VIRGINIA-MARYLAND SERIES

- Virginia maintains a 98-73-1 lead in the all-time series with Maryland – it marks UVA's most wins against any ACC opponent.
- The Cavaliers own a 17-1 record against Maryland under the current coaching staff (since 2004) – the only loss came April 4, 2009, at Davenport Field.

VALDES OUT 2-4 WEEKS AFTER KNEE SURGERY

- Catcher Franco Valdes will miss approximately two to four weeks after having arthroscopic surgery to repair the meniscus in his left knee.
- Valdes has been battling the injury for most of the season.

HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational in his Friday starts this season, posting a 5-1 record with a 2.10 ERA, which ranks first in the ACC.
- In 60 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 76 and walked just 10. Batters are hitting .188 against him – lowest in the ACC.
- He ranks seventh nationally in strikeouts, 12th in hits allowed per nine innings (5.85) and 20th in ERA.

QUICK NOTES FROM THE VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

- Tyler Cannon and Jarrett Parker each went 4-for-10 in the series.
- The series was well-played – both teams committed two errors each.
- UVA got three strong performances from its starting pitchers. All three worked at least six innings and gave up only two earned runs apiece.
- Virginia Tech had just 22 hits in the series – the Hokies hit just .222 in the three games.

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 3 IN LATEST RPI

- Virginia is ranked No. 3 in the second RPI report, which was released Tuesday by the NCAA. Arizona State and Arkansas top the rankings.
- UVA rose from No. 5 in the first RPI this year.
- Virginia has eight wins against the RPI top 50 so far this year; UVA's strength of schedule is fifth nationally according to WarrenNolan.com.

WAHOOS RACK UP SERIES WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has won all five of its series against ranked foes, including ACC series wins over Top-10 opponents Florida State, Clemson and Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers are 10-6 this year against ranked foes.
- Virginia has played the most ranked opponents this year among ACC teams.
- UVA's strength of schedule is No. 5 nationally according to WarrenNolan.com.

VIRGINIA RANKS 21ST NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,780 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 21st nationally in attendance.
- Virginia's average attendance has nearly doubled from the same point last season.
- On April 6 vs. James Madison, UVA had its largest mid-week attendance ever, as 2,521 came out to watch the Cavaliers' win.
- UVA ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVA is on pace to obliterate the single-season attendance average record of 1,774, set in 2007.

UVA SHATTERS ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke its series attendance record again last weekend, drawing 12,657 fans for the three-game series with Virginia Tech.
- Over the last two weekends, UVA drew 25,236 fans for series against Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech.
- UVA has had record, sellout crowds of 4,219 in four of its last five weekend games.
- A record total of 73,237 fans have come out to Davenport Field this year (27 dates) – the school record was 65,661 in 2007 (37 dates).
- UVA already has played in front of six road crowds and eight home crowds of more than 3,500.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, school-record crowds at William and Mary, James Madison and VMI.

SEATS ADDED, MORE ON THE WAY

- Virginia has added 979 general admission bleacher seats down the right-field line this season.
- Nearly 600 new bleacher seats in right field will be in place for the North Carolina series (May 14-16), pushing the Davenport Field capacity to 4,825.

VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Entering the week Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.9 hits per nine innings – tops in the ACC and sixth fewest in the nation.
- UVA ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (7.97).
- UVA has given up more than nine hits just six times in the last 24 games.

ARICO NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Kevin Arico has been named to the midseason watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award, presented by the NCBWA.
- The award is annually presented to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.
- Arico currently leads all Division I pitchers in saves with 12 this season (in 14 attempts) and boasts 23 career saves – second in Virginia history and tied for ninth in ACC history.
- Former Cavalier Casey Lambert (2004-07) is the ACC's all-time leader with 43 saves.

LEGGING OUT THE EXTRA BAGGERS

- Virginia has sprayed the ball all over the field this year and ranks among the nation's leaders in triples and doubles (ACC leader in triples, third in doubles).
- Entering the week UVA was second nationally to Arizona State with 22 triples.
- The Cavaliers also were 20th in doubles with 93.
- The extra-base hits are coming from everyone – no Cavalier ranks higher than 43rd nationally in either category.

GOSSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .391 batting average, .477 on base percentage and 13 stolen bases.
- He leads the ACC in hits with 63 and ranks sixth in stolen bases, eighth in batting and 10th in on base percentage.
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 18 games.
- He had a career-best 14-game hitting streak earlier this season.

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 61-for-137 (.445) this season with 30 RBI and 46 runs scored.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 21-for-36 with 13 runs scored and eight RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 19-for-45 with two homers, 13 RBI and 15 runs scored in the ninth spot.

DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Through 40 games, Virginia has committed 34 errors – good for an impressive .977 fielding percentage.
- UVa entered the week with a .979 fielding percentage, which is second in the ACC and fourth in the nation.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

BRUNO STREAK COMES TO HALT AT 15

- Stephen Bruno had his 15-game hit streak snapped Friday vs. Virginia Tech.
- He batted .397 (23-for-58) during that stretch.
- It was the longest hit streak for a UVa freshman since Brandon Guyer recorded hits in 15 straight games in 2005.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded one of its best months of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 16 games in March (16-3).
- It also is the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.842), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 32-23 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded from there.
- UVa has outscored its opponents 42-10 in the second inning this year and 211-86 from the second through the sixth innings.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 326-164 this season.

BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with 10 players boasting at least 20 hits and 15 runs.
- In 16 games at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On four occasions all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting an .338 as a team through 40 games. Nine regular starters are batting .300 or better.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon stands in a second-place tie in career games at UVa with 221 entering the weekend. With four more games played, he will tie David Stone (1999-2002) for first on the all-time UVa list.
- Cannon also comes into the week with 825 career at bats, which is fifth in UVa history.
- Cannon has 58 career doubles and has broken the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (53, 2005-07).
- He also is third in triples (12), sixth in total bases (351), hits (254) and runs scored (165), ninth in walks (99) and 11th in HBP (19).

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 51-for-134 (.381).
- Bruno is batting .407 and had a 15-game hit streak at one point this season.
- Gragnani had three hits and three RBI Wednesday vs. George Mason.
- Taylor scored seven runs in UVa's two midweek wins this past week.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,253 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 215 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (157), Jarrett Parker (150) and Phil Gosselin (143), Franco Valdes (106) and Steven Proscia (103) each have made at least 100 career starts.

WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia earned a No. 1 ranking from Baseball America and Rivals.com for six-consecutive weeks this season.
- It marked the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia has had five teams ranked No. 1 this season – baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer and men's tennis.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.
