OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia welcomes the Drexel Dragons to Klöckner Stadium on Saturday for the home opener. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 7 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 8 in the Cascade/Maverik media poll. Drexel is not ranked.

THE SERIES VS. DRAGONS

- UVA and Drexel are meeting for the 17th time in a series that began in 1947. The first meeting may have been in 1947, but the series was put on hiatus until 2002. Since restarting the series, UVA and Drexel are meeting for the 16th-straight season.
- Drexel head coach Brian Voelker is in his eighth season in charge of the Dragons, and returns 26 letterwinners and seven starters off last year's 6-9 team.

UVA SWEEPS WEEKLY ACC AWARDS

- UVA swept the weekly ACC Player of the Week awards after its road victory at then-No. 6 Loyola.
- M Dox Aitken was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week after scoring four goals in his collegiate debut.
- D Tanner Scales was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week after causing three turnovers and snatching six ground balls.



Tanner Scales held Loyola's first-team pre-season All-American and Tewaaron Trophy hopeful, Pat Spencer, to zero goals and only two points in UVA's 16-15 win over the Greyhounds.

#GOHOOS: BY THE NUMBERS

1 Lars Tiffany earned his first win as UVA's head coach at Loyola, becoming sixth UVA head coach to win his debut.

6 All six of UVA's offensive starters against Loyola scored at least one point in the win. Michael Kraus led all scorers with five points (two goals, three assists).

9 Nine combined points by freshmen Dox Aitken and Michael Kraus in their collegiate debuts at Loyola.

40 Defenseman Tanner Scales will be making his 40th career start on Saturday against Drexel.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. DREXEL

- Saturday marks the 17th all-time meeting between UVA and Drexel in lacrosse. UVA owns the advantage in the series with a 15-1 record.
- The all-time series with Drexel dates back to 1947, a 7-2 UVA win in Philadelphia, but went on hiatus until 2002.
- The 2017 season marks the 16th year in a row the Cavaliers and Dragons have met in lacrosse.
- After suffering a surprising loss to Drexel in Charlottesville to open 2007, the Cavaliers got back on the winning track against the Dragons with an 11-7 win in the 2008 season opener.
- UVA's 20-5 win in 2002 was the first meeting with Drexel in more than 50 years.
- The first meeting of the two schools occurred in 1947, Virginia's first season following World War II. The Cavaliers gained a 7-2 victory in Philadelphia. Barry Robertson was high man for UVA with four goals, while goalie Bob Catzen registered 12 saves. Curiously Catzen's 12 saves that afternoon stood as the most by a Cavalier goalie in the series, along with Rob Fortunato (2011), until Dan Marino's 15 in 2013. That mark was topped by Matt Barrett last year when a new standard was set with 16 saves.
- As the No. 1 team in the nation during the 2012 meeting, UVA escaped the City of Brotherly Love with a narrow 9-8 victory as Rob Emery and Owen Van Arsdale each had two goals. Steele Stanwick, playing his first game as the reigning Tewaaraton Trophy winner, was held point-less for only the fourth time in his illustrious UVA career.
- In 2013 Drexel tied the game with 10 seconds left on a Ryan Belka goal. UVA however won the game in overtime, 13-12, when Matt White scored on a Nick O'Reilly pass 11 seconds into the overtime period. It was O'Reilly's sixth assist of the game. With eight points on the day O'Reilly was named the ACC Player of the Week.
- In the 2014 meeting, the last game in the series at Drexel, UVA used a game-winning goal by Mark Cockerton with 15 seconds left to elevate the Cavaliers over the Dragons, 11-10, at Vidas Field in Philadelphia.
- Goalie Matt Barrett made a big save for UVA and the Cavaliers were able to push the ball into transition to setup the game-winning score. Owen Van Arsdale tried to feed Ryan Tucker in front of the crease, but his stick was hit on the pass. Cockerton picked up the ball off the turf and deposited it into the goal from the front of the crease.
- The last time Drexel came to Klöckner Stadium in 2015, the Dragons jumped out to a 3-0 lead on a chilly Valentine's Day night in Charlottesville. UVA then went on an 11-3 run to take full control of the game en route to a 14-10 triumph over then-No. 16 Drexel.
- The last meeting UVA used a 4-0 second half run to take a commanding 10-4 lead at Drexel. Greg Coholan and AJ Fish each recorded a hat trick in UVA's 14-7 win.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 126-32 (.7975) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-3 mark in 2016. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

TIFFANY VS. VOELKER

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany and Drexel head coach Brian Voelker are no strangers to each other as they met each other three previous times in Ivy League play.
- Tiffany's first three years at Brown (2007-08-09) were Voelker's last three as the head coach at Penn.
- Voelker owns a 2-1 record against Tiffany-coached teams.

ONE MORE UVA-DREXEL CONNECTION

- Drexel's Deputy of Athletics Nick Gannon is a 1992 graduate of Virginia and was a goalie for the men's lacrosse team. His lone season as a letterwinner was 1992, Jim Adams' last season as head coach of the Cavaliers.

TIFFANY MAKES KLÖCKNER DEBUT

- Virginia head coach Lars Tiffany makes his Klöckner Stadium debut as the 17th head coach of the Cavalier men's lacrosse program.
- Saturday will not be his first time on the sidelines at Klöckner Stadium. Tiffany was the head coach at Stony Brook in 2006 when the Seawolves lost 17-4 to Virginia, the eventual national champs that season.
- Tiffany's first time on the sidelines at Klöckner Stadium was in 2003 when he was an assistant at Penn State. The Nittany Lions lost that game, 11-10, to a 2003 Cavalier team that also went on to win the national championship.

TIFFANY WINS UVA DEBUT

- Lars Tiffany won his UVA head coaching debut at then-No. 6 Loyola, 16-15, in the season opener. He becomes just the sixth Cavalier head coach to do so.
- Only Lars Tiffany and Jim Adams beat teams ranked in the USILA Top 20. Adams beat a Duke team ranked No. 12.

FIRST YEARS SHINE AT LOYOLA

- First years Dox Aitken (four goals) and Michael Kraus (two goals, three assists) led UVA with nine combined points at then-No. 6 Loyola.
- The nine combined points is the most by a UVA freshmen duo in a season-opening collegiate debut since Drew McKnight (two goals, four assists) and Jay Jalbert (four goals) combined for 10 points in the 1997 season opener against then-No. 2 Syracuse.
- Aitken's four goals in his collegiate debut makes the freshman the third Cavalier since 1997 to score four goals in a season-opening collegiate debut, joining Jay Jalbert (1997, 4 against Syracuse) and Joe Yevoli (2002, 4 against Drexel).
- Aitken and Kraus become the 6th and 7th Cavalier freshmen since 1997 to record at least four points in a season-opening debut.

AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017

- Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.
- It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.
- Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

VIRGINIA IN SEASON OPENERS

- UVA is 50-33-1 (.595) all-time in season openers.
- When the season opener is at home, the Cavaliers have compiled a 28-17-1 (.633) record throughout the years.
- The Cavaliers are 17-16 (.515) when the season opener is on the road, including winning the last six.
- The 2017 season was the seventh time in the last 18 seasons the Cavaliers have opened on the road.

TIFFANY BRINGS FAST PACE OF PLAY TO UVA

- New UVA head coach Lars Tiffany has brought a frantic pace of play with him from Brown. His Brown team led the nation in goals per game in 2016 with a 16.3 average, helping the Bears to Championship Weekend in Philadelphia. Brown was No. 5 in the nation in goals scored per game in 2015 with a 13.9 goals per game average.
- Tiffany has commented about this style of play: "We're absolutely committed to this style of play. This is the way the game used to be played. This is the way we played the game growing up, and it's the way I saw the game played. This is nothing new. We just dusted it off and brought back the '70s and '80s."

TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.
- Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).

TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.
- Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.
- Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009, UVA has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011.
- UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SID's, only 30 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times it's been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.

It was a wild finish at the Ridley Athletic Complex as 13 combined goals were scored in the fourth quarter, but No. 14 Virginia (1-0) outlasted No. 6 Loyola (0-1), 16-15, to open the Lars Tiffany era.

Virginia owned a 10-5 lead with 7:50 left in the third quarter when Zed Williams found Ryan Conrad for a Cavalier goal that capped a 6-0 UVA run. It took 45 seconds for Loyola to begin a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game, 10-10, with 12:57 left in the game.

Making his collegiate debut against Loyola, Dox Aitken went straight toward the cage and scored his third goal of the game with 12:19 left in the contest to halt the Greyhounds run, giving UVA the lead back, 11-10. Conrad scored unassisted at 11:27 to give UVA a 12-10 advantage. Aitken and Conrad's goals were the beginning of a 4-1 UVA, giving the Cavaliers a 14-11 lead. Aitken capped the run with his fourth goal of the game with 8:13 left to play.

The Greyhounds came roaring back with a 4-1 run of their own, tying the game at 15-15 after Graham Savio won a faceoff and sprinted toward the UVA cage with 2:59 left. Virginia wasted no time after winning the ensuing faceoff as Williams dodged and flipped a pass behind his back to Conrad and the sophomore deposited the game's final goal, lifting UVA to the 16-15 win.

A UVA turnover in the final seconds set up an opportunity for Loyola to tie the game. But Tanner Scales knocked down Zack Sirico's pass with three seconds left and Conrad picked up the ground ball as time expired.

Loyola started the game's scoring with a Mike Perkins goal via an assist by Zach Sirico at 12:08 in the first quarter. Virginia responded with a 4-1 run to take a two-goal lead, 4-2. Aitken and Joe French each scored goals for UVA, while Jason Murphy and Michael Kraus capped the run. Kraus' first collegiate goal came with 8:56 left in the first half.

The Greyhounds retaliated with a 3-0 run, taking a 5-4 lead. Loyola received goals from Brian Begley and one from Zirico. Savio capped the Loyola run with an unassisted goal with 6:14 left in the second quarter. Virginia held Loyola scoreless for the next 14:09, while the Cavaliers took a 10-5 lead, via a aforementioned 6-0 run.
