TODAY'S GAME

- UVa hosts South Carolina in the first round of the NCAA Tournament
- The Cavaliers are making their 17th consecutive NCAA appearance and 23rd overall appearance in the tournament
- Virginia looks for its sixth consecutive trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen
- For the first time since 2003, the Cavaliers' second round opponent is a team they didn't play in the regular season

SERIES HISTORY

- UVa leads series 1-0-0 (1-0-0 in Charlottesville)
- Only previous meeting came in 2004, a 5-2 UVa win at Klöckner Stadium

- UVa: #11 (Soccer America) #6 (Soccer Times), #8 (NSCAA, TopDrawerSoccer)
- SC: #20 (NSCAA), #13 (Soccer Times), #16 (TopDrawerSoccer)

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Virginia is participating in its 17th consecutive NCAA Tournament and 23rd NCAA Tournament overall
- Only North Carolina and Notre Dame have longer active consecutive NCAA streaks
- Since the tournament expanded to 64 teams in 2001, Virginia is one of six schools to advance from the first round every year (North Carolina, Notre Dame, Portland, Texas A&M, UCLA, Virginia)
- Virginia has a 21-20-4 all-time NCAA Tournament record
- Under Steve Swanson, the Cavaliers have a 18-9-3 NCAA Tournament record

AT HOME IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Virginia is hosting NCAA Tournament play for the 17th year
- At home, Virginia is 15-10-3 in NCAA Tournament play
- UVa is 13-2-2 at home in NCAA play since 2000

FARRELLY NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Sinead Farrelly was named the 2010 ACC Offensive Player of the Year
- She is the first Cavalier to win the offensive award (since 2004 when the award was split into an offensive and defensive player)
- She has 10 goals and seven assists this season

MORE ACC-OLADES

- Sinead Farrelly was named first-team All-ACC for the fourth time, becoming the just the 10th player in league history to do so, and just the second in the 2000s
- Chantel Jones became the first Virginia goalkeeper to be named to the first-team since 1997
- Meghan Lenczyk was named to the second-team for the second time in her career
- Gloria Douglas named to the ACC All-Freshman Team

LAST TIME OUT

- The Hoos defeated Lehigh 3-0 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament
- Maggie Kistner, Gloria Douglas and Julia Roberts scored in a 10-minute span

HIGH SCORING

- UVa ranks fourth nationally in scoring a 2.68 goals per game
- Virginia has scored multiple goals in 14 games this season (only nine multiple-goal games in 22 total games in 2009)

A NOTABLE REGULAR SEASON RECORD

- The Cavaliers' seven ACC wins are their most since 2005
- The Cavaliers' 13 regular season wins are their most since 2005

FIRST GOAL KEY

- Virginia is unbeaten in their last 39 games (35-0-4) when it has scored the game's first goal, over the past three seasons
- UVa is 4-15-2 during that span when the opponent scores first

COMEBACKS

- UVa has trailed in a game eight times this season and rallied to tie five of those times (two come from behind wins)
- Last season, Virginia trailed 10 times and rallied to tie five times

SECOND HALF STRONG

- UVa has scored 36 of their 54 goals after halftime this season (34 in 2nd Half, 2 in OT)
- The Cavaliers have only scored 18 first half goals
- Nine times this season Virginia has gone to halftime with the score 0-0

DOMINATING RUN OF PLAY

- UVa has outscored opponents 45-5 this season in the run of play
- Virginia has only outscored opponents 9-7 this season from set pieces

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- 20 different Cavaliers have recorded a point this season
- That number includes 16 different goal scorers

KLÖCK-WORK AT HOME

- Virginia is 10-1-0 at home this season
- The Cavaliers have outscored opponents 37-5 at Klöckner Stadium this season

JONES SETS SHUTOUT MARK

- Chantel Jones enters tonight's game with 32 career shutouts
- She broke the previous record of 31 set by Christina de Vries (2003-06) with her shutout over Lehigh in the NCAA Tournament
- Jones' 32 shutouts ranks T-5th in ACC history

LENCZYK ON THE MARK

- Meghan Lenczyk's 12 goals is a career high (had 11 as a sophomore in 2008)
- Her six game-winning goals is one shy of the UVa single season record

LENCZYK HONORED BY ACC AGAIN

- Meghan Lenczyk was honored as ACC Player of the Week for the third time this season on Oct. 19
- Lenczyk scored three goals in the wins over Duke and Wake Forest
- She became the third player in ACC history to receive the award three times in a season (UNC's Mia Hamm in 1992 [four times], UNC's Debbie Keller in 1995)
- Lenczyk tied Angela Hucles' school record with four career ACC POW awards

SWANSON WINS NO. 250

- UVa's 3-2 overtime win over Boston College was the 250th career win for head coach Steve Swanson
- He became the 22nd Division I coach all-time to reach the mark

FARRELLY HONORED

- Sinead Farrelly was named ACC Player of the Week on Sept. 14
- She was MVP of the Virginia Nike Soccer Classic, scoring three goals in the wins over Texas and Boston University, including the game-winner in both

LENCZYK HONORED BY NSCAA

- Meghan Lenczyk was named NSCAA National Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after scoring the game-winner in overtime vs. #1 BC
- She is the first Cavalier to ever be named NSCAA National Player of the Week

LENCZYK WITH FOUR DOUBLES

- Meghan Lenczyk scored two goals against Liberty, Colgate, Richmond and Duke
- She now has eight career multi-goal games (3rd in UVa history)
- Lenczyk was the first Cavalier to have consecutive multi-goal games since Angela Hucles in 1997 (Liberty - Colgate)

FARRELLY RECEIVES PRESEASON HONORS

- Senior midfielder Sinead Farrelly has received several preseason honors
- Farrelly was one of 45 players named to the Preseason Hermann Trophy Watch List, announced by the NSCAA
- She was one of 25 players named as a Soccer America Preseason All-American

RECORDS WATCH

- Chantel Jones ranks first in school history in career GAA (0.59), 1st in career shutouts (32) and third in career saves (196)
- Lauren Alwine ranks second in school history in career assists (33) and second in career game-winning assists (13)
- Meghan Lenczyk ranks 3rd in school history in career goals (36) and seventh in career points (84)
- Sinead Farrelly ranks eighth in school history in career assists (22) and 10th in career points (78)

UP NEXT
