VIRGINIA-EAST CAROLINA SERIES

- Virginia and East Carolina are meeting this weekend for the first time since the 1999 season.
- UVa holds an 18-16 lead in the all-time series.
- ECU won the last meeting, 12-0, at the Winn-Dixie Shootout, hosted in Charleston, S.C., by The Citadel.
- The Cavaliers are making their first appearance in Greenville since taking 2-of-3 in a series from March 1-2, 1997.
- ECU is slated to visit UVa for a series next season.

RARE SEASON OPENER ON ROAD

- Virginia is opening a season on the road for the first time since 2007 when the Cavaliers traveled to Myrtle Beach to compete in Coastal Carolina's tournament.

MCMULLAN RETURNS TO ECU

- Virginia associate head coach Kevin McMullan was an assistant at East Carolina from 2000-02.
- In 2001-02, he served as acting head coach for Keith LeClair, who was diagnosed with Lou Gehrig's Disease.
- ECU went 43-20 in 2002 and won the Conference USA Championship.
- The Pirates won three C-USA titles and an NCAA Regional championship during his tenure.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 920 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 179 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (119), Jarrett Parker (110) and Phil Gosselin (103) each have more than 100 career starts.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia returns its entire starting lineup from 2009.
- UVa has led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA the last five years (3.13).
- The Cavaliers hit 59 home runs last year – most by a UVa team since 2002.
- Virginia led the ACC with a .327 batting average last year, the highest BA at UVa since 1985.
- UVa stole at least 100 bases last season (119) for the fourth straight year.

PAIR OF NORTH CAROLINA NATIVES

- UVa has two residents of North Carolina on its 2010 roster – junior C/1B/OF Kenny Swab and freshman LHP Aaron Stull.
- Stull is from Croatan, N.C., and attended Croatan High School, while Swab is from Kernersville and attended East Forsyth High School.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 per-

cent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.

- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers’ best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa’s most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO’S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.

- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

HIT STREAKS ON THE LINE

- Franco Valdes and Danny Hultzen each carry long hit streaks from the conclusion of the 2009 season.
- Valdes recorded hits in the last 12 games of the ‘09 season – a career-long streak.
- Hultzen posted hits in 11 straight contests to conclude the year, also a career best.

SUMMER CONNECTIONS

- While these teams have not played in the regular season in 11 years, there still are some connections.
- UVa’s Robert Morey played with ECU’s Seth Maness and Kyle Roller last summer with the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod League; the team won the Cape Cod championship.
- UVa’s Tyler Wilson teamed with ECU’s Kevin Brandt, Dustin Harrington and Trent Whitehead at the Cape with the Hyannis Mets.
- Virginia’s Will Roberts and ECU’s Brad Mincey played together with the champion Newport Gulls of the NECBL.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

THIRD ROTATION SLOT UP FOR GRABS

- Virginia enters the year with two veteran weekend starters in Hultzen and Morey.
- With the graduation of Andrew Carraway, the final weekend slot is still up for grabs.
- Tyler Wilson, junior transfer Cody Winiarski, Will Roberts and freshman Branden Kline all are vying for that spot, as well as midweek starting assignments.
- Wilson went 9-3 last year when he primarily came out of the bullpen. He was named to the All-Cape Cod League Team this past summer while starting.

NEXT MAN UP ON MOUND

- While Virginia has plenty of arms returning, they still need players to step up, particularly in the bullpen.
- Senior Neal Davis and freshman Aaron Stull both will be key left-handed options.
- From the right side, Kevin Arico, Corey Hunt, Ryan Briggs, Tyler Wilson, Chad O'Connor, Branden Kline, Shane Halley, Will Roberts, Justin Thompson, Cody Winiarski and Whit Mayberry all will have chances to step up for UVa.

NEWCOMERS ADD TALENT, DEPTH

- UVa welcomes a top-10 recruiting class this year, including five who were previously drafted.
- Stephen Bruno, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor all will push the returning infielders at second, third and shortstop for immediate playing time.
- Kenny Swab (C/1B/OF) and Ryan Levine (C/1B) each are physical players who add power to the lineup.
- Ryan Briggs, Branden Kline, Cody Winiarski, Whit Mayberry and Aaron Stull all provide options on the mound.
- Rob Amaro gives UVa another option at first or behind the plate, while Colin Harrington adds depth in the infield and outfield.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the Cavaliers' depth comes because of their versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opens with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
