HOOS AND HEELS RENEW ACQUAINTANCES

- North Carolina holds a 179-107-4 edge in the all-time series with Virginia.
- Virginia has won nine of the last 11 meetings, including a three-game series sweep in Chapel Hill to conclude the 2015 regular season.
- UVA has won its last four series against UNC.
- Twenty-one of the last 30 games have been decided by three runs or fewer.
- UVA head coach Brian O'Connor is 23-22 against UNC.

LIFTING THE LID ON THE ACC SEASON

- Virginia has won its opening ACC series in each of the last eight seasons.
- UVA last lost an ACC-opening series in 2008 when it dropped two of three games at NC State.
- This marks the fourth straight year UVA has opened ACC play in the Triangle (at Duke in 2014 and 2016, vs. Pitt in Cary in 2015).

DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Virginia already has hit 16 home runs, the most homers through 13 games in the Brian O'Connor era.
- The Cavaliers did not hit their 16th homer last year until April 6 (31st game).
- Adam Haseley has a team-high five long balls – each to the opposite field.
- Seven Cavaliers have gone yard this year.

RUNNING WILD

- Virginia stole four bases Tuesday and is 25-for-27 in base thievery this year.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 11 steals, nearly twice what any Cavalier had in the entire 2016 season (Ernie Clement led team with six).
- McCarthy is second nationally in stolen bases to Campbell's Drew Butler (14).
- It's also the most for a UVA player since Jake's brother, Joe, had 11 in 2014.
- UVA stole 27 bases last year, its fewest during the Brian O'Connor era.
- On the flip side, UNC has allowed just eight stolen bases this year.

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- Virginia batters have struck out an ACC-low 32 times in 13 games (2.5 strikeouts per game).
- That total is nearly half that of any other ACC team (Georgia Tech, 60).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in every game and last recorded a strikeout in the ninth inning of the Saturday game against Niagara.
- Ernie Clement has yet to whiff in 67 plate appearances this year, while Robbie Coman and Pavin Smith each have one strikeout.

THINGS TO KNOW

- UVA ranks third nationally in scoring (10.2 runs/game and fourth in runs (133).
- Pavin Smith is a .381 career hitter vs. UNC (8-21, 4 2B, 4 RBI).
- Jake McCarthy leads the ACC and is tied for first nationally with 11 stolen bases.
- Cameron Simmons leads the team in OBP at .580 (.313 last year).
- UVA did not strike out in the last two games and has nearly a 2:1 BB/K ratio (63/32).

HOT BATS TO START THE SEASON

- Virginia ranks third nationally in scoring (10.2/game) and fourth in runs (133). Only New Mexico State (11.1/game) and Louisville (10.4) average more.
- UVA ranks fifth nationally in batting at .343.
- Virginia scored at least seven runs in each of its first eight games for the second time in program history (1897).
- UVA's six starters who have started each game are all batting at least .339, led by Cameron Simmons (.439, fifth in ACC), Robbie Coman (.420, ninth in ACC) and Adam Haseley (.404, 13th in ACC).

SIMMONS HAS BIG WEEKEND

- Cameron Simmons was a constant presence on the basepaths in UVA's four games last weekend.
- He reached base safely in 16 of his last 20 plate appearances, including 12 of 15 last weekend (6 hits, 6 BB).
- Simmons was 6-for-9 with a triple and three RBI last weekend and 3-for-4 with a walk on Tuesday at GW.
- He already has walked a team-high 11 times this year – more than his entire total in 2016 (8).
- Simmons also leads the team in OBP (.582) this year.

CAVALIERS ON THE ROAD

- Virginia is in a stretch in which it plays seven of eight games on the road, including ACC series at nationally ranked UNC and Clemson.
- UVA is 4-0 away from home this year (2-0 neutral).
- UVA finished 11-8 in true road games in 2016 and was 14-10 away from home.

O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He ranks 10th in ACC history in wins and, in 825 games, is the second-fastest in league history to reach 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).

- Now with 608 career wins, O'Connor needs one victory to surpass former Wake Forest coach George Greer (1988-2004) for ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (244) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

COMEBACK KIDS

- Virginia has come from behind on three occasions this year when it trailed in the seventh inning or later.
- UVA twice has rallied from large, late deficits.
- UVA came back from a 6-0, seventh-inning deficit on Feb. 19 against Kansas to win 9-6. It marked the Cavaliers' largest comeback since rallying from 6-0 down in the first inning on May 16, 2006, at Old Dominion.
- The Cavaliers rallied from a 6-2 deficit in the seventh inning against VMI, winning 9-7.

IN THE POLLS

- Virginia is ranked as high as No. 7 in the latest polls (Collegiate Baseball) and is No. 8 in the USA Today Coaches poll this week.
- UNC is Virginia's first ranked opponent this year.
- UVA has 15 games scheduled against teams ranked in the Baseball America poll: Florida State (3), Louisville (5), North Carolina (10), Clemson (11) and Georgia Tech (23).
- The Cavaliers do not play NC State (receiving votes) in league play this year.

VETERAN COMAN STARTS FIFTH YEAR STRONG

- UVA benefits from the return of graduate student Robbie Coman, who suffered a season-ending arm injury on Feb. 28, 2016, just seven games into the season.
- Coman is off to a hot start, batting .420 (ninth in ACC), including a pair of four-hit games, in 13 starts (nine at catcher, four at DH).
- He has been a part of 197 wins during his five years, including three NCAA Super Regionals, two CWS and the 2015 NCAA Championship.
- Coman earned his bachelor's degree in economics (with a history minor) last spring and is on track to earn a master's in higher education athletic administration in May.

RECORDS WATCH

- Currently with 66 games and 10 saves, RHP Alec Bettinger needs seven appearances and two saves to reach the top 10 in UVA history.
- Adam Haseley is tied for 10th in program history with nine triples and will move into ninth with his next triple.
- Haseley also needs 24 runs to reach UVA's top 10.
- Ernie Clement (7 triples) needs two triples to crack the top 10 at UVA.
- Pavin Smith (123 RBI) needs 23 RBI to reach the top 10 at UVA.

CAVALIERS AT HOME AT DAVENPORT

- This marks the 129th season of Virginia Baseball, including the 16th at Davenport Field, which opened in 2002.
- Virginia is 384-96 (.800) at Davenport Field since 2004 under Brian O'Connor, including a 8-1 mark this season.

- UVA averaged 3,675 fans per game last year, including a program-record 3,638 per game for the regular season.
- The Cavaliers passed the 100,000 mark in attendance for the sixth time in seven years this season (120,082 total).

TRIO OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named to various All-America teams in the preseason: Ernie Clement (2B), Adam Haseley (UTL) and Pavin Smith (1B).
- Haseley and Smith also were named to the 55-man Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- The Preseason All-America honors:
 - **Ernie Clement:** 1st team (D1Baseball), 2nd team (Baseball America)
 - **Adam Haseley:** 2nd team (Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball)
 - **Pavin Smith:** 1st Team (Baseball America, Perfect Game), 2nd Team (Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball)

VETERAN LINEUP RETURNS

- Virginia returns seven position starters from its 2016 team, including 2015 starter Robbie Coman, who missed most of 2016 with an injury.
- UVA's right side of the infield is one of the best in the nation, with the All-ACC duo of Pavin Smith (1B, 141 starts) and Ernie Clement (2B, 134 starts).
- UVA returns outfield starters Adam Haseley (CF, 141 starts) and Cam Simmons (RF), and also regains the services of Jake McCarthy, who missed the final 53 games last year with a toe injury.
- Coman anchors the catching staff, while versatile infielder Justin Novak (76 starts) also is back.

QUESTION MARKS, BUT TALENT FOR PITCHERS

- Virginia's starting pitching is largely unproven entering 2017, but the coaching staff is enthusiastic about the potential.
- Adam Haseley (21 career starts) is the lone rotation holdover from the end of the 2016 season. He was second in the ACC was a 1.73 ERA last year.
- Daniel Lynch started nine games last year, including six on weekends, primarily in the first half of the year.
- The bullpen is anchored by junior Tommy Doyle at closer and Alec Bettinger – each of whom spent time in the 2016 weekend rotation.
- Veterans Bennett Sousa, Jack Roberts, Tyler Shambora and Chesdin Harrington also are back for the bullpen.

BACK FROM INJURIES

- Virginia got five players back this year from injuries suffered over the past two seasons.
- Pitchers Derek Casey, Evan Sperling and Riley Wilson are back and healthy, as are catcher Robbie Coman and outfielder Jake McCarthy.
- Sperling suffered an arm injury in his final start as a senior in high school and missed all of his freshman season at Virginia.
- Casey was injured while pitching on April 21, 2015, and sat out all of the 2016 season.
- Wilson battled shoulder problems over his first two seasons at UVA, but has returned to full strength.
- McCarthy (toe) and Coman (arm) each were injured in the first two weeks of the 2016 season.

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 608-224-2 (.729) in his 14th season as UVa's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history late last season.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's first 13 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

LONGEVITY, STABILITY IN COACHING STAFF

- Virginia's coaching trio of Brian O'Connor, Kevin McMullan and Karl Kuhn are in their 14th year together.
- No current coaching staff in Division I college baseball has been together longer.
- The staff has combined for 607 wins, an average of over 45 wins per season, and has reached the NCAA tournament in each of their first 13 seasons.

UVA SECOND NATIONALLY IN ERA SINCE 2005

- Entering the season, Virginia owned the second best ERA among all NCAA Division I teams over the past 12 seasons with a 3.17 team ERA since 2005.
- UVA finished second nationally in ERA (2.23) in 2014 and has ranked among the NCAA top 20 in nine of the 13 years under the current coaching staff.
- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2011 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

DEFENSE TOPS ACC UNDER CURRENT STAFF

- Virginia has posted the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- UVA has accrued a .973 fielding percentage over the last 13 seasons.
- UVA owns a .977 fielding percentage this year.

CAVALIERS TOP ACC IN BATTING SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years with a combined .303 average and is second this year (.343).
- The Cavaliers led the conference in batting in 2009, 2010 and 2013 and were second in 2011, 2012 and 2014.
- UVA was third in the ACC in batting last year at .304.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia lost several key players off of its 2016 team.
- Two-time All-America catcher Matt Thaiss (153 career starts) was a first-round draft pick (16th overall) of the L.A. Angels after batting a team-high .375 in 2016.
- Three-year starting shortstop Daniel Pinero (194 starts) was drafted in the ninth round by the Tigers.

- UVA's Friday starter, Connor Jones, was selected in the second round by St. Louis, and finished fourth in career wins (22) and eighth in innings (268.2) at UVA.
- Left-handed pitchers Kevin Doherty and David Rosenberger each graduated after playing key roles out of the bullpen last year.

PINERO NAMED TO CANADA'S ROSTER FOR WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC

- Former Cavalier shortstop Daniel Pinero has been named to Canada's roster for the upcoming World Baseball Classic.
- Pinero is the first Virginia alum to play in the WBC, which began in 2006 and is in its fourth installment this year.
- Canada joins Colombia, Dominican Republic and United States in Pool C, which will be played at Marlins Park in Miami from March 9-13.

CHANGES COMING AT DAVENPORT

- Davenport Field is scheduled to undergo a \$12-18 million expansion following the 2017 season, with renovations slated to be complete in time for the start of the 2018 campaign.
- Among the planned renovations to improve the game-day experience:
 - A new grand entry in right field.
 - An expanded concourse down the right-field line that extends around the right-field pole toward right centerfield.
 - A field-level club area and seating for approximately 140 fans.
 - Chairback seats along the first baseline.
 - Moving the UVA bullpen to left field to make room for chairback seats along the third baseline.
 - New concessions, merchandise, and restroom facilities.
 - Areas for player training and development, including an indoor pitching development center.
 - New offices for the baseball coaches.
