## ESPN's GameDay Heads to Tallahassee; No. 1 FSU Hosts No. 22 Clemson Ranked Virginia Tech Hosts Georgia Tech in Coastal Clash Miami, Virginia Travel to No. 24 Nebraska, No. 21 BYU; Unbeaten Pitt Hosts Iowa

ACC heads into Week Four with a sparkling 27-5 (.844) non-conference record which includes two wins against Top 10 teams...For only the second time in league history (first since 1981), two unranked ACC teams (Virginia Tech, Boston College) have upset Top 10 foes (No. 8 Ohio State, No. 9 Southern California)...ACC now has five wins against Top 10 non-conference teams in a two-year span (2013-14) for the first time in league history...ACC also tied its all-time high for non-conference road victories on a weekend (3)...All 14 ACC teams are in action this week...A pair of important divisional matchups headline the Week Four schedule with top-ranked **Florida State** hosting No. 22 Clemson in an Atlantic Division contest in primetime at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee (8 pm, ABC) and Virginia Tech hosting Georgia Tech at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg (ESPN, Noon) in a Coastal division battle...The win-

ner of the FSU-Clemson game has claimed the ACC championship in each of the last three years and has claimed the Atlantic title in each of the last five seasons...ESPN's GameDay will be making its ninth appearance in Tallahassee...The Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, are led by 2014 Heisman Trophy winner **QB Jameis Winston** and **WR Rashad Greene**, while the Tigers are coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by 2014 consensus All-American **DE Vic Beasley**...Clemson is ranked sixth nationally in total defense and fourth in pass efficiency defense...Only once in ACC history has a league team defeated a reigning No. 1 ACC team on its home turf, and that was in 1990 when Georgia Tech downed No. 1-ranked Virginia in Charlottesville...Meanwhile in Blacksburg, **Virginia Tech**, coached by **Frank Beamer**, and led by junior **QB Michael Brewer**, hosts the un-

beaten Yellow Jackets of coach **Paul Johnson**...Georgia Tech is led by sophomore **QB Justin Thomas**, who leads the ACC in pass efficiency (177.7) and who is fourth in the ACC in rushing, averaging 92.7 yards per game...In eight of the nine years since the ACC has been in divisions, one of these teams has claimed the Coastal Division crown and a berth in the ACC Championship Game...The conference also has a pair of road games against nationally-ranked foes on tap this week...**Miami**, coached by **Al Golden** and led by **RB Duke Johnson**, **WR Phillip Dorsett** and **LB Denzel Perryman**, will travel to Lincoln, Neb., to face the 24th-ranked Cornhuskers of coach Bo Pelini at Memorial Stadium (8 pm, ESPN2)...Nebraska is ranked fifth nationally in total offense (594.3) and

18th in total defense (294.3) and is led by TB Amer Abdullah and QB Tommy Armstrong...**Virginia**, coached by **Mike London** and fresh off an impressive win over 21st-ranked Louisville, now heads to Provo Utah, to face the 21st-ranked BYU Cougars at LaVell Edwards Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN)...Virginia is led by All-America **S Anthony Harris**, while the Cougars, coached by Bronco Mendenhall, are led by QB Taysom Hill, who leads BYU in passing and rushing...Unbeaten **Pitt**, coached by **Paul Chryst** and led by **RB James Conner**, hosts Iowa of the Big Ten Saturday at Heinz Field (noon, ESPN)...The Panthers rank fourth nationally in rushing offense (344 yards per game), led by Conner, who is second nationally in total yards, and they are also second nationally in total defense (211/gm)...Iowa is coached by Kirk Ferentz and led by junior QB Jake Rudock...In **Syracuse**, the Orange, coached by **Scott Shafer**, will host former ACC member Maryland in the Carrier Dome (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...**Syracuse** is led by **QB Terrel Hunt**, who accounted for 4 TDs, and **LB Cameron Lynch**, who had 3.5 tackles for loss, in its impressive win over Central Michigan...Maryland is in its first year in the Big Ten under coach Randy Edsall...In Durham, N.C., Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, will be looking to start the season 4-0 for the first time since 1994 when it hosts Tulane at Wallace Wade Stadium (12:30 pm, RSN)...The Blue Devils are led by senior **QB Anthony Boone** and **S Jeremy Cash**...Boone has passed and run for 9 TDs while Cash had 12 tackles in the Blue Devils 41-3 win over Kansas...Tulane, facing its second ACC foe in three weeks, is coached by Curtis Johnson...In Chestnut Hill, Mass., **Boston College**, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **QB Tyler Murphy**, will host the Black Bears of Maine at Alumni Stadium (1 pm, ESPN3)...The Eagles are coming off an impressive 37-31 upset of 9th-ranked Southern California and will be playing their fourth straight game in Massachusetts and third in Alumni Stadium...Murphy is second in the ACC in rushing (133.7) while senior **LB Josh Keyes** had 5.5 tackles for loss in the win over the Trojans...**North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora**, will travel to Greenville, N.C., to face the East Carolina Pirates at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...The Pirates are coached by Ruffin McNeill and led by QB Shane Carden, who is 7th nationally in passing yardage...The Tar Heels are led by **QB Marquise Williams** and **CB Brian Walker**...Williams has completed 67 percent of his passes while Walker, who earned National Defensive Back of the Week honors from the Jim Thorpe Award for his play

on Sept. 6, leads the nation in pass interceptions per game (1.0)...ECU is coming off a pair of impressive performances against nationally-ranked teams in a close loss to then 21st-ranked South Carolina on Sept. 6, and a 28-21 win over 17th-ranked Virginia Tech last Saturday...**Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by **QB Will Gardner** and **DE Lorenzo Mauldin**, will be on the road for the second straight week facing Florida International at Alfonso Field at FIU Stadium in Miami (3:30 pm, FOX Sports 1)...The Golden Panthers are coached by Ron Turner and led by freshman QB Alex McGough...In Winston-Salem, N.C., **Wake Forest** will hold its Military Appreciation weekend, hosting Army at BB&T Field (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...The Deacons and coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by freshman **QB John Wolford** and sophomore **SS Ryan Janvion**...Wolford threw for 257 yards and 2 TDs and Janvion added 18 tackles in a loss to Utah State...Army is coached by former Georgia Tech assistant **Jeff Monken**...**NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren**, will be looking for its fourth straight win of the year when it hosts Presbyterian at Carter-Finley Stadium (6 pm, ESPN3)...The Wolfpack, led by **QB Jacoby Brissett**, is coming off an impressive 49-17 win over South Florida where State's defense limited the Bulls to just 159 yards of total offense...Brissett leads the ACC in pass completion percentage (70.4) and is second in pass efficiency (161.4)...The Blue Hose are coached by Harold Nichols.

### Duke's Wilson Named

#### National Freshman of the Week by Athlon Sports

Duke true freshman **RB Shaun Wilson**, who ran for 245 yards on only 12 carries in the Blue Devils' 41-3 win over Kansas, has been honored as the National Freshman of the Week by Athlon Sports. Wilson is the first player since at least 2000 to rush for at least 240 yards in a game on 12 or fewer carries.

### Virginia's Frye Honored By Groza Award

Virginia junior **PK Ian Frye** was honored as one of the Lou Groza Kicking Stars of the Week for making all three of his field goal attempts, including a 42-yarder that provided the winning points in UVA's 23-21 victory over Louisville.

### Georgia Tech's Thomas Honored by Manning Award

Georgia Tech sophomore **QB Justin Thomas** was honored by the Manning Award as one of its eight quarterback stars of the week. Thomas ran (137 yards) and passed (188) for over 100 yards in Tech and 5 TDs in Tech's win over Georgia Southern.





# The ACC By The Numbers

**.844** - The non-conference winning percentage for the ACC after the first three weeks of the season. ACC teams have compiled a 27-5 record, an .844 winning percentage including wins over three teams ranked in the AP Top 25, two wins against teams in the Top Ten.

**.964** - The career field goal percentage for Florida State's All-American sophomore placekicker **Roberto Aguayo**. Aguayo, who captured the 2013 Lou Groza Award as the nation's top kicker as a redshirt freshman, has made 27 of the first 28 field goal attempts of his career.

**1.75** - Syracuse **LB Cameron Lynch** ranks 4th nationally in sacks per game, averaging 1.75 a contest. He leads the ACC in tackles per game (11.5) and is 15th nationally.

**2** - When Boston College **QB Tyler Murphy** rushed for 191 yards in the Eagles' dramatic upset win over 9th-ranked Southern California, it was the second-highest rushing total by an ACC quarterback in history. Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler holds the record with 220 yards against Virginia in 2000.

**3** - **Virginia Tech** ranks 3rd nationally this week in third-down conversion percentage defense, allowing its foes to successfully convert only 23.3 percent of the time on third down. **Georgia Tech** is 2nd nationally in third down conversion offense, successfully converting 63.9 percent of the time. The two teams meet this Saturday in Blacksburg, Va.

**3** - Also the number of quarterbacks in the ACC who rushed for more than 100 yards in their games last weekend. Boston College's **Tyler Murphy** led the way with 191 yards against 9th-ranked USC, and he was joined by Pitt **QB Chad Voytik** (114) and Georgia Tech's **Justin Thomas** (137).

**4** - When Duke true freshman **RB Shaun Wilson** ran for 245 yards on just 12 carries--an explosive 20.4 per carry average with TD runs of 69, 68 and 45 yards. It was the fourth highest single-game rushing total in ACC history. Wilson's total was bettered only by UNC's Amos Lawrence (286, 1978 vs. Virginia), Virginia Tech's Darren Evans (253, 2008 vs. Maryland) and Wake Forest's James McDougald (249, 1976 vs. Clemson).

**6** - The last six meetings between **Georgia**

**Tech and Virginia Tech** have been decided by an average of just six points each.

**8.37** - The average yards-per-carry for **Boston College's rushing offense** in the Eagles' 37-31 defeat of No. 9 USC. BC ran the football 54 times for 452 net yards, an average of 8.37 yards per game. The week before, USC gave up just 128 rushing yards and a 3.4 per-carry average to then 13th-ranked Stanford.

**15** - Florida State sophomore **PK Roberto Aguayo** has been successful on his last 15 field goal attempts., dating back to the Wake Forest game of last year. The ACC record is 27, set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Aguayo's current streak already ties for 10th-best in league history.

**17** - **Wake Forest** is ranked 17th nationally in total defense this week. The Demon Deacons, led by **SS Ryan Janvion** and **LBs Josh Banks** and **Brandon Chubb**, have allowed an average of just 291.3 yards per game and have returned a pair of interceptions for touchdowns.

**18** - **Florida State** has won 18 consecutive games, the nation's longest current winning streak. The streak is also the ACC's longest winning streak, breaking a mark set by the Seminoles during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

**23.0** - The number of career sacks for Clemson All-American **DE Vic Beasley**. He leads the nation among all active FBS players in career QB sacks.

**47** - The number of victories to which Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles in just over four seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. His winning percentage of .825 is the best of any ACC coach with three or more seasons.

**50.25** - The average number of yards per catch for Miami senior **WR Phillip Dorsett** in the Canes' 41-20 win over Arkansas State. Dorsett had only four catches, but carried them a career-high 201 yards including two 63-yard scoring plays. Dorsett was honored by the Hornung Award for his versatility as he also returned 2 punts for 27 yards.

**70.4** - The completion percentage for **NC State QB Jacoby Brissett** for the first three weeks of the season. Brissett leads all of the ACC's passing leaders in completion percent-

age and is second in pass efficiency (161.4).

**84.7** - The number of rushing yards yielded per game by **Virginia's defensive unit**. Coordinator Jon Tenuta's unit has improved over 60 yards per game since 2013. The Cavaliers rank 17th nationally in defense against the run.

**177.7** - The pass efficiency rating for Georgia Tech sophomore **QB Justin Thomas**. Thomas leads the ACC and is ranked 10th nationally.

**193.3** - The average number of rushing yards for Pitt running back **James Conner** in his last four games. Conner ended the 2013 season with 229 yards rushing against Bowling Green in the Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl and added 153 yards against Delaware on Aug. 30 in Pitt's season opener, then rushed for 214 against Boston College and 177 vs. FIU. He has rushed for 773 yards in his last 106 carries--a 7.3 per carry average.

**214** - The number of career receptions for Duke senior **WR Jamison Crowder**. Crowder is currently sixth on the ACC career receptions list and is two behind fifth-place Desmond Clark of Wake Forest (216, 1995-98) and 15 behind Michael Campanaro, also of Wake Forest (229, 2010-13).

**268** - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**, is the leader among active FBS coaches with 268 career victories and ranks 6th all-time. He is the NCAA's FBS active leader in career wins. He is 30 wins behind 5th-place Joe Paterno.

**283** - The number of yards against the run which **Boston College's defense** improved from week two to week three. On Friday, Sept. 5, the Eagles gave up 303 rushing yards to Pitt in a 30-20 loss. Just eight days later, BC's stop troops allowed 9th-ranked Southern California just 20 rushing yards in handing the Trojans a 37-31 defeat.

**1981** - The last time **two unranked ACC teams** upset Top 10 teams in the same season. Thirty-four years ago unranked Georgia Tech defeated No. 1 Alabama and Clemson downed 4th-ranked Georgia. That matches the feat turned in this year as then unranked Virginia Tech defeated No. 8 Ohio State on Sept. 7 and Boston College downed No. 9 Southern California on Sept. 14.

# ACC Players of the Week

## Boston College Trio Earns Honors After Upset of #9 USC

GREENSBORO, N.C. (theACC.com) – Three Boston College student-athletes received Atlantic Coast Conference weekly football honors following Saturday night's 37-31 upset win over ninth-ranked Southern California. Tyler Murphy, whose 191 yards rushing were the second-most by a quarterback in conference history, was recognized as the ACC Offensive Back of the Week. Eagles center Andy Gallik, who led the blocking up front, was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week. Senior Josh Keyes picked up ACC Linebacker of the Week honors after leading a defensive unit that limited the Trojans to 20 yards on the ground in Boston College's first win over a ranked team since November of 2008 and first over a Top-10 opponent in a decade. Virginia, which posted a 23-21 upset win over No. 21 Louisville in the weekend's lone league game, saw strong safety Anthony Harris recognized as ACC Defensive Back of the Week, while place-kicker Ian Frye was named the ACC Specialist of the Week. Miami senior Phillip Dorsett was named the ACC Receiver of the Week, while Wake Forest sophomore tackle Josh Banks was recognized as the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week, and Duke's Shaun Wilson was tabbed as the ACC Freshman of the Week. Wilson, who rushed for a school-record 245 yards in Duke's 41-3 win over Kansas, was also named the National Freshman of the Week by Athlon Sports. Virginia's Frye, whose late-game field goal accounted for the winning points against Louisville, was named one of three Lou Groza Award Kicking Stars of the Week. Miami's Dorsett, who amassed 201 reception yards on just four catches in a 41-20 win over Arkansas State, was one of five players named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll for week three.

### OFFENSIVE BACK – Tyler Murphy, Boston College, Gr., QB, 6-2, 213, Wethersfield, Conn.

Murphy led the Eagles to the upset of No. 9 Southern California with a career-high 191 yards on 13 carries, averaging 14.7 yards per carry against a Trojan defense that allowed just 128 total rushing yards to 13th-ranked Stanford in week two and only 4.0 yards per rush in its first two games. Murphy scored a rushing touchdown for the third straight game and tallied over 100 yards on the ground for the second time in 2014 and in his career. He also recorded a career-long 66-yard touchdown run, the longest of the season for the Eagles, which put BC up 37-24 with 3:30 to play.

### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Andy Gallik, Boston College, Gr., C, 6-3, 304, Evergreen Park, Ill.

Gallik led the offensive line, starting in his 31st career game, as the Eagles rushed for 452 yards and totaled 506 yards on the day against a USC defense that had allowed just 285 total rushing yards over the first two games. For the second time in 2014, Gallik led an offensive line that helped the Eagles to a 500-yard offensive output. The Eagles also scored five rushing touchdowns on the night, while quarterback Tyler Murphy and running backs Jon Hilliman, Myles Willis and Sherman Alston all put up career days for rushing yards. Gallik graded out at 85 percent and had three knockdowns.

### RECEIVER – Phillip Dorsett, Miami, Sr., WR, 5-10, 180, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

Dorsett recorded a career-high 201 receiving yards and two touchdowns on four catches in the Hurricanes' 41-20 win over Arkansas State. He is the nation's only receiver this season to record three catches of 50-plus yards in the same game. The career day for Dorsett marks just the third time in program history that a player had over 200 receiving yards in a game. Dorsett became the second receiver in the nation this season with two touchdown catches of at least 60 yards in the same game and the first ACC player with two TD catches of 60-plus yards in the same game since 2011.

### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Josh Banks, Wake Forest, So.-r, DT, 6-4, 250, Apex, N.C.

Banks had seven tackles (three solo, four assists), a sack and two tackles for loss in the Demon Deacons' 36-24 loss at Utah State on Saturday. Banks also intercepted a pass, returning it 70 yards for a touchdown, marking the longest interception return for a score ever by a Wake Forest defensive tackle.

### LINEBACKER – Josh Keyes, Boston College, Sr., LB, 6-2, 223, Ghent, N.Y.

Keyes helped the Eagles' defense stifle ninth-ranked USC's running attack, as the Trojans netted just 20 rushing yards on the night. In the first two games of the season, Southern Cal averaged 216.5 yards on the ground per game. Keyes recorded eight total tackles, including seven solo stops. Of his eight tackles, 5.5 were tackles for a loss and included a sack. On third-and-four at the USC 42, and the Eagles up by 10 in the fourth quarter, Keyes sacked USC quarterback Cody Kessler for a loss of eight yards, forcing a punt which would eventually lead to a BC field goal.

### DEFENSIVE BACK – Anthony Harris, Virginia, Sr., SS, 6-1, 185, Chesterfield, Va.

Harris had eight tackles and one interception in Virginia's 23-21 upset of No. 21 Louisville. The UVA defense limited Louisville to just 282 yards of total offense as the Cavaliers picked up the win.

### SPECIALIST – Ian Frye, Virginia, Jr., PK, 6-6, 200, Bristol, Va.

Frye made all three of his field goal attempts, including the game-winner, in Virginia's win over Louisville. Frye's game-winning kick was a 42-yarder with 3:42 to play. Earlier in the game he converted field goals from 35 and 47 yards. His 47-yarder was the second-longest by an ACC player this season. Frye also converted two PAT attempts.

### ROOKIE – Shaun Wilson, Duke, Fr., RB, 5-9, 180, Charlotte, N.C.

Wilson set the Duke single-game record for rushing yards with 245 yards on 12 attempts in Saturday's 41-3 win over visiting Kansas, breaking the previous mark of 238 yards set by Robert Baldwin versus Maryland in 1994. Wilson is the first FBS player since at least 2000 to rush for 240 or more yards on 12 or fewer carries. Wilson rushed for three touchdowns on runs of 45, 68 and 69 yards to match the Duke single-game record for total points (18) by a freshman, equaling the standard set by DeVon Edwards vs. NC State in 2013. Wilson's rushing yardage total marks the fourth-highest single-game total by a freshman in ACC history.

# 2014 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 13

## **Virginia 23, #21/-- Louisville 21**

PK Ian Frye's 42-yard field goal following a Louisville turnover late in the fourth quarter proved to be the difference as Virginia (2-1, 1-0) scored its first win over a ranked team since 2011. The Cavaliers ended an 11-game Atlantic Coast Conference losing streak and a 10-game skid against FBS-level competition. The Cardinals (2-1, 1-1) had won seven straight road games and eight consecutive overall. Frye also had field goals of 47 and 35 yards for Virginia, and QB Greyson Lambert scored on a 10-yard touchdown run and found WR Miles Gooch with a 15-yard strike for another score. Louisville QB Will Gardner threw a pair of touchdown passes, and RB Dominique Brown rushed for 74 yards and one TD.

## **Boston College 37, #9/10 Southern California 31**

The Eagles (2-1) defeated a top-10 team and the first time in 10 years and turned back USC for the first time in five meetings. Graduate QB Tyler Murphy rushed for over 100 yards for the second time this season, racking up a 191 yards on 13 carries, the second-most by an ACC QB. He rushed for a career-long 66-yarder – his longest run of the season – in the fourth quarter, scoring a touchdown to put the Eagles up, 37-24. Freshman RB Jon Hilliman scored two touchdowns, tallying 89 yards on 19 carries in a career night. Boston College handed the Trojans (2-1) their first loss of the season, giving up just 20 rushing yards after allowing 303 to Pittsburgh the week before. BC picked up 452 yards on the ground and 506 overall, collecting over 500 offensive yards for the second time in 2014.

## **NC State 49, South Florida 17**

Sophomore WR Bra'Lon Cherry scored the first three times he touched the ball on offense, leading the Wolfpack (3-0) to its third straight win and first road victory of the season. On the opening drive, Cherry rushed for a 17-yard TD, followed with a 17-yard touchdown reception, and then scored another rushing TD. Cherry has now scored five touchdowns in three games. The Wolfpack with 315 yards (most since 1994) and five scores on the ground. QB Jacoby Brissett finished 20-of-29 for 266 yards and two touchdowns.

## **Duke 41, Kansas 3**

Freshman RB Shaun Wilson broke the school single-game rushing record with 245 yards and scored three touchdowns to lead the Blue Devils over the visiting Jayhawks. Head coach David Cutcliffe's squad improved to 3-0 with the victory, marking the program's best start since the 1994 season. Junior wide receiver WR Max McCaffrey added seven receptions for 79 yards and two touchdowns as Duke outgained the Jayhawks 511-297 in the win and recorded 30-plus points for the third consecutive game. S Jeremy Cash led the Blue Devils with 12 tackles and a half of a sack as Duke limited Kansas to 95 passing yards.

## **Syracuse 40, Central Michigan 3**

After allowing a Central Michigan field goal on the opening possession of the game, Syracuse scored 40 unanswered points to roll to a 40-3 win and improve to 2-0. Led by LB Cameron Lynch, the Orange limited the Chippewas (2-1) to just 217 yards of total offense, with 66 of that coming on the opening drive of the game. The Syracuse offense, led by QB Terrel Hunt's 267 yards and four touchdowns, moved its way to 464 total yards on the day.

## **Georgia Tech 42, Georgia Southern 38**

QB Justin Thomas threw a 13-yard touchdown pass to RB Deon Hill with 23 seconds remaining as the Yellow Jackets (3-0) claimed the win after seeing the visiting Eagles (1-2) rally to take the lead after trailing 35-10. The final touchdown pass was Thomas' fourth of the game, and he also led Tech in rushing with 137 yards. Yellow Jackets DB Jamal Golden forced a fumble with 4:12 remaining in the game to set up the winning score. Yellow Jackets WR De'Andre Smelter had four catches for 106 yards, including a 57-yard touchdown reception.

## **Miami 41, Arkansas State 20**

WR Phillip Dorsett had 201 yards and two touchdowns on just four receptions to lead the Hurricanes (2-1). Dorsett's 201 yards were the second-most by any ACC receiver in a single game this season (Rashad Greene, Florida State vs. Oklahoma State, 203 yards). Miami Hurricanes' QB Brad Kaaya set a new single-game passing record for a Miami true freshman quarterback with 342 passing yards, and he became the first Hurricane freshman QB since 2008 (Jacory Harris) to throw four touchdown passes in game. DL Ufomba Kamalu paced Miami up front with a pair of quarterback sacks.

## **Pitt 42, FIU 25**

The visiting Panthers rallied from an early 16-0 deficit to record their third win in as many games this season. Sophomore RB James Conner rushed for 177 yards and three touchdowns on 31 carries. Conner now has 544 rushing yards, breaking Tony Dorsett's school record for most rushing yards in the first three games of a season. QB Chad Voytik rushed for 114 yards on 12 carries and had a 32-yard touchdown run for the Panthers, who host Iowa next week. He also completed 9-of-17 passes for 89 yards and one touchdown, an 18-yarder to WR Tyler Boyd in the second quarter.

## **East Carolina 28, #17/19 Virginia Tech 21**

QB Shane Carden threw for 427 yards and three touchdowns, and then scored on a 1-yard keeper for the winning touchdown with 16 seconds to play as the visiting Pirates (2-1) scored the upset win. Virginia Tech QB Michael Brewer finished 32-of-56 for 298 yards with two interceptions and three touchdowns – two to WR Isaiah Ford and an 18-yarder to WR Cam Phillips with 1:20 remaining that tied the score and capped a Hokies rally from a 21-0 deficit. But East Carolina countered by driving for the winning score on its next possession.

## **Utah State 36, Wake Forest 24**

DT Josh Banks returned an interception 70 yards for a touchdown to give Wake Forest an early lead, but Utah State (2-1) scored 29 straight points en route to a 36-24 victory over the Demon Deacons (1-2) at Romney Stadium on Saturday night. SS Ryan Janvion led the Wake Forest defense with a career-high 18 tackles. QB John Wolford finished with 257 yards passing, completing 20-of-50 attempts with a pair of touchdowns and 2 interceptions. TE Cam Serigne notched career-highs of seven receptions and 91 receiving yards.

## FSU's Fisher Joining Select Company

After just four seasons as head coach at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher compiled a 45-10 record (.818) during that time. His winning percentage put him in 2nd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 43-5-1 record (.888). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 3rd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792).

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 268 triumphs in his 34-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in the 2012 Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list.



Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 12th on the active FBS list with 157 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

## Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first six seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches Dabo Swinney and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only five other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after six seasons than Swinney (.689) and only three have won more games. Only seven other coaches in league history have won more games (47) than has Johnson after his first six seasons in the league and he ranks 14th in winning percentage.



## Home Sweet Home for Tigers' Swinney, Noles' Fisher



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** and Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley, and the Seminoles' home turf, Doak Campbell Stadium. Now, beginning his seventh season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 19 of the first 22 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .864, third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is only behind former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893) and Fisher, who is 14-2 (.875) in his four seasons against league foes. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.

## Program Builder Clawson Begins New Era at Wake Forest

Wake Forest new head coach Dave Clawson is in his first year as the Demon Deacons' head coach, but he is no rookie leading a program. Clawson, now in his 15th season as a head coach, has already re-built three football programs. He ranks fourth in years of experience among head coaches in the ACC, behind only Frank Beamer (34) and Paul Johnson (18). His overall, 91-82 (.526) record is more impressive when you take into account that he had to rebuild programs at Fordham, Richmond and Bowling Green, where his combined mark in his final three seasons (nine years total) at each stop was 75-37, a .670 winning percentage.

## Duke Experiencing Success Under National and ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 and 2013 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 34 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 15 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham.

■ Duke's 2013 team had 10 wins, the most in school history. Duke was Coastal Division champions for the first time since the ACC went to Divisional play in 2005 and the Blue Devils went to back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, dropping a last-second contest (52-48) to Texas A&M in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

■ Duke made its first appearance in the BCS Standings on Nov. 25, getting ranked 24th.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749) with senior **Jamison Crowder** set to challenge those marks.

■ Cutcliffe was honored in 2013 by being named National Coach of the Year by five different outlets--the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), The Maxwell Football Club, The Bobby Dodd Foundation, the Walter Camp Foundation and The Sporting News (Co-Coach of the Year).

## Under Steve Addazio Boston College Becomes One of the Top Five Most Improved Teams in the FBS

Under head coach **Steve Addazio**, Boston College in 2013 became on the nation's most improved football teams. Inheriting a program which had posted a 6-18 record over the past two seasons, including a 2-10 mark in 2012, Addazio led the Eagles to a 7-6 record and into the Independence Bowl in his first season on The Heights.

Addazio's physical style of football and a veteran offensive line allowed TB Andre Williams to set ACC single-game, multi game and single-season rushing records and to win the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back. Williams became the first running back in ACC history to top 2,000 rushing yards in a season (2,177).

The four-and-a-half win improvement from 2012 was the fifth-best turnaround in the FBS last year, bettered only by Auburn (8), Missouri (6) and Michigan State and UNLV (5 each).

## UNC Has An Offensive and Special Teams Mindset Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,



■ Now in his third season as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 10 times and bettered 30 points 18 times. His Tar Heel teams averaged 37 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference.

■ Also, in his first two seasons, UNC has 454 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game of offense.

■ Fedora's first two Tar Heel teams both bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once (1993) in its history when it scored 421 points.

■ Fedora's 2013 team set a school record for most touchdowns by returns with eight, including five by punt return, two by kickoff return and one interception runback.

■ Now in his third season in Chapel Hill, Fedora's teams have had 14 returns for touchdowns including eight by punt return and three by kickoff return.

■ In 2012 and 2013 UNC returned 65 punts, averaging 16.0 per return. As a freshman in 2013, Ryan Switzer tied an NCAA FBS single-season record and set an ACC standard when he returned five punts for scores last year.

■ Now in his third season at Chapel Hill, UNC has scored 60 or more points three times, including an 80-point outburst against Old Dominion.

■ By posting records of 8-4 and 7-6 in his two years in Chapel Hill, he becomes the first UNC coach since Ray Wolf in 1936-37 to post winning records in each of his first two seasons.

## Florida State Has Nation's Longest Current Win Streak

Florida State has the nation's longest current winning streak of 18 games which began in the 2012 ACC Championship. This streak is the longest in ACC history surpassing FSU's previous mark of 17 set during the 1999-2000 seasons. The Seminoles, though, have quite a ways to go to reach the NCAA all-time Top 20, which has five teams tied for 19th with 25 consecutive victories.

Finally, Pitt sophomore **RB James Conner** was named as the Maxwell Club's National Player of the Week after rushing for 214 yards on 35 carries in the Panthers' 30-20 win over Boston College.



## ESPN's GameDay Coming To Tallahassee

*Second Straight Year That Clemson-FSU*

*Draws College Football's Iconic Show*

Florida State, the nation's 2013 national champion and the preseason No. 1 in both major polls, will be hosting ESPN's



College Football GameDay for the ninth time this weekend, when the Seminoles face Clemson at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee. This is the second year in a row that GameDay has emanated from the Clemson-Florida State game and the second time in four weeks that the Seminoles have played at the site of GameDay. When the No. 1-ranked Seminoles opened the season

against Oklahoma State at AT&T Stadium in the Cowboys Classic in Arlington, Tex. on Aug. 30, GameDay was there. It actually marks the third time in five games for GameDay and the Seminoles as they captured the 2013 BCS National Championship at the Rose Bowl last January with GameDay present.

In all, this will be Florida State's 29th appearance on GameDay are the most of any ACC team. GameDay made two appearances last year at Clemson, the last time the show has been on an ACC campus, when the Tigers hosted Georgia on Aug. 31 and Florida State on Oct. 19. This will mark Clemson's seventh appearance at the site of GameDay.

Including Saturday, ACC schools have hosted College GameDay a total of 30 times, while ACC schools have appeared 73 times on the sites where College GameDay has been held. Florida State has hosted GameDay more than any other ACC school (9). Miami and Virginia Tech have each hosted the coveted show six times.

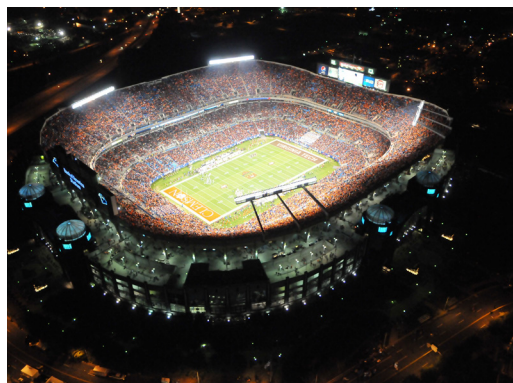

### ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

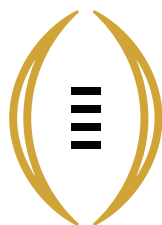
### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top ranked tied teams.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football enters a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format includes the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning on Oct. 28. The final rankings, though, will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 7.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Cotton, Fiesta and Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the first year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games it will appear in the Orange Bowl, or, if the Orange Bowl is a semifinal or national championship site, one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta of Chick-fil-A Peach. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

### Orange

Opponent will be a team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If ACC Champion is in the College Football Playoff, a second ACC team will take its place in the Orange Bowl.

### Capital One

Only if the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl, in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten, which can occur a maximum of three times in six years.

## The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Capital One Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

## ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions

After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among the ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Syracuse and Villanova ended regulation tied at 17 in week 1 of the 2014 season, it marked the 66th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 66 overtime contests, a large portion of them—28—have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 16 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 66 overtime contests, 32 have been ACC games while 34 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 36-22 advantage in the 58 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 35-31 record. Fifty of the games were decided in the first overtime with 11 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
