones leads all active ACC running backs with his 126 career catches, with NC State's James Washington (82) the closest of all league backs.

- Jones was one of only two players (only BCS player) in the nation last season to rush for at least 900 yards and notch at least 500 yards receiving, joining him was New Mexico State's Kenny Turner (1074 rush, 514 rec).

SPREADING THE RECEIVING WEALTH

- Virginia QBs have completed passes to 16 different receivers already in 2012.
- That number surpasses the 14 different receivers that caught passes in all of 2012.
- The 2010 season saw UVA connect on passes to 19 different receivers, the most since the 1959 season when that squad also found 19 different receivers during the season.
- 10 different receivers have caught TD passes in 2012 after nine did so in 2011.
- During Mike London's first season in 2010 there were 10 different receivers who caught TD passes.
- Before London came in 2010, UVA hadn't had more than eight since 2003 when it had 10.

PRO STYLE OFFENSE PAYS DIVIDENDS

- UVa has amassed more than 400 yards of total offense in 18-of-36 games since offensive coordinator Bill Lazor brought his pro-style attack to Charlottesville. The Georgia Tech (297) and Penn State games this year (295 yards), the Oct. 22, 2011 game vs. NC State (249 yards) and UVa's 2011 (241 yards) and 2010 (291 yards) regular-season finales against Virginia Tech are the only games during the Mike London tenure where the Cavaliers failed to amass at least 300 yards of total offense.
- The Penn State game this year is the only time UVa has failed to reach 300 yards of total offense and won the game.
- Five times since 2005 UVa has amassed 500 yards of total offense. They did so against La Tech (625) on Sept. 29, Richmond (545) in the season-opening win, at Maryland (527) in 2011, Duke (643) in 2010 and Indiana (536) in 2009.

EIGHTS ARE WILD FOR ROCCO

- Michael Rocco ranks No. 8 all-time at UVa in various categories.
- Rocco is No. 8 in career passing yards (4,554), total offense (4,668), touchdown passes (26) and attempts (628).

- Since playing TCU and Duke, their season average for total yards has dipped lower than the total number of yards they gained against UVa.
- UVa held the nation's leader in total offense, La Tech, to only 385 total yards. The game is the only time all season La Tech has not reached 400 yards of total offense and one of two times they haven't reached 500 yards of total offense.
- Here is how UVa has done this season versus its opponents season average of total yards:

UVA RANKS IN TOP 20 ON THREE & OUTS

- UVA ranks No. 16 in the nation as a defense forcing three and outs, posting a 4.45 three and out average per game.
- UVA's opponents have gone three and out 49 times over 11 games; 32.9 percent of UVA's opponents drives have ended in a three and out.
- UVA is No. 3 in the ACC as Florida State leads the nation at 49.7 percent of drives ending in a three and out. NC State (4.91 per game) is tied for No. 9 and Clemson (4.18 per game) is No. 20.
- UVA's week four opponent TCU is No. 2 this week with a 42.0 percent rate or 6.0 per game. UVA only had four drives end at TCU as a three and out, two drives fewer than the Horned Frogs' average.

DEFENSE CLAMPING DOWN

- Before giving up 420 total yards to Miami and 446 to UNC, the Virginia defense over a three-game span against Maryland, Wake Forest and NC State had been forcing its opponents to only 3.98 plays per drive. Miami averaged 4.92 plays per drive.
- Over that three-game span opponents were 5-of-41 on third down opportunities, which comes out to a 12.2 percent success rate. Miami was 4-of-10.
- UVA opponents amassed only 664 total yards over the three-game span for an average of 221.3 yards per game. That is an average of 40.7 rushing yards per game and 180.7 passing yards per game.

UVA HAS NO SENIORS IN SECONDARY

- UVA has zero seniors in its secondary after having three senior starters a year ago.
- Only three other schools (Florida State, LSU and North Texas) in the nation also lack a senior in their secondary.

NO UPPERCLASSMEN AT CORNERBACK

- UVA has zero upperclassmen on its roster at the cornerback position.
- On UVA's roster there are four freshmen and two sophomores listed as cornerbacks.
- UVA is one of 13 schools in the nation that has zero upperclassmen at a specific position on its roster.
- North Texas lacks upperclassmen at cornerbacks and safeties.
- Boston College, Navy and North Texas join UVA at the cornerback position.
- Six of those schools (Auburn, Indiana, Marshall, Nevada, Oregon and Texas A&M) are at the QB position.
- Rounding out the list are Illinois (RBs), Idaho (TEs) and Tulsa (TEs).

NICHOLSON SENIOR STATESMAN AS SO. AT CB

- In 2011 Demetrius Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook did so in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.
- He started all 13 of the Cavaliers' 2011 contests and earned freshmen All-America honors from two different publications.
- Now Nicholson (11 starts in '12) is the veteran in experience in a UVA secondary that features four sophomore starters: Harris (FS), Hoskey (CB) and Phelps (SS). Canady (CB), a true Fr. has two starts.

DYNAMIC DUO OF GREER AND REYNOLDS

- The last three seasons the linebacker duo of Steve Greer and LaRoy Reynolds has been solid, accumulating 494 tackles between the two since the start of the 2010 season. Below is a list that shows where they rank among the top active tackling duos in the ACC since the start of 2010:

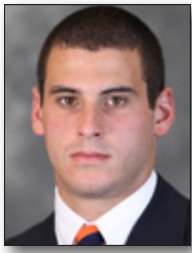

- UVA QB Michael Rocco and WR Dominique Terrell share a unique bond as both from 2006-08 could be spotted at Liberty football games watching their older brothers play together for the Flames. Zach Terrell and Chris Rocco were teammates for three years together in Lynchburg where current UVA offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator.
- UVA WR Tim Smith is cousins with MLB stars B.J. and Justin Upton. Smith's father, Timothy Smith, Sr., is first cousins with B.J. and Justin's father, Manny Upton.
- Ausar Walcott has a unique story behind the meaning of his name first name. His mother, Pamela Robinson, named him Ausar, which is a derivative of Osiris, the Egyptian god of the afterlife. Osiris is classically depicted with two large ostrich feathers at either side, ironic since Ausar has stated over his life people have told him it looks like he runs like an ostrich.

- With a 312 passing game vs. Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Bowl and a 311 passing game vs. Richmond, Rocco became the first UVa QB to pass for 300 yards in back-to-back games since Jameel Sewell in 2009 - at Southern Miss (312) and vs. Indiana (308).

ROCCO GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLUTCH

- Michael Rocco led his fourth career 4th quarter comeback for a UVa win, leading the Cavaliers to a 41-40 win over Miami on Nov. 10.
- Rocco has 11 career wins as the starting QB at UVa - four of which he led drives late in the fourth quarter for the win.
- Rocco was 10-of-15 for 79 yards on UVa's 16-play, 87-yard drive, capped by a 10-yard pass to Jake McGee, the second time this season the tandem connected for a game-winning score.
- Rocco was pinpoint on UVa's final offensive drive against Penn State, throwing what proved to be the game-winning TD pass in the process.
- Rocco was 6-of-6 passing for 97 yards and had the one TD pass to Jake McGee during the drive against PSU. He was 4-of-4 on the drive when in a third down situation.
- The other games: **at Indiana** (Sept. 10, 2011) when Rocco orchestrated a 15-play, 77-yard drive that tied the contest with 1:36 left in the game after Rocco found Paul Freedman on the two-point conversion. **At Florida State** (Nov. 19, 2011) when Rocco started the game-winning drive with 1:53 left on the clock and he marched the Cavaliers down the field on a five-play, 75-yard five in 47 seconds, culminating with a Kevin Parks TD run.

ROCCO EFFICIENT ON 3RD DOWN

- Michael Rocco, as the starting quarterback, has completed 61.5 percent (96-of-156) of his third down passes during the 2011 and 2012 seasons.
- Rocco is also completing 62.2 percent (69-of-111) of his third down and long opportunities through his 20 career starts.
- His third down numbers are relatively consistent to his overall passing percentage of 61.9 percent (350-of-565) through 20 career starts.
- Third down and long represents any situation of seven yards or longer needed to reach a first down.

THE MCGEE AND ROCCO CONNECTION

- UVa QB Michael Rocco and TE Jake McGee have a connection that goes back before both enrolled at UVa back in 2010, both as QBs.
- McGee led his high school, Collegiate School in Richmond to the 2008 & 2009 VIS Division I state titles, defeating Michael Rocco's Liberty Christian Academy squad in the state title game in 2009. McGee tallied seven TDs in the game, four passing and three rushing.
- McGee later got the best of Rocco in the boys' basketball state quarterfinal round.
- McGee asked the UVa coaching staff to move from QB to TE after two practices in fall camp of 2010.

PHILLIP SIMS HAS SECOND BEST UVA QB DEBUT

- UVa head coach Mike London announced during the ACC weekly teleconference on Oct. 3 that Phillip Sims would start against Duke on Oct. 6.
- Sims became only the third different QB to start a game during the Mike London era.
- Of London's 36 games at UVa, 12 have been started by Marc Verica, 20 by Michael Rocco and four by Sims.
- Sims is only the sixth different UVa QB to start a game since the start of the 2007 season. Included in that group was two games started by Vic Hall and two by Peter Lalich. The other 63 games over the span of six seasons have been started by Jameel Sewell (23), Marc Verica (22) and Michael Rocco (18).

NOTING VIRGINIA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

NOTING THE LAST QB START FOR PHILLIP SIMS PRIOR TO 2012

- Phillip Sims' start at Duke was his first start since Dec. 5, 2009 when at Oscar Smith High School.
- Sims is former Oscar Smith HS teammates with current Cavalier starters Perry Jones and Tim Smith. Smith missed the Duke game with an injury - Until the Wake Forest game - the last time all three started in a game together was Dec. 6, 2008 at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va., that the trio took the field together as starters.
- In that game Sims threw for 334 yards and six touchdowns, while Smith had six receptions for 224 yards and four TDs as Oscar Smith rung up its first state championship in any sport since the school opened in 1954, defeating Osbourn, 54-24, in the Group AAA Division 6 state championship.
- Perry Jones rushed 23 times for 162 yards and two TDs in the championship game.

- Former UVA greats D'Brickshaw Ferguson, Matt Schaub and Heath Miller had their jerseys retired and were honored with plaques on Legends Walk in the north end of Scott Stadium this season.
- Ferguson (No. 66), a current member of the New York Jets, finished his career as one of the most decorated offensive linemen in school history. He was named a first-team All-American as a senior in 2005 and was an All-ACC pick as both a junior and senior.
- Schaub (No. 7) was named ACC Offensive and Player of the Year in 2002. The former Cavalier signal caller finished his career with 22 school records, including the marks for career yards passing, touchdown passes, completions, attempts, completion percentage, 300-yard games, and 200-yard games. Schaub is currently the starting quarterback for the Houston Texans.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 428 games in the historic venue. UVa's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 244-172-12.

Mike London's plans to build the Virginia football program made remarkable progress during his second season in 2011.

The Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the

ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVA being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. A total of five Cavalier players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Virginia's 2011 squad ranked No. 4 in the ACC in total offense at 399.8 yards per game and rose to No. 3 in total defense at 351.7 yards allowed per game. The Cavaliers were one of just two ACC teams to be ranked in the top four of both of those key statistical categories.

In the spring of 2012 DE Cam Johnson was selected by the San Francisco 49ers to mark the 29th consecutive season a UVA player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media. He did not just wait for constituents to come to Virginia, he actively took the Cavalier program to the public.

London embraced a groundbreaking 18-episode television production entitled "The Building of a Program" that gave an all-access look at UVA football. He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He quickly defined the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVA the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years and student-athletes were heavily involved in community service projects and outreach programs.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. His first edition of Virginia football produced a 4-8 record but achieved a number of milestones that showed positive progress.

The Cavalier offense ranked third in the ACC at 404.8 yards per game after finishing last in 2009 at 269.6 yards per game. Senior Marc Verica led the league's fourth-best passing attack, finishing with 2,799 yards in the air, marking the third-best season mark in UVA history. Wide receivers Dontrelle Inman and Kris Burd became the first UVA wide receiving duo to each total a minimum of 40 receptions in a season. They also recorded over 600 yards receiving, also a program first for a wide receiver tandem.

Keith Payne led a much-improved rushing attack that featured two of the ACC's most productive runners. Payne led

the ACC with 14 rushing touchdowns, 16 total touchdowns and an 8.7 points per game scoring average.

Honorable mention All-American Chase Minnifield anchored the UVA defense in 2010, earning first-team All-ACC honors. Minnifield's two interceptions helped spark the Cavaliers' upset of No. 22 Miami, giving UVA its first win over a ranked team since 2008. Minnifield finished the year No. 2 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation with six INTs.

Offensive lineman Morgan Moses earned freshman All-America honors by helping the Cavaliers go 13 consecutive quarters without allowing a quarterback sack.

Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVA staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVA to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texans. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew

Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

- Seven Virginia players started for the first time in their career: Zachary Swanson, Cody Wallace, Sean Cascarano, Drequan Hoskey, Brandon Phelps, Anthony Harris and Brent Urban.
- Corey Mosley forced the second fumble of his career in the second quarter against the Tribe. Steve Greer recovered the fumble, marking his first-ever fumble recovery.
- Michael Rocco passed for 311 yards to make him the 16th player in UVa history to reach the 3,000-yard plateau for passing in a career.
- Rocco now has 3,125 career passing yards and sits No. 13 all-time at UVa, passing Symmion Willis (3,003), Bob Davis (3,095) and Wayne Schuchts (3,124) with his performance against Richmond.
- Rocco has thrown for over 300 yards in two straight games, becoming the first UVa QB to do that since Jameel Sewell in 2009 - at Southern Miss (312) and vs. Indiana (308).
- Rocco has now tossed over 200 yards for the eighth time in his career, tying him for No. 10 in the UVa annals all-time.
- Rocco has reached 200 yards passing in four straight games.
- Zachary Swanson finished with two catches for seven yards, his first two collegiate catches.
- Jake McGee caught two passes for 23 yards, his first two collegiate receptions.
- Darius Jennings' 51-yard TD catch is the second longest reception of his career. He had a 53-yard TD reception in '11 at Miami. Both of his TD receptions have gone for over 50 yards.
- Jennings set career highs with five receptions and 84 yards receiving.
- Drew Jarrett attempted his first career FG, and his 45-yard make ranks as the fifth-longest initial FG by a UVa kicker.
- Khalek Shepherd returned his first career punt and returned two for nine yards.
- Shepherd's 59-yard kick return to start the second half was the longest return of his career.
- E.J. Scott caught three balls for 54 yards, the first catches of his career.
- Kevin Parks had two TDs and now has five career TDs in UVa season openers.

- The 213 total yards by Wake Forest is the fewest allowed by UVa since William & Mary had 169 in the 2011 season opener. It's the fewest by a UVa ACC opponent since North Carolina's 174 in 2009.
- Wake Forest's 213 total yards is the fewest by a UVa opponent in a win against the Cavaliers since Clemson had 192 in a 13-3 Tigers' victory in 2008 -- also played at Scott Stadium.
