QUICK HITS - WEEK TWO

The second week of the ACC schedule features two conference matchups – Louisville at North Carolina and Wake Forest at Boston College. Seven of the remaining 10 teams play at home against non-conference opponents.

The ACC and Big Ten square off in three games this weekend when Pitt plays at Penn State, Indiana visits Virginia and Duke hosts Northwestern. Last year, the ACC was 6-2 vs. the Big Ten.

In a battle of top 15 teams, No. 3/3 Clemson plays host to No. 12/13 Auburn Saturday evening on ESPN at 7 p.m. Clemson has won three straight in the series, including last year's 19-13 victory in Auburn en route to the national championship.

Pitt and Penn State renew their rivalry for the 98th time. Last season, Pitt's James Conner rushed for 117 yards in a 42-39 win over the eventual Big Ten champs.

No. 16/17 Miami's game at Arkansas State has been cancelled and with no mutually available dates, will not be rescheduled this season.

Led by QB Daniel Jones, who has attempted 198 consecutive passes without an interception, Duke will look to go 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five years.

Seeking a 2-0 start for the second time under head coach Steve Addazio, Boston College kicks off its conference slate with a home game vs. Wake Forest. The Deacons opened the year with a home win last Thursday over Presbyterian.

Florida State, which lost starting QB Deondre Francois to a season-ending injury, will start true freshman QB James Blackman against ULM. Kickoff time of the game in Tallahassee has been moved to noon due to the potential impact of Hurricane Irma.

Syracuse plays the second of three-straight games at home as the Orange welcome Middle Tennessee to town.

Virginia Tech earned the ACC's first win over a ranked team this season with a thrilling 31-24 victory over No. 20/22 West Virginia. QB Josh Jackson threw for 200 yards and rushed for 100 in his debut.

A LOOK AT THE LEAGUE

ACC Five Atlantic Coast Conference football teams are ranked in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches Top 25 polls. Clemson is third in both polls. Also included in the rankings are No. 10 (AP)/9 (Amway) Florida State No. 16/17 Miami, No. 17/16 Louisville and No. 18/18 Virginia Tech.

ACC Four ACC quarterbacks made their first career starts this past weekend, including Boston College's Anthony Brown, Clemson's Kelly Bryant, Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson and Georgia Tech's TaQuon Marshall. Florida State, due to the season-ending injury to QB Deondre Francois, will be fielding a first-time starter at quarterback in week two.

ACC The ACC tied its all-time high for most non-conference wins on an opening week with a 10-4 mark over the five-day Labor Day weekend.

ACC ABC's Saturday Night Football telecast of the historic matchup between Florida State and Alabama (Sept. 2 at 8 p.m.) delivered a total live audience of 12,560,000 viewers to become the most-watched kickoff weekend game in college history.

ACC Clemson facing Auburn this week – two schools where the legendary John Heisman coached before spending 16 years as head coach at Georgia Tech – is a reminder that no fewer than eight national college football awards have connections to current ACC schools. Heisman, of course, is the namesake of the Heisman Trophy, given annually to the nation's top college football player. But the league's current membership also has connections to the Mackey Award (Syracuse), the Biletnikoff Award (Florida State), the Hendricks Award (Miami), the Ubitas Golden Arm Award (Louisville), the Joe Moore Award (Pitt) and the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award (Georgia Tech). Also, though he made his primary mark in college football at Arkansas, the legendary Frank Broyles (Broyles Assistant Coach of the Year Award), was a former assistant to Bobby Dodd and also team captain of the 1945 Georgia Tech basketball team.

ACC Seven ACC players were chosen to the AP preseason All-America first team: Pitt's Quadree Henderson (All-Purpose), Boston College's Harold Landry (DE), NC State's Bradley Chubb (DE), Clemson's Dexter Lawrence (DT), Louisville's Jaire Alexander (CB) and Florida State's Tarvarus McFadden (CB) and Derwin James (S). Five more ACC players were chosen to the second team, including Louisville QB Lamar Jackson, NC State all-purpose back Jaylen Samuels, Clemson DT Christian Wilkins,

and LB Micah Kiser and S Quin Blanding, both of Virginia.

COASTAL NOTES

ACC Virginia Tech head coach Justin Fuente sports a .750 winning percentage over the last four years, including his last two seasons at Memphis and his first two at Virginia Tech. Fuente's teams have posted a 30-10 mark during that time. Last season, he became just the 13th coach to be named ACC Coach of the Year in his first season in the league and only the third to be named Coach of the Year and lead his team to 10 wins.

ACC Virginia safety Quin Blanding leads all active players nationally in career tackles per game. Blanding, currently in his fourth year as a starter, has 370 career tackles, an average of 10.00 per game. Both total tackles and tackles per game average are the highest of any current active player in the FBS.

ACC When Duke CB Bryon Fields returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown against North Carolina Central, it marked the third scoring return of his career. He previously had returned a pick for a score against Tulane in 2014 and Pitt in 2016.

ACC Pitt all-purpose back Quadree Henderson has scored five times on kick returns. Henderson has four kickoff returns for scores and one punt return for a TD. The ACC record for career kickoff TD returns is seven, set by former Clemson standout C.J. Spiller during the 2006-09 seasons.

ACC Syracuse junior QB Eric Dungey has topped the 300-yard passing mark in seven of his last 10 games. He threw for 328 yards in a season-opening win over Central Connecticut State.

ACC Virginia Tech true freshman Oscar Bradburn averaged 46.5 yards on eight punts against 22nd-ranked West Virginia, with a net of 46.9 yards per punt.

ACC Virginia Tech WR Cam Phillips leads all ACC receivers in career pass receptions with 172. Phillips ranks third nationally among all returning receivers.

ACC Duke sophomore QB Daniel Jones has thrown 198 consecutive passes without an interception. That's the eighth-longest streak in ACC history.

ACC In his first career start, Georgia Tech junior QB TaQuon Marshall set an ACC record for rushing yards by a quarterback with 249 on 44 carries in a double-overtime loss to No. 25 Ten-

nessee. Marshall, who scored five times, was named a Manning Award Star of the Week.

ACC In his first game as Virginia Tech's starting quarterback, redshirt freshman Josh Jackson totalled 336 yards against 22nd-ranked West Virginia. He became the first player to record 200 (235) or more yards passing offense and 100 (101) or more yards of rushing offense in his first start since at least 2000.

ACC Georgia Tech rushed for 535 yards rushing against No. 25/24 Tennessee. The total was the fourth-highest by an ACC team in history and the most against a ranked opponent. The 535 rushing yards were also the most of any team nationally in the first week of the season.

ACC Michael Jordan will return to Chapel Hill on Saturday, Sept. 9, to serve as an honorary captain for North Carolina's game vs. Louisville. Jordan will walk with Carolina's game captains onto the field for the official coin toss prior to kickoff. Last Saturday marked the official debut of UNC's Jordan Brand uniforms after the two expanded their partnership in the offseason.

ATLANTIC NOTES

ACC Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has a .706 career winning percentage against teams ranked in the Top 10. The Tigers are 12-5 against Top 10 teams under Swinney and face No. 13/13 Auburn this week in Death Valley.

ACC Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last six years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of six or more years with double-figure victories. The Tigers are only the 11th team to have had 10 wins in six successive seasons.

ACC Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher has a 78-18 record in seven-plus seasons as head coach of the Seminoles. Fisher's .813 winning percentage ranks third among all active FBS head coaches, trailing only Ohio State's Urban Meyer and Washington's Chris Peterson.

ACC Clemson allowed just one passing yard in its season-opener against Kent State. The ACC record is minus one yard, set twice previously. Clemson (21.68) and its opponent this week, Auburn (29.69), rank first and second in the nation in pass efficiency defense after just one week.

ACC NC State running back/return specialist Nyheim Hines was named to the Paul Hornung Award (most versatile) Honor Roll for his performance against South Carolina. Hines had a total of 26 touches, one touchdown, and 192 all-purpose yards rushing, receiving, and

returning punts and kicks in a narrow loss to South Carolina.

ACC NC State's versatile H-Back Jaylen Samuels had 15 catches in the Wolfpack's season-opener against South Carolina. He came within one reception of tying the ACC single-game record currently held by eight different players.

ACC NC State senior QB Ryan Finley threw for career-high 415 yards while completing a school-record 45 passes against the Gamecocks.

ACC Wake Forest's 51 points in its season-opening win over Presbyterian was the highest scoring output for the Deacons during the Dave Clawson Era and marked the most points by Wake since a 54-48 win over Duke in 2010.

ACC Clemson scored 56 points in its first game of the year against Kent State, the most since 1990 when the Tigers beat Long Beach State, 59-0.

ACC Louisville QB Lamar Jackson, who won the Heisman Trophy as a sophomore while averaging an ACC-record 393.4 yards per game of total offense, picked up where he left off, piling up 485 total yards in a 35-28 season-opening win over Purdue. He was named a Davey O'Brien Great 8 performer of the week.

ACC Boston College junior kicker Colton Lichtenberg was named a Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Star of the Week. The Savannah, GA native hit a 37-yard field goal with 2:13 remaining in the game to break a 20-20 tie and lift Boston College to a 23-20 road victory over Northern Illinois on Friday night. He also connected from 42 and 35 yards and converted both his extra point tries for an 11-point night, setting a new career high.

MIAMI TO FACE ALABAMA IN 2021 CHICK-FIL-A KICKOFF GAME

ACC For the first time in 28 years, Miami and Alabama will face off on the gridiron in the 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. An exact date, kick time and television network will be finalized at a later date. The 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game will mark the 18th time the Hurricanes and the Crimson Tide have faced each other, but the first meeting since 1993. The two teams last met in the 1993 Sugar Bowl to conclude the 1992 season when (2) Alabama handed (1) Miami a 34-13 defeat to win the national championship.

ACC Miami will be making its debut in the 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game and will be the

ninth ACC team to make such an appearance. The Hurricanes return to Atlanta for the first time on a neutral field since their clash with LSU in the 2005 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

LABOR DAY WEEKEND RATINGS

ACC ABC's Saturday Night (Sept. 2 at 8 p.m.) Football telecast of the historic matchup between Florida State vs. Alabama delivered a total live audience of 12,560,000 viewers, becoming the most-watched kickoff weekend game ever across all networks. The game surpassed last season's Notre Dame at Texas game which also aired on ABC.

ACC ABC's Sunday night Top 25 telecast of West Virginia vs. Virginia Tech (Sept. 3 at 7:30 p.m.) drew a 2.9 overnight rating, the highest of any college game that evening by 32 percent.

ACC ESPN concluded its industry-leading 65-game, five-day college football kickoff weekend (Aug. 31-Sept. 4) with a thrilling, double-over-time Labor Day matchup between Tennessee and Georgia Tech (8 p.m. ET), which delivered a 3.3 overnight rating.

ACC Throughout its 13-game history, the ACC's Labor Day Monday night appearance on ABC and ESPN, has been a ratings success. The 13 games have averaged more than seven million viewers. This year's Georgia Tech vs. Tennessee game drew an overnight 3.3 rating.

A LOOK AT THE 2017 ACC SCHEDULE

ACC ACC teams play more games (22) against Power 5 non-conference teams in 2017 than any of its peer conferences. The ACC also has a higher percentage (.393) of its non-conference games against Power 5 opponents than any other league.

ACC Including the 11 ACC teams that went to bowl games, no ACC team faces fewer than seven opponents that went to bowls last season. ACC teams play 26 games against non-conference opponents that went to bowl games in 2016, the second-highest total among peer conferences.

ACC The 2017 schedules for three ACC schools – Syracuse (seventh, .613), Georgia Tech (eighth, .609) and Duke (ninth, .606) – rank among the top 10 nationally in opponents' winning percentage.

ACC ACC teams' FBS non-conference opponents had the second-highest winning percentage (.526) in 2016 of any of the Power 5 conferences.

ACC COACHING SUCCESS

ACC Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top 18 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State's Jimbo Fisher ranks third (.813), followed by Clemson's Dabo Swinney (sixth, .763), Miami's Mark Richt (seventh, .738), Louisville's Bobby Petrino (10th, .719), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (16th, .668) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (18th, .658).

ACC Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 177 wins in his 20-year career. Miami's Mark Richt is eighth with 155 wins, followed by Louisville's Bobby Petrino, who is 16th with 110 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (104) who is 21st, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall, who is 22nd with 102 wins, and Duke's David Cutcliffe, who is tied for 23rd with 97 wins.

2017 AWARD WATCH LISTS

ACC The ACC led all conferences with the most players on seven preseason watch lists for the Bednarik Award (top defensive player), the Outland (top interior lineman) and Nagurski (top defensive player) Trophies, the Mackey (top tight end), Groza (top placekicker) Horning (most versatile) Awards and Hendricks Awards (Top Defensive End), and tied for the most players chosen for the preseason watch list for four more in the Manning Award, the Jim Thorpe Award (top defensive back), the Wuerffel Trophy (most service) and the Walter Camp.

ACC A total of 95 ACC players were named on at least one preseason National Awards Watch List for a total of 178 selections. Clemson defensive lineman Christian Wilkins leads all ACC players, being named on eight preseason awards watch lists. Florida State defensive back Derwin James and Boston College's Harold Landry were each named to six different watch lists, while Louisville's Lamar Jackson and Virginia's Quin Blanding were each named on five lists.

ACC The ACC tied for the most quarterbacks selected to the Manning Award preseason watch list with five. Tabbed from the ACC were Eric Dungey of Syracuse, Ryan Finley of NC State, Deondre Francois of Florida State, Lamar Jackson of Louisville and Daniel Jones of Duke. The Manning Award is presented annually to the nation's best quarterback and was won by former Clemson All-America Deshaun Watson the past two years. Jackson was a finalist for last year's award.

ACC A national-best 18 ACC players were named to the watch list for the Bednarik Award Watch List, given to the nation's top defensive player.

ACC Eleven ACC players were named to the watch list for the Maxwell Award, given to the nation's top football player.

NATIONAL TITLES & HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS

ACC Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the four years.

ACC The ACC is the first conference since 1994 to have a football national title winner (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

ACC Louisville's Lamar Jackson became the second ACC player in the last four years to

claim the Heisman Trophy. With Clemson's Deshaun Watson at No. 2 in the Heisman voting, it marked the seventh time in the 82-year history of the award that the top two finishers have been from the same conference, and only the second time that the top two finishers have been quarterbacks from the same conference.

ACC With junior QB Lamar Jackson returning to lead Louisville in 2017, the ACC has had reigning Heisman Trophy-winner return to compete in the league twice in the last four years. Florida State's Jameis Winston did so in 2014 after winning the 2013 Heisman Trophy. Jackson is the youngest athlete (19 years, 337 days) to win the Heisman Trophy, while Winston (19 years, 342 days) is the second youngest.

ACC BOWL SUCCESS

ACC The ACC was 9-3 in 2016 postseason bowl games, a league record for most bowl wins in a season and tied for the most for any conference in history.

ACC Over the last five seasons, the ACC has the most wins in BCS, New Year's Six, and College Football Playoff games. The league's 8-3 record in these games leads the Pac-12 (5-4), Big Ten (6-7), SEC (5-8), and Big 12 (3-5).

ACC ORANGE BOWL SUCCESS

ACC When FSU defeated No. 6 Michigan, 33-32, in the Capital One Orange Bowl, it marked the fifth straight victory for an ACC team in the Orange Bowl. That's the longest such streak for a conference in the Orange Bowl in 72 years. FSU began the streak in the 2013 contest against No. 16 Northern Illinois and it has continued with Clemson's win over No. 7 Ohio State in 2014, Georgia Tech's win over No. 8 Mississippi State in 2015 and Clemson's win over No. 4 Oklahoma in 2016.

DR PEPPER ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

ACC This season, The Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be held at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium for a seventh time, resuming an agreement between the ACC and the Queen City venue that runs through the 2020 season.

ACC The 13th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is set for Saturday, Dec. 2. The game will again be shown in prime time on ESPN (at 7:45 p.m.) or ABC (at 8 p.m.)

ACC The six Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Games held in Charlotte have been extremely successful from a fan experience and attendance standpoint. The games have averaged over 69,000 fans per contest, including sellout crowds in 2010, 2011, and 2015.

An ACC Football Championship record crowd of 74,514 in 2015 set an attendance record at Bank of America Stadium. Over the last seven years, the ACC ranks second among all conferences in attendance at its football championship games.

ACC Since 2011, the ACC Championship has been the most competitive of the four major conference championship games, as it has been decided by more than five fewer points per game than any other championship.

ACC BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

ACC The ACC is in its fourth year of a 12-year agreement with the Capital One Orange Bowl, which will host an ACC team—either its champion or next available team—in all years in which the Orange Bowl is not a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff. The opponent will be the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame.

ACC The ACC has won five consecutive Orange Bowl games, the longest winning streak in the Orange Bowl by any conference in 72 years.

ACC The ACC is in its fourth year of an extended bowl relationship, with teams potentially playing in the Camping World Bowl in Orlando, Belk Bowl in Charlotte, Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso, New Era Pinstripe Bowl in the Bronx, Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl in Nashville, TaxSlayer Bowl in Jacksonville, Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman in Annapolis, Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Quick Lane Bowl in Detroit, Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl in St. Petersburg, and the Birmingham Bowl in Birmingham. In addition, if the ACC's opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Citrus Bowl.

ACC Overall, the lineup of bowl games provides more postseason opportunities, selection flexibility, improved financials, marquee matchups and attractive destinations for the ACC's member schools.

ACC ACADEMIC SUCCESS

ACC Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate at or above the FBS average of 74 in 2016. That ties for first among Power Five conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.

ACC The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher every year since 2005. Duke (94), Wake Forest (91) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau last year.

ACC In its 2016 U.S. News and World "Best

Colleges" rankings, ACC member schools combine for an average rank of 55.7, marking the 10th straight year that the ACC has led all Power Five conferences.

THE ACC & THE NFL DRAFT

The ACC had 43 players chosen in the 2017 NFL Draft. The total was the second highest of any conference this year and the third highest in league history.

The ACC has had 158 players chosen in the last four NFL Drafts, the second-highest total of any conference.

In the 2017 draft, Miami led all ACC teams with nine selections followed by Clemson and North Carolina (6 each), Pitt (5), Florida State and Virginia Tech (4 each), NC State (3), Boston College and Louisville (2 each), and Georgia Tech and Wake Forest with one selection apiece.

Florida State Picked To Win ACC Football Title

Florida State was the preseason favorite to claim the Atlantic Coast Conference football championship, according to a poll of 167 media members at the 2017 ACC Football Kickoff.

Reigning Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson of Louisville was chosen to repeat as ACC Player of the Year after a record-setting 2016 campaign in which he averaged 393.4 yards per game of total offense and accounted for 51 touchdowns, both ACC single-season records. His 1,571 rushing yards and 21 rushing touchdowns were also ACC records for a quarterback.

Clemson led all schools with five selections to the 2017 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Football Team.
