**5th-Ranked Florida State Hosts Wake Forest; Virginia Travels to Georgia Tech in Atlantic, Coastal Clashes; 13th-ranked Virginia Tech Visits Pittsburgh; North Carolina, Boston College, Maryland & NC State Face Non-Conference FBS Foes**

Fresh off a two-week non-conference record of 15-3, Atlantic Coast Conference football enters Week Three of the 2012 season which is highlighted by the first of back-to-back Atlantic Division clashes in Tallahassee, Fla., and a key Coastal Division matchup...5th-ranked Florida State, led by **QB EJ Manuel** and coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, hosts Wake Forest, led by **QB Tanner Price** and coached by **Jim Grobe**, in a nationally televised game (ESPN, Noon) at Doak Campbell Stadium... The game is the first of two important Atlantic contests for the Seminoles, who host 11th-ranked Clemson on Sept. 22...Wake is coming off a dramatic 28-27 win over North Carolina, while FSU has outscored a pair of FCS foes 124-3 the past two weeks... In Atlanta, unbeaten Virginia, coached by **Mike London** and led by junior **QB Michael Rocco** faces Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, and led by **QB Tevin Washington**...Both teams are looking for their first ACC and Coastal Division wins of the year, while the Yellow Jackets are also looking to

avoid an 0-2 start in the Coastal...Coastal leader Virginia Tech, ranked 13th nationally and coached by **Frank Beamer**, resumes its series with Pittsburgh, coached by **Paul Chryst**, at Heinz Field (ESPNU, Noon) in a game which will be a preview of the future, as the Panthers are scheduled to join the ACC next season...Two other ACC squads face difficult road challenges as well...North Carolina, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Bryn Renner** travel to 19th-ranked Louisville (ABC/ESPN2, 3:30 pm) at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium...The Cardinals, coached by Charlie Strong, are unbeaten after wins over Kentucky and Missouri State...Boston College, coached by **Frank Spaziani** and led by **QB Chase Rettig**, travels to Evanston, Ill., to face unbeaten Northwestern (3:30 pm, Big Ten Network) at Ryan Field...Rettig ranks 8th nationally in passing yards per game (330.0 avg)...Maryland, 2-0, after an impressive win against Temple, leads five ACC schools who are hosting non-conference foes this

weekend...The Terps, coached by **Randy Edsall** and led by **DE Joe Vellano**, host their second straight Big East foe in Connecticut (12:30 pm; ACC Network), which is also playing its second straight ACC opponent...In Miami, the Hurricanes, coached by **Al Golden**, and led by **QB Stephen Morris**, host unbeaten Bethune-Cookman (Noon, ESPN3) at Sun Life Stadium...Clemson's 12th-ranked squad, led by **QB Tajh Boyd**, hosts in-state rival Furman at Memorial Stadium (3 pm, RSN), and welcomes the return of All-America **WR Sammy Watkins**, who missed the Tigers' first two games with a suspension... After games in Atlanta and Storrs, Conn., NC State, coached by **Tom O'Brien**, hosts South Alabama in its home opener at Carter-Finley Stadium (6 p.m., ESPN3) in Raleigh...Completing the weekend, Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **WR Conner Vernon**, will host cross-town foe North Carolina Central (7 pm, ESPN 3) at Wallace Wade Stadium.

### Weekly Football Release

The ACC will publish its football release every week during the season. The first ACC release of the year will be available on Friday, August 24; the second on Tuesday, Sept. 4 and the release prior to the ACC Football Championship Game will be available on Sunday, Nov. 25. On all other weeks, the ACC Football release will be available in three parts: the first, which includes standings, statistics, game previews and game summaries, will be available each Sunday by 7 p.m. A second section of the release, including team and individual notes, TV schedules and players of the week will be released by Mondays at 3 p.m. Finally, a third section of the release with more detailed notes, national awards and announcements, will be available on Tuesdays by 2 p.m. At this time, the way to access the release on the ACC website-theACC.com-is to go to the media services section and insert the username (ACC in all caps) and password (media in all lower case) for access. Access to the website will change shortly to require an individual registration.

### ACC Players of the Week

Weekly during the season, beginning on Tuesday, Sept. 4 and, thereafter, continuing on each Monday of the season through Nov. 26, a panel of ACC media members will select the ACC Offensive and Defensive Linemen and Back of the Week; Linebacker and Receiver of the Week; as well as the ACC Rookie and Specialist of the Week. This release will be posted by 12 noon on each Monday (with the exception of the first release which will be on Tuesday, Sept. 4) of the regular season.

In addition to the normal football release package on Monday, the ACC will also release an abbreviated notes page each Wednesday during football season beginning Wednesday, Sept. 5, and concluding, Wednesday, Nov. 21.

## National Football Hall of Fame To Induct Miami's Jimmy Johnson



Atlantic Coast Conference schools will have one inductee this year at the annual National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annual banquet in New York City. Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

**Johnson** coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been

selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

# 2012 ACC Football By The Numbers

**.795** - The winning percentage of Wake Forest under head coach **Jim Grobe** when facing in-state opponents. Saturday's dramatic 28-27 win over North Carolina pushed Grobe's record against in-state teams to 31-8 in his 12 seasons at Wake Forest, a winning percentage of .795. Saturday's win gave Grobe a 5-3 mark at Wake Forest against North Carolina.

**.833** - The ACC's non-conference winning percentage through the first two weeks of the season. The Conference has posted a 15-3 mark against non-league foes. This week ACC teams face 8 non-conference opponents.

**1** - Wake Forest junior **WR Michael Campanaro** is tied for first nationally in pass receptions per game. Campanaro is averaging 11 catches per contest and is tied for the national lead with Brett Leonard of Louisiana-Monroe. Campanaro also ranks 6th nationally in receiving yards per game (130).

**2** - After season-opening wins over Murray State and Savannah State, 6th-ranked **Florida State** ranks 2nd nationally in six team categories including Scoring Offense (62.0 ppg), Scoring Defense (1.5 ppg), Rushing Defense (29.0 yds/g), Pass Defense (63.0 yds/gm), Total Defense (92.0 yds/g) and Pass Efficiency Defense (55.80).

**2.50** - Florida State **DE Bjoern Werner** ranks 2nd nationally this week in sacks per game. The Seminole junior is averaging 2.50 sacks per contest. He also ranks 4th nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 3.25 per contest.

**4** - Four times on Saturday, Virginia turned the football over to Penn State deep in its territory by fumble or interception at the UVA 17, 19, 29 and 17 yard lines. On these four occasions, **the Cavalier defense** forced Penn State (with the help of one 10-yard holding penalty) to a minus 14 yards of offense in 12 plays from scrimmage, no first downs and only allowed three total points

**6** - Six of the ACC's 12 starting quarterbacks hail from Virginia and all six led their teams to bowl games in 2011 including Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Discover Orange), Virginia Tech's **Logan Thomas** (Lynchburg, Allstate Sugar), Virginia's **Michael Rocco** (Lynchburg, Chick-fil-A), Florida State's **EJ Manuel** (Virginia Beach, Champs Sports), NC State's **Mike Glennon** (Centreville, Belk) and North Carolina's **Bryn Renner** (West Springfield, Advocare V100 Independence).

**8** - The jersey number of sophomore Duke wide receiver **Blair Holliday**, who suffered severe head injuries in a summer boating accident. The Blue Devils will wear a decal with the No. 8 on their helmets this fall to honor him.

**10** - By holding Savannah State to no points in Saturday's weather-shortened football game, **Florida State** extended its streak to 10 straight

games in which it has held its opponents to 19 or fewer points.

**12** - The number of 100-yard receiving games for Clemson junior **WR DeAndre "Nuk" Hopkins**, including two this season. Hopkins had 119 receiving yards against Auburn and 105 reception yards against Ball State. Hopkins ranks 5th in the ACC in receptions per game (9.5), 4th in receiving yards per game (112.0) and first in TD receptions (4). Duke's **Conner Vernon** leads all active ACC players with 15 100-yard receiving games, followed by UNC's **Jheranie Boyd** (13).

**12.5** - Virginia Tech junior **LB Jack Tyler** leads all ACC tacklers this week, averaging 12.5 tackles per game. Tyler keys a unit which ranks 16th nationally in total defense.

**14** - The number of teams the ACC will have on July 1, 2013. **Pittsburgh** and **Syracuse** are scheduled to join the ACC on that date with the Panthers joining the Coastal Division and the Orange moving to the Atlantic Division.

**14** - Also the number of career interceptions by NC State **CB David Amerson**, who made a game-saving pass deflection in State's 10-7 win over Connecticut. Amerson is now tied for 19th on the ACC career interception list.

**15** - The number of tackles for Virginia **LB Steve Greer** in the Cavaliers' 17-16 win over Penn State. Greer, named to the preseason All-ACC team, had three solo hits, 12 assists, 2 QB sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss as UVa held the Nittany Lions to just 121 yards of rushing offense.

**35** - The number of rushing yards allowed by NC State's defense Saturday in the Wolfpack's 10-7 win over Connecticut. In its last seven games, NC State's defense has allowed an average of only 93.9 yards rushing per game.

**61** - Clemson placekicker **Spencer Benton** set a Clemson and ACC record by booting a 61-yard field goal last Saturday in the Tigers' 52-27 win over Ball State. Benton's boot bettered the former mark of 60 yards set by Florida State's **Gary Cismesia** against Florida in 2007.

**66.8** - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 364 of 545 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .668. Only Virginia's **Matt Schaub** (.670) and Wake Forest's **Riley Skinner** (.690) have completed passes at an equal or better rate.

**82** - The ACC had two scoring plays of exactly 82 yards on Saturday. Boston College **WR Spiffy Evans** returned a punt 82 yards for a TD against Maine and Georgia Tech **QB Vad Lee** completed an 82-yard pass to **WR Jeff Greene** for a score against Presbyterian.

**188** - The amount of improvement in Maryland's rushing defense in just one year against Temple. The Owls ran for 240 against the Terps in a 38-7 win last year. This time, Maryland's defense, led by **DE Joe Vellano** and **LB Demetrius Hartsfield**, held the Owls to just 52 rushing yards on 39 carries (a 1.3 yards-per-carry average).

**192.9** - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State **QB EJ Manuel**. The Virginia Beach, Va., senior ranks 6th nationally in pass efficiency this week.

**198** - Georgia Tech quarterbacks **Tevin Washington** (97) and **Vad Lee** (101) combined to rush for 198 yards in Tech's 59-3 win over Presbyterian. Washington, who ranks 2nd in rushing in the ACC this week, has 1,701 career rushing yards, a figure which ranks 8th in ACC history for the quarterback.

**214** - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon moved into 3rd place on the ACC career list for pass receptions in the Blue Devils' loss to Stanford with 6 catches. He trails only Aaron Kelly of Clemson (232) and Desmond Clark of Wake Forest (216) on the ACC career list. His career total of 2,904 receiving yards is good enough for 11th place on the ACC career list.

**244** - The number of players from current ACC schools who earned a spot on the opening day rosters of NFL teams this year. That's the 2nd-highest amount of any conference. Miami, which has 47 of its former players in the NFL ranks, leads all schools nationally.

**253** - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 253 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is now 8th on the NCAA's career FBS list with 7th-place Tom Osborne (Nebraska) now two wins away at 255.

**330** - Boston College junior **QB Chase Rettig** is averaging 330 yards passing per game this year including a career-best 441 yards against Miami in BC's season opener. By comparison, a year ago Rettig averaged just 150.3 yards per game through the air.

**348** - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** has 348 career points, putting him in 3rd place on the ACC career scoring list. Hopkins now only trails Maryland's **Nick Novak**, who scored 393 points during the 2001-04 seasons, and Florida State's **Xavier Beitia** who scored 375 points concurrently with Novak. Hopkins, though, had his consecutive PAT streak end at 145 straight PATs without a miss against Savannah State, which was the 6th longest in NCAA history.

**712** - The number of yards of total offense for **Georgia Tech** in its 59-3 win over Presbyterian. The yardage was the 11th-best total in ACC history and the Yellow Jackets total of 469 rushing yards was the 9th-best effort by a team since the ACC began some 60 years ago.



# 2012 ACC FB Game Summaries-- Sept. 8

## Wake Forest 28, North Carolina 27

QB Tanner Price threw for a career-high 327 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 1-yard run with 2:09 to play, lifting the Demon Deacons (2-0, 1-0) over the visiting Tar Heels (1-1, 0-1) in the ACC opener for both teams. WR Michael Campanaro was on the receiving end of 13 of Price's passes for 164 yards, establishing career highs in both categories. North Carolina RB A.J. Blue, starting in place of injured Giovani Bernard, led all rushers with 106 yards and a touchdown on 19 carries.

## #6/6 Florida State 55, Savannah State 0

QB EJ Manuel passed for three touchdowns in the opening seven minutes, and Florida State's defense held Savannah State (0-2) of the FCS to 28 yards in a game that was halted in the third quarter due to lightning and heavy thunderstorms. RB James Wilder Jr. and Kelvin Benjamin each scored two touchdowns for the Seminoles (2-0).

## #12/12 Clemson 52, Ball State 27

WR DeAndre Hopkins caught three touchdown passes to tie a school record as the Tigers (2-0) cruised past the Cardinals (1-1) in Clemson's home opener. Clemson PK Spencer Benton set an ACC record with a 61-yard field goal, and RB Andre Ellington rushed for a pair of touchdowns.

## #15/18 Virginia Tech 42, Austin Peay 7

Special teams played a big role for the Hokies (2-0), who parlayed a 46-yard punt return by DB Kyshoen Jarrett and a blocked punt by RB Tony Gregory into touchdowns against the visiting Governors (0-1). QB Logan Thomas passed for 212 yards and accounted for three touchdowns and Michael Holmes rushed for two touchdowns as Virginia Tech won for the second time in five days.

## Maryland 36, Temple 27

One week after struggling to score points against William & Mary, the visiting Terps (2-0) stormed out to an early lead against the Owls en route to their second straight victory. Freshman QB Perry Hills passed for two touchdowns and ran for another to key Maryland, which built a 26-3 halftime lead and fended off a rally by Temple (1-1), which closed within 29-27 at one point in the second half.

## Virginia 17, Penn State 16

Virginia QB Michael Rocco found TE Jake McGee on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 1:28 to play, and PK Drew Jarrett's extra point lifted the Cavaliers (2-0) to the win. Penn State (0-2) saw PK Sam Ficklen miss a potential game-winning field goal attempt on the final play of the game. Virginia LB Steve Greer tallied a game-high 15 tackles, including a pair of quarterback sacks.

## NC State 10, Connecticut 7

LB Brian Slay delivered a key quarterback sack, and CB David Amerson knocked down a pass on fourth down as NC State (1-1) held off the Huskies (1-1). QB Mike Glennon's 46-yard pass to WR Bryan Underwood in the third quarter accounted for the game's only touchdown as the Wolfpack rebounded from a loss to Tennessee in Week 1 and improved to 9-1 in games following a loss since the start of the 2010 season.

## Georgia Tech 59, Presbyterian 3

RB Zach Laskey ran for 116 yards and a touchdown in his first college start, and backup QB Vad Lee threw for one touchdown and passed for another as the Yellow Jackets (1-1) won their home opener. LB Brandon Watts blocked a field goal and had six tackles to help keep the Blue Hose (1-1) off the scoreboard until another field goal try with five seconds remaining in the game was successful. Georgia Tech had 712 total yards, the second-highest total in school history, including 469 yards rushing.

## Boston College 34, Maine 3

QB Chase Rettig threw three touchdown passes, and WR Spiffy Evans caught a touchdown pass and ran a punt back 82 yards for another TD to lead the Eagles (1-1). LB Nick Clancy had 11 tackles (8 solo) and broke up three passes to help Boston College keep the visiting Bears out of the end zone.

## #21/20 Kansas State 52, Miami 13

QB Collin Klein completed 9 of 11 passes for 210 yards and had 71 yards rushing to lead the Wildcats (2-0). Miami (1-1) saw its lone touchdown come after a 77-yard kickoff return by RB Duke Johnson. Backup QB Ryan Williams hit TE Clive Walford in the back of the end zone for the touchdown, the first allowed by Kansas State's defense this season.

## #25/21 Stanford 50, Duke 13

QB Josh Nunes threw for 275 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Cardinal (2-0). Duke WR Desmond Scott caught a career-high 11 passes for 83 yards, while fellow WR Jamison Crowder hauled in a career-high 10 catches for 112 yards. Duke finished with 358 yards passing with starting QB Sean Renfree throwing for 200 and back up QB Anthony Boone for 147.

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Wake Forest quarterback Tanner Price, receiver Michael Campanaro, and defensive end Hasan Hazime headline a list of eight players named as the Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week, announced by the conference on Tuesday. Price threw for a career-high 327 yards, Campanaro caught a career-high 13 passes for 164 yards, and Hazime had five tackles in the Demon Deacons' 28-27 win over North Carolina.

Freshman quarterback Perry Hills led the Terrapins to a 36-27 win at Temple and was recognized as the Rookie of the Week.

Two Virginia Cavaliers were recognized for their performance in the 17-16 victory over Penn State. Steve Greer tallied a career-high 15 tackles to be named the Linebacker of the Week, and senior Oday Aboushi, who had 12 knockdown blocks, was named the Offensive Lineman of the Week.

Clemson's Spencer Benton connected on a 61-yard field goal to set a new ACC record and was named the Specialist of the Week. NC State's Earl Wolff, the Defensive Back of the Week, intercepted a pass and recovered a fumble to help the Wolfpack win at Connecticut.

#### OFFENSIVE BACK – Tanner Price, Wake Forest, Jr., QB, 6-2, 205, Austin, Tex.

Price completed 27 of 38 passes for 327 yards in Wake Forest's 28-27 win over North Carolina on Sept. 8. Price also carried seven times for 5 yards and rushed for a pair of touchdowns. Price's 327 yards represented a career-high in passing yards and the two rushing touchdowns were also a career-best. Trailing 27-21 with 6:36 to play in the game, Price led Wake Forest on an 11-play, 93-yard drive for the game-winning touchdown. On the drive, Price completed five of seven passes for 67 yards and carried three times for 5 yards including the game-winning 1-yard TD plunge.

#### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Oday Aboushi, Virginia, Sr., OT, 6-6, 310, Brooklyn, N.Y.

Senior offensive tackle Oday Aboushi had another solid day, grading out at 92 percent on 65 plays. He had 12 knockdown blocks against the Penn State front seven.

#### RECEIVER – Michael Campanaro, Wake Forest, Jr., WR, 5-11, 195, Clarksville, Md.

Campanaro caught a career-high 13 passes for a career-high 164 yards in Wake Forest's 28-27 win over North Carolina on Saturday. Campanaro had nine catches for 108 yards in the first half as Wake Forest built a 21-14 halftime lead. He had four catches for 56 yards in the second half, including one 15-yard reception on the game-winning drive. Campanaro's 13 receptions were two shy of the school record and the most ever by a Deacon versus the Tar Heels.

#### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Hasan Hazime, Wake Forest, Sr., DE, 6-5, 270, Pickering, Ontario

Hazime had five tackles including three solos and two assists versus North Carolina. A fifth-year transfer from Akron, Hazime made his first career start for Wake Forest on Saturday, filling in for an injured DE Zach Thompson. Hazime had a sack of North Carolina QB Bryn Renner, forcing a fumble which he then recovered, setting up Wake Forest's go-ahead touchdown in the second quarter. Hazime also broke up a team-high two pass attempts by the Tar Heels.

#### LINEBACKER – Steve Greer, Virginia, Sr., LB, 6-2, 230, Solon, Ohio

Greer had the best game of his career in Virginia's 17-16 victory against Penn State. Greer registered a career-high 15 tackles and tied his career high with two sacks. He finished the game with 2.5 tackles for loss. Greer was part of a Cavalier defense that rose up and kept the Nittany Lions out of the end zone and forced them to attempt field goals, which they converted just 1 of 5. The Virginia defense held Penn State to just -14 total yards and 3 total points following four Cavalier turnovers during the game. Three of those turnovers came inside the Virginia 25-yard line and the fourth was at the 38-yard line. Penn State managed just 2.9 yards per play during the game.

#### DEFENSIVE BACK – Earl Wolff, NC State, Sr., S, 6-0, 207, Raeford, N.C.

Wolff tallied seven stops (including five first hits or solos) in the 10-7 road win over UConn, even though he played just three quarters after leaving with an injury. He picked off the fifth pass of his career in the second half with UConn driving when Wolff caught the interception at midfield and returned it 16 yards. The senior made perhaps the biggest play of the game on defense in the third quarter when he recovered a fumble that Brandon Bishop forced with NC State leading 3-0. That gave the Pack the ball at the UConn 41 and three plays later, State scored its only touchdown of the afternoon.

#### SPECIALIST – Spencer Benton, Clemson, Sr., K, 6-1, 195, Myrtle Beach, S.C.

Benton kicked an ACC record 61-yard field goal in Clemson's 52-27 victory over Ball State. The 61-yard field goal broke the previous Clemson record by four yards and broke the previous ACC record by a yard. It was just the fourth field goal of 60 yards or more at the FBS level this century (The fifth was kicked later in the afternoon by Andrew Furney of Washington State against Eastern Washington, a 60-yarder). In addition to his record setting field goal, Benton kicked off five times with four resulting in touchbacks. He also had a 43-yard average on two punts, both of which pinned Ball State inside its own 20. He also held on Clemson place kicks, except for his 61-yard attempt.

#### ROOKIE – Perry Hills, Maryland, Fr., QB, 6-3, 205, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Hills, who last week became the first freshman to start a season opener for Maryland since Calvin McCall in 1999, had an excellent outing in the 36-27 win against Temple. The Pittsburgh, Pa., native went 11 of 21 for 190 yards and two touchdowns, and also ran for a touchdown. He also made several momentum-changing plays on third down: he ran for an 11-yard TD on third-and-goal after a low snap that hit the ground; he hit Marcus Leak for a 39-yard gain on third-and-17 in the third quarter; and finally, hooked up with Stefon Diggs down the sideline for 38 yards on a third-and-11 with under 4:00 left and Maryland clinging to a 29-27 lead. In all, Hills led Maryland on six scoring drives (four touchdowns, two field goals) in its 36-27 win over Temple.

## Boston College

Sophomore WR **Spiffy Evans** recorded his first career touchdown reception in last Saturday's win over Maine and finished with career highs in receptions (4) and receiving yards (53) ...

Evans also recorded a career long 36-yard reception in the third quarter and returned an 82-yard punt for a TD ... The return marked the first Eagles' punt return touchdown since Sept. 5, 2009 against Northeastern (Rich Gunnell) ... Junior QB **Chase Rettig** threw two touchdown passes in the span of 1:37 in the second quarter ... Rettig matched his career high in TD passes (3), which he last accomplished against Massachusetts on Sept. 24, 2011 ... Junior WR **Johnathan Coleman** recorded his first career TD reception in the second quarter vs. Maine ... Junior PK **Nate Freese** improved to 5-for-5 on the season with field goals of 39 and 20 yards ... Senior DB **Jim Noel** registered his sixth career interception, the first of the season, in the third quarter ... The field goal allowed by BC marked the first points Maine had scored against the Eagles since 1915.



## Maryland

Maryland showed improvement on offense in Saturday's 36-27 win at Temple ... The Terps' 12 first downs in the first half nearly matched their total of 13 in against William & Mary in the Sept.

1 season opener ... Maryland finished with 334 yards of total offense and 19 first downs vs. the Owls ... True freshman QB **Perry Hills** provided a spark for the offensive upgrade, completing 11 of 21 passes for 190 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing for another TD ... He was named ACC Rookie of the Week for his play ... The Terps' defense forced two early turnovers and was once again tough against the run, holding Temple to 52 yards on 39 carries ... Maryland finished the game with three sacks and seven tackles for loss ... LB **Cole Farrand** had a game-high six tackles ... DT **A.J. Francis** had a blocked field goal, sack and fumble recovery ... Maryland recorded its first safety in exactly five years in the second quarter of the Temple game ... The most recent safety prior to that had come vs. FIU on Sept. 8, 2007 ... Maryland's 23 points in the second quarter marked its most in one quarter since the Terps had 28 vs. Wake Forest on Oct. 30, 2010.



## Clemson

PK **Spencer Benton**'s 61-yard field goal at the end of the first half of Saturday's 52-27 win over Ball State set a school and ACC record ... The previous ACC-record long field goal was 60 yards by Florida State's Gary Cismesia of Florida State in 2007 ...

The previous Clemson record was 57 yards set by Obed Ariri vs. Wake Forest in 1977 and matched by Chris Gardocki vs. Appalachian State in 1990 ... Clemson has now won eight straight games at home ... The Tigers scored 45 points in the first half of Saturday's game. That is the most points scored by Clemson in a half since the Tigers scored 49 in the first half against Wake Forest in 1981 ... Clemson tallied 526 yards of total offense vs. Ball State ... Clemson is 59-0-1 all-time when amassing 500-plus yards of total offense ... WR **DeAndre Hopkins** caught six passes for 105 yards receiving and a school-record tying three touchdowns in the first half vs. Ball State ... Hopkins now has 13 career touchdown receptions ... However, Saturday marked the first time that Hopkins has had more than one touchdown reception in a game in his career.



## NC State

The game's lone touchdown in the Wolfpack's 10-7 win at Connecticut last Saturday came on QB **Mike Glennon**'s 46-yard strike to WR **Bryan Underwood** in the third quarter ... Underwood now has three

career touchdown receptions, all of at least 33 yards (79 and 33 yards last year at Virginia) ... The Pack's 10 points were its least in a victory since beating South Carolina 10-0 in the second game of the 1999 season ... It marked the fewest points NC State had scored in a road win since defeating Wake Forest 10-6 in the 1968 season opener ... The Wolfpack defense recorded three interceptions vs. the Huskies ... NC State was 5-0 last season when recording at least three interceptions in a game ... S **Earl Wolff** recorded his fifth career INT in the first half, then CB **David Amerson** picked off his 14th career pass and S **Brandan Bishop** had his 10th each in the second half ... Amerson is now two from the school record for career INTs (16) ... Redshirt sophomore **Tyson Chandler** earned his first career start vs. UConn, filling in for the injured **Rob Crisp** at left tackle ... Coming into the game, Chandler played a total of just 26 career snaps.



## Florida State

With Saturday's weather-shortened 55-0 win over visiting Savannah State, the 5th-ranked Seminoles recorded their fourth shutout (since 2010) under defensive coordinator **Mark Stoops**

... FSU's other shutouts under Stoops occurred in 2010 against Wake Forest (31-0), and 2011 versus Louisiana-Monroe (34-0) and NC State (34-0) ... All four shutouts with Stoops have come at home ... Senior WR **Rodney Smith** extended his receptions streak to 27 straight games on a four-yard catch on Florida State's first offensive play of the game vs. Savannah State ... The Miami, Fla., native followed with a career-long 61 yard touchdown catch, the eighth of his career. ... The TD pass was also the longest thrown by QB **EJ Manuel**, and came 39 seconds into the game ... Senior PK **Dustin Hopkins** missed an extra point attempt with 8:02 remaining before the half vs. Savannah State ... The miss ended his string of successful PATs at 145, which is the sixth longest in NCAA history ... Prior to the miss, Hopkins held the nation's longest active streak.



## Wake Forest

QB **Tanner Price** had a career game through the air and on the ground in last Saturday's ACC win over visiting North Carolina ... Price was 27-of-38 for a career-high 327 yards ... Price also recorded

two rushing touchdowns in the game for the first time in his career. He now has seven rushing touchdowns in his career, but Saturday marked his first times finding the end zone as a runner since Sept. 17, 2011 against Gardner-Webb ... After having a career-high 10 catches a week earlier, junior WR **Michael Campanaro** hauled in a new career-high 13 passes for a career-high 164 yards vs. the Tar Heels ... The 13 receptions are the most for the Demon Deacon against North Carolina, breaking Desmond Clark's record of 11 set in 1997 ... Campanaro's 13 catches also tied for the second-most for any receiver ever against North Carolina ... RB **Deandre Martin** connected with WR **Brandon Terry** on a 35-yard vs. UNC ... In 11-plus seasons under head coach **Jim Grobe**, Wake Forest is now 23-of-33 for 694 yards and eight touchdowns with just one interception in passes thrown by non-quarterbacks.

## Duke

With six catches for 49 yards vs. Stanford last Saturday night, senior **WR Conner Vernon** moved into third place on the ACC's all-time receptions list and into 11th place on the all-time receiving yards list .. Vernon has 214 career receptions for 2,904 yards ... The league's all-time leaders are Clemson's Aaron Kelly (2005-08) with 232 receptions and Florida State's Peter Warrick (1996-99) with 3,517 receiving yards ... Vernon extended his NCAA-leading receiving streak to 37 games. His streak is three games longer than the next closest player (Taylor Stockemer, Arkansas State at 34) and is one of only five active streaks of at least 30 games nationally ... **WR Desmond Scott** also caught a career-high 11 passes to extend his streak to 28 games ... Scott has multiple catches in 10 straight games ... Blue Devil backup **QB Brandon Connette** has averaged a touchdown for every 8.64 rushing attempts during his career ... He has 11 career rushing touchdowns on 95 rush attempts ... **P Will Monday** averaged 47.1 yards per punt on seven punts vs. the Cardinal, the second highest single-game punting average by a freshman in school history.



## North Carolina

**OG Jonathan Cooper** will be making his 38th career start in Saturday's road game at Louisville ... That is the most of any active offensive lineman in the ACC ... Cooper (37), **T James Hurst** (27), **G Travis Bond** (19), **T Brennan Williams** (16) and **C Russell Bodine** (4) have 101 combined starts on the offensive line ... **PK Casey Barth** is North Carolina's career leader with 55 made field goals ... He surpassed his brother, Connor (54), with a 30-yard field goal at Wake Forest last Saturday ... Through two games, Carolina is averaging 78 plays per game ... In 2011, UNC ran 63.4 plays per game, which ranked 117th nationally ... The Heels had a season-high 82 plays at Wake, the most at UNC since 2003 (a triple-overtime game vs. Syracuse) ... **RB A.J. Blue** has 145 yards rushing through the first two games, including a career-high 106 against Wake Forest ... Blue's career rushing total entering this season was 171 yards ... UNC head coach **Larry Fedora** and Louisville head coach Charlie Strong both served on the Florida staff in 2003-04 ... Fedora was the offensive coordinator and Strong was the defensive coordinator for Ron Zook.



## Georgia Tech

The 56-point margin of victory in the Yellow Jackets' 59-3 win over Presbyterian last Saturday was the largest in the Paul Johnson era at Tech ... Eight different Yellow Jackets scored touchdowns – the most for a Georgia Tech team since Sept. 8, 2001 vs. Navy ... Two different Tech quarterbacks threw touchdown passes (**Tevin Washington** and **Vad Lee**) for the first time since Dec. 31, 2007 vs. Fresno State in the Humanitarian Bowl ... The three points scored by Presbyterian were the fewest allowed by a Tech team since blanking Duke on Oct. 4, 2008, and it marked the first time since the 2009 season that the Yellow Jackets had held an opponent without a touchdown ... The Blue Hose averaged just 2.8 yards per pass attempt – the lowest average by a Tech opponent since 2005 ... **RB Zach Laskey** made his first career start vs. Presbyterian ... Laskey rushed for 116 yards, his 56-yard touchdown run on Tech's opening possession was his first career TD and his longest career rush.



## Virginia

Virginia's 17-16 win over Penn State last Saturday and last season's 34-31 win over Indiana marks only the fourth time an ACC team has defeated different Big Ten opponents in successive seasons – NC State (Indiana in 2000 and Minnesota in 2001), NC State (Iowa in 1992 and Purdue in 1993) and North Carolina (Michigan State in 1964, Ohio State in 1965 and Michigan in 1966) ... **LB Steve Greer** had 15 tackles against the Nittany Lions, a new career high. His previous high was 14 against Miami in 2009 ... It was Greer's eighth career game with double digit tackles and first since the 2011 meeting with NC State ... Greer also had two sacks, matching a career high set against Florida State in 2011 ... **TE Jake McGee's** 44-yard catch in the fourth quarter vs. Penn State was a career-long reception ... McGee had a career-high 99 receiving yards (his previous best was 23 yards vs. Richmond a week earlier), and his touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was the first of his career ... **QB Michael Rocco** has reached 200 yards passing in five straight games.



## Miami

The Hurricanes (1-1) play their home opener this Saturday vs. Bethune-Cookman as they attempt to bounce back from last weekend's loss at No. 20 Kansas State ... Under second-year head coach **Al Golden**, the Hurricanes are a perfect 6-0 after a loss, including this season's opener in which Miami avenged a loss to Boston College in the final game of the 2011 season ... Redshirt sophomore **TE Clive Walford** had three catches for 61 yards and a touchdown against K-State, including a career-best 56-yard catch-and-run in the first quarter ... Walford's TD grab in the fourth quarter was the first of the season and second of his career ... Thirteen freshmen, including 11 true freshmen, saw action for Miami in the game at Kansas State ... Miami has 12 different players that have at least one reception in the first two games of the season ... Junior **WR Allen Hurns** leads all receivers with 10 catches and 113 receiving yards on the season ... Five of Miami's nine scoring drives this season have used less than two minutes of clock time ... True freshman **RB Duke Johnson** leads the ACC in all-purpose yards (198.5 per game).



## Virginia Tech

The 13th-ranked Hokies have won a school- and ACC-record 13 straight true road games heading into this Saturday's trip to Pittsburgh, the longest active streak in the country, ahead of Oregon (11) ... Tech's last loss on the road came on Oct. 17, 2009 with a loss at Georgia Tech ... Only three of those wins during the 13-game road winning streak have been non-conference wins ... Ten Virginia Tech players caught passes during last Saturday's 42-7 win over Austin Peay ... **QB Logan Thomas** has moved into ninth place in career passing at Tech with 3,562 yards ... **RB Tony Gregory** blocked the second punt of his Tech career to set up a touchdown against Austin Peay ... Virginia Tech has blocked five punts - and 10 total kicks - in 11 previous games against Pittsburgh ... **CB Kyle Fuller** picked up his fourth career pass interception and second in two games in last Saturday's win ... **WR Corey Fuller's** 30-yard touchdown grab on Saturday was the first of his collegiate career ... Seven true freshmen have seen action so far this season for the Hokies ... Tech has now scored in a school-record 219 straight football games, beginning with a win over Miami on Sept. 23, 1995.

## Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Becomes NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 253 triumphs in his 32-year coaching career. Beamer is currently in 8th place on the all-time career wins list for the FBS, and trails former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne (255) by two triumphs and former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards (257) by four wins. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 141 career wins and NC State's Tom O'Brien is in 21st place (109). Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, finished his career in 2nd place on the all-time list with 389 victories, though the NCAA recognizes only 377 triumphs due to NCAA sanctions. With the NCAA sanctions levied against Penn State, Bowden is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader.

### Five Current ACC Head Football Coaches Have UVa Ties

When **Al Golden** joined the ACC as Miami's head coach for the 2011 season, he became the fifth former UVa assistant or graduate assistant coach to be a current head football coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Golden joined Boston College's **Frank Spaziani**, NC State's **Tom O'Brien**, Virginia's **Mike London** and Wake Forest's **Jim Grobe** as current ACC head coaches who have spent time as assistants or graduate assistants for the Cavaliers. Golden spent four seasons (2001-04) at Virginia as defensive coordinator under Al Groh. The Eagles' Spaziani served as an assistant coach at Virginia under then head coach George Welsh for nine seasons (1982-90), the last five as defensive coordinator. O'Brien also served under Welsh at UVa, spending 15 seasons (1982-96) there including the last six as offensive coordinator. London served two terms at UVa under Groh, serving as defensive line coach in 2001-04 and again in 2006-07 as defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. London and Golden also served as assistants to Tom O'Brien at Boston College. Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe, a 1975 Virginia graduate, who just completed his 11th season with the Deacons, lettered two seasons at UVa as a middle guard and linebacker and also spent one year as a graduate assistant coach (1975) under then Virginia head coach Sonny Randle.

### Wake Forest's Jim Grobe Latest To Join 100-Win Club

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is the fourth active ACC coach with 100 career wins. Grobe now has a record of 103-100-1 career mark for 18 seasons, the last 12 with the Deacons. ### North Carolina's Larry Fedora Makes UNC/ACC Coaching Debut

North Carolina made his debut as head coach a successful one, leading the Tar Heels to a 62-0 win over in-state foe Elon on Sept. 1. Fedora, who led Southern Mississippi to the 2011 Conference USA championship last year, is now the 35th head coach in UNC history and its 11th since joining the ACC in 1953. Fedora compiled a record of 34-19 in four years as head coach at Southern Miss.

## NC State's Tom O'Brien Latest To Coach at Multiple ACC Schools

NC State's Tom O'Brien is the fifth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to have served as a head coach of two ACC schools. O'Brien coached at Boston College from 1997 through 2006, which included the school's first two seasons (2005-06) of ACC membership. Jim Tatum was the first ACC coach at two schools; he first coached at North Carolina in 1942, then at Maryland from 1947-55 before returning to UNC beginning in 1956 until his death in 1958. Others who have coached at two ACC schools include Bobby Ross (Md, GT), Al Groh (WF, UVa) and Bill Dooley (UNC, WF).



Dooley actually coached at three current ACC schools as he spent nine seasons at Virginia Tech before the Hokies joined the ACC, in between stints at UNC and Wake Forest, winning 162 games in his career. Dooley and Ross are the only coaches in ACC history to be named ACC Coach of the Year at more than one school. Others who have coached at more than one current ACC school, though not necessarily when they were in the ACC, include John Heisman, who coached at both Georgia Tech and Clemson.

## Tech's Beamer Becomes 10th FBS Head Coach To Win 200 Games At One School

## Florida State's Jimbo Fisher Joins Select Company in Second Season

In 2011 Florida State's second-year head coach **Jimbo Fisher** joined some select company in only his second season on the job as the Seminoles head coach. Fisher compiled a 19-8 record (.704) in his first two seasons. His winning percentage ranks him 12th among all ACC head coaches in their second season, ahead of such figures as Clemson's Danny Ford and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first two years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who lost just twice in 25 games during the 1992-93 seasons, capturing ACC crowns in both years and the national title in 1993.

## Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney

Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams have won 12 of the first 14 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .857. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage ties him with Maryland's Jerry Claiborne for 3rd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is second-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won six of his first eight ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (tie for 3rd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

## ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non-divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

## 2012 ACC Bowl Selection

### Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series.



Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

### After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocare V100 Independence Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C.

### Conditional Agreement\*

8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

\*If Pac-12 or Navy is unable to fill obligation and ACC has an available team

### Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

### Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.



# The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

## The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

## BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt or Western Athletic conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is

## Playoff Coming In 2014-15

On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

## Bill Hancock, Executive Director

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

# ACC Overtime Games

## The ACC & Overtime

The Labor Day Monday matchup between Virginia Tech and Georgia Tech marked the 59th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 59 overtime contests, a large portion of them--25--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 59 overtime contests, 29 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-18 advantage in the 52 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 31-28 record. Forty-six of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
