VIRGINIA-FLORIDA STATE SERIES

- Florida State owns a 42-14 all-time series advantage against Virginia.
- Virginia captured both meetings last year, winning 15-2 in Charlottesville and 6-3 in the ACC Championship Game.
- The rest of the 2009 series at Virginia was rained out.
- UVa has lost four straight in Tallahassee and has not won at Dick Howser Stadium since May 1, 2005; UVa was swept in its last series at FSU in 2008, although each of the last two games were decided by 3-2 scores in 10 innings.

GOSSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been hot at the plate thus far, with a .406 batting average (23-for-57).
- He had his career-best 10-game hitting streak snapped Wednesday at William and Mary.
- Gosselin has led off seven games, including six of the last seven, with hits.

SUMMER CONNECTIONS AT THE CAPE

- UVa's Phil Gosselin and Dan Grovatt were teammates with Stuart Tapley, John Gast and Geoff Parker with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League last summer.
- Tapley and Gosselin lived at the same host house at the Cape.

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big numbers out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 21-for-41 (.512) this season with 11 RBI and 11 runs scored.
- Outside of Gosselin in the leadoff spot, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the batting order.
- Keith Werman, out of the ninth spot in the order, has gone 12-for-20 with six runs scored and four RBI this year.
- John Barr, David Coleman and freshmen Chris Taylor, Reed Gagnani and Stephen Bruno also have gotten opportunities out of the nine-hole.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Steven Proscia is tied for the ACC lead in RBI (23) and has seven multiple-RBI games.
- Virginia ranks second in the ACC in batting (.378) and has scored 10 or more runs seven times this year.
- UVa will play its first official night games of 2010 on Friday and Saturday.
- Virginia's returning starters have combined for over 1,000 career starts.

VIRGINIA IN ACC OPENERS

- Virginia traditionally has struggled in its ACC season-opening series. In the last 10 years, UVa has won only two of these series – in 2004 at Georgia Tech and last year at Wake Forest (both sweeps).
- UVa last opened an ACC season at Florida State during the 2003 season, and the Seminoles recorded a three-game sweep.
- The Cavaliers have kicked off ACC play on the road in each of the last eight seasons (including 2010).

OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has been outscored 9-8 in the first inning this

year, but the Cavaliers have rebounded to outscore their foes 53-10 over the next three innings, including 19-1 in the second inning.

- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 120-47 this season.

HITS COMING FROM TOP TO BOTTOM

- In seven of 12 games this season, at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On three occasions, all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting .378 as a team through 12 games.

HICKS KEEPS STREAK ALIVE

- John Hicks is the lone Cavalier to record hits in all 12 games this season.
- With his hit Wednesday, he broke his previous career-long hitting streak of 11, set from March 18-31 last year.
- Dating to last season (June 6), Hicks has a 16-game hit streak.

PROSCIA PICKS UP GAME

- Steven Proscia has been a force in the cleanup spot, tying for the ACC lead in RBI with 23.
- His .426 batting average is tied for 14th in the ACC, while he also ranks second in doubles (6) and total bases (37) and eighth in slugging percentage (.787).
- He has seven multiple-RBI games this year.
- Proscia typically hit in the five-hole last season.

NOT EASY TO RUN AGAINST CAVALIERS

- Virginia's battery has done a good job of holding runners on and cutting them down on the basepaths.
- UVa catchers have thrown out 7-of-16 (43.8%) would-be base stealers this season.
- Only Florida State (46.1%, 6-of-13) has a higher percentage in the ACC this season.
- Virginia threw out 26-of-63 (41.3%) potential base stealers last season.

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 14-for-31 (.452).
- Bruno had a grand slam against Rhode Island and was 3-for-3 against Dartmouth last Sunday.
- Gagnani posted a pair of hits in each of his starts at DH last weekend and had the go-ahead two-run single in the Sunday win vs. Wright State.
- Taylor hit a big run-scoring triple in the ninth inning in UVa's win at East Carolina Feb. 21.

VIRGINIA RANKS 29TH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 1,993 per game, Virginia ranks 29th nationally in attendance through the first three weeks of the season.
- Virginia's attendance is up nearly 900 fans per game from the same point last season.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa averaged 1,513 fans per game last season. The UVa single-season attendance average record is 1,774, set in 2007.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia has earned a No. 1 ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com for the third straight week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia currently has three teams ranked No. 1 – baseball, men's lacrosse and men's tennis.

DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START

- Through 12 games, Virginia has committed just 10 errors – good for an impressive .979 fielding pct.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon comes into the weekend with 725 career at bats, which is eighth in UVa history; he needs nine ABs to match Ryan Zimmerman (2003-05) for seventh.
- Cannon is in ninth place in career games played with 196.
- Cannon now has 49 doubles – tied for third at UVa. He needs three to reach second.
- He also is tied for second in career triples (11) and 10th in HBP (19) and also is 10th in runs scored (148).
- Cannon is nearing the top 10 in hits (217) and stolen bases (39).

ARICO, PARKER MOVE UP IN UVA ANNALS

- With his save Sunday, Kevin Arico now has 15 career saves – good for fourth in Virginia history. He needs one to match Michael Schwimer (2005-08) for third.
- With his triple at ECU, Jarrett Parker has hit 11 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVa history. He needs two more three-baggers to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,016 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 190 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (131), Jarrett Parker (122) and Phil Gosselin (115) each have more than 100 career starts.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.

CAPTAIN OF THE WEEK

- Instead of naming team captains for the season, UVa has decided that all 35 players are responsible to take captain roles throughout the year.
- Each week, one player will be designated the team captain and don the captain's C on his jersey.

- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVA ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

CAVALIERS RANK THIRD IN SB SINCE 2006

- Virginia ranks third nationally in stolen bases the last four years with 495 (123.7 per year).
- UVA trails only Prairie View and Jackson State over that span.
- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVA has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVA had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

NEXT MAN UP ON MOUND

- While Virginia has plenty of arms returning, they still need players to step up, particularly in the bullpen.
- Senior Neal Davis and freshman Aaron Stull both will be key left-handed options.
- From the right side, Kevin Arico, Corey Hunt, Ryan Briggs, Tyler Wilson, Chad O'Connor, Branden Kline, Shane Halley, Will Roberts, Justin Thompson, Cody Winarski and Whit Mayberry all will have chances to step up for UVA.

NEWCOMERS ADD TALENT, DEPTH

- UVA welcomes a top-10 recruiting class this year, including five who were previously drafted.
- Stephen Bruno, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor all will push the returning infielders at second, third and shortstop for immediate playing time.
- Kenny Swab (C/1B/OF) and Ryan Levine (C/1B) each are physical players who add power to the lineup.
- Ryan Briggs, Branden Kline, Cody Winarski, Whit Mayberry and Aaron Stull all provide pitching options.
- Rob Amaro gives UVA another option at first or behind the plate, while Colin Harrington adds depth in the infield and outfield.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVA's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVA opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.

2009 IN REVIEW

- Virginia finished 49-15-1 (16-11-1 ACC) and advanced to the College World Series for the first time in program history.
- UVA won the NCAA Irvine Regional and Oxford Super Regional – the program's first NCAA regional and super regional championships.
- UVA defeated Clemson, UNC, Duke and Florida State to win the ACC Baseball Championship – the third ACC crown in school history. Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, .533) was named the tournament MVP, while Danny Hultzen and Franco Valdes joined him on the All-Tournament Team.
- As the sixth seed, UVA became the lowest seed ever to win the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The Cavaliers won a school-record 49 games, while posting a record .761 winning percentage.
- Brian O'Connor was named the NCBWA and CBI National Coach of the Year.
- UVA led the ACC in batting (.327), ERA (3.23) and stolen bases (119) – the first school since Maryland in 1954 to lead the ACC in all three categories.
- UVA ranked third nationally with a 3.23 ERA.
- The Cavaliers set 11 team school records, including hits (767), runs (507) and strikeouts (593).
- Virginia had a school-record five players picked to the All-ACC First Team – Tyler Cannon (SS), Phil Gosselin (2B), Dan Grovatt (OF), Danny Hultzen (UTL) and Jarrett Parker (OF).
