VIRGINIA AT THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia has won three ACC tournament titles (1996, 2009, 2011).
- UVA has played in each of the 44 ACC tournaments, joining Clemson as the only schools to do so.
- UVA is 56-72 all-time at the ACC Baseball Championship and 4-5 as the 4-seed.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), Virginia is 25-19 in the tournament.
- The Cavaliers have been a top-four seed in 10 of O'Connor's 14 seasons.

CAVALIERS AGAINST POOL OPPONENTS

- Virginia went 3-3 this season against the other members of its pool, dropping two of three games at Clemson and winning two of three at home against Duke.
- UVA coach Brian O'Connor is 26-9 career against Clemson and 33-11 vs. Duke.
- UVA's all-time, 2017 and ACC tourney history against its pool opponents:

IT'S THE POSTSEASON ALREADY? A QUICK RECAP ...

- Virginia eclipsed the 40-win mark in the regular season for the first time since 2014 and already has its 11th 40-win season in the last 14 years.
- After dropping three of its first four ACC series, Virginia won its last six series and (most consecutive series wins since nine straight in 2014).
- Since the start of April, UVA has gone 21-6, including 14-6 in ACC play.
- UVA led the ACC in batting (.325) and hit a league-best .311 in ACC games.
- UVA finished second to UNC in the ACC Coastal Division.
- Adam Haseley was the regular-season ACC batting champion (.400) and also leads the league in runs (64) and on-base percentage (.498).

SIX CAVALIERS EARN ALL-ACC HONORS, MURDOCK ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM

- Adam Haseley (OF) and Pavin Smith (1B) each earned first-team honors, while Cameron Simmons (OF) nabbed second-team laurels.
- Robbie Coman (C), Ernie Clement (SS) and Tommy Doyle (RP) notched third-team honors.
- Smith was a second-team honoree in 2016, while Clement was a second-team honoree at second base last year. Coman, Doyle, Haseley and Simmons each were first-time honorees.
- Noah Murdock (P) was an All-Freshman Team honoree.

MCCARTHY EARNS PLAYER OF WEEK HONORS

- UVA outfielder Jake McCarthy was named the ACC Player of the Week Monday.
- He went 12-for-21 (.571) with a home run and six RBI while recording four straight multiple-hit games last week.
- He recorded his first career two-home run game Thursday in the series opener at Georgia Tech and followed it up Friday with his first career four-hit game.
- Six of McCarthy's 12 hits went for extra bases.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Virginia recorded its most regular-season wins since 2014 and has its 11th 40-win season in the last 14 years.
- Virginia recorded a .500 or better ACC record for the 14th straight year (10 prior to 2004).
- Pavin Smith owns a UVA-record 70 RBI this year and ranks second in career RBI with 171.
- In eight games since moving back to the 2-hole, Jake McCarthy is batting .500 (18-36) with 7 XBH.
- UVA ranks fourth nationally in batting (.325).
- UVA boasts four players among the ACC's top 12 in batting.
- Adam Haseley has reached base safely in 52 of 53 games, including a current streak of 35 straight (most at UVA since Joe McCarthy - 36 in 2013).
- UVA has hit 59 home runs - tied for second most in the O'Connor era and fifth most in school history.

HASELEY HAVING HISTORIC SEASON

- Adam Haseley is just the third player to bat .400 in the regular season under Brian O'Connor, joining Keith Wer- man (.446 in 2010) and Mike Papi (.408 in 2013).
- Haseley is putting up team highs in batting (.400), extra-base hits (30) and on base percentage (.498) while hitting in the 3-hole.
- He leads the ACC in batting, runs (64) and OBP, ranks second in slugging (.688), third in hits (82), fourth in walks (40) and seventh in home runs (14) and RBI (53).

MORE ON HASELEY

- Adam Haseley has reached base safely in 52 of his 53 games, including 35 straight (longest at UVA since Joe McCarthy reached in 36 straight in 2013).
- He is on the John Olerud Two-Way Player Award and Golden Spikes Award watch lists and is a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy.
- Haseley owns a team-high 14 home runs – seven of which have gone to the opposite field. He is tied for sixth in UVA single-season history in homers.
- He also is 7-1 with a 3.58 ERA in 65 1/3 innings on the mound.

NOTING THE GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- Virginia rebounded from a series-opening defeat to take two of three games at Georgia Tech last weekend.
- The Cavaliers racked up 33 runs and 42 hits, their most in

any ACC series this year, and batted .356 in the series.

- Jake McCarthy was 9-for-16 with three doubles and two homers, while Robbie Coman and Adam Haseley each were 6-for-11.

NOTING THE DUKE SERIES

- Virginia rebounded from an ugly Friday loss to post 13-6 wins Saturday and Sunday (March 25 & 26) in its ninth straight series win over Duke.
- UVA scored in double figures in back-to-back ACC games for the first time since May 10-11, 2013, also against Duke.
- UVA had 20 hits and no strikeouts in the Saturday win.
- Adam Haseley was 5-for-11 with six runs scored in the series, while Caleb Knight was 5-for-10 and Charlie Cody was 5-for-11 (2B, 2 HR, 4 RBI).

NOTING THE CLEMSON SERIES

- Virginia dropped two-of-three games at Clemson (March 17-19), snapping a streak of seven straight series wins against the Tigers, dating to 2005.
- UVA blanked Clemson 2-0 in the opener behind 7 2/3 innings of four-hit baseball from starter Daniel Lynch.
- UVA fell behind 6-0 after one inning in Game 2, but the bullpen fired 7 1/3 innings of one-run, five-hit baseball to give the Cavaliers a chance to win it in a 7-6 defeat.
- Pavin Smith and Cameron Simmons each homered and were a team-best 4-for-11 (.364) in the series. Adam Haseley was 4-for-12.
- Virginia left 25 runners on base in the series, including 19 in the two losses.

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- UVA batters have struck out an ACC-low 203 times in 54 games (3.7 per game).
- That total by far the fewest among all power-conference teams. Oregon State has the second-fewest at 297. (Louisville second fewest in ACC with 338).
- Seven ACC teams have struck out twice as many times as Virginia.
- UVA is the only ACC team to walk more than it has struck out (239 BB).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 46 of 54 games.
- Ernie Clement (1st), Pavin Smith (2nd) and Robbie Coman (8th) all rank among the top 10 nationally in toughest to strike out and are the three toughest to whiff in the ACC.

CAVALIERS EYE ACC BATTING TITLE

- Virginia leads the ACC in batting at .325, 13 points ahead of Wake Forest.
- UVA is in line to lead the conference in batting for the first time since 2013.
- UVA also won ACC batting crowns in 2009 and 2010.
- This is UVA's team batting average since 2010 - tied with the 1998 team for fifth best in program history.
- UVA's 18 triples ranks ninth in program history, while the Cavaliers' 59 homers is tied for fifth in school history.
- UVA is averaging 7.98 runs per game, matching the 1981 team for fourth in the program's annals.
- In ranking ninth nationally in scoring at 7.98 runs per game, UVA is fourth among all Division I teams in batting and 10th in hits (614).

SIMMONS CONTINUES HOT STREAK

- After a hot April, Cameron Simmons has continued his solid work at the plate since the finals break.
- He currently is batting .373 (fourth in the ACC).
- He is batting .374 in ACC games, tops among UVA players and third in the ACC.
- He is seventh in the ACC in on-base percentage (.455) and RBI (53).

- Simmons has recorded multi-hit games in seven of his last 10 games and had a streak of eight straight multi-hit games earlier this year.

MCCARTHY THRIVES IN 2-HOLE

- Jake McCarthy batted a solid .291 in his first 25 games, but is batting .393 in the last 29 contests, which is tied with Adam Haseley and Cam Simmons for the team lead.
- After batting in the 9-hole for 19 games, McCarthy moved back into the 2-slot eight games ago and is batting .500 (18-36) with a pair of triples and three home runs in that time.
- McCarthy is 27-for-29 in stolen bases this year, the third-most steals in one season at UVA and most since 2008. It ranks ninth nationally this year.

TOP HITTERS LIST

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley were listed as the top two college hitters recently by D1Baseball.com.
- The list was compiled after polling scouts and coaches from across the nation.
- According to D1Baseball, the "list is geared toward ranking the college hitters with the best pure "hit tool" on the scouting scale MLB scouts use to analyze these players for the upcoming draft."

CAVALIERS MASHING

- UVA has hit 59 home runs, tied for the second most in the Brian O'Connor era and the fifth most in program history.
- The top two home run seasons under O'Connor: 2010 (61) and 2009 (59), both of which came with the old bats.
- This ties the 1998 and 2009 teams for fifth in school history. The top HR seasons at UVA: 1988 (67), 1996 (62), 2010 (61) and 2002 (60).
- The Cavaliers hit 42 home runs in 2016 (60 games).
- Twelve Cavaliers have gone deep this year.
- Adam Haseley is seventh in the ACC with 14 home runs, while Pavin Smith has 12 homers.
- UVA had a streak of 10 straight games with at least one home run snapped on April 19 (longest since 11-game stretch from Feb. 28-March 15, 1998).

RUN, RUN AND RUN SOME MORE

- Virginia has stolen 75 bases this year (in 89 attempts), its most since swiping 90 in 2011 (68 games). UVA ranks second in the ACC to Louisville (82) in stolen bases.
- Four Cavaliers have at least nine stolen bases. UVA's leader in 2016 was Ernie Clement with six.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 27 steals in 29 tries. He ranks ninth nationally.
- It marks the third-most steals in a season for a UVA player and the most since Greg Miclat had 30 in 2008.
- UVA stole 27 bases in 60 games last year, its fewest stolen bases during the Brian O'Connor era.

PAVIN SMITH: NOT YOUR NORMAL POWER HITTER

- Pavin Smith has put up some big numbers this season, hitting for power as well as contact.
- Smith has more home runs (12) than strikeouts (8).
- He ranks as the second toughest to strike out of any player in Division I, with eight strikeouts in 210 official at bats (252 plate appearances).

DOYLE NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Junior right-hander Tommy Doyle was named to the midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List.
- Doyle is 3-1 with 13 saves in 21 outings this year.
- He is second in the ACC and 10th nationally in saves. Eight of his saves came in ACC play.
- He has struck out 35 and walked eight over 32 1/3 innings out of the bullpen.

BETTINGER HAVING BIG YEAR OUT OF PEN

- Senior right-hander Alec Bettinger has worn many hats during his career, working as a starter, reliever and closer.
- This year he primarily has worked as a long reliever. In 12 of his 18 appearances this year, he has worked more than two innings, including eight of his last nine outings.
- He is tied for second in the league with eight wins (8-0 record) and owns a 2.65 ERA in 54 1/3 innings while limiting opponents to a .176 batting average.
- He is now 22-10 in his career (tied for fourth in wins in school history).
- Bettinger has appeared in 79 career games (eighth in school history; moves to seventh with next outing).

TIME TO ... GO TO WORK!

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley are the first UVA teammates to each record at least 10 homers in a season since Phil Gosselin (11), Jarrett Parker (10) and Steven Proscia (10) in 2010.
- Haseley (14) is seventh in the ACC in home runs, while Smith has 12. Cameron Simmons is not far off with eight.

- UVA is first nationally in sacrifice flies with 37 and 21st in sacrifice bunts with 47.
- UVA also has been hit by 59 pitches, which is fifth most in the conference.

HASELEY, SMITH NAMED TO MIDSEASON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia's junior duo of Adam Haseley and Pavin Smith were named to the 40-man midseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award.
- UVA is one of six schools to have two players on the list.
- Haseley was named to the midseason watch list for the second year in a row.

RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation this decade (372).
- UVA has won 637 games since 2004 – an average of more than 45 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 38 wins each of the last 14 years, including 11 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 that has completed its eligibility has played in at least one College World Series.

THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

- Virginia has qualified for 13 straight NCAA tournaments, including four CWS trips and UVA's first national championship in 2015.

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He was the 10th coach in ACC history to reach the 600-win plateau and, in 825 games, the second-fastest in league history to hit 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 637 career wins, O'Connor ranks ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (262) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

RECORDS WATCH

- Having pitched in 79 career games, RHP **Alec Bettinger** has appeared in the eighth-most contests in school history.
- Bettinger has won 22 career games – tied for fourth in UVA history.
- **Adam Haseley** stands fifth in school history with 181 runs scored and needs three to pass Matt Street (2002-05) and five to eclipse Tyler Cannon (2007-10) for fourth.
- Haseley is ninth in program history with 10 triples and will move into a fifth-place tie with his next triple.
- **Pavin Smith** (27 HR) is eighth in career HR at UVA and with 171 RBI is second in program history.
- Smith has a program-record 70 RBI this season.
- With 16 career saves, **Tommy Doyle** is tied for seventh in school history (would move to sixth with next save). He has 13 saves this year (seventh in UVA single-season history).
- **Jake McCarthy** (27 SB) is third in single-season stolen bases and needs three to reach the No. 2 slot (Greg Miclat, 2008). The record is 32, set by Miclat in 2007.

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 637-236-2 (.729) in his 14th season as UVA's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history on May 28, 2016, against Louisville.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's 14 seasons, including 11 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 637 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 13 seasons.

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia has posted the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- UVA has accrued a .973 fielding percentage over the last 13 seasons.
- UVA owns a .975 fielding percentage this year (fifth in ACC).

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years (combined .303 average) and is tops again this season (.325).
