VIRGINIA HEADS TO ATLANTA FOR ROAD ACC MATCH WITH GEORGIA TECH

- Virginia heads to Atlanta Saturday to face the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets in the first of two consecutive road ACC games for the Cavaliers. The game will be televised on ESPNU.
- After playing in Atlanta three times over three seasons (2010, 2011, 2012), UVa is playing its first game in the Big Peach since Sept. 15, 2012, a span of 777 days.

VIRGINIA VS. GEORGIA TECH

- The Yellow Jackets narrowly lead the all-time series, 18-17-1, which dates back to 1965.
- The Yellow Jackets are outscoring UVa in the series by only 38 points, 919-881, over the 36 meetings. Georgia Tech gained the scoring edge with a 36-point win in 2012, followed by a 10-point win last season.
- The series has favored the home team historically. UVa is 10-4-1 all-time at Scott Stadium against Georgia Tech. The Yellow Jackets are 14-7 at Bobby Dodd Stadium against UVa.

TURNOVERS MAY TELL THE STORY

- Since 1982, Virginia is 9-3 vs. Georgia Tech when committing fewer turnovers. The losses were in 1991, 2010 and 2013.
- Georgia Tech is 7-4-1 during that span when committing fewer turnovers.
- There have been seven games since 1982 ('82, '87, '98, '02, '05, '08, '09) where the teams had equal turnovers; UVa won in 1987, 2005 and 2008.
- In the last nine meetings, Virginia has recorded 23 takeaways and turned them into 64 points.
- The Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over at least once in every game in the series since 2001 (24 total).
- Last season UVa forced Georgia Tech into five turnovers, two interceptions and three fumbles. UVa did not score any points off those Yellow Jacket turnovers. UVa punted three times, lost the ball on downs and the first half ended while UVa still was driving.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVa Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVa athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVa later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- Zach Laskey and David Sims each ran for two touchdowns as Georgia Tech overcame five turnovers to hold off Virginia, 35-25.
- Sims scored on the Yellow Jackets' third play of the game and sealed it with a 29-yard TD run with 1:55 left after Virginia had cut the lead to 28-25 on David Watford's 12-yard touchdown pass to Darius Jennings and 2-point conversion pass to Khalek Shepherd.
- Georgia Tech got lots of big plays from its triple-option offense, rolling up 507 yards as three backs rushed for over 100 Laskey with 133, Robert Godhigh with 111 and Sims with 107.
- Virginia got no points off Georgia Tech's turnovers three fumbles and two Anthony Harris interceptions but moved the ball well against the nation's then-12th-rated defense. Watford was 43-of-61 for 376 yards for the Cavaliers, whose 444 total yards were over a 100 more than Georgia Tech had allowed on average.
- Jennings had a career day for the Cavaliers with 13 catches for 119 yards and two touchdowns.

UVA CONNECTIONS WITH GEORGIA TECH

- Six Cavaliers hail from the state of Georgia Jordan Ellis (Suwanee), WR Miles Gooch (Decatur), OLB D.J. Hill (Covington), QB Greyson Lambert (Jesup), Darious Latimore (Lawrenceville) and OT Eric Smith (Decatur).
- UVa head coach Mike London and Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson are two of three active FBS head coaches who have won a NCAA title at the FCS level. London won with Richmond in 2008 and Johnson won with Georgia Southern in 1999 and 2000. The third current FBS head coach to win an FCS NCAA title as a head coach is Wyoming's Craig Bohl who won the 2011, 2012 and 2013 titles with North Dakota State.
- UVa's associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta was the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech from 2002-07.
- Georgia Tech offensive line coach Mike Sewak was a three-year letterwinner (1978-79-80) as an offensive lineman at Virginia for former head coach Dick Bestwick.
- Tenuta and Sewak were teammates from 1978-80 at UVa.
- UVa's special teams coordinator and running backs coach Larry Lewis coached together with Georgia Tech's wide receivers coach Al "Buzz" Preston at Washington State for four seasons (1994-97).
- Georgia Tech linebacker coach and recruiting coordinator Andy McCollum spent three seasons on the staff of UVa's current associate head coach for offense Tom O'Brien's staff at NC State (2007-09).
- Georgia Tech defensive backs coach Joe Speed ('96) and O'Brien ('71) are both graduates of the Naval Academy. Both O'Brien and Speed started their collegiate coaching careers as assistant coaches at Navy.

UVA DEFENSE LIMITING TOTAL YARDS TO OPPONENTS

- UVa's defense is limiting opponents to 336.6 total yards per game, which ranks No. 21 in the nation.
- However, FBS opponents are only averaging 324.4 yards per game against UVa. The Cavaliers gave up 422
 yards to FCS opponent Richmond, the only UVa opponent to surpass 374 total yards this year.
- The 324.4 yards per game average UVa is yielding to FBS opponents would rank No. 18 nationally this week if you took out the Richmond result.

UVA RANKS NO. 23 IN DEFENSIVE THREE-AND-OUTS

- Virginia ranks No. 23 nationally and No. 3 in the ACC in averaging 4.75 three-and-outs on defense.
- UVa has forced 38 three-and-outs over eight games and 34.2 percent of its defensive drives end in a threeand-out.
- Louisville leads the nation with 7.75 three-and-outs per game. Clemson is No. 3 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC with 6.50 three-and-outs per game.
- UVa ranked No. 3 nationally (6.00) in 2013 and No. 15 nationally (4.58) in 2012 in three-and-outs as defense.

VIRGINIA DEFENSE STRUGGLED ON FIRST DOWN AGAINST NORTH CAROLINA

- UVa yielded 230 yards on 28 first down plays by the Tar Heels (8.2 yards per play).
- On second, third and fourth downs combined UNC only managed 144 total yards.
- That comes out to a combined 4.1-yard average that covered 2nd, 3rd and 4th down.

VIRGINIA HAS FORCED 20 TURNOVERS THROUGH EIGHT GAMES

- UVa is No. 7 in the nation with 20 takeaways through eight games.
- UVa also is No. 6 in the nation with 10 fumble recoveries. Of the 10 fumble recoveries, seven came on defensive sacks by the Cavaliers.
- Virginia had 13 takeaways through the first three games, the most by the Cavaliers through the first three games of a season since 13 to start the 2002 campaign.

VIRGINIA HAS EIGHT PLAYERS WITH INTERCEPTIONS

- Virginia is No. 2 in the nation with eight different players recording at least one interception. Houston leads the nation with nine. Georgia Tech and Ohio State share the No. 2 slot with UVa.
- Quin Blanding, Maurice Canady, Anthony Harris, Tim Harris, Demetrious Nicholson, Brandon Phelps, Daquan Romero and Max Valles all have recorded an interception for Virginia.

WHAT VIRGINIA IS DOING ON FIRST DOWN

- Through the first three games UVa only passed on first down 19 times.
- Against BYU the Cavaliers opened it up and passed 22 times on first down.
- UVa went to the ground again against Kent State, passing only 13 times on 39 first down plays against the Golden Flashes.
- Against Pitt UVa passed only six times on 28 first down opportunities against the Panthers.
- At Duke UVa passed 17 times on 33 first down chances against the Blue Devils.
- Against North Carolina passed only 12 times on 36 first down opportunities against the Tar Heels.
- More on what Virginia has done on first down this season can be found on page 29.

VIRGINIA OFFENSE ON A ROLL

- Virginia is averaging 458.6 yards per game over the past four games.
- Virginia amassed over 500 yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 2004. UVa tallied 519 yards at BYU and surpassed that with 520 against Kent State.
- The last time UVa accomplished the feat was in 2004 over a three game span against Temple, North Carolina and Akron.
- Virginia also rushed for 114 yards on Louisville, the nation's toughest team to gain yards on the ground against. Louisville yields 68.8 rushing yards per game. UVa nearly doubled that and is the only opponent of the Cardinals to surpass 100 yards rushing.
- The Louisville defense went 17 quarters without allowing an offensive touchdown since Greyson Lambert's 10-yard rushing touchdown. The Cardinals' streak ended in the first quarter against NC State on Oct. 18. UVa tallied two against Louisville in the Cavalier win.

UVA LIMITS PITT'S JAMES CONNER

- UVa's defense limited Pitt's running back James Conner to a season-low 83 rushing yards.
- Conner entered the Oct. 4 game No. 2 in the nation in rushing yards.
- Conner is now No. 7 in the nation with 1,079 rushing yards (134.9 per game).

UVA LIMITS THE LOUISVILLE OFFENSE

- Virginia limited Louisville to seven first-half points, marking the Cardinals' lowest scoring opening half since tallying three first-half points at Rutgers on Nov. 29, 2012.
- After the Cardinals marched down and scored a touchdown on their first drive of the game, the Cavaliers limited Louisville to 88 total yards over its next 11 drives, including only four total yards in the third quarter alone. The Cardinals only averaged 2.1 yards per play during those 11 drives.
- Louisville then went 108 yards on 17 plays (6.35 yards per play) on back-to-back fourth quarter drives to take the lead, 21-20. The Cardinals' final offensive drive after the two touchdowns was for -10 yards.
- UVa limited Louisville to 282 total yards, the lowest amount by the Cardinals since Sept. 29, 2012 vs. Southern Miss (269).

SCOUTING THE UVA SCHEDULE

• Ten of UVa's 2014 opponents played in a bowl game last year. This is the second straight year UVa has had a tough schedule. UVa in 2013 and Florida State in 2002 are the only teams in college football history to play 11 teams during the regular season that would go on to play in a bowl game.

JACOB RAINEY IS A STUDENT ASSISTANT

- Jacob Rainey, a sophomore, will assist offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild with the quarterbacks as a student assistant.
- Jacob Rainey, a quarterback from Woodberry Forest in Virginia, had his right leg amputated after a freak injury in a scrimmage in 2011.
- Rainey suffered a dislocated right knee, but while he was hospitalized the news got far worse. An artery in his lower right leg had been severed, cutting off circulation. Over the next week, Rainey underwent four surgeries as doctors tried to save his leg. They were unsuccessful.
- A week after Rainey was tackled on a routine play, doctors amputated his right leg above the knee.
- As word of Rainey's ordeal spread, he was inundated with letters and gifts from well-wishers, including Alabama football coach Nick Saban, Green Bay Packers linebacker Clay Matthews and current New England Patriot Tim Tebow, who was quarterback for the Denver Broncos at the time.
- Tebow reached out to Rainey and wanted to meet in person. On Dec. 24, Rainey, along with his father and older brother, attended the Broncos' game in Buffalo as Tebow's quests.
- Rainey's experience and inspiring story was documented an episode of ESPN's series E:60.
- The Woodberry Forest quarterback returned to the field in 2012 and played with a prosthetic leg, throwing two touchdowns on nine passes.
- UVa WR Canaan Severin changed his number prior to this season from 84 to 9 in honor of his friend. Rainey wore number 9 at Woodberry Forest.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 442 games in the historic venue. UVa's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 250-181-12.

VIRGINIA HAS FOUR PLAYERS WITH MORE THAN 20 RECEPTIONS

- Virginia has four players with at least 20 receptions (Taquan Mizzell, Canaan Severin, Miles Gooch and Kevin Parks).
- Only four other teams have more receivers with 20 catches than UVa. Washington State leads all schools with seven. Western Kentucky (6), Texas A&M (6) and Bowling Green (5) are the only schools with more 20-catch receivers than Virginia.
- Seventeen other schools are tied for No. 5 nationally in the category with UVa.

FIRST DOWNS ARE GOLD TO GOOCH

- Fifth-year senior Miles Gooch has recorded a first down on 19 of his 24 receptions this season (79.2 percent).
- Gooch is averaging 18.1 yards on catches that result in a first down for UVa.
- He had receptions of five and three yards against UCLA, three yards against Louisville and three yards against BYU that did not result in a first down.
- Gooch had a 19-yard reception at Duke that did not result in a first down because he fumbled on the play.

AVOIDING THE SACK – UVA OFFENSIVE LINE PROTECTS

- Many questions surrounded the UVa offensive line throughout camp, especially with the graduation of Luke Bowanko and Morgan Moses to the NFL, coupled with an injury to 2013 starter Jay Whitmire that has sidelined the junior since spring practice.
- All considering, the UVa offensive line is ranked No. 6 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed.
- UVa has allowed six sacks through the first eight games.
- With 293 passing attempts, that's is one sack every 48.8 passing attempts. That trails only Duke (65.25) for the ACC lead.
- The first sack was given up by the third-string offensive line in the fourth quarter of the Richmond game when the Spiders corralled third-string quarterback David Watford
- Against Louisville, UVa yielded three sacks against its first string line.
- A fifth sack was credited to Pitt on an intentional grounding penalty.
- North Carolina recorded a sack against UVa, its sixth allowed.

DARIUS JENNINGS AND HIS EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

- Darius Jennings has recorded 18 plays of 20 yards or more through eight games.
- He has accumulated 70 career plays of 20 yards or more.
- Since Jennings stepped on Grounds in 2011 UVa has 296 plays of 20 yards or more. Jennings has recorded 23.6 percent of those plays.
- The breakdown for Jennings year-by-year: **2014** 18 plays (9 kick returns, 8 receptions, 1 rush); **2013** 20 plays (15 kick returns, 5 receptions); **2012** 10 plays (8 receptions, 1 kick return, 1 reception); **2011** 22 plays (18 kick returns, 3 receptions, 1 punt return.

- Darius Jennings is No. 7 all-time at UVa with 123 career receptions and No. 13 all-time at UVa with 1,491 career receiving yards.

VIRGINIA OFFENSIVE TRAIN STARTED ROLLING AT BYU

- UVa set a program record with 102 offensive plays at No. 21 BYU, breaking the previous record of 98 plays against South Carolina in 1968.
- The Cavaliers recorded 35 first downs, the third-most in a game in program history. The 35 first downs were one short of the UVa record of 36 that happened against Davidson in 1968 and William & Mary in 1990.
- UVa also held the ball for 40:55 against the Cougars and outgained BYU, 519-332.
- What was the difference in the game? In addition to BYU's 99-yard kick return for a touchdown, twice UVa was inside BYU's five yard line and had to settle for a field goal each time.

UVA'S RUSHING ATTACK AT BYU

- UVa rushed for 192 yards on 44 attempts (4.4 yards per rush) and two touchdowns at BYU.
- In BYU's other six games the Cougars have limited its opponents to a combined 487 rushing yards on 194 attempts (2.5 yards per rush).

FRESHMEN SHINE AMONG UVA RECEIVING CORPS

- Redshirt freshman Andre Levrone and true freshman Doni Dowling made their collegiate debuts in solid fashion against No. 7 UCLA.
- The duo caught eight combined balls for 100 combined yards and one touchdown.
- Dowling caught five balls for 25 yards, while Levrone recorded three receptions for 75 yards and one touchdown.
- Dowling's five receptions are the most by a UVa true freshman receiver in a debut since 1972. That was the first season in which freshmen were eligible to play varsity football. The NCAA had historically prohibited freshmen from varsity competition, except during the US involvement in World War II.
- Dowling's effort passed teammate Darius Jennings' four catches in the senior's 2011 debut against William & Mary.

YOUTHFUL WIDE RECEIVING CORPS

- Outside of established senior WR Darius Jennings, the bulk of the noise made in preseason camp by the receiving corps has been made by either the young, inexperienced or tall receivers. Some are all three.
- Kyle Dockins, Miles Gooch, Keeón Johnson and Canaan Severin all register at 6-2 or taller and expect to be primary targets in the UVa offense.
- The guartet enters 2014 with 37 combined career catches between them, 20 of which belong to Johnson's stellar freshman campaign in 2013.
- Added to the deep mix will be three wide receivers making collegiate debuts in 2014. True freshmen Jamil Kamara (6-2) and Doni Dowling (6-1) will find time in the mix, as will redshirt freshman Andre Levrone (6-2).

INEXPERIENCE ON THE OFFENSIVE LINE

- With Jay Whitmire's injury to start the season, UVa has only 36 career starts combined entering the 2014
- Among all FBS teams, UVa has the 14th most inexperienced offensive line to start the year.
- Among Power Five conference schools, UVa has the seventh-most inexperienced offensive line. Below is a look at who is in front of UVa:

- His 76 tackles ranks No. 2 in the ACC and No. 2 among the nation's freshmen (true and redshirt).
- New Mexico State's Derek Ibekwe leads the nation's freshmen with 78 stops.
- Blanding is one of two freshmen in the nation that leads his team in tackles, joining NC State's redshirt freshman Jerod Fernandez (58).
- Blanding's 76 tackles are the most by a UVa freshman since Steve Greer led UVa with 92 in 2009. It's the most by a UVa true freshman since Ahmad Brooks set the UVa freshman record for tackles with 117 in 2003.
- Four previous Cavaliers led UVa in tackles as a freshman: Ahmad Brooks (T/2003), Charles McDaniel (T/1982), Steve Greer (R/2009) and P.J. Killian (R/1990)

- Washington has Hau'Oli Kikana (1), Danny Shelton 13) and Andrew Hudson (T-49).

NICHOLSON DONE FOR THE SEASON

- Senior cornerback Demetrious Nicholson has been shelved for the remainder of the season. The cornerback will apply for a medical hardship waiver at the conclusion of the regular season.
- Nicholson is unable to perform as he still is rehabbing from an offseason surgery to fix his 'turf toe' injury.
- Nicholson made one appearance in 2014, starting vs. Kent State and recording five tackles and one interception.

FORCING AND RECOVERING FUMBLES

- UVa's defense has recovered 10 fumbles by opponents through seven games.
- Of the 10 fumbles UVa has recovered, seven were lost by the opponent's quarterback. Five came in the first two games (UCLA & Richmond).
- Kent State lost both of its fumbles against UVa on quarterback sacks.

DEFENSE FINISHES STRONG AGAINST PITT

- UVa yielded 311 total yards to Pitt, but only 197 over the final three quarters.
- The Cavalier defense limited the Panthers to 14 total yards in the second quarter when UVa scored 21 unanswered points.
- UVa finished strong in the fourth quarter, yielding 46 total yards to Pitt.

UVA DEFENSE DIALS UP HEAT ON KENT STATE

- UVa yielded 185 yards of offense in the opening quarter against Kent State as the Golden Flashes jumped out to a 10-7 lead.
- UVa's vaunted defense limited Kent State to 95 total yards through the final three quarters.
- Kent State accumulated 40 of those 95 yards against UVa's bench on the Golden Flashes' final drive of the game.

CANADY WITH THE PICK 6 AGAINST KENT STATE

• CB Maurice Canady's 69-yard pick-6 TD return against Kent State was the sixth longest INT return in program history, the fourth-longest INT return for a touchdown in program history and the 11th-longest INT return in the nation this year.

BLANDING GETS FIRST INTERCEPTION

- UVa free safety Ouin Blanding recorded the first interception of his career against Richmond.
- Blanding's pick was the first of the year for UVa. The last time a true freshman made the first interception of the year for Virginia was 2011 when Demetrious Nicholson snatched one against William & Mary.
- Not only did both Blanding and Nicholson both go to Bayside High School in Virginia Beach, but are the last two true freshmen to start a season opener for Virginia.

UVA RETURNS EXPERIENCE IN THE SECONDARY

- UVa opened the 2014 season with 112 career starts among its returning defensive backs, which was the most in the nation amongst teams that run schemes with four defensive backs.
- Demetrious Nicholson leads the group with 30 career starts. He started the first 30 games of his collegiate career before being hurt in game five last season against Ball State and did not play the rest of the season.
- All-American Anthony Harris is second among returning defensive backs entering the season with 23 career starts.
- 2014 is a stark difference over 2012 when UVa was one of the four schools in the nation without a senior in the secondary and started four sophomores for most games, sometimes throwing a freshmen into the mix. 2012 sophomores Anthony Harris (12), DreQuan Hoskey (10) and Brandon Phelps (12) started the majority of the games, while 2012 freshman Maurice Canady (2) also started two games. Now they make up one of the nation's most experienced defensive backfields.

FRESHMAN QUIN BLANDING GETS THE STARTING NOD AT FREE SAFETY

- Freshman Quin Blanding made his collegiate debut against UCLA.
- Blanding started at free safety and was the first UVa true freshman to start a season opener at one of the two safety positions since Tony Blount did so on Sept. 11, 1976.
- Blount played strong safety for the Cavaliers in a road opener at Washington, Virginia's first-ever game against a Pac-12 school. At the time of the 1976 game it was the Pac-8 Conference.
- Blanding is the first true freshman Cavalier at any position to start a season opener since fellow UVa teammate Demetrious Nicholson did so in 2011. Nicholson and Blanding are both graduates of Bayside High School in Virginia Beach.
- Blount was a four-year letterwinner (1976-79) and starter for the Cavaliers. Current UVa defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta was Blout's backup at one point.

ANDREW BROWN IS UVA'S SECOND GATORADE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR - ATTENDS ESPYS

- UVa freshman defensive tackle was named the 2013 Gatorade High School National Player of the Year.
- Former UVa great Terry Kirby is the only other Cavalier football player to earn the award.
- The five-star recruit is the 11th Virginia athlete to earn Gatorade National Player of the Year honors in their respective sports.
- Current UVa senior women's soccer player Morgan Brian was the 2011 Gatorade National Female Athlete of the Year.
- Seven former UVa men's soccer players and one women's basketball player also won the national honor for their respective sports.
- Brown attended the 2014 ESPYS at the Nokia Theatre in Los Angles in July.



TENUTA GAVE UVA'S DEFENSE AN AGGRESSIVE MAKEOVER IN 2013 AND IT CONTINUES INTO 2014

- Virginia's associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta is a UVa alum and has brought an aggressive makeover to the Cavaliers since he came home to Charlottesville in 2013.
- UVa over the six seasons prior to Tenuta Uava had the sixth-worst turnover margin in the nation. In 2012 UVa recorded only four interceptions, the fewest by a Virginia Cavalier team since the birth of the forward
- Tenuta said prior to the 2013 season that "we want to create problems for the front five and never let the quarterback set his feet in the passing game."
- UVa over the past few seasons have been near the bottom nationally in turnover margin and sacks per game — Tenuta wants to change that.
- During Tenuta's first season at UVa the Cavaliers boasted Anthony Harris who led the nation in interceptions. Eli Harold was No. 4 in the nation among underclassmen with 8.5 sacks.
- Tenuta enters his 34th season of collegiate coaching and his 18th as a defensive coordinator. He has had stops in the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and at Notre Dame and looks to continue to create turnovers and sack numbers that have declined in recent years at UVa prior.

BLANDING AND BROWN BEGIN UVA CAREERS

- Freshmen Quin Blanding and Andrew Brown became the first multiple five-star recruits UVa signed in one year since 2002 when the Cavaliers signed three, Áhmad Brooks, Michael Johnson and Kai Parham.
- Brooks later prepped a year at Hargrave Military and enrolled a year later.
- Brown was rated the No. 5 overall recruit in the nation and the No. 1 defensive tackle, while Blanding was rated the No. 10 overall recruit in the nation and No. 1 safety.
- · Blanding and Brown join TB Taquan Mizzell as former five-star recruits on the UVa roster. Mizzell, nicknamed Smoke in high school for his elusiveness. signed in 2013 and was the first five-star recruit for the Cavaliers since Eugene Monroe in 2005.

ANTHONY HARRIS EARNS THE GRAY-CARRINGTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- Established in 1971 in memory of Arthur P. "Pete" Gray IV and expanded in 1987 to include Edward C. Carrington Jr., this award honors two outstanding students whose achievements have served as an inspiration to others. Its one of the highest honors given to a UVa student.
- Winners exhibit traits that defined Pete Gray and Ed Carrington, including personal integrity, achievement, leadership and humility.
- Harris said what makes this award special is that it's not a sports award; its an award that the entire student body is eligible for. "To actually win meant that I accomplished not only some things on the football field, but things within the social and academic community as well," said Harris. "It is a very humbling award."

HARRIS LED THE NATION IN INTS IN 2013

- Anthony Harris led the nation with eight interceptions in 2013.
- Harris set a UVa record recording at least one INT (six overall) in five straight games.
- The eight picks by Harris were four more than the entire UVa team had in 2012.
- The eight interceptions were the most by a Cavalier since Ronde Barber led the ACC with eight in 1994.
- The eight interceptions rank No. 2 all-time at UVa for most in a season.
- Harris' eight interceptions are the most by a UVa safety since Keith McMeans led the nation with nine in 1987. Harris' 2013 season is tied for No. 2 at UVa for INTs in a season with Kevin Cook (1987) and
- Harris was named a first-team All-American by Sports Illustrated and a second-team honoree by the Walter Camp Football Foundation for his 2013 efforts.

IAN FRYE OFF TO A HOT START

- lan Frye has made 16-of-19 field goal attempts to start the season.
- It's the best start by a Cavalier kicker since Robert Randolph was 14-of-15 to start the 2009 season.
- Frye's first miss was a 46-yard attempt that hit the right post against Richmond. Frye made nine straight before missing wide right on a 52-yard attempt at Duke. His third miss was a 50-yard attempt vs. North Carolina.

KICK RETURN COVERAGE STARTS OUT STRONG

- UCLA averaged 24.9 yards per kick return in 2013, but Virginia held the Bruins to 49 total kick return yards over four returns, a 12.25 yards per return average.
- Wilfred Wahee led UVa with two tackles on kickoffs, his first collegiate action after sitting out 2013 with a knee injury.
- UVa did it again against Richmond, limiting the Spiders to 48 return yards on three kicks, a 16.0 vards per return average.
- Louisville did a tad better, averaging 18.0 yards per return.
- BYU torched UVa for 132 yards on three returns, including a 99-yard TD return.
- If you take out the BYU game, UVa is allowing 15.2 yards per return over the other seven games.

JENNINGS & SHEPHERD CHASE KR RECORD

- Darius Jennings currently sits No. 2 all-time at UVa with 1,575 career kick return yards and needs 71 more yards to pass No. 1 Joe Sroba (1,645).

IAN FRYE HEALTHY IN 2014

- Junior PK Ian Frye returns healthy in 2014 after missing the final eight games after he sustained an inury in the Pitt game.
- Frye connected on 2-of-2 field goals and both PATs he attempted against UCLA in his first game action since Pitt (2013).
- Frye is 16-of-19 on field goal attempts. His misses are from 46, 50 and 53 yards.
- Frye booted the third-longest game-winning field goal in program history with his 42-yarder against No. 21 Louisville.
- Frye's range can reach 50+ and owns the third-longest made field goal in program history, connecting on a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against BYU.
- The kick is tied with Connor Hughes, who hit his 53-yarder in 2003 against Wake Forest.
- The program record is 56 yards by Kenny Stadlin in 1984 against Virginia Tech and matched by Rafael Garcia vs. Texas in 1995.
- Coach London put Frye on scholarship during the spring semester.

UVA DEBUTS A NEW LONG SNAPPER

- UVa debuted a new long snapper in the 2014 opener after using only two over the past seven seasons.
- From 2007-10 Danny Aiken was UVa's long snapper before moving on to the NFL. He currently is the New England Patriots' long snapper.
- Matt Fortin succeeded Aiken during for the 2011 season and held the job through 2013.
- Fortin's graduation in May has forced a competition between redshirt freshmen Alex Foertsch and Tyler Shirley for the open long snapper spot.
- Shirley won the job and made his debut against UCLA.

ALEC VOZENILEK CAN PLACE KICK IN A PINCH

- UVa punter Alec Vozenilek is an option to place kick in a pinch if needed. The precedent was set last season.
- Due to an injury to Ian Frye at Pitt in 2013, UVa's punter Alec Vozenilek filled in on field goals and PAT attempts the rest of the 2013 season.
- Vozenilek kicked his first two career field goals, making a 39-yard field goal on his first career attempt. He later made a 38-yard field goal and both his PAT attempts against Ball State.
- Vozenilek also did his normal duties of punting, booting one 56 yards and averaging 45.0 yards per punt.
- Vozenilek kicked a career-high four field goals at Maryland. His fifth attempt sailed wide right from 42 yards in the game's final seconds.

ALEC VOZENILEK IS A SEASONED PUNTER

- Alec Vozenilek returns for his final season after serving as UVa's punter the past two seasons. His punting numbers have improved over the last 32 games. Of Vozenilek's 189 career punts, 44.4 percent have gone for 50 yards, or have pinned an opponent inside the 20 yard line.
- Vozenilek booted the fifth-longest punt in the nation in 2013 with a 77-yard kick at Pitt. The punt was also the fourth longest in UVa history.
- Vozenilek has punted nine balls over 50 yards and is averaging 44.1 yards per kick in 2014.

 OG/C Luke Bowanko (Jaguars), OT Morgan Moses (Redskins) and DT Brent Urban (Ravens) were all drafted.
- WR Tim Smith (Browns) and DE Jake Snyder (Vikings) signed free agent contracts. Both have since been released.
- Overall, 24 former Cavaliers are currently playing in the NFL.

DID YOU KNOW?

• UVa freshman Quin Blanding was named after the folk-rock song titled "The Mighty Quinn" by his mother Cory Lee. It was the first song she heard following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of

that moment during pregnancy.

Blanding's father Kevin played football at NCAA
Division II Glenville State (W.V.) for current Arizona
football head coach Rich Rodriguez.

UVA WR Canaan Severin changed from number 84

- to number 9 prior to the 2014 season in honor of UVa student assistant Jacoby Rainey. Rainey wore number 9 as the Woodberry Forest quarterback where a freak game accident forced the amputation of his leg. After the accident Rainey was featured on an episode of E60 and was a guest of then-Denver QB Tim Tebow at a game in Buffalo.
- UVa head coach Mike London's younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back for Virginia from 1992-95. Paul played a major part during UVa's NCAA record streak of 39 straight games with at least one interception. The streak ran from Nov. 6, 1993 through Nov. 29, 1996.
- UVa quarterback David Watford and current wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins and both were quarterbacks at Hampton High before enrolling at UVa.
- UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 104 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day. (More on page 21).
- Paul Wisman also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew staff and has done so since 1956. His 59 straight years of work in the press box is the longest current streak in the nation (More on page 21).
- Current UVa offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator at Liberty (2006-08) when UVa WR Dominique Terrell's older brother, Zach, was a standout All-Big South running back and slot receiver for the Flames.
- CB Demetrious Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.
- WR Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.
- Sophomore CB Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13).

- college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in
- UVa history.
 P/PK Alec Vozenilek's younger brother Rob is a member of UVa's men's basketball squad. On off days from spring football, Alec drove down to Greensboro, N.C., to support his brother and watch UVa win the ACC Tournament. Alec also attended all of UVa's NCAA Tournament games in Raleigh, N.C., and at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

• After missing three games with an ankle injury sustained at BYU, Greyson Lambert returned to the field against North Carolina and threw for a careerhigh 261 yards and two touchdowns.

GREYSON LAMBERT ON THIRD DOWNS

- On third downs QB Greyson Lambert is connecting on 67 percent (36-of-53) of his passes for 26 first downs.
- Lambert is connecting on 65 percent (27-of-41) for 19 first downs on his third-and-long opportunities.
- Five yards and longer is the base for an opportunity of third-and-long.

GREYSON LAMBERT MISSES THREE STARTS WITH AN ANKLE INJURY

 Greyson Lambert has missed his starts against Kent State, Pitt and Duke with an injury to the ankle he sustained at BYU in the third quarter.

GREYSON LAMBERT STEPS OUT AT BYU

- Was 21-of-35 for a 188 passing yards at BYU before leaving with an ankle
- Rushed for a career-high 49 yards and his second career touchdown.

GREYSON LAMBERT MADE FIRST CAREER START AGAINST UCLA

- On May 5 after the conclusion of spring practice, UVa head coach Mike London put Greyson Lambert atop of his post-spring depth chart at guarterback. The redshirt sophomore started his first collegiate game in the season opener against UCLA.
- Lambert is the fifth different QB to start a game during the Mike London era at Virginia.
- Of London's 54 games at UVa, 21 have been started by Michael Rocco, 12 by Marc Verica, 12 by David Watford, four by Phillip Sims, four by Lambert and one by Matt Johns.
- Lambert is the eighth different UVa QB to start a game since the start of the 2007 season. Included in that group was two games started by Vic Hall and two by Peter Lalich. The other 87 games over the span of eight seasons have been started by Jameel Sewell (23), Marc Verica (22), Michael Rocco (21), David Watford (12), Phillip Sims (4), Greyson Lambert (4) and Matt Johns (1).

GREYSON LAMBERT ON A SHORT LIST OF ACC QUARTERBACKS

- Greyson Lambert attempted 75 passes in his seven games off the bench in 2013.
- Despite making his first career start Saturday against UCLA, Lambert is one of the more experienced starting ACC quarterbacks from last year.
- Lambert is one six starting ACC quarterbacks in 2014 that attempted at least 50 passes last season.
- The other quarterbacks with at least 50 pass attempts in 2013 are from Clemson (Cole Stoudt), Duke (Anthony Boone), Florida State (Jameis Winston), North Carolina (Marquise Williams) and Syracuse (Terrel Hunt).

JOHNS FILLS IN AT BYU AFTER LAMBERT INJURY

- Matt Johns was efficient off the bench for UVa at No. 21 BYU after starter Greyson Lambert left with a foot injury.
- Johns was 14-of-23 for 139 yards and a touchdown.
- Johns has starte the last two UVa games because of the injury to Lambert.

JOHNS SHINES OFF THE BENCH VS. UCLA

- Matt Johns threw his first collegiate passes against No. 7 UCLA.
- His first collegiate pass came on UVa's final drive of the second quarter, he connected with Canaan Severin for 32 yards.
- The next play he rushed for nine yards before stepping out of bounds.
- Johns capped the drive on the very next play with a 29-yard scoring strike to Andre Levrone, the first collegiate touchdown for both Cavaliers.
- Johns finished the game 13-of-22 for 154 yards and two touchdowns.

- Johns played quarterback against VMI in 2013, but only handed the ball off.

- The very first collegiate play for Johns came when he held on lan Frye's 53yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter against BYU in 2013. The field goal by Frye is tied for the third longest in UVa history.

A LOOK BACK AT COLLEGE FOOTBALL HISTORY ON THE GROUNDS OF UVA AS THE COLONNADES AT LAMBETH FIELD CELEBRATE 101 YEARS

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 101 in 2014. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVa's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVa President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013 and 2014, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

WISMAN AND RISHER HAVE BOTH WORKED ON UVA'S FOOTBALL STAT CREW FOR 50+ YEARS

- Paul Wisman and Dr. John Risher have each worked on the stats crew at Scott Stadium for over 50 years.
- Wisman enters his 59th consecutive season on the UVa stat crew, which is tied with Toledo's Chet Sullwold for the longest active streak in FBS football. Both men started in 1956.
- Risher began in 1963 and enters his 52nd season in a row.
- Risher used to be Wisman's primary care physician in Lynchburg before retiring. When Risher found out what Wisman did with UVa, he hounded him to plug him in with the stats crew too.
- Risher is UVa's oldest living football alum. He turned 104 on May 13 of this year. He golfed nine holes on his 100th birthday in 2010.
- Wisman has missed only one home game at Scott Stadium since he started working on the stat crew and that was the 2011 season-opening game against William & Mary.
- The William & Mary game in 2011 is the only home game Wiseman has missed for that matter at Scott Stadium since 1946.
- In April 2013, both Risher and Wisman were recipients of the "Order of the Crossed Sabre" award, which goes annually to someone who has contributed greatly to Virginia football.

Mike London enters his fifth season at Virginia with a complete roster of players he has recruited, a large number of returning letterwinners and all of his coaching coordinators from the 2013 campaign. Fresh off a recruiting class that included two top-10 prospects for the first time in the program's history, London believes the Cavaliers are in position to return to the form that saw UVa win eight

games in 2011 and compete in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Facing one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2014 will be a challenge, but the energetic London feels the Cavaliers are ready to turn the corner. With recruiting classes consistently ranked among the top-30 in the nation, Virginia is in a position to erase the memories of the 2013 campaign when it went 2-10 with a roster that featured just six seniors who played on a consistent basis. In both 2012 and 2013, the Cavaliers were among the nation's leading teams in terms of playing true freshmen.

Knowing London's backstory, it is easy to understand why he is so optimistic as well as why his players enjoy and embrace his

A former Richmond police detective, London's time in law enforcement dealing with the entire spectrum of human emotions and actions has provided a wealth of experience that he draws on to assist players both on and off the field. There are few stressful situations he has not faced - including having a loaded pistol pointed at him and the trigger pulled, only to have the weapon malfunction and not discharge its potentially lethal round.

London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his daughter's lives when he was identified as a perfect match for her rare bone marrow disorder. That opportunity is one reason why London is an advocate of servitude and makes sure his players understand and embrace the concept of giving back through a variety of community services activities. One of the most visible is the team's annual bone marrow donor registration drive as part of the national "Get in the Game, Save a Life" initiative.

London's biography includes plenty of chapters of football success on the field as well.

In the spring of 2013 OT Oday Aboushi was selected by the New York Jets to mark the 30th consecutive season a UVa player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools

In 2011, he led Virginia to one of its most outstanding seasons as the Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVa being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. Five of his players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media.

He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He defines the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVa the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years. Those results have continued to improve and during the spring of 2013, his players once again set a high mark

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVa staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVa to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texas. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina, are the parents of four children -Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. He has three older children, Michael, Jr., Brandon and Kristen through a previous marriage. The 53-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants practice squad. Brandon since 2010 has been with the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVa women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVa from 1991-95.
