VIRGINIA AT THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia has won three ACC tournament titles (1996, 2009, '11) – all in Durham.
- UVa has won eight straight ACC tournament games in Durham.
- UVa now has played in each of the 40 ACC tournaments.
- Virginia is 51-64 all-time at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), Virginia is 20-10 in the tournament.

CAVALIERS AGAINST POOL B OPPONENTS

- Virginia went 5-4 this season against its foes from Pool B.

VIRGINIA TIES PROGRAM RECORD FOR REGULAR-SEASON WINS

- Virginia earned 45 regular-season wins, tying the 2006 and 2011 teams for the most in program history.
- This marks the fifth-most wins in a season in UVa baseball history, matching the 2007 season.
- The only UVa seasons with more wins: 2011 (56), 2010 (51), 2009 (49) and 2006 (47).

CAVALIERS HIT 40 WINS FOR EIGHTH TIME IN 10 YEARS

- Virginia recorded its 40th win of the year last Friday, reaching the 40-win plateau for the eighth time in the last 10 seasons.
- UVa had one season of 40 wins or more prior to 2004 (1996).
- UVa has recorded 39 wins or more in all 10 years under the current coaching staff (39 wins in 2008, 2012).

SIX CAVALIERS NAMED ALL-ACC

- Virginia boasted a conference-high six players on the 2013 All-ACC Team.
- UVa had four players on the All-ACC First Team: Kyle Crockett (relief pitcher), Reed Gragnani (second base), Nick Howard (utility) and Mike Papi (outfield).
- Joe McCarthy was named to the second team at outfield, while Brandon Cogswell was a second-team honoree at shortstop.

ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa won eight of its 10 ACC series, posted the most ACC wins and played the ACC's toughest SOS in conference.
- Virginia stands third nationally in the latest NCAA RPI report (as of May 14).
- UVa is first in the ACC in batting (.317), fourth in ERA (3.11) and seventh in fielding (.969).
- Mike Papi leads the nation in on base percentage (.546).
- UVa has recorded at least eight hits in 13 of its last 14 games.

POTENT LINEUP FROM TOP TO BOTTOM

- There is not an easy out in the Virginia lineup, as all nine Virginia starters are batting at least .276, while seven are batting over .300.
- Five Cavaliers have at least 44 RBI apiece, including Reed Gragnani, who owns 48 RBI while typically batting in the 7- or 8-hole.
- UVa's 10 regulars in the lineup all own on base percentages of .350 or better, while five are over .400.

CAVALIERS FINISH OFF DEGREES

- Seven members of the Virginia baseball program earned degrees Sunday from the University of Virginia.
- Rob Amaro (sociology), Reed Gragnani (history), Colin Harrington (chemistry), Whit Mayberry (commerce) and manager Taylor Myers (psychology) all earned their bachelor's degrees.
- Jared King (kinesiology) and Scott Silverstein (education) earned their master's degrees.
- King and Silverstein have been on five UVa teams that have combined for 240 wins, while the fourth-year class has been a part of 191 victories.

OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG INNINGS REGULARLY

- Virginia has scored three or more runs in an inning 66 times this year.
- UVa has recorded three runs in an inning on 29 occasions this year.
- UVa has outscored foes 220-68 in the fifth through eighth innings: 43-18 in fifth, 49-18 in sixth, 52-16 in seventh and 76-16 in eighth.
- UVa averages 8.3 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 447-209.

HOT WAHOO BATS

- Virginia has been scorching at the plate since returning from its exam break on May 10. UVa has hit .380 as a team in the seven games since coming back, while recording at least eight hits in each.
- UVa has scored at least five runs in each game, totaling 77 in the seven-game stretch.
- Twenty-nine of the hits have gone for extra bases (20 2B, 5 3B, 4 HR).
- In a four-game stretch from May 11-16, UVa recorded four consecutive double-figure scoring outputs for the first time since racking up five straight from April 28-May 4, 2010.

PAPI RED-HOT AGAIN

- Mike Papi leads the nation with a .546 on-base percentage and ranks fourth in batting (.408) and 14th in slugging (.669).
- Papi has been hot at the plate of late, going 14-for-29 with 13 runs and 13 RBI since UVa returned from its final break (all in leadoff spot in batting order).
- Papi has been named the ACC Player of the Week each of the last two weeks and owns hits in 10 of his last 12 games.
- He has scored at least one run in all seven of his games in the leadoff slot.
- Since being inserted into the Cavaliers' lineup as a pinch hitter March 15 at Clemson, Papi is batting .438 (53-for-121) with 48 runs and 46 RBI (38 games).

VIRGINIA STANDS THIRD IN RPI

- Virginia holds a No. 3 standing in the latest NCAA RPI report (as of May 13).
- The Cavaliers stand behind Vanderbilt and UNC.
- UVa is 8-1 against the RPI top 10, 14-7 against the top 25 and 17-8 against the top 50.

NOTING THE UNC SERIES

- Virginia won a series in Chapel Hill for the first time since March 17-18, 2007.
- UNC was the highest-ranked opponent the Cavaliers have defeated in a road series since UVa won two of three at then-No. 1 UNC in 2007.
- Virginia hit .318 as a team in the series and racked up 11 extra-base hits.
- UVa's loss in Game 2 was its first this season when leading after seven innings (UVa is 38-1 when leading after seven innings).
- UVa scored first in all three games and trailed in just four innings in the series.

GRAGNANI A TOUGH OUT

- Despite batting in the bottom third of Virginia's batting order, Reed Gragnani has been a tough out for opposing pitchers.
- Nationally, he is the eighth toughest to strike out, with just nine strikeouts in 184 at bats (one per 20.4 AB).
- He also has been one of UVa's top run producers, with 48 RBI, which is third on the team and tied for 12th in the ACC.
- Gragnani has a team-high 18 RBI in his last 13 games.

LATE-INNING THUNDER

- Virginia has been strong in the late innings, outscoring its foes 161-54 from the seventh inning on this year.
- UVa owns three ninth-inning rallies from two runs or more down – 5-2 in ninth at Clemson, won 6-5 in 11; 6-2 at Wake Forest, won 7-6; 5-3 vs. Duke, won 6-5.
- The Cavaliers also rallied from five runs down in the sixth inning on April 17 against Old Dominion to win 10-9 in 10 innings.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Virginia scored its 19th comeback win of the season last Friday at North Carolina.
- UVa has rallied from three runs or more behind to win on seven occasions this year, with five coming in the sixth inning or later:

CROCKETT ANCHORS BULLPEN

- Junior lefty Kyle Crockett has closed out games this season and been sensational. He owns 10 saves, which ranks second in the ACC.
- Crockett was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List (one of 25 players nationally).
- Crockett has made 25 appearances this year, allowing just 10 earned runs while opponents have hit .200 against him. He appeared in 19 of UVa's 30 ACC games (most of any conference pitcher).
- He has made 84 career appearances – most on the staff and fifth most in program history.

VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to shut down its opponents' running games this year.
- Virginia has allowed just 30 stolen base attempts in 54 games, with 17 successful steals (57% success rate).
- The Cavaliers also have picked off 11 baserunners.
- UVa has given up just five stolen bases in eight attempts in the last 22 contests.
- UVa allowed three stolen bases to Maryland, which entered with 44 steals in 12 games, and none to NC State, who entered with 47 stolen bases in 53 attempts.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Twelve true freshmen have seen playing time.
- Seven true freshmen have accounted for 45 percent of the innings pitched this year (219 1/3 of 482 2/3 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started 52 of 54 contests in the batting order and currently is UVA's 3-hole hitter.

VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Virginia ranks third nationally in runs and scoring.
- The Cavaliers have scored 447 runs (8.3 per game) in 54 games.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 20 in eight statistical categories on offense.

FOUR CAVALIERS NAMED TO AWARD WATCH LISTS

- Three Virginia players recently have been named to watch lists for various national awards.
- Branden Cogswell is one of 25 players to be named to the watch list for the Wallace Award, presented to the nation's top shortstop.
- Kyle Crockett is one of 51 players on the NCBWA's watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award, which is given to the premier relief pitcher in NCAA baseball. He also is on the Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- Nick Howard stands as one of 25 players on the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award Watch List. UVA's Danny Hultzen won this award in 2011.
- Nate Irving was named to the watch list for the Johnny Bench Award for the nation's best catcher.

COGSWELL OUT WITH FRACTURED FINGER

- Branden Cogswell suffered a fractured finger in practice on May 4, breaking the middle finger on his right hand.
- He had surgery to repair the break and will be reevaluated prior to the ACC tournament.
- Cogswell was having a sensational year, batting .346 (10th in ACC) with a .464 on base percentage (seventh).
- Prior to his injury, Cogswell was the lone Cavalier to play in every game in 2013 and had reached base safely in 43 of 47 games this year.

MCCARTHY AMASSING HUGE ROOKIE YEAR

- Virginia freshman Joe McCarthy has put together an impressive rookie campaign. He currently ranks second among all ACC freshmen in batting with a .333 average (16th overall).
- He is second among ACC rookies in walks with 45 (fifth overall) and on base percentage at .460 (eighth overall).

MCCARTHY A REGULAR ON BASEPATHS

- Joe McCarthy was the only ACC player to reach base safely in every game this year until April 14 when he went 0-for-3 in the rain-shortened game at Georgia Tech.
- He has reached base safely in 49 of his 52 games.
- The rookie reached base safely in the first 36 games this year, the longest streak by a UVA player since Dan Grovatt reached base in 43 straight games in 2009.

- He owns a .460 on base percentage, which is third on the team and eighth in the ACC.
- He has the third-best OBP of any freshman in Division I this year.

DOWNES AN EXTRA-BASE HIT MACHINE

- In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has been solid and is batting .327 with a .401 on base percentage.
- Downes owns 34 extra-base hits and tops the team in home runs (8), triples (7), doubles (19), runs (60), RBI (56) and total bases (129).
- Downes is first in the ACC in triples, fifth in doubles and eighth in home runs.
- Downes ranks first on the team in hits (72) and runs and second in slugging (.586).

NO FREE PASSES ...

- Virginia pitchers make opposing batters earn their way on base. The UVA pitching staff has issued just 128 walks in 54 games, by far the fewest walks allowed in the ACC this year. Miami is second with 160.
- UVA allows just 2.39 walks per nine innings, which is fifth fewest nationally.
- The Cavaliers also have hit only 24 batters this year (third fewest nationally).

... BUT PLENTY OF FREEBIES FOR UVA BATTERS

- While the Cavaliers' pitchers have thrived on not issuing walks, Virginia batters have found plenty of ways to get on base.
- Virginia batters rank seventh nationally with 276 walks (fourth in ACC).
- UVA batters also have been hit by 66 pitches, which is third among ACC squads.
- The Cavaliers rank fourth nationally with a .415 on base percentage.

VIRGINIA TOPS 100,000 IN ATTENDANCE AGAIN

- Despite the chilly temperatures and poor weather earlier this year, Virginia ranks 12th nationally in total attendance (102,410) and 17th in average attendance (3,012) this year (third in ACC).
- More than 100,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past four seasons. UVA has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last four years.
- UVA ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand sold out once again this year.

UVA BREAKS SERIES ATTENDANCE RECORD

- Virginia broke the program's three-game series attendance record April 20-21 by drawing 13,890 fans for its series with Florida State.
- The program's three-game series record was 13,625, set April 13-15, 2012, against North Carolina.
- The final two games at Davenport Field each drew capacity crowds of 4,980.

UVA 10TH NATIONALLY IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up eight shutouts, which is tied for 10th in the country.
- UVA is three off the lead, which is held by Rice.
- The total is already tied with the 2007 squad for fourth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVA finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

PAPI MAKES A GRAND STATEMENT

- Mike Papi has had a flair for the dramatic this year.
- Two of his homers have been clutch, late-inning grand slams.
- Papi hit a seventh-inning grand slam to tie the game against Old Dominion.
- He hit a two-out grand slam on an 0-2 pitch in the ninth inning April 6 to rally UVA to a 7-6 win at Wake.
- Papi also blasted an 11th-inning homer to win the Clemson game on March 15, just two innings after he hit a two-out RBI single to tie the game in the ninth inning.

WADDELL STRONG IN FIRST YEAR

- Southpaw Brandon Waddell has been a standout while serving as UVa's Friday starter as a freshman.
- He owns 71 strikeouts in 74 1/3 innings this year; he ranks third among all freshmen nationally in strikeouts.
- He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.
- In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVa freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.
- On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

CAVALIERS OWN MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia has posted 240 wins since the start of the 2009 season – most in Division I baseball.
- South Carolina has 237 victories in that span, while Florida State has 233.
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.

FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors guiding the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has played 195 career games, with 176 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

O'CONNOR NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA'S COACH OF THE FIRST HALF

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor was tabbed the National Coach of the First Half by Baseball America on April 4.
- The Cavaliers racked up a 27-3 record (9-3 ACC) at that point despite featuring a lineup of primarily sophomores and freshmen as well as a freshman-laden pitching staff.

O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 456-158-2 (.738) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA FROM 2005-12

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past eight seasons, boasting a 3.14 team ERA from 2005-12.
- UVa was the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA from 2005-11 seasons; UVa was 57th with a 3.48 ERA last year.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2012 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also was the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each season from 2008-11.

- Brian O'Connor became just the second UVa coach to reach 400 career wins when UVa topped VCU on April 25, 2012; he is now 456-158-2 in his career.
- He was the second fastest to reach 400 wins in ACC history, doing so in his 546th game at UVa (400-144-2). Mike Martin (FSU) achieved this feat in 542 games.

- Jared King went 3-for-4 with three RBI in Game 1 of the series. Brandon Waddell earned the win in the opener, giving up six earned runs and eight hits in 5 2/3 innings.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- Virginia holds a 92-78 advantage in the all-time series with the Hokies.
- The Cavaliers dropped two of three games to the Hokies earlier this year in Blacksburg (April 26-27).

- Georgia Tech captured two of three games in the teams' series April 12-14 in Atlanta.
- The Yellow Jackets' took Game 1, 2-1, on a Buck Farmer complete-game gem.
- UVa cruised to a 7-2 victory in

Game 2, as Scott Silverstein tossed seven innings while allowing just a run, two hits and two walks while striking out nine.

- The Yellow Jackets took the rubber game, 3-2, in a game that was halted in the bottom of the sixth inning because of rain.
- Reed Gragnani had a big series, going 6-for-8 with a home run and three RBI. Derek Fisher was 5-for-11 (.455) with a homer and three RBI.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- Georgia Tech owns a 68-45-2 series edge over Virginia, although UVa is 18-13-1 against the Yellow Jackets since the current coaching staff took over in 2004.
- Recent games have been extremely tight – 25 of the 32 games since 2004 have been decided by three runs or fewer (14 by one run or a tie).
- UVa is 3-7 all-time against Georgia Tech in the ACC tournament, but the teams have played just three times in the postseason since 1997 (GT 4-3 in 2005 championship game, UVa 4-1 in 2007, GT 17-5 in 2012).

- Virginia swept a Saturday doubleheader, taking Game 1, 9-2, before shutting out the Semi-

noles, 2-0, in the nightcap.

- The Cavaliers finished off the sweep with a 5-2 win on Sunday.
- UVa did not trail at any point in the series.
- Jared King was 4-for-11 with three RBI to highlight the UVa offense. Neither team hit particularly well in the series, with UVa posting a .247 average and FSU hitting at a .154 clip.
- The teams combined for just five hits in Game 2 of the series, as Scott Silverstein and Kyle Crockett combined on a one-hitter, while Brandon Leibrandt gave up just four hits and two unearned runs.

ALL-TIME SERIES

- Florida State has a 48-23 advantage in the all-time series against Virginia.
- Virginia has won four of its last five series against FSU.
- The Cavaliers have won 12 of the last 18 meetings.
- UVa defeated FSU, 7-2, in the 2011 ACC Championship Game and is 7-7 all-time against FSU in the tournament.
