## Noting ACC Football

### Three Held Below 100 Total Yards

Three ACC teams (Boston College, Syracuse, Miami) held their opponents to under 100 total yards of offense last weekend, making the ACC the only conference to have three teams do so on the same weekend since at least 2000.

### 1943

Not since 1943 had **Clemson** played as many as 13 true freshmen in a season-opening game. That year, in the middle of World War II, Clemson's upperclassmen had all been drafted.

### 1967

When **Syracuse** held Rhode Island to just 64 yards of total offense, it marked the lowest total allowed by a Syracuse defense since 1967 when the 'Cuse held West Virginia to 61 yards.

### 1975

**Wake Forest's** 591 yards of total offense, recorded last Saturday against **Elon**, was the school's highest yardage output since a 598-yard performance against **Virginia** in 1975.

### 1992

When **Boston College** held **Maine** to just 91 total yards in its season-opening win, it marked the fewest yards allowed by BC since yielding only 75 yards to **Northwestern** in 1992.

### The Conference of NFL Quarterbacks?

As of Tuesday, Sept. 8, NFL rosters included 18 quarterbacks who played at current ACC schools. That is the most of any conference nationally. In all, 16 of the 18 were on active rosters and six were projected starters.

## Wake Forest Faces Syracuse in Initial 2015 ACC Game

*UVa Hosts No. 11 Notre Dame in First of Six ACC-Irish Clashes*

After its teams went 10-4 in the 2015 season's opening week, the ACC begins league play in Week Two when Atlantic Division rivals **Wake Forest** and **Syracuse** meet Saturday in the Carrier Dome (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...Both teams are coming off impressive victories in their season-openers...**Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by QB **John Wolford**, piled up 591 yards of total offense, the most yards for the Deacons since 1975, in a 41-3 win over **Elon**...**Syracuse**, coached by **Scott Shafer**, held Rhode Island to just 64 yards of total offense, the fewest yards permitted by the Orange since 1967, in a 47-0 season-opening triumph...Syracuse lost starting QB **Terrel Hunt** for the season with an injured achilles but received strong performances from true freshmen QB **Eric Dungey** and TB **Jordan Fredericks**...**Virginia**, coached by **Mike London**,

faces its second consecutive Top 15 test when it hosts 10th-ranked **Notre Dame** Saturday at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va. (3:30 pm, ABC)...The Cavaliers, led by QB **Matt Johns**, dropped a 34-16 decision to 13th-ranked UCLA last weekend...Notre Dame, which is coached by **Brian Kelly** and led by QB **Malik Zaire**, is making the first of six appearances against ACC teams this fall and its first appearance in Charlottesville...**Miami** begins the weekend early facing instate foe Florida Atlantic Friday night (8 pm, FOX Sports 1) at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Fla...The Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden** and led by QB **Brad Kaaya**, overcame an hour weather delay to down Bethune-Cookman 45-0 in its season-opener...**Miami** is facing FAU of Conference USA for just the second time, and is making its first appearance

Another Sunshine State matchup will occur several miles to the north, as 11th-ranked **Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **QB Everett Golson** and **RB Dalvin Cook**, host **South Florida** of the American Athletic Conference on Saturday at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee (11:30 am, ESPN)... The Seminoles, who are coming off an impressive 59-16 win over Texas State, are looking to extend their 15-game home winning streak against the Bulls...Golson, in his debut with the Seminoles, recorded a 230.3 pass efficiency rating, the fourth best nationally...USF is coached by Willie Taggart...In **Louisville**, the Cardinals of Coach **Bobby Petrino** will host Houston of the American at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium (Noon, RSN)...Louisville true freshman **QB Lamar Jackson** will make his first collegiate start after rushing (106) and passing (100) for at least 100 yards each in the Cardinals close loss to sixth-ranked Auburn...Houston, which opened with a 52-24 win over Tennessee Tech, is coached by former Ohio State offensive coordinator Tom Herman, who is in his first season as a head coach...The game is the first of a doubleheader on the ACC's Regional Sports Networks...12th-ranked Clemson, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Deshaun Watson**, hosts Appalachian State of the Sun Belt Conference, at Memorial Stadium (12:30 pm, ESPN3)...The Tigers recorded their largest margin of victory in a season-opener since 2006 in a 49-10 win over Wofford...Appalachian State is coached by Scott Satterfield, and enters with a seven-game winning streak...In Chestnut Hill, Mass., **Boston College**, coached by **Steve Addazio** hosts Howard of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference at Alumni Stadium (1 pm, ESPN3)...The Eagles are led by **QB Darius Wade** and a stingy defense featuring **LB Steven Daniels**...Howard is coached by Gary Harrell...In Atlanta, 15th-ranked **Georgia Tech** hosts a **Tulane (3:30 pm, RSN)** team that will be facing its second straight ACC opponent...The Green Wave, coached Curtis Johnson, dropped a 37-7 decision to Duke in its home opener last week...The Jackets of Coach **Paul Johnson** enjoyed a 69-6 win over Alcorn State in their season opener as freshman B-Back **Marcus Marshall** ran for 184 yards on just eight carries (23.0 avg.)... Marshall's total was the third highest nationally for last weekend...In Blacksburg, Va., Virginia Tech, coached by **Frank Beamer**, hosts Furman of the Southern Conference (3:30, ESPN3)...The Hokies are coming off a 42-24 loss to top-

ranked Ohio State in which starting **QB Michael Brewer** suffered a left shoulder injury and will not be available for this Saturday's game with the Palladins...Furman is coached by Bruce Fowler...In Durham, N.C., **Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, host cross-town foe North Carolina Central of the MEAC at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium (6 pm, ESPN3)... The Blue Devils are led by junior **QB Thomas Sirk** and junior **S DeVon Edwards**, who recorded his fourth career kickoff return for a TD in Duke's win over Tulane...NC Central is coached by Jerry Mack...In Chapel Hill, N.C., North Carolina, coached by **Larry Fedora**, hosts in-state foe North Carolina A&T at Kenan Stadium (6 pm, ESPN3)... Led by sophomore **RB Elijah Hood**, who rushed for a career-high 138 yards in the Tar Heels' close loss (17-13) to South Carolina...UNC is facing an Aggie squad, coached by longtime ACC assistant Rod Broadway, that opened its season with a 61-7 win over Shaw... # ACC Football By The Numbers

**.913** - The completion percentage for NC State **QB Jacoby Brissett** after just one week of the season. Brissett completed 21 of 23 passes in NC State's 49-21 win over Troy, which leads the nation in completion percentage. Brissett has now thrown 93 consecutive passes without an interception. Clemson's **Deshaun Watson** was tied for fourth nationally in completion percentage (.818).

**.925** - The career field-goal percentage of Florida State **PK Robert Aguayo**, who leads all active placekickers with 25 or more career attempts. Aguayo has made 49 of his 53 career field goal attempts. Aguayo has made 157 consecutive PAT attempts.

**2** - Louisville junior **S Josh Harvey-Clemons** had big shoes to fill in helping to replace Jim Thorpe Award-winner Gerald Holliman in the Cardinal secondary. Holliman led the nation in interceptions in 2014, tying an NCAA single-season record with 14. Saturday, against sixth-ranked Auburn, Harvey-Clemons picked right up where Holliman left off, picking off a pair of passes, while also making a game-high 14 tackles

**4** - When Duke's **DeVon Edwards** returned a Tulane kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in the Blue Devils' season-opening win, it marked the fourth kickoff returned for a score for Edwards. The ACC career record is seven by former Clemson standout C.J. Spiller (2006-09). In all, Edwards has six returns for TDs in his career, having returned a pair of interceptions for scores.

**11** - The number of pass receptions for Duke **WR Johnell Barnes** in the Blue Devils' 37-7 triumph over Tulane. Barnes recorded his first career 100-yard receiving agme with 109 yards against the Green Wave. He ranked fourth nationally this week.

**23.0** - The average yards per carry for Georgia Tech freshman **B-Back Marcus Marshall** in the Yellow Jackets' win over Alcorn State. Marshall had 184 yards on just eight carries, including touchdown runs of 49 and 64 yards. His total of 184 yards was the third best nationally.

**24** - **Florida State** has won 24 consecutive games against ACC opponents, dating back to a 17-16 loss at NC State in 2012. The Seminoles own the record for most consecutive ACC wins. They established the mark by winning their first 29 league games from 1992 until a loss at Virginia in 1995.

**40** - The number of years since **Wake Forest** gained at least 591 yards of total offense in a single game, which occurred in 1975 when the Deacons gained 598 versus Virginia. Wake totalled 591 in its season opener against Elon.

**55** - The number of career field goals for Duke senior **PK Ross Martin**, who is the active career leader among all ACC kickers. Martin, who made all three of his FG attempts in Duke's season-opening win over Tulane, has made 55 of his 66 career attempts, an .833 percentage.

**59** - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles just one game into his sixth season as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .843 (59-11) is the best of any ACC coach after his first six seasons as a head coach.

**64** - The number of total yards allowed by **Syracuse** in the Orange's 47-0 season-opening win over Rhode Island. The 'Cuse faces Wake Forest this week, which gained 591 yards against Elon last week.

**69** - When **Georgia Tech** scored 69 points against Alcorn State in its season-opener last Thursday night, it marked the fourth time a Paul Johnson-coached Tech squad had scored 65 or more points in a game in this, his eighth season on The Flats.

**76** - North Carolina **TB Elijah Hood**, who rushed for a career-high 138 yards on 12 carries against South Carolina, topped his previous career high by 76 yards. His previous high was 62 yards vs. Rutgers in the 2014 Quick Lane Bowl. His 138 rushing yards are the most by a Tar Heel in a season-opener since Torin Dorn gained 165 vs. Illinois on Sept. 5, 1987.

**130** - The **ACC** had 130 nominations to preseason watch teams for the 2015

season. The league led all conferences in players selected to the Manning (QB), Groza (PK), Mackey (TEs) and Wuerffel (Community Service) watch lists and tied for first or finished second for four others (O'Brien, Bednarik, Thorpe, Guy).

**145** - In his last four games, dating back to 2014, but including games against Florida, Georgia Tech, Oregon and Texas State, Florida State **TB Dalvin Cook** has averaged rushing for 145.0 yards per game. During that time Cook has also averaged 6.5 yards per carry (89-580).

**207** - The rushing yardage total for Pitt freshman running back **Qadree Ollison** in Saturday's win over Youngstown State. Ollison became the first freshman in ACC history to run for 200 or more yards in the opening game of the season and he did it in just the second half after an injury sidelined Pitt's James Conner. Ollison's total ranks 2nd nationally on the opening weekend of the season.

**230.3** - Maybe its just Bobby Bowden Field at Doak Campbell Stadium, but Florida State **QB Everett Golson** seems to light up in Tallahassee, Golson posted a 230.3 pass efficiency mark in his Seminole debut against Texas State, the fourth-best rating of the weekend in the FBS. In two games at Doak Campbell, one for FSU and one against, Golson has completed 50 of 77 passes for 615 yards, seven touchdowns and only two interceptions.

**273** - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314).

**2,435** - The number of career pass receiving yards for Pitt preseason All-American **WR Tyler Boyd**. Boyd is the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in each of his freshman and sophomore seasons.

Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** is ninth on the list averaging 9.2 wins per season with Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** right behind, averaging 9.17 wins a year. Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** is 15th, averaging 8.71 wins during his seven-year stay at Clemson, which includes a partial seven-game campaign in 2008. Virginia Tech's

**Frank Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, ranks 24th overall, averaging 8.03 wins for his 34-year career.

## Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 273 triumphs in his 34-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach **Paul Johnson** ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 166 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach **Bobby Bowden**, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

## Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

## Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).



## North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

After three seasons with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 15 times and bettered 30 points 24 times in 38 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 35.4 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first three seasons, UNC has averaged 446 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



## NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning its final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 18 of 20 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .900, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 23 of his first 26 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .885. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18

years in the league.

## Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins over the past two seasons, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to almost as many wins (41) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham





# Preseason Predictions; All-ACC

## ACC Football Kickoff Media Tabs Clemson to Unseat Florida State For ACC Football Title

VILLAGE OF PINEHURST, N.C. -- Clemson is the preseason favorite to claim the Atlantic Coast Conference football championship, according to a poll of 158 media members in attendance at the 2015 ACC Football Kickoff at Pinehurst Resort.

The Tigers were also picked over three-time defending ACC champion Florida State to capture the Atlantic Division, while Georgia Tech was favored to repeat as the Coastal Division winner.

Clemson quarterback Deshaun Watson, who established himself as one of the nation's rising stars as a true freshman last season, was voted the 2015 ACC Preseason Player of the Year.

The Tigers were picked the likely overall champions of the ACC on 84 ballots, followed by Florida State with 41 and Georgia Tech with 20. Virginia Tech (7 votes), North Carolina (3), Miami (2) and NC State (1) rounded out the balloting.

In the Atlantic Division preseason voting, Clemson received 101 first-place votes and led with 1,032 total points. Florida State received 56 first-place votes and finished second with 992 points, while Louisville had one first-place vote and was third in the voting with 746 points. Georgia Tech was selected the likely Coastal winner by 96 voters and finished with 991 total points, followed by Virginia Tech with 44 first-place votes and 841 points. Miami received seven first-place votes and was third with 632 total points.

## Clemson Headlines 2015 All-ACC Preseason Football Team With Five Players Selected

VILLAGE OF PINEHURST, N.C.— Clemson led all schools with five selections to the 2015 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Football Team announced July 23.

The team was selected by a vote of 163 media members who were credentialed for the 2015 ACC Football Kickoff at Pinehurst Resort.

Clemson sophomore quarterback Deshaun Watson, who was voted the ACC Preseason Player of the Year, is joined on the All-ACC preseason team by Tiger wide receivers Mike Williams and Artavis Scott, offensive guard Eric Mac Lain and defensive end Shaq Lawson.

Florida State and Virginia Tech each placed four student-athletes on the 2015 All-ACC preseason team, while Pitt had three selected.

Watson, who threw for 1,466 yards and 14 touchdowns despite being limited to eight games and five starts last season due to injuries, is joined in the offensive backfield by running backs James Conner of Pitt and Shadrach Thornton of NC State.

Conner, a 2014 All-American and the reigning ACC Player of the Year, led the conference and ranked among the nation's leaders with 1,765 yards rushing and an ACC-record 26 touchdowns as a sophomore. Thornton, a rising senior, ranks 10th in NC State history with 2,369 career rushing yards and 12th all-time among Wolfpack ball-carriers with 16 career rushing touchdowns.

Clemson's Williams and Scott are joined on the preseason All-ACC wide receiving corps by Pitt junior Tyler Boyd, the first player in ACC history to compile 1,000 receiving yards in both his freshman and sophomore seasons. Williams joined Boyd as one of four ACC players with at least 1,000 receiving yards in 2014, and Scott was close behind with 965.

Preseason All-ACC tight end recognition goes to Virginia Tech's Bucky Hodges, a redshirt sophomore who broke in last season with 45 receptions for 526 yards

and six TDs. He is joined on the offensive line by Florida State's Roderick Johnson and Pitt's Adam Bisnowaty at tackle. North Carolina's Landon Turner and Clemson's Mac Lain man the guard spots, while Duke's Matt Skura was selected at the center position.

Three defensive ends were selected due to ties in the voting, with Virginia Tech's Dadi Lhomme Nicolas joining Clemson's Lawson and Louisville's Sheldon Rankins. Adam Gotsis of defending Coastal Division champion Georgia Tech is a choice at defensive tackle, along with Virginia Tech's Luther Maddy.

Florida State's Terrance Smith, Wake Forest's Brandon Chubb and Louisville's James Burgess form the preseason All-ACC linebacker corps.

The secondary features a trio of returning All-Americans in cornerbacks Jalen Ramsey of Florida State and Kendall Fuller of Virginia Tech, as well as Duke safety Jeremy Cash. Virginia's Quin Blanding, the 2014 ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year, also earned a spot at safety on the preseason team.

The special teams include junior All-America place-kicker Roberto Aguayo, whose 293 total points in two seasons already ranks eighth on Florida State's all-time list. Wake Forest's Alex Kinal earned the spot at punter, while North Carolina's Ryan Switzer is the choice at return specialist.

Pitt's Conner led the overall voting, being chosen by 148 of the 163 media members casting ballots. Florida State's Aguayo received 141 votes.

Boyd, Conner, Aguayo, Fuller and Ramsey were all named first-team All-ACC last year, while Scott, Williams, Nicolas, Gotsis, Smith, Cash, Blanding and Kinal all earned second-team All-ACC. Switzer, Hodges, Turner, Skura and Rankins were 2014 third-team All-ACC selections.

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.  
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

## The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

## ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Boston College and Penn State ended regulation tied at 24-24 in the Pinstripe Bowl, they played the 71st game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 71 overtime contests, a large portion of them--29--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 71 overtime contests, 35 have been ACC games while 36 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 38-24 advantage in the 62 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 37-34 record. Fifty-two of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
