### VIRGINIA-GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- Georgia Tech holds a 70-51-2 series edge over Virginia, but UVA is 25-15-1 against the Yellow Jackets since the current coaching staff took over in 2004.
- Virginia has won four of its last six series against Georgia Tech, including three straight in Charlottesville.
- Since 2004, 17 of the programs' 41 meetings have been decided by one run or a tie.
- The teams split four games in 2015, with the Yellow Jackets taking two of three in Atlanta and UVA earning an 11-0 in a seven-inning mercy-rule win in the first round of the ACC tournament.

### BACK TO THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF DAVENPORT FIELD

- Virginia completes the regular season with seven straight home games, the Cavaliers' longest stretch of home contests to end the season since 2008.
- UVA is the lone ACC team to play its final two ACC series of 2016 at home.
- Virginia is 370-92 (.802) at home since 2004 under Brian O'Connor, including a 18-9 mark this year.
- UVA has averaged 3,532 fans per game this year. The Cavaliers drew 13,858 fans for their series with UNC and will pass the 100,000 mark for the sixth time in seven years this weekend.

### MAKING HEADWAY ON THE ROAD

- Virginia concluded a successful road trip on May 3 at Liberty prior to the exam break, capping a 7-1 swing with a 7-3 win over the Flames.
- The eight-game trip was UVA's longest stretch of regular-season true road games since 1999.
- UVA picked up ACC series wins at then-No. 1 Miami and Pitt.
- The Cavaliers finished 11-8 in true road games in the regular season.

### NOTING THE WIN STREAK

- Virginia has won six straight games, its longest win streak of the season.
- In that stretch, Cam Simmons leads the team in batting at .375 (9-24) with four doubles, while Daniel Pinero is batting .360 (9-25). Pavin Smith has driven in nine runs.
- UVA is batting .320 as a team, while opponents are hitting just .223.
- UVA has committed only four errors in that span (.983 fielding pct.).
- The start of the streak coincides with Ernie Clement's move to the leadoff spot in the batting order. He is batting .346 (9-26) in that stretch.

### THINGS TO KNOW

- Virginia is No. 16 in the NCAA's latest RPI figures, while Georgia Tech is No. 19.
- UVA is 6-6 in its first game back from the exam break since 2004.
- Ernie Clement has reached base in 19 straight games.
- UVA has not allowed a stolen base in its last 11 games (only one attempt).
- UVA is honoring late bus driver Bernard Martin with a patch on its hats for the rest of the season.

### PITCHING MOVES PAY DIVIDENDS

- Virginia tinkered with its pitching rotation in early April, moving Adam Haseley and Alec Bettinger in and shifting Tommy Doyle to the bullpen.
- In the four series since Bettinger came out of the closer role, UVA's weekend starters are 6-2 with a 2.19 ERA in 78 innings (6 1/2 inns per start).
- Doyle has struck out 14 batters in 9 2/3 innings in seven ACC bullpen appearances. He has picked up three saves.

### THAISS CONTINUES BIG SEASON

- Matt Thaiss is in the midst of his best season at UVA.
- He leads Virginia in multiple-hit (21) and multiple-RBI (12) games.
- Thaiss is UVA's top hitter in ACC play (.326) and has driven in a team-high 22 runs in conference play.

### NOVAK GIVES LINEUP BOOST

- Justin Novak has been a jack-of-all-trades for UVA this season, but of late has been a steady force at third base.
- Novak has started UVA's last 22 games, including 14 straight at third base.

- He has played in 37 games, with 32 starts (20 at 3B, six at 2B, five at C and one at SS); he has hits in each of his last six games.

### NOTING THE PITT SERIES

- Virginia captured its third straight ACC series, including its first sweep of the year. UVA won three of its five ACC road series this season.
- Ernie Clement (6-14), Daniel Pinero (5-12) and Matt Thaiss (4-12) were UVA's top hitters as the Cavaliers hit .297 in the series.
- UVA got fantastic starts from Connor Jones (CG) and Adam Haseley (8 IP) in Game 1 and 3, respectively.
- After squandering an early 5-0 lead in Game 2 Saturday, UVA rallied with two outs in the ninth inning on Justin Novak's two-run double.

### NOTING THE MIAMI SERIES

- Virginia won its seventh straight series against the Hurricanes, matching UVA's longest current streak against an ACC opponent (Clemson).
- Miami led in only four innings in the series (sixth through ninth Saturday).
- Twelve of Virginia's 15 runs came with two outs.
- UVA got contributions up and down the lineup, while its typical top four in the order (Haseley, Clement, Thaiss, Smith) went 8-for-47 (.170).
- Justin Novak (4-9) and Daniel Pinero (4-10) led UVA in hits.
- UVA's starting rotation allowed five earned runs in 20 innings in three straight quality starts.

### DOYLE LEARNING AS CLOSER

- In his first four weeks as the UVA closer, Tommy Doyle already has been challenged in an array of tough situations.
- After a tough first weekend at BC, Doyle has allowed one earned run in the last three weeks while picking up three saves and finishing off three more wins.
- He earned his first two saves at Miami, picking up a two-inning save Friday before recording four straight outs to close the Sunday victory.
- He left the bases loaded to end the Friday game.

### QUARTET OF CAVALIERS HONORED ON MIDSEASON WATCH LISTS

- UVA's Adam Haseley, Connor Jones and Matt Thaiss each were tabbed on the midseason Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- UVA joined Louisville and Vanderbilt as the lone teams with three honorees on the GSA watch list.
- Haseley and Jones also were picked on the Pitcher of the Year watch list.
- Kevin Doherty joined Haseley on the watch list for the John Olerud Two-Way Player Award. UVA is the lone school to have two players on the Olerud Watch List
- Thaiss also is on the Johnny Bench Award Watch List.

## CLEMENT CONTINUES TO RAKE

- Ernie Clement is having a standout sophomore season, batting .346 (18th in ACC).
- He is tied for the ACC lead in hits (72) and ranks fourth in runs (51).
- Clement owns hits in 43 of 48 games and has three streaks of eight games or more this season. He had hits in his final six games prior to the exam break.
- He has 20 multiple-hit games this year after picking up 12 in the entire 2015 season.

## HASELEY A KEY FIGURE IN OFFENSE

- In addition to his work on the mound, Adam Haseley has been a key instigator in the Cavaliers' offense this season.
- He ranks third in the ACC in runs (52) and sixth in doubles (16), and owns a team-high 24 extra-base hits (16 2B, 3 3B, 5 HR).
- He has reached base safely in all but six games this season.

## CAVALIERS LOOK TO SHORE UP DEFENSE

- After a strong start defensively this season, Virginia has committed at least one error in 29 of its last 32 games.
- UVA started the season strong on defense, recording 11 errors in its first 16 contests (.982 fielding pct).
- The Cavaliers currently own a .968 fielding percentage, which ranks ninth in the ACC. UVA is fielding at a .966 clip in ACC games.

## BIG FIVE HIGHLIGHT THE BATTING ORDER

- Virginia has leaned on five veterans to anchor its batting order this year: Matt Thaiss (.366), Ernie Clement (.346), Pavin Smith (.330), Daniel Pinero (.311) and Adam Haseley (.293).
- They are batting a combined .329 this year.
- The quintet has 308 of the team's 505 hits (61 percent) and 214 of the 325 runs (66 percent).

## YOUTH IS SERVED

- Even with five key returning veterans anchoring the lineup, Virginia has one of its greenest teams in recent years.
- Virginia's 35-man roster includes just three seniors and six juniors, which includes JuCo transfers Holden Grounds and Tyler Shambora.
- UVA has 16 freshmen, one redshirt freshman and 10 sophomores.

## FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES AGAIN

- Much like 2015, Virginia has relied on a host of freshmen as part of its regular lineup.
- UVA has started at least three freshmen in the field in 32 games, including three games with four rookie starters.
- Five rookies have played in at least 20 games.
- Ryan Karstetter leads the freshmen with 44 games and 30 starts. Cam Simmons (38), Nate Eikhoff (33), Andy Weber (31) and Doak Dozier (25) also have seen significant action.
- 31 percent of UVA's at bats have come from rookies.

## 2015 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- In a turbulent season, Virginia peaked at the perfect time as the Cavaliers won their first NCAA National Championship.
- Making its second straight trip to the College World Series Finals, UVA avenged its 2014 series defeat to Vanderbilt by defeating the Commodores in a best-of-three series.
- Virginia finished with a 44-24 record, including a 10-2 mark in the NCAA tournament.
- UVA became the first ACC team to win the NCAA baseball championship since Wake Forest in 1955.
- The NCAA championship was the 23rd in Virginia Athletics history.

## REGULAR SEASON

- Dealing with youth and an onslaught of injuries, the Cavaliers went 18-19 in March and April and a berth in the ACC tournament was in peril.
- UVA bounced back to go 5-1 in their final two ACC series, including a three-game sweep at North Carolina to end the regular season.
- After winning their ACC tournament play-in game, 11-0, over Georgia Tech, UVA then lost the next three games in pool play.

## NCAA TOURNAMENT

- After winning three straight games at the Lake Elsinore Regional, UVA rallied for back-to-back super regional wins at home against Maryland, with Ernie Clement's walk-off, two-run single sending UVA to Omaha.
- UVA topped Arkansas, 5-3, in its CWS opener, and won two of three games against No. 4 seed Florida to advance to the CWS Finals.
- UVA dropped the first game of the CWS Finals to Vandy, 5-1, but allowed just two runs over the final two games to rally and win the title.
- The Cavaliers trailed 2-0 after one inning in Game 3 against Vandy, but Pavin Smith's two-run homer in the fourth inning tied the game and his two-out RBI single in the fifth gave UVA the lead.

## TOURNAMENT NOTES

- UVA came from behind in seven of its 10 tournament and scored the go-ahead run in the fifth inning or later in each of their 10 wins.
- Forty of Virginia's 57 runs in the tournament came in the fifth inning or later. In seven CWS games, Virginia recorded 24 two-out hits that resulted in 15 runs.
- Sborz was named College World Series Most Outstanding Player. He tied a CWS record by earning three wins at the 2015 CWS.
- Sborz made eight appearances in the NCAA tourney and did not allow an earned run. He did not allow an earned run over his final 27 innings, including all 13 of his innings in Omaha.
- Virginia was just the the third No. 3 seed or lower to win the CWS Finals since seeding began in 1988 (joining No. 3 Oregon State in 2007 and No. 4 Fresno State in 2008).

## INJURIES PLAGUE CAVALIERS AT KEY POSITIONS

- Injuries hit UVA hard during the first few weeks of the season.
- A pair of regulars, Robbie Coman (elbow) and Jake McCarthy (big toe), each are out for the season after injuries suffered in the East Carolina series.
- Charlie Cody suffered a sprained ankle against VMI, but returned on April 6.

## SEVEN OF NINE STARTING POSITION STARTERS RETURN

- Virginia returns seven of its nine starting position players from its championship team (77.5 percent of games started).
- UVA lost four-year starting third baseman Kenny Towns and three-year starting right fielder Joe McCarthy.
- Three-quarters of the infield is back with Pavin Smith (1B), Ernie Clement (2B) and Daniel Pinerio (SS), while starting catchers/DH Matt Thaiss and Robbie Coman also are back in the mix.
- Starting outfielders Adam Haseley and Kevin Doherty also are back.

## TRIO OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers have earned preseason All-America honors from the plethora of national publications: RHP Connor Jones, 1B/OF Pavin Smith and C Matt Thaiss.
- Jones has been named to the preseason All-America squads of D1Baseball (first team), Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game (second team) and Baseball America (third team).
- Thaiss was a second-team selection by D1Baseball and a third-team pick by Collegiate Baseball.
- Smith was a third-team selection by Baseball America.

## FRESH FACES LINE CAVALIERS' ROSTER

- Virginia's roster features 17 newcomers this season – 15 freshmen and junior transfers Holden Grounds and Tyler Shambora.
- The group of 15 incoming freshmen is the largest in Brian O'Connor's 13 years at UVA.
- UVA had 14 freshmen on the roster last year, which was the previous high.
- The 17 newcomers hail from nine different states.

## O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 589-218-2 (.729) in his 13th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor needs six wins to surpass Dennis Womack (1981-2003) for the winningest coach in program history.
- O'Connor's 73.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 14th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Coming off the program's first national championship in 2015, Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 12 of O'Connor's seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

## RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation over the last eight years (373).
- UVA has won 589 games since 2004 – an average of more than 46 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 39 wins each of the last 12 years, including 10 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 has played in at least one College World Series.

## THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

- Virginia has qualified for 12 straight NCAA tournaments, capped by UVA's first national championship in 2015.
- UVA is one of six programs nationally to play in each tournament since 2004 and one of two to play in six of the last seven NCAA Super Regionals.
- Virginia is one of 17 schools in Division I history to have a streak of at least 12 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances.

## NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- UVA has won 40 NCAA tournament games since 2009 – second most in the nation in that span.
- Eighteen of the 40 tournament wins since 2009 have come in the College World Series.
- Virginia has earned four national seeds in the NCAA Tournament, including the No. 1 overall seed in 2011.

## BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

- Virginia has made four College World Series appearances, including two trips to the CWS Finals.
- UVA has won six NCAA Regional and four Super Regional championships since 2009.
- UVA earned the 2010 and 2011 ACC Coastal Division Championships (regular season).
- Virginia has made four appearances in the ACC Championship game, including titles in 2009 and 2011.

## NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- UVA reached the No. 1 national ranking in the polls in 2010, 2011, 2014 and 2015.
- Twenty-one Cavaliers have earned All-America selections in the last 12 seasons.
- Brian O'Connor has been named National Coach of the Year on three occasions.

## SUCCESS AT NEXT LEVEL

- Sixty-six Cavaliers have been selected in the MLB Draft in the last 12 years, including seven in 2015

**WHO'S GONE?**

- Virginia lost several key players off of its 2015 National Championship squad.
- The biggest losses came on the mound, where UVA lost key contributors Brandon Waddell (school-record 53 career starts), Nathan Kirby (31 starts) and Josh Sborz (80 career games).
- Sborz was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2015 College World Series, while Waddell and third baseman Kenny Towns joined him all the All-CWS Team.
- Towns played in 207 career games (ninth in UVA history), including 178 starts.
- Starting right fielder Joe McCarthy (151 career starts) also departed for the MLB Draft.

**IT'S BIG, IT'S BLUE, BUT IT'S NO LONGER A MONSTER**

- Virginia's infamous Blue Monster in center field takes on a new meaning this year. It now serves simply as a batter's eye.
- With the addition of wall padding this year, a consistent home run line was established throughout the park.
- Previously, a ball had to carry over the 32-foot-high wall to be a home run.

- Fans will notice an array of enhancements to Davenport Field this season, with several to commemorate Virginia's 2015 National Championship. Among the additions and changes:
  - A new backlit sign hangs below the scoreboard in right-center field, honoring the 2015 National Champions
  - A new trophy case to showcase the 2015 NCAA Championship trophy on the concourse level
  - New signage to honor UVA's CWS teams and ACC championship teams located beneath the press box
  - New NCAA championship murals on the back of the right-field bleachers as well as the façade of the suite level on the first-base side of the stadium
    - Higher protective netting that extends throughout the entire blue-seat reserved section
    - All of the bleacher seats have been painted blue
    - New padding and signage on the outfield wall
    - The foul poles also have been painted yellow, per new NCAA regulations
