FOR OPENERS

- UVa has a 17-game home-opening winning streak, including a 5-0 mark under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia's last loss in its home-opener was a 62-52 setback against then-No. 25 Clemson on Dec. 7, 1996.
- London Perrantes and Evan Nolte return to the lineup after missing the JMU game due to violation of team rules in the summer.
- The Cavaliers are 3-0 all-time against Norfolk State in the series that began in 2010-11.

SERIES HISTORY

- UVa is 3-0 all-time against Norfolk State with all three wins coming at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville.
- Virginia has a 7.3 point margin of victory in its three wins against Norfolk State.
- UVa has held Norfolk State to 56 points or less in all three wins.

LAST TIME VS. NORFOLK STATE

- The Cavaliers defeated the Spartans 66-56 behind 14 points and eight rebounds from Justin Anderson on Dec. 23, 2013, last season.
- Former UVa star Joe Harris added 12 points for UVa and all 10 Cavaliers who played scored in the win.
- Virginia outrebounded NSU, 36-31, and limited the Spartans to 36.4 percent (20-of-55) shooting from the field.

VIRGINIA'S NO. 9 AP PRESEASON RANKING BEST SINCE 1982-83

- UVa is ranked No. 9/8 in the Associated Press and USA Today preseason coaches' polls.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking is UVa's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- Virginia has been ranked in the preseason rankings in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2000-01 and 2001-02.
- UVa's No. 3 final AP ranking last season marked its highest final ranking since 1982.

ALL-TIME VS. MID-EASTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

• Virginia is 21-0 all-time vs. the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (6-0 vs. Hampton, 4-0 vs. Howard, 2-0 vs. Maryland Eastern Shore, 2-0 vs. Morgan State, 3-0 vs. Norfolk State, 1-0 vs. Bethune-Cookman, 1-0 vs. Coppin State, 1-0 vs. North Carolina A&T and 1-0 vs. South Carolina State).

- Justin Anderson tallied a game-high 18 points to lead No. 9/8 Virginia to a 79-51 win at James Madison on Friday, Nov. 14.
- Anthony Gill added 15 points and Malcolm Brogdon had 14 points and a team-high four assists in the win.
- Devon Hall recorded five steals and Isaiah Wilkins had eight points, five rebounds, two steals and two blocks in their collegiate debuts.
- Virginia shot 58 percent from the floor, including a 69.2 percent (18-26) clip in the first half.
- The Cavaliers outscored the Dukes 36-8 in the paint and held a 38-27 edge in rebounds.

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- Since the 1999-2000 season, Virginia has a 52-13 record against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- UVa is 18-4 in its last 22 games vs. in-state opponents.
- The Cavaliers went 6-1 against in-state teams last season, defeating Virginia Tech twice and James Madison, Liberty, Hampton and Norfolk State once each. UVa suffered its Ione in-state loss to VCU.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year UVa head coach Tony Bennett sports a 107-60 mark in Charlottesville and 176-93 record in nine seasons.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to the three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 61-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09; second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, fifth in 2012-13 and first in 2013-14).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

ABOUT THE 2014-15 SCHEDULE

- Six of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the AP preseason poll (Duke, North Carolina, Louisville, Syracuse and Harvard), while six (Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Notre Dame, Florida State and Maryland) are receiving votes.
- Nine opponents (Duke, Louisville, Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Harvard, North Carolina, Syracuse and VCU) played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, while three (Clemson, Davidson and Florida State) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Norfolk State and Cleveland State) in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball for the second consecutive season.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last five seasons.
- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Louisville, Virginia, Syracuse, Pitt, Notre Dame, Florida State, NC State, Miami, Clemson, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Boston College and Virginia Tech.

EMBRACE THE PACE

• In 2013-14, the Cavaliers ranked in the top 10 nationally in seven defensive categories: points per game (1st), possessions per 40 minutes (3rd), rebounds per game (4th), offensive rebound percentage (5th), true shooting percentage (8th), field goal percentage (9th) and points per possession (9th).

- Virginia held 35 of its 37 opponents below 50 percent shooting from the floor, and opponents shot 38.8 percent (9th nationally) from the floor and 32.3 percent from 3-point range.
- The Cavaliers have held 24 straight opponents and 37 straight ACC opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field.
- Virginia limited its opponents to a combined 127 fast break points for an average of 3.4 per game.

BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason All-ACC performer Malcolm Brogdon leads UVa into action this season.
- Brogdon had 14 points and a team-high four assists in the season-opener at JMU.
- Brogdon has scored in double figures in 24 of the last 25 games dating back to last season.
- In 2013-14, Brogdon averaged a career-high 12.7 points and 5.4 rebounds en route to All-ACC honors.
- Brogdon scored a career-best 23 points in the 2014 ACC Tournament final against Duke.

LONDON CALLING

- Sophomore point quard London Perrantes averaged 5.5 points and 3.8 assists to earn All-ACC Freshman Team honors last season.
- Perrantes ranked sixth nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.5.
- Perrantes (140 assists) became the fourth UVa freshman to record 100 assists in a season, joining Cory Alexander (144 in 1991-92), Jeff Jones (136 in 1978-79) and Sean Singletary (113 in 2004-05).
- Perrantes had a career-high 15 points vs. Miami (2/26/14) and career-best nine assists vs. North Carolina (1/20/14).

ANDERSON STARTS FAST

- Junior guard Justin Anderson started at guard and led Virginia with 18 points and six rebounds in the season-opening win at James Madison.
- Anderson was named 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds.
- In 2013-14, Anderson led the team in scoring in five games and had several game-changing defensive plays to ignite UVa.

PAINT IT ORANGE AND BLUE

- Virginia dominated the interior at James Madison, outscoring the Duke 36-8 in the paint.
- Frontcourt players Anthony Gill (15 points), Isaiah Wilkins (8 points), Darion Atkins (7 points) and Mike Tobey (6 points) combined for 36 points in the win at JMU.

- Atkins had a game-high 10 rebounds and Wilkins and Tobey blocked two shots each.
- Gill, Wilkins, Atkins and Tobey combined to shoot 63.6 percent (14-22) against the Dukes.

NOLTE KNOWS SHOOTING

- Junior forward Evan Nolte is one of Virginia's top 3-point shooting threats.
- Nolte, who keyed UVa's rally with a pair of 3-pointers against Coastal Carolina in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, has shot 37.1 percent from 3-point range during his career.
- Nolte made five 3-pointers and scored a career-high 18 points at Virginia Tech as a freshman in 2012-13.

ROOKIES IMPRESS IN COLLEGIATE DEBUTS

- Redshirt freshman Devon Hall and true freshmen Isaiah Wilkins and Marial Shayok made strong impressions in their collegiate debuts at JMU.
- Hall had five points and five steals in a starting role in place of London Perrantes.
- Wilkins chipped in eight points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks, while Shayok added six points.
- Freshman B.J. Stith added a pair of steals in eight minutes of action.
- Wilkins averaged 18.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.4 blocks en route to Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year honors for Greater Atlantic Christian last season, while Shayok averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds per game for Blair Academy.
- Stith averaged 12.4 points and 4.3 rebounds for national runner-up Oak Hill Academy.
- Wilkins is the stepson of NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, and Stith is the son of UVa all-time leading scorer Bryant Stith.

BROGDON NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Malcolm Brogdon is one of five players named Preseason All-ACC.
- Joining Brogdon on the preseason All-ACC team were Marcus Paige (North Carolina), Montrezl Harrell (Louisville), Jahlil Okafor (Duke) and Jerian Grant (Notre Dame).
- Paige was the pick for Preseason ACC Player of the Year and Okafor was named Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year.

PERRANTES ON EARLY SEASON COUSY WATCH LIST

- · London Perrantes is one of 36 players on the preseason Bob Cousy Award Watch List, honoring the nation's top point guard
- Perrantes ranked first in assist-to-turnover ratio (4.47) and seventh in assists (4.22 apg) during ACC games last season.

VIRGINIA INKS POWER FORWARD JARRED REUTER

- Brewster Academy power forward Jarred Reuter (Marion, Mass.) inked a National Letter of Intent with the Cavaliers on Nov. 12.
- In 2013-14, the 6-8, 250-pound Reuter averaged 13 points and nine rebounds and shot 57.5 percent from the floor, helping Brewster to a 33-2 record and New England Preparatory School Athletic Council (NEPSAC) Class AAA championship and National Prep title.
- In 2012-13, Reuter was named the NEPSAC Class A Player of the Year after averaging 23 points and 12 rebounds for Tabor Academy.

You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basket-ball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

<u>RADIO</u>

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.
