- UVA begins its 111th season of men's basketball, sporting a 1,514-1,143 (.570) all-time record.
- UVA is $16-1$ in its last 17 season-opening games, including a 79-51 road win at James Madison last season.
- Virginia is 5-1 in season openers under head coach Tony Bennett with the lone loss at George Mason (63-59) to begin the 2012-13 campaign. -The Cavaliers are 88-22 all-time in 110 season-opening games.
- UVA opens the season against a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference team for the first time since defeating South Carolina State (75-38) in 201112.
- Morgan State assistant coach Brian Ellerbe served as an assistant coach at UVA from 1991-94.


## VIRGINIA'S NO. 6 AP PRESEASON RANKING BEST SINCE 1982-83

- UVA is ranked No. 6 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' preseason polls.
- The No. 6 preseason ranking is UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 24 consecutive AP polls since March 3, 2014, its longest span since 49 consecutive polls from 1980-83.
- Virginia has been ranked in the preseason top-10 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1981-82 and 1982-83.
- UVA has finished in the top 10 ( $N o .3$ in 2014 \& No. 6 in 2015) in the final AP rankings in back-to-back seasons for the first time since three straight seasons from 1981-83.


## SERIES HISTORY

- UVA sports a 2-0 all-time mark, including a 2-0 mark in Charlottesville, against Morgan State in the series that dates back to 2006-07.
-The Cavaliers defeated the Bears 85-66 at University Hall on Nov. 19, 2006.
- UVA posted a $75-57$ win over Morgan State at John Paul Jones Arena in the last meeting between the teams on Dec. 19, 2012.


## LAST TIME VS. MORGAN STATE

- Virginia capped a season-high, eight-game winning streak with a 75-57 win over Morgan State on Dec. 19, 2012.
- Akil Mitchell had 15 points and 12 rebounds to lead the way for UVA.
- Darion Atkins had a career-high 17 points and former Cavalier and current Northern lowa guard Paul Jesperson added 11 points.
- UVA had 23 second-chance points and outrebounded Morgan State, 39-21.


## ALL-TIME VS. MID-EASTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

-Virginia is 24-0 all-time vs. the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (7-0 vs. Hampton, 4-0 vs. Howard and Norfolk State, 2-0 vs. Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State and South Carolina State, 1-0 vs. Bethune-Cookman, Coppin State and North Carolina A\&T).

- UVA went 2-0 vs. the MEAC last season, defeating Norfolk State (67-39) and South Carolina State (75-55) in back-to-back tilts on Nov. 18 and Nov. 21, respectively.
- Tony Bennett is 12-0 all-time vs. MEAC opponents as head coach at Virginia.

## VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett sports a 136-64 mark in six seasons at Virginia and 205-97 career mark in nine seasons.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett was also named ACC Coach of the Year, NABC District 2 Coach of the Year and USBWA District 3 Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to four consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014 and 2015, and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett-coached teams are 75-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense three times (2008-

09, 2013-14 \& 2014-15), and finished in the top five nationally in six of nine seasons.

- Bennett is one of 26 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.


## VIRGINIA PICKED 2ND IN THE ACC

- Virginia was picked to finish second in the ACC preseason poll.
- The second-place preseason selection is UVA's highest since being selected first in 1982-83.
-The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first in each of the last two seasons, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last six seasons.
- North Carolina is the preseason favorite, followed by Virginia, Duke, Notre Dame, Miami, Florida State, Louisville, NC State, Syracuse, Pitt, Wake Forest, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Boston College.


## ABOUT THE 2015-16 SCHEDULE

- Five of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the top 19 of the AP preseason poll (North Carolina, Duke, Villanova, California and Notre Dame), while four (Miami, Louisville, NC State and Florida State) received votes.
- The Cavaliers will play nine games against 2015 NCAA Tournament teams: home games against North Carolina, Louisville, Villanova, Notre Dame and NC State, road contests at Duke, Louisville and Ohio State, and a neutral-site tilt against West Virginia in the Jimmy V Men's Basketball Classic at Madison Square Garden.
- Four opponents (George Washington, Miami, Pitt, William \& Mary) participated in the National Invitation Tournament.


## VIRGINIA EMBRACED THE PACE IN 2014-15

- Virginia averaged 65.4 points and yielded a nation-leading and school-record (modern era) 51.5 points in 2014-15.
- UVA shot 45.7 percent from the field and 35.2 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 36.7 percent from the field (3rd nationally) and 30.8 percent from 3-point range.
-The Cavaliers ranked in the top five nationally in eight defensive categories: points per game (1st), points per possession (2nd), true shooting percentage (2nd), field goal percentage (3rd), effective shooting percentage (4th), possessions per 40 minutes (4th), offensive rebounding percentage (5th) and rebounds per game (5th).
- UVA ranked in the top 20 nationally in thre offensive categories: defensive rebound percentage (5th), rebound percentage (9th) and assist-toturnover ratio (20th).
- Virginia limited its opponents to 106 fast break points (3.1 per game).


## ALL-AMERICAN BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason co-ACC Player of the Year Malcolm Brogdon leads UVA into action this season.
- Brogdon was named a preseason All-American by The Sporting News (1st team), Blue Ribbon Yearbook (1st team), CBSSports.com (2nd team), NBCSports.com (2nd team), Bleacher Report (2nd team), USA Today (3rd team) and Collegelnsider.com.
- In 2014-15, Brogdon averaged a career-high 14.0 points and 3.9 rebounds en route to All-America second-team and All-ACC first-team accolades.
- The two-time All-ACC performer, who was a John Wooden Award finalist last season, ranks 39th on UVA's all-time scoring list with 1,134 points in 99 career games ( 11.5 career ppg).
- Brogdon ranks second on UVA's career free-throw percentage list at 86.5\% (282-for-326).
- Brogdon scored a career-best 25 points in UVA's ACC Tournament semifinal loss against North Carolina.
- Brogdon, who is a candidate for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award, was named to the 2014 Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- Brogdon helped Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto.
- The redshirt senior earned a degree in history and is pursuing a master's degree in public policy from the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy.

## HIGH POINT MAN TO THE GILLS

- Preseason All-ACC second-team selection Anthony Gill is Virginia's top returning frontcourt player.
- Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, averaged career highs in points (11.6) and rebounds (6.5) en route to All-ACC third-team (media) honors in 2014-15.
- Gill's team-leading 29 steals helped earn him a spot on the coaches' All-ACC Defensive Team in 2014-15.
- Gill, who has led UVA in field goal percentage in each of the past two seasons, is shooting 54.4 percent during his collegiate career.
- Gill earned MVP honors at the 2014 Barclays Center Classic and ranked 13th in the ACC in rebounding.
- Gill is 51 points shy of reaching 1,000 career points in two seasons at UVA and one at South Carolina.


## LONDON CALLING THE SHOTS

- Junior point guard London Perrantes averaged 6.4 points and 4.6 assists en route to honorable mention All-ACC honors last season.
- Perrantes ranked third in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.0) and fourth in assists (4.6 apg).
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami (1/3/15).
- Perrantes has a career 3.23 assist-to turnover ratio ( 288 assists, 89 turnovers) in 69 career games.

## THOMPSON AND SALT

- Redshirt sophomore Darius Thompson and redshirt freshman Jack Salt make their UVA debuts this season.
- Thompson sat out last season after averaging 2.6 points and 2.4 assists in 37 games at Tennessee in 2013-14.
