VIRGINIA-NC STATE SERIES

- NC State holds a 119-66-1 edge in the all-time series against Virginia.
- The Wolfpack handed Virginia its lone series loss of the 2010 season, taking two of three in Raleigh (April 2-4).
- Virginia has not lost an ACC series since the trip to Raleigh last year, totaling 12 straight series wins, including seven sweeps.
- UVa won two of three games against the Wolfpack in 2009 in Charlottesville – UVa's first series win against NC State since March 23-25, 2001.
- Virginia is 8-1 against teams from the Atlantic Division this season.

VIRGINIA TIES BEST START IN ACC HISTORY

- Virginia has started the season with a 38-3 record, tying the best start in conference history and becoming just the second ACC team to start 38-3.
- The 1995 Clemson teams started 38-3 as well (Clemson began 40-3 before a three-game sweep at Florida State).
- The best start in NCAA history came from the 1977 Texas team, which began the season with 34-consecutive wins and a 40-1 record.

O'CONNOR REACHES 350 WINS IN FEWEST GAMES IN ACC HISTORY

- In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 354 wins entering the weekend (354-121-1); he reached 350 last Friday.
- He posted 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history (472).
- Mike Martin of Florida State was the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC). He needed 478 games (in seven seasons from 1992 to 1998) to reach the mark.
- Other current coaches of note in the ACC: Jack Leggett (Clemson) and Danny Hall (GT) each needed 487 games to reach 350 wins (350-137 each).

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 1 IN THIRD RPI

- UVa is ranked No. 1 in the third RPI report, announced Tuesday by the NCAA.
- UVa held the No. 2 spot for the first two weeks, but supplanted Florida for the No. 1 position this week.
- Virginia already is 10-2 against the RPI top 25 this year.
- NC State is 33rd in the RPI this week.

- Virginia owns a Division I-high 38 wins this season.
- The Cavaliers have won 13 straight games at home.
- Steven Proscia needs two RBI to tie the UVa career record.
- Branden Kline was named to the Stopper of the Year Watch List on Thursday.
- Virginia is batting .350 as a team in 14 games during the month of April.
- David Coleman is batting .564 with a team-high 19 RBI in April.

HULTZEN, ROBERTS OWN TWO LONGEST ACTIVE WIN STREAKS

- Danny Hultzen and Will Roberts boast the two longest active win streaks in the nation – Hultzen with a 17-game win streak and Roberts with a 15-game streak.
- Hultzen last took a loss on March 5, 2010, against Wright State and is 28-2 in his career.
- Roberts has yet to absorb a loss at UVa and is 15-0 in his career, including 8-0 this year.
- The only other pitcher nationally to have a 10 or more game winning streak currently is Texas' Taylor Jungmann (10).

BATS COME IN LIKE A LION IN APRIL

- Since the start of April, Virginia has been sizzling at the plate, hitting at a .350 clip in 14 games during the month.
- UVa has had at least 10 hits in 13 of 14 games (the exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).
- UVa has 180 hits, including 38 doubles, five triples and eight homers, in the last 14 games.
- Six Cavalier regulars are hitting over .300 during that span, including a pair over .400 – David Coleman (.564) and Steven Proscia (.415). Reed Gragnani is batting .395 in April.

COLEMAN CONTINUES TO MASH

- David Coleman has been the Cavaliers' hottest hitter of late, batting .564 (22-for-39) with a team-best 19 RBI in April.
- Entering Friday, Coleman owns hits in seven straight at bats as he lifted his batting average to .394.
- He has posted a pair of four-hit games in April and has notched hits in 11 of the 12 games he has played in the month (only exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.6 runs per game, fewest in Division I baseball (UCLA, Texas A&M, Vandy are second at 2.8 per game).
- Virginia entered the week with a .982 fielding percentage, which was second in the nation behind San Francisco (.984).
- UVa has committed 26 errors in 41 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

WAHOOS RACK UP ACC-RECORD 12TH SHUTOUT

- Virginia has recorded a dozen shutouts in its 38 wins this season, breaking the ACC record.
- The conference record of 11 shutouts was held by the 1977 Clemson and 2005 Virginia teams.
- The NCAA single-season shutout record is 24, set by the 1972 Arizona State team.
- UVa posted two shutouts in 2010 and five in 2009.

CAVALIERS STRIKE FOR BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has a tendency to score in bunches, with 50 innings of three runs or more this season.
- The Cavaliers' single-inning high is 10 runs vs. Maryland; UVa scored nine in an inning vs. Duke as well.
- UVa has scored three runs in 29 different innings this year.
- On the flip side, Virginia has allowed just 11 innings of three or more runs (six 3-run innings, five 4-run innings).

PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time in school history, Virginia has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak, starting March 22, which ended April 10 at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-10 in all of those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (7th, 2.35), strikeouts/nine innings (1st, 10.5), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.78), fewest walks/9 inns (2nd, 2.07).
- UVa has allowed more than four earned runs just four times this year.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,013 games all time (1,611 losses, 40 ties).

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 91 batters (2.21/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.26 team ERA.
- UVa averages nearly a walk fewer per nine innings than any other ACC team this year. (Clemson, 3.11/9 IP).

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 99, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (110).
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in eight of his nine starts this season (14.53 per nine innings - first in the nation).
- He has issued only 10 walks (9.9:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 9-0 in Hultzen's starts this year and 33-8 in his career, including 23-2 since 2010; UVa is 13-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia has won 15 straight series openers with Hultzen pitching, dating to April 2, 2010 at NC State.

- He has allowed no more than seven hits in any start this season.
- With 99 strikeouts this season, Hultzen ranks 10th in UVa single-season history (needs two to reach ninth place, five to tie for eighth).

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record earlier this season. With 329 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He currently ranks 12th in ACC history.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He passed Jacob Thompson (2006-08) for first in career wins at UVa last week with his 28th career win.
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.933; 28-2), ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.19 stands third in UVa history, while his 329 strikeouts ranks first.
- He ranks eighth in innings pitched with 263.1. With 0.1 innings he will match Jeff Kamrath (2001-05) for seventh, and with 4.1 innings he will tie Kent Kruse (1990-93) for sixth.

Hultzen on the UVa Career Charts:

WILSON A FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball.
- One-third of the final voting tally comes from fan votes at seniorclassaward.com.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the week-end rotation in 2011.
- He is 4-0 with a 2.63 ERA this year. In 54.2 innings he has allowed just 40 hits and 15 walks with 66 strikeouts (sixth most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 21 career wins, which is tied for fourth in Virginia history (21-7, 3.11 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 81 (12 starts) and needs four strikeouts to reach the top 10 in career strikeouts at UVa.

ROBERTS SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 26.2 INNS

- Will Roberts gave up a run-scoring single to Duke's David Perkins last Sunday in the first inning, ending his scoreless innings streak at 26.2.
- That is the longest scoreless streak for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle worked 29.0-consecutive scoreless innings from April 10-May 25, 2005.
- He had not allowed a run in his previous four starts (5.0 innings vs. Towson, 9.0 vs. George Washington, 7.0 vs. Radford, 5.0 vs. Georgetown).
- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.
- Roberts currently leads the ACC with a 1.11 ERA and is tied for first in wins (8) and shutouts (2) while standing seventh in innings pitched (56.2).

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has virtually stopped its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 14 stolen bases in 26 attempts (53.8 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 17 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 46.2 percent of potential base stealers, UVa also tops the ACC. UNC is second at 44.7 percent.

KLING EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 11 saves in as many opportunities.
- He ranks third in the nation in saves; the total also is tied for the fourth most in a season in UVa history.
- Kline has struck out 34 in 24.0 innings (18 games). In that span he has allowed five runs, 15 hits and nine walks (1.88 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 25 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 25 dates), Virginia ranked 17th nationally in total attendance in 2011 with a total of 68,378.
- UVa also stood 24th in average attendance at 2,735 fans per game.
- UVa has played in front of eight home crowds of 3,000-plus this season.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- In the NCAA's latest rankings on Monday, Virginia ranked second nationally in doubles with 93.
- Kennesaw State held the national lead with 95 doubles.
- The Cavaliers hit 21 doubles in the last six games and 38 in the last 14 contests.

NOTING THE ROBERTS PERFECT GAME

Some quick bullet points on Will Roberts' perfect game against George Washington on March 29:

- Eighth nine-inning perfect game in NCAA Division I since 1957 (19 total - 10 7-inning, one 5-inning)
- Second ACC perfect game (Dick Reitz of Maryland vs. Johns Hopkins, 1957)
- First perfect game in Virginia history; first UVa no-hitter since Mike Ballard vs. BC on April 16, 2006
- First perfect game in Division I since March 2, 2002 (Auburn's Eric Brandon vs. Murray State)
- Roberts threw 98 pitches (67 strikes)
- He went to just four three-ball counts (one 3-0 count) and six two-ball counts
- He was behind in the count in just 12 instances (five were at 1-0); nine outs came on first two pitches
- Roberts recorded 10 strikeouts, 14 groundouts, two pop outs and one fly out
- He tied a career high with his 10 strikeouts
- Final out came on a groundout to second baseman Keith Werman, who was the busiest UVa defender with seven assists and two putouts
- It was Roberts' first career complete game and shutout (previous career high was 7.2 innings)
- He threw seven pitches in second and seventh inning and eight in the third
- Game lasted just 1 hour, 55 minutes
- The perfect game earned ESPN's top play that night and the next day
- The win marked Virginia's 2,000th victory in program history (122 seasons)

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate this year.
- He is batting a team-best .369, which ranks seventh in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks has racked up a .351 batting average in 18 ACC games this season (12th in conference).

PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .415 clip (34-for-82). That ranks second in the conference behind Georgia Tech's Kyle Wren (.422).
- Proscia leads the conference with 21 RBI in ACC games and stands second with 34 hits (Wren, 35).
- He owns a .437 on base percentage in ACC play.
- Proscia has racked up two or more hits in 11 of the 18 ACC games, with at least one hit in 15 of 18.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers.
- He has moved into fourth-place tie in career RBI at Virginia with 165.
- Proscia needs one RBI to match Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) and Bill Narleski (1984-87) for second.
- He is two shy of Sean Doolittle's school record of 167.
- Proscia now has 227 career hits, which ranks ninth in Virginia history (he needs 13 hits to tie for eighth).
- Proscia also owns 54 career doubles, which is second in the Virginia career annals behind only Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He is tied for fourth on the team with a .308 batting average and is tied for first in the ACC with Georgia Tech's Kyle Wren with 43 runs.
- Taylor has notched hits in 34 of his 41 games this year and has reached base safely in all but one game.
- He led off the Tuesday game at Radford with a home run on the game's first pitch (his first college home run).
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

LAST WEEKEND: VIRGINIA SWEEPS DUKE

- Virginia swept three games from Duke last weekend at home, winning 10-0 Friday night, then taking both ends of the Sunday doubleheader, 3-2 in 11 innings and 18-4.
- Danny Hultzen fired seven shutout innings with nine strikeouts in the Friday win.
- Duke scored two in the eighth inning of the first game Sunday to send it to extra innings, but John Hicks hit a walk-off single in the 11th win it for UVa.
- Tyler Wilson fired 7.2 innings in game 1 against Duke, including 5.1 perfect innings to open the game.
- UVa scored nine in the third inning of game two to cruise to an easy win.

2010: NC STATE USES LONG BALL TO WIN 2 OF 3 FROM CAVALIERS

- NC State was the lone team to take an ACC series with UVa last year, winning 6-5 in 11 innings in the opener before UVa took the Saturday game, 8-4. The Wolfpack won the rubber game, 7-6.
- The Virginia bullpen squandered late-inning leads in the Friday and Sunday games; in game three, Andrew Ciencin hit a seventh-inning grand slam off Tyler Wilson to rally the Pack to the win.
- Steven Proscia went 7-for-12 (.583) in the series,

while John Hicks and Phil Gosselin each were 6-for-14 (.429).

- UVa had at least 13 hits in each of the three games.
- Eight of the nine UVa starters had hits in each of the games.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 27.0 innings out of the bullpen and 34.2 innings total in 31 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

HULTZEN NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK – AGAIN

- Virginia LHP/utility Danny Hultzen was named one of *Collegiate Baseball's* National Players of the Week Monday (March 11). He joined Baylor RHP Logan Verrett and Georgia Tech RHP Mark Pope in earning the honor.

- It marks the second time in three weeks that Hultzen gleaned this distinction from *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Hultzen improved to 4-0 on the season after firing 6.2 shutout innings Friday against Clemson, which came into the game as the top hitting team in the ACC with a .343 batting average. He fanned 14 Clemson batters and struck out at least two batters in six of the seven innings he worked during a 5-0 win against the Tigers.
- Hultzen also went 3-for-8 with three RBI at the plate for the week.

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVa averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC over the same span with a .968 fielding mark.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVa’s depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong defensive first baseman and will DH and play the outfield as well.
- Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor each can play multiple infield positions as well as the outfield.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.
