OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia returns to Klöckner Stadium on Tuesday when Robert Morris comes to town for the final regular season game in Charlottesville. Faceoff is set for 7 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 18 in the USILA coaches the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media polls. RMU is receiving votes in the coaches poll.

THE SERIES VS. ROBERT MORRIS

- Tuesday is the second all-time meeting between UVA and Robert Morris with the Cavaliers holding a 1-0 edge.
- RMU is coming to Klöckner Stadium for the first time since 2010 when the Cavaliers were ranked No. 1 in the nation and cruised to an 18-9 victory.
- Chris Bocklet led all players with six goals and three assists for a career-high nine points in the 2010 game.
- RMU head coach Andrew McMinn is in his fifth season at Robert Morris and is coming off a 2016 season where the Colonials finished 7-8.

ONE-GOAL GAMES

- Seven of UVA's 12 games this season have been decided by one goal or less. UVA is 3-4 in those games with two losses in overtime. Three of the five games not decided by one goal or less took place over a four game span between Feb. 18-March 1.



Zed Williams returned to action for the Cavaliers on Sunday after attending the funeral of his father, Daniel Williams. Zed scored three goals and dished out one assist in his return against North Carolina.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

RADIO

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. THE COLONIALS

- Virginia leads the all-time series with Robert Morris, 1-0, after an 18-9 thrashing when UVA was the No. 1 team in the nation in 2010.
- Chris Bocklet had a day against the Colonials, scoring six goals and dishing out nine assists for a career-high nine points. Bocklet's six goals that day against RMU equaled a career high that he accomplished three times during his illustrious UVA career.
- In the 2010 meeting 13 Cavaliers scored points as UVA assisted 14 of 18 goals.
- UVA also received multi-goal games from Matt White (3), Rhamel Bratton (2), Matt Kugler (2) and Tim Fuchs (2).
- Robert Morris began its men's lacrosse program in 2005 and started playing in the CAA. Since 2011 RMU has been playing its conference games in the NEC.
- The Colonials are 0-6 all-time against members of the ACC, playing games against UVA, North Carolina, Notre Dame and Maryland before the Terps left the league following the 2014 season.

VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 130-34 (.7926) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-2 mark in 2017. UVA also is 11-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

NEAR INVINCIBLE UNDER THE KLÖCKNER LIGHTS

- Virginia has lost only eight night games at Klöckner Stadium.
- Overall UVA is 38-9 when playing under the lights at Klöckner Stadium.
- UVA is 3-2 so far in 2017 under the Klöckner lights.
- Overall the Cavaliers had 21-consecutive night wins since moving to Klöckner in 1993.
- UVA fell to Duke in 2008, the first night loss - a game that started at 6 p.m. in April daylight shadows.
- Virginia dropped its second overall game under the Klöckner Stadium lights, ironically, also to Duke on April 17, 2010.
- UVA dropped back-to-back night games at Klöckner Stadium for the first time with losses to Duke on April 13, 2012 and North Carolina in the ACC Tournament a week later on April 20, 2012.
- Originally scheduled for 1 p.m. on March 9, 2013, the fifth loss came to Cornell after field conditions due to snow in the Charlottesville area pushed game back to an evening start.
- UVA also lost to North Carolina in 2015, a 7 p.m. start.
- UVA lost its first night game in 2016, an overtime setback (12-11) to High Point.

OVERTIME GAMES IN 2017

• UVA has played three overtime games in 2017.

• In fact, they all came in a row, marking only the second time in program history such a feat has happened.

• This year UVA has gone to overtime with Cornell (March 11), Notre Dame (March 18) and Johns Hopkins (March 25).

• The only other time UVA has gone to overtime in three straight games was the 1980 NCAA Tournament and UVA beat Cornell in overtime, North Carolina in double overtime, before losing to Johns Hopkins in double overtime.

AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017

- Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.
- It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.
- Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.
- Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.
- Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.
- Currently UVA ranks No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (44.30).
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 30 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

It was a wild finish at the Ridley Athletic Complex as 13 combined goals were scored in the fourth quarter, but No. 14 Virginia (1-0) outlasted No. 6 Loyola (0-1), 16-15, to open the Lars Tiffany era.

Virginia owned a 10-5 lead with 7:50 left in the third quarter when Zed Williams found Ryan Conrad for a Cavalier goal that capped a 6-0 UVA run. It took 45 seconds for Loyola to begin a 5-0 run of its own to tie the game, 10-10, with 12:57 left in the game.

Making his collegiate debut against Loyola, Dox Aitken went straight toward the cage and scored his third goal of the game with 12:19 left in the contest to halt the Greyhounds run, giving UVA the lead back, 11-10. Conrad scored unassisted at 11:27 to give UVA a 12-10 advantage. Aitken and Conrad's goals were the beginning of a 4-1 UVA, giving the Cavaliers a 14-11 lead. Aitken capped the run with his fourth goal of the game with 8:13 left to play.

The Greyhounds came roaring back with a 4-1 run of their own, tying the game at 15-15 after Graham Savio won a faceoff and sprinted toward the UVA cage with 2:59 left. Virginia wasted no time after winning the ensuing faceoff as Williams dodged and flipped a pass behind his back to Conrad and the sophomore deposited the game's final goal, lifting UVA to the 16-15 win.

A UVA turnover in the final seconds set up an opportunity for Loyola to tie the game. But Tanner Scales knocked down Zack Sirico's pass with three seconds left and Conrad picked up the ground ball as time expired.

Loyola started the game's scoring with a Mike Perkins goal via an assist by Zach Sirico at 12:08 in the first quarter. Virginia responded with a 4-1 run to take a two-goal lead, 4-2. Aitken and Joe French each scored goals for UVA, while Jason Murphy and Michael Kraus capped the run. Kraus' first collegiate goal came with 8:56 left in the first half.

The Greyhounds retaliated with a 3-0 run, taking a 5-4 lead. Loyola received goals from Brian Begley and one from Zirico. Savio capped the Loyola run with an unassisted goal with 6:14 left in the second quarter. Virginia held Loyola scoreless for the next 14:09, while the Cavaliers took a 10-5 lead, via a aforementioned 6-0 run.
