### VIRGINIA-DUKE SERIES

- Virginia holds an 81-52-1 edge in its all-time series with Duke.
- UVA head coach Brian O'Connor holds an 14-6 record against Duke.
- UVA won two of three in Charlottesville last season, then defeated the Blue Devils 11-7 in the ACC Tournament.
- Duke won two of three against UVA in the Cavaliers' last ACC trip to Durham, marking the Blue Devils' first series win against UVA since 1998.

### CAVALIERS IN FRIENDLY CONFINES AT DBAP

- Virginia has fond memories of Durham Bulls Athletic Park – UVA won each of its last two ACC Championships at DBAP (1996, 2009).
- UVA is 9-6 all-time at DBAP, which opened in 1995.

### VALDES OUT 2-4 WEEKS AFTER KNEE SURGERY

- Catcher Franco Valdes will miss approximately two to four weeks after having arthroscopic surgery April 19 to repair the meniscus in his left knee.
- Valdes has been battling the injury for most of the season.

### O'CONNOR HITS 300 MARK

- Brian O'Connor recorded his 300th career win at Virginia Tuesday against Coastal Carolina.
- In his seventh season, O'Connor has a 301-113-1 record at Virginia.
- He is the second UVA baseball coach to reach 300 wins (Dennis Womack, 594, 1981-2003).

### ROTATION PRODUCING FOR WAHOOS

- Virginia's starting rotation has produced 12 ACC wins this season – most of any ACC team.
- Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey and Cody Winiarski own four wins apiece, each of which is tied for tops in the ACC in conference games.
- Only four other pitchers in the ACC have four wins in league games.

- Kevin Arico is tied for the NCAA lead with 13 saves and ranks ninth in ACC history with 24.

## ANOTHER DAY, ANOTHER GAME FOR CANNON

- With his next appearance on the field, senior infielder Tyler Cannon will play in his 226th career game, setting the Virginia career record.
- David Stone set the record of 225 from 1999-2002.

## HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational in his Friday starts this season, posting a 6-1 record with a 2.00 ERA, which ranks first in the ACC.
- In 67.2 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 81 and walked just 11. Batters are hitting .186 against him – lowest in the ACC.

- He ranks 12th nationally in hits allowed per nine innings (5.98), 13th in strikeouts and 14th in ERA.

## HICKS SHOWS OFF THE ARM

- John Hicks has thrown out six of the last eight potential basestealers over the past 10 games.
- For the season, Hicks has thrown out 52 percent (15-of-29) of runners attempting to steal.
- As a team, UVa has thrown out 26-of-59 (44 percent) of potential basestealers.

## GOSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .394 batting aver-

age, .472 on base percentage and 15 stolen bases.

- He leads the ACC in hits (71) and ranks fourth in batting and stolen bases, fifth in triples (4), seventh in total bases (109) and eighth in runs (48).
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 18 games.
- He had a streak of 122-consecutive starts snapped Saturday when he sat out because of the effects of food poisoning.

## WHO'S HOT OVER THE LAST 10 GAMES

- Kenny Swab leads the team with a .448 batting average in UVa's last 10 games (13-for-29).
- Keith Werman (.423) and Phil Gosselin (.400) each are at or above the .400 mark during that time.
- Gosselin and Steven Proscia each have 13 RBI, while Swab has 12.
- UVa is 15-for-16 in stolen bases the last 10 games.

## QUICK NOTES FROM THE MARYLAND SERIES

- Virginia outscored Maryland 43-7 in the series and racked up 51 hits.
- Kenny Swab went 8-for-18 (.444) with four extra-base hits and seven RBI, while Steven Proscia was 7-for-18 (.389) with three homers and 11 RBI.
- Virginia picked up 19 doubles and 26 extra-base hits in the series.
- UVa's starting weekend rotation of Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey and Cody Winiarski each worked at least seven innings and gave up two runs or fewer.
- UVa scored its second-most runs ever in an ACC game in a 27-4 win in the second game of the Friday DH.
- The Cavaliers extended their winning streak in College Park to 13 games.

## CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 7 IN LATEST RPI

- Virginia is ranked No. 7 in the third RPI report, which was released last Tuesday by the NCAA. Arizona State and Arkansas top the rankings.
- UVa defeated the top-ranked team in the RPI, Coastal Carolina, on Tuesday.
- Virginia has 12 wins against the RPI top 50 this year.

## WAHOOS RACK UP SERIES WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has won all five of its series against ranked foes, including ACC series wins over Top-10 opponents Florida State, Clemson and Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers are 11-6 this year against ranked foes.
- Virginia has played the most ranked opponents this year among ACC teams.

## VIRGINIA RANKS 22ND NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,712 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 22nd nationally in attendance.
- On April 6 vs. James Madison, UVa had its largest mid-week attendance ever, as 2,521 came out to watch the Cavaliers' win.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa is on pace to obliterate the single-season attendance average record of 1,774, set in 2007.

### UVA SHATTERS ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke its series attendance record again April 16-18, drawing 12,657 fans for the three-game series with Virginia Tech.
- Over the last two home weekends, UVa drew 25,236 fans for series against Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech.
- UVa has had record, sellout crowds of 4,219 in four of its last five weekend games.
- A record total of 77,549 fans have come out to Davenport Field this year (29 dates) – the school record was 65,661 in 2007 (37 dates).
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds and eight home crowds of more than 3,500.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, school-record crowds at William and Mary, James Madison and VMI.

### SEATS ADDED, MORE ON THE WAY

- Virginia has added 979 general admission bleacher seats down the right-field line this season.
- Nearly 600 new bleacher seats in right field will be in place for the North Carolina series (May 14-16), pushing the Davenport Field capacity to 4,825.

### VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Entering the week Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.95 hits per nine innings – second in the ACC and sixth fewest in the nation.
- UVa ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (7.97).
- UVa has given up more than nine hits just 14 times this season and twice in the last 10 games.

### CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon stands in a first-place tie in career games at UVa with 225 entering the weekend. With one more game played, he will break the tie with David Stone (1999-2002) for first on the all-time UVa list.
- Cannon also comes into the week with 838 career at bats, which is fourth in UVa history.
- Cannon has 58 career doubles and has broken the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (53, 2005-07). He needs three doubles to reach the ACC's career Top 25.
- He also is third in triples (12), fifth in hits (256), sixth in total bases (353) and runs scored (168), ninth in walks (102) and 11th in HBP (19).

### LEGGING OUT THE EXTRA BAGGERS

- Virginia has sprayed the ball all over the field this year and ranks among the nation's leaders in triples and doubles (ACC leader in both).
- Entering the week UVa was second nationally to Arizona State with 25 triples (ASU, 26).
- The Cavaliers also were seventh in doubles with 114 (Texas Tech leads with 129).
- UVa hit 19 doubles in the series against Maryland, including 10 in the second game of the Friday DH.
- The extra-base hits are coming from everyone – no Cavalier ranks in the top 50 nationally in either category.

## GOLDEN EYES

- Virginia's offense ranks ninth nationally with 219 walks.
- Interestingly, the Cavaliers are just fifth in walks in the ACC – six ACC teams ranks among the NCAA's top 10 in walks.
- FSU (2), Clemson (3), NC State (4), Georgia Tech (8), Virginia (9) and UNC (10) all rank among the Top 10.



### ARICO NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Kevin Arico has been named to the midseason watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award.
- The award is annually presented by the NCBWA to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.
- Arico currently is tied with Appalachian State's Chris Patterson for No. 1 among all Division I pitchers in saves with 13 this season (in 15 attempts) and boasts 24 career saves – second in Virginia history and ninth in ACC history.
- Former Cavalier Casey Lambert (2004-07) is the ACC's all-time leader with 43 saves.

### NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 70-for-157 (.446) this season with 35 RBI and 49 runs scored.
- Last weekend, UVa's No. 9 hitters went 7-for-14.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 22-for-40 with 14 runs scored and eight RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 22-for-53 with two homers, 15 RBI and 18 runs scored in the ninth spot.

### DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Through 45 games, Virginia has committed 37 errors – good for a .977 fielding percentage.
- UVa ranks second in the ACC and seventh in the nation in fielding.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

### OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 32-24 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded from there.
- UVa has outscored its opponents 55-11 in the second inning this year and 158-43 from the second through the fourth innings.
- UVa outscored Maryland 7-0 in the second and 18-1 from the second through the fourth innings of their series last weekend.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 385-179 this season.

### BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with 10 players boasting at least 30 hits and 20 runs each.
- In 19 games at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On six occasions all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting an .341 as a team through 45 games. Nine regular starters are batting .300 or better.

### FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno,

Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 70-for-178 (.393).

- Bruno is batting .400 and had a 15-game hit streak at one point this season.
- Gagnani is 9-for-15 in his last five games.
- Taylor scored nine runs last week and had a career-high three hits out of the leadoff spot Saturday.

### VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,287 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 219 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (160), Jarrett Parker (155), Phil Gosselin (147), Steven Proscia (108) Franco Valdes (106), and John Hicks (102) each have made at least 100 career starts.

### BRUNO STREAK COMES TO HALT AT 15

- Stephen Bruno had his 15-game hit streak snapped April 16 vs. Virginia Tech.
- He batted .397 (23-for-58) during that stretch.
- It was the longest hit streak for a UVa freshman since Brandon Guyer recorded hits in 15 straight games in 2005.

### MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded one of its best months of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 16 games in March (16-3).
- It also is the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.842), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

### WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

### CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia earned a No. 1 ranking from Baseball America and Rivals.com for six-consecutive weeks this season and is back at No. 1 in the Baseball America rankings this week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia has had five teams ranked No. 1 this season – baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer and men's tennis.
