FOR OPENERS

- Virginia (15-0) is off to its best start since the 1980-81 season when that team led by legendary center Ralph Sampson started 23-0.
- UVA seeks its first 4-0 ACC start for the first time since 1994-95.
- The Cavaliers are ranked No. 2 for the first time since March 8, 1983.
- UVA ranks first in the nation in scoring defense at 51.1 points per game.

- Malcolm Brogdon added 13 points and four assists, and helped hold Notre Dame's Jerian Grant to just six points on 2-8 shooting.
- Justin Anderson added 11 points, and Mike Tobey contributed eight points and seven rebounds off the bench.
- Virginia, which has won eight straight games vs. Notre Dame, held the Fighting Irish to 33.9 percent field goal shooting.
- The Cavaliers shot 49 percent, but were outrebounded for the second time this season 35-34.

ALL-TIME AGAINST CLEMSON

- Virginia is 70-52 all-time vs. Clemson, including a 42-16 record in Charlottesville, in the series that dates back to 1935-36.
- The Cavaliers are 4-0 in their last four meetings against the Tigers in Charlottesville, including a 78-41 win on Feb. 7, 2013 at John Paul Jones Arena.
- The Cavaliers are 3-2 in their last five meetings vs. Clemson and 5-5 in their last 10.
- The Cavaliers went 1-0 vs. the Tigers last season, posting a 63-58 win at Littlejohn Coliseum on Feb. 15, 2014.
- Head coach Tony Bennett is 4-3 all-time vs. Clemson.

UVA RANKED NO. 2 FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1983

- UVA is ranked No. 2 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today coaches polls.
- UVA is ranked No. 2 in the AP poll for the first time since March 8, 1983.
- Virginia has delivered three of the nine home losses by teams currently ranked in the top 17 of this week's AP poll (Notre Dame, Maryland, VCU).
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top 10 for the first 11 weeks of the season for the first time since 1982-83.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA is one of three teams (Duke and Arizona) that have been ranked in the top 10 for 13 straight weeks dating back to last season.

LAST TIME OUT

- Darion Atkins had a season-high 14 points and eight rebounds to lead No. 3 Virginia to a 62-56 win at then-No. 13 Notre Dame.

ALL-TIME VS. ACC OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 478-589 all-time against current ACC members (10-7 vs. Boston College, 70-52 vs. Clemson, 86-53 vs. Virginia Tech, 50-116 vs. Duke, 20-22 vs. Florida State, 37-39 vs. Georgia Tech, 5-3 vs. Louisville, 7-10 vs. Miami, 51-128 vs. UNC, 61-82 vs. NC State, 8-1 vs. Notre Dame, 9-3 vs. Pittsburgh, 3-3 vs. Syracuse and 61-70 vs. Wake Forest).

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year head coach Tony Bennett sports a 121-60 mark at Virginia and 190-93 mark in nine seasons overall.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 66-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09 and 2013-14, second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, and fifth in 2012-13).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 70.6 points and yielding a nation-leading 50.8 points, marking its best averages under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVa has shot 48.4 percent from the field (24th nationally) and 39 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 33.7 percent from the field (2nd nationally) and 31.4 percent from 3-point range.
- As of Jan. 12, the Cavaliers rank in the top five nationally in 12 defensive categories: points per game (1st), defensive rebounds per game (2nd), field goal percentage (2nd), rebounds per game (2nd), true shooting percentage (2nd), effective shooting percentage (3rd), assists per game (4th), possessions per 40 minutes (4th), points per possession (5th), rebound percentage (6th), turnovers per game (6th) and offensive rebound percentage (9th).
- As of Jan. 12, the Cavaliers rank in the top 10 nationally in five offensive categories: rebound percentage (7th), defensive rebounds per game (8th), defensive rebound percentage (9th), points per possession (10th) and assist-to-turnover ratio (10th).
- The Cavaliers have held 39 straight opponents and 40 straight ACC opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field.
- UVa has limited its opponents to 26 fast break points.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

- The Cavaliers have held their opponents scoreless for five or more minutes 13 times this season.
- Virginia held Tennessee State scoreless for 10:23 and Cleveland State scoreless for 10:03 during the non-conference season.
- Virginia has also limited its opponents without a field goal for eight or more minutes seven times, highlighted by Harvard for 19:53 on Dec. 21.

BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason All-ACC performer Malcolm Brogdon leads UVa into action this season.
- Brogdon ranks second on the team at 13.0 points per game and had a season-high 20 points against La Salle and added 18 at Maryland.
- He ranks third in the ACC in free throw percentage (83.6%).
- Brogdon has 10 or more points in 11 games.
- In 2013-14, Brogdon averaged a career-high 12.7 points and 5.4 rebounds en route to All-ACC honors.
- Brogdon scored a career-best 23 points in the 2014 ACC Tournament final win against Duke.

HIGH POINT MAN IN THE PAINT

- Anthony Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, is averaging career highs in points (12.0) and rebounds (6.7) this season.
- He recorded career highs in points (25) and rebounds (13) against Davidson for his second career double-double.
- Gill tallied his first career double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds en route to MVP honors at the Barclays Center Classic.
- Gill hit doubles figures in six straight games from Nov. 25-Dec. 18, averaging 14.5 points during that span.
- Gill ranks second on the team in field goal percentage (57.5%) and has improved his free-throw shooting to 70.4 percent.

LONDON CALLING

- Sophomore point guard London Perrantes ranks third in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.1) and seventh in assists (4.4 avg).
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami.
- Perrantes is averaging 4.8 points, 1.8 rebounds and 4.4 assists in 14 games overall.
- Perrantes averaged 5.5 points and 3.8 assists and ranked sixth nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5) to earn All-ACC Freshman Team honors last season.

PAINT IT ORANGE AND BLUE

- Virginia is averaging 32.1 points in the paint, while limiting its opponents to 18.5 points per game in the paint.
- Frontcourt players Anthony Gill, Mike Tobey and Darion Atkins have combined to shoot 56.9 percent (164-288) from the field and are averaging 20.1 rebounds as a unit.
- UVa has outrebounded its opponent in 13 of 15 games, and has a +11.8 rebounding margin.
- Gill, Tobey, Atkins and Isaiah Wilkins have combined for 48 blocked shots.

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP

- Virginia recorded its fourth undefeated non-conference regular season since joining the ACC in 1953-54 (1978, 1982 and 2001).
- The Cavaliers captured the Barclays Center Classic with wins over Rutgers, La Salle, Tennessee State and Norfolk State.
- Virginia posted road wins at then-No. 21 Maryland and VCU.
- The Cavaliers won 11 of their 12 non-conference games by 11 or more points.
- Virginia outrebounded each of its 12 opponents and limited each of its 12 foes to less than 50 percent field goal shooting.
- Virginia held five opponents to 42 points or less (George Washington, Norfolk State, Tennessee State, Harvard and Rutgers).
- The Cavaliers limited Harvard and Rutgers to 27 points and 26 points, respectively, marking the first and second fewest points allowed by the Cavaliers in the shot clock era.
- Virginia is the first NCAA Division I team to hold two Division I opponents under 30 points (Rutgers and Harvard) in a season since Bucknell in 2004.
- The Cavaliers limited Rutgers to eight points in the second half and Harvard to eight points in the first half.
- UVa set a school and ACC record by limiting Harvard to just 16 percent (8-50) field goal shooting.
- Harvard's one first-half field goal tied the NCAA record for fewest made field goals in a half in the shot clock era (Savannah State, one second-half field goal at Kansas State on Jan. 7, 2008).

ROOKIES ARE FINDING THEIR WAY ON GROUNDS

- Redshirt freshman Devon Hall and true freshmen Isaiah Wilkins and Marial Shayok have made solid contributions in 2014-15.
- Shayok had nine points, five rebounds and four assists at Maryland, and nine points in a season-high 31 minutes at Miami.
- Hall had five points and five steals in a starting role in place of London Perrantes at James Madison.
- Wilkins chipped in eight points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks at James Madison.
- Wilkins averaged 18.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.4 blocks en route to Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year honors for Greater Atlanta Christian last season, while Shayok averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds per game for Blair Academy.
- Stith averaged 12.4 points and 4.3 rebounds for national runner-up Oak Hill Academy.
- Wilkins is the stepson of NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, and freshman B.J. Stith is the son of UVa all-time leading scorer Bryant Stith.

Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.
