NC State Hosts 3rd-Ranked Clemson on ESPN's Thursday Night Package North Carolina-Georgia Tech; Pitt-Duke Meet in Coastal Division Clashes Maryland Hosts West Virginia in Baltimore; Syracuse, Virginia Tech Look For No. 700

A nationally-televised Thursday night Atlantic Coast Conference Atlantic Division battle between 3rd-ranked Clemson and unbeaten NC State headlines three division contests in Week Four of the 2013 ACC Football schedule...Three ACC teams remain nationally ranked in the Associated Press poll with Florida State (8th) and Miami (16th) joining Clemson...In the coaches' USA Today poll, the Tigers are 4th, followed by FSU (8th) and Miami (17th)...Seven non-conference games are also on the slate for this Saturday, led by the annual border battle as West Virginia visits Maryland, this time at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore...The ACC enters Week Four with a 21-7 non conference record and still has played a higher percentage of nationally-ranked non conference foes (21.4%) than any of the other Big 5 Power Conferences...The week begins in Raleigh, N.C., where NC State, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Pete Thomas** hosts the potent Tigers of coach

Dabo Swinney at Carter-Finley Stadium this Thursday night (7:30 pm, ESPN)... **QB Tajh Boyd** leads Clemson, which has captured eight of the last nine meetings in the series which is named the Textile Bowl... State, though, claimed the last meeting in Raleigh, a 37-13 upset of the then 7th-ranked Tigers...The Wolfpack are 7-5 at home on ESPN on Thursday nights and 4-2 against ranked teams...On Saturday, Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Vad Lee**, hosts Coastal Division rival North Carolina at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta (Noon, ESPN)...The Tar Heels, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Bryn Renner**, are looking for their first win in Atlanta since 1997, while the Jackets will be seeking their second straight Coastal Division victory after downing Duke, 38-14, last week...The Blue Devils of coach **David Cutcliffe** will be facing their second straight Coastal Division foe this

Saturday when they host Pitt at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...The Panthers of coach **Paul Chryst**, led by **QB Tom Savage**, are coming off an impressive 49-27 win over New Mexico...Duke will be led by junior **QB Brandon Connette**, who will be making only his 3rd career start, after losing starter **Anthony Boone** for an indefinite period of time to a collarbone injury....Unbeaten Maryland, coached by **Randy Edsall** and led by **QB C.J. Brown**, hosts West Virginia in Baltimore (3:30 pm, ESPNU) in the final non-conference contest of the year for the Terps...Brown leads the ACC in total offense, running and throwing for an average of 363.3 yards per game as the Terrapins seek to end a seven-game losing streak to West Virginia which began in 2004...A pair of ACC schools will have a chance to win

their 700th games this weekend...Virginia Tech, coached by **Frank Beamer** and led by **QB Logan Thomas**, hosts Marshall of Conference USA this Saturday at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. (Noon, ESPNU)...The Hokies rank 2nd nationally in defense, allowing just 190.7 yards per game, while the Thundering Herd is 20th nationally in total offense (527 yds/gm)...Tech enters Saturday with an all-time mark of 699-441-46 (.609)...Syracuse is also in search of its 700th win when the Orange, coached by **Scott Shafer** and led by sophomore **QB Terrel Hunt**, host Tulane at the Carrier Dome (12:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks)...The Orange enter Saturday with an all-time record of 699-498-49 (.580) in 124 years of football...In Tallahassee, Fla, the 8th-ranked Seminoles of coach **Jimbo Fisher**, host undefeated Bethune-Cookman at Doak Campbell Stadium (6 p.m., ESPN3)...FSU is led by redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**, who is 2nd nationally in pass efficiency (248.0)...The Wildcats are ranked 23rd nationally in the FCS poll...16th-ranked Miami returns from a bye week to host Savannah State at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens (7 p.m., ESPN3)...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden**, are led by **QB Stephen Morris** and **RB Duke Johnson**...Johnson leads the ACC in rushing and ranks 15th nationally (122.5)...Wake Forest looks to get back on the winning track as the Deacons head to West Point, N.Y., to face Army Saturday at Michie Stadium (Noon, CBSSN)...The Deacons, coached by **Jim Grobe** and led by **QB Tanner Price**, who threw for 310 yards last week in a last-minute loss to Louisiana-Monroe...Army ranks 7th nationally in rushing offense (314 yds/gm)...Wake Forest is 17th nationally in total defense (332.7)...Virginia, coached by **Mike London** and led by **QB David Watford**, concludes Week Four, hosting VMI at Scott Stadium (6 pm, ESPN3)...The Cavaliers and Keydets are meeting for the 83rd time in a series which began in 1893.

ACC News & Notes

ACC Has Three Teams Ranked in the AP Top 16

For the second straight week, the ACC has the teams ranked among the Top 16 nationally in the Associated Press poll. Clemson leads the way at No. 3, followed by Florida State at No. 8 and Miami at No. 16.

ACC 21-7 Against Non-Conference Foes;

Has Faced Largest Percentage of Ranked Teams

The ACC enters Week Four of the season having compiled a 21-7 (.750) mark against non-conference foes. The ACC has faced a higher percentage of non-conference teams that were nationally-ranked (21.4%) than any of the other Big Five Conferences.

Syracuse, Virginia Tech Look for No. 700

To ACC teams will be looking to record their 700th all-time victories this week when Syracuse hosts Tulane and Virginia Tech is at home against Marshall. Both schools enter the week with 699 all-time wins. Should they do so, they would become the 15th and 16th programs in NCAA history with 700 or more victories in football.

Georgia Tech, Florida State Top 100 Points

Georgia Tech and Florida State became the 9th and 10th teams in ACC history to record 100 or more points in their first two games of a season. Tech, which scored 70 points against Elon on Aug. 31, added 38 against Duke and now has 108 points in its first two games, the 5th-best amount. FSU, which had 41 points against Pitt in its opener, added 62 against Nevada last Saturday for 103 points, the 8th-highest total.

FSU's Jameis Winston Most Accurate This Century

Florida State **QB Jameis Winston's** (Hueytown, Ala.) accuracy in his first two college games has been impressive. Winston has completed 40 of 45 passes, an 88.9 completion rate

Virginia Tech Ranks 2nd Nationally in Defense

Virginia Tech's defense, ranked 2nd nationally this week, held an East Carolina offense, which entered the game averaging 397 yards per game, to just 204 total yards in a 15-10 victory. The Hokies' "D" is allowing just 197 yards per game this year, and just 195.3 yards over its last nine games dating back to last season.

Georgia Tech's Spread Option Goes Airborne

Georgia Tech sophomore **QB Vad Lee** (Durham, N.C.) became the first QB at Georgia Tech to throw four touchdown passes in a game since 2006, when former Tech QB Reggie Ball tossed four scoring strikes against NC State.

Maryland 3-0 For First Time Since 2001

Maryland, which downed Connecticut Saturday, 32-21, for its third straight win of the year, is off to its best start since the 2001 season. The Terrapins captured their first seven games that year in Ralph Friedgen's debut as head coach.

Campanaro Ties ACC Receiving Record, Again

Wake Forest senior **WR Michael Campanaro** (Clarksville, Md.) tied the ACC single-game record with 16 pass receptions against Louisiana Monroe. Campanaro also had 16 catches against Boston College in 2012. North Carolina's Charlie Carr set the record originally in 1966 and it has been tied six times since.

2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 14

Georgia Tech 38, Duke 14

Georgia Tech scored 28 unanswered points Saturday en route to a 38-14 win over Duke in the teams' ACC football opener at Wallace Wade Stadium. The Yellow Jackets (2-0 overall) finished with 469 yards of total offense in the game. Georgia Tech QB Vad Lee, playing in his hometown of Durham, N.C., threw for 125 yards and four touchdowns, while RB Robert Godhigh amassed 79 yards on four carries. PK Harrison Butker connected on a 49-yard field goal, matching the longest at Tech since Paul Johnson took over as head coach in 2008. Duke QB Brandon Connette, filling in for injured starter Anthony Boone and making his second career start, threw for 122 yards, completing 15-of-28 passes and ran for 76 yards and another score. RB Jela Duncan led the Blue Devils' running game with 89 yards on 16 carries and one touchdown. Sophomore DT Adam Gotsis helped key a Yellow Jacket effort that limited the Blue Devils to one touchdown in each half. Gotsis recorded his first career sack and had a career-high two tackles for lost yardage. LB Kelby Brown highlighted the Blue Devils' defense with a career-high 17 tackles, including seven solo stops. S Jeremy Cash also had a career day for Duke (2-1 overall), making 14 tackles and recording his first forced fumble.

Florida State 62, Nevada 7

FSU redshirt freshman Jameis Winston completed his final 13 passes and finished 15-of-18 for 214 yards and two touchdowns, while running 10 yards for another score. Winston, who is 40-of-45 passing with six touchdowns throws this season, led an effort that saw the 10th-ranked Seminoles score 59 unanswered points in Saturday's rout. Winston connected on a pair of 24-yard touchdown passes to WRs Kenny Shaw and Rashad Greene in the second quarter that put the Seminoles (2-0) ahead for good. RBs Karlos Williams and Devonta Freeman ran for 110 and 109 yards, respectively, with one score each. Williams' effort came after making a position switch from safety during the Seminoles' recent bye week. In total, FSU's offense racked up 617 yards at a clip of 9.8 yards per play while the defense allowed just 214 yards at 3.5 yards per Nevada snap. Seminole DBs Terrance Brooks and Lamarcus Joyner both had six tackles as 24 different defenders registered stops.

Pitt 49, New Mexico 27

The Panthers (1-1) scored on six of their first eight possessions to down the visiting Lobos (1-2) and register their first win of the season. Pitt true freshmen accounted for 37 of the 49 points the Panthers posted, scoring the team's first five touchdowns. Freshman WR Tyler Boyd finished with 195 all-purpose yards. Boyd led the team in receiving with 134 yards on six catches and a touchdown, and added 39 rushing yards with a touchdown and 22 kickoff return yards. Junior RB Isaac Bennett added 101 rushing yards as Pitt outgained New Mexico in total yardage, 527-270. Senior DT Aaron Donald tied a career high with four tackles for loss to lead the Pitt defense, which limited the Lobos to 59 first-half yards. Donald also recorded two sacks, bringing his career total to 21.5. UNM RB Kasey Carrier, who entered the game with an NCAA-best 345 yards rushing, had just 22 yards on seven carries against the Panthers.

Virginia Tech 15, East Carolina 10

DE James Gayle recorded a safety in the waning moments to help the Hokies hold on in a 15-10 nonconference road victory at East Carolina on Saturday afternoon. QB Logan Thomas completed 25 of 43 passes for 258 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception for the Hokies (2-1). Virginia Tech limited East Carolina (2-1) to 204 yards total offense. The Hokies trailed 10-7 with 8:48 remaining in the third quarter after ECU kicker Warren Harvey made a 44-yard field goal. But the Hokies answered with what turned out to be the game-winning score. A 10-play, 75-yard drive ended when Thomas found WR D.J. Coles in the back of the end zone for a 3-yard touchdown and a 13-10 lead.

Syracuse 54, Wagner 0

Syracuse used its home opener at the Carrier Dome to provide Scott Shafer his first victory as head coach in a 54-0 shutout of Wagner on Saturday. The Orange (1-2) piled up 595 total yards against the Seahawks (1-2), while recording the largest margin of victory for SU since 2000. QB Terrel Hunt came off the bench and hit 15-of-18 targets for 265 yards and three touchdowns. Starter Drew Allen was 8-of-11 for 62 yards and a touchdown. RB Jerome Smith led the SU ground game, rushing for 61 yards and two touchdowns. WR Jarrod West had a breakout performance, recording the first 100-yard game of his career. He finished with five catches for 147 yards and a touchdown. DT Jay Bromley keyed the shutout with a pair of quarterback sacks for 23 yards, and FS Durell Eskridge and LB Cam Lynch each had an interception.

Maryland 32, Connecticut 21

Maryland is off to its first 3-0 start since 2001 following Saturday night's road win at Connecticut. QB C.J. Brown rushed for 122 yards and a touchdown and passed for 277 yards and another score as the Terrapins amassed 501 yards of total offense. Maryland has broken the 500-yard barrier in each of its first three games. WR Stefon Diggs had 110 yards receiving, including a 12-yard touchdown reception for the Terrapins, who pulled away in the final two quarters after leading just 13-10 at the half. Senior CB Dexter McDougale helped Maryland break the game open with a 49-yard interception return for a touchdown. McDougale finished with two interceptions on the day. The road win over Connecticut (0-2) gave Maryland third-year head coach Randy Edsall a victory over the program he headed up for 12 years prior to joining the Terps and avenged a loss to the Huskies last season in College Park.

Louisiana-Monroe 21, Wake Forest 19

With Wake Forest trailing by eight points, WR Orville Reynolds caught a 23-yard touchdown pass from QB Tanner Price with four seconds left in the game to cap a 97-yard drive, but the Demon Deacons were unable to convert the two-point conversion and ULM held on for a two-point victory on Saturday afternoon at BB&T Field. Wake Forest (1-2) lost despite seeing WR Michael Campanaro tie a career and ACC record by catching 16 passes. His 177 receiving yards set a new career-high. Reynolds caught three passes for 101 yards and was the recipient of the first two touchdown passes of his career. ULM won behind QB Kolton Browning, who completed 43-of-68 passes for 315 yards and three touchdowns.

USC 35, Boston College 7

QB Cody Kessler passed for 237 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Trojans (2-1) past the visiting Eagles (2-1). Boston College's lone touchdown came on freshman RB Tyler Rouse's 29-yard run with 10:40 remaining in the game. Boston College P Nate Freese averaged 50.4 yards on eight kicks, including a 65-yarder. Boston College junior DB Spenser Rositano recorded a game-high 11 tackles, and DB Sean Syliva added 10. Eagles DL Mehdi Abdesmad and LB Josh Keyes each recorded quarterback sacks.

ACC Notes By The Numbers

.889 - The hard-to-believe completion percentage for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston** after he has completed 40 of 45 passes in his first college two games. This is the highest completion percentage for any FBS quarterback in his first two games in this century. West Virginia's **Geno Smith** was at 88.0% after his first two games last year.

.966 - Clemson **PK Chris Catanzaro** has made 28 of his last 29 field goal attempts, a .966 percentage. He had a school-record string of 20 field goal attempts without a miss in 2012 and now has a current streak of eight without a miss.

2 - In the history of the Atlantic Coast Conference, only 10 teams have scored **100 or more points in the first two games of a season**, but two of them have occurred this season. Georgia Tech has scored 108 points in its first two games, the fifth highest total in league history, while Florida State has scored 103 points, the 8th best total. FSU set the standard last fall with 124 points in its first two games, and holds the top three two-game totals.

2 + 2 - Two ACC teams, **Pitt and FSU**, had multiple 100-yard rushers and a QB with a passing efficiency rating of greater than 200 (min. 15 attempts) on Saturday. Florida State's **Jameis Winston** had a 208.8 pass efficiency mark while **RBs Karlos Williams** (110) and **Devonta Freeman** (109) topped the 100-yard rushing mark. Pitt saw **QB Tom Savage** record a 208.4 pass efficiency rating and **James Conner** (119) and **Isaac Bennett** (101) both top 100 rushing yards. They become the first ACC teams to achieve this combo since Nov. 9, 2002, when Clemson did it in a 42-12 win at UNC as **Charlie Whitehurst** (241.1 rtg) and **RBs Bernard Rambert** (106 yds) and **Tye Hill** (105 yds) accomplished the feat.

3.5 - NC State **PK Niklas Sade** is tied for the nation's lead in field goals made per game, having made all of seven of his attempts in the first two weeks of the season.

4.0 - Pitt **DT Aaron Donald** had four tackles for loss in Pitt's 49-27 win over New Mexico, Donald had two sacks for 15 yards in losses and two more tackles for an additional 5 yards in losses. Donald, who is averaging 2.5 tackles for loss on the season, ranks 3rd nationally.

13 - North Carolina head coach **Larry Fedora** has been the Tar Heels' head coach for only 14 games, but in that time, his offenses have topped the 400-yard mark on 13 occasions.

14 - As a head coach, NC State's **Dave Doeren** has never lost a game at home. In his third season as a head coach, after serving at

Northern Illinois the past two years and his first two games at NC State, Doeren's teams have compiled a 14-0 home record.

15 - When **Miami** entered the AP poll last week for the first time this year and was ranked 15th, it marked the highest, first-time ranking for an ACC team during the regular season in the Associated Press poll since AP started ranking 25 teams. Maryland debuted into the poll at No. 13 on Sept. 23, 1986. AP went to a Top 25 in 1989.

16 - For the second time in his career, Wake Forest **WR Michael Campanaro** tied the ACC single-game record for pass receptions when he had 16 catches for 177 yards against Louisiana Monroe. Campanaro tied the mark last year when he had 16 catches against Boston College. The record was originally set by North Carolina's **Charlie Carr** in 1966 and has been matched on six previous occasions.

37 - The total of points scored by true Pitt true freshmen in the Panthers' 49-27 win over New Mexico. **TE Scott Orndoff** (Waynesburg, Pa.) caught a 4-yard TD pass; **WR Tyler Boyd** (Clairton, Pa.) had a 33-yard TD run and a 34-yard TD reception; **RB James Conner** (Erie, Pa.) had TD runs of 1 and 38-yards and **PK Chris Blewitt** (Alexandria, Va.) was perfect on 7 PATs.

129.0 - The average reception yards for Maryland sophomore **WR Stefon Diggs**. Diggs leads the ACC and ranks 6th nationally in reception yards per game. Wake Forest's **Michael Campanaro** is averaging 131.5 yards a game, but needs one more game to qualify for the standings since missing the Deacons' season-opener.

152.16 - The career pass efficiency rating for North Carolina junior **QB Bryn Renner**. Renner has completed 565 of 851 passes (.664) for 6,989 yards, 56 TDs and only 21 interceptions. His pass efficiency rating would be an ACC record if maintained through this season. The current record is 151.15, set by Florida State's **Chris Weinke**.

173.0 - The all-purpose yardage average of Pitt freshman **WR Tyler Boyd**. Boyd leads all freshmen nationally and ranks 16th overall in all-purpose yardage. He leads the ACC in kickoff return average and is 7th in the league in reception yards per game.

195.3 - Over a span of its last nine games, which includes a bowl game with Rutgers and games with No. 1-ranked Alabama, then 14th-ranked Clemson and 8th-ranked Florida State, **Virginia Tech's** defense has allowed its foes only 248.3 yards per game on defense. Over

its last five games, the Hokies "D" has been even better, allowing just 197.0 yards per game. Tech ranks 2nd nationally in total defense this week (190.7).

200 - Georgia Tech has scored in 200 consecutive games, the 8th-longest active streak in the nation. Virginia Tech, which has not been shut out in 233 games, has the longest active streak in the ACC and 6th longest active streak in the nation. The Hokies have bettered Florida State's streak of 232 games without a shutout, a skein which ended in 2006, as the longest for any ACC school.

243.61 - The pass efficiency rating for Georgia Tech **QB Vad Lee**, a mark which would lead the nation if he had three more pass attempts. Lee does not appear in the ACC or NCAA standings for pass efficiency because he is just short of the minimum number of pass attempts (15 per game). Lee is tied with FSU's **Jameis Winston** and Maryland's **C.J. Brown** for most TD passes in the league with 6.

260 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 260 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late **Joe Paterno** (298) is next on the list.

262.0 - The pass efficiency rating for Syracuse sophomore **QB Terrel Hunt**, in his first extensive playing time for the Orange. Hunt led Syracuse to 54-0 win over Wagner, completing 15 of 18 passes (.833) for 265 yards and 3 TDs with no interceptions. The pass efficiency rating is the third-best single-game performance by a QB this year in the NCAA's FBS.

269.9 - The number of yards Maryland's offense has improved by per game in the first 3 games of the season. Last year the Terrapins, hampered by injury, were dead last in total offense, averaging just 284.8 yards per game. This year, they are 2nd in the conference in total offense, averaging 554.7 yards per game, an increase of 269.9 yards per contest.

363.3 - The total offense yardage average for Maryland senior **QB C.J. Brown**. Brown leads the ACC and is 9th nationally in total offense for the 3-0 Terrapins.

700th - Both **Virginia Tech** and **Syracuse** have a chance to notch the 700th victory in their schools' histories this week. Both schools have 699 wins and both schools are hosting foes from Conference USA with Virginia Tech hosting Marshall and Syracuse hosting Tulane. Overall, the Hokies have a 699-441-46 (.609) while Syracuse is 699-498-49 (.580).

Six players have scored touchdowns for the Eagles in their first three games ... True freshman **RB Tyler Rouse** became the latest last Saturday, when he scored on a 29-yard run with just under 11 minutes remaining in Boston College's road game at Southern California ... Senior **P David Freese** averaged 50.4 yards on eight punts versus the Trojans ... Four of Freese's punts were pinned inside the USC 20-yard line ... Senior **TE Mike Naples'** 13-yard reception in the first quarter of Saturday's game marked his first catch of the season ... Sophomore **LB Josh Keyes'** third-quarter sack of Southern California quarterback Cody Kessler marked his second solo sack of the season ... Keyes now has 2.5 sacks in three games ... Junior **DL Mehdi Abdesmad** recorded his first sack of the season on Saturday ... Boston College has recorded nine quarterback sacks as a team thus far, which surpasses the Eagles' total of six from all of 2012.



PK Chandler Catanzaro needs just eight points to become Clemson's career scoring leader ... Catanzaro, originally a walk-on from Greenville, S.C., has scored 17 points this year and has 322 points for his career ... When **QB Tajh Boyd** was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Georgia in the season opener, he tied the school record for most ACC Player of the Week selections in a career. ... The selection Boyd's seventh as ACC Player of the Week, the same amount Keith Adams had as a linebacker from 1998-2000 ... Clemson has started the season 2-0 for the fourth consecutive year, marking a first in program history ... **WR Charone Peake**, the second leading receiver on Clemson's third-ranked football team, suffered a torn ACL during practice on September 10 and will be lost for the season ... **Adam Humphries** will move into Peake's starting position ... Humphries has seven catches for 53 yards in two games this year.



Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston** was named the ACC Rookie of the Week for the second time this season after completing 15-of-18 passes - including his final 13 - in last Saturday's 62-7 win over Nevada ... Winston has completed 40-of-45 passes (88.9 percent) in his first two collegiate games ... Freshman **PK Roberto Aguayo** was good on a 33-yard field goal in Saturday's game ... It was the fourth field goal and the longest field goal of his two-game career ... Aguayo, the ACC Specialist of the Week, has made each of the first 17 kicks of his career (13 PATs and four field goals) ... **RB Karlos Williams** scored a touchdown on a 65-yard run with 12:47 left in the third quarter to put Florida State up 31-7 on Saturday ... The rush was the first career offensive touch for Williams, a converted DB who was added to the offensive side of the ball during the bye week following Florida State's victory over Pitt on Sept. 2 ... Williams will still see playing time on defense according to head coach **Jimbo Fisher**.



Maryland has opened the season 3-0 for the first time since 2001 ... With 501 yards in last Saturday's win over Connecticut, the Terrapins are one of three FBS teams to gain at least 500 yards total offense in each of its first three games, joining Oregon and California. ... **QB C.J. Brown** has five rushing touchdowns this season, matching his season high from 2011 (his last season played after missing last year due to injury) ... **CB Dexter McDougle** finished with a personal-best two interceptions versus Connecticut, the second of which he returned 49 yards for a touchdown ... McDougle, the ACC Defensive Back of the Week, became the first Terrapin to return an interception for a touchdown since **A.J. Hendy** took one back 32 yards against NC State on Nov. 26, 2011 ... Maryland has six interceptions as a team this season, topping last season's total of four ... ACC Linebacker of the Week **Marcus Whitfield** tallied a career-high three sacks in the win over UConn.



Junior **PK Niklas Sade** is a perfect 7-for-7 on field goal attempts this season, including a 48-yarder with 33 seconds remaining that lifted the Wolfpack to a 23-21 win over Richmond in its last outing on Sept. 7 ... Wolfpack first-year head coach **Dave Doeren** is undefeated in 14 career home games (12-0 at Northern Illinois, 2-0 with NC State) heading into Thursday night's ESPN matchup against visiting third-ranked Clemson ... NC State has upset a top 10 team each of the past two seasons at Carter-Finley Stadium ... Last season, State defeated 5-0 and third-ranked Florida State, 17-16 ... In 2011, the Clemson Tigers came to town with a 9-1 record and a No. 7 ranking, but left with a 37-13 loss at the hands of the Pack ... In fact, NC State has beaten the last three top-10 teams it faced, as Chuck Amato's squad defeated No. 9 FSU, 20-15, in 2005 ... Overall, the Wolfpack has posted a 9-9 record in Thursday night ESPN games, including a 7-5 mark at home and a 4-2 mark against teams ranked among the nation's top 25.

It marked SU's most points in a game since putting up 63 in a 63-17 rout of Rhode Island exactly 11 years ago (Sept. 14, 2002) ... Syracuse recorded its first shutout since a 31-0 blanking of Buffalo in the 2005 season opener ... **QB Terrel Hunt** guided the Orange on seven scoring drives on Saturday, including six that resulted in touchdowns ... Junior **WR Jarrod West** caught five passes for a career-best 147 yards. It was the first 100-yard receiving game of West's career ... The Orange limited Wagner to 87 yards of total offense ... The last Syracuse opponent to finish with less than 100 offensive yards was Rutgers (80 yards) in 1997.

Junior **WR Orville Reynolds** hauled in touchdown passes of 65 yards and 23 yards on Saturday ... Those were the first two touchdown receptions of his career and the 65-yard catch was the longest of his career ... **CB Merrill Noel** recorded his third career interception vs. Louisiana-Monroe ... For the season, the Deacons have six interceptions and have come up with a total of nine turnovers.

The 72-yard punt is tied for the 10th-longest punt in school history and was Monday's second punt of 70 or more yards in his career ... Monday averaged 45.6 yards on nine punts and two punts downed inside the Georgia Tech 5 and three punts downed inside the Yellow Jacket 20 ... **WR Jamison Crowder** has caught at least six passes in all three of the Blue Devils' games this season.



Georgia Tech stands 2-0 for the fourth time in six years under head coach **Paul Johnson** ... The Yellow Jackets have won three straight ACC road games ... **PK Harrison Butker's** 49-yard field goal versus Duke on Saturday was the longest by a Georgia Tech kicker in nearly four years, matching Scott Blair's 49-yarder vs. Clemson in the 2009 ACC Championship Game ... In head coach **Al Golden's** first two seasons, Miami used 22 different defensive starting lineups, including a different lineup in all 12 games in 2012 ... Yates (2007-10) ... Senior **S Tre Boston** has intercepted at least one pass in each of his four collegiate seasons and has nine for his career ... Sophomore **WR Quinshad Davis** caught a touchdown pass in each of the Tar Heels' first two games and now has seven TD receptions for his career ... **OT James Hurst's** 38 career starts are a team high ... **PK Thomas Moore** is a perfect 55-for-55 on extra points in his career ... Moore has combined with his predecessor to connect on a school record 181 PATs ... Barth connected on 126 straight while kicking for the Tar Heels.

The All-America candidate is tied for the national lead with 1.5 sacks per game ... Donald's 2.5 TFLs per contest lead the ACC and rank 3rd nationally ... Twelve true freshmen and seven redshirt freshmen have played for Pitt this year, including ACC Receiver of the Week **Tyler Boyd** ... Boyd piled up 195 all-purpose yards in the win over New Mexico, including a 33-yard touchdown run and a highlight reel 34-yard touchdown catch ... True freshmen have accounted for 71 percent of Pitt's scoring thus far (44 out of 62 points) ... Biletnikoff Award candidate **WR Devin Street** is only 17 receptions away from becoming the all-time leading pass catcher at Pitt ... Georgia Tech's Lee, FSU's Winston honored for stellar quarterback play

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Georgia Tech sophomore Vad Lee has been named the Atlantic Coast Conference Offensive Back of the Week, and Florida State freshman Jameis Winston earned his second ACC Rookie of the Week honor after their standout play at quarterback led their teams to wins on Saturday. Lee threw a career-high four touchdown passes and rushed for another score to lead Georgia Tech to a 38-14 road win at Duke in its ACC opener. Lee led a Yellow Jacket offense that piled up 469 total yards. Winston completed his final 13 passes and finished 15-of-18 with a pair of touchdown throws in the Seminoles' 62-7 rout of Nevada. Other honorees include Georgia Tech's Shaq Mason as ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week and Pitt's Tyler Boyd as ACC Receiver of the Week. Virginia Tech's James Gayle was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week, while Maryland's Marcus Whitfield was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week and Terrapin cornerback Dexter McDougle earned ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors. Florida State kicker Roberto Aguayo was tabbed as the ACC Specialist of the Week.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Vad Lee, So., QB, Georgia Tech, 6-1, 215, Durham, N.C.

In his return to his hometown, Lee was responsible for all five touchdowns in Georgia Tech's 38-14 win at Duke. The sophomore passed for four touchdowns – the most by a Yellow Jacket since 2006 – and rushed for another. He rushed 22 times for 76 yards and completed 8-of-16 passes for 125 yards with one interception, helping the Yellow Jackets accumulate 469 yards of total offense.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Shaq Mason, Georgia Tech, Jr., OG, 6-1, 305, Columbia, Tenn.

Mason paced an offensive line that allowed zero sacks and helped the Yellow Jackets churn out 344 rushing yards and 125 passing yards in Saturday's 38-14 ACC win over Duke. Mason, who had 16 knockdowns Saturday, leads the only offensive line in the nation that has not allowed a sack this season.

RECEIVER – Tyler Boyd, Pitt, Fr., WR, 6-2, 185, Clairton, Pa.

Boyd fit a season's worth of highlights into just his second collegiate game with 134 receiving yards on six catches (22.3 yards per catch average) and a touchdown in Saturday's 49-27 win over New Mexico. He also rushed for a 33-yard touchdown. With Pitt down to its last play of the first half, Boyd hauled in a desperation pass to the back of the end zone by jumping over a defender and getting one foot down for a 34-yard touchdown and 35-6 lead. Boyd currently ranks third in the ACC and 16th nationally with an average of 173 all-purpose yards per game.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – James Gayle, Virginia Tech, Sr., DE, 6-4, 269, Hampton, Va.

Gayle had a heavy hand in limiting the high-powered East Carolina offense, recording three tackles (2.5 of which were for loss and two of which were sacks) and two quarterback hurries as the Hokies beat the Pirates 15-10. Gayle's final sack was a big one as he stripped ECU quarterback Shane Carden to force a safety and essentially ice the game.

LINEBACKER – Marcus Whitfield, Maryland, Sr., LB, 6-3, 240, Germantown, Md.

Whitfield had a career-best three sacks as part of a six-sack day by the Terrapin defense in Saturday night's 32-21 win at Connecticut. His final sack forced a safety as UConn quarterback Chandler Whitmer try to avoid pressure and was hit with intentional grounding. He is the first Terrapin to record three or more sacks in a game since Shawne Merriman tallied three against North Carolina on Nov. 2, 2002.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Dexter McDougle, Maryland, Sr., CB, 5-11, 195, Falmouth, Va.

McDougle had a career-high two interceptions, returning one for a touchdown on Saturday to key a 32-21 road win at Connecticut. His touchdown return was 49 yards. McDougle also led the team with seven solo tackles. McDougle is the first Terrapin to return an interception for a touchdown since A.J. Hendy did it against NC State on Nov. 26, 2011.

SPECIALIST – Roberto Aguayo, Florida State, Fr.-R, PK, 6-1, 208, Mascotte, Fla.

The heir to NCAA and ACC all-time scoring leader Dustin Hopkins, Aguayo remained perfect on the season on both field goals and PATs. He converted field goal of attempts from 23 and 33 yards in the win over Nevada and is now 4-of-4 on the season. Aguayo capped his career-best 14-point performance by converting all eight of his PAT attempts and is 13-of-13 on the season. He is the first FSU kicker to convert his first 17 combined kick attempts since Derek Schmidt (1984), who set the record with 29 consecutive made kicks to start his career.

ROOKIE – Jameis Winston, Florida State, Fr.-R, QB, 6-4, 225, Hueytown, Ala.

Winston completed his final 13 pass attempts of the day after a first-half interception to finish 15-of-18 for 214 yards, with two touchdown throws in Florida State's 62-7 win over Nevada. Winston led the Seminoles to 45 unanswered points from 3:21 left in the first half until 58 seconds remaining in the third quarter. Winston led a streak of six consecutive touchdown drives, which included his two touchdown throws and was capped by his 10-yard scoring run with 4:41 left in the third quarter for a 45-7 lead.

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night



The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When NC State hosts 3rd-ranked Clemson this Thursday night (7:30 p.m.) at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C., the game will be the 85th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the 19th appearance for NC State and the 12th for Clemson on the ESPN Thursday night package.

The game marks the fourth time the two teams have played on ESPN's Thursday night. They last met in 2005 in Raleigh, with the Tigers emerging with a 31-10 victory. State, though, took two previous Thursday night games with Clemson, 17-15 in Raleigh in 2003 and 38-9 at Clemson in 2002, for a 2-1 advantage.

Overall, NC State is 9-9 overall on ESPN Thursdays, including a 7-5 record at home and 4-2 against ranked teams at home.

Clemson has a 2-9 record on ESPN's Thursday night package, 2-7 on the road. The Tigers are 1-2 when ranked. Clemson is the highest-ranked ACC team to play on Thursday night since 2nd-ranked Boston College defeated 8th-ranked Virginia Tech on October 25, 2007.

Miami has the highest winning percentage on nationally televised games on Thursday night of any current ACC school, having posted a 16-3 overall mark, an .842 winning percentage. The Hurricanes have been better at home, posting a 11-1 mark in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

Virginia Tech has won more nationally televised games on Thursdays than any other current ACC school, and the Hokies are equally effective at home in Lane Stadium (.733 winning percentage) and on the road (.727 winning percentage). Tech has won more Thursday ESPN road games (8) than any other ACC squad.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 145 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

Virginia Tech (26) and Georgia Tech (25) lead all ACC schools in appearances, followed by Miami (19), NC State (19), Maryland (13), Boston College (12), Florida State (12), Virginia (12), Clemson (12) and North Carolina (11).

Georgia Tech has hosted more games (18) than any other ACC school. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

There have been many other great moments in the series, including the previously mentioned 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia

Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top Ten nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC turned the tables, upsetting 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by UNC placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was also a classic; a see-saw battle which featured a dramatic 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by the Hokies' David Wilson with 2:23 remaining as the deciding play.

Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's dramatic upset of 2nd-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating.

This week's game is the second of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. North Carolina lost to 6th-ranked South Carolina, 27-10 on Aug. 29. Virginia Tech travels to Georgia Tech on Sept. 26, followed by North Carolina making its second Thursday night appearance of the year on Oct. 17, when it hosts Miami. Georgia Tech then travels to Clemson on Nov. 14 for the second 2013 Thursday night appearance by both the Yellow Jackets and Tigers.

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 260 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 149 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th,

8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

Having completed only three seasons as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has already joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 31-10 record (.756). His winning percentage has him in 5th place among all ACC head coaches after three seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.795).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 16 of the first 18 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .889. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage has him 2nd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 10 of his first 12 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (2nd), Danny Ford (8th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

North Carolina Sets Offensive Records In First Year Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,

■ In Fedora's first 14 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 14 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 10 occasions.

■ In his first 14 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 13 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.



NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 2-0 record in his two games as State's head coach and now is 25-4 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 2-1 start to the 2013 season, **David Cutcliffe**, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 23 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

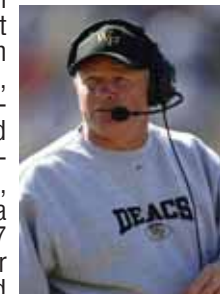
Wake Forest's Jim Grobe is Longest Tenured Coach in ACC Play

Maryland's Stefon Diggs Going Long Distance

Maryland sophomore WR Stefon Diggs is one of the dangerous deep receiving threats in the ACC this year. 10 List for best career per-carry average with a minimum of 1,000 career yards earned. Johnson, who ran for a career high 186 yards against FAU on Aug. 30, now has 1,192 career yards on just 179 career carries, a 6.66 per-play average. That norm is currently the

7th-best career average by an ACC player. Georgia Tech's Orwin Smith, who completed his career last fall, holds the record, averaging 9.28 with 1,839 career yards. In Johnson's last three games against Duke (176) last year, and FAU and Florida this year, he has averaged 140.3 yards per contest. In just 14 career games, he is averaging 85.1 yards a game.

start this fall. Williams has vaulted into leading the ACC among its active career rushers (1,880 yds) by topping the 100-yard mark in his first two games this fall. Williams ran for 114 yards on just 23 carries in the Eagles' season-opening win over Villanova, then topped that by rushing for a

career-high 204 yards on 35 carries and a TD in BC's 24-10 win over Wake Forest. Williams is 2nd in the ACC and ranks 18th nationally in rushing this week, averaging 118.7 yards per game. He has now topped the 100-yard mark 7 times in his career, the most of any current ACC back.

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Vizio BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Rose Bowl on Jan. 6 in Pasadena, Calif. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among the Top 14 in the final BCS

Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocate V100 Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C. and Annapolis, Md.
8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

Conditional Agreement*

*If Pac-12 or BYU is unable to fill their obligations and ACC has an available team

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2). The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or BYU to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 8. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games then, in order to determine the divisional champion, the procedures listed below will be followed.

A. Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall winning-percentage (divisional and non-divisional), and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Overall winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games. If both tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

B. Three (or More) Team Tie

(Three team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaking procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can only be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaking procedure will then be applied).

1. Combined head-to-head winning percentage among the tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference winning percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Combined winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaking procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If all tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

Bowl Championship Series

Heading into its 16th and final year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Rose Bowl Stadium in Pasadena, Calif., on January 6, 2014.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 10 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 10 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, The American Athletic Conference, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, and the Southeastern.

Six conferences (ACC, American, Big 12, Big

Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, or Sun Belt conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 20 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 8. The first Harris Poll will be released on Sunday, Oct. 13.



COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football will enter a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later. It will be the best of all worlds, and the biggest innovation to the sport in decades.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

The ACC and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

Bowl Championship Series; College Football Playoff

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock achieved a unique triple accomplishment at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics when he was named the first Executive Director of the College Football Playoff, which begins after the 2014 season. Previously, Hancock was named the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and then was named the first executive director of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) in 2009, a role he continues in this year until the completion of the BCS with this year's national championship game. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the

The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Rutgers ended regulation tied at 10-10 in the Russell Bowl, it marked the 62nd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 62 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 62 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 31 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-20 advantage in the 54 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-30 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
