TELEVISION COVERAGE

Saturday's game is being televised live by ESPN2 with Jason Benetti on playby-play, Kelly Stauffer on color and Kris Budden on the sidelines.

RADIO COVERAGE

The UConn IMG Sports Network is the home of Husky football on the radio. WTIC Newstalk 1080 in Hartford serves as the flagship station and is the state's only 50,000 watt signal and can be heard in 23 states and parts of Canada. The 2017-18 year marks the 26th consecutive season that WTIC is the flagship for UConn sports. The 2017-18 football, men's and women's basketball and men's ice hockey seasons also marks the fifth year that the radio rights are held by IMG College, which is UConn's multi-media rights partner.

Veteran UConn play-by-play announcer Joe D'Ambrosio is calling Husky games for the 26th season while Wayne Norman, who is celebrating his 50th year in broadcasting this year, in on color. Ken Sweitzer is back for his second season as the sideline reporter. Sweitzer was the 1981 Yankee Conference Offensive Player of the Year for the Huskies as a quarterback and earned All-Yankee Conference honors five times at three different positions during his career. Anthony "Rex" McCalla is on production

Other affiliates for UConn football on the UConn IMG Sports Network include longtime affiliate WILI 1400-AM in Willimantic in addition to WAVZ 1300-AM in New Haven and WGCH 1490-AM in Greenwich. In addition, the games can be hard on the TuneIn Radio app.

The UConn vs. Virginia game will also be available on Sirius Radio Channel 112, XM Channel 193 and 955 on the internet.

UCONN VS. VIRGINIA SERIES

Saturday's game is the fourth meeting between UConn and Virginia with the Huskies leading the series, 2-1. UConn won last year's meeting at Pratt and Whitney Stadium 13-10 on Sept. 17.

Bobby Puyol drilled a 43-yard game-winning field goal with 1:33 remaining in the fourth quarter to propel the Huskies to a 13-10 win.

On Sept. 13, 2008, Donald Brown rushed for 206 yards and three TDs for the Huskies while QB Tyler Lorenzen passed for 124 yards on 13 completions. UConn scored touchdowns on its first four possessions of the game and led 28-0 at the half. Virginia QB Marc Verica was 22 of 30 in the air for 158 yards. The Huskies knocked off the Cavaliers 45-10.

Virginia won its lone game in the series on Oct. 13, 2007 a 17-16 victory. Chris Gould kicked a 19-yard FG with 3:20 left to play for the winning margin. UConn has taken a 16-14 lead with 8:06 left to play on a 25-yard FG by Tony Ciaravino, who had a total of three field goals on the day. The loss was the first for UConn that season after winning its first five games.

UCONN VS. THE ACC

UConn has a record of 19-39 against the current football-playing members of the ACC. UConn has a 0-11-2 record vs. Boston College and is 2-0 vs. Duke, 0-3 vs. Georgia Tech, 4-6 vs. Louisville, 0-1 vs. Miami, 0-3 vs. North Carolina, 0-2 vs. North Carolina State, 5-4 vs. Pittsburgh, 5-4 vs. Syracuse, 1-2 vs. Virginia, 2-1 vs. Virginia Tech and 1-2 vs. Wake Forest. UConn has never played Clemson or Florida State. UConn is also 1-0 vs. Notre Dame, which plays in the ACC for most sports, but not football.

Sept. 9 vs USF

UConn went 1-2 against the ACC in 2016, defeating Virginia but dropping contests to Syracuse and Boston College.

Following the Virginia game, UConn has one more game vs. ACC teams this year – vs. Boston College on Nov. 18 at Fenway Park.

HURRICANE IRMA FORCES USF CANCELLATION

UConn and USF were scheduled to play their first conference game of the season last Saturday, Sept. 9. Due to the storm the Bulls were unable to travel and since both teams do not have a common bye week, the game has been cancelled and will not be made-up. The Huskies were forced to cancel a game in 1985 against Yale due to Hurricane Gloria.

QUITE A DEBUT FOR HOPKINS

Redshirt freshman Nate Hopkins rushed for 130 yards and three touchdowns in his UConn debut. Hopkins became the first player since Lyle McCombs on September 3, 2011 against Fordahm to rush for over 100 yards and score three touchdowns or more in his first game in a UConn uniform. Against Fordham, McCombs rushed for 141 yards and four scores. The feat earned Hopkins a spot on the American Conference Weekly Honor Roll.

SHIRREFFS REACHES 5,000 YARDS

Redshirt senior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs became the fifth UConn player to reach 5,000 total yards in his UConn career with 5,038 yards. Dan Orlovsky (10,421), Matt DeGennaro (9269, Shane Stafford (8829) and Ken Sweitzer (6126) are the four other Huskies to reach the 5,000 yard plateau.

CAREER NIGHT FOR HERGY

Junior wide receiver Hergy Mayala set a new career-high with 106 receiving yards and caught his first career touchdown to give UConn a 21-20 lead against Holy Cross. Mayala's previous high for receiving yards came on Sept. 29, 2016 against Houston, hauling in 92 yards.

100 ON THE GROUND AND THROUGH THE AIR

The Huskies received 100-yard performances from running back Nate Hopkins and wide receiver Hergy Mayala. It was the first time the Huskies have had a 100-yard rushed and receiver in the same game since Oct. 22, 2016 against UCF (Arkeel Newsome, Noel Thomas).

HUSKY COMEBACK

The Huskies overcame a 20-7 halftime deficit on Thursday night to defeat Holy Cross 27-20. For UConn, the 13-point second half comeback was the largest comeback since Nov. 23, 2013 at Temple. The Huskies overcame a 21-0 halftime deficit to win 28-21.

FIRST ONE OUT OF THE WAY

Many Huskies played their first game in a UConn uniform on Thursday night against Holy Cross. Darrian Beavers, Tre Bell, Brayden Brown, Garrison Burnett, Tyler Coyle, Cam DeGeorge, Keyion Dixon, Mason Donaldson, Omar Fortt, AJ Garson, Brett Graham, Eddie Hahn, Tajh Herring-Wilson, Nate Hopkins, David Pindell, Jay Rose, Quayvon Skanes, Santana Sterling, Jordan Swann, Ryan Van Demark all played in the season opener.

DEPTH CHART BREAKDOWN

UConn revealed its two-deep for the Holy Cross game prior to the debut of the UConn Football Coach's Show on Aug. 23. The depth chart consists of 53 players, 29 of which are upperclassmen. The redshirt freshman class represents the largest contingent of Huskies on the

The council consists of players that displayed leadership qualities to the coaching staff and will be responsible for holding teammates accountable, leading respective units and relaying information back to the coaches in order to benefit the team. FATUKASI NAMED TO WATCH LISTS

UConn redshirt senior defensive lineman Foley Fatukasi has been named to three watch lists; the Wuerffel Trophy, Outland Trophy and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy.

The Wuerffel Trophy is college football's premier award for community service and is presented to the FBS player that best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement. Semifinalists will be announced November 2 and finalists November 22. The 2017 recipient will be selected on December 5 at the National



Football Foundation's press conference in New York City.

The Outland Trophy is awarded to the top interior linemen in FBS. Semifinalists are announced on Wednesday, Nov. 15 and finalists on Nov. 21. The Outland Trophy will be awarded on Dec. 7 at The Home Depot College Football Awards. The Bronko Nagurski Trophy honors the best defensive player in college football. Finalists are revealed on Thursday, Nov. 16.

Fatukasi recorded 43 tackles in his junior season, including 3 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss in 12 games started for the Huskies.

FOUR OTHERS ON WATCH LISTS

In addition to Fatukasi, four other Huskies were named to watch lists this preseason – senior linebacker Junior Joseph for Butkus Award, senior tight end Alec Bloom for the John Mackey Award, redshirt senior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.

Senior linebacker Vontae Diggs has been nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. Players nominated have demonstrated that they are actively involved in a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

THE UCONN FOOTBALL COACH'S RADIO SHOW

The UConn Football Radio Show made its debut on Wednesday, August 23 at 6:00 p.m. with head coach Randy Edsall.

The show takes place at Grille 86 on 33 Wilbur Cross Way in Storrs Center and is hosted by the radio play-by-play voice of the Huskies, Joe D'Ambrosio. Fans are encouraged to come watch the show live in person.

Edsall, players and other individuals associated with the football program will participate in the hour-long show. Follow UConn Football on social media platforms for promotions and giveaways tied to individual shows.

The Coach's Show is scheduled to air most Wednesday's throughout the fall and can be heard on WTIC NewsTalk 1080 and on the TuneIn Radio App. The show is scheduled for August 23, August 30, September 6, September 13, September 27, October 4, October 11, October 18, October 25, November 1, November 8, November 15, November 22, November 29. All times and dates are subject to change.

BOBBLEHEAD SERIES

To help enhance the fan experience, bobblehead giveaways will take place at 3 home football games this season. Additionally, fans who purchased season tickets prior to the April 24 Priority Seating Deadline will receive a special edition "Jonathan the Husky" bobblehead. HUSKIES SET TO PLAY AT FENWAY PARK

The University of Connecticut, in partnership with the Fenway Sports Management Group, is proud to announce that the Huskies will face Boston College at Fenway Park on November 18, 2017.

This game is being played as a part of a series of "Football at Fenway" games matching several New England institutions and was originally scheduled to be played at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field in East Hartford on the same date.

"I think this is a great opportunity for our team, to play a quality opponent, New England rival and in such a unique and famous setting," said UConn Head Coach Randy Edsall. "When David said that this was a possibility, I immediately thought about it being a once in a lifetime game day experience for our team, staff and fans."

THE STADIUM

The Huskies moved into Rentschler Field in East Hartford for the 2003 season as UConn enters its 14th season of play there on Thursday. The stadium officially became known as Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field in 2015.

Located within miles of Interstates 91, 84 and 384, the home of the Huskies lies on 75 acres of land donated to the State of Connecticut from the historic Pratt & Whitney Airfield. The stadium, like the former airfield, was originally named for that company's founder, Frederick Rentschler. The stadium boasts a capacity of 40,000 with 38 luxury suites.

UConn has an all-time record of 61-35 at Rentschler Field and a 34-15 mark in non-conference games. UConn has played to 83.3-pct. of capacity all-time there, drawing 3,266,643 fans, or an average of 34,128 per game. UConn set a new all-time single-game attendance record at Rentschler Field on Sept. 21, 2013 against Michigan with a crowd of 42,704. That capacity was achieved with extra bleachers brought in for that game.



ide, 51-ZECCHINO, Nick, 74-VAN DEMARK, Ry., 80-MYERS, Shirreffs came off the bench to lead UConn on three second-half scoring drives and 82- Donaldson, Tommy, 81-GRAHAM, Brett, 83-VERNIERI, TJ, the Huskies came from behind to beat Holy Cross 27-20 as Edsall began his second 90-HOLMAN, Zordan, 91-ROSE, Jay, 94-MURPHY, Kevin stint as head coach.

'It was great to be back here, but it's not about me," Edsall said.

Sophomore running back Nate Hopkins ran for 130 yards and three touchdowns in his UConn debut and receiver Hergy Mayala caught nine balls for 106 yards and a score.

Fifth-year senior Peter Pujals threw for 358 yards and a touchdown for Holy Cross, from the Football Championship Subdivision, which led 20-7 late in the third quarter.

That's when Shirreffs replaced David Pindell, a junior college transfer who could not get the Husky offense going despite throwing for 154 yards.

'I think it helps that I have some experience," said Shirreffs, a fifth-year senior who lost his starting job late last season. 'I know the guys and I've played with most of the guys and I've been in the environment before. But really what it came down to is that I prepared for this game than I did any other game in the past."

He immediately led UConn on a five-play, 53-yard touchdown drive, capped by Hopkins' 3-yard run.

The Huskies got the lead back at 21-20 on an 11-yard pass from Shirreffs to Mayala in the front left corner of the end zone to complete a 59-yard fourth-quarter drive. The final score came after defensive back Tre Bell knocked the ball out of the arms of Holy Cross receiver Blaise Bell. UConn drove 47 yards and Hopkins punched the ball in from a yard out.

UConn's defense ended a late Crusaders' scoring threat, stopping a Pujals run on fourth down at the UConn 15.

Bell caught 10 passes for 129 yards and a touchdown for Holy Cross.
