## ACC ADs Decide on Eight-Game League Schedule for Football

The ACC announced last week that its athletic directors had voted to remain with a scheduling model that includes eight conference games and at least one non-conference game against a Power 5 opponent. The decision was made at the ACC's annual fall meetings held this year on the campus of North Carolina.

## ACC Has .778 Non-Conference Winning Percentage

Through the games of Oct. 8, the ACC has compiled a 35-10 record against non-conference opponents, a winning percentage of .778, which is the second-best of all of the Power Five conferences. If maintained, that would be the best in league history. The previous best was a 28-8-1 mark in 1990, a .770 winning percentage. The 35 non-league wins already ties for fifth-most in ACC history.

## Jackson, Watson Rank 1-2 On ESPN's Heisman Watch

A pair of ACC quarterbacks, Louisville's Lamar Jackson and Clemson's Deshaun Watson, were ranked first and second after the games of Oct. 1 in ESPN's poll of its college football writers who vote on its Heisman Watch. In all, three ACC QBs were listed as North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky was tabbed 11th.

## Four ACC Teams Ranked in FWAA-NFF Super 16 Poll

The ACC is one of three conferences with four teams ranked in the Top 16 of the Football Writers of America (FWAA)-National Football Foundation Super 16 poll this week. **Clemson** leads the way at No. 3, followed by **Louisville** (7), **Virginia Tech** (15) and **Miami** (16). The pollsters consist of FWAA writers and College Football Hall of Famers who were selected to create a balanced-geographical perspective.

## Louisville Hosts Duke on Friday Night Clemson Hosts NC State in Atlantic Battle Miami Hosts North Carolina in Coastal Clash

Please Note: Release of the AP and Amway Coaches Top 25 has been delayed to Monday. Our Sunday Release will not have national rankings, which will be added to Monday's release. The Atlantic Coast Conference reaches the midpoint of the 2016 season this week with seven games on the schedule, including a major Coastal Division matchup featuring **Miami** hosting **North Carolina** at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens (3:30 pm; ABC/ESPN2). Both are seeking to keep pace with Coastal Division leader **Virginia Tech**, which has been impressive in successive dominant performances against East Carolina, Boston College and North Carolina, in which the Hokies have outscored their opposition 137-20. Tech travels to **Syracuse** (3:45 pm, ESPNU). In all there are six conference games; two Coastal matchups; one Atlantic Division pairing, two interdivisional games and one non-conference contest. Boston College has a bye...The ACC is 35-10 (.778) in non-conferences games to date, the second-

best winning percentage of any league nationally... Since interdivisional play began in 2005, the Atlantic holds a 103-100 advantage.

### ACC Tailgate Tour Sponsored by Lumber Liquidators Heads to Louisville

This Friday night Papa John's Cardinal Stadium is the backdrop for this week's stop of the ACC Tailgate Tour, sponsored by Lumber Liquidators, as **Duke** travels to meet the seventh-ranked Cardinals (7:30 pm, ESPN). **Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by **QB Lamar Jackson**, will see its first action since dropping a 42-36 decision to third-ranked Clemson on Oct. 1. The Cardinals are looking to keep their Atlantic Division and College Football Playoff hopes alive. **Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **QB Daniel Jones**, is seeking to take a step towards bowl eligibility for a school-record fifth straight year. Jackson leads the nation in touchdown responsibility (28), is second continued, page 2

## The ACC On Sirius/XM Satellite Radio

The first intercollegiate athletics conference to reach agreement to have its sports broadcast on satellite radio, the Atlantic Coast Conference begins its 12th season in its partnership with Sirius/XM Radio. Since 2004, the ACC has had its football and men's basketball games broadcast over XM or Sirius Satellite Radio.

in total offense (462.6) and fifth in rushing yards per game (137.6) and is the leader of an offense that is first in the nation (659.2). This is the first meeting of the two schools as ACC members; the Cardinals claimed their only previous meeting, a 40-3 decision at Duke in 2002.

### Miami Hosts UNC in Coastal Showdown

For the second straight week Miami, coached by **Mark Richt** and led by **QB Brad Kaaya**, faces a tough challenge when it hosts **North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Mitch Trubisky**, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens (ABC/ESPN2). Last week, the Hurricanes dropped a 20-19 decision to archrival Florida State, while **North Carolina** lost at home to Virginia Tech. Both teams need wins to keep pace with Tech in the Coastal Division race. The game matches two of the nation's top quarterbacks. Kaaya is ranked 15th nationally in passing efficiency (160.2) while Trubisky is 14th (160.3). UNC holds 10-9 advantage in the series, but Miami has captured four of the last six games. UNC took a 59-21 decision last year in Chapel Hill. North Carolina's last win in Miami Gardens was in 2008.

### Third-Ranked Clemson Hosts NC State in Atlantic Division Contest

**Clemson**, coached by Dabo Swinney and led by **QB Deshaun Watson** and **LB Ben Boulware**, hosts **NC State**, which is coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Ryan Finley**, Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (Noon, ABC). Clemson enters this game having won 12 consecutive ACC games and has won the last four meetings with the Wolfpack in their series and 11 of the last 12. This game also showcases two of the top quarterbacks in the nation. Watson was named the Walter Camp and Maxwell Player of the Week Awards and the Davey O'Brien QB of the Week Award for his play in the Tigers' win over Louisville on Oct. 2. Finley ranks 8th nationally in pass completion percentage (.695) and 13th in pass efficiency (161.1).

### Pitt Travels to Virginia in Coastal Division Contest

A pair of teams looking to remain in the Coastal Division race meet Saturday in Charlottesville, Va., when **Virginia** hosts **Pitt** at Scott Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network). The Cavaliers, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall** and led by **QB Kurt Benkert** and **LB Micah Kiser**, have won two straight and are 1-0 in the ACC, while Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi**, and led by **WR Quadree Henderson** and **QB Nathan Peterman**, has bounced back from a pair of close losses to win two straight. In UVa's wins over Central Michigan and Duke, Benkert threw for 757 yards and 8 TDs with only 2 interceptions, and Kiser had 18 tackles in the Cavaliers' win over Duke. Peterman has com-

pleted 64 percent of his passes, including 73.8 over his last three games, while Henderson is sixth nationally in all-purpose yardage (174.33). Even though the Panthers lead the series, 5-3, their only win in Charlottesville came in 1953, as UVa claimed wins at Scott Stadium in 2007 and 2014.

### Georgia Tech Faces In-State Foe Georgia Southern

**Georgia Tech** head coach **Paul Johnson** will be facing his former school Saturday when the Jackets host **Georgia Southern** at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta (12:30 pm, Regional Sports Networks). Johnson served two stints with the Eagles as an assistant coach (1983-86) and as head coach (1997-2001), leading the Eagles to FCS National Championships in 1999 and 2000. The Jackets are led by **QB Justin Thomas** and freshman B-Back **Derrick Mills**, who has twice been honored as the ACC Freshman of the Week. Georgia Southern is coached by Tyson Summers. Saturday's game will be just the second meeting of the two schools in football. Tech took a 42-38 decision at Bobby Dodd Stadium in 2014.

### Florida State Hosts Wake Forest in Atlantic Division contest

**Florida State**, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**, faces an Atlantic Division foe when it hosts Wake Forest this Saturday at Doak S. Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee (3:30 pm; ESPN). The Deacons, off to their best start since 2006, are coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by **DE Duke Ejiofor**. Ejiofor is tied for 11th nationally in tackles for loss (1.80) and is tied for 10th in sacks (1.08). Cook is sixth nationally in rushing yards per game (130.8) and is second in all-purpose yardage per game (188.33). The Seminoles have won six of the last seven meetings in the series and Wake Forest has not won in Tallahassee since back-to-back triumphs in 2006 and 2008.

### Syracuse Hosts Virginia Tech at the Carrier Dome

Offensive-minded Syracuse, coached by **Dino Babers**, and led by the passing combinations of **QB Eric Dungey** and **WRs Amba Etta-Tawo** and **Ervin Philips**, hosts Coastal Division leader **Virginia Tech**, coached by **Justin Fuente** and led by **QB Jerod Evans** and a defensive unit ranked third nationally (237.6) Saturday at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. (3:45 pm, ESPNU). Dungey leads the Orange's pass-happy offense, averaging 314.3 yards per game through the air, which ranks 15th nationally. Etta-Tawo is fifth (8.5) in the nation in receptions per game, while Philips is tied for ninth (7.0). Etta Tawo leads the nation in receiving yards per game (146.0). Evans is fifth nationally in pass efficiency (176.1) and is tied for ninth in TD passes (15). Tech **LB Andrew Motuapuaka** is second in the ACC in tackles per game (9.8).



# The ACC By The Numbers

**.080** - Louisville junior **OLB James Hearns** leads the nation with four forced fumbles in five games, an average of 0.8 forced fumbles per game. Four other ACC players rank in the Top 10, including Harold Landry, Boston College (tied for 3rd); Parris Bennett, Syracuse (tied for 9th); Ejuan Price, Pitt (tied for 9th) and DeMarcus Walker, Florida State (tied for 9th).

**.632** - Wake Forest ranks fourth nationally in red zone defense, allowing its opponents to score just 63.2 percent of the time they are in the red zone.

**.923** - Clemson's winning percentage with **Deshawn Watson** starting at quarterback. The Tigers are 24-2 with Watson as their starter.

**1** - **Louisville** leads the nation in both scoring (58.0) and total offense (659.2) and ranks fourth in rushing offense (309.2).

**1-2** - Pitt senior **DE Ejuan Price** and Louisville senior **OLB Devonte Fields** ranked first and second among all active players in the FBS in career tackles for loss per game. Price leads in career TFLs, averaging 1.68 per game and also leads all active players in career sacks per game (1.08), while Fields is second nationally in TFLs (1.36) and fourth nationally in sacks (0.72).

**4** - When **Florida State** defeated 10th-ranked Miami, 20-19, played a team ranked in the Amway Coaches Poll for the fourth time in six games. The Noles defeated 12th ranked Ole Miss, lost to No. 10 Louisville, lost to No. 23 North Carolina and defeated the 10th-ranked Hurricanes.

**5** - Virginia Tech junior **QB Jerod Evans** is ranked fifth nationally in passing efficiency, posting a 176.1 rating. Four other ACC QBs are in the Top 20, including **Lamar Jackson**, Louisville (12th), **Ryan Finley**, NC State (13th); **Mitch Trubisky**, North Carolina (14th) and **Brad Kaaya** of Miami (15th).

**8.5** - The number of receptions per game for Syracuse graduate transfer **Amba Etta-Tawo**. He is currently fifth

nationally in receptions per game, but leads the nation in receiving yards per game (146.0). Both marks are ahead of the ACC record paces of NC State's Torry Holt in 1998 of 8.0 catches per game and 145.8 receiving yards per game. North Carolina's **Ryan Switzer** (8.2) is also ahead of the Holt's record pace for catches per game.

**11** - When Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** rushed for 150 yards against 10th-ranked Miami, it marked his 11th game of 140 or more yards. That is the most by an ACC player in this century. Former Boston College standout Andre Williams had 10 games during his four year career (2010-13).

**12** - **Clemson's** win over Boston College was its 12th consecutive against ACC competition, a streak that dates back to the beginning of the 2015 season. That ties for the ninth longest winning streak of ACC games in league history.

**14.3** - Over his last three games Syracuse junior **LB Parris Bennett** has averaged 14.3 tackles per game. For the season, he ranks seventh in the ACC at 9.0 tackles per game.

**19.03** - The career punt return average for Syracuse senior **WR Brisly Estime**, who has carried 32 punts 609 yards, twice for TDs. He is averaging 21.9 yards a return this year, but does not have enough returns to qualify for the national or ACC standings. The ACC career standard for punt return average is 17.1, set some 50 years ago by South Carolina's Bobby Bryant during the 1964-66 seasons.

**39** - The average margin of victory for **Virginia Tech** in its last three games, wins over East Carolina (49-0), Boston College (54-17) and North Carolina (34-3). The Hokies have outscored their opponents during this span by a 137-20 total, an average of 39 points per game.

**43** - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt's **James Conner**. Conner has 41 rushing touchdowns, which ties him for eighth on the all-time ACC list. The total of 43 TDs puts him in 10th place on the ACC career list.

**112.39** - The average number of rush-

ing yards per game for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** in his 31-game ACC career. If maintained, that would be the highest per-game average in ACC history. Former North Carolina standout Giovani Bernard average 107.89 yards per game in a two year career in 2011-12.

**113** - **NC State** allowed only 113 yards of total offense in its 10-3 win over Notre Dame. The total is the lowest the Wolfpack has permitted to another FBS team since holding Maryland to 104 yards on Oct. 16, 2004.

**185.67** - The average number of rushing yards for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** in his last three games. After a relatively slow start, Cook now ranks second nationally in all-purpose yards (188.3) and sixth nationally in rushing yards per game (130.8).

**197** - The number of career receptions for North Carolina **WR Ryan Switzer**. Switzer is the leading active career receiver in the ACC and is currently 15th on the ACC career receiving list.

**209** - Duke's defensive unit, led by **LB Ben Humphreys** who had 10 tackles, held Army West Point to just 165 rushing yards in its win over the Cadets. That is 209 yards under Army's average coming into the game. The Cadets were leading the nation in rushing offense, averaging 374 rushing yards per game.

**237.6** - **Virginia Tech** defense, under longtime coordinator **Bud Foster** and new head coach **Justin Fuente**, has held its five opponents to an average of just 237.6 yards per game and ranks third nationally. The Hokies lead the nation in fewest first downs allowed and in team pass efficiency defense and are second in passing yards allowed.

**274** - **Virginia Tech** has scored in 274 straight games, the sixth-longest active streak in the nation among FBS schools. It's also the 10th longest streak in FBS history.

## UNC's Fedora Named Bobby Dodd Coach of the Week

Fedora recognized for success on the field, as well as the classroom and community.

Officials from the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl on Oct. 3 that

North Carolina Head Football Coach Larry Fedora was selected as The Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week.

The Dodd Coach of the Week Award honors the football coach whose program embodies the award's three pillars of scholarship, leadership and integrity, while also having success on the playing field during the previous week.

North Carolina traveled to Tallahassee to face the No. 12-ranked Florida State Seminoles as double-digit underdogs. While the Tar Heels led most of the game, Florida State took a late lead before North Carolina kicker Nick Weiler drilled a career-long 54-yard field goal as time expired.

Fedora is coming off one of the best seasons in Tar Heel history, winning 11 straight games a year ago and earning a birth in the ACC Championship. His on-the-field success has been matched in the classroom as North Carolina earned an impressive Academic Progress Rate score of 952 last year.

## Clemson Continues ACC Winning Streak

With its win last Friday against Boston College, Clemson currently has an active 12-game winning streak against ACC opponents. The Tigers won all eight of their regular season ACC games last fall and added the ACC Championship contest against North Carolina, as well as wins over Georgia Tech, Louisville and the Eagles this season. A win this week against NC State and Clemson have the ninth-best winning streak against league foes in history.

# Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a "collaborative" process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference's Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC's stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?**

**A:** They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

### **Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?**

**A:** There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

### **Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?**

**A:** Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

### **Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?**

**A:** They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

### **Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?**

**A:** Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

### **Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?**

**A:** No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?**

**A:** No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?**

**A:** No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

### **Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?**

**A:** The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.

Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. Beamer, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

#### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.(as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

#### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.



# COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF, ACC BOWL LINEUP



## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the third year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.)

The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

### The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

### ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.
