**No. 11 Miami Hosts Virginia Tech In Pivotal Coastal Division Showdown**

**No. 2 Florida State Can Clinch Berth in Dr Pepper ACC FB Championship Game With Win at Wake  
Pitt Hosts No. 23 Notre Dame; 118th Meeting for Virginia and North Carolina**

Heading into Week 11, Florida State, the nation's 2nd-ranked team in the recently released BCS Standings, has a chance this Saturday to earn a berth in the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game for the third time in four years, when Coach Jimbo Fisher's team takes the field at BB&T Field in Winston Salem (Noon, ABC) against Wake Forest...The Deacons are coached by **Jim Grobe** and led by **QB Tanner Price**, but will be without **FL Michael Campanaro**, the ACC's leading receiver, due to an injury...A win by the Seminoles against the Demon Deacons insures them of no less than an Atlantic Division co-championship and a berth in the Dr Pepper ACC title game in which FSU participated in 2010 and won last year...Wins by the 'Noles both Saturday against Wake Forest and on Nov. 16 against Syracuse in Tallahassee would give them the outright Divisional crown over No. 7 Clemson, which has a bye week in preparation for a Thursday night game on Nov. 14 against Georgia Tech...The Seminoles are led by redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**, who ranks 2nd nationally in pass efficiency...The view of the Coastal Division race, though, is much murkier...Coastal leader Mi-

ami, ranked 11th in this week's BCS, is the only team that could claim the title by simply winning all of its remaining games...Of course, there is nothing simple about that as the 'Canes, coached by **Al Golden**, and led by **QB Stephen Morris**, face Virginia Tech this Saturday at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens in a pivotal contest in the Coastal race (7 pm, ESPN)...The Hokies, coached by **Frank Beamer** and led by **QB Logan Thomas**, are coming off back-to-back losses, but can reinsert themselves in the running for the Coastal title with a win against the Hurricanes...Miami will be without big-play **RB Duke Johnson**, who suffered a broken ankle against FSU and will miss the remainder of the season...Georgia Tech and Duke also have just two conference losses and are in the mix under different scenarios...Tech, which is also enjoying a bye week, is 5-2 in the league with only its date at Clemson remaining in ACC play...The Jackets would have to defeat the Tigers and receive some help to have a chance at a second straight trip to Charlotte... With losses already to Virginia Tech and Miami, Georgia Tech needs to

avoid tie-breaking scenarios with either of those teams...Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **WR Jamison Crowder**, hosts Big Four rival NC State, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Brandon Mitchell**, this Saturday at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham (4 p.m., ESPNU)...The Blue Devils can claim the Coastal Division berth by winning their final four games, including a Nov. 16 contest in Durham with Miami and having Georgia Tech lose at Clemson...In all, six ACC teams are already bowl-eligible in Florida State, Clemson, Miami, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Duke...Maryland could join them as early as this weekend as the Terrapins, coached by **Randy Edsall** and led by **QBs C.J. Brown** and **Caleb Rowe**, host Atlantic Division rival Syracuse Saturday at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium (3:30 pm, RSN)...The Terps need one win to be eligible for the post season for the first time since 2010...Syracuse, coached by **Scott Shafer**, and led by the RB tandem of **Jerome Smith** and **Prince-Tyson Gulley**, is one

of four ACC teams with four victories each (Syracuse, Boston College, Pitt and Wake Forest) who are also fighting for post-season trips...One of those four-win squads, the Pitt Panthers, will be facing a big challenge when they host 23rd-ranked Notre Dame this Saturday in the 68th meeting between the two teams in a nationally televised game at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh (8 pm, ABC)...Pitt is coached by **Paul Chryst** and led by senior **DT Aaron Donald**, who is in the running for national honors in a spectacular senior season that has him leading the nation in tackles for loss (2.4/gm) and 3rd in sacks (1.1/gm)...Notre Dame is coached by **Brian Kelly** and led by **QB Tommy Rees**...Pitt is seeking to claim its first win in the series since 2009, but the last five games (two of them Pitt wins) have been decided by an average of four points per game and resulted in a pair of multiple overtime contests including last year's triple OT thriller...Another longtime rivalry--the South's oldest and the ACC's most played--takes place in Chapel Hill, N.C., when North Carolina hosts Coastal Division rival Virginia at Kenan Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...Saturday's game will mark the 118th meeting between the two teams in a series which began in 1892...UNC, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Bryn Renner** and **TE Eric Ebron**, have won two straight games and are looking to get back in the bowl picture...UVA, coached by **Mike London**, and led by **QB David Watford** and **S Anthony Harris**, is looking to snap a six-game overall losing streak and a three-game series skein at the hands of its long-time rival...Harris is tied for 2nd nationally in pass interceptions with 6 in 7 games (0.7/gm)... From a series of 118 games to a first-time meeting which will occur many, many miles to the west of Chapel Hill, in Las Cruces, N.M, Boston College travels to our nation's Southwest to face New Mexico State at Aggie Memorial Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...The Eagles, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **RB Andre Williams** and **QB Chase Rettig**, are coming off an impressive win over Virginia Tech and find themselves with a 4-4 overall mark and in the running for a post-season berth...Running is something Williams has done quite a bit of this fall, as he has rushed for 100 or more yards in 6 of the Eagles' 8 games and ranks 2nd nationally in yards per game (147.0) and total rushing yards (1,176)...In an ironic twist, New Mexico State head coach **Doug Martin** served as BC's offensive coordinator last year.

## ACC News & Notes

### Three ACC Teams in BCS Top 11;

#### FSU Moves Back to No. 2

Three ACC teams are ranked in this week's Top 11 of the BCS Standings led by Florida State moving back into the No. 2 spot after its win over Miami, which was ranked 7th last week. This week, Clemson moves up to No. 7, followed by Miami at No. 11. The ACC and SEC are the only leagues with three teams among the Top 11 in this week's BCS Standings.

#### Winston, Boyd Named O'Brien Semifinalists

Florida State's **Jameis Winston** (Bessemer, Ala.) and Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Va.) have been named semifinalists for the Davey O'Brien Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top quarterback.

#### Three ACC Kickers Named Groza Semifinalists

Florida State's **Roberto Aguayo** (Mascotte, Fla.), NC State's **Niklas Sade** (Wake Forest, N.C.) and Maryland's **Brad Craddock** (Adelaide, Australia) were all named as semifinalists for this year's Lou Groza Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top placekicker. Aguayo has yet to miss a kick this season, having made all 53 PATs and 12 FG attempts. Sade ranks 2nd nationally in FG's per game (2.1), while making 89.5 percent of his 3-point attempts. Craddock has made 15 of 18 field goal tries.

#### Duke's Perry Simmons Named NFF Scholar Athlete

Duke senior offensive tackle **Perry Simmons** (Raleigh, N.C.) has been honored as a 2013 National Football Foundation Hall of Fame Scholar-Athlete. As such, he is a candidate for the NFF's prestigious Campbell Trophy, which is presented annually to the top football scholar-athlete in the nation. Simmons owns a 3.83 grade point average as a civil engineering major. He has started an ACC-leading 45 consecutive games at right tackle, played over 3,200 snaps in his career and has blocked for a Duke offense that ranks fifth in the ACC with 32.9 points per game, sixth with 420.4 yards per game and tied for third with just 10 sacks allowed. Simmons becomes the 51st player from an ACC school and the fourth Duke player to earn the honor.

#### Florida State On Record Scoring Pace

Led by redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston** (Bessemer, Ala.), Florida State is piling up some impressive numbers. The Seminoles are averaging 51.1 points per game, which would be an ACC single-season record. FSU set the record (48.4) in 1995. Florida State has also become the first team in ACC history to score 40 or more points in eight consecutive games. The Seminoles have topped the 40-point mark in all eight games this year.

#### Clemson Sets School Mark For Most Top 10 Appearances

Clemson's appearance in the Top 10 this week of the Associated Press poll marked the Tigers' 11th straight Top 10 ranking this year. That is the most in Clemson history. The Tigers were ranked in the Top 10 for 10 consecutive weeks during the 1981 National Championship season.

#### Clemson's Boyd Sets One ACC Mark On Verge of Second

With three TD passes and a touchdown run in 7th-ranked Clemson's 59-10 win over Virginia, **QB Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Va.) shattered the ACC career mark for touchdown responsibility formerly held by NC State stand-out Philip Rivers. Rivers accounted for 112 TDs rushing and passing in his four-year career as a starter with the Wolfpack. Boyd's total Saturday gives him 116 TDR, 93 passing and 23 rushing which is impressive considering he has only started for three seasons. Boyd is now challenging Rivers' career TD pass mark of 95 scoring tosses.

#### BC's Andre Williams 2nd Nationally In Rushing

Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** (Schnecksville, Pa.) continues to have a strong final season. Williams is 2nd nationally in both rushing yards per game (147.0) and total rushing yards (1,176). His average is the 4th best in ACC history. He had 166 yards Saturday against a Virginia Tech defense which had allowed just 91 yards on the ground per game and was ranked 5th nationally.

# National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame; ACC Digital Network

*NC State's Ted Brown, Miami's Vinny Testaverde:*

*Standout Players from ACC Schools Named to Prestigious College Hall of Fame*



A pair of standout players from Atlantic Coast Conference schools—NC State's Ted Brown and Miami's Vinny Testaverde will be inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame at its annual awards banquet on Tuesday, Dec. 10 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City.

Since 2006, ACC schools have had 18 former players and coaches inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and now total 95 inductees.

Brown and Testaverde will be inducted as part of the 2013 College Football Hall of Fame Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Class at the 56th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on December 10, 2013, at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. They will be honored guests at the National Hall of Fame Salute at the Allstate Sugar Bowl in New Orleans on January 2, 2014 and officially enshrined in the summer of 2014.

Brown, a native of High Point, N.C., is one of the great running backs in Atlantic Coast Conference history. He is still the ACC's all-time record holder for career rushing yardage, having totaled 4,602 yards in a spectacular four-year (1975-78) career for the Wolfpack. Brown played in an era where bowl game statistics were not included among career totals, which would have added an additional 399 yards, giving him 5,001 yards for his career. A consensus All-American as a senior, Brown is the only football player in ACC history to be named first-team All-ACC four times. He still holds ACC career marks for most 100-yard games (27) and most rushing touchdowns (49) and he topped 1,000 rushing yards in three of his four seasons with the Wolfpack. He went on to an eight-year career in the National Football League with the Minnesota Vikings, rushing for over 4,500 yards and 53 touchdowns.

Brown becomes seventh former NC State player or coach to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame joining Dennis Byrd (2010), Lou Holtz (2009), Jim Ritcher (1998), Roman Gabriel (1989), Jack McDowall (1975) and Buck Shaw (1972).

One of the most celebrated players in a Miami program stocked with mythical talent, Vinny Testaverde claimed virtually every major award during his senior season in 1986. He becomes the ninth Hurricane to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame joining Jimmy Johnson (2012), Russell Maryland (2011), Gino Torretta (2009), Bennie Blades (2006), Don Bosseler (1990), Ted Hendricks (1987), Andy Gustafson (1985) and Jack Harding (1980).

As a senior, Testaverde (1982, 1984-86) earned unanimous First-Team All-American honors, and he won the Heisman Trophy, the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Maxwell, Davey O'Brien and UPI Player of the Year awards. He led the Canes to three consecutive bowls, including the 1987 Fiesta Bowl National Championship game. He finished his collegiate career with more than 6,000 passing yards and 48 touchdown passes, and he still ranks in the top five in virtually every passing category in school history. Testaverde, who was a redshirt on Miami's 1983 National Championship team, went 23-3 as a starter playing for legendary coaches Howard Schnellenberger and Hall of Famer Jimmy Johnson.

Tampa Bay selected Testaverde as the No. 1 overall selection in the 1987 NFL Draft, and his pro career spanned 21 seasons with seven different teams. The 1998 All-Pro and two-time Pro Bowl selection finished his NFL career seventh all-time in passing yards (46,233) and eighth in touchdowns (275). The Elmont, N.Y., native currently resides in Florida where he plays an active role with the Children's Cancer Center of Tampa. Testaverde remains among only four Hurricanes to have their jerseys retired at Miami.

# 2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Nov. 2

## Florida State 41, Miami 14

RB Devonta Freeman rushed for a pair of touchdowns and had a 48-yard reception for another score, and QB Jameis Winston completed 21-of-29 passes for 325 yards as the third-ranked Seminoles (8-0, 6-0) prevailed in a battle of unbeaten top-10 teams and moved a step closer to their second straight ACC Atlantic Division title. Seventh-ranked Miami (7-1, 3-1) took advantage of interceptions by S Deon Bush and S Rayshawn Jenkins that set up a pair of touchdown passes from QB Stephen Morris to WR Allen Hurns. The second, which came with 22 seconds remaining in the second quarter, left the Hurricanes trailing just 21-14 at the half. But the Seminoles responded with 20 unanswered second-half points. RB James Wilder Jr. rushed for his second touchdown of the game, Freeman added another rushing score, and PK Roberto Aguayo connected on field goals of 25 and 28 yards in the fourth quarter to close out the scoring. LB Terrance Smith led Florida State defensively with 10 tackles, and DE Mario Edwards had a pair of tackles for loss, including a quarterback sack.

## Clemson 59, Virginia 10

The eighth-ranked Tigers scored their second straight ACC road win behind QB Tajh Boyd and WR Sammy Watkins. Boyd, returning to his home state of Virginia, completed 24 of 29 passes for 377 yards and accounted for four touchdowns in the victory. The big day lifted Boyd past former NC State star Philip Rivers to No. 1 all-time among ACC players in touchdown responsibility. Boyd has now accounted for 116 touchdowns in his career (93 passing and 23 rushing). Watkins hauled in scoring passes of 33 and 96 yards on Clemson's first possessions of both the first and second halves. He finished with eight catches for 169 yards. Defensively, freshman S Jayron Kearshe created two turnovers--an interception and a forced fumble--on back-to-back Cavalier possessions to help Clemson score three touchdowns in the final 4:18 of the first half and pull away. QB David Watford's 6-yard run in the first quarter produced the lone touchdown for Virginia (2-7, 0-5).

## Boston College 34, Virginia Tech 27

ACC leading rusher Andre Williams carried 33 times for 166 yards and two touchdowns, and LB Kevin Pierre-Louis had a key 33-yard interception return for a touchdown midway into the fourth quarter as Boston College (4-4, 2-3) enhanced its hopes of a postseason bowl bid with Saturday's win over the visiting Hokies. Eagles QB Chase Rettig went 11-of-14, including a 2-yard scoring toss to FB Jake Sinkovec. PK Nate Freese added a pair of field goals for Boston College. Virginia Tech (6-3, 3-2) finished with 446 yards total offense, but turnovers led to 17 Boston College points. Hokies QB Logan Thomas completed 24 of 41 passes for a career-high 391 yards, with two touchdowns and two interceptions. WR Josh Stanford accounted for much of Thomas' yardage, as the redshirt freshman caught six passes for a career-high 171 yards and PK Cody Journell added FGs of 47 and 56 yards, the latter the longest field goal for Tech since 1977.

## North Carolina 27, NC State 19

The visiting Tar Heels spotted the Wolfpack an early 10-0 lead, but fought back to claim their second straight win in the rivalry on Saturday afternoon. WR Quinshad Davis caught a pair of touchdown passes, including a 59-yard strike from WR Ryan Switzer that gave North Carolina the lead for good at 21-16 with 9:53 to play in the second quarter. QB Marquise Williams connected with Davis from two yards out for the other passing touchdown, and QB Bryn Renner and freshman RB T.J. Logan added rushing touchdowns for the Tar Heels (3-5, 2-3). NC State QB Brandon Mitchell rushed for 105 yards, including a 6-yard touchdown that was set up by CB Juston Burris' interception on the game's second play from scrimmage. PK Niklas Sade matched his career high with four field goals for the Wolfpack (3-5, 0-5).

## Georgia Tech 21, Pitt 10

RB Robert Godhigh rushed for two touchdowns, and the Yellow Jackets' defense recorded five sacks to claim an ACC victory on Homecoming night. Georgia Tech (6-3, 5-2) clung to a 14-10 lead most of the second half, but QB Vad Lee's 42-yard pass to WR DeAndre Smelter set up Godhigh's second touchdown run, from 11 yards, with less than three minutes remaining to provide the clinching score. RB David Sims had one rushing score for Tech. DE Jeremiah Attaochu had two quarterback sacks, and LB Jabari Hunt-Days had a sack and three tackles for losses in the Yellow Jackets' third straight win. Pitt QB Tom Savage completed 25 of 37 passes for 233 yards with one touchdown and one interception. The Panthers (4-4, 2-3) fell short despite a mammoth effort by DT Aaron Donald, who had 11 solo tackles, including a career-high six tackles for loss, one sack and forced two fumbles. Donald's six tackles for loss are the highest single-game total by an FBS player this season.

## Syracuse 13, Wake Forest 0

Syracuse (4-4, 2-2) scored two third-quarter touchdowns and used a strong defensive effort to defeat Wake Forest (4-5, 2-4) on Saturday afternoon in the Carrier Dome. The shutout is the second for the Orange this year, marking the first time since 1997 Syracuse has blanked two opponents in the same season. It marked the first shutout by the Orange in a conference game since 1996. QB Terrel Hunt completed 18 of 30 passes for 143 yards. He also rushed for 36 yards and scored the game's first touchdown on a six-yard run. Brisly Esteime was Hunt's top target. The freshman made his first career start and set personal bests for receptions (9) and yards (62), including his first career touchdown on a reverse-pass from fellow WR Jarrod West. LB Cameron Lynch led the defensive charge with five tackles, including 1.5 for a loss. True freshman DL Isaiah Johnson recorded a sack and intercepted his first pass to set up Syracuse's second touchdown. With WR Michael Campanaro sidelined early in the game due to a shoulder injury, WR Sherman Ragland III led the Wake Forest offense with a game- and career-high 10 catches for 91 yards. Deacons LB Brandon Chubb recorded 11 tackles.



# ACC Notes By The Numbers

**-5** - The total number of rushing yards that **Georgia Tech** allowed the Pitt Panthers last Saturday in its 21-10 win in Atlanta. It was the lowest amount of yardage a Tech team has allowed on the ground in the Paul Johnson Era. Georgia Tech is one of only three teams nationally to rank in the Top 15 in both rushing offense (5th) and rushing defense (11th). Wisconsin and Ohio State are the others.

**0.67** - Virginia junior **SS Anthony Harris** leads the ACC and is tied for 2nd nationally in pass interceptions per game with 6 in 9 games, a 0.67 per game average.

**.895** - The field goal percentage for NC State junior **PK Niklas Sade** this year. Sade, who entered the year with a career field goal percentage of just .615, has made 17 of 19 field goal attempts this year, including all four of his attempts in the Wolfpack's 27-19 loss to UNC last Saturday. Sade is tied for 2nd nationally in field goals (2.1) per game.

**0** - The number of kicks that Florida State redshirt freshman **PK Roberto Aguayo** has missed this season. Aguayo, who ranks 3rd nationally in scoring, averaging 11.1 points a game, has made all 53 of his PATs and all 12 of his field goal attempts in racking up 89 points in just 8 contests.

**First** - Boston College **LB Kevin Pierre-Louis**, who just goes by KPL, picked a good time for his first career interception. KPL intercepted a Logan Thomas pass and returned it 33 yards for TD to break a tie and give the Eagles a 27-20 lead and they never looked back in a 34-37 win over Virginia Tech.

**2** - Boston College **Andre Williams** ranks 2nd nationally in rushing after running for 166 yards on 33 carries and 2 TDs against Virginia Tech. Williams ranks 2nd nationally in total yards (1,176) and in yards per game (147.0).

**3** - The number of ACC placekickers named as semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, which is given annually to the nation's top placekicker. Named among the 20 semifinalists were **Robert Aguayo** of Florida State, **Niklas Sade** of NC State and **Brad Craddock** of Maryland.

**6** - The number of tackles for loss for Pitt senior **NT Aaron Donald** in the Panthers' 21-10 loss to Georgia Tech. Donald was credited with 11 total tackles and 6 TFLs and two forced fumbles. He leads the nation this week in tackles for loss, averaging 2.4 per game and is 3rd in QB sacks per game (1.1).

**6** - Also the number of bowl eligible teams in the ACC this week with **Florida State**, **Clemson**, **Miami**, **Duke**, **Georgia Tech** and **Virginia Tech** all

having become eligible for a post-season contest.

**8** - The number of touchdown pass receptions for Florida State junior **WR Rashad Greene**. Greene, who has averaged 17.2 yards per catch on 45 receptions, leads all ACC receivers in TD receptions this fall.

**13** - Clemson junior **WR Sammy Watkins** recorded the second longest pass play in Clemson history when he hooked up with QB Tajh Boyd for a 96-yard TD pass play against Virginia. Watkins finished the afternoon with 169 receiving yards, the 13th 100-yard receiving yard game of his career and his 6th this year.

**14** - The number of years since **Florida State** started the season 8-0. 1999 was the last time the Seminoles were 8-0 in route to a 13-0 campaign and the BCS National Championship.

**39** - The number of victories Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has led the Seminoles to in less than four seasons as head coach in Tallahassee. That is more wins than any other ACC coach in their first four seasons of coaching. Fisher has compiled a 39-10 mark with a .796 winning percentage. Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, holds the mark for any coach in their first four years in the ACC, having compiled a 43-5-1 record from 1992 through 1995.

**42** - The average margin of victory for **Florida State** this season against nationally-ranked teams. In wins over 25th-ranked Maryland (63-0), 3rd-ranked Clemson (51-14) and 7th-ranked Miami (41-14) The Seminoles outscored their ranked opponents 155-28. That is the most in history for an ACC team against nationally-ranked foes.

**46.5** - The punting average for Miami's **Pat O'Donnell** this year. The average would lead the ACC and would tie for third-best nationally, but O'Donnell, a transfer graduate student at UM, has only had to punt 27 times this fall and does not have enough attempts to qualify for the NCAA rankings.

**54** - The number of pass receiving yards that Boston College senior **WR Alex Amidon** needs to become the all-time leading receiver in Eagle history. Amidon, who had 54 receiving yards against Virginia Tech last week, has 2,406 career receiving yards and trails only Rich Gunnell (2,459, 2006-09) on the BC career receiving yards list.

**56** - Virginia Tech **PK Cody Journell** booted a 56-yard field goal against Boston College last Saturday. The kick was the longest of Journell's career and the longest for the Hokies in the Frank Beamer Era or since 1977. Clemson PK Spencer Benton set the ACC record last year with

a 61-yarder against Ball State.

**116** - The number of touchdowns for which Clemson senior **QB Tajh Boyd** has been responsible in his career at Clemson. He has broken the ACC career mark of 112 set by former NC State All-America Philip Rivers during the 2000-03 seasons. Boyd now has 93 career TD passes and 23 touchdowns and needs just 3 more TD tosses to break Rivers' career TD passing record of 95.

**118** - This Saturday, North Carolina and Virginia will meet for the 118th time on the gridiron. That total includes a UNC forfeit in 1956. The series, which began in 1892, is the South's oldest rivalry and the most-played series in the ACC.

**171** - The number of receiving yards for Virginia Tech redshirt freshman **WR Joshua Stanford** in the Hokies' 34-27 loss to Boston College. Stanford's career-high came on six catches and included a 69-yard TD play. His previous career-high was 59 yards against North Carolina earlier this year.

**201.1** - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**. Winston has recorded the third-best pass efficiency rating this century for a quarterback in his team's first eight games of a season (minimum 15 attempts per game). This season, Winston ranks 2nd nationally only to Baylor's Bryce Petty (219.0). Winston's rating also trails only that of Petty and David Johnson of Tulsa (205.8, 2008) and is just ahead of Russell Wilson of Wisconsin in 2011 (196.9).

**253.2** - The number of yards allowed per game of total offense by **Virginia Tech's** defense. The Hokies "D" ranks 3rd nationally in total defense and first in passing yards allowed, allowing just 150.6 yards a game.

**264** - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 264 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

**669** - The pass receiving yardage for North Carolina **TE Eric Ebron** through eight games this season. Ebron has set North Carolina school records for a tight end in receptions (44) and receiving yardage this year. He needs just 203 more yards in his final four games to break the ACC single-season receiving yardage record for tight ends, set by Maryland's Vernon Davis (871) in 2005.

**700** - The number of total wins for **Georgia Tech** in football (700-471-43, .594). The Jackets became the 17th school in NCAA FBS history to record their 700th victory with a 21-10 win over Pitt, joining both Virginia Tech and Syracuse which accomplished the feat earlier this year on Sept. 21.

# ACC ATLANTIC DIVISION TEAM NOTES ACC



Boston College is 16-for-17 (94 percent) in red-zone scoring opportunities in 2013 with 10 touchdowns and six field goals. ... With 24 sacks through eight games this fall, the Eagles have achieved their highest single-season sack total since 2008, when they recorded 35 in 13 games and finished 8-5 ... Senior **RB Andre Williams** had 166 rushing yards in last Saturday's win over Virginia Tech, marking his sixth 100-plus-yard rushing performance of the season, and passed L.V. Whitworth for eighth all-time in career rushing yards with 2,738 at BC ... Williams now ranks 14th all-time for single season rushing yards with 1,176 ... Senior **WR Alex Amidon** passed Pete Mitchell for second all-time in career receiving yards at BC with 2,406 after his 53 receiving yards against the Hokies.



Clemson's 59-10 win over Virginia last Saturday marked the largest margin of victory for the Tigers in an ACC road game since a 55-0 win at Virginia in 1984 ... It was the second time this year Clemson had won by 49 points; the other was a 56-7 win over Wake Forest at Clemson ... It tied for the fourth largest victory margin anywhere for the Tigers in an ACC game ... The 59 points scored last Saturday were the most points scored by the Tigers on an opponent's home field since the Tigers won at South Carolina 63-17 in 2003 ... Clemson finished 4-0 in ACC road games for the first time since 1995 ... The Tigers are off to an 8-1 start for the third straight year ... **QB Tajh Boyd** is now the ACC's career leader in touchdown responsibility ... Boyd has 116 TDR for his career (93 passing and 23 rushing).



The Seminoles have scored 92 points against top-10 ranked opponents this season, tied for fourth most in ACC history in a season ... FSU has an average margin of victory of 32 points against Top 10 teams, the second-highest in league history ... In games against all fellow ranked teams, the Seminoles have scored 155 points, 12th most in ACC history ... FSU's 42-point average margin of victory against Top 25 opponents is 42 points, the highest in league history ... The Seminoles are the first ACC team to score 40 or more points in 8 straight games ... FSU is averaging 51.13 points per game, the most of any team in ACC history ... Last Saturday night's FSU-Miami matchup set an all-time attendance record at Bobby Bowden Field at Doak Campbell Stadium, with 84,409 tickets distributed ... **PK Roberto Aguayo** has made a school-record 65 consecutive kicks, including 53 PATs and 12 field goals ... Aguayo has already broken the previous school record of 54 straight kicks made Dustin Hopkins during the 2010 and 2011 seasons.



Maryland started a season-high 14 underclassmen (11 sophomores, two redshirt freshmen and one freshman) in its most recent game at Wake Forest on Oct. 26 ... Since 1999, that total is tied for the most by a Maryland team. Last season, the Terps started 14 underclassmen at North Carolina (Nov. 24, 2012) and against Wake Forest (Oct. 6, 2012) ... Maryland's 7.7 tackles-for-loss per game average is the highest for a Terrapin defense since 2001, when Maryland averaged 9.2 per game ... **LB Marcus Whitfield** has increased his season mark to 6.5 sacks ... Heading into this Saturday's ACC home game against Syracuse, Whitfield is 1.5 sacks shy of cracking the top-15 all-time for sacks in a single season at Maryland...**PK Brad Craddock** has been named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award after making 15 of his first 18 field goal attempts this year...**TB Brandon Ross** has averaged 5.0 yards per carry on 91 attempts and ranks 9th in the ACC in rushing (65.4 yds/gm).



With 105 yards rushing in last Saturday's game against North Carolina, **Brandon Mitchell** became the first Wolfpack QB to rush for over 100 yards in a game since Johnny Evans did it twice during the 1976 season ... Mitchell was seeing action in just his second game since returning from a foot injury that sidelined him for five contests... **PK Niklas Sade** has been named one of 20 finalists for the Lou Groza Award, which is presented annually to the nation's kicker ... Sade matched his career-high in the UNC game with four successful field goals ... The junior has connected on .895 percent (17-of-19) of his field goal attempts this season ... Sophomore **RB Shadrach Thornton** has averaged 131.5 yards rushing over his last two games ... One week after rushing for a career-high 173 yards against Florida State, Thornton ran for 90 yards against North Carolina ... NC State's Nov. 16 trip to Boston College will be its last outside a 23-mile radius of Carter-Finley Stadium ... The Wolfpack plays at nearby Duke this Saturday and closes with home games vs. East Carolina (Nov. 23) and Maryland (Nov. 30).



Syracuse's 13-0 shutout win over Wake Forest last Saturday was its second of the year ... SU blanked Wagner, 54-0, on Sept. 14 ... The last time the Orange recorded two shutouts in the same season was 1997 (Wisconsin, East Carolina) ... Prior to the win over Wake Forest, the Orange's last shutout versus a conference opponent was a 42-0 win against Rutgers on Oct. 5, 1996 ... With 28.5 career tackles for loss, **LB Dyshawn Davis** owns sole possession of 10th place on Syracuse's all-time list ... **RB Prince-Tyson Gulley's** run on the final play of the third quarter last Saturday was the longest rushing play for the Orange this season and matched Gulley's career-long ... **P Riley Dixon** boomed three punts of at least 50 yards versus Wake Forest, including two in the opening quarter, and now has 12 punts this season of at least 50 yards ... With 74 catches for 1,039 yards in his career, **WR Jarrod West** is the 19th player in Syracuse history to pass the 1,000-yard mark in receiving yardage.



Senior **WR Michael Campanaro** suffered a broken collarbone in last Saturday's 13-0 loss at Syracuse and could be sidelined for the remainder of the season ... Campanaro, who ranks first in Wake Forest and third on the ACC's all-time list with 229 career receptions, has been ruled out for four-to-six weeks ... That means that the Demon Deacons (4-5 overall) must earn bowl eligibility in order for Campanaro to play another game in a Wake Forest uniform ... With Campanaro unavailable most of the way against Syracuse, **WR Sherman Ragland III** led the Wake Forest offense with 10 catches for 91 yards, both career highs ... **ILB Brandon Chubb** led the Deacons defensively with 11 tackles, and **OLB Justin Jackson** chipped in 10 stops, including a sack...Coach **Jim Grobe** needs one more victory to surpass Douglas Clyde "Peahead" Walker for all-time coaching wins as Wake Forest's head coach with 77 ... Grobe is now 77-79 in 13 years at Wake Forest and 110-112-1 in 19 years as a college head coach.



# ACC COASTAL DIVISION TEAM NOTES ACC



With its 13-10 win at No. 16 Virginia Tech in its most recent outing Oct. 26, Duke upset a top-25 team on the road for the first time since 1971 when the No. 19 Blue Devils topped No. 10 Stanford 9-3 ... Duke's last road win as an unranked team over a ranked foe came in 1970 against No. 11 West Virginia, 21-13 ... The Virginia Tech win was Duke's first over a ranked opponent since 1994 when No. 23 Duke topped No. 14 Virginia 28-25 in Durham ... Duke beat Virginia Tech for the first time since 1981, when the Blue Devils won 14-7 at home ... For the first time since the 1988 and 1989 seasons, Duke has won at least six games in back-to-back seasons ... Duke (6-2, 2-2) is bowl-eligible for the second straight year ... The Blue Devils have never played in a bowl in back-to-back seasons ... Duke has held opponents to an average of 7.8 points in second halves this season.



Georgia Tech has played 206 consecutive games without being shut out (the last shutout loss came vs. Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997) ... The Yellow Jackets have played 351 consecutive home games since being shut out (the last shutout loss came vs. Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957) ... With an all-time record of 700-471-43 in 121 seasons of football, Georgia Tech has joined Syracuse and Virginia Tech among ACC teams reaching the 700-win mark this season ... The Yellow Jackets became the 17th program in NCAA FBS history to record its 700th victory with a 21-10 win over Pitt last Saturday night at Bobby Dodd Stadium ... Tech (6-3 overall, 5-2 ACC) is assured of at least five ACC victories for the third straight season and for the fifth time in the last six seasons ... The Yellow Jackets are also bowl eligible for the 17th consecutive year ... With 25 career quarterback sacks **DE Jeremiah Attaochu** has tied Eric Henderson for fourth place on Georgia Tech's all-time career sacks list and needs 6.0 more sacks to tie the school record.



Miami sophomore **RB Duke Johnson** fractured his right ankle in last Saturday night's 41-14 loss at Florida State ... Johnson will undergo surgery this week and will miss the remainder of the season ... The Hurricanes' standout back currently ranks second among ACC rushers with 920 yards in eight games and has rushed for 1,867 career yards in less than two full college seasons ... **WR Allen Hurns** Hurns hauled in five catches for 84 yards and a career-high-tying 2 touchdowns in Miami's at Florida State ... Hurns recorded the third multi-TD game of his career ... **LB Denzel Perryman** racked up a game-high 11 tackles in the loss to the Seminoles, including eight solo stops ... It marked Perryman's fourth game with 10-plus tackles this season and his third in ACC play ... Perryman, who had one tackle for loss on Saturday night, leads Miami with 63 total tackles and 41 solo stops ... **S Deon Bush** picked off a first-half pass vs. FSU and is one of eight Hurricane defenders with at least one interception this season



**TE Eric Ebron** has set school records for a tight end in receptions (44) and receiving yardage (669) this year ... Ebron is 203 yards shy of the ACC single-season receiving yardage record for tight ends (871 yards) set by Maryland's Vernon Davis (871) in 2005 ... Freshman **RB T.J. Logan's** 8-yard run that accounted for the Tar Heels' final score in last Saturday's 27-19 road win at NC State was the first touchdown of his college career ... Freshman **Ryan Switzer** attempted and completed the first pass of his college career when he found fellow **WR Quinshad Davis** with a 59-yard scoring strike on a trick play in the second quarter of the win over NC State ... Davis, who has seven touchdown receptions on the year, also threw a 32-yard touchdown pass vs. East Carolina on Sept. 28 in his only passing attempt of the season thus far ... Add in a successful 23-yard option pass by **RB A.J. Blue**, and the Tar Heels are 3-for-3 for 114 yards and two touchdowns on passes thrown by players other than quarterbacks this season.



**DT Aaron Donald** is coming off one of the most dominant individual performances in Pitt history ... At Georgia Tech last weekend, Donald compiled 11 tackles (all solo), six TFLs, two forced fumbles and a sack ... The six TFLs are the most by an FBS player this season ... Freshman **WR Tyler Boyd** had 11 catches for 118 yards and a touchdown at Georgia Tech ... Boyd now has four 100-yard receiving games through just eight collegiate contests, matching Larry Fitzgerald's 2002 freshman season record ... Twelve true freshmen have played for Pitt this season, and the Panthers are led in six different statistical categories by freshmen ... Boyd leads in all-purpose yards (1,000 yards), receptions (45), touchdown catches (six) and kick return yards (250 yards, 20.8 avg.) ... **PK Chris Blewitt** paces Pitt in scoring (45 points on 7-of-9 field goals and 24-of-25 PATs); while **LB Matt Galambos** and **DB Terrish Webb** are among those who share the team lead in fumble recoveries (five players tied with one).



**SS Anthony Harris** grabbed his sixth interception of the season during last Saturday's loss to eighth-ranked Clemson ... It was the third-straight game with an interception for Harris, who is tied for second nationally ... Harris' six interceptions are tied for No. 4 all-time for a season in the Virginia school record book ... **P Alec Vozenilek** set a Virginia single-game record with 522 punting yards against Clemson, eclipsing the old mark of 464 set by Ryan Weigand vs. Wyoming in 2007 ... With his 82 rushing yards in the Clemson game, **TB Kevin Parks** moves into 14th place on the Cavalier career rushing list with 2139 yards, passing Nikki Fisher (1988-91) and Kevin Brooks (1992-95) ... **WR Keeon Johnson** had a career-high 77 receiving yards on a career-high five catches against the Tigers ... **TE Jake McGee** has had at least one reception in each of the last 11 games ... McGee had two catches for 12 yards vs. Clemson.



Virginia Tech is an impressive 60-17 in ACC games since joining the league in 2004 ... The Hokies are 41-8 against ACC Coastal Division teams and 29-9 in ACC road games heading into this Saturday's test at 11th-ranked Miami ... Virginia Tech is 19-4 in ACC road games against Coastal Division opponents ... The Hokies have posted a 29-5 record in the month of November (27-5 in ACC games) since 2004, when they joined the conference ... Between last weekend's game at Boston College and this week's game at Miami, the Hokies will fly 2,674 miles total in a little over eight days ... In this Saturday's game at Miami, the Hokies will seek Virginia Tech to beat a ranked AP team on the road for the first time since Nov. 26, 2011 (a 38-0 win at No. 24 Virginia when Tech was ranked sixth in the country) ... **PK Cody Journell's** 56-yard field goal against Boston College tied for longest in the FBS this season and tied for the third longest in Tech history.

# ACC Players of the Week

## Clemson's Boyd, Watkins; Boston College's White and Pierre-Louis Lead ACC Players of the Week Selections; FSU's Winston Wins 6th Rookie Honor

GREENSBORO, N.C. – The Clemson quarterback-receiver duo of Tajh Boyd and Sammy Watkins has earned Atlantic Coast Conference football weekly honors, and Boston College offensive tackle Ian White and linebacker Kevin Pierre-Louis were also among the eight student-athletes cited by the league on Monday. Boyd was named the ACC Offensive Back of the Week after throwing for 377 yards with three touchdowns and running for another in Clemson's conference road win at Virginia. Watkins, who hauled in eight catches for 169 yards and a pair of touchdowns, was cited as the ACC Receiver of the Week. White, whose blocking helped pave the way for a strong rushing attack in Boston College's win over Virginia Tech, was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week. Pierre-Louis, who recorded eight tackles and returned an interception for a tie-breaking touchdown, earned ACC Linebacker of the Week honors.

The other honorees included Pitt's Aaron Donald as ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week, Georgia Tech's Jemea Thomas as ACC Defensive Back of the Week, Virginia Tech's Cody Journell as ACC Specialist of the Week and Florida State's Jameis Winston as ACC Rookie of the Week. The Rookie of the Week honor is the sixth of the season for Winston, matching former North Carolina quarterback Darian Durant (2001) for third-most all-time. Former NC State quarterback Philip Rivers (2000) and Virginia Tech running back Ryan Williams (2009) were each named seven times, the most since the award began in 1970. Clemson's Watkins was named ACC Receiver of the Week for the second consecutive week and for the third time this season. Boyd also received his third ACC Offensive Back of the Week honor of the year. Georgia Tech's Thomas was recognized for the second straight week after being named ACC Co-Defensive Back of the Week seven days ago. Boston College's Pierre-Louis and Virginia Tech's Journell were also honored for the second time each this season.

### OFFENSIVE BACK – Tajh Boyd, Clemson, Sr.-R, QB, 6-1, 225, Hampton, Va.

Boyd completed 24 of 29 passes for 377 yards and three touchdowns to lead Clemson to a 59-10 win at Virginia. He finished the day with an efficiency rating of 219.1 while averaging 13 yards per pass attempt and playing just the first 34 minutes of the game. He completed two scoring passes to Sammy Watkins, one a 96-yarder on his last pass of the day, that gave Clemson a 42-7 lead in the third period. Boyd established the ACC career touchdown responsibility record with his three passing and one rushing touchdowns in Saturday's game. He now has had a hand in 116 career touchdowns (93 passing and 23 rushing).

### OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Ian White, Boston College, Sr.-R, RT, 6-5, 303, Conway, N.H.

White was a key component of an offensive line that did not allow a sack and allowed Boston College to rush 42 times for 196 yards in a 34-27 home win over Virginia Tech on Saturday. White helped block and seal the right side for running back Andre Williams on his season-long 62-yard touchdown run that lifted the Eagles to a two-touchdown lead – at 34-20 – with 4:35 left in the game. The team's 196 yards on the ground marked the highest rushing total by any opponent against Virginia Tech this season. White and the offensive line allowed a net loss of only five rushing yards in the game.

### RECEIVER – Sammy Watkins, Clemson, Jr, WR, 6-1, 205, Fort Myers, Fla.

Watkins had another record-setting day with eight catches for 169 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday's win at Virginia. It marked Watkins' 13th career 100-yard receiving day, breaking the school record of 12 previously held by former teammate DeAndre Hopkins. It was Watkins' sixth 100-yard receiving game of the year. Watkins had a 33-yard scoring reception from Tajh Boyd in the first quarter on Clemson's first possession of the game. He then caught a 96-yard scoring pass from Boyd on the first possession of the second half, Watkins' second reception of at least 90 yards this season. Watkins is the only receiver in college football with a pair of 90-yard scoring receptions in 2013. Saturday's big play was the longest pass reception on the road in Clemson history.

### DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Aaron Donald, Sr., Pitt, DT, 6-0, 275, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Donald recorded 11 tackles (all solo), including six tackles for loss in Saturday night's 21-10 ACC road loss at Georgia Tech. Donald's big night included a quarterback sack and two forced fumbles, and his six tackles for lost yardage are the most recorded by an FBS defender this season. Donald currently ranks first nationally in tackles for loss per game (2.4), quarterback sacks per game (1.1), and 12th in forced fumbles per game (0.38). He also leads all active players nationally in career quarterback sacks with 27.5.

### LINEBACKER – Kevin Pierre-Louis, Boston College, Sr., LB, 6-1, 215, Norwalk, Conn.

Pierre-Louis recorded a game-high eight solo tackles and picked off a Virginia Tech pass and returned it 33 yards for a touchdown to lift Boston College to a 27-20 lead with seven minutes to play in the fourth quarter of Saturday's eventual 34-27 ACC win. The interception marked the first of Pierre-Louis' 39-game career. Pierre-Louis matched a single-game season high with his eight solo tackles. The senior linebacker currently ranks second in the ACC with 73 total tackles (9.1 per game).

### DEFENSIVE BACK – Jemea Thomas, Georgia Tech, Sr.-R., S, 5-10, 195, Queensland, Ga.

Thomas had a team-best six solo tackles, a tackle for loss, a pass break-up and his eighth career interception in Saturday's 21-10 win over Pittsburgh. Thomas, who has 21 tackles over the last two games combined, sealed the victory when he came up with his interception at the Pitt 4-yard line with less than a minute to play.

### SPECIALIST – Cody Journell, Virginia Tech, Sr.-R, PK, 6-0, 195, Ripplemead, Va.

A week after struggling, Journell bounced back with a solid performance in Virginia Tech's 34-27 road loss at Boston College. Journell ended the first half with a 56-yard field goal, 8 yards longer than his career long, to give the Hokies the lead. The field goal was the longest in the ACC season and tied three other kickers nationally for the longest in the FBS this season. He later nailed a 47-yarder in addition to three extra points.

### ROOKIE – Jameis Winston, Florida State, Fr.-R, QB, 6-4, 225, Bessemer, Ala.

Winston recorded his fifth 300-yard passing game of the season (325 yards) in leading Florida State past No. 7 Miami, 41-14, on Saturday night. Winston completed 12 of 14 passes in the second half as Florida State outscored Miami 20-0 in the final two quarters to pull away. With Winston leading the way, the Seminoles have opened the season by scoring 40 or more points in a school-record eight straight games.

## Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 264 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 12th on the active FBS list with 153 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

## Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th, 8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

His winning percentage has him in 2nd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first four years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 45-5-1 record (.892). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 2nd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792), followed by Fisher and Clemson's Danny Ford (.772).

## Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. Now in his sixth

season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 18 of the first 21 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .857. That is third-best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is behind of former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893), and legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a very good pace himself, having won 13 of his first 15 ACC home games and tying Swinney percentage-wise but needs this entire season to qualify for this list. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (3rd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

## North Carolina Sets Offensive Records Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,

■ In Fedora's first 20 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 20 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 12 occasions.

■ In his first 20 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 16 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.



## NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 3-5 record in his six games as State's head coach and now is 26-9 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



## Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 6-2 start to the 2013 season, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 27 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.

■ Duke is now bowl eligible for the 2nd straight year. The Blue Devils have never been to back-to-back bowl games.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

## Clemson's Tajh Boyd: Sets ACC Record for TDR, Closing in on TD Pass Mark

Despite having been a starter at quarterback for only 36 games, Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Va.) has shattered one long-time ACC record and is closing in on another. Boyd, who had 3 TD passes and a touchdown rushing while throwing for 377 yards against Virginia shattered the ACC career touchdown responsibility mark (TDR) set by NC State's Philip Rivers (112) during the 2000-2003 seasons. Boyd now has 116 TDR with 23 touchdowns rushing and 93 TD passes. He is now threatening Rivers' TD pass mark (95). He is also in second place to Rivers in both career passing yards with 10,296 and career total offense with 12,291 yards.

## UNC's Renner: One of the Nation's Most Accurate and Efficient

North Carolina QB Bryn Renner is one of the most accurate and efficient quarterbacks in the NCAA's FBS. Renner has completed 668 of 1,005 passes for .665 percent in his career. That mark is just behind the ACC career record of .670 set by former Virginia standout Matt Schaub. Renner's career pass efficiency mark of 151.22 is slightly ahead of the ACC career record of 151.15 set by Florida State's Chris Weinke during the 1997-2000 seasons, but slightly behind that of Clemson's Tajh Boyd (151.87) who is also challenging the mark.

## Florida State's Winston 2nd Nationally in Pass Efficiency; Has 3rd Best First 8-Game Rating In The Century

Eight games into his collegiate career, Florida State redshirt freshman quarterback **Jameis Winston** (Bessemer, Ala.) leads the ACC and is 2nd nationally in passing efficiency and 7th in pass completion percentage (.703). His pass efficiency rating for the first eight weeks of the season is the third-best mark of any player in the FBS this century in their first seven games of a season. His passing yards per game average of 312.8 is significantly ahead of the ACC record pace of 246.8 set by FSU's Drew Weatherford in 2005.

## Clemson's Watkins BC's Amidon Pitt's Street

### Leading Active Receivers



Clemson junior WR **Sammy Watkins** (Ft. Myers, Fla.), Boston College senior WR **Alex Amidon** (Greenfield, Mass.), Pitt senior WR **Devin Street** (Bethlehem, Pa.) and Wake Forest senior **Michael Campanaro** (Clarksville, Pa.) are the leading active career receivers in the ACC this year.

■ Watkins leads all ACC receivers with 13 100-yard receiving games, followed by Alex Amidon (10), Duke's Jamison Crowder (9), Pitt's Street (8) and Campanaro (7).

■ Watkins has averaged 90.9 yards per game in his 32 career starts, the best average of any ACC player, in history. Watkins' career per-game average of 6.41 catches ranks 4th nationally among active players.



■ Pitt's Street actually has more career receiving yards with 2,737 yards than any other current ACC player besides Watkins, and set a Pitt school record last week. But Street's first three years were spent in the Big East Conference.

■ Amidon is 4th in the conference in receptions per game (6.1) this year.

Over his last 20 games, Amidon has averaged 6.35 receptions per contest with 127 catches in that span.

■ Campanaro tied the ACC single-game receiving record for the 2nd time in his career with 16 catches against ULM then had double-figure pass receptions in 3 straight games against NC state, Maryland and Miami. But he suffered a broken collarbone against Syracuse and will likely finish his career with 229 receptions, 3rd-best in ACC history.

■ Watkins has 22 career TD catches, which is one more than FSU's Rashad Greene (21) as the most of any active ACC player.

## UM's Johnson 7th in Career Rushing Average Suffers Season-Ending Injury



Miami sophomore RB **Duke Johnson** (Miami, Fla.), who suffered a season-ending ankle injury against Florida State, is in the ACC's career Top 10 List for best career per-carry average with a minimum of 1,000 career yards earned. Johnson ends the year with 1,867 career yards on just 284

career carries, a 6.57 per-play average. That norm is the 7th-best career average by an ACC player. Georgia Tech's Orwin Smith, who completed his career last fall, holds the record, averaging 9.28 with 1,839 career yards. In Johnson's last nine games including a 176-yard effort against Duke last year, he has averaged 121.8 yards per contest. In just 20 career games, he is averaging 93.35 yards a game.

(Schnecksville, Pa.) is having a banner senior season. Williams leads the ACC and is 2nd in the nation in rushing yards per game (147.0) and total yards (1,176). He has topped the 200-yard mark twice this year, including a career-high 263 yards and 5 TDs against Army, which tied for the 10th-best

total in ACC history. He has vaulted into leading the ACC among its active career rushers (2,738 yds) and has topped the 100-yard mark six times in eight games this year, and 11 times in his career. He becomes the first ACC player to top 200 yards twice in the same season since Virginia Tech's Brandon Ore in 2006. Earlier this year, Williams ran for 204 yards on 35 carries against Wake Forest.

## ACC Returns Has Five Quarterbacks Who Have Thrown for at Least 7,000-Yard Career Yards

## Ebron Breaks UNC Mark For Tight Ends, 2nd All-Time In ACC

North Carolina junior TE **Eric Ebron** (Greensboro, N.C.) shattered the school record for pass receiving yards by a tight end against 10th-ranked Miami on Oct. 17, with 8 catches for 199 yards and a 71-yard TD catch and run play. Only one other tight end in ACC history has recorded more yards in a game, John Henry Mills of Wake Forest had 230 receiving yards against

Duke in 1990. Ebron then set a UNC mark for single-season reception yardage by a tight end on Nov. 2. He now has 669 yards this season, the 3rd-best total by a tight end in ACC history. He needs 203 more yards this year to break the ACC single-season mark of 871 set by former Maryland standout Venon Davis.



## Clemson's Boyd, FSU's Winston Named Davey O'Brien Semifinalists



Two Atlantic Coast Conference quarterbacks, senior **Tajh Boyd** of Clemson and redshirt freshman **Jameis Winston** of Florida State have been named as semifinalists for the Davey O'Brien Award. They are two of 16 players nationally tabbed by the O'Brien Award. Boyd, from Hampton, Va., has led Clemson to a No. 7 ranking in the most recent BCS Standings and to a school record 11 consecutive weeks in the nation's Top 10 while averaging 312.7 yards of total offense per game. Boyd recently set an ACC career record

for touchdown responsibility and is closing in on the ACC career mark for TD passes. Winston, from Bessemer, Ala., leads the ACC and is 2nd nationally in pass efficiency while leading the Seminoles to a No. 2 ranking in the most recent BCS Standings and to eight consecutive victories. His pass efficiency rating through eight games is the third best of any QB this century in the first 8 games of a season.



## Aguayo, Sade, Craddock Named Groza Semifinalists

Three Atlantic Coast Conference placekickers, Florida State freshman **Roberto Aguayo** (Mascotte, Fla.), NC State junior **Niklas Sade** (Wake Forest, N.C.) and Maryland sophomore **Brad Craddock** (Adelaide, Australia) have been named as semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award,



which is presented annually to the nation's top placekicker. Aguayo has made all 12 of his field goal attempts and all of his 53 PAT's this year and is the only kicker in the nation who has been perfect on 50 or more attempts this year. Aguayo is also 3rd nationally in points per game (11.1). Sade, one of the most improved players in the ACC this year, is 2nd nationally in field goals per game, having made 17 of 19 three-point attempts this year, an impressive .895 percentage. Sade entered this year with a 61 percent career percentage in FG attempts. Craddock is also one of the most improved players in the ACC, having made 15 of 18 field goals this fall (.833) after having made just 10 of 16 a year ago. Craddock ranks 7th nationally in field goals per game (1.9).

## O'Leary, Ebron Record Two of the Top 10 Performances By ACC Tight Ends

Just two days apart, North Carolina's **Eric Ebron** and Florida State's **Nick O'Leary** recorded two of the top 10 receiving days for a tight end in ACC history. Ebron's 199 yards, coming on Oct. 17 against then 10th-ranked Miami, was the 2nd-highest single game total for a conference tight end and included a 71-yard TD play. O'Leary's 161-yard, five-catch performance two nights later on Oct. 19 against 3rd-ranked Clemson was the 4th-highest single-game yardage total and included a 94-yard non-scoring play.

## ACC Announces 2013 Football Championship Game Legends Class

*National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers*

*Terry Kinard, Tom Scott, Floyd Little and Johnny Majors;*

### *ACC 50th Anniversary Team Members Kinard and Boomer Esiason Headline 2013 Class*

Led by four members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and two members of the Atlantic Coast Conference's prestigious 50th Anniversary team, the ACC has announced the 2013 Class of Legends for its 9th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 7.

Leading this year's class are former Maryland quarterback **Boomer Esiason (East Islip, N.Y.)**, Clemson safety **Terry Kinard (Sumter, S.C.)**, Virginia defensive end **Tom Scott (Baltimore, Md.)**, Syracuse running back **Floyd Little (New Haven, Conn.)** and former Pitt head coach **Johnny Majors (Lynchburg, Tenn.)**.

Esiason and Kinard were both chosen in 2003 to be members of the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, which honored the 50 best players of the league's first 50 years, while Kinard, Scott, Little and Majors are members of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend. They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 6, and on Dec. 7, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

The group of 15 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year; 10 former All-Americans, including six first-team All-America honorees; and 12 players who combined for 97 years in the National Football League. Twelve of the Legends were drafted into the NFL, including six first- or second-round draft choices.

In all, the collection of players combined for two national championships, five ACC Championships and one Super Bowl title.

Joining the aforementioned selections are Boston College running back **Mike Cloud (Portsmouth, R.I.)**, who ended his collegiate career in 1998 as the Eagles' all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards; Duke halfback and end **Wes Chesson (Edenton, N.C.)**, who ended his career with nine 100-yard receiving games, at the time the most in ACC history; Florida State guard **Jamie Dukes (Orlando, Fla.)**, a consensus first-team All-America for the Seminoles in 1985; and Georgia Tech tailback **"Rambling" Robert Lavette (Cartersville, Ga.)**, who is still the leading career rusher in Yellow Jacket history with 4,066 yards.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2013 are Miami's **Edgerrin James (Immokalee, Fla.)**, one of the most successful running backs in Hurricane history; North Carolina's **Ken Willard (Richmond, Va.)**, a second-team All-America fullback for the Tar Heels; NC State's famed Buckey twins, **Dave Buckey (Akron, Ohio)**, an All-ACC quarterback, and **Don Buckey (Akron)**, an All-ACC wide receiver, who keyed the Wolfpack's football resurgence in the 1970s under then head coach Lou Holtz; Virginia Tech wide receiver **Andre` Davis (Niskayuna, N.Y.)**, a first-team All-America and explosive performer who was one of the leaders of Tech's 2000 team which reached the BCS National Championship Game; and Wake Forest quarterback **Jay Venuto (Salem, N.J.)**, the 1979 ACC Player of the Year who led the Deacons to wins over three nationally-ranked foes that year.

## ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games then, in order to determine the divisional champion, the procedures listed below will be followed.

### A. Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall winning percentage (divisional and non-divisional), and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Overall winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games. If both tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

### B. Three (or More) Team Tie

(Three team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaking procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can only be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaking procedure will then be applied).

1. Combined head-to-head winning percentage among the tied teams.
2. Winning percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference winning percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaking procedures.
4. Combined winning percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined winning percentage versus all non-divisional opponents.
6. Winning percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference winning percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaking procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If all tied teams are not ranked in the full Bowl Championship Series Standings, the computer ranking portion of the Standings will be used, eliminating the high and the low computer ranking, and averaging the remaining rankings.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

## 2013 ACC Bowl Selection

### Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Vizio BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Rose Bowl on Jan. 6 in Pasadena, Calif. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among the Top 14 in the final BCS

Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

### After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.
5. Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl, Nashville, Tenn.
6. Advocate V100 Bowl, Shreveport, La.
7. The Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman, Washington, D.C. and Annapolis, Md.
8. Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, San Francisco, Calif.

### Conditional Agreement\*

\*If Pac-12 or BYU is unable to fill their obligations and ACC has an available team

### Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2). The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or BYU to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

### Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 8. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.



# The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series



## Bowl Championship Series

Heading into its 16th and final year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Rose Bowl Stadium in Pasadena, Calif., on January 6, 2014.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 10 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 10 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, The American Athletic Conference, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, and the Southeastern.

Six conferences (ACC, American, Big 12, Big

Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Additionally, the highest-ranked champion of Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, or Sun Belt conferences will be guaranteed a slot in a BCS game if that team is ranked 12th or higher in the final BCS standings, 16th or higher if its ranking is higher than that of a champion from one of the six conferences with automatic qualification. Other teams are eligible to be selected at large by a bowl game if they finish among the top 14.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

## BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 20 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 8. The first Harris Poll will be released on Sunday, Oct. 13.



## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

Beginning with the 2014-15 season, college football will enter a new era when a postseason playoff will begin. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later. It will be the best of all worlds, and the biggest innovation to the sport in decades.

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## The ACC and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

## Bill Hancock, Executive Director Bowl Championship Series; College Football Playoff

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock achieved a unique triple accomplishment at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics when he was named the first Executive Director of the College Football Playoff, which begins after the 2014 season. Previously, Hancock was named the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and then was named the first executive director of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) in 2009, a role he continues in this year until the completion of the BCS with this year's national championship game. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the

# ACC Overtime Games

## The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Marshall ended regulation tied at 21 in week four of the 2013 season, it marked the 63rd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 63 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 63 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-20 advantage in the 55 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-31 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
