## Jackson Earns Record Third Walter Camp Offensive National Player of the Week Honor

For the third time this season, Louisville QB Lamar Jackson has been named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week for his 7 TDR performance against Boston College. He is the first player (since 2004) to earn Walter Camp Player of the Week honors three times in a season. This marks the sixth Walter Camp honor for an ACC QB this year. Jackson also won the award on Sept. 4 and 11; North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky was honored on Sept. 25; Clemson QB Deshaun Watson on Oct. 2; and Georgia Tech QB Justin Thomas was honored on Oct. 30.

## ACC Has Five Ranked Teams Only League With Five in AP Top 20

Led by Clemson, the ACC had five teams selected to both the AP and Coaches polls and is the only league with five teams in the AP Top 20. Clemson is third in AP and second in the Amway Coaches poll, Louisville is fifth in AP and sixth in the Coaches. North Carolina is 13th in the Coaches poll and 15th in AP. Virginia Tech is ranked 18th in AP and No. 22 in the Coaches poll, while Florida State is No. 20 in AP but 18th in the Coaches poll.

## ACC Has 5 in First CFP Rankings

Five ACC teams were selected for the first College Football Playoff Committee Rankings, with Clemson leading the way at No. 2. The Tigers were followed by Louisville (7th), Virginia Tech (19th), North Carolina (21st) and Florida State (22nd). The ACC also had five teams in the AP and Coaches Top 25.

## Jackson Remains Firmly No. 1 in ESPN Heisman Watch

Louisville QB Lamar Jackson remained firmly on top of ESPN's Heisman Watch, while Clemson QB Deshaun Watson was third for the second straight week in the rankings of Nov. 1. Florida State RB Dalvin Cook moved up to sixth in the Heisman Watch which is a compilation of votes by ESPN.com's writers and editors.

## No. 2 Clemson Hosts Pitt, Looks to Clinch Championship Berth No. 21 North Carolina Travels to Duke on ESPN Thursday Night No. 7 Louisville Hosts Wake Forest; BC at No. 22 FSU in Friday ESPN Test

### Second-Ranked Clemson Hosts Pitt; Seeks ACC Championship Berth (All National Rankings are CFP)

Clemson, ranked second in the nation in the first College Football Playoff Rankings last Tuesday, heads into Week 11 of the 2016 season looking to clinch its berth in the 2016 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Orlando's (Fla.) Camping World Stadium on Saturday, Dec. 3. The Tigers, coached by Dabo Swinney, can clinch the Atlantic Division berth this Saturday with a win over Pitt. Even with a loss to Pitt this week, Clemson could still clinch a berth in the ACC title game with a win at Wake Forest on Nov. 19. Seventh-ranked Louisville, coached by Bobby Petrino, would gain a berth in the title game with a win over Wake Forest this Saturday and Clemson losses this week and on Nov. 19 to Wake Forest. The Demon Deacons, coached by Dave Clawson, could also reach the title game if they win their final three games (at Louisville, Clemson and Boston College on Nov. 26) and Clemson stumbles against Pitt this Saturday.

### Virginia Tech, North Carolina Battle for Coastal Division Berth

Virginia Tech, coached by Justin Fuente, and North Carolina, coached by Larry Fedora, head into this week's action tied for the Coastal Division lead, with the Hokies holding the tiebreaker advantage by virtue of their win over the Tar Heels on Oct. 8. The Hokies can clinch the Coastal berth in the Championship game this Saturday with a win over Georgia Tech and a loss by North Carolina at Duke this Thursday night. Wins this week by both teams sends the Coastal race into the final week of the season, when North Carolina hosts archrival NC State on Friday, Nov. 25 and Virginia Tech hosts archrival Virginia on Saturday Nov. 26. Both Tech and UNC play non-conference opponents on Nov. 19, with the Hokies travelling to Notre Dame and the Tar Heels hosting The Citadel.

day night, one on Friday night and five on Saturday. There are three Coastal Division battles and three Atlantic contests with one inter-divisional game in Pitt at Clemson. To date this season, the Atlantic Division has forged 7-3 advantage and an overall 107-100 lead in inter-divisional play since the ACC went to divisions for the 2005 season. With major Coastal Division implications, Duke and North Carolina begin the week early on Thursday night in a nationally televised ESPN contest at Brooks Fields at Wallace Wade Stadium (7:30 pm; ESPN). Florida State then hosts a rare Friday night game in Tallahassee, with Boston College at Doak S. Campbell Stadium (7:30 pm, ESPN2)

### Six ACC Teams Bowl-Eligible

With three weeks remaining in the regular season, six ACC teams have earned postseason bowl eligibility, Clemson, Florida State, Louisville, North Carolina, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest. Three more teams could earn bowl eligibility this weekend with a win, including Georgia Tech (at Virginia Tech), Miami (at Virginia), and Pitt (at Clemson).

### ACC Has 36-12 Non-Conference Record

ACC teams have posted a 36-12 record, a .750 winning percentage, against nonconference competition this year, the third-best in the nation. The ACC faces two nonconference games on Nov. 19 and has four non-conference tests on Nov. 26, the final week of the regular season.

### ACC Tailgate Tour Headed to Tallahassee

The ACC Tailgate Tour, sponsored by Lumber Liquidators, is headed to Tallahassee, Florida this week for Florida State's Friday night battle with Boston College.

### Tar Heels-Blue Devils Meet for 102nd Time

This Thursday night Duke, coached by David Cutcliffe and led by **QB Daniel Jones**, hosts 21st-ranked North Carolina, coached by Larry Fedora and led by **QB Mitch Trubisky**, at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium (7:30 pm, ESPN). Though this will be the 102nd meeting between the two teams in football in a series which began in 1888 in Raleigh, this will only be the second meeting between the two teams on ESPN's Thursday night package. UNC took a 45-20 win over the then 20th-ranked Blue Devils in 2014 on Thursday night. UNC has won the last two games between the two archrivals, scoring 111 points in the process. Trubisky is 11th nationally in pass efficiency (160.6) and is fifth nationally in pass completion percentage (.703). Jones is fourth among all freshmen nationally in completion percentage (.606).

### No. 22 Florida State Hosts Boston College

Florida State, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**, will host a rare Friday night game against Boston College, which is coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **DE Harold Landry**, at Doak Campbell Stadium (7:30, ESPN2). Cook is 11th nationally in rushing yards per game (126.0) and is facing his second straight opponent with a Top 10 rushing defense. Boston College is eight nationally, allowing just 106.6 yards per game. Landry is tied for third nationally in sacks (9.0), FSU

**DE DeMarcus Walker** leads the nation in sacks (10.5).

### Pitt Makes First Appearance at Clemson

Earning an invitation to the ACC Championship Game in Orlando will be on the line when **Clemson**, ranked second in the first College Football Playoff Rankings, hosts Pitt this Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Clemson, S.C. (3:30 pm; ABC). A victory for Tigers, who are led by **QB Deshaun Watson**, will clinch the Atlantic berth in the Dec. 3 game. **Pitt**, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by **WR Quadree Henderson**, needs just one win to become bowl-eligible. Henderson leads the nation in kickoff return average (33.8) and has returned three kickoffs for TDs this year. This is the Panthers' first visit to Clemson.

### Seventh-ranked Louisville Hosts Wake Forest; Seeking to Keep Pace with the Tigers

**Louisville**, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by explosive sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson**, looks to keep pace with second-ranked Clemson when it hosts Wake Forest this Saturday at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium in Louisville (7 p.m.; ESPN2). **Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by **SS Jessie Bates**, is bowl eligible for the first time since 2011. Jackson needs just three TDR to set the ACC's single-season record. He is one rushing touchdown short of that ACC standard.

### 19th-Ranked Virginia Tech Hosts Georgia Tech

**Virginia Tech**, led by **QB Jerod Evans**, looks to remain tied for the Coastal Division lead with North Carolina when it hosts Coastal Division rival **Georgia Tech** Saturday at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. (3:30 pm, ESPN). **Georgia Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, needs one more win to become bowl eligible for the 19th time in the last 20 years.

### Virginia Hosts Miami; NC State Heads to Syracuse

**Virginia** and **Syracuse** will both hold their Military Appreciation Days this Saturday. The Cavaliers, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall** and led by **RB Taquan Mizzell**, will host **Miami**, coached by **Mark Richt** and led by **QB Brad Kaaya** at Scott Stadium (2 pm; RSN). Mizzell needs just 10 receiving yards to become the first player in ACC history with 1,500 yards rushing and 1,500 yards receiving. **Miami** needs one win to be bowl-eligible, but the Hurricanes have not won in Charlottesville since 2008. Kaaya threw for 356 yards and four TDs against Pitt last week. The Orange, coached by **Dino Babers** and led **WR Amba Etta-Tawo**, will host **NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **WR Nyheim Hines** at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. (12:30 pm; ACC Network). Both teams need two more wins for bowl eligibility. Etta-Tawo is fifth nationally in pass receiving yards per game (128.7) and receptions per game (8.3), while Hines had 11 catches for 124 yards against 22nd-ranked Florida State. The Wolfpack have taken eight of the nine meetings in the series.



# The ACC By The Numbers

**.703** - North Carolina **QB Mitch Trubisky** is ranked fifth nationally this week in pass completion percentage. Trubisky has completed 223 of 317 passes for a .703 completion percentage.

**0.8** - Florida State **CB Tarvarus McFadden** leads the nation in interceptions and interceptions per game. McFadden has seven picks this year in nine games, an average of 0.8 per game.

**.931** - Clemson's winning percentage with **Deshaun Watson** starting at quarterback. The Tigers are 27-2 with Watson as their starter.

**1** - Georgia Tech senior **QB Justin Thomas** has thrown just one interception this year in 115 pass attempts. His pass efficiency rating for his last four games is 241.11. He has completed 29 of 45 (.644) passes for 750 yards, five TDs and no interceptions.

**2-3** - According to the NCAA's Strength of Schedule listing, **Clemson** will play the nation's second toughest schedule this year and **Florida State** the third most difficult. Based on winning percentage for both teams past and future opponents, Clemson foes have posted a .646 winning percentage and FSU has faced and will face teams with a .642 mark. To date, Florida State (.702) has faced the nation's third toughest schedule, while Clemson (.684) has played the fifth most difficult.

**3** - Louisville **QB Lamar Jackson** needs just three touchdown passes and/or touchdowns rushing to set an ACC record for touchdown responsibility in a season. He currently has 45 (in only nine games). Clemson's Deshaun Watson set the current mark of 47 last year.

**5** - **Louisville** leads the ACC in five major statistical categories: scoring offense (50.2), total offense (593.4), rushing offense (261.6), total defense (293.1) and rushing defense (106.0). The Cardinals' total offense average is on an ACC-record pace.

**6** - Louisville **QB Lamar Jackson** leads the ACC in six main statistical categories this week. Jackson leads the conference in total offense (437.1), passing yard-

age per game (305.9), rushing yards per game (131.2), passing efficiency (164.9), scoring (12.7) and scoring by TDs (12.7).

**7** - Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** is only the seventh player in ACC history to top 1,000 rushing yards in three separate seasons. He is the first to accomplish the feat since Wake Forest's Chris Barclay did it during the 2003-05 seasons. Cook is 11th on the ACC's career rushing list with 3,833 yards.

**8.0** - In his last three games, Virginia Tech **DT Woody Baron** has had eight tackles for loss. Baron had 4.5 against Miami on Oct. 20 and 3.5 versus Duke on Nov. 5. He now is tied for 12th in the nation in tackles for loss with four other ACC stand-outs: **Bradley Chubb** of NC State, **Duke Ejirofor** and **Marquel Lee** of Wake Forest and **Tremaine Edmunds** of Virginia Tech.

**9** - **Clemson** has now won nine consecutive games and 26 of its last 27. The nine-game winning streak is the fifth-longest current streak in the FBS, bettered only by Alabama (21), Washington (12), Western Michigan (11) and Michigan (10).

**10** - Virginia **RB Taquan Mizzell** needs just 10 receiving yards to become the first player in ACC history to rush for 1,500 career yards and have 1,500 receiving yards.

**10.5** - Florida State senior **DE DeMarcus Walker** leads the nation this week in quarterback sacks. Walker has been credited with 10.5 sacks, an average of 1.17 per game. Pitt's **Ejuan Price** and Boston College's **Harold Landry** are among eight players tied for third with 9.0 sacks.

**15** - **Clemson's** win over Syracuse was its 15th consecutive victory against ACC competition, a streak that dates back to the beginning of the 2015 season. That ties for the eighth longest winning streak of ACC games in league history with North Carolina's string of 15 during the 1970-72 seasons.

**33.8** - Pitt sophomore **WR Quadree Henderson** leads the nation in kickoff return average (33.8) and kickoff return touchdowns (3). One more and he will tie the ACC single-season record of four, set in 2009 by Clemson's C.J. Spiller.

**49** - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt's **James Conner**. Conner has 47 rushing touchdowns, which has him second on the all-time ACC list with Clemson's James Davis (2005-08). His total of 49 TDs, rushing and receiving, puts him in a tie for fifth pace on the ACC career list with Davis, Warrick Dunn of Florida State (1993-96) and Travis Zachery of Clemson (1998-01).

**185** - Virginia senior **RB Taquan Mizzell** has made 185 catches in his career. That's more than any other running back in ACC history. His total is currently 17th among all active players in the FBS.

**218** - With four receptions against Virginia on Nov. 5, North Carolina senior **WR Ryan Switzer** now has 218 career catches, which places him eighth on the all-time list behind Wake Forest's Michael Campanaro (229).

**258** - Clemson junior **QB Deshaun Watson** needs just 258 yards of total offense to become only the sixth player in ACC history to record 10,000 or more yards. Watson currently has 9,742 yards in less than three full seasons and would become the first player in league history to top 10,000 yards in his junior season.

**469** - Thursday night's Duke-North Carolina football game will be the 469th Duke football games broadcast by **Bob Harris**, the longtime "Voice of the Blue Devils". Harris is retiring after this year's men's basketball campaign after spending 41 years broadcasting Duke football and men's basketball.

**772** - Since **Bud Foster** became the defensive coordinator at Virginia Tech for the 1998 season, the Hokies have made more sacks than any other team nationally (772).

**2011** - Is the last time that **Wake Forest** was bowl eligible. The Deacons qualified for a bowl game last Saturday with their sixth win of the season, a 27-20 triumph over Virginia.

### Duke's Edwards, Wake Forest's Janvion Named Campbell Finalists

*ACC is only Power 5 conference with two finalists for NFF's 'Academic Heisman'*

A pair of senior defensive backs – Duke's DeVon Edwards and Wake Forest's Ryan Janvion – are among the 12 finalists for the 2016 William V. Campbell Trophy, presented by Fidelity Investments.

The Atlantic Coast Conference is the only Power 5 league with two student-athletes among the finalists for college football's "Academic Heisman." The Campbell Trophy, awarded by the National Football Foundation and prominently displayed at its official home inside the New York Athletic Club, recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

"DeVon and Ryan are true leaders and role models - in the classroom, on the field and in their communities," said ACC Commissioner John Swofford. "They are certainly deserving of this prestigious honor, and the ACC is proud to celebrate their tremendous success."

The 12 finalists will each receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments. The finalists will travel to New York City for the 59th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 6, where their accomplishments will be highlighted in front of one of the most powerful audiences in all of sports. At the event, one member of the class will be declared the winner of the 27th William V. Campbell Trophy and have his postgraduate scholarship increased to \$25,000.

Duke's Edwards is one of only two active players who earned both All-America and Academic All-America honors in 2015. The team captain becomes the sixth NFF National Scholar-Athlete in Duke history.

A 2015 Second Team Academic All-American, Edwards graduated in May with a 3.35 GPA in psychology with a minor in markets and management. The two-time First Team Academic All-District selection is currently pursuing his master's in liberal studies, where he maintains a 3.6 GPA. Edwards is a three-time member of the ACC All-Academic team and a four-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

A native of Covington, Georgia, Edwards injured his knee during the Sept. 24 Notre Dame game, which ended his 44-game career at Duke with 327 tackles, 13 tackles for loss, 10.5 quarterback sacks, five interceptions, six forced fumbles and 21 pass breakups. In addition, he returned 74 kickoffs for 2,060 yards for a 27.84 average and six touchdowns. Edwards closed his career ranking 17th on Duke's all-time tackles chart while holding school career records for kickoff return average and kickoff returns for touchdowns. His six

kickoff returns for scores rank as the third most in NCAA history. A three-time All-America and All-ACC pick as a kick return specialist, Edwards also garnered all-league honors as a defensive back in each of the past two seasons. The four-time ACC Player of the Week led Duke to three consecutive bowl games and its first ACC Championship Game appearance in school history in 2013.

A member of the 2016 AFCA Good Works Team, Edwards is active in the community and volunteers at the Ronald McDonald House every Thursday during the summer. He has also volunteered for the Boys & Girls Club, Bull City Fit and the Kid's Club in Oxford Manor.

Wake Forest's Janvion has made his mark as one of the most decorated defensive players in school history. He makes history as the Demon Deacons' first-ever NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

A two-time Academic All-District selection, Janvion is a three-time member of the ACC All-Academic Team and a three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll selection. The Pembroke Pines, Florida, native maintains a 3.53 GPA in business and enterprise management, and he plans to pursue an MBA.

A three-year team captain, Janvion is a four-year starter who led the team in tackles in both 2013 and 2014. In his 2014 campaign, he became the first sophomore at Wake Forest since 1992 to lead the team in tackles and collect more than 100 tackles in one season. The 2013 Honorable Mention All-ACC selection has amassed 322 career tackles, which is currently tied for 11th in the Demon Deacon record books. Janvion has also recorded 11.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and four fumble recovering during his career in Winston-Salem.

Having numerous interests off the field, Janvion is a four-year member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, and he plays the saxophone for the Athletes-in-Action Worship Team. He serves as a board member for the Santa's Helper initiative; participated in "Brenner Deacs" at Brenner Children's Hospital; and greeted guests at the Wake Baptist Health Fair. Janvion has volunteered with Habitat for Humanity and Project H.O.P.E (Help Our People Eat). Gonzalez in 2001.

The trophy is named in honor of the late Bill Campbell, the former chairman of Intuit, a former player and head coach at Columbia University, and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, who passed away this year on April 18. The finalists were selected from a list of 156 semifinalists.

# The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night



## The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When North Carolina travels the short distance to play Duke in Durham, this Thursday night at Brooks Field at Wallace Wade Stadium, the meeting will be the 102nd contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night.

Duke will be hosting North Carolina on a Thursday night on ESPN for just the second time in this, the 102nd meeting between the two schools in football. UNC took a 45-20 decision in Durham in 2014 on a Thursday night, as Duke will be hosting a Thursday game on ESPN for only the third time in school history.

This week's game will be the Tar Heels' 16th appearance on the ESPN package. UNC has an overall 8-7 record, but is 7-4 on the road on Thursday nights. Overall, Duke is 1-2 in the Thursday night package.

In 2009, North Carolina was involved in a pair of Thursday night thrillers. The Tar Heels and Florida State were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third-quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC upset 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by Casey Barth.

Virginia Tech has played in more Thursday night games televised by ESPN than any other ACC team, having made 32 appearances. The Hokies have also won more ESPN Thursday night games (23) than any other team.

This week's game has major implications for the Coastal Division race as North Carolina and Virginia Tech are tied for the Coastal Division lead. Tech, though, holds the tiebreaker advantage by virtue of its October 8 win over the Tar Heels.

The ACC's tradition of Thursday night football, which, more often than not has featured high drama, actually began with Georgia Tech. The Jackets hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

This week's game is the fourth ESPN Thursday night contest of the year for the ACC. Earlier, on Sept. 22, Clemson defeated Georgia Tech, 26-7 at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta. The win was Clemson's sixth consecutive triumph on Thursday's under current head coach Dabo Swinney. Virginia Tech then defeated Miami (37-16) and Pitt (39-36) in back-to-back Thursday night contests in Blacksburg and then Pittsburgh, respectively

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 179 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies (32) and Georgia Tech (29), Miami leads in total appearances with 23, followed by Pitt (22), Louisville (20), NC State (19), Clemson (16), North Carolina (15), Florida State (14), Boston College (12) and Virginia (12).

When Maryland was a member of the ACC, the Terrapins played

in 13 Thursday ESPN games, 10 of them at home.

There have been many great moments in the Thursday night series, including the 2007 game at Lane Stadium was also a memorable thriller when second-ranked Boston College rallied to beat eighth-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was a classic a see-saw battle decided when the Hokies' David Wilson returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown with 2:23 remaining. Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's win over second-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami has the highest winning percentage of any ACC school, having a posted an 18-5 overall record, an .783 winning percentage. Miami is 11-1 at home on Thursdays, posting an 8-0 record at the old Orange Bowl and is 3-1 in Hard Rock (then Sun Life) Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

Miami also still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating. Louisville recorded a pair of strong ratings while a member of the Big East in 2006, a 5.33 in downing West Virginia and a 5.03 in losing to Rutgers.

# Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a “collaborative” process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference’s Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC’s stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?**

**ANSWER:** They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

### **Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?**

**A:** There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

### **Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?**

**A:** Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

### **Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?**

**A:** They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

### **Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?**

**A:** Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

### **Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?**

**A:** No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?**

**A:** No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?**

**A:** No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

### **Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?**

**A:** The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

# Noting the ACC--The Coaches

## Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. **Beamer**, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.

Now in his seventh season as head coach at Florida State, **Jimbo Fisher** is in select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 70-15 record (.824) during that time. His winning percentage is the best of any first-time ACC head coach after six seasons and is second only to Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden,

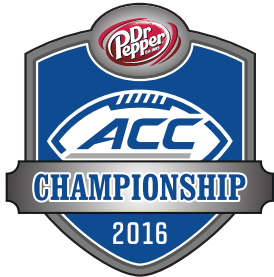

## ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.(as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.





# COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF, ACC BOWL LINEUP



## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the third year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

### The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

### ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When NC State ended regulation tied with Clemson at 17-17 on October 14, 2016, they played the 78th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 78 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 15 have been played in October, three in August, seven in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 78 overtime contests, 39 have been ACC games while 39 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 42-26 advantage in the 68 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-37 record. Fifty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
