VIRGINIA-CLEMSON SERIES

- Clemson owns a 101-39 edge in the all-time series with Virginia.
- The teams are meeting for the first time in the regular season since April 20-22, 2007, at Clemson (a 2-1 UVA series win). The Tigers are playing at Davenport Field for the first time since March 17-19, 2006.
- Clemson has not won in Charlottesville since May 13, 2002, and has been swept in each of its last two visits.
- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 12-3 in his tenure against the Tigers.
- The teams' last meeting came in the 2009 ACC Tournament, where UVA won 6-5 to start its postseason run of success.

HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational this season, posting a 4-1 record with a league-low 1.06 ERA.
- In 34 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 43 and walked just four. Batters are hitting .138 against him – lowest in the ACC.
- Since allowing two runs, two hits and two walks in the first inning of the season opener at East Carolina, Hultzen has surrendered just three runs (two earned), 14 hits and two walks, with 43 strikeouts.

PITCHING STRONG OVER PAST 10 DAYS

- In the last six games (all wins), Virginia's pitching staff has been stingy, with a 1.83 team ERA.
- Opponents are batting .174 during this stretch.
- UVA has allowed no more than three runs in any of those games. In 54 innings, UVA pitchers have allowed just 32 runs and 18 walks with 55 strikeouts.

CANNON RIDES THE HIT WAVE

- Tyler Cannon has a career-best 13-game hit streak entering the week, dating to March 5. The streak currently is the eighth-longest in the country and the longest active streak in the ACC.

- Tyler Cannon is the only current UVA player who has seen regular-season action against Clemson (2007).
- Virginia has outscored its opponents 28-3 in the second inning this season.
- Virginia leads the ACC in doubles (63).
- Cannon has moved into eighth place on the all-time UVA hits list (233).
- Virginia's returning starters have combined for over 1,000 career starts.

- In the streak, he is batting .444 (24-for-54) and has at least two hits in eight of the 13 games, including four Tuesday vs. Marshall.
- He also has six doubles and three triples during this stretch.
- This also is UVa's best hit streak of the season; John Hicks had a 12-game streak to start the season.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon comes into the weekend with 763 career at bats, which is sixth in UVa history.
- Cannon also is in seventh place in career games played with 205.

- Cannon hit his 53rd career double on Tuesday to tie the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (2005-07).
- He also is tied for second in triples (12), eighth in hits (233) and runs scored (153) and 10th in HBP (19).

GOSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .412 batting average and .514 on base percentage.
- He ranks sixth in the ACC in batting and is tied with teammate Tyler Cannon for the ACC lead in doubles (10).

- His on base percentage ranks seventh in the ACC.
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 11 of 21 games.

GROVATT CONTINUES HOT STRETCH

- Dan Grovatt did not get the dreaded jinx after earning ACC Player of the Week honors last week, as he went 7-for-17 (.412) with a team-high nine RBI.
- He homered and drove in four runs in UVa's Sunday win vs. BC.
- He was named the ACC Player of the Week after going 9-for-17 (.529) with seven RBI March 10-14.
- He had three homers in the FSU series, including a two-homer game in the Friday win.

ARICO MOVES INTO SECOND ON SAVES LIST

- With seven saves this season, Kevin Arico now has 18 career saves – tied for second in Virginia history.
- He has matched Tim LaVigne (1997-2000) for second in the UVa annals.
- Arico currently leads the ACC with his seven saves. He has converted all of his opportunities this year.

NOTES FROM THE BOSTON COLLEGE SWEEP

- Virginia pitchers posted a 1.67 ERA in the series, with starters Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey and Cody Winiarski combining for a 0.81 ERA while striking out 23 and walking just three
- The Davenport Field crowd of 3,206 on Sunday pushed Virginia's attendance for the weekend to 9,642 - most ever for a three-game series at UVa.
- Phil Gosselin went 7-for-10 with three doubles in the series.
- Dan Grovatt was 4-for-10 with a team-high six RBI.

NO STRANGERS TO BIG CROWDS

- Virginia has gotten used to playing in front of large crowds at home and on the road this season.
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds of more than 3,500.
- UVa set a three-game home series record with 9,642 fans last weekend against Boston College.
- Virginia's home attendance (2,258) has more than doubled from this point last season (1,121), despite a cool February and early March.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, record-setting crowds at William and Mary and James Madison.

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 30-for-70 (.429) this season with 16 RBI and 25 runs scored.
- Outside of top three spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 13-for-22 with eight runs scored and five RBI this year.

OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

• Virginia has outscored opponents 14-13 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded over the the next three innings, outscoring their foes 80-18, including 28-3 in the second inning and 26-5 in the fourth.
• Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 185-76 this season.

BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

• UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with six players boasting at least 20 hits and 15 runs.
• In 10 games, at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
• On four occasions, all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
• The Cavaliers are hitting .354 as a team through 21 games (third in the ACC). Eight regular hitters are batting .300 or better.

PROSCIA PICKS UP GAME

• Steven Proscia has been a force in the cleanup spot this year. He ranks third in the ACC in RBI with 29.
• He also ranks sixth in doubles (8).
• He has a team-high eight multiple-RBI games as well as 10 multiple-hit games.
• Proscia typically hit in the five-hole last season.

NOT EASY TO RUN AGAINST CAVALIERS

• Virginia's battery has done a good job of holding runners on and cutting them down on the basepaths.
• UVa catchers have thrown out 10-of-25 (40%) would-be base stealers this season.
• Only Florida State (45.8%, 11-of-24) and Georgia Tech (42.9%, 12-of-28) have a higher percentage in the ACC this season.
• Virginia threw out 26-of-63 (41.3%) potential base stealers last season.

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

• UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 22-for-55 (.400).
• Bruno went 3-for-6 in the Florida State series and had a grand slam against Rhode Island.
• Gragnani is 8-for-18 with six RBI in four starts at DH.
• Taylor hit a big run-scoring triple in the ninth inning in UVa's win at East Carolina Feb. 21.

VIRGINIA RANKS 23RD NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

• With a season average of 2,310 per game, Virginia ranks 23rd nationally in attendance through the first

• Virginia's attendance has more than doubled from the same point last season – through 12 home games last year, UVa averaged 1,123 fans per game.
• UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
• UVa averaged 1,513 fans per game last season. The UVa single-season attendance average record is 1,774, set in 2007.

DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START

- Through 21 games, Virginia has committed just 18 errors – good for an impressive .977 fielding percentage, which is tied for the ACC lead.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

PARKER NEARING TOP OF TRIPLES LEDGER

- With his triple Sunday vs. Boston College, Jarrett Parker has hit 12 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVa history.
- He needs one more three-bagger to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,085 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 199 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (140), Jarrett Parker (131) and Phil Gosselin (124) each have more than 100 career starts.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia has earned a No. 1 ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com for the fifth straight week. UVa also was tabbed No. 1 by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) for the second straight week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia currently has three teams ranked No. 1 – baseball, men's lacrosse and men's tennis.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

- Virginia ranks third nationally in stolen bases the last four years with 495 (123.7 per year).
- UVa trails only Prairie View and Jackson State over that span.
- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

VERSATILITY KEY FOR CAVALIERS

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

2009 IN REVIEW

- Virginia finished 49-15-1 (16-11-1 ACC) and advanced to the College World Series for the first time in program history.
- UVa won the NCAA Irvine Regional and Oxford Super Regional – the program's first NCAA regional and super regional championships.
- UVa defeated Clemson, UNC, Duke and Florida State to win the ACC Baseball Championship – the third ACC crown in school history. Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, .533) was named the tournament MVP, while Danny Hultzen and Franco Valdes joined him on the All-Tournament Team.
- As the sixth seed, UVa became the lowest seed ever to win the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The Cavaliers won a school-record 49 games, while posting a record .761 winning percentage.
- Brian O'Connor was named the NCBWA and CBI National Coach of the Year.
- UVa led the ACC in batting (.327), ERA (3.23) and stolen bases (119) – the first school since Maryland in 1954 to lead the ACC in all three categories.
- UVa ranked third nationally with a 3.23 ERA.
- The Cavaliers set 11 team school records, including hits (767), runs (507) and strikeouts (593).
- Virginia had a school-record five players picked to the All-ACC First Team – Tyler Cannon (SS), Phil Gosselin (2B), Dan Grovatt (OF), Danny Hultzen (UTL) and Jarrett Parker (OF).

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.
