FOR OPENERS

- Virginia meets Pitt for the lone regular season meeting between the teams.
- UVA ranks first nationally in scoring defense at 50.9 points per game.
- UVA junior guard Justin Anderson fractured a finger on his left hand on Feb. 7 and is out 4-6 weeks.
- Virginia is first in the ACC at 11-1, while Pitt is eighth at 6-6.
- Virginia's 23-1 record marks ties for its best 24-game start in school history (23-1 starts in 1980-81 and 1981-82).
- The Cavaliers have won 23 or more games in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 1981-83.

A WIN VS. PITT:

- Would tie UVA's best 25-game start in school history at 24-1 (1981-82).
- Would give UVA 81 wins during a three-year span, it most since winning 88 games from 1981-83.
- Would give Virginia 12 or more ACC wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1982-83.
- Would give UVA its sixth straight win vs. Pitt.
- Would give UVA a five-game winning streak.
- Would give UVA 13 or more home wins in four straight seasons for the first time in school history.
- Would give Tony Bennett 199 career wins and 130 wins at Virginia.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- UVA is 120-36 (.769) in nine seasons, including a 12-1 mark in 2014-15, at John Paul Jones Arena.
- The Cavaliers have won 11 or more home games for six straight seasons.
- UVA's 21-game home winning streak from Dec. 21, 2013-Jan. 22, 2015 set a JPJ record.
- UVA is 82-20 (.804) at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia has sold out home contests vs. Harvard, Davidson, Duke, Louisville, Wake Forest, Pitt (2/16), Florida State (2/22) and Virginia Tech (2/28) this season.
- Virginia enjoyed a school-best, 21-game ACC home winning streak from Jan. 6, 2013-Jan. 22, 2015, marking the longest in the ACC since Duke's 22-game ACC home winning streak from 2002-04.

ALL-TIME AGAINST PITT

- Virginia is 9-3 all-time vs. Pitt in the series that dates back to 1957-58.
- The Cavaliers have a five-game winning streak against Pitt, including a pair of three-point victories last season (48-45 in Pittsburgh and 51-48 during the ACC Tournament in Greensboro).
- The Cavaliers meet the Panthers for the first time in ACC play in Charlottesville, and are 3-1 against Pitt at home overall.
- Tony Bennett is 2-0 vs. Pitt as head coach at Virginia and 2-1 career.
- Bennett suffered a 57-43 loss to Pitt in Newark, N.J., on Nov. 29, 2008, as head coach at Washington State.

LAST TIME VS. PITT

- Anthony Gill hit two free throws with 8.5 seconds left to help Virginia hold off Pitt 51-48 in ACC Tournament semifinal action on March 15, 2014.
- Justin Anderson secured the win with a block on James Robinson's 3-point attempt with three seconds left.
- Joe Harris led UVA with 12 points, while Malcolm Brogdon and Anthony Gill each added 10 points.
- Akil Mitchell had eight points and eight rebounds for UVA.
- Talib Zanna and Lamar Patterson had 15 points apiece for Pitt.

LAST TIME OUT

- Malcolm Brogdon's steal near the final buzzer sealed No. 2 Virginia's 61-60 win over Wake Forest on Saturday, Feb. 14.
- Brogdon prevented Codi Miller-McIntyre from driving past him and caused the game-ending turnover as the Cavaliers held on after blowing almost all of a 13-point second-half lead in the win.
- Anthony Gill scored 19 points to lead Virginia, while Brogdon added 11 points, nine rebounds, five assists and four steals.
- London Perrantes added 11 points for the Cavaliers, who played their second straight game without injured Justin Anderson.
- The Cavaliers shot 45.3 percent from the floor, including a 16-31 (51.6%) effort in the second half.
- Dinos Mitoglou led the Demon Deacons with 18 points on 6-12 shooting from 3-point range.
- Miller-McIntyre added 13 points and Cornelius Hudson had 12.

UVA RANKED NO. 2/3 IN THE LATEST NATIONAL POLLS

- UVA is ranked Nos. 2 and 3 in the latest AP and USA Today coaches' polls.
- The Cavaliers were ranked No. 2 in both polls from Jan. 12-Feb. 1.
- Prior to this year, the Cavaliers achieved their last No. 2 ranking on March 8, 1983.
- Virginia has delivered four of the 18 home losses by teams currently ranked in the top 20 of this week's AP poll (Notre Dame, North Carolina, Maryland, VCU).
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top 10 for the first 15 weeks of the season for the first time since 1982-83.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA is one of three teams (Duke and Arizona) that have been ranked in the top 10 for 17 straight weeks dating back to last season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year head coach Tony Bennett sports a 129-61 mark at Virginia and 198-94 mark in nine seasons overall.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVA's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 71-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09 and 2013-14, second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, and fifth in 2012-13).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.
- Bennett is the only active coach to have wins over the five active Hall of Fame coaches (Jim Boeheim, Larry Brown, Mike Krzyzewski, Rick Pitino, Roy Williams).

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 66.6 points and yielding a nation-leading and school-record (modern era) 50.9 points, marking its best averages under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVA has shot 46.2 percent from the field and 36.4 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 35.7 percent from the field (2nd nationally) and 30.3 percent from 3-point range.
- As of Feb. 15, the Cavaliers rank in the top five nationally in eight defensive categories: points per game (1st), points per possession (2nd), possessions per 40 minutes (2nd), true shooting percentage (2nd), field goal percentage (3rd), rebounds per game (3rd), effective shooting percentage (3rd) and assists per game (4th).
- As of Feb. 15, the Cavaliers rank in the top 10 nationally in three offensive categories: assist-to-turnover ratio (6th), defensive rebound percentage (6th) and rebound percentage (9th).
- UVA has limited its opponents to 61 fast break points, but allowed a season-high 14 in its loss to Duke.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

- Virginia has held their opponents scoreless for five or more minutes 20 times.
- Virginia held Louisville scoreless for 12:06, Tennessee State scoreless for 10:23 and Cleveland State scoreless for 10:03 this season.
- Virginia has also limited its opponents without a field goal for eight or more minutes nine times, highlighted by Harvard for 19:53 on Dec. 21.

START YOUR ENGINES

- Virginia enjoyed its second-best start in school history at 19-0 prior to its 69-63 loss to Duke on Jan. 31, 2015.
- UVA started 7-0 in ACC play for the first time since the 1980-81 team started 12-0.

TWENTY-SOMETHINGS:

- NCAA Division I teams have been held under 30 points seven times this season, and Virginia is responsible for three of them (Rutgers-26, Harvard-27, Georgia Tech-28).
- Virginia is the first Division I team to hold multiple opponents under 30 in a season since Bucknell did it twice in 2003-04.
- The last Division I team to hold three opponents under 30 in a season was NC State in 1996-97 (Winthrop, Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Texas-Pan American).
- The last time Virginia held at least three opponents under 30 points in a season was in 1945-46 (five times).
- Georgia Tech's 28 points on Jan. 22 marked the lowest point total ever in an ACC regular season game.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Virginia has won its first nine true road games of a season for the first time since 1980-81 (won first 10 road games).
- The Cavaliers are 11-0 away from home this season.
- Virginia is 13-2 in ACC road games over the past two seasons, the most road wins in the conference over that period.
- The Cavaliers have four true road wins over teams currently ranked in the AP poll, most in the nation.
- UVA's current nine-game road winning streak is the longest in the nation.

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 14-18 against ranked opponents, including a 2-6 mark vs. top-5 foes, in the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 129-313 vs. ranked opponents, including a 25-119 mark against top-5 foes, since 1953-54.
- The Cavaliers are 1-26 vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).
- UVA is 4-1 against ranked opponents this season, defeating Maryland, Notre Dame, North Carolina and Louisville.

ABOUT THE 2014-15 SCHEDULE

- Six of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the latest AP poll (Duke, Louisville, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Maryland and VCU).
- UVA is 4-1 vs. ranked opponents, defeating then-No. 21 Maryland, then-No. 13 Notre Dame, No. 12 North Carolina and No. 9 Louisville.
- The Cavaliers have also defeated three opponents (George Washington, VCU and Davidson) that were receiving votes in the AP poll.
- Nine opponents (Duke, Louisville, Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Harvard, North Carolina, Syracuse and VCU) played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, while three (Clemson, Davidson and Florida State) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Norfolk State and Cleveland State) in the Collegelinsider.com Tournament.

- Virginia is 486-590 all-time against current ACC members (11-7 vs. Boston College, 71-52 vs. Clemson, 87-53 vs. Virginia Tech, 50-117 vs. Duke, 20-22 vs. Florida State, 38-39 vs. Georgia Tech, 6-3 vs. Louisville, 7-10 vs. Miami, 52-128 vs. UNC, 62-82 vs. NC State, 8-1 vs. Notre Dame, 9-3 vs. Pittsburgh, 3-3 vs. Syracuse and 62-70 vs. Wake Forest).

- Anderson was named the USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week and ACC Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 9 after averaging 18.5 points and seven rebounds in wins at Maryland and VCU.
- Anderson tallied a season-high 21 points at VCU and had 20 against Tennessee State.
- He is averaging career highs in points (13.4), rebounds (4.3), field goal percentage (48%), 3-point percentage (48.4%) and minutes (29.4).
- He ranks first in the ACC in 3-point percentage, ninth in 3-pointers per game (2.1) and 19th in scoring.
- Anderson was named 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds off the bench.

- UVa has outrebounded its opponent in 19 of 24 games, and is second in the ACC with a +8.7 rebounding margin.

- Malcolm Brogdon was one of 10 players named to the 2015 Allstate NABC Good Works Team® on Feb. 10.

- Brogdon has volunteered as a reader and mentor to fifth grade students at Broadus Elementary School in Charlottesville and served as a mentor at the Charlottesville Boys and Girls Club.
- Brogdon, who is a dual-degree student in the Accelerated Bachelor/MPP Program in the Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy at UVa, has made mission trips to South Africa and Malawi, and Ghana.
- Brogdon served as a mentor in both the W.E.B. DuBois Society and Norcross Elementary school in Georgia, and was also a counselor at the East Lake YMCA summer camp in Atlanta.

CAVALIERS IN THE NBA

- Mike Scott (Atlanta) and Joe Harris (Cleveland) are former Cavaliers who have played in the NBA this season.
- Scott is in his third season and has averaged 7.6 points in 52 games, while Harris has averaged 2.8 points in 38 games during his rookie season.

ANDERSON NAMED USBWA NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Justin Anderson earned USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week honors on Dec. 8.
- Anderson averaged 18.5 points and seven rebounds as Virginia posted road wins at then-No. 21 Maryland (76-65) and VCU (74-57).
- In the two wins, Anderson shot 68.8 percent (11-16) from the field and 84.6 percent (11-13) from the free-throw line.
- Anderson shared ACC Player of the Week honors with Notre Dame's Jerian Grant.

BROGDON NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Malcolm Brogdon was one of five players named Preseason All-ACC.
- Joining Brogdon on the preseason All-ACC team were Marcus Paige (North Carolina), Montrezl Harrell (Louisville), Jahlil Okafor (Duke) and Jerian Grant (Notre Dame).
- Paige was the pick for Preseason ACC Player of the Year and Okafor was named Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year.

HAND DELIVERED LEGEND

- Former Virginia guard Donald Hand is the Cavaliers' 2015 ACC Men's Basketball Tournament Legend.
- Hand, who starred at Virginia from 1998-2001, was the UVa player to serve as a team captain three consecutive years.
- He was a second-team All-ACC selection as a junior in 2000, and set the Virginia sophomore record for points in a game with 41 against NC State in 1999.
- Hand closed out his career with the Cavaliers just short of the 1,500-point career scoring mark (1,486), averaging 12.4 points per game to rank 18th all-time among Virginia players.

VIRGINIA INKS POWER FORWARD JARRED REUTER

- Brewster Academy power forward Jarred Reuter (Marion, Mass.) inked a National Letter of Intent with the Cavaliers on Nov. 12.
- In 2013-14, the 6-8, 250-pound Reuter averaged 13 points and nine rebounds and shot 57.5 percent from the floor, helping Brewster to a 33-2 record and New England Preparatory School Athletic Council (NEPSAC) Class AAA championship and National Prep title.
- In 2012-13, Reuter was named the NEPSAC Class A Player of the Year after averaging 23 points and 12 rebounds for Tabor Academy.

BROGDON ON WOODEN AWARD AND NAISMITH WATCH LISTS

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball for the second consecutive season.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last five seasons.
- Duke was the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Louisville, Virginia, Syracuse, Pitt, Notre Dame, Florida State, NC State, Miami, Clemson, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Boston College and Virginia Tech.

BARCLAYS CENTER CLASSIC RECAP

- The Cavaliers' Barclays Center title on Nov. 29 marked their third tournament championship in the Tony Bennett era (2014 ACC Tournament and Corpus Christi Challenge).
- Virginia defeated Norfolk State (67-39), Tennessee State (79-36), La Salle (64-56) and Rutgers (45-26) en route to the title.

You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for court-side space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a court-side location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.
