QUICK HITS - WEEK SIX

A battle of Top 25 squads kicks off week six of the ACC schedule when No. 17/17 Louisville travels to No. 24/24 NC State on Thursday, Oct. 5. The game will be televised by ESPN at 8 p.m. from Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh. This is the first time the two teams have met on an ESPN Thursday night game.

NC State is ranked No. 24 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches Top 25 Polls. This marks the first Top 25 ranking for NC State since the final poll of the 2010 season when the Wolfpack was No. 25.

Louisville's Lamar Jackson has 37 career rushing touchdowns and is just one shy of the ACC career mark for a quarterback (38) set by Georgia Tech's Tevin Washington (2009-12). Jackson needs only 13 yards to have 10,000 career total offense yards.

Five ACC teams are ranked in both the AP and Amway Coaches Top 25 Polls this week. No. 2/2 Clemson leads the way, followed by No. 13/12 Miami, No. 16/19 Virginia Tech, No. 17/17 Louisville and No. 24/24 NC State. Florida State leads all others receiving votes and Georgia Tech is also receiving votes.

Coastal Division rivals Virginia and Duke will meet for the 68th time this Saturday in a series which began in 1890 in Richmond, Virginia. UVA holds a slim, 35-33 advantage, and has won the last two meetings. Under David Cutcliffe, Duke has taken six of the last nine contests.

Clemson's win over 12th-ranked Virginia Tech last week marked the first time in ACC and AP poll history that a team has recorded three wins over Top 15 teams in the month of September. The Tigers downed No. 13 Auburn on Sept. 9, No. 14 Louisville on Sept. 16 and No. 12 Virginia Tech on Sept. 30. The combined score of those three games was 92-44.

Wake Forest travels to No. 2/2 Clemson on Saturday for a noon kickoff on ESPN2. Tigers' head coach Dabo Swinney has never lost to the Demon Deacons.

Miami holds a one-game advantage (31-30) in the series with Florida State, which resumes this weekend in Tallahassee at 3:30 p.m. on ESPN. The Seminoles have won all seven meetings with Jimbo Fisher as head coach. Ironically, FSU leads in games played in Miami (20-17) but Miami leads 14-10 in games played in Tallahassee.



QUICK HITS

ACC Pitt travels to Syracuse on Saturday for a rematch of last November's high-scoring affair. Pitt's 76-61 win was the highest-scoring regular season game in FBS history with more than 1,300 yards of combined

total offense (668 for Syracuse and 644 for Pitt). The two teams set an FBS record for most combined points (137) in a single regulation game and most combined touchdowns (20).

Streaking

- Clemson's win over Virginia Tech was its 10th straight win overall since losing to Pitt at home on Nov. 12 of last year. That ties South Florida for the second-longest current win streak in the FBS behind only Oklahoma (14). Miami's eight-game win streak is the fourth best in the FBS.

- Clemson's win over 12th-ranked Virginia Tech was its eighth straight win over a top 25 team, the longest streak in Clemson history. The Tigers are now 10-1 in matchups of top 15 teams over the last three years and 13-1 in its last 14 games against teams ranked in the top 25 of at least one poll.

- With its 31-17 win at Virginia Tech, Clemson won its 12th-straight road game, a school record, and its 10th-straight ACC road win. The league record for consecutive ACC road wins is 12, set during the 1992-94 seasons by Florida State. Clemson's 12-game road winning streak is tied for second best in the nation with Alabama. Oklahoma has the longest at 13.

ACC Clemson has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in each of the past 32 weeks. That ties Alabama for the longest current streak in the nation.

ACC North Carolina plays host to No. 21/22 Notre Dame at 3:30 p.m. on ABC. The Fighting Irish have won 17 of the previous 19 meetings, including a high-scoring 50-43 decision at South Bend in 2014.

ACC For the first time since 2014, Boston College plays under the lights in a Saturday prime-time home game as the Eagles host No. 16 Virginia Tech on Saturday. The Eagles rushed for a season-high 224 yards in a win last week over Central Michigan.

ACC Eight ACC football players have been named semifinalists for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, which is given annually to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. The semifinalists are OT Gabe Brandner of Duke; OT Andrew Marshall of Georgia Tech; WR Braxton Berrios of Miami; TE Cole Cook of NC State; P Ryan Winslow of Pitt; DB Jordan Martin of Syracuse; LB Micah Kiser of Virginia and TE Cam Serigne of Wake Forest.

ACC Twelve ACC football players have been nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works team. The list is led by Heisman Trophy winning QB Lamar Jackson of Louisville and includes DT Christian Wilkins of Clemson, T Gabe Brandner of Duke, TE Mavin Saunders of Florida State, QB Matthew Jordan of Georgia Tech, DL Demetrius Jackson of Miami, WR Austin Proehl of North Carolina, P A.J. Cole III of NC State, T Brian O'Neill of Pitt, QB Zack Mahoney of Syracuse, S Quin Blanding of Virginia and PK Jerry Slye of Virginia Tech.

ACC Eight quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers were from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They were joined by Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers). All eight played in the ACC.

ACC Seven ACC quarterbacks have made their first career starts this season. Boston College's Anthony Brown, Clemson's Kelly Bryant, Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson and Georgia Tech's TaQuon Marshall all made their first starts in week one. North Carolina's Chazz Surratt made his first career start in week two vs. Louisville. Florida State true freshman James Blackman and Pitt sophomore Ben DiNucci made their first starts on Sept. 23. In addition, Miami's Malik Rosier made just the second start of his career in the Hurricanes' season-opener against Bethune-Cookman.

ACC ABC's Saturday Night Football featuring Clemson at Virginia Tech on Sept. 30 at 8 p.m. earned a 3.0 overnight, the best among all networks in week 5.

COASTAL NOTES

ACC Pitt QB Max Browne completed 28 of 32 passes (.875) for 410 yards in the Panthers' 42-10 win over Rice. His total included three dropped passes. The 410 yards were the most for a Panther QB since 2013 when Tom Savage threw for 426 against Duke.

ACC Virginia LB Micah Kiser, a semifinalist for the prestigious National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, is tied for second nationally in sacks per game. He made five in UVA's first four games, a 1.25 average.

ACC Duke senior cornerback Bryon Fields Jr. recorded his fourth career interception return for a touchdown when he returned a pick 61 yards for Duke's final score in a 27-17 win over arch-rival North Carolina. Fields Jr. tied the ACC career mark for interception returns for touchdowns set by Virginia's Randy Neal (1991-94) and matched by Wake Forest's Alphonso Smith (2005-08).

ACC Miami junior running back Mark Walton is averaging 9.16 yards per carry this season, which ranks second nationally in the FBS. Walton leads the ACC in rushing yards per game (134.3).

ACC Pitt wide receiver Quadree Henderson recorded his sixth kick return for a touchdown when he returned a punt 80 yards for a score against Georgia Tech. Henderson has returned four kickoffs and two punts for scores. The ACC and NCAA record is eight, held by Clemson's C.J. Spiller and several others at the national level.

ACC Miami sophomore WR Ahmmon Richards led all freshmen last year in yards per catch (19.1) and did nothing to hurt that number in his first game back for the Hurricanes this season. After sitting out Miami's first two games with an injury, Richards averaged 35.3 yards a catch against Duke, with three grabs for 106 yards, including a 49-yard TD pass and run play.

ACC Pitt P Ryan Winslow leads the ACC and ranks fourth nationally in punting this season, averaging 46.8 yards a boot.

ACC Virginia Tech WR Cam Phillips ranks second nationally among all active receivers with 206 career catches. That total ties him with former Clemson WR DeAndre Hopkins for 15th place on the ACC career list.

ACC Virginia Tech PK Joey Slye moved into seventh place on the ACC career scoring list with 365 points. Slye tallied five points in the Hokies' loss to Clemson, including his 71st career field goal, which ties for the

fourth-highest total in league history with former Wake Forest PK Sam Swank (2005-08). Slye ranks second nationally among all active career players in field goals.

Georgia Tech topped the 400-yard rushing mark in back-to-back games against Pitt on Sept. 23 (436) and North Carolina (403) on Sept. 30. No team has rushed for more than 400 yards against consecutive ACC opponents since at least 2000.

For the third time in four games Georgia Tech QB TaQuon Marshall and B-Back KirVonte Benson topped the 100-yard mark in rushing. Marshall rushed for 137 yards and Benson 130 in Tech's win over North Carolina. Marshall and Benson are currently ranked second and third, respectively, among ACC rushing leaders and have combined for 999 yards.

Since 2008, no team in the FBS has rushed for more yards than Georgia Tech. Using its spread-option attack, the Jackets have run for 37,055 yards during that time, or 21.0359 miles. Tech is second in the nation in rushing offense, averaging 396 yards per game.

Virginia safety Quin Blanding leads all active FBS players in career total tackles with 401. Blanding, currently in his fourth year as a starter, averages 10.03 tackles per game.

Virginia QB Kurt Benkert is averaging 312.2 yards passing per game. That ranks second in the ACC only to Louisville's Lamar Jackson. Benkert has thrown 10 TD passes with only one interception.

ATLANTIC NOTES

Clemson is the fifth team in ACC history to play three teams ranked in the AP's Top 14 in the first five games of a season. The others were Miami in 2009, North Carolina in 2001, Clemson in 1966 and Duke in 1957. Clemson faced No. 13 Auburn in week two, No. 14 Louisville in week three and No. 12 Virginia Tech in week five. Clemson is the only team to win all three.

Clemson ranks seventh nationally in total defense, allowing just 250.0 yards per game. The Tigers are fourth in scoring defense, 12th in run defense and 16th in pass defense. Clemson held 13th-ranked Auburn to just 117 total yards, the fewest by a team ranked in the nation's top 15 since No. 2 Alabama held No. 1 LSU to just 92 yards in the 2012 BCS National Championship Game.

NC State quarterback Ryan Finley has thrown 257 consecutive passes without an interception, which is the third-longest streak in ACC history. He trails only former NC State QB Russell Wilson, who set the ACC mark of 379 passes without a pick during the 2008-09 seasons, and Florida State's Drew Weatherford, who had 270 attempts without an interception, during the 2007 season.

Boston College junior free safety Lucas Denis is tied for national lead in interceptions with five in BC's five games, an average of 1.0 per contest. Florida State CB Tarvarus McFadden tied for the national lead in 2016.

Florida State PK Ricky Aguayo is averaging 2.67 field goals per game after making four three-pointers in each of his last two games. Aguayo ranks fourth nationally in the BCS.

Syracuse wide receiver Ervin Philips set an ACC record with 17 catches in the Orange's loss to NC State. Philips broke a mark held by

nine different players who had 16 catches 10 different times.

Syracuse senior wide receiver Steve Ishmael has topped 100 yards receiving in every game this season (5). Ishmael, who leads the nation in receptions per game (10.2), has been named to the watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top receiver. The ACC single-season record is 8.0 receptions per game, set in 1998 by NC state's Torry Holt. Ishmael is one of four ACC receivers ranked among the top five in the FBS. His teammate Ervin Philips is ranked third (8.8), while NC State's Jaylen Samuels is fourth (8.6) and Virginia Tech's Cam Phillips is fifth (8.2).

Wake Forest PK Mike Weaver is one of just two FBS placekickers with at least 10 field goal attempts this season without a miss. Weaver is perfect on all of his 10 attempts, while Utah's Matt Gay is 14 of 14.

Louisville QB Lamar Jackson, who has 2,968 career rushing yards, passed Florida's Tim Tebow and Central Michigan's Dan Lefevour for 22nd place on the NCAA career quarterbacks rushing list. Both Tebow and LeFevour played four years and Jackson is only five games into his junior season.

Boston College P Mike Knoll has pinned the Eagles' opponents' inside of their 20-yard line on 20 occasions this year in just 38 total punts or on 52.6 percent of his punts.

Louisville QB Lamar Jackson ranks second among all active players averaging 332.9 total yards of offense per game. His current average would break the ACC career mark set last year by Deshaun Watson of Clemson (318.3) by 14 yards per game. Jackson is one of four ACC quarterbacks ranked in the top 15 of active career total offense per game. His is joined by Eric Dungey of Syracuse (288.0) who is eighth, Daniel Jones of Duke (267.8) who is 13th and Florida State's Deondre Francois (265.8) who is 14th.

Jackson has 9,987 career total yards of offense. He just needs 13 yards to top the 10,000-yard career mark for total offense this Thursday night when the Cardinals travel to NC State. He would become only the second junior to do so in league history joining Clemson's Deshaun Watson. Thursday will be Jackson's 31st career game, Watson accomplished the feat in 33 games.

Jackson broke the ACC career mark for most rushing yards by a quarterback in only his third season. Jackson now has 2,968 career yards, bettering the mark of 2,806 set during the 2007-10 seasons by Georgia Tech's Joshua Nesbit. Jackson, who has 37 career rushing touchdowns, is one shy of the ACC career mark for a quarterback (38) set by Georgia Tech's Tevin Washington (2009-12).

Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last six years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of six or more years with double-figure victories. The Tigers are only the 11th team to have had 10 wins in six successive seasons.

ACC COACHING SUCCESS

Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top 19 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State's Jimbo Fisher ranks third (.806), followed by Clemson's Dabo Swinney (sixth, .770), Miami's Mark Richt (seventh, .741), Louisville's Bobby Petrino (10th, .720), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (16th, .672) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (19th, .658).

Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 180 wins in his 20-year career. Miami's Mark Richt is eighth with 157 wins, followed by Louisville's Bobby Petrino, who is 16th with 113 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (107) who is 21st, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall, who is 22nd with 104 wins, and Duke's David Cutcliffe, who is 23rd with 100 wins.

NATIONAL TITLES & HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS

Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the four years.

The ACC is the first conference since 1994 to have a football national title winner (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

In 2016, Louisville's Lamar Jackson became the second ACC player in the last four years to claim the Heisman Trophy. With Clemson's Deshaun Watson at No. 2 in the Heisman voting, it marked the seventh time in the 82-year history of the award that the top two finishers have been from the same conference, and only the second time that the top two finishers have been quarterbacks from the same conference.

With junior QB Lamar Jackson returning to lead Louisville in 2017, the ACC has had reigning Heisman Trophy-winner return to compete in the league twice in the last four years. Florida State's Jameis Winston did so in 2014 after winning the 2013 Heisman Trophy. Jackson is the youngest athlete (19 years, 337 days) to win the Heisman Trophy, while Winston (19 years, 342 days) is the second youngest.

DR PEPPER ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

This season, The Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be held at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium for a seventh time, resuming an agreement between the ACC and the Queen City venue that runs through the 2020 season.

The 13th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is set for Saturday, Dec. 2. The game will again be shown in prime time on ESPN (at 7:45 p.m.) or ABC (at 8 p.m.)

The six Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Games held in Charlotte have been extremely successful from a fan experience and attendance standpoint. The games have averaged over 69,000 fans per contest, including sellout crowds in 2010, 2011, and 2015. An ACC Football Championship record crowd of 74,514 in 2015 set an attendance record at Bank of America Stadium. Over the last seven years, the ACC ranks second among all conferences in attendance at its football championship games.

ACC FOOTBALL - ESPN THURSDAY NIGHT BROADCASTS



- When Louisville travels to play NC State this Thursday night at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, the meeting will be the 104th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night.

- The Cardinals have an overall 11-10 mark on Thursday night when televised by ESPN, including a 5-4 mark away from home.

- NC State will be playing in its 20th game on ESPN Thursday night. The Wolfpack is 9-10 overall, and 7-6 at home. This week's game marks the first time the Atlantic Division rivals have played each other on Thursday.

- Virginia Tech has played in more Thursday night games televised by ESPN than any other ACC team, having made 32 appearances. The Hokies have also won more ESPN Thursday night games (23) than any other team.

- The ACC's tradition of Thursday night football began with Georgia Tech. The Jackets hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

- There were originally three Thursday night ACC games on ESPN this year, but the Georgia Tech at Miami contest originally scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 12, has been moved to Saturday, Oct. 14. The change was made to accommodate the rescheduling of the Florida State-Miami (Oct. 7) game, which was postponed due to Hurricane Irma. That allows both Tech and Miami to have equal rest heading into their game. The other ESPN Thursday night contest this year is North Carolina at Pitt on Nov. 9.

- After this week's game, ACC teams will have made 182 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

- After Virginia Tech (32) and Georgia Tech (29), Miami (22) leads in total appearances, followed by Pitt (22), Louisville (21), NC State (19), Clemson (16), North Carolina (16), Florida State (14), Boston College (12) and Virginia (12).

- Clemson has the longest current winning streak of any ACC team on Thursday nights, having won six straight Thursday games dating back to 2012.

- Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's win over second-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

- Miami has the highest winning percentage of any ACC school, having posted an 18-5 overall record, a .783 winning percentage. Miami is 11-1 at home on Thursdays, posting an 8-0 record at the old Orange Bowl and is 3-1 in Hard Rock Stadium (3-1). The only Miami loss at home came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

- The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating.

The ACC & ESPNU on Thursday Night

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005, and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006. Louisville appeared on ESPNU as a member of the Big East in 2011.
